SILVER DOLLAR GROUP:

Source advised that JAMES FORD SEALE was a member of the Silver Dollar Group. (SDG) land source was of the opinion that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER is the individual who had given SEALE his silver dollar. Source advised that SEALE attended a meeting of the SDG which was held on a sandbar on the Homochitto River in Franklin County, Mississippi, and he attended the meeting of this group at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE in the Summer of 1965.



Source advised that some of the group, while at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE in the Summer of 1965, had attempted to make an explosive. Source advised that the ingredients they tried to use to make the explosive were totally ineffective. Source advised that to his knowledge, the name GEORGE METCALFE was not mentioned at the fishfry.

Source identified the following individuals as being members of the SDG in, addition to the individuals who had been mentioned above:

and JAMES Source advised that he did not know HOMER T. Horton "SONNY" TAYLOR by name

Source advised he knows BUFORD ASHLEY who resides in Meadville, Mississippi. He stated that ASHLEY was not a member of the SDG,

Source advised that he knows ELDON HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND, both of whom reside in the rural area of Meadville. He stated that neither of these individuals were members of the SDG,

Regarding the meeting of some members of the SDG in Ferriday, Louisiana, on February 21, 1967, wherein they drank coffee at a couple of restaurants.

Source advised that if DONALD HOLLAND had appeared at that coffee-drinking session, that was probably the reason that he had been present.

EARL HODGE MURDER:

Source professed to have no knowledge regarding this murder.

KU KLUX KLAN, FRANKLIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI;

Source advised that there is no active Klan in Franklin County, Mississippi, at the present time. Source advised that the Klan in Franklin County had been totally inactive since 1964 when JAMES FORD SEALE and CHARLES MARCUS EDWARDS were arrested by the MHSP and Agents of the FBI,

source stated that the arrest of these two individuals frightened the other Klansmen so that they lost interest in Klan activities.

Chief of Police J. T. ROBINSON observed a number of photographs in the possession of interviewing Agents and he stated that he casually knows DONALD HOLLAND, who he understands operates a feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi. Chief ROBINSON did not know DONALD HOLLAND to be involved in any Klan activities.

Chief ROBINSON stated that LAMAR HOLLAND is a brother of DONALD HOLLAND, resides in the Hunter Hall subdivision, and is a contractor. He stated that ROBERT HOLLAND is a brother also, who resides at 33 Cloverdale and has a very bad case of arthritis. He stated that LESLIE HOLLAND of 307 Mescagne and ARLISS HOLLAND of 97 Booker Road are believed to also be related to the above HOLLANDS.

The information furnished herewith concerns an individual who is believed to be covered by the agreement between the FBI and Secret Service concerning Presidential protection, and to fall within the category or categories checked.

Details:

This investigation is predicated upon information received that DONALD HOLLAND of Meadville, Mississippi, is a member of the Silver Dollar Group (SDG).

Characterizations of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), United Klans of America, Incorporated (UKA), and the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) are contained in the appendix of this report.

I. BACKGROUND:

A. True Name and Aliases:

The subject's true name is DONALD DEWAYNE HOLLAND

B. Residence Address and Mailing Address :

The subject resides at Route 3, Meadville, Mississippi.

C. Marital Status:

The subject is married and his wife's name is SYLVIA BROOKS HOLLAND.

D. Occupation:

Subject is the owner and operator of Holland Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi.

E. Education:

Subject graduated from Meadville High School, Meadville, Mississippi.

F. <u>Birth:</u>

The subject was born October 13, 1929, at Meadville, Mississippi.

G. Military Record:

Subject served in United States Army, Army Serial Number 53088674 from January 3, 1952, until October 2, 1953. He received an honorable discharge from the Army Reserve on January 2, 1960.

H. Identification Record:

By communication dated April 15, 1967, the FBI Identifi cation Division advised that they could find no criminal record identifiable with the subject.

I . Local Criminal Check:

On May 31, 1967, Deputy Sheriff KIRBY SCHELL, Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi, advised the subject has no criminal record on file with that agency.

II. CONNECTION WITH KLAN AND HATE-TYPE ORGANIZATIONS:

On March 9, 1967, JN T-l advised that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER stated that DONALD HOLLAND is a Meadville, Mississippi, Klansman and feed store operator.

On March 28, 1967, JN T-l advised that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER stated that someone who attended the coffee drinking session of the Silver Dollar Group at Vidalia, Louisiana on February 20, 1967, had been doing some talking. GLOVER advised that he had recently conversed with DONALD HOLLAND of Meadville, Mississippi, and HOLLAND told him that he had been interviewed by the FBI. GLOVER, advised that HOLLAND also told him that the FBI had mentioned that he had been at this coffee drinking session and HOLLAND was sure that the information had to come from someone who was at this session. HOLLAND told GLOVER that he felt that one of the "boys from Louisiana" was doing some talking. GLOVER also indicated that HOLLAND had told him that the FBI was still asking about the fish fry at the home of JAMES LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana.

The source advised GLOVER stated HOLLAND told him that there was a particular reference to the feed mill man from Meadville, Mississippi, and HOLLAND advised that only the people from Louisiana would have referred to him by that title.

On April 11, 1967, JN T-l identified a photograph of DONALD HOLLAND as the individual who owns a feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi, and who attended the Silver Dollar Group meeting in Vidalia, Louisiana, on February 20, 1967.

CHARACTERIZATION OF THE SILVER DOLLAR GROUP:

On April 4, 1967, JN T-l and on May 3, 1967, JN T-2 described the "Silver Dollar Group" as. a hard-core action group made up of present and former members of the

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White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA), and the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from Louisiana and Mississippi. No formal organizational format has been adopted by the group. Membership is attained by invitation and upon receipt of a silver one dollar coin from the group organizer, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

III. MISCELLANEOUS:

DONALD HOLLAND was contacted at his feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi, And was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent who also advised him that he did not have to furnish any information and that any information he did furnish could be used in a court of law. Be was advised that he could contact an attorney or anyone else at any time.

HOLLAND advised that he would talk to one FBI Agent, but under no circumstances would he willingly converse with two.

HOLLAND advised he **is** the owner and operator of **Holland's Feed Mill,** Meadville, Mississippi, and has resided **in Franklin** County, Mississippi, most of his life.

HOLLAND advised that he is not now and **has** never **been a** member of any Klan type organization in Franklin County **or elsewhere.** Ke stated that he has heard of the "Silver **Dollar Group, but** would not state where, when, or from whom **he heard of** this organization. He did state that he knew **it to be an** organization in "this part of Mississippi and part of Louisiana."

When asked if he had been a member or was a **member of the** Silver Dollar Group, HOLLAND stated "I won't **answer that.**"

HOLLAND advised that on the night of February 20, 1967, he and a friend of his from Natchez, Mississippi, drove **to the** Magnolia Restaurant in Ferriday, Louisiana, where his **friend** made several telephone calls in an effort to locate **an individual** who owned a dog that he was interested in. HOLLAND **would** not identify the friend with whom he drove to **Ferriday that** night. He stated he drank a cup of coffee or **two while his friend** made the telephone calls and does not **recall with** whom he may have conversed while **his** friend made **the telephone** calls.

j' HOLLAND advised that he might further discuss the Silver Dollar Group with the interviewing Agent tomorrow or the next day or when he wanted to. He stated that when he wanted to talk to the Agent he would contact the FBI and that he did not want the FBI to contact him again.

DONALD HOLLAND was contacted at the Holland Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi, and was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent. HOLLAND was further advised that he did not have to make any statement and that any statement he made could be used in a court of law. He was advised that he had the right to consult an attorney or anyone else prior to making any statement.

HOLLAND stated "me and my friends figured out who is in the Silver Dollar Group, it is niggers and FBI Agents." HOLLAND declined to identify his friends who helped him with his "figuring", stated that he did not want another FBI Agent in his place of business wasting his time unless they had a warrant for his arrest or a subpoena for him.

HOLLAND refused to answer any questions or reply to any comments made by the interviewing Agent.

A green Chevrolet pickup truck bearing the inscription Holland's Feed Mills on the door was observed parked in front of HOILAHD's place of business. The license number of the vehicle was observed to be 1967 Mississippi F/6 32296.

DONALD HOLLAND, contacted at the Holland Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi was advised that he did not have to furnish any information and that any information he did furnish could be used in court. He was further advised that ho had the right to consult with an attorney prior to saying anything.

HOLLAND stated "do you have a warrant, if not I got nothing to say." HOLLAND was advised that the interviewing Agents were not interested in discussing the Silver Dollar Group, but possible violations of Federal statutes such as theft from interstate shipment or income tax violations.

HOLLAND again stated he would not talk about anything to the FBI unless the FBI had a warrant for his arrest. He stated he would talk to Internal Revenue Service Agents as they were good men and he had a personal friend by the name of JOHN LOGAN, who was employed by the Internal Revenue Service.

HOLLAND repeated several times "I don't want the FBI bothering me unless you have a warrant for my arrest."

On April 18, 1967, JN T-3 furnished the following information regarding DONALD HOLLAND, the current owner and operator of Holland's Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi:

DONALD HOLLAND WAS born and raised in rural Franklin County, Mississippi, in the immediate vicinity of his current residence which can be reached by taking Highway 98, east from Meadville, Mississippi, crossing the Homochitto River, and taking a left on the first blacktop road approximately one half mile east of the Homochitto River.

DONALD HOLLAND resides in a small brick ranch house on the left, or west side of the blacktop road, FOIA(b)7 approximately three miles from Highway 98.

He advised that HOLLAND'S father and two or three brothers reside in that immediate vicinity. He advised that ELDEN HESTER resides approximately one half mile past the residence of DONALD HOLLAND, on the same road

advised that he has no information indicating that DONALD HOLLAND or ELDEN HESTER were members of either of the UKA units in Franklin County, Mississippi.

He stated that he has on numerous occasions believed DONALD HOLLAND to be associated with the Klan in some manner due to his close association with BUFORD ASHLEY of Meadville, who he knew to have been a member of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM). i

advised that some four or five years ago DONALD HOLLAND, after working as a carpenter most of his life, by some means talked. Mr. SCAROBOROUGH, who owns | . the local Ford Motor Company, into selling him a feed mill that he owned and operated in Meadville.

He advised that Mr. SCAROBOROUGH apparently financed this transaction for HOLLAND and from information that came to his attention, HOLLAND swindled Mr. SCAROBOROUGH out of \$25,000 during the first year he operated the feed mill.

He stated he has also been advised that Mr. SCAROBOROUGH detected this swindle and rather than prosecuting HOLLAND gave him either four or five years to repay the \$25,000 or be prosecuted.

advised that the entire HOLLAND family has a reputation of being extremely hotheaded and he is reasonably certain that either DONALD HOLLAND or one of his brothers killed a man during the course of a church service at their Holiness Church in their community some eight to ten years ago. He stated the HOLLAND boy, whichever one it was, was not prosecuted as no members of the congregation would testify against him.

WILLIAM M_0 SCARBROUGH* owner, Ford agency, located in Meadville, Mississippi, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and voluntarily furnished the following information:

SCARBROUGH stated that he is well acquainted with DONALD HOLLAND present owner of the Holland Feed Mill located in Meadville, Mississippi. He prefaced his remarks concerning HOLLAND with the observation that HOLLAND comes from a "good family" and that SCARBROUGH had at some time in the past sold HOLLAND the feed mill which he presently owns. SCARBROUGH stated that he initially sold this feed mill to DONALD HOLLAND and his brother JOE HOLLAND.

SCARBROUGH stated that it was necessary for him to dispose of the feed mill after he had suffered several business reversals due to bad management. He advised that because of this he had sold the feed mill operation to DONALD and JOE HOLLAED who bought the entire operation for \$500 down and both agreed to pay SCARBROUGH the remainder (undisclosed) in monthly installments. SCARBROUGH continued by stating that JOE HOLLAND has since left the partnership of his brother, and at the present time the feed mill operation is run entirely by DONALD HOLLAND. He remarked that JOE HOLLAND could not get along with his brother, DONALD, and stated this was the reason for the breakup.

In the Initial contracts drawn for the purchase of the feed mill by DONALD HOLLAND, SCARBROUGH agreed to pay for the concentrates and the corn purchased from out of the state in the Missouri and Tennessee areas to help HOLLAND get started. SCARBROUGH stated that approximately 99 per cent of the corn and concentrates which were purchased by HOLLAND, using SCARBROUGH¹s credit, were intended for the use of SCARBROUGH in connection with the feeding of approximately three-fourths of a million broilers which SCARBROUGH was then maintaining in the outlying area of Meadville, Mississippi. However, SCARBROUGH stated that in connection with his purchase of corn and

concentrates, HOLLAND had asked SCARBROUGH for permission to buy extra corn and concentrates on SCARBROUGH's credit which he could sell to various consumers in the Meadville area. SCARBROUGH stated he granted this permission to HOLAND, however, he advised that he felt he would not be using more than about 100 or 150 pounds of corn from SCARBROUGH's order at any one time during a monthly period. In essence, SCARBROUGH stated that HOLLAND was operating his feed mill business on SCARBROUGH's established credit record and name.

After about a two and one half year period SCARBROUGH stated he and his accountants checked the records of the operation at the feed mill based on bills received from the out of state corn and concentrate suppliers said found that there was a shortage of approximately \$33,000.

SCARBROUGH further stated that after, double checking the figures and arriving at the obvious conclusion that he was being swindled by HOLLAND, he immediately got in touch with HOLLAND'S brother, LAMAR HOLLAND, a local Natchez, Mississippi, builder, and confronted him with the shortage. SCARBROUGH stated that to© has a great deal of respect for LAMAR HOLLAND and that LAMAR HOLLAND, upon being made aware of the scheme of his brother, became angry and related to SCARBROUGH that he should confront his brother with the facts.

SCARBROUGH stated he confronted DONALD HOLLAND with the shortage and HOLLAND initially stated he did not know anything about it. SCARBROUGH then stated that upon checking the records more closely and by asking certain questions in the immediate area of Meadville found that HOLLAND had been operating a "hog operation" on the side and was using corn intended for SCARBROUGH's broilers in his hog operation. Further checks by SCARBROUGH culminated in HOLLAND admitting selling in excess of 30 hogs and "pocketing the profits" at markets in Jackson and throughout the State of Mississippi. When SCARBROUGH asked him for an accounting of this hog operation, HOLLAND refused. SCARBROUGH, initially angered at this deception, threatened HOLLAND with a law suit and with revealing the information to the Internal Revenue Service. However, SCARBROUGH related after consulting with his lawyers, found that the burden of proof rested with him in any type of law suit and because of this decided to settle for \$13,000 total payment for the feed mill operation.

SCARBROUGH described HOLLAND as "one of the biggest

crooks I dealt with" and "I don't doubt anything he'll do." SCARBROUGH related that although he does not have anything on HOLLAND, he certainly doss not doubt anything that he hears about HOLLAND'S character.

In addition, SCARBROUGH stated that HOLLAND has an old Negro man working for him named HUGH D. ROLLINS, who has the reputation in the community of being a good, conscientious worker. SCARBROUGH stated that on several occasions he has tried to induce the Negro to leave the employ of HOLLAND and go to work for the local County Co-Op. ROLLINS is a close friend of SCARBROUGH and has confided to SCARBROUGH that he is afraid to leave the employ of HOLLAND because he is afraid that HOLLAND may do something to him or his family. SCARBROUGH stated that he doubted that ROLLINS would talk to the FBI because ho is too afraid of HOLLAND to do so.

SCARBROUGH stated that he has no doubt that HOLLAND is a member of a Klan group in the Meadville, Mississippi, area and that more than likely he is a member in the "Wentworth Broup." SCARBROUGH also advised that HOLLAND is a close associate of one DOUGLAS LEONARD who farms near the Berryville Community located east of Meadville off Highway 98. He further stated he knew HOLLAND to be a veteran of the Korean Conflict and he believed he served in the U. S. Army.

In conclusion, SCARBROUGH stated that prior to HOLLAND'S purchase of his Pontiac Bonneville which he presently drives, HOLLAND owned a red Chevrolet, 1959 or

I960 model, four-door sedan, and he further recalled that HOLLAND, had purchased this red Chevrolet new from some unknown dealer in the immediate area.

DOUGLAS H, LEONARD, Veterinarian, who lives on Route 3, approximately two miles south of Meadville, Mississippi, was contacted at his residence and he furnished the following information;

He has known ELDEN GENE HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND, both of whom reside about four miles east of him, for a number of years. He and HESTER were schoolmates and both graduated from the Meadville High School in 1947,

LEONARD stated that he has never known HESTER to be in any type of trouble and has never known him to be in any klan group. He stated that HESTER works for the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company in Natchez, Mississippi, and he farms in Franklin County. He stated that HESTER is farming some land in the Hominy Ridge Section which is located north of Bude, Mississippi, which he leased from JAMES WENTWORTH who owns the Dodge Agency in Meadville, He stated that HESTER raises some cattle and he, LEONARD, in the past few months sold to HESTER a registered calf.

LEONARD stated that he had. never heard that DONALD HOLLAND is a member of any klan group, but he would not be surprised if he were in such a group because he is a radical type individual. He stated that HOLLAND runs the feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi.

LEONARD stated that he had no knowledge that HOLLAND or HESTER had any acquaintances in Vidalia - Ferriday, Louisiana. •

He stated he would talk to HESTER and HOLLAND in the immediate future and determine what he could from them regarding this investigation. LEONARD advised he is a candidate for Representative, Position II, Amite Franklin, Wilkinson Counties.

JONES advised that he has known both DONALD HOLLAND and ELDEN HESTER all their lives. He stated that they were approximately the same age, went to the same high school together and were very close friends to his knowledge until they completed high school. He stated that he does not know the degree of their association since they finished high school. He stated that DONALD HOLLAND has three brothers, MONROE, CHARLIE and JOE who, to his knowledge reside in the immediate vicinity of the residence of DONALD HOLLAND. He stated that DONALD HOLLAND is a member of his "Holiness Church," but attends very infrequently. He stated ELDEN HESTER, to his knowledge, does not attend any church in that area.

JONES stated he could furnish no information regarding any klan activity on the part of either ELDEN HESTER or DONALD HOLLAND. He stated that he did not know if there was now or had been an active klan unit in his (the Berryville) community. He stated he had no knowledge of any trouble either HESTER or HOLLAND has been in in Franklin County, Mississippi.

JAMES D. DANIELS, Director of the Head Start Program of Mississippi For Action in Progress (MAP) for Franklin and Claiborne Counties, was contacted on Highway 84 a few miles east of Meadville, Mississippi.

DANIELS was ashed if he knew ELDEN GLEN HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND in view of the fact he resides in their immediate area. DANIELS stated he has known these individuals for the past 20 years and furnished the following information regarding them:

ELDEN GLEN HESTER and his family which consists of his wife, three sons and one daughter, reside across the street from HESTER'S father, OTIS HESTER, whose residences are located on Route 3, Meadville, Mississippi, in the Berryville Community. DANIELS stated HESTER married a girl from Amite County, Mississippi, but he could not recall her maiden name at that time, he stated that HESTER has no sisters and the only brother he had died a number of years ago after losing a leg in some type accident.

He stated he had no information regarding any klan affiliation on the part of HESTER. He stated HESTER did not practice any particular religion that he knew of.

He stated HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND grew up in the same area and had, as youngsters, played together quite frequently. He stated he did not know there was any particularly close association at the present time; however, they only lived a short distance from each other at the present time.

He advised that DONALD HOLLAND married a woman from Rural Amite County whose name he cannot now recall. He advised that HOLLAND has three brothers, MONROE and CHARLES currently residing in the immediate vicinity of his (DANIEL'S and HOLLAND'S) residence and a brother, JOE, whose current residence is unknown to him.

ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (LOUISIANA) (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 25, 1963, that an organization known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) had been organized in the State of Louisiana at Shreveport, Louisiana, in December of 1960.

A second source advised on August 12, 1966, that the OKKKK continues to be active within the State of Louisiana, and that the aims and purposes of this organization continue to be to promote Americanism, the supremacy of the white race, and the furtherance of segregation between the races.

^{JN 157-7510} UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, lnc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a slip in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klaus, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organisation established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa,

Alabama. (.The organisation is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Visard of this organization and was. elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SKELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, North- port, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

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This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the. Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy, and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on August 10, 1966, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organisation existing in the State of

Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not show any advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force end violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the State is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as of August 10, 1966, of 800 to 1000 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. Sam H. Bowers, Jr., Laurel, Mississippi, continues to be the Imperial Wizard.

Mrs. RALEIGH J. (LAVONIA) GLOVER, contacted at her rural residence, Route 3, Kentwood, Louisiana, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents by SA REESIE L. TIMMONS who also advised her that she did not have to furnish any information, that any information she did furnish could be used in a court of law and that she could contact an attorney or anyone else at any time.

Mrs. GLOVER advised that she did not desire to talk with the FBI about anything. She stated that she had furnished the interviewing Agents at Vidalia, Louisiana, some two or three months ago all she knew about the activities of her husband on February 27, 1967.

She advised that if the FBI did not have a warrant for her arrest, she had nothing more to say.

Mrs. GLOVER advised that she was aware that the FBI had searched the residence of her son, "PETE" WATTS, in Vidalia, Louisiana. She stated that she has never seen the painting that the FBI mentioned in connection with the search of her son's residence and is certain that it was never there.

She advised she is also certain that there has never been explosives of any type at the residence of her son.

She advised she has never seen any explosives of any type in the possession of her husband. She advised that there have never been any guns in her residence at Vidalia or Kentwood, Louisiana. She advised that to her knowledge the only gun in their house is a .38 caliber pistol that she keeps for protection as her husband works the "graveyard shift" and is now staying in Vidalia, Louisiana, through the week, returning home on Saturday morning and remaining until late Sunday afternoon.

Mrs. GLOVER advised that she has no reason to believe that her husband has ever been associated with any

Mrs. GLOVER advised that RALEIGH J. GLOVER'S 83 year old mother has resided with them for the past 12 to 13 years. She advised that during the past 2 or three weeks she stayed with a "grand niece" until they got settled in their new residence and she has now moved in with them. She advised that she and her husband's mother are alone at the residence from Sunday night through Saturday morning.

Mrs, GLOVER advised that she was born and raised in the Kentwood, Louisiana area. She stated that her mother's maiden name was BLADES, she married a BURT from the Brookhaven, Mississippi area, and divorced him when she, Mrs. GLOVER, was an infant.

She stated she moved to the Natchez, Mississippi area when she was a teenager, met her first husband and RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER at the same time when both of them were in a "C.C.C. Camp" in Southwest Mississippi. She stated her first husband was killed in World War II and thereafter she married RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

Mrs. GLOVER viewed photographs of the following individuals and made the following comments concerning each:

(2) E. D. MORACE - a close friend of her husband. She has known him four or five years, and his family often visited the GLOVER residence in Vidalia, Louisiana.

DONALD HOLLAND, contacted at the Holland Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi, was advised that he did not have to furnish any information and that any information he did furnish could be used in court. He was further advised that he had the right to consult with an attorney prior to saying anything.

HOLLAND stated "do you have a warrant, if not I got nothing to say." HOLLAND was advised that the interviewing Agents were not interested in discussing the Silver Dollar Group, but possible violations of Federal statutes such as theft from interstate shipment or income tax violations.

HOLLAND again stated he would not talk about anything to the FBI unless the FBI had a warrant for his arrest. He stated he would talk to Internal Revenue Service Agents as they were good men and he had a personal friend by the name of JOHN LOGAN, who was employed by the Internal Revenue Service.

HOLLAND repeated several times "I don't want the FBI bothering me unless you have a warrant for my arrest."

JAMES D. DANIELS, Director of the Head Start Program of Mississippi For Action in Progress (MAP) for Franklin and Claiborne Counties, was contacted on Highway 84 a few miles east of Meadville, Mississippi. DANIELS was asked if he knew ELDEN GLEN HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND in view of the fact he resides in their immediate area. DANIELS stated he has known these individuals for the past 20 years and furnished the following information regarding them:

ELDEN GLEN HESTER and his family which consists of his wife, three sons and one daughter, reside across the street from HESTER's father, OTIS HESTER, whose residences are located on Route 3, Meadville, Mississippi, in the Berryville Community. DANIELS stated HESTER married a girl from Amite County, Mississippi, but he could not recall her maiden name at that time. He stated that HESTER has no sisters and the only brother he had died a number of years ago after losing a leg in some type accident.

He stated he had no information regarding any klan affiliation on the part of HESTER. He stated HESTER did not practice any particular religion that he knew of.

He stated HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND grew up in the same area and had, as youngsters, played together quite frequently. He stated he did not know there was any particularly close association at the present time; however, they only lived a short distance from each other at the present time.

He advised that DONALD HOLLAND married a woman from Rural Amite County whose name he cannot now recall. He advised that HOLLAND has three brothers, MONROE and CHARLES currently residing in the immediate vicivity of his (DANIEL'S and HOLLAND'S) residence and a brother, JOE whose current residence is unknown to him.

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He stated that HOLLAND was a carpenter by trade and worked throughout the Mississippi-Louisiana are until approximately four years ago when he and his brother, JOE, purchased "The Feedmill" in Meadville, Mississippi. He advised JOE HOLLAND sold out to DONALD HOLLAND after approximately one year.

He stated he had no knowledge of any klan activity or association on the part of DONALD HOLLAND.

He stated HOLLAND formerly, regularly attended the Holiness Church in the Berryville Community; however, during the past two or three years it is his understanding that he no longer regularly attends.

DANIELS stated that he knows BUFORD WILLIE ASHLEY who resides in Rural Meadville. He did not know any close association between ASHLEY and ELDEN GLEN HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND. He did not know any klan affiliation which ASHLEY might have.

He stated that on Saturday, April 15, 1967, he was in the City Cafe in Meadville and while there BUFORD ASHLEY asked him if he were still teaching the "pickaninnies."

DANIELS stated he told ASHLEY he was not actually teaching the Negro children, but he was in charge of the local Head Start School. He stated that ASHLEY is employed at International Paper Company in Natchez and he and other men commute to this plant in some type small bus. He stated ASHLEY did not, to his knowledge, drive his own vehicle to and from his place of employment.

DANIELS stated that on Sunday, April 16, 1967, at 11:45 p.m., his telephone rang and when he picked up the receiver there was no one on the other end of the line.

He stated he did not know if ASHLEY had made the call to his residence after their conversation on April 15, 1967.

He stated he is aware that ASHLEY gets off from work at International Paper Company at 11:00 p.m., and and he would arrive in Meadville about the time he received the telephone call. DANIELS pointed out that he had no knowledge as to who might have telephoned his home at that particular time.

MALCOLM M. JONES, Route 3, Box 195, Meadville, Mississippi, located at his rural residence, voluntarily furnished the following information:

JONES advised that he has known both DONALD HOLLAND and ELDEN HESTER all their lives. He stated that they were approximately the same age, went to the same high school together and were very close friends to his knowledge until they completed high school. He stated that he does not know the degree of their association since they finished high school. He stated that DONALD HOLLAND has three brothers, MONROE, CHARLIE and JOE who, to his knowledge, reside in the immediate vicinity of the residence of DONALD HOLLAND. He stated that DONALD HOLLAND is a member of his "Holiness Church," but attends very infrequently. He stated ELDEN HESTER, to his knowledge, does not attend any church in that area.

JONES stated he could furnish no information regarding any klan activity on the part of either ELDEN HESTER or DONALD HOLLAND. He stated that he did not know if there was now or had been an active klan unit in his (the Berryville) community. He stated he had no knowledge of any trouble either HESTER or HOLLAND has been in in Franklin County, Mississippi.

DOUGLAS H. LEONARD, Veterinarian, who lives on Route 3, approximately two miles south of Meadville, Mississippi, was contacted at his residence and he furnished the following information:

He has known ELDEN GENE HESTER and DONALD HOLLAND, both of whom reside about four miles east of him, for a number of years. He and HESTER were schoolmates and both graduated from the Meadville High School in 1947.

LEONARD stated that he has never known HESTER to be in any type of trouble and has never known him to be in any klan group. He stated that HESTER works for the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company in Natchez, Mississippi, and he farms in Franklin County. He stated that HESTER is farming some land in the Hominy Ridge Section which is located north of Bude, Mississippi, which he leased from JAMES WENTWORTH who owns the Dodge Agency in Meadville. He stated that HESTER raises some cattle and he, LEONARD, in the past few months sold to HESTER a registered calf.

LEONARD stated that he had never heard that DONALD HOLLAND is a member of any klan group, but he would not be surprised if he were in such a group because he is a radical type individual. He stated that HOLLAND runs the feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi.

LEONARD stated that he had no knowledge that HOLLAND or HESTER had any acquaintances in Vidalia - Ferriday. Louisiana.

He stated he would talk to HESTER and HOLLAND in the immediate future and determine what he could, from them regarding this investigation. LEONARD advised he is a candidate for Representative Position II, Amite Franklin, Wilkinson Counties.

DONALD HOLLAND was contacted at the Holland Feed Mill, Meadvilie, Mississippi, and was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent. HOLLAND was further advised that he did not have to make any statement and that any statement he made could be used in a court of law. He was advised that he had the right to consult an attorney or anyone else prior to making any statement.

HOLLAND stated "me and my friends figured out who is in the Silver Dollar Group, it is niggers and FBI Agents." HOLLAND declined to identify his friends who helped him with his "figuring", stated that he did not want another FBI Agent in his place of business wasting his time unless they had a warrant for his arrest or a subpoena for him.

HOLLAND refused to answer any questions or reply to any comments made by the interviewing Agent.

A green Chevrolet pickup truck bearing the inscription Holland's Feed Mills on the door was observed parked in front of HOLLAND'S place of business. The license number of the vehicle was observed to be 1967 Mississippi F/6 32296.

WILLIAM M. SCARBROUGH, owner. Ford agency, located in Meadville, Mississppi, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and voluntarily furnished the following information:

SCARBROUGH stated that he is well acquainted with DONALD HOLLAND, present owner of the Holland Feed Mill located in Meadville, Mississippi. He prefaced his remarks concerning HOLLAND with the observation that HOLLAND comes from a "good family" and that SCARBROUGH had at some time in the past sold HOLLAND the feed mill which he presently owns. SCARBROUGH stated that he initially sold this feed mill to DONALD HOLLAND and his brother JOE HOLLAND.

SCARBROUGH stated that it was necessary for him to dispose of the feed mill after he had suffered several business reversals due to bad management. He advised that because of this he had sold the feed mill operation to DONALD and JOE HOLLAND who bought the entire operation for \$500 down and both agreed to pay SCARBROUGH the remainder (undisclosed) in monthly installments. SCARBROUGH continued by stating that JOE HOLLAND has since left the partnership of his brother and at the present time the feed mill operation is run entirely by DONALD HOLLAND. He remarked that JOE HOLLAND could not get along with his brother, DONALD, and stated this was the reason for the breakup.

In the initial contracts drawn for the purchase of the feed mill by DONALD HOLLAND, SCARBROUGH agreed to pay for the concentrates and the corn purchased from out of the state in the Missouri and Tennessee areas to help HOLLAND get started. SCARBROUGH stated that approximately 99 per cent of the corn and concentrates which were purchased by HOLLAND, using SCARBROUGH'S credit, were intended for the use of SCARBROUGH in connection with the feeding of approximately three-fourths of a million broilers which SCARBROUGH was then maintaining in the outlying area of Meadville, Mississippi. However, SCARBROUGH stated that in connection with his purchase of corn and

concentrates, HOLLAND had asked SCARBROUGH for permission to buy extra corn and concentrates on SCARBROUGH's credit which he could sell to various consumers in the Meadville area. SCARBROUGH stated he granted this permission to HOLLAND, however, he advised that he felt he would not be using more than about 100 or 150 pounds of corn from SCARBROUGH's order at any one time during a monthly period. In essence, SCARBROUGH stated that HOLLAND was operating his feed mill business on SCARBROUGH's established credit record and name. After about a two and one half year period SCARBROUGH stated he and his accountants checked the records of the operation at the feed mill based on bills received from the out of state corn and concentrate suppliers and found that there was a shortage of approximately \$33,000.

SCARBROUGH further stated that after double checking the figures and arriving at the obvious conclusion that he was being swindled by HOLLAND, he immediately got in touch with HOLLAND'S brother, LAMAR HOLLAND, a local Natchez, Mississippi, builder, and confronted him with the shortage. SCARBROUGH stated that he has a great deal of respect for LAMAR HOLLAND and that LAMAR HOLLAND, upon being made aware of the scheme of his brother, became angry and related to SCARBROUGH that he should confront his brother with the facts.

SCARBROUGH stated he confronted DONALD HOLLAND with the shortage and HOLLAND initially stated he did not know anything about it. SCARBROUGH then stated that upon checking the records more closely and by asking certain questions in the immediate area of Meadville found that HOLLAND had been operating a "hog operation" on the side and was using corn intended for SCARBROUGH'S broilers in his hog operation. Further checks by SCARBROUGH culminated in HOLLAND admitting selling in excess of 30 hogs and "pocketing the profits" at markets in Jackson and throughout the State of Mississippi. When SCARBROUGH asked him for an accounting of this hog operation, HOLLAND refused. SCARBROUGH initially angered at this deception, threatened HOLLAND with a law suit and with revealing the information to the Internal Revenue Service. However, SCARBROUGH related after consulting with his lawyers, found that the burden of proof rested with him in any type of law suit and because of this decided to settle for \$13,000 total payment for the feed mill operation.

SCARBROUGH described HOLLAND as "one of the biggest crooks I dealt with and "I don't doubt anything he'll do." SCARBROUGH related that although he does not have anything on HOLLAND, he certainly does not doubt anything that he hears about HOLLAND's character.

In addition, SCARBROUGH stated that HOLLAND has an old Negro man working for him named HUGH D. ROLLINS, who has the reputation in the community of being a good, conscientious worker. SCARBROUGH stated that on several occasions he has tried to induce the Negro to leave the employ of HOLLAND and go to work for the local County Co-Op. ROLLINS is a close friend of SCARBROUGH and has confided to SCARBROUGH that he is afraid to **leave the** employ of HOLLAND because he is afraid that **HOLLAND** may do something to him or his family. SCARBROUGH stated that he doubted that ROLLINS would talk to **the FBI because he** is too afraid of HOLLAND to do so.

SCARBROUGH stated that he has no doubt that HOLLAND is a member of a Klan group in the Meadville, Mississippi, area and that more than likely he is a member in the "Wentworth Broup." SCARBROUGH also advised that HOLLAND is a close associate of one DOUGLAS LEONARD who farms near the Berryville Community located east of Meadville off Highway 98. He further stated he knew HOLLAND to be a veteran of the Korean Conflict and he believed he served in the U. S. Army.

In conclusion, SCARBROUGH stated that prior to HOLLAND'S purchase of his Pontiac Bonneville which he presently drives, HOLLAND owned a red Chevrolet, 1959 or 1960 model, four-door sedan, and he further recalled that HOLLAND, had purchased this red Chevrolet new from some unknown dealer in the immediate OPTIONAL FORM NO. 10

DONALD HOLLAND was contacted at his feed mill in Meadville, Mississippi, and was advised of the identity of **the** interviewing Agent who also advised him that he did not **have to** furnish any information and that any information he did furnish could be used in a court of law. He was advised **that he** could contact an attorney or anyone else at any time.

HOLLAND advised that he would talk to one FBI Agent, but under no circumstances would he willingly converse with two.

HOLLAND advised he is the owner and operator of Holland's Feed Mill, Meadville, Mississippi, and has resided in Franklin County, Mississippi, most of his life.

HOLLAND advised that he is not now and has never been a member of any Elan type organisation in Franklin County or elsewhere. He stated that he has heard of the "Silver Dollar Group, but would not state where, when, or from whom he heard of this organization. He did state that he knew it to be an organization in "this part of Mississippi and part of Louisiana."

When asked if he had been a member or was a member of the Silver Dollar Group, HOLLAND stated "I won't answer that."

HOLLAND advised that on the night of February 20, 1967, he and a friend of his from Natchez, Mississippi, drove to the Magnolia Restaurant in Ferriday, Louisiana, where his friend made several telephone calls in an effort to locate an individual who owned a dog that he was interested in. HOLLAND would not identify the friend with whom he drove to Ferriday that night. He stated he drank a cup of coffee or two while his friend made the telephone calls and does not recall with whom he may have conversed while his friend made the telephone calls.

HOLLAND advised he does not know an individual by the name of R. J. (RED) GLOVER of Vidalia, Louisiana. He

does not know SONNY TAYLOR, T. L. TORGERSEN or JAMES (RED) LEE. HOLLAND stated he has attended many fish fries throughout the State of Louisiana and may have attended a fish fry on June 26, 1965, but does not believe he attended one at the residence of JAMES LEE, since he does not know JAMES LEE.

HOLLAND advised that he might further discuss the Silver Dollar Group with the interviewing Agent tomorrow or the next day or when he wanted to. He stated that when he wanted to talk to the Agent he would contact the FBI and that he did not want the FBI to contact him again.
