As noted in relet, ROBERT WARREN, Chief of Police, Ferriday, La., advised on 12/2/71 that subject still maintains a residence at 322 Iowa Street in Ferriday, but does not live there. WARREN also stated that subject apparently still works at the International Paper Company in Natchez, Miss. In addition, WARREN said he had not seen SCARBOROUGH in the Ferriday area for many months.

The most recent informant information received relative to subject was from [redacted] in May of 1971, who advised that on 5/24/71 "Chicken Foot" ROBERTSON got a coded message from "RED" GLOVER, which allegedly meant for subject to get in touch with RED GLOVER. Also, subject was overheard to say, at the Barbecue Pit, "It is time for the bells to ring," allegedly meaning that the Silver Dollar Group is supposed to respond to a call for help from RED GLOVER.

Previous to this subject was [redacted] and to be inactive in the Silver Dollar Group and no longer a member of the Minute-men. Still previous to this [redacted] reported that the Concordia Unit of the klan voted to eject SCARBOROUGH as Exalted Cyclops.

5/25/71

On 5/21/71 RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, DON WILKINSON, EDNA PENNINGTON, JEWEL LEE BURT, "CHICKEN FOOT" ROBINSON, and others were seen meeting at Bob's Eats, Highway 61 North, Natchez, Mississippi. During the conversation RED GLOVER was overheard to tell the group that ADRIAN LEE from Natchez and GORDON VINES from Centreville, Miss., had met with the sheriff of Wilkinson County, Miss., and his girl friend, EDNA PENNINGTON, had put up the money that resulted in his bond. DON WILKINSON was overheard to ask GLOVER if he wanted him (WILKINSON) to mention his trouble at the state meeting that he was planning on going to, but GLOVER stated he did not want any action taken at this time.

GLOVER said that he expected the old Silver Dollar Group to take some type of action but did not make any type of statement as to what this action might be. WILKINSON mentioned to GLOVER that he had been approached by BUD GETER, Deputy Sheriff of Wilkinson County, and had been told to pass the word to GLOVER that he (GETER) could possibly get the burglary charges dismissed against him if he would return the items that were stolen. GLOVER then appeared to become angry and said that he knew too much about BUD GETER and could get him in trouble concerning that WALKER Negro that was killed in Wilkinson County, because GETER was E.C. of the unit at that time.

GLOVER also said that he was planning to have some klan material printed on H. B. MC CRAW, the sheriff of Wilkinson County, and put out.

On 5/22/71 JEWEL LEE BURT and DON WILKINSON were observed to take some axes, lanterns, a television set, and other items from the residence of DON WILKINSON and drive to the residence of "CHICKEN FOOT" ROBERTSON. At that time

JEWEL LEE BURT took the items and threw them into a pond out behind ROBERTSON's house.

On 5/22/71 DON WILKINSON, JEWEL LEE BURT, and KENNETH "PETE" ROBERTSON, E.C. of Liberty, Mississippi, Unit #2, went to the state meeting in Newton, Mississippi. The following individuals are a partial list of those persons recognized at the meeting:

C. D. FREEMAN
JAMES JACKSON
A. C. JACKSON
GEORGE BALLARD from Brookhaven, Miss.
(FNU) GRIFFIN from McComb, Miss.

It is noted that all of the cars were backed in to the old house and that one pickup showed up at the vicinity with no license plate whatsoever.

Prior to the meeting KENNETH ROBERTSON was overheard telling some individuals that GEORGE BALLARD is the one who "put the screws" to JOHN BORSKI's chances for grand dragon of the UKA and subsequently he had no use for him.

The meeting commenced at approximately 9:00 PM, with approximately 30 men, representing approximately 15 units, being present. Approximately half of the units called out were not represented. A partial listing of those represented is as follows:

Olive Branch, Mississippi
Newton, Mississippi
Natchez 1 & 2, Mississippi
Columbus, Mississippi
Greenville, Miss.
Vicksburg, Miss.
Gloster, Miss.
Liberty, Miss.

It is noted that the charter for the Newton County organization UKA #748 or #758 was issued by E. L. MC DANIEL in 1966.

During the course of the meeting all members were urged to attend the upcoming meeting at Lake, Miss., where SHELTON is supposed to attend. This rally is to be held on 5/29/71, and all the members were urged to bring their robes. FONDREN mentioned that ROBERT SHELTON was trying to get a polygraph of Mississippi and mentioned that he had supposedly obtained polygraphs for other states.

GEORGE BALLARD was then called to the floor by FONDREN and explained that a white man who is a 55 percent owner of the Perkins Hardware in Brookhaven, Miss., had recently sold eighty acres to a Negro man from Chicago. It was stated by BALLARD that the man had purchased the eighty acres through the Credit Union and the Klan was concerned because they thought the property was for the use of black militants. BALLARD indicated that he had contacted the man and determined that the man had accepted \$14,000 for the property and had no information that the man was involved in any militant activities.

BALLARD then said that another white male who owns 35 percent of the Perkins Hardware talked to an unknown Klansman from Brookhaven, Miss., who threatened to drain his 100 acre man-made lake if they did not make the Negro man give back the land. The man answered that he would shoot anyone attempting to drain his lake, but the lake was drained and almost washed out Highway 84.

The meeting ended with FONDREN putting out a statement that he wished for everyone to support JIMMY SWAN in the upcoming Governor's election and the final decision was that each unit was to help insofar as it was possible.

On 5/23/71, JEWEL LEE BURT and CHICKEN FOOT ROBERTSON were overheard talking at the Barbecue Pit. At that time JEWEL LEE BURT was upset about the information that the "Natchez Democrat" had recently published about RALEIGH GLOVER. BURT was overheard saying that he would like to go talk to the men at the "Natchez Democrat", but they decided to wait because they did not know what RED GLOVER had in mind. At that time TOMMY LOVE was overheard talking to some individuals and he mentioned that C. B. TODD had recently been fired from his job because he was responsible for "shipping some bad oil" to some company which was instrumental in destroying a refinery.

On 5/24/71, CHICKEN FOOT ROBERTSON obtained a message from RED GLOVER which said "call the one who made the little children sad". "He is ready for the bell to ring and cheer them up". This allegedly is a message to JAMES SCARBOROUGH to get in touch with RED GLOVER.

CHICKEN FOOT ROBERTSON and JEWEL LEE BURT were overheard talking and it seemed they were upset over BILL RILEY charging RED GLOVER \$500 to represent him.

They decided not to conduct any type of contact as far as RILEY is concerned until they found out what RED GLOVER had in mind.

CHICKEN FOOT ROBERTSON was overheard talking to DON WILKINSON and ROBERTSON mentioned that he wanted a new number for a secret secret member. No one is to know who this person is and WILKINSON was overheard telling him that he could have 00301. ROBERTSON mentioned that he was involved with a collection being taken up for GLOVER out at the tire plant.

JAMES SCARBOROUGH was overheard talking at the Barbecue Pit and mentioned something to the effect "it is time for the

bells to ring". This allegedly means that the Silver Dollar Group is supposed to respond to a call for help from one of its membership, RED GLOVER.

On 5/25/71, JAMES FREDRICK "RED" LEE, is alleged to have received a message for RED GLOVER which said "the bad little children have been at my door; they wanted the candy that is never more." "If they eat that candy they will have to swim to and fro".

On 5/25/71, A. C. JACKSON was overheard talking to DON WILKERSON at the Barbecue Pit. At that time JACKSON mentioned that he had a man by the name of LEWIS who had access to machine guns. He stated that he believed LEWIS could get a case of M-16.23 caliber weapons which are being used in Viet Nam and could also obtain a grease gun or perhaps several grease guns.

JACKSON mentioned that (FNU) GRIFFIN from McComb, Miss., had told him at the state meeting that a gunsmith, name unknown, who lives between Newton and Lawrence, Miss., but has a small gunsmith sign on his mailbox can buy and sell all types of weapons and is agreeable to selling all types of weapons to Klansmen.

MINUTEMEN ACTIVITIES

There have been no meetings of Unit 1733 of the Minutemen in Natchez, Miss., or Vidalia, La., during the past month. DAVID KENNEDY, C. B. TODD, TOMMY LOVE have not been observed talking to the network commander concerning Minutemen activities during the preceding month.

KLAN UNIT
CONCORDIA PARISH, LA.

During a conversation at Woolco located in Natchez, Miss., on or about 8/4/70, JOHN KAHL was observed talking to DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON. KAHL had gone under the name of JOHN COMBS but WILKINSON saw a letter in his pocket addressed to JOHN KAHL and after asking him about it, KAHL admitted that was indeed his last name.

At a later time, STEVE O'QUINN and DON WILKINSON were overheard talking at the Barbeque Pit located on Highway 61 north, Natchez, Miss., and at that time, WILKINSON asked O'QUINN if KAHL wanted the job as the EC of the Unit. O'QUINN advised that he believed that he did and thought he would make a good one. It is noted that JEWEL LEE BURT was approached by REGGIE CARTER and CHARLES DAVIDSON trying to get them to affiliate with the Unit.

On 8/7/70, a meeting was held on the levee in Concordia Parish, La. The following were in attendance:

DON WILKINSON
C. B. TODD
TOMMY LOVE
JOHN KAHL
STEVE O'QUINN
DAVID KENNEDY
JERALD BLANEY
WESLEY BLANEY
JEWEL LEE BURT

It is noted that all of the individuals were dressed in their robes and at that time took in as a new member, BILL HINSON, allegedly the manager of the Woolco Department Store in Natchez, Miss. J. D. MONTGOMERY was not taken in inasmuch as members of the unit claimed that "the Feds had come to see him at home."

RED GLOVER was not in attendance and had previously contacted members of the unit stating that he had been involved in a wreck at Roxie, Miss., and some man had run into the side of his car. Further, it is noted that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had already left for Morgan City, La., where he had bought into a business there.

On 8/8/70, a barbeque was held at (FNU) TEMPLE's house in Vidalia, La., and it is noted the following individuals were present:

BILL DELANEY
CHARLES SMITH
SONNY TAYLOR
(FNU) SMITH (employed at Bluff City Motors)
JAMES F. LEE
KENNETH NORMAN HEAD
DONALD WILKINSON
GERALD BLANEY
BUD SPINKS and three others who identities were unknown

RED GLOVER was not in attendance but was later seen that night drinking at the Barbeque Pit with EDNA PENNINGTON.

On 8/10/70, RED GLOVER and DON WILKINSON were overheard discussing with KENNETH NORMAN HEAD the moving of some explosives from someplace in Ferriday, La. HEAD made the statement that "too many people knew about it" but no definite plans were made.

On 8/9/70, DON WILKINSON, JEWEL LEE BURT, STEVE O'QUINN, JOHN KAHL met at the Barbeque Pit located on Highway 61 and discussed the bringing in of more individuals. O'QUINN

indicated that it might be best to rent a room at the Holiday Inn to bring the men in and said that he could probably provide two or three more men. It was discussed the possibility of burning crosses but it was decided not to do it and not to put out any literature. It was also discussed the support of the unit by the UKA, which will be only by money. The terms were that each man would pay \$2 per month and a charter could be issued for 15 members from Miss., and 25 members from La. It was decided to have another meeting on 8/14/70, to put it to a vote and further a UKA man was to meet with the leaders of the unit.

On 8/21/70, a meeting was held on the levee in Concordia Parish, La. JOHN KAHL presides as EC and the following individuals were in attendance:

During the course of the conversation during the meeting, the EC read a letter received from W. J. KIDD wherein KIDD wants to meet with the unit to discuss the benefits of coming into the UKA. He wants to meet with the officials either on Tuesday or Thursday but no definite decision was reached. It is noted that BILL BLANEY did not want to go into the UKA but later agreed. It is noted that the letter had a business card in it with the following information on it:

On 8/24/70, JOHN KAHL and STEVE O'QUINN were observed talking to DON WILKINSON at Woolco located Natchez, Miss.

The conversation indicated that a man that they had wanted to come in had decided not to and did not want any part of the Klan unit. They further stated that they thought the FBI was checking up on some of them and further that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had indicated to them that he was strictly against the affiliation with the UKA.

On 8/31/70, RED CLOVER was overheard talking with several individuals and at that time indicated that "the Feds were really bothering him." He indicated also during the conversation that he is presently residing at Route 1, Kentwood, La., while Armstrong Tire and Rubber is on strike.

KENNETH PENNINGTON has been approached to join the unit and PENNINGTON allegedly indicated that he would like to do so.

A meeting was held of the Klan unit on 6/12/70 at the residence of BILL RILEY, an attorney in Natchez, Miss. Present during this meeting were several individuals among which were RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and DONALD WILKINSON. During the course of the meeting, BILL RILEY asked that the Klan pass several rumors in and around the Natchez, Miss., area to the effect that FRED BIERGER was holding back by the Negro elements in Adams County, Miss., and would not be sympathetic toward the problems of any white men.

After that meeting adjourned the Klan group then retired to the residence of KENNETH NORMAN HEAD at Vidalia, Louisiana, where KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was elected as EC of the unit after the group voted to eject JAMES SCARBOROUGH. Present during this meeting were KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, STEVE O'QUINN, DONALD WILKINSON and BILL BLANEY. The main topic of conversation was the upcoming election in Adams County for Circuit Judge, but RED GLOVER, who came somewhat later to the meeting and KENNETH NORMAN HEAD were talking about bringing in a man named BROWN, who owns an auto salvage company in Vidalia, Louisiana.

No meeting was held of the unit on 6/19/70. Most of the members of the unit assisted in the distribution of political pamphlets in and around the Natchez, Miss., area against FRED BERGER.

STEVE O'QUINN was overheard to tell several individuals that he had requested from his boss at Woolco in Natchez, Miss., that he would like to have every Friday evening off. He told his boss that he needed this time to attend Reserve meetings.

JOHN COMBS who works in the Tire Department at Woolco was seen talking to [redacted] a Natchez Police Department Detective who appeared to be drunk. COMBS later told several persons that [redacted] came in and wanted some "dirty tapes".

On 6/28/70, several individuals were sitting at the Barbecue Pit located on Highway 61, Natchez, Miss., and JAMES HARPER asked the group if they knew where RED GLOVER was. He stated that he had done something and some unnamed boy had seen him and he had been threatened by this boy to divulge the information. None of the group indicated that they had seen RED GLOVER. They all thought he was at his farm in Kentwood, Louisiana.

A meeting was held on Friday, 6/26/70, in front of the Dixie Lanes, located in Concordia Parish, Louisiana. Present during this meeting were the following individuals:

RED GLOVER was not there inasmuch as he was at Kentwood, Louisiana. During the course of the meeting, KENNETH HEAD indicated that he was upset because of a subpoena he had received from a Fire Marshal in Concordia Parish, Louisiana. He stated that the Fire Marshal told him that they had "missed him this time but they would put an informant in his group and catch him next time". HEAD made a statement to the effect that "the niggers could burn down the whole damn city and the klan would get the blame". The meeting also discussed the guns for sale at Magnolia Tire Company in Natchez, Miss. BILL BLANEY asked ROBERT MYRICK if the guns were convertible to a machine gun and MYRICK indicated that they could be altered but he did not think that it would be an easy job. MYRICK indicated that he looked at the guns and he thought "they were a piece of junk". A meeting of the Klan unit was held on 7/3/70, at the Barbecue Pit, Natchez, Miss., at approximately 9:00 P.M., but the only two individuals who were there were DON WILKINSON and JOHN BOSTICK. Inasmuch as there were no other members in attendance, the meeting was adjourned.

On 7/1/70, DON WILKINSON was overheard to discuss with others in the group that he had received a telephone call from RED GLOVER from Kentwood, Louisiana, where GLOVER is staying on his farm. GLOVER told WILKINSON after WILKINSON had told him that JAMES HARPER was looking for him that he had something on JAMES HARPER and to help him out in any way he could.

Present and in attendance were STEVE O'QUINN, employee of Woolco in Natchez, Miss.; DAVID KENNEDY, living at Camelot Apts, Natchez, Miss.; JOHN COMBS, employee of Woolco, Natchez, Miss.; C. B. TODD; CHARLES MULLINS; RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER; JAMES SCARBOROUGH and DONALD H. WILKINSON. THOMAS YOUNG was not present and has not been in attendance at any meetings of the unit since he was inducted into the organization and elected to an office. Prior to the meeting, JAMES SCARBOROUGH was seen shooting into the lake and had been heavily drinking. He was subsequently elected the EC of the Unit after the group decided to oust PAUL TOLBERT because he had not been at any of the recent meetings. A meeting was set for the forthcoming Friday night, 5/22/70.

On 5/22/70, a meeting was held on the levee near Lake Concordia in Concordia Parish, La., and present in attendance were the following:

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had a pencil written copy of a pamphlet that he wanted distributed in the Concordia Parish, La. region. RALEIGH GLOVER in connection with KENNETH NORMAN HEAD mentioned that there was a white man in Harrisonburg, La., who had accepted money from a church up there for assistance for his family but had gambled and drank the money up and GLOVER and HEAD wanted to have a group of men call on him. GLOVER alleged that the men were "staked out" and HEAD, GLOVER, BILL BLANEY, DAVID KENNEDY, and JOHN COMBS, allegedly went to Harrisonburg to locate the man.

On 6/5/70, the unit met on the levee near the end of Lake Concordia in Concordia Parish, La., and present during this meeting were the following individuals:

During the course of the conversation RED GLOVER had mentioned that he thought it would be a good idea if no one carried any guns during the putting out of the pamphlet. That way if they were stopped, all they could be charged with would be littering. It is noted that GLOVER has not had the M-1 carbine in his possession that fires full automatic since the night he showed it to JAMES HARPER and fired it on the levee in Concordia Parish. During the meeting, JOHN MYRICK made the statement that he had possession of the Russian Boat gun and believed that he could fix it so that it would shoot the 7.63 ammunition.

During this meeting, BILL BLANEY asked KENNETH NORMAN HEAD about a possible list of Deacons for Defense and Justice in the Ferriday-Vidalia, La. area. BLANEY wanted to take the list and start killing off the men. He mentioned specifically a principal of a high school or

junior high school in the Concordia Parish area either Vidalia or Ferriday. However, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER talked him out of this and stated that they wanted to get in good with the influential people in the area before they took any strong action.

Prior to the meeting, DON WILKINSON and KENNETH HEAD were overheard talking about JAMES SCARBOROUGH. Both of them stated that they were unhappy with the fact that SCARBOROUGH had been elected EC because he was not dependable and "blew hot and cold depending on whether he was drunk or not." A meeting was scheduled to be held on 6/12/70. //

CITIZENS OF CONCORDIA PARISH!

Make them do! If they call this litter, then litter they'll get! Our cause is too great to let trifles like this interfere.

You people of Concordia parish, like the rest of the country, don't realize that the problem you face at this time stems from the original communist plot to take over this country. You're at the half-way mark of complete communist takeover! Our next generation completes their goal! They've got your children! When your children finish their so called education, with the environment their in and the books that they study, then the communist will take over completely, as they said they would, "without firing a shot." Your children will be so confused, so brainwashed, so de-moralized, that they'll be led to do any task that these communists dogs force them to do. They'll know no better.

To fight this battle will take all of the people. In our parish we have several private school systems. In God's name, meet together and unite these systems under one system, make it strong! Let all white men who care participate. If you don't unite and fight as one body, you'll die one by one. If you are white, if you are an American, if you are a man, then join and unite! During the course of the meeting, PAUL TOLBERT and RED GLOVER indicated that they wanted to discuss the formation of a new Klan unit and were to consider whether they wanted to become part of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan or the UKA. The EC of the unit elected by the group was PAUL TOLBERT. RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER was elected the Investigator and THOMAS YOUNG was elected the secretary.

During the meeting, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was overheard to tell several individuals that he had recently been stopped by Louisiana State Trooper by the last name of BLUNSCHI who had caught him and one of the BLANEY boys putting out literature. He stated that he had to pay a fine for littering but did not indicate that he wanted to take any action against BLUNSCHI.

CHARLES D. SMITH was there with several items of UKA material which he gave to several individuals there. He indicated that it was his desire to become affiliated with the UKA.

On 4/18/70, another meeting was held on the levee near the Hunting Club inasmuch as there was approximately five feet of water over the road and no one could get into the club. During this meeting, PAUL TOLBERT called the meeting to order and the following individuals were present:

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD indicated that he had six men who he wanted to bring into membership and implied that one of them was his son-in-law. The initiation fee for new members will be \$10 plus a \$5 a month membership dues and the old Klan members will pay only the \$5 per month dues. During the course of the conversation, RED GLOVER had a M-1 carbine which had been changed to be an M-2 carbine and several other of the individuals around were armed. The meeting broke up at approximately 9:00 p.m.

MINUTEMEN

DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON was talking to RED GLOVER at the Barbeque Pit on North Highway 61 at Natchez, Miss.,

and indicated to RED GLOVER that he had written a letter to the Minutemen and advised them that he will begin to send dues into them when they begin to correspond with him. He stated that he has not heard from them since the first part of March other than the material that was sent to him and further indicated that he intends to keep his unit intact. GLOVER discussed with him trying to find a clip for a "grease gun" stating that he knew where one was or where he could get a hold of one.

During the course of the meeting on the levee in Concordia Parish, La., KENNETH NORMAN HEAD mentioned that he knew that there was a Minutemen organization in the Ferriday, La.-Adams County, Miss. area but he felt it had been largely ineffectual. He indicated that he thought that the Minutemen ought to work closely with the Klan unit that is forming and DONALD WILKINSON who is the Network Commander for the Minutemen indicated that he would be glad to work closely with any Klansman or Klan unit that wanted to.

BREAK THROUGH NOW

The color wall is breaking, the doors of the schools have been opened. This will open the doors of the churches, the home, the heart and then into the brotherhood of all men.

You can do something now to help crumble and break the color wall. The Berlin wall is still there. The iron curtain is still there, but the color wall here in America is crumbling down.

Instruct your children in the school to take the initiative in being friendly to Negro children, to make friends, to be a friend. If your child is rebuked by another student instruct your child to be forgiving and loving. Do not allow bigotry and racism to flare up within you if your child is abused by one of another race. Today this must be specially accepted, and particularly so if a colored child is abusing a white child because they have been deprived of this for so long.

Do not be worried or concerned about private schools; your child would only receive a solid education. In an integrated public school your child will not only receive an education, but his whole outlook on life will be broadened as they intermingle with another race. Instruct your daughters to always turn the other cheek when slapped by a colored girl or pinched by a colored boy.

Do not put all the responsibility on your child of socializing with the colored people. Do your part as parents by following the following suggestions: Give the colored people a lift to and from the market and have them sit in front with you. Invite their children to visit and play with yours. Plan parties, picnics, and other social gatherings together. Invite the Negro neighbors to drop in for coffee or tea, and chat awhile. Insist on them joining your clubs and taking active parts in civic affairs. Invite them to go with you to your churches and become members. Carry them to other mass meetings that you attend.

Patronize Negro gas stations, dry cleaning establishments, barber shops, dentist and other establishments.

Always invite and urge Negroes to "sit up front" at meetings. Whenever possible include Negroes on civic and social committees. You probably have noticed how effective this is in your own city.

Socialize with the Negroes in a natural manner, never provocative, where ever possible. Sit by them and strike up a conversation so they will feel at ease.

By putting in practice these suggestions we will build for ourselves and the future generation a richer and fuller life for they will not face the problem of the color line, for there will only be one color.

Do not think of the breaking down, but building together. How, for the first time in over 100 years one of our state Senators, and other state officials and the majority of the local public school officials are advocating the support of public schools which will surely create this togetherness and one color.

If you approve these ideas and want to see them work, contact your local public school board and let them know that you are behind them 100 percent, and that you are sending your child fully instructed.

HERMAN EUGENE CARVER and H. S. RIECKE, JR. are unknown to Unit 1733 of the Minutemen. DONNIE CRAFT maintains his old employment and does not have any contact with any old Klan or Minutemen members.

During a conversation between DON WILKINSON, RED GLOVER, JULIE BURT and TINY LEWIS at the Bar-B-Que Pit the statement was made that GORDON VINES and GORDON JETER, both of Woodville, Miss. are allegedly "pretty good men". VINES was recently injured in a hunting accident, when a friend with whom he was hunting accidentally shot him in the shoulder but he has apparently recovered from any and all results of that shooting. JETER, who is better known as DUB works as a welder at the International Paper Company, full time, and is also a constable at the Wilkinson County Sheriff's Office at Woodville, Miss.

On 11/6/69, RED GLOVER called DON WILKINSON and made arrangements to pick up the dynamite that WILKINSON had. He went to the Bar-B-Que Pit and picked up the dynamite and then immediately left, allegedly en route to the Armstrong Tire Plant to go to work. The next day he gave some primer cord and dynamite fuse to WILKINSON to transfer to JIMMY SCARBOROUGH inasmuch as SCARBOROUGH had some sort of an idea to mount the primer cord on an arrow to test to see that when the arrow was shot if it would explode upon impact.

During the conversation, WILKINSON was overheard to say to GLOVER that he thought it would "throw the Feds off to have the boys across the river to do the printing of the next pamphlet", and GLOVER indicated that he thought that this would be a good idea. GLOVER brought up the Silver Dollar Group (SDG) and said that a man who was unnamed holds a

special dollar and is the head man of the outfit. GLOVER said that he wanted WILKINSON to swap silver dollars with him and then he was to instruct WILKINSON to take his, GLOVER'S, silver dollar and show it to a particular individual. However, he did not elaborate and nothing further was said about this matter. GLOVER was also overheard to say to WILKINSON that he wanted WILKINSON to "meet some people who really counted in the future" and also stated that these people knew where some primer cord was buried about 100 miles from here. GLOVER said that there were several people who got silver dollars at the beginning of the organization who did not deserve it and it does not really mean anything. He said particularly JACK SEALE, BUCK HORTON, and REGGIE CARTER have one, but they are really not members.

On 11/11/69, JOHN BARBER made some statements to the effect "old man Templeton" is writing a letter to the Natchez Democrat in answer to certain allegations that were made against him in a recent editorial. He is also allegedly writing another letter for distribution by the Minutemen and the Klan.

JOHN BOSTICK and his wife are back together and BOSTICK is again attempting to work some overtime in order to catch up on his back bills.

The local ex-Klan members and Minutemen group all have discussed the private school situation and indicate that they do want private schools, but the consensus seems to be that none of them want to pay for it. They all want the State of Miss. to do something rather than to pay for any schooling out of their own pockets.

JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH continues to reside at 322 Iowa Street, Ferriday, La., although some days during the week he stays in a house trailer at Gilbert, La., as his two children are attending school there to keep from going to an integrated school. SCAROBOROUGH continues to work at the International Paper Co., Natchez, Miss. He is not presently a member of any klan group and is reported to have dropped out of the Minutemen several months ago. However, it has been reported that SCAROBOROUGH did pay his dues in the OKKKK Unit of the klan at Ferriday, La., during July, 1969, even though this unit has been inactive for three years.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

Subject continues to reside at 322 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, but also maintains a house trailer at Gilbert, Louisiana.

B. Employment

Subject continues to work at the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, as a welder.

C. Automobile Data

a 1957 Chevrolet, two-door sedan, hot rod, bearing 1968-1969 Louisiana license 83E431; a 1967 brown Dodge and a 1957 International Pickup truck, Louisiana license number unknown.

D. Position in Klan or Other Hate-Type Organizations

SCARBOROUGH allegedly claims to be a leader of Minutemen Unit 1733, Ferriday, Louisiana, but in the past this unit has been reported as almost inactive. SCARBOROUGH is also a member of the Silver Dollar Group (SDG) and was last reported to be on the outs with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER. Up until almost a year ago, SCARBOROUGH was known to be cooperating with OKKKK Grand Dragon MURRAY MARTIN at the time MARTIN was trying to re-organize an OKKKK Unit in the Ferriday, Louisiana area.

II. AFFILIATION WITH KLAN OR OTHER HATE-TYPE ORGANIZATIONS.

NO T-1 on September 10 and 17, 1968, advised the following:

DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON received a communication from national headquarters, Minutemen, advising him that all dues collected are to be sent to the occupants of P.O. Box 57, Independence, Missouri. WILKINSON intends to contact all present members of Unit 1733, collect back dues and send them to this P.O. Box and determine by request of a receipt if they are ever received.

While trying to contact JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH in Ferriday, La., WILKINSON conversed with SCARBOROUGH's father-in-law. SCARBOROUGH's father-in-law advised WILKINSON that SCARBOROUGH had moved to Wisner, La., and had purchased a \$4400 trailer to live in. SCARBOROUGH reportedly moved to Wisner because he did not want his children going to school with any "niggers" in Ferriday, La. SCARBOROUGH's father-in-law is reportedly angry with JAMES because he once loaned him \$300 and neither JAMES nor DOROTHY SCARBOROUGH offered to pay it back before they bought the trailer.

WILKINSON advised SCARBOROUGH's father-in-law that he should tell SCARBOROUGH that a meeting of Unit 1733 of the Minutemen was going to be called for 5:00 p.m., 9/22/68, at the old creek hunting camp. WILKINSON told SCARBOROUGH's father-in-law to advise SCARBOROUGH that he was going to contact all members, including WRIGHT and GUTHRIE, and that anyone who did not show up for this meeting was going to be considered out of the unit.

At the meeting on 9/22/68, Unit 1733, Minutemen, WILKINSON plans to discuss the re-organization of the unit under his leadership and the support of GEORGE WALLACE for President by the members and their families.

On 9/15/68, E. D. MORACE came to see DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON at his residence. WILKINSON told MORACE that SCAROBOROUGH had formed a unit of the Minutemen but that he was losing interest and had not taken part in any plans or activities of the unit in several months. WILKINSON told MORACE that he was taking the unit over and that he would like to have him in it. WILKINSON also told MORACE that he would give him the position of Team Captain and that he (MORACE) would be allowed to pick his own men. MORACE advised WILKINSON that he was interested in joining the Minutemen and that he would meet with him at a later date and bring RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER with him to join. WILKINSON told MORACE that he had already contacted GLOVER but that GLOVER would not put his name on a piece of paper of any type.

MORACE told WILKINSON that in the past, SCAROBOROUGH and he had been fairly good friends and that, in fact, MORACE had gotten SCAROBOROUGH his position as Exalted Cyclops in the klan unit in Ferriday, La. MORACE stated that someone in this klavern would cover all the meetings and would then tell FULLER and BLACKIE DRANE about what had been discussed at the meetings. MORACE stated that SCAROBOROUGH had intimated on several occasions that it was him (MORACE) who was doing the talking. MORACE told WILKINSON that he got five men together, dressed them in robes and went to the next meeting and demanded a hearing. SCAROBOROUGH refused to give MORACE a hearing and as a result of this, the unit later disbanded.

On September 24, 1968, NO T-2 advised that DONNIE CRAFT was mad at JAMES SCARBOROUGH as they had had a falling out over a girl at Natchez, Mississippi, and also because CRAFT wanted an accounting of Minutemen funds from SCARBOROUGH.

NO T-3, on October 10, 1968, advised the following:

SONNY TAYLOR contacted JAMES SCARBOROUGH at Ferriday, Louisiana, on October 7, 1968, at which time SCARBOROUGH told TAYLOR that he was inactive in the Minutemen. SCARBOROUGH said that he was no longer able to get out at night because of his wife. He said that DON WILKENS of Natchez, Mississippi, took over as Network Commander of the Minutemen. SCARBOROUGH said that all mail from Minutemen Headquarters goes to WILKENS in Natchez, and that is now the headquarters for the Ferriday-Natchez Unit of the Minutemen.

TAYLOR said he was considering joining the Minutemen and SCARBOROUGH told him that he would have to see DON WILKENS.

On October 8, 1968, NO T-1 advised that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER had been overheard to comment that it was thought that JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH was an informant for the FBI. GLOVER commented that many times in the past SCARBOROUGH had built up units in the klan and would abandon them just before the FBI began their investigation.

NO T-2, on October 23, 1968, advised that DONNIE CRAFT, Minutemen member, has been having trouble with the previous leader of the Minutemen, JAMES SCARBOROUGH. It is reported that this trouble is over both SCARBOROUGH and CRAFT dating the same girl in Natchez, Mississippi.

NO T-2 also advised that CRAFT had been heard to comment that SCARBOROUGH would reload 38 ammunition and carbine ammunition for Minutemen members, but had never gotten around to it. CRAFT had been heard to comment that he confronted SCARBOROUGH concerning this, and that SCARBOROUGH became angry stating he would do this when he got ready.

On April 15, 1969, NO T-2 advised that there was a meeting of the SDG and the Minutemen, on April 10, 1969. During the meeting, an attempted bombing of a Negro Masonic Lodge in Laurel Hills, Louisiana, was discussed. This bombing was attempted in February, 1964, and had failed. RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER advised that this attempted bombing had been "messed up" by a TOMMIE JONES and an individual known as TORGENSON, both of whom were Masons.

According to GLOVER, these two men went into the Negro Masonic Hall and spread five gallons of gas around it. GLOVER, JAMES SCARBOROUGH and JAMES F. LEE stood shotgun guard outside. However, JONES and TORGENSON were frightened by some lights from a nearby house and ran away without setting the fire.

On April 22, 1969, NO T-2 advised the following:

E. D. MORACE and JAMES SCARBOROUGH met by chance on April 19, 1969, at the Concordia Hunting Lodge near Clayton, Louisiana. SCARBOROUGH spoke of the Negro trouble at Ft. Gibson, Mississippi, and said he was standing by to be called if the Negroes "break out." SCARBOROUGH asked MORACE if he would be available if needed and MORACE said he would. SCARBOROUGH stated he would come by and pick MORACE up if he went to Fort Gibson.

MORACE told SCARBOROUGH he needed one pound of black powder for a project. SCARBOROUGH said he had the powder and MORACE could get it any time. SCARBOROUGH said his children are still attending school at Chigger, Louisiana, near Gilbert, Louisiana, or Wisner, Louisiana, so he was not home much of the time.

PAUL TOLBERT came by while SCARBOROUGH and MORACE were talking. TOLBERT said he had not filled out his Minutemen application. TOLBERT stated his wife was very upset over possible Negro riots at Fort Gibson, Mississippi, as she has relatives living in Mississippi, and that he, TOLBERT, was staying close to home.

NO T-1, on April 24, 1969, and May 1, 1969, advised the following:

As former commander of the Minutemen, JIMMY SCAROBOROUGH accumulated several items of reloading equipment and also some \$225 that was accumulated at the Concordia Rifle and Pistol Club was turned over to him to buy additional reloading equipment. WILKINSON introduced a girl by the name of RUTH RAND to JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and one night at a party, DONNIE CRAFT spent quite a bit of time dancing with her and subsequently made SCAROBOROUGH jealous. CRAFT, later on that night, asked SCAROBOROUGH about whether or not he had bought any of the reloading materials, and got a smart answer from SCAROBOROUGH, and he and SCAROBOROUGH then had some pretty hot words. CRAFT then indicated to WILKINSON that he did not want anything more to do with the klan in Louisiana, or with the Minutemen. He has subsequently not attended any meetings and has been out of touch with all Minutemen members.

On May 13, 1969, NO T-2 furnished the following information:

JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH continues to live at 322 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, although some weeks during the week he stays in a house trailer at Gilbert, Louisiana, as his two children are going to a school there to escape an integrated school. SCAROBOROUGH continues to work at International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi.

SCAROBOROUGH is not a member of the OKA or the OKKKK or any other klan organization since he dropped out of the Minutemen approximately ten months ago.

NO T-2, on June 18, 1969, advised that there was a meeting on June 14, 1969, at the entrance to a hunting camp on the levee between Ferriday and Clayton, Louisiana. In attendance were the following individuals:

JAMES BILL BLANEY, and his brother

GERALD BLANEY (both SDG members)

JAMES HORACE "SONNY" TAYLOR
Harrisonburg, Louisiana
an SDG and Minutemen member

JAMES SCAROBOROUGH
an SDG member, along with

WILLIAM GUTHRIE
a friend of SCAROBOROUGH and
former Minutemen member

JOHN MC CLERKIN
former Exalted Cyclops
of the Klan at Ferriday, Louisiana

E. D. MORACE

PAUL TOLBERT
an SDG member, showed up with
his son-in-law, who is not a member
of any organization.

NO T-4 made available a list of individuals in Louisiana of persons who were believed to be members of the Minutemen. One of the names in this list was JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, of Ferriday, Louisiana.

On July 16-17, 1969, a notebook was made available by NO T-4 which contained names and addresses of persons believed to be Minutemen. JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, 332 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, was among the persons listed.

On July 2, 1969, NO T-2 advised the following:

On July 30, 1969, NO T-2 advised the following:

On June 28, 1969, E. D. MORACE and R. J. GLOVER went to the home of JAMES SCAROBOROUGH in Ferriday, Louisiana. SAMMY BUTLER, a former Klansman, was there, but was to one side during the conversation. GLOVER asked SCAROBOROUGH if he still had the item he sent to him, indicating that it was the Russian Burp Gun. SCAROBOROUGH said he had the item, but had not been able to get it to function properly. GLOVER asked if SCAROBOROUGH still had his fast-talking weapon, meaning his automatic carbine, and SCAROBOROUGH said he did. GLOVER told him to pass both of these on to a friend. GLOVER said this was the way to build trust, that he has passed his Russian Burp Gun to several people and all had proven trustworthy.

On July 30, 1969, NO T-2 advised the following:

While E. D. MORACE and PAUL TOLBERT were talking on July 28, 1969, TOLBERT mentioned that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH had been to see him the week before and had paid his dues in the Klan. MORACE was surprised and noted the OKKK unit of the Klan had been in-active for three years. TOLBERT said that when the unit broke up, he, TOLBERT, took the box with the dues cards and has kept this. He said that from time to time someone will pay their Klan dues, and that SCAROBOROUGH regularly pays. TOLBERT said he sends this money to MURRAY MARTIN of Winnsboro, Louisiana, the former head of the OKKK in Louisiana.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP

A source on April 4, 1967, and a second source on May 3, 1967, characterized the Silver Dollar Group as a hard-core action group made up of present and former members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM); the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA); and Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi and Louisiana.

On August 15, 1967, a third source advised that the Silver Dollar Group was formed approximately in May or June, 1964. The secret group within the Klan was formed to further Klan activities involving the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and maintaining total segregation. Klansmen were dissatisfied with the inactivity in their respective Klan groups. The members of the new secret action unit had to be trusted Klansmen and had to vouch for each other.

A fourth source advised on May 26, 1969, that there is no formal organization in the Silver Dollar Group, but membership is obtained by invitation only, and upon receipt of a silver dollar from the group organizer, Raleigh Jackson Glover, membership is acquired. There have been no formal meetings or group sponsored activity by the Silver Dollar Group during the past year; however, those holding silver dollars still claim membership in the organization.

A P P E N D I X

"MINUTEMEN"

The "Minutemen" was organized in June, 1960. Its present headquarters are Norborne, Missouri. Robert B. DePugh, Norborne, Missouri, has been publicly identified as the founder and National Coordinator of the organization since its inception. Membership of the "Minutemen" is claimed by DePugh to be in excess of 35,000 members; however, confidential sources state this figure is greatly exaggerated and that a more true estimate would be between 500 and 1,000 members. Statements by DePugh and literature distributed by the organization indicate its purpose to be the resistance to, and exposure of, the spread of communist influence within the United States; for the formation of a guerilla or underground organization to combat the troops of any foreign powers which might eventually occupy this country; to resist passage of laws which would regulate private ownership of firearms.

In April, 1966, DePugh stated the "Minutemen" organization was then dividing itself into two bodies: one group to be members who have been able to maintain their identity in complete secrecy from the public and Government investigative agencies, and the other group to be made up of members who have been publicly identified and who will become active in the Patriotic Party. National conventions of the Patriotic Party were held in July, 1966, at Kansas City, Kansas.

Members of the "Minutemen" organization, including Robert B. DePugh and his close associate, Walter P. Peyson, have been arrested in the past on charges of violation of the Federal Firearms Act, Bank Robbery - Conspiracy, Illegal Possession of Firearms and Conspiracy to Commit Arson. They have also engaged in maneuvers utilizing guerrilla tactics wherein machine guns, mortars, grenades, and other firearms were employed.

ORIGINAL KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC.
(LOUISIANA) (OKA)

Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December of 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a result, a split in the OKKKK occurred. Houston Morris and Robert Fuller led the split and formed the OKA, according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that Houston Morris and Robert Fuller formed the OKA after splitting away from the OKKKK in December of 1964. The second source advised that the OKA has the same general purposes as the OKKKK; that is, the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and the maintaining of segregation.

The second source also advised that Robert Fuller assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in February of 1965, after Houston Morris left the organization. The second source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside of the State of Louisiana.

This second source advised on May 19, 1969, that the aims and purposes of the OKA remain the same with the exception that the OKA has several Klan units chartered in Arkansas, and the Arkansas Klan units are under the leadership of Robert Fuller, who continues to hold the position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana.

E. L. "TINY" LEWIS and E. D. MORACE have not been in touch with DON WILKINSON for quite some time. MORACE has told WILKINSON that he has been busy in Vidalia, Louisiana and "TINY" LEWIS stated that he has had problems with attorneys etc., and will not be readily available for any Minutemen activities.

SCARBOROUGH claims to be the leader of Minutemen Unit 1733, Ferriday, Louisiana, but during recent weeks he has become almost inactive in the minutemen. SCARBOROUGH is a member of the SDG, but during recent weeks has not been very active and is last reported to be estranged, or on the outs with, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER. Up until about six months ago, SCARBOROUGH was co-operating with OKKKK Grand Dragon MURRAY MARTIN, trying to re-organize an OKKKK Unit in the Ferriday - Clayton, Louisiana area but since then has been reported to have become totally inactive.

II AFFILIATION WITH KLAN OR OTHER HATE TYPE ORGANIZATIONS

NO T-1 advised on June 4, 1967 that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, as of this time, is in the process of organizing a new National Rifle Association (NRA) Chapter in the vicinity of Ferriday, Louisiana. This chapter is to be a front group for a ~~new minuteman~~ ~~organization~~ also being promoted by SCAROBOROUGH for establishment in the Mississippi - Louisiana area centering around the Natchez, Mississippi - Ferriday and Vidalia, Louisiana area. At this time SCAROBOROUGH is claiming that "our fight is not with the Civil Rights Movement but is with the Communist Party USA." SCAROBOROUGH appears to be well versed in the operations of the minutemen organization and he is in possession of various types of minuteman literature. SCAROBOROUGH has been invited by letter to attend the second annual meeting in Kansas City, Missouri during July of 1967 of the Patriotic Party, which according to the source is part of the minuteman movement. Recently, an application has been made for NRA, affiliation to NRA headquarters in Washington, D. C., but NO T-1 was not certain whether the NRA application was sent in by WILLIAM GUTHRIE, the alleged head of the newly formed NRA ~~was~~ under the name of SCAROBOROUGH. Another individual who appears to be under SCAROBOROUGH's influence is WAYNE REED. REED is also very conversive with the minutemen organization. REED is known to have the following weapons: 44 magnum; a lever action Winchester, which is equipped to shoot carbine ammunition; a 308 Remington with a scope, a 22 caliber rifle with a scope; and a 12 gauge Winchester pump shotgun. At this time, SCAROBOROUGH has the following weapons: 22 magnum ruger; and a 30.06 Remington rifle with a scope. SCAROBOROUGH also has a quantity of ammunition in his home. SCAROBOROUGH has bragged on occasion that, although he is left handed, he, SCAROBOROUGH, could shoot equally well with either hand. NO T-1 advised on June 21, 1967 that WAYNE REED, who lives on Iowa Street, near the residence of SCAROBOROUGH, has been telling his close friends that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH has now received his charter for the new NRA chapter to be organized in this area. This is the same WAYNE REED who in the past had burned up the automobile of a Negro worker at International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi because the Negro had taken over a white ~~man's~~ job. Following the car burning, this Negro man by the name of CAMEL left the International Paper Company and re-enlisted in the Air Force. This REED is also a thief because it is known in Klan and Silver Dollar

Group (SDG) circles that he and another Klan associate recently stole a "chain hoist" from the construction project at the paper company.

NO T-2 on June 20, 1967 advised that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, 332 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, Social Security Number 436-16-2846 has been employed by International Paper Company since 1947. SCAROBOROUGH started work with this firm at Bastrop, Louisiana, but he was transferred to the Natchez, Mississippi Plant in May of 1950. SCAROBOROUGH had a prior employment during 1946-47 with the Mengal, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, as a chipper operator. SCAROBOROUGH is married to DOROTHY FAYE WATKINS, who was born in April of 1926, and they have three children, a girl born in 1948 and two boys, one born in 1951, and the other born in 1957. SCAROBOROUGH's father is CHARLIE SCAROBOROUGH of Haile, Louisiana, and his mother's first name was LIZZIE. SCAROBOROUGH reportedly has an eighth grade education, having attended grade school in Leonville, Louisiana until 1935 and he has advised his employer that he had served in the U. S. Navy from October, 1942 to December of 1945 as a coxswain. SCAROBOROUGH was born on March 11, 1921 at Haile, Louisiana.

NO T-3 advised on June 14, 1967 that there must be some kind of trouble or feud among members of the SDG because the word has been passed that it would be well to stay away from JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and RALEIGH GLOVER, who is an extreme segregationist, and one of the founders of the SDG. The plan was that several SDG members later would contact GLOVER as a group in order to get the matter settled.

NO T-3 advised on June 7, 1967 that a fully loaded automatic carbine weapon had been observed in the possession of SCAROBOROUGH in SCAROBOROUGH's home during the Fall of 1966. At the time it was observed SCAROBOROUGH was keeping this gun some place in the rear part of his home.

NO T-1 advised on July 5, 1967 that the newly organized NRA chapter under the auspices of SCAROBOROUGH is in existence and is making progress. During late June of 1967, this chapter was known to meet at the racially segregated private school. WAYNE REED has been appointed by SCAROBOROUGH as leader of the Junior Club of the NRA and VIRGIL G. WRIGHT, who has been observed at

meetings wearing a Louisiana Highway Patrol uniform bearing a left arm patch identifying him as being with the Driver's License Bureau, is one of the Board members of the new NRA chapter at Ferriday. SCAROBOROUGH, in organizing the NRA chapter as a front for minutemen and SDG, is proceeding cautiously because he has told his close associates that they are going to get the Junior Club started first in order to avoid suspicion. In the Junior Club, both boys and girls will be given an opportunity to learn about weapons. At this time SCAROBOROUGH planned on building a firing range on land directly behind the private school near the Mississippi Levee, but as yet work had not started on the range.

NO T-1 advised on July 11, 1967 that WAYNE REED's wife, MARTHA, recently claimed she hated the Klan and attributed the failure of their marriage to the Klan. Apparently this is due to the undue influence of SCAROBOROUGH over the activities of her husband, WAYNE REED. MARTHA REED claimed that they rented the house next door to SCAROBOROUGH because SCAROBOROUGH wanted her husband to be close to him at all times. It was recently ascertained that SCAROBOROUGH is unhappy with WAYNE REED over his apparent lack of interest in organizing young people into the Junior Club of the NRA chapter. SCAROBOROUGH, at this time, may be looking for a replacement for REED. Among some of the minutemen literature in possession of SCAROBOROUGH is a book entitled Blue Print for Victory by ROBERT B. DE PUGH, who is leader of the Patriotic Party, a political arm of the minutemen organization.

NO T-4 advised on June 20, 1967 that RALEIGH GLOVER, the Leader of the SDG in this area, is currently in trouble inside the group as well as with law enforcement over recent thefts. SCAROBOROUGH, who is currently alligned with GLOVER in the SDG and other segregationist action type of activity, did not agree with other klansmen about the thefts. SCAROBOROUGH finally decided that if a majority of SDG members wanted to take action against GLOVER over the thefts, he would go along with the majority.

NO T-4 advised on July 12, 1967 that close associates were unable to locate JAMES SCAROBOROUGH in his regular hangouts but it was later learned that during this period SCAROBOROUGH had been spending all his spare time working on the construction of a new segregated private school in Ferriday, Louisiana.

NO T-1 advised on July 25, 1967 that WAYNE REED, a close associate of SCARBOROUGH, had recently been trying to get a job on the Ferriday, Louisiana Police Department. REED was attempting to fill the expected vacancy of Officer GEORGE SEWELL, who is planning on becoming a Louisiana Highway Patrolman. REED has told close friends and associates that during the latter part of July he is moving out of his address on Iowa Street to a new place on Love Street in Ferriday, Louisiana. This would seem to be an indication that REED may possibly be trying to get away from SCARBOROUGH's influence and control.

NO T-3 ascertained that REED had recently been designated the official leader of the NRA Junior Club and that the purpose of this club was to orient the young people in the area in the operation of various types of firearms. It was the impression of NO T-1 at this time that VIRGIL WRIGHT, the Louisiana Driver's License Examiner, who is a Board Member of the newly formed NRA chapter, may not know that SCARBOROUGH has plans to use the NRA as a cover for minuteman SDG and Klan training in firearms because recently REED claimed that he did not know anything about the Patriotic Party or minutemen organization.

NO T-1 advised on July 31, 1967 that on July 28, 1967 it was ascertained that SCARBOROUGH had been denied the use of the facilities of the racially segregated private school at Ferriday for NRA meetings and also for installation of a NRA firing range. This refusal was based on a decision of the private school board members. SCARBOROUGH was very upset over the school board's decision and he attributed this to a plot by the FBI to prevent the new NRA chapter from being accepted in the community. It was SCARBOROUGH's opinion that the FBI had talked to parents and potential members of the Junior Club and had caused them to bring the matter to the attention of the private school officials. SCARBOROUGH seems to be disturbed over possible investigation of his activities because he recently contacted WAYNE REED at his new residence in Ferriday and asked all sorts of questions about the number of FBI Agents in the area and about who they were talking to. At times, SCARBOROUGH gets a little emotional over this and makes claims that the "FEDS" know every move that he is making. SCARBOROUGH is supposed to have told WAYNE REED that if he is asked by the FBI why he moved out of SCARBOROUGH's neighborhood,

NEED should tell them that he became scared of their interest in SCARBOROUGH. SCARBOROUGH and NEED's wife, MARTHA, do not get along well because she thinks SCARBOROUGH has made a slave out of her husband and ruined their marriage.

NO T-5 advised on August 3, 1967, that during late July, 1967, RALEIGH GLOVER was overheard to describe SCAROBOROUGH as being one of the very first members of RALEIGH GLOVER's super action group, the SDG.

NO T-5 advised on August 5, 1967, that some of the local SDG members are "shook up" because the Federal Bureau of Investigation has been asking questions in the Natchez-Ferriday area about the killing of a Negro, FRANK MORRIS, who was burned to death in his shoe shop on December 10, 1964. NO T-5 had developed information that SCAROBOROUGH was one of three or four individuals who had something to do with the death of FRANK MORRIS. NO T-5 recalled that, a few days after MORRIS' death, some of these individuals expected that they might be arrested, and one of them, not SCAROBOROUGH, went so far as to make arrangements with another associate to get them out of jail on bond in the event they were arrested. One of the group was suppose to have tried to get a group of Mississippi Klansmen to whip MORRIS, allegedly because MORRIS was suppose to have flirted and made smart remarks to a white woman who frequented MORRIS' shoe shop. The Mississippi group of Klansmen did not take immediate action but wanted to verify the allegation, and the night before MORRIS' death somebody in the Mississippi group was notified that their help was no longer necessary.

NO T-1 advised on August 8, 1967, that SCAROBOROUGH is still very active and an officer in the NRA chapter, which has been called the Concordia Rifle Club. At this time VIRGIL WRIGHT was the President. WILLIAM GUTHRIE was the Secretary-Treasurer, and JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH was President of the Junior Rifle Club. The group had recently received its charter from Washington, D. C., and they were planning their meetings in the racially-segregated school. NO T-1 advised that, on the basis of casual conversation with SCAROBOROUGH, it is believed that SCAROBOROUGH had some knowledge of the identity of the subjects who had placed explosives in the trucks of GEORGE METCALFE and WHARLEST JACKSON in Natchez, Mississippi.

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but SCAROBOROUGH has always denied this knowledge. From the tone of SCAROBOROUGH's voice, according to NO T-1, it seems obvious that SCAROBOROUGH knows something about the crimes against METCALFE and JACKSON.

NO T-6 advised on August 15, 1967, that a fish fry was held on August 11, 1967, at the Concordia Private Christian Academy (CPCA), Doty Road, Ferriday, Louisiana, which was the dedication ceremony of this school. There were some 35 to 40 persons there, and JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH was among those in attendance. The purpose was to exhibit the progress made in the school and to inform the public that applications were now being taken for six teacher positions for the four grades that are being currently planned for the school. The main theme of the various speeches made was to the effect that this school should get public support in order to insure the white children in the area would not be forced to attend the same school as Negroes.

NO T-7 advised on August 8, 1967, that the Ferriday OKKKK Unit, during the period of 1962 through 1963, had at least 18 active members and that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH, a resident of Ferriday, Louisiana, who is employed by International Paper Company at Natchez, Mississippi, was one of those considered to be an active member.

NO T-8 advised on August 16, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH was one of about 40 people in attendance at the fish fry held at the CPCA on August 11, 1967. SCAROBOROUGH was one of the leaders in the organization of this academy and took a leading role during this fish fry.

NO T-1 advised on August 16, 1967, that, during mid-August, 1967, he had determined from DONNIE CRAFT, an International Paper Company employee, that he knew and liked JAMES SCAROBOROUGH, a known SDG member but that

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he did not think much of WAYNE REED, a close associate of SCARBOROUGH. CRAFT was overheard to claim that there was a Minutemen organization in existence in this area and that CRAFT knew several members so that, if anyone was interested, CRAFT would be able to drop their names around in the right places. It was NO T-1's belief, from the way CRAFT was talking, that CRAFT may also be a member of SCARBOROUGH's Minutemen organization.

NO T-1 advised on August 15, 1968, that JAMES SCARBOROUGH, who is known as "Indian," was one of several who attended one of the organization meetings of the SDG during a fish fry at Wildsville, Louisiana, at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE, which occurred on June 26, 1965. RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER was the organizer and one of the leading figures at this fish fry.

NO T-9 advised on August 15, 1967, that JAMES SCARBOROUGH and his wife were present at the SDG organizational fish fry on June 26, 1965, held at "RED" LEE's home, which is located near Forman's Store near Wildsville, Louisiana. NO T-9 further mentioned that SCARBOROUGH was one of the group of SDG characters under the direction of RALEIGH GLOVER who set up the plans for the beating of Negro JAMES WHITE, a quail raiser near Horseshoe Lake Road in Louisiana. This Negro wore a goatee and was allegedly an official in the Black Muslims, and it was for this reason that this group was going to take care of the Negro. One of the Klansmen in the party was carrying a shotgun which he had not loaded before he got out of the car at WHITE's place. They tried to induce the Negro to go to his quail pens to look at the birds, but the Negro had had prior experience with these type of individuals, so the Negro left his wife at the back door of his home with a shotgun. The one Klansmen with a gun showed his shotgun, and the Negro's wife shot him, which caused the group to seek out a physician from Brookhaven, Mississippi, to remove the shot from the Klansmen's body. SCARBOROUGH was suppose to have admitted to others that, in addition to helping whip this Negro,

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SCAROBOROUGH and some of this group had also burned down a Negro nightclub in this vicinity in the past. The group was suppose to have warned the nightclub owner to quit selling to teenagers. The Klansmen tried to burn it one night without success and returned the following night and burned it to the ground.

NO T-4 advised on August 21, 1967, that SCAROBOROUGH and his group were involved in 1965 or 1966 in the whipping of the Negro quail raiser and were also involved in the burning of a Negro nightclub.

NO T-1 advised on August 20, 1967, that there was a recent meeting of the NRA chapter held at the Office of VIRGIL WRIGHT, the driver's license examiner in the Ferriday City Hall. At this time those present were advised that the official name for this NRA chapter is the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club, Ferriday, Louisiana. The main item of business was trying to find a suitable site for target ranges. SCAROBOROUGH has now officially taken over the management of the Junior Rifle Club because he became disgusted with the lack of interest in the club shown by WAYNE REED. SCAROBOROUGH explained that WAYNE REED is now trying to salvage his marriage, which is the reason the REEDS moved out of the house next door to SCAROBOROUGH on Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana. NO T-1 could tell from the way SCAROBOROUGH was talking that he knew that MARTHA REED has been unfaithful to her husband and that her husband was also aware of this. SCAROBOROUGH is still trying to recruit members into the Minutemen, and he has told some of the candidates that, within the Minutemen, there are categories of duties, such as Combat Team, Weapons, Political, or Religious. To be admitted to SCAROBOROUGH's Minutemen group requires an application of \$5.00 in a \$5.00 bill, and the number of this bill is recorded, which may possibly become the applicant's official Minutemen's serial number when he is accepted. SCAROBOROUGH recently has been trying to obtain a high-powered rifle with a scope attached, and he is also

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looking for sources of ammunition, such as .32 short, .38 caliber automatic, .38-06, and .30M1.

NO T-5 advised on July 11, 1967, that, during the early part of July, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH was overheard to state that RALEIGH GLOVER should be left out of any newly-organized Klan organizations in this area. SCAROBOROUGH recommended that in his organization, apparently the Minutemen, he wanted old hard core members of the Klan, and he wanted to eliminate the thugs and the thieves. It should be noted that GLOVER is having trouble over some of his past thefts and is being investigated extensively, and it is possible that this is the reason for SCAROBOROUGH's rejection of GLOVER.

NO T-10 advised on August 21, 1967, concerning the events which occurred during the latter part of 1964 or early part of 1965 when the SDG was being formed. At that time JAMES SCAROBOROUGH, while at work at International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, was overheard to tell some of his trusted friends that they were currently forming a super secret organization within the Klan. SCAROBOROUGH at the time was attempting to find members, and he told those members taken in that they were "hand picked." It was shortly after this that NO T-10 learned that TOMMY LEE JONES was also a SDG member, and T. L. TORGERSEN also indicated his membership in the SDG. It was only later that NO T-10 learned that RALEIGH GLOVER was also one of the organizers.

NO T-4 advised on August 8, 1967, of evidence in 1964 leading to formation of the SDG. He described JAMES SCAROBOROUGH as being one of the first members of the SDG and probably joined up with "RED" GLOVER during the fall of 1964 at the time GLOVER resigned as the Klan Bureau of Investigation (KBI) man for the Fifth Province OKKKK of Louisiana. It was the original plan to pick trusted hard core Klansmen from various Klan organizations and to mold them into one hard-knit, super-action group, which they called the Silver Dollar Group. Evidence of

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membership in this group was to be the member's possession of a silver dollar bearing some identifying mark, which was given to him at the time he was admitted.

NO T-4 advised on August 15, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH is disturbed over school integration and that, during early August, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH had heard rumors that three Negro teachers were to be placed in the white elementary school in Ferriday, Louisiana. These rumors also were that three white teachers were to be transferred to the Negro school in Ferriday. At this time SCAROBOROUGH did not indicate any violent action to prevent integration but did comment that his, SCAROBOROUGH's, private school now seems to have enough pupils registered for the coming year so that the school is sound financially. NO T-4 also identified SCAROBOROUGH as being one of a group of Klansmen who attempted to take action against the Negro pheasant raiser, who was alleged to be a Muslim. SCAROBOROUGH was one of the ones in the group who was to furnish protection for the other Klansmen when they worked over the Negro, but SCAROBOROUGH had forgotten to load his equipment and, when the group came under fire from the Negro's house, they were unable to defend themselves. Later SCAROBOROUGH wanted permission from the local Klan KBI man to shoot into this Negro's house, but this was turned down by the Klan because there was no proof that this Negro was a Muslim.

NO T-4 advised on September 5, 1967, that some of the SDG, during late August, 1967, had heard that a white man, PETE WADDELL, was subject to gossip that WADDELL had been dating a Negro woman. This allegation was suppose to have dated on back to about 1965, when the local sheriff or somebody is supposed to have seen a news clipping out of a Vicksburg, Mississippi, indicating that

NO T-4 was of the opinion that the

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SDG would have taken some action against WADDELL if the morals charges were found true.

NO T-3 advised on August 16, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH is one of the early members of the SDG. NO T-3 furnished a list of at least 18 names, and SCAROBOROUGH was at the head of the list.

NO T-1 advised on September 5, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH has not been following the National Rifle Club activity too closely recently because he has been working a great deal of his time in the organization of the new private school. SCAROBOROUGH has been overheard to explain his great amount of work for the school was because the Federal Bureau of Investigation had been investigating SCAROBOROUGH constantly and that he no longer wanted to talk to them, so he spent most of his time away from home at the private school. SCAROBOROUGH believed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation would not attempt to talk to him at the school because there were always other persons present. Meetings of the NRA chapter are still being held at VIRGIL WRIGHT's office in the Ferriday City Hall, but recently WRIGHT has suggested that it is no longer wise to hold these meetings in his office. SCAROBOROUGH apparently is also desirous of finding a new NRA meeting place because he thinks the present space may be bugged with electronic equipment. This NRA chapter, which has the title Concordia Pistol-Rifle Club, now has about 20 members and, according to this source, it has become apparent that WRIGHT has assumed leadership of the NRA chapter and is possibly getting into SCAROBOROUGH's Minutemen organization. NO T-1 seemed to think that WRIGHT at this time seems to be in complete control of SCAROBOROUGH for some unknown reason.

NO T-3 advised on August 9, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH was already established in the SDG at the time when the fish fry organizational meeting was held near Wildsville, Louisiana, on June 26, 1965. NO T-3 noted

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that RALEIGH GLOVER has always been recognized as being the leader and the organizer of the SDG but that SCAROBOROUGH ranks very high under RALEIGH GLOVER as a charter member of the SDG.

NO T-1 advised on September 15, 1967, that SCAROBOROUGH, as of about September 12, 1967, cautioned his Minutemen followers about distributing anymore Minutemen stickers in Natchez, Mississippi because the Federal Bureau of Investigation had found some of the stickers and was investigating the organization. At this time SCAROBOROUGH had the feeling that he was about to be arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and he was unusually upset and nervous and was trying to make arrangements to have other leadership in the Minutemen in the event he was arrested. SCAROBOROUGH also claims that he has now become disgusted with the white private school, Concordia Private Christian Academy, which he has been helping construct. SCAROBOROUGH was disgusted because registration for this school has been very slow and, due to the registration, the school board is postponing the opening day. NO T-1 advised that apparently WAYNE REED had managed to get his distance from SCAROBOROUGH because now REED is employed by an offshore drilling company out of Leesville, Louisiana, and REED and his wife have plans to go to England or Australia sometime next year.

NO T-4 advised on September 12, 1967, that apparently WAYNE REED and SCAROBOROUGH have had a "falling out" because REED, who was close to SCAROBOROUGH in the past, has switched his occupation to work in the oil industry offshore. REED was overheard on September 9, 1967, to state that he had a misunderstanding with SCAROBOROUGH about some ammunition, and REED claimed he is now through with SCAROBOROUGH and has no use for him. SCAROBOROUGH got into trouble with LEE KING and his wife because she thought SCAROBOROUGH had been talking to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and claiming that Mrs. KING had been "leaking" information to somebody in the FBI.

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about individuals who might be under investigation for Klan activity.

NO T-11, who is close personally to Mr. and Mrs. WAYNE REED, on September 13, 1965, advised that MARTHA REED was very happy when she could move to her new residence on Love Street because the situation on Iowa Street, when they lived near SCAROBOROUGH, had become unbearable. Because of SCAROBOROUGH, her husband, WAYNE REED, had come to the attention of various law enforcement officers. While they lived next to SCAROBOROUGH, SCAROBOROUGH's wife, DOROTHY, was continually pestering Mrs. REED about Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) and to become active in opposing racial integration. Mrs. SCAROBOROUGH allegedly threatened Mrs. REED by saying it would be Mrs. REED's children who would be forced to go with the Negroes later, and then Mrs. REED would regret opposing integration now.

NO T-3 advised on September 20, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH was one of six or seven members who attended a meeting of the SDG on September 9, 1967, at Natchez, Mississippi. The meeting was held at the home of member JAMES F. LEE but, as soon as the group arrived, they went to a river front park in Natchez, where the business portion of the meeting was transacted. JAMES LEE presided, and the primary purpose was to discuss ways and means to discipline another member, TOMMY JONES, who at that time was suspected of being a Federal Bureau of Investigation informant. The reasons for JONES' becoming suspected as an informant was that JONES had recently come to LEE's home for a visit and, while JONES was there, something happened to LEE's television set because it flipped everytime JONES walked near the set which, to them, was an indication that JONES must have been wearing a recorder or some type of electronic device on his person. Finally, it was decided that the group would take a vote on whether or not to do away with JONES, and LEE and most of the others were in favor of doing so, but RALEIGH GLOVER, the leader, intervened and said that they

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must have definite proof against JONES before taking any action. Two others then supported GLOVER, and the tension in the group eased off since they decided to postpone a final decision on JONES to a later date.

NO T-1 advised on September 22, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH is again concentrating on organizing his Minutemen organization. He is recommending that members of his group read two ~~books~~ books, the titles of which are "Guerrilla" by CHARLES W. THAYER and "Craft of Intelligence" by ALLEN DULLES. SCAROBOROUGH indicated that there would be no more new meetings of the NRA chapter at VIRGIL WRIGHT's office in City Hall because the Vice President, WILLIAM GUTHRIE, of the chapter is doing the work and VIRGIL is not. It appears evident, in view of this, that SCAROBOROUGH was upset with VIRGIL WRIGHT because he had held no immediate NRA meetings for the past three or four weeks. SCAROBOROUGH, in describing plans for his Minutemen organization, claims that one member will never know more than three other members in the organization. This is done to provide maximum security inside the group. SCAROBOROUGH seemed to be obsessed with harassing a fellow SDG member, TOMMY LEE JONES, who is suspected as a possible informant, because he has suggested Minutemen place some kind of sticker on JONES' automobile but cautioned that they were not to get caught doing this. Someone asked SCAROBOROUGH if he thought JONES was a traitor, and his answer was "I don't know, but I am going to find out." JONES is apparently in fear of his life because now, when he goes to work at International Paper Company, he parks his automobile right near the company guard shack so that it will be under observation of somebody while he is at work. NO T-1 thinks JONES is in fear that somebody will place a bomb in his car which will blow him up when he tries to start the motor. SCAROBOROUGH is anticipating trouble in the United States, and he has told some of his associates that, when the revolution begins, he has definite plans for key members of the group to go directly

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to SCAROBOROUGH's home for orders. As of September, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH was concerned with securing parts for various automatic weapons from wholesale sources so that his Minutemen group could either make up their own automatic weapons from the parts, or they could secure sufficient parts to convert M1 rifles to the M2, which is an automatic. Several of the SDG members have all the parts for their individual sub-machine guns except the "receiver," and they have been able to have this part made to order through the cooperation of a local welding shop owner who has turned out to be a pretty good gunsmith. Someone within the SDG reported that it was probably one of these rebuilt-type guns, which had been used to kill a man by the name of BEN CHESTER WHITE in the past. NO T-1 could not verify this with certainty.

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NO T-13 did not know any more concerning this incident and claimed no knowledge of any harassment of the Negro.

NO T-4 advised on October 3, 1967, that during early October, 1967, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER was irked at SCARBOROUGH because SCARBOROUGH had made no contributions to GLOVER's legal defense fund. This was at the time that local authorities were investigating GLOVER intensively over numerous thefts and he was in dire need of money for attorney fees.

NO T-1 advised on October 13, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH was one of several SDG members who attended a meeting of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club held on October 12, 1967. The meeting was held in the Highway Patrol Driver's License Examiners Office of VIRGIL WRIGHT at Ferriday, Louisiana. WRIGHT appeared to be leading the discussion and he immediately told those present there would be no discussion about the Minutemen organization inside the office as there was reason to believe the Federal Bureau of Investigation had "bugged" the building. He told those present that future discussions about the Minutemen were to be had only in an open field in order to provide maximum security. The balance of the meeting had to do with the Junior Rifle Club and there was discussion to indicate that a charter had already been obtained for the Junior Rifle Club as a subsidiary of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club. SCARBOROUGH at this time seems to be totally engrossed with what he thinks is the influence which Communist have in our present society.

SCARBOROUGH went so far to claim that there had been Communist penetration of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that this was one of the reasons for the organization of the Minutemen throughout the country. The Minutemen apparently used the name "Biolab" Corporation, Norborne, Missouri, as a cover name or a mail drop of the Minutemen national organization because much of their literature instructs members or applicants for membership to use this address.

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NO T-4 advised on October 10, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH announced there was to be a SDG meeting in the Ferriday area on October 15, 1967. This meeting was scheduled to be held at a hunting camp owned by one of the members, whose last name is MORACE, which is located on the levee between Ferriday and Vidalia area. Some of the members at this time were "shook up" because many of the ordinary Klansmen in the Black River, Louisiana, area have been contacted and notified about this proposed meeting.

JAMES AVANTS, who resides somewhere near SCAROBOROUGH, is reportedly a member of the Ferriday-Clayton Unit of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK). JAMES AVANTS is an uncle of ERNEST AVANTS of Natchez, Mississippi, who is a well known avid segregationist in this area. JAMES AVANTS is also on the school board of a private school, which is being started by SDG member SCAROBOROUGH.

NO T-13 advised on October 25, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH and JOHN MC CLERKIN and their wives have been associated regularly during recent weeks, but they had not done so since WAYNE REED moved away from his Iowa Street address, which was near that of SCAROBOROUGH. The MC CLERKIN's also reside on Iowa Street. SCAROBOROUGH and his wife are troublesome neighbors because they are always suspicious of the neighbors and attempting to check out any unidentified contacts these neighbors have in the neighborhood. It seems that the TERRELLS, who reside at 320 Iowa Street may have had some kind of trouble with the SCAROBOROUGHs, the Klan or the SDG because about two months ago when Mrs. TERRELL was returning to her home at about 2:30 a.m. accompanied by her mother, MARY ETHEL LEWIS, and her sister, from a dance WAYNE REED, who is a close associate of SCAROBOROUGH, was driving a white Mustang and swerved his car at the mother and attempted to run over her. Mrs. TERRELL spotted and identified REED as

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the driver of the car and REED saw her doing this as she was hiding behind the tree. REED thereafter either went into his own house or that of JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH and the mother went to her home. Some time later the mother called the daughter and was very excited claiming that somebody was trying to break into her house. The daughter started to get ready to go to her mother's aid, but before she was dressed and left the house she received another call from her mother telling her it was no longer necessary because she had driven the two burglars off with a .22 caliber rifle. The mother claims she fired nine shots at the men and that she heard one of the men scream. The daughter claimed that when she went outside right after the second phone call she noted that WAYNE REED's Mustang was missing from where he had previously parked it about a hour before. The daughter claimed the Ferriday Police investigated the incident and NO T-13 upon recontact had no additional information as to whether WAYNE REED was ever identified as being one of the participants in the attempted burglary of the mother's house.

NO T-1 advised on October 23, 1967, that SCARBOROUGH is still enthusiastic about his current efforts to organize a Minuteman Chapter. SCARBOROUGH has now advised that the Minutemen nationwide were going to go underground in three or four weeks and that they would discontinue using the cover address "Biolab" Corporation, Norborne, Missouri. SCARBOROUGH commented that a new address will be used for the underground operation, but the exact address was not known to NO T-1 at this time. During mid October, 1967, SCARBOROUGH expressed an interest in knowing the location of warehouses in New Orleans, Louisiana, which store explosives for shipment to South Viet Nam. SCARBOROUGH bragged that he had a contact in New Orleans, not otherwise identified that could provide him with this information. SCARBOROUGH recently has been attempting to convert his M-1 carbine to a M-2 (fully automatic), but still needed and was still looking for three additional parts to complete the conversion.

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On October 19, 1967, SCARBOROUGH mentioned to associates that he had recently been interviewed by a Federal Bureau of Investigation Agent who allegedly accused him of sending a threatening letter to T. L. JONES, a SDG member who was the suspect as an informant. SCARBOROUGH claimed he certainly did not want to see that Agent any more. SCARBOROUGH is always very interested in obtaining ammunition, weapons, and explosives and it is believed that those materials which SCARBOROUGH can acquire are probably being stockpiled. During mid October, 1967, SCARBOROUGH and WILLIAM GUTHRIE were attempting to locate a place for Guerrilla warfare training somewhere in the vicinity of Harrisonburg, Louisiana. SCARBOROUGH has been overheard on occasion to brag that while in the military service he had been a demolition expert.

NO T-14 advised on October 27, 1967, that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER was holding a SDG meeting on October 29, 1967.

NO T-14 advised that SCARBOROUGH was one of those who went to the meeting. Upon arrival at the meeting place, which was a hunting lodge, the gate was found locked and one of the parties in attendance crawled over the gate and checked the house and found it vacant. After this it was believed that the three proceeding them to this meeting had possibly gone hunting in the nearby woods in order to kill deer or other meat. Those remaining held a meeting outside the gate and discussion centered around stockpiling of weapons and ammunition and one of those present knew about some air base in Louisiana, which was closing down which might be a source of more ammunition. "RED" GLOVER gave a demonstration with two handy-talkie radios and claimed that by taping down the transmitter button on one of these radios it could be placed in his car, truck or house and that he could monitor this transmitter unit with the other unit and would be able to hear Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents or others who tried to get near his property without his knowledge.

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NO T-7 advised on October 31, 1967, that on October 30, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH had been observed in Ferriday, Louisiana. At this time SCAROBOROUGH was wearing a cap bearing an emblem of the National Rifle Association. SCAROBOROUGH did not discuss SDG or Minutemen, but limited the conversation to the upcoming Louisiana elections and expressed a hope that Congressman JOHN R. RARICK would be successful as the Klans sponsored candidate for Louisiana Governor.

NO T-4 advised on October 31, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH was one of nine or ten individuals who attended a meeting of the SDG at the hunting lodge of E. D. MORACE and PAUL TOLBERT near Ferriday, Louisiana, during the afternoon of October 29, 1967. The meeting was held at the gate entering on the property and consisted of a discussion about firearms and explosives which was led by SCAROBOROUGH. This hunting lodge where the meeting was held had originally been built as a place of safety for the wives and children of Klansmen during some future time when their husbands were expected to be away from home busy fighting rioters. SCAROBOROUGH also mentioned that his rifle club has been successful and several men have been attending recent meetings. SCAROBOROUGH stressed the need for all men present to have arms and ammunition available to fight the Negroes when they started a revolution.

NO T-4 had the same information about RED GLOVER and the handy-talkies. SCAROBOROUGH, along with two others, left the meeting area to go into the hunting lodge area to see about planting some oats in order to attract deer into the area. While RED GLOVER was talking about the handy-talkies, he claimed that these sets could also be used to ~~FIND~~ electronic bugs, meaning microphones, and he thereafter demonstrated by testing the hunting lodge and the car of MORACE and claimed that there were no bugs in this area. GLOVER is very leery over investigation of his activities and he told those present that when he holds this handy-talkie near his living room divan the handy-talkie "goes crazy" so he is sure that the divan is bugged. GLOVER was really disturbed over this and said he had also torn the divan all apart, but could not find the bug.

NO T-1 advised on October 27, 1967, that recently JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH has been refusing to discuss Minutemen activities in not only his own house, but any house or vehicle for fear that they are bugged. SCAROBOROUGH and his close associate, WILLIAM GUTHRIE, are thoroughly imbued with the item that there is an upcoming revolution. SCAROBOROUGH claims that he knew of a parish in Northern Louisiana (later ascertained to be Union Parish) where the Minutemen could go when the revolution begins. In the meantime, it is SCAROBOROUGH's intention to use parts of this parish for Guerrilla warfare training. He claimed that this parish was so isolated that he could "blow" three bridges and isolate the parish from outsiders. He further alleged that the sheriff of the parish was a good Klansmen and could be counted on in times of emergency.

SCAROBOROUGH also claims to be a personal acquaintance of the head of the Minuteman DE PUGH. SCAROBOROUGH at this time claimed he is actively looking for "good men" for membership in the Minutemen and SCAROBOROUGH bragged that he knew of about 24 men that he could get to join the unit. SCAROBOROUGH indirectly indicated that these 24 men were members of the SDG plus a few Klansmen who have broken away from the Klan because the Klan was not violent enough for them. SCAROBOROUGH likewise has been advocating that a list of all Jews and politicians that he does not like in Natchez, Mississippi and the surrounding area should be made up so that these individuals, particularly in Natchez in the event of a revolution, could be killed after which the Minutemen would retreat across the Mississippi River Bridge at Natchez. SCAROBOROUGH and WILLIAM GUTHRIE are also perturbed because GUTHRIE recently had been interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation about activities of the Minutemen and the National Rifle Association Chapter and it was obvious that there must be an information leak. SCAROBOROUGH and GUTHRIE were inclined to attribute this leak to an old time Klan associate, but to date have not been overheard to identify this suspect individual by name.

GUTHRIE and SCAROBOROUGH in discussing Minutemen and the National Rifle Association unit frequently brought up the names of JIM WALKER and H. L. HINT and they sometimes gave the impression that WALKER (who they admire greatly) is the head of the Minutemen organization.

NO T-1 furnished a copy of the October 19, 1967, bulletin, which shows a mailing address for the organization of P. O. Box 57, Independence., Missouri. The following is a copy of this bulletin:

"All shall be usurped from the States, and the government of all be consolidated into one. This I am opposed; because when all government, domestic and foreign, is little as in great things, shall be drawn to Washington as the center of all power, it will render powerless the checks provided of one government over another, and will become as venal and oppressive as the government from which we separated."

A good pair of shoes will cost you \$30.00 to \$35. The shoes should have hard rubber lugs which will grip slippery surfaces. They should be about 6" to 7" in height to provide ankle support. They should not be tight, but allow the wearing of one pair of heavy shoes and one pair of light socks.

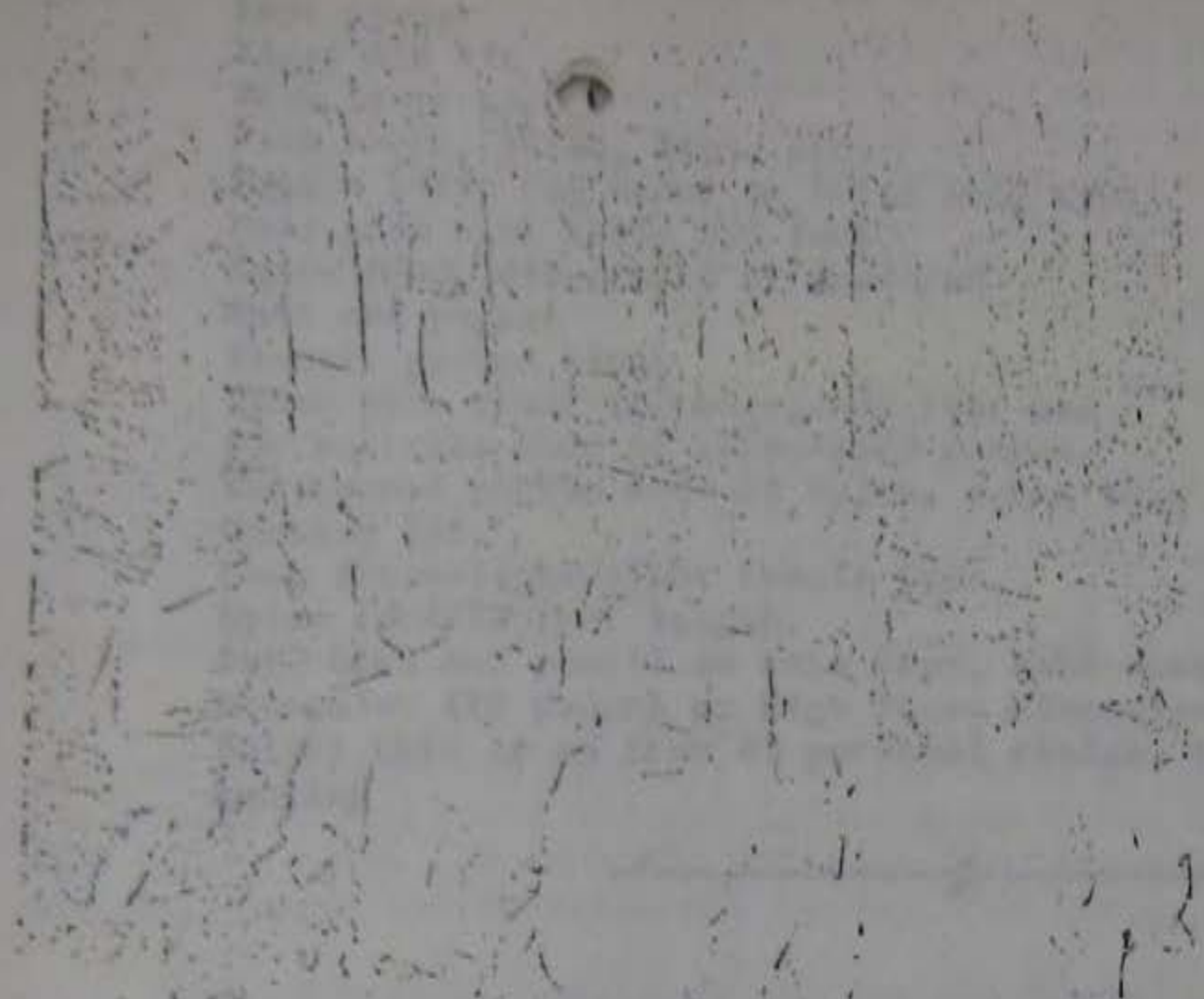
A good pack frame is also necessary. It should be of lightweight aluminum with a nylon pack bag. It should be carried high and close to the body to allow maximum comfort. The better the bag, the longer you will be able to carry the load. Forty dollars may seem steep, but when you consider the load you will be carrying, it will prove a bargain.

In purchasing a sleeping bag, there are no financial short cuts. If possible you should buy a 100% down bag. It will cost approximately \$90.00 to \$100.00. The 100% down bag will roll up into a tight bundle and when fluffed out will trap the air between the down. Feather-filled bags are about 80% as warm as down bags. The least desirable is the Dacron-filled bag as it does not compress into as small a pack and is not warm enough in really cold weather.

Sometimes down filled sleeping bags can be obtained at lower prices from government surplus. If you do get a dacron filled bag it should contain a minimum of six to eight pounds of fill.

Flannel pajamas should be used to sleep in so as to let other clothing air out at night. Skin diseases develop quickly where the same clothes are worn both day and night.

with a high throat count are necessary for protection from the wind. It is
phenomenal how the use of body heat
can be used to take out sentries.

7. Let us suppose that a person is living in a house with a reinforced concrete basement. The floor is reinforced with steel rods and wire. This reinforcement will cause a detector to give loud signals everywhere and a metal object buried therein cannot be found because the signals are the same throughout. In this case a burial can be made in the floor and a piece of metal sheet placed over the object before the new concrete is poured over the opened hole. In this case the signals will remain the same as stated above.

8. In case a big cache is planned in a reinforced concrete basement and a part of it can be sealed off with a wall that will not arouse suspicion, then, naturally, a brick wall will have to be built, and in doing so, small nails, iron filings and lathe cuttings will have to be put in the mortar between the bricks. The mortar used to plaster the new wall must be free of this metal or suspicion will be aroused. It is also best to place the objects in question right in the middle of the new room or the far end.

9. If a secret or hidden room can be found in a building that is not made of reinforced concrete then the metal objects must be placed in the middle of the room, and not leaned against the wall, or the detector will locate them. Be sure the distance from the wall to the objects is enough to cause the detector not to register them.

10. The safest place of all for the burial of metal objects is a cave of which the entrance can be closed and made to look natural with the rest of the surroundings.

I have taken time out on this trip to give you the product of years of experience with a metal detector that I have used under almost all circumstances. If it is of help, well and good. If not, toss these suggestions in the nearest wastebasket.

Let me add that as water is an excellent conductor, damp or wet earth is a better conductor than dry earth. After earth has been dug up it takes about a year or two for it to become packed sufficiently to ensure good conduction of detector signals. These waves penetrate water, concrete and what have you but bounce off of metal, hence the signal.

NO T-9 advised on September 19, 1967, that SCAROBOROUGH, about late 1964, was one of a group of Klansmen and Silver Dollar Group (SDG) members who tried to secure the help of E. L. MC DANIEL, who was then a Province investigator in the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) in Mississippi to handle three "projects" (involving harassment of Negroes) for his Louisiana group of Klansmen. One of these projects as recalled by NO T-9 had to do with FRANK MORRIS, a Ferriday, Louisiana Negro Shoe Repair Shop. MC DANIEL allegedly declined the projects without having time to verify the allegations the Louisiana group had against the Negroes. Someone was supposed to have notified MC DANIEL that the Mississippi Klansmen need take no further action because it would be handled by the Louisiana group. A day or so later FRANK MORRIS was burned to death and his shop destroyed by fire.

NO T-9 advised on September 26, 1967, that the SDG held a meeting on October 1, 1967, at a hunting lodge "on the levee", but it was announced beforehand that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH would not be present at this meeting because his wife was undergoing surgery.

NO T-12 advised on September 20, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH was one of a group of SDG members who attended a fish fry meeting of the group held at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE during the summer of 1965. At this meeting some of the group attempted to make explosives and test them, but the ingredients they used were totally ineffective. Among those listed as present by NO T-12 were as follows:

some others not named at this time.

NO T-5 advised on September 26, 1967, that at the time E. L. MC DANIEL was Province Titan of the WKKKKKOM, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER or JAMES SCAROBOROUGH had made contact with E. L. MC DANIEL to handle some (Negro) project. The initial contact to set up a meeting of the Louisiana Klansmen and MC DANIEL was supposed to have been arranged by REGGIE P. CARTER. Thereafter two of the Mississippi group met with GLOVER and SCAROBOROUGH in Louisiana. REGGIE CARTER at this meeting left the group momentarily and then returned to the Louisiana Group and announced that MC DANIEL would not give his authority for any project.

NO T-5 stated that if this occurred at the time MC DANIEL was an investigator for WKKKKKOM that the incident could not be related to the FRANK MORRIS murder which occurred in 1964.

NO T-5 placed the time when MC DANIEL was a WKKKKKOM investigator as being 1963.

NO T-1 advised on September 29, 1967, that during late September, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH was part of a group of SDG members attempting a "shoot" or target practice, located on land near Lake St. John, Louisiana. This shoot was sponsored by the newly formed Concordia Rifle and Pistol Club, Ferriday, Louisiana. At this practice SCAROBOROUGH fired a .22 caliber Reuger, a 7 millimeter Mauser rifle, a 30-06 Remington, a 357 Magnum Highway Patrol Pistol, and a .22 Remington automatic rifle.

NO T-1 also advised that SCAROBOROUGH was one of those in attendance at a NRA Chapter meeting held on September 28, 1967, in the office of VIRGIL WRIGHT, in Ferriday, Louisiana City Hall. WRIGHT was overheard to comment to those present from Mississippi that a branch of the Minutemen was likely to be organized in the Natchez, Mississippi area. SCAROBOROUGH announced that the individuals to be in control of the Minutemen organization in Ferriday, Louisiana, will be VIRGIL WRIGHT and WILLIAM GUTHRIE and possibly others.

SCAROBOROUGH has been overheard claiming to associates that he has handled loading equipment for various types of ammunition such as 243 Remington, 6 millimeter Remington, 7 millimeter Remington, 30-06 rifle, 38 carbine and 44 Magnum.

NO T-5 advised on October 3, 1967, concerning the burning of the Carrio Drive-In on Highway 84 between Vidalia and Ferriday, Louisiana, during late 1963 or 1964 and also concerning the burning of a Negro night club near Ferriday, Louisiana, during the same period.

NO T-5 advised that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH along with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER and other individuals who are now SDG members had something to do with these two incidents at least in the planning stage.

NO T-5 noted that these two projects were carried out a few months after the plans were made. NO T-1, however, claimed that he has not had definite information at this time that SCAROBOROUGH participated in the actual burnings.

NO T-13 advised on September 22, 1967, that some time back a Ferriday Negro, who was then employed two or three blocks from where SCAROBOROUGH lived on Iowa Street drove through SCAROBOROUGH's neighborhood. SCAROBOROUGH was disturbed over this and he approached several of his Klan and SDG associates asking them if they would help out in the event there was any racial trouble with this Negro.

NO T-4, on November 7, 1967, advised that recently, when NORMAN HEAD had pawned his carbine at a Natchez, Mississippi, pawn shop, it was JAMES SCAROBOROUGH who loaned HEAD the money with which to redeem the gun. HEAD pawned this gun, according to NO T-4, at the time when the "Feds" got hot on carbines. Since getting the gun out of the pawn shop, HEAD was overheard to tell someone that he was going to take this gun to SCAROBOROUGH and leave it with him until such time as he can repay SCAROBOROUGH for the cost of the pawn ticket. This gun, with the addition of three parts, can be made fully automatic. HEAD is still active, along with SCAROBOROUGH, in the SDG.

NO T-9 advised on November 8, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH has not been attending recent SDG meetings because SCAROBOROUGH is angry with E. D. MORACE. SCAROBOROUGH's difference of opinion with MORACE is because MORACE, at times, is allegedly inclined to drink and run around with women. SCAROBOROUGH has not lost his interest in the SDG as an organization and at the time the last SDG meeting was held, SCAROBOROUGH and another individual drove by the meeting place, but they did not stop and attend.

NO T-1 advised on November 10, 1967, that during early November, 1967, SCAROBOROUGH was overheard to comment that there was now an excellent National Rifle Association (NRA) chapter in Monroe, Louisiana, and it was SCAROBOROUGH's implication that the Monroe NRA might possibly be another cover chapter for the Minutemen. TOMMY LEE JONES is still somewhat suspected in SDG and Minutemen circles of being an informant but recently SCAROBOROUGH told some of his associates that JONES is alright. SCAROBOROUGH does not feel that JONES should be admitted to the Minutemen organization at present because he is under too much pressure from the FBI. SDG leader RALEIGH "RED" GLOVER and SDG member ED MORACE are still active in the Ferriday, Louisiana, area. WILLIAM GUTHRIE, one of SCAROBOROUGH's close associates in SCAROBOROUGH's Minutemen Unit, has been overheard to express dislike of MORACE and has made statements that he, GUTHRIE, did not want to be seen in public with MORACE. Some of these

statements were made in the presence of SCAROBOROUGH while they were driving out toward ED MORACE's hunting lodge and because GUTHRIE was so unhappy with MORACE, the car in which GUTHRIE was riding did not stop at the hunting lodge. SCAROBOROUGH's belief in the Minutemen organization is still very strong and at this time, he and some of his associates have been practicing maneuvers in some of the swamp area near Ferriday. SCAROBOROUGH, although still extremely interested in the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club, was unable to attend its meeting on November 9, 1967, because he had to work late.

NO T-3 advised on November 15, 1967, that an SDG meeting was held on November 12, 1967, at Ferriday, Louisiana. The club assembled at a restaurant but later adjourned to the residence of one of the members, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD. Only four showed up and the meeting consisted of conversation rather than organization business. The conversation led to a discussion as to why SDG member JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH has not been attending any of the meetings. RALEIGH GLOVER, the SDG leader, claimed that SCAROBOROUGH was now afraid that GLOVER and MORACE would get him in trouble. RALEIGH GLOVER is still planning and trying to organize a project for the SDG to build ammunition bunkers in the vicinity of Vidalia-Ferriday-Natchez. These bunkers would also be used to store firearms and explosives and GLOVER seemed to favor the area around Harrisonburg as the site of the first bunker.

NO T-11 advised on November 16, 1967, that it has now come out in discussion among SDG members in Ferriday that the reason WAYNE REED and his wife, MARTHA, moved away from their home on Iowa Street, which is next door to SCAROBOROUGH's home was because of the unhealthy influence that Mrs. REED thought SCAROBOROUGH had over her husband. Mrs. REED recently was overheard to comment that the only reason they lived on Iowa Street to begin with was because SCAROBOROUGH had wanted them to. Mrs. REED further complained that SCAROBOROUGH and his wife, DOROTHY, are obsessed with the notion of trying to prevent integration from being "forced on them". NO T-11 heard recently that Mr. and Mrs. REED are seriously thinking about moving out of Ferriday to Australia. If the REEDS make this move, there is a possibility that they may leave in the next four or five months.

NO T-15 advised on November 2, 1967, that during the time WESLEY WARREN was the Exalted Cyclops of the Monterey, Louisiana, OKKKK Unit, JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH visited that Klavern on at least two occasions and spoke to the members. NO T-15 was not sure if SCAROBOROUGH, during these talks, spoke of racial violence or if SCAROBOROUGH had made any inquiry among the members as to whether or not there was any harassment of Negroes in the Monterey area.

NO T-13 advised on November 15, 1967, that JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH is a close associate of WILLIAM GUTHRIE and a Mr. AVANTS. The AVANTS' children and the GUTHRIE children attend the same school in Clayton, Louisiana, along with the children of SCAROBOROUGH. The reason for this is that they want their children to go the Clayton School in order to avoid attendance in the integrated school system in Ferriday.

NO T-16 advised on November 22, 1967, that some of the members of SCAROBOROUGH's Minutemen Unit are being selected from the ranks of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club, an NRA Chapter. At this time, according to NO T-6, the only person known to definitely be members of the Minutemen are JAMES SCAROBOROUGH of Ferriday and possibly R. S. "SCOTTIE" WRIGHT, a former Exalted Cyclops of the Ferriday-Clayton Unit of the old Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. There has been some attempt, possibly by SCOTTIE WRIGHT, a couple of weeks ago, to recruit a Ferriday Police Officer into the NRA club and likewise into the Minutemen organization by its leader and organizer, JAMES SCAROBOROUGH. SCAROBOROUGH was also described as being a member of the Ferriday-Clayton OKKKK Unit, who is now engaged in organizing a Ferriday Minutemen Unit. President of the NRA Chapter, according to NO T-16, is VIRGIL WRIGHT, who is employed by the State of Louisiana Motor Vehicle Department, to run the Driver's License Office at the Concordia Parish Court House. NO T-16 was not sure at this time whether WRIGHT was also a Minuteman.

NO T-1 advised on November 20, 1967, that the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club held a meeting on November 16, 1967, at VIRGIL WRIGHT's office in the Ferriday, Louisiana City Hall. JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, a known Silver Dollar Group member, and a Ferriday, Louisiana, Minuteman organizer

was unable to attend this meeting because he was working overtime at International Paper Company in Natchez. Plans were made to stake out and construct a rifle range to be located on a Mr. SAXON's property near Lake St. John, Louisiana, on November 21, 1967. The members at this meeting elected the following officers of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club:

VIRGIL WRIGHT - President
JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH - Vice-President
WILLIAM GUTHRIE - Secretary-Treasurer

WRIGHT appears also to have some connection with the Minutemen because he has been overheard to claim that he was constructing an area in his house where he would be able to hide items of a secret nature. WRIGHT apparently is following Minutemen instructions set out in the organization's pamphlets concerning this construction. The Pistol and Rifle Club still has permission to meet at the Ferriday Private School. It appears that SCAROBOROUGH is the primary force behind both the Rifle Club and Minutemen organization at this time. There was some discussion that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD is the individual who SCAROBOROUGH has been referring to recently as being his Minutemen group commander.

NO T-1 advised on November 15, 1967, that there was a Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club "shoot" (target practice) planned in the future for a location near Lake St. John, Louisiana. SCAROBOROUGH is still concerned about the possibility of future racial violence but during the course of this target practice, SCAROBOROUGH made no mention concerning his attempts to organize the Minutemen. A while later in Natchez, Mississippi SCAROBOROUGH did indicate to another group of close associates that he was recruiting for a possible Minutemen chapter in the Natchez, Mississippi, area. SCAROBOROUGH is currently trying to locate possible sources of .22 and .45 caliber ammunition for purchase in the Natchez area.

NO T-17, advised on November 20, 1967, that during a recent discussion among SDG members, the subject of the fire death of FRANK MORRIS, the Negro shoe shop owner, in Ferriday, Louisiana, came up. It seems that a recent article in a magazine called "Grit" brought on the discussion. The article indicated that MORRIS, when he was killed, was held at gun point and that he was shot with a flame thrower, and the discussion brought out that that is about the way it happened. One of the SDG men described a homemade machine powered with a 6 or 12 volt battery was used and this machine was capable of spraying five gallons of burning gasoline on a building in five seconds. Someone asked what MORRIS did and someone else seemed to know how MORRIS was able to get out of his shoe shop after it had been set on fire.

NO T-17 was of the opinion that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH was one of the four or five who was involved in MORRIS' death. RALEIGH GLOVER, the SDG founder and leader, was not believed to have been on this job and it was discussed that at about that time LGOVER had backed down on doing three harassment jobs on Negroes. The SDG at this time is in a state of nerves because everybody thinks there is an informant in the group.

TOMMY LEE JONES, although still considered a SDG member, is now and has been considered somewhat a suspect as the informer.

NO T-9 advised on November 20, 1967, that the intensive investigation currently being conducted into the SDG, the activities of GLOVER, and the SDG members, has caused a great deal of discussion inside the group.

NO T-9's belief is that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and three other SDG members had something to do with the murder of FRANK MORRIS. This opinion is not based on first hand information, but on what NO T-9 has heard during discussions among SDG members.

The homemade flame thrower consisted of the following elements:

A 12 volt battery (for automatic starting)

A power steering pump from a tractor

A hose and a pistol grip nozzle

NO T-9, at this time, was unable to develop information as to the location of this flame thrower now or to further substantiate the hearsay information received.

NO T-4 advised on December 7, 1967, that as of December 7, 1967, JAMES SCAROBOROUGH, deliberately stayed away from R. J. GLOVER and E. D. RICE because SCAROBOROUGH is afraid these two men might get into serious trouble.

NO T-7 advised on December 6, 1967, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and his son, KENNY SCAROBOROUGH, were observed hunting on December 2, 1967. Later, SCAROBOROUGH was overheard telling LAWRENCE HARRINGTON that he should join the National Rifle Association (NRA) Chapter in Ferriday, and that if he did so, he would be able to purchase a good rifle through the NRA. It seems that HARRINGTON had recently purchased a .30 caliber rifle from the Otasco Store in the Lewis Shopping Center near Ferriday, and the discussion of HARRINGTON's new weapon, caused SCAROBOROUGH to make this comment about the NRA.

NO T-18 advised on December 6, 1967, that SCAROBOROUGH is still hard at work trying to organize his Minutemen Chapter in the Ferriday, Louisiana, area. The open address for the Minutemen organization is Post Office Box 68, Norborne, Missouri, but another address, which is possibly a cover for the Minutemen is entitled: Chairman, Post Office Box 111, St. Peters, Missouri. There is set out below a sample of the Minutemen circulars and forms which SCAROBOROUGH gives out to trusted applicants during the recruiting process:

57-34-7479
6. The word, "Minutemen" had once become little more than a faint echo of past history. Now it has again become a familiar term. Who can say how far reaching the subtle effects may be of having this one word re-introduced into common usage by our citizens?

7. We have, by long years of trial and error, developed a new concept of total resistance suitable to the peculiar characteristics of this nation and its people-- a unique form of civilian defense that offers a real possibility of saving our nation from communism where no hope existed before.

8. While the bureaucratic dictatorship in Washington, D.C. has tried to disguise itself as a benign welfare state, the mere presence of the Minutemen organization has provoked it into showing its real nature to thousands of other citizens and helped in this way to alert more people to the true danger facing our constitutional republic.

9. The Minutemen have researched, written, printed and distributed vast quantities of training material on resistance warfare. We did so when virtually nothing else of this type was available. We are still the only private American organization to have originated new material in this field and to have produced it in worthwhile amounts. This material has been of value, not only to members of the Minutemen but to many individuals and other organizations throughout the free world.

10. We have provided other patriotic organizations with information on improved advertising and propaganda techniques so that the material put out by them would be better received and more effective.

11. The Minutemen have served as a communications center for several other conservative organizations, thus providing unity of purpose and coordination that did not previously exist.

12. The Minutemen have tested and given our members practice in various underground techniques of communications, surveillance, escape and evasion, recruiting and similar skills that are absolutely essential to a final victory over our communist enemies.

13. Our members, working individually and in small groups have stockpiled tens of thousands of firearms and several million rounds of ammunition plus communications equipment, medical supplies, extra clothing, medicine, printing presses, paper and similar items that are sure to be restricted by any dictatorship. Much of this material has been carefully hidden or buried in sealed caches where it will last for years and still be usable when all other sources are exhausted.

14. The Minutemen have taken the blunt of the legal harassment by pro-socialist forces in our federal bureaucracy which might otherwise have been directed against other conservatives. We have fought legal battles that acted in the defence of all Americans generally as to their continued right to own and bear arms.

15. We have learned many lessons the hard way when that is the only way to learn them-- we have, however, learned them at a time when mistakes cost only time and money-- not lives.

16. We have developed a reasonably efficient and secure communications system between various areas-- still far from perfect but a great deal better than nothing at all.

What Have the Minutemen Accomplished?

This is a question we often hear from our own members as well as from other conservatives. What do we really have to show for seven years' effort? What has been accomplished by all the work and sacrifices made by our own members and by the contributions of our many friends?

There are times when even our most dedicated and hardest working members must wonder if their efforts are not in vain. The task we face is so great and what we can do each day seems so small. Have we done anything at all that has actually been effective in the fight against communism?

The truth is that we have accomplished a great deal!

As in any underground organization, many important accomplishments cannot be discussed in definite terms-- membership lists that have disappeared out of various communist headquarters,-- enemy plans that accidentally went astray,-- executive position in the enemy apparatus now held by secret members of the Minutemen.

There are many less exciting but equally important accomplishments which we can discuss and which are easily overlooked. For the morale of our own members and for the continued support of other conservatives, it is important that we occasionally review these accomplishments. We must remind ourselves from time to time of their true importance.

1. We have built a close-knit organization of several thousand members. This is the most often overlooked of our accomplishments but it is by far the most important. Those who have not gone through it can hardly imagine the time, money, effort, tact, persuasion and patience required to build such an organization-- starting with nothing and hampered every step of the way. Each and every member of this organization represents a separate accomplishment by someone, who printed a leaflet, put up a poster, recruited a friend, or mailed a letter.

Our enemies have tried to destroy the organization by every means: by infiltration, by bad publicity, by rumor campaigns against its leaders, by legal persecution. The very fact that the organization still survives and continues to grow is an accomplishment that few people can fully appreciate.

2. We have weeded out several hundred "sunshine patriots". Such people have been merely a nuisance in the past but in time of crisis they could be a danger to the lives or security of other members.

Although it might seem logical to screen these people out before they join the organization, this is not always practical. There are many situations in which the only way to test a person completely is to actually try them out.

Just as it requires time and effort to bring new people into the organization, it also requires time and effort to weed out those who can't take the pressure. Both tasks are equally important in the building of a strong organization.

3. We have identified many professional infiltrators and have passed their identities on to other conservative organizations so they could be on their guard against these agents.

There is not one of these countries in which the communists rule by the consent of the people. Everywhere they must perpetuate themselves by terror. They remain in power only through the use of the most brutal police state tactics.

The communists consider their party workers not simply as necessary to armed conquest but as the actual spearhead of any invasion into new territory. From this point of view the United States was invaded by Soviet troops more than 30 years ago. It has been authoritatively estimated that the communists now have an army of 500,000 combatants already landed on American shores and already working by the most insidious means to destroy our American way of life.

The cold war is very real. It must be fought and won. The only alternative is to lose and to lose means that future Americans for generations to come must live in terror and in slavery. Appeasement is futile. We cannot bargain with barbarians who never have and never will know the meaning of honesty.

Communism must be defeated, not merely resisted. We must rid our country of traitors and fellow travelers. We must embark on a massive offensive turning every communist trick— from propaganda to infiltration— against our mortal enemy. This is the one and only way to win the struggle for survival.

ATTENTION: Enclosed is applicants name, address, phone No. Zip code, etc. on a yellow card. If applicant does not wish to take a chance on mail being opened or lost, the enclosed application is coded in such a manner as to identify you to the unit you will be assigned to. Upon receipt of this application, your name and all pertinent data will be returned to National Headquarters. Rest assured, no one, not even qualified cryptographers, can identify you.

2. Use deceptive measures. Subscribe to one or more left-wing periodicals or get on the mailing list of some "Peace Movement". This will keep the postal inspectors guessing as to which side you are really on. Members can be of great assistance in searching this left-wing literature for names and addresses of fellow travelers and forwarding this information for our Central Intelligence files. We desperately need people to assist in this work. Please inquire as to detailed instructions.

3. Always use two envelopes in sending mail to any patriotic organization or to any other member of our organization. Do not put a return address on the outer envelope. Always mark mail addressed to National Headquarters, "Postage Guaranteed".

4. Place some opaque material such as tin foil, carbon paper, art construction paper, etc. between the inner and outer envelopes to prevent your mail from being read by infra-red cameras.

5. Always send mail from areas or post offices where you are not known.

6. Avoid loose talk, or any connection with this organization.

7. Do not write patriotic letters to newspapers or magazines under your own name, it will achieve very little except to identify you to the enemy.

8. Members of this organization are willing to make any sacrifice necessary for our country. We have a strategy which we believe can be effective and which can lead ultimately to victory. YOU must start preparing now. Our future battle will be won or lost before the first shot is fired, therefore our membership remains secret.

9. New members are thoroughly screened. The time is past when treason, disloyalty or breach of security will go unpunished.

10. Each member should realize he is an individual, should assume his responsibility as an American, use his own talent, but still be a part of the team, to be able to work in a coordinated effort in organizational plans and objectives.

NO T-18 also mentioned that SCARBOROUGH was very interested in recruiting DONNIE CRAFT as a Minuteman. CRAFT appears to be knowledgeable about the Minutemen during past conversations with him. CRAFT was one of the original members of the SDG and he is an associate of RALEIGH JACKSON "RED" GLOVER, who is the head of the SDG.

SCARBOROUGH is likewise continuing to push the organization of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club, and mentioned casually that it was okay to admit JOE LEE HARDY into the pistol club. Having HARDY join the pistol club was to make the group appear to the general public as legitimate. SCARBOROUGH explained that HARDY has a tendency to talk too much, and because the pistol club is operated on the "legit", this will be publicized.

NO T-1 advised on December 13, 1967, that a pistol club meeting was held on December 7, 1967. VIRGIL WRIGHT was notably absent from this meeting and SCARBOROUGH intimated that WRIGHT may be out of the pistol club entirely. Under SCARBOROUGH's tutelage, this group is making rather an extensive plan to go out into the woods in the near future; to camp out and to conduct maneuvers similar to conditions that would exist in case a Negro revolution occurred.

NO T-4 advised on December 19, 1967, that JAMES SCARBOROUGH as of December 16, 1967, was very disturbed and SCARBOROUGH claimed that something must be done about the white girl who is married to the Mexican boy who hangs around the Mexican fruit stand at Ferriday, Louisiana. SCARBOROUGH further commented that this girl had been associating with Negroes and she was a bad influence on other white girls.

At this time, SCARBOROUGH indicated he would ask another SDG member, JACK SEALE, to do something about this. SCARBOROUGH owns an archers bow which is part of his collection of deadly weapons and SCARBOROUGH is described as being a deadly shot with this weapon. This apparently is why SCARBOROUGH has the nickname "INDIAN", and according to NO T-4, this nickname has been with him for a long time.

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NO T-4 advised on December 27, 1967, that there is a tire raffle currently being conducted by RAULEIGH JACKSON GLOVER to help GLOVER defray some of his legal expenses and court costs following his investigation by local authorities on a whole series of incidents involving thefts. JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH helped GLOVER in this project by selling tickets. It was later determined by NO T-4 that the proceeds of this raffle, instead of being for GLOVER, were to be turned over to Silver Dollar Group (SDG) member MYRON JACK SEALE, who is heading up a committee of local Klansmen to handle the proceeds from other raffles currently being held to provide funds for the defense of the Klansmen under indictment at Meridian, Mississippi.

NO T-3 advised on December 28, 1967 that SCARBOROUGH was overheard on December 21, 1967 to claim that he was through with his associates involved in opposing segregation. At the time SCARBOROUGH did not identify the individuals he was through with but inferred that he was through with GLOVER and E.D. MORACE. This comment came up because SCARBOROUGH recently has been noticeably absent from SDG members and this appears to substantiate information from other informants mentioned elsewhere, that SCARBOROUGH was scared of GLOVER and MORACE because SCARBOROUGH felt that they would get him in trouble.

NO T-1 advised on December 20, 1967, that SCARBOROUGH is still pushing the organization of the Minutemen in this area. SCARBOROUGH told others that CHARLES DAVID SMITH has now been approved for membership in the Minutemen. T-1 also ascertained that the National Rifle Association (NRA), Ferriday Chapter and its leader VIRGIL WRIGHT had apparently received a letter from the national NRA headquarters which upset SCARBOROUGH. SCARBOROUGH did not fully indicate the contents of the NRA letter but told NO T-1 that the letter included some type of list of subversive organizations.

NO T-1 advised on January 3, 1968 that as of December 30, 1967 SCARBOROUGH was highly pleased because JEWELL LEE BURT had joined the Minutemen chapter. SCARBOROUGH is still pushing the organization and would like to recruit E.L. "TINY" LEWIS into the Minutemen because LEWIS has a wide personal following and prestige among Klansmen in the Natchez, Mississippi area. At this time SCARBOROUGH was very disturbed over the acquittal of ERNEST H. AVANTS several months ago on charges involving the murder of BEN CHESTER WHITE. SCARBOROUGH is suspicious of the AVANTS acquittal because he thinks AVANTS was acquitted because he turned states evidence and is now willing to testify against a "co-defendant in the same case, CLAUDE FULLER, accordingly SCARBOROUGH, must reserve his opinion on AVANTS until after the FULLER trial.

NO T-1 advised on January 14, 1968 that as of January 9, 1968 SCARBOROUGH expressed the desire to step up his actions concerning his Minuteman unit. SCARBOROUGH admits using the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club as a cover for some of his Minuteman activities and a source for recruitment of new members. SCARBOROUGH, during a discussion on January 12, 1968, indicated that there is possibly a Minuteman organization being considered ~~for~~ Union Parish in Louisiana, but according to NO T-1 this is not yet definite. SCARBOROUGH also spoke well about WALTER WAYNE REED, who was formerly associated with SCARBOROUGH in Minuteman and SDG work and described REED as a good man but mentioned that REED's wife MARTHA prevented REED from participating in Klan and Minuteman activities. SCARBOROUGH's son received a Christmas card from the National Rifle Association headquarters in Washington, D.C., granting the son one years free membership in the NRA.

NO T-8 advised on January 5, 1968 that a man by the name of SCARBOROUGH, whose first name he did not know, but who had at one time come from the Bastrop, Louisiana area, was one of several Klansmen who attended a meeting held on December 26, 1967. Plans were discussed at this meeting for the future election of a Grand Titan for the Original Ku Klux Klan of America (OKA) and plans were made to assist the Oakgrove OKA unit

in sponsoring the OKA meeting planned for January 7, 1968.

NO T-19 advised on January 19, 1968 that SCARBOROUGH was one of either five or six members who attended a meeting of the Concordia Rifle and Pistol Club on January 18, 1968, held at the office of the Louisiana drivers examiners in Ferriday, Louisiana. There was a discussion about choosing a site for future "shoot outs" or target practices. And there was likewise a discussion concerning the unit's possible purchase of camouflage clothing.

NO T-7 advised on January 10, 1968 that JAMES SCARBOROUGH still works at International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, he still resides at the same address on Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana and he drives a 1957 black GMC pickup truck which has a red pipe frame on the body which extends out over the cab of the truck. SCARBOROUGH also has a 1964 Dodge, saddle tan metallic colored, four door sedan, but NO T-7, at this time, did not know the 1968-69 tag numbers for these vehicles.

NO T-7 advised on January 11, 1968 that SCARBOROUGH's Concordia Rifle and Pistol Club are currently trying to obtain an ammunition loading van. VIRGIL WRIGHT, the president of the club, has plans to convert a trailer into this type of van and the plan is that the van would be hauled to the various sites where the club will be holding target practice. WRIGHT, as of January 11, 1968 was trying to find a suitable location for a new target range.

NO T-1 advised on January 22, 1968, that JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH was one of four who attended a meeting of the Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club held on the evening of January 18, 1968. At this meeting SCARBOROUGH told the group that NRA headquarters in Washington, D.C. had turned the club down on its request for a NRA charter. The \$20 and the individual memberships submitted were returned. SCARBOROUGH suggested that the club should keep this secret and continue to meet under the pretext that they had received a charter from the NRA. SCARBOROUGH is actively engaged in organizing and promoting the

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Minuteman Organization. A sample of some of the promotional material used in the recruitment of new members is as follows:

JANUARY BULLETIN

We have several important items to bring to our members' attention this month and with the new postage rate in effect, we will try to be as brief as possible.

Item 1. First, we want to thank those of you who sent the many wonderful Christmas cards which we received this year.

December was an especially good month for those of us who work at National Headquarters. For the first time in many months we had enough money come in to operate with real efficiency. For quite a while we had been operating on a day to day basis. We had been so far behind in paying our utility bill that we could never know when the lights, gas, water or phone might be shut off.

It's a wonderful feeling to have the material available to work effectively and I hope that our members will continue to send in enough extra contributions to maintain this state of affairs.

Item 2. We are continuing our extensive reorganization.

For several months we have been gradually changing our organizational pattern from a series of para-military bands into a large number of resistance networks. This has been done because we feel that the resistance type organization more closely meets our requirements under the present circumstances in which we have to operate.

So far, about 2,000 networks have been set up. Not all of these networks are fully operational and there are still additional members as yet unassigned. Still, this work is progressing in a satisfactory manner and when its complete, it should result in much closer contact between individual members while preserving the necessary security.

The upper areas of our organization are also being reorganized for greater efficiency. As originally planned, each member of the Executive Council had a specific area of responsibility. During the intervening years, three members of the council have died and the division of labor has been neglected. At a secret meeting held recently, three new people were elected to the executive council after having been selected from among our most dependable area coordinators.

Now we have once again divided our work into ten separate departments with one member of the Executive Council responsible for each department. To assist in filing and communication, new identification numbers have been assigned to each council member and to the department they represent as follows:

Item 3. It is ~~no~~ impossible to know what the final outcome may be of the legal cases now pending against the National Coordinator and certain other organizational leaders. The present situation is this: These men have been convicted and presently face penitentiary sentences of from two to four years each. All of those sentences have been appealed and all are out on bond. We are now waiting a decision from the district court as to whether or not a new trial will be granted.

If a new trial is granted, then we will, in effect, start the legal battle all over but with a new deck of cards. If this appeal is turned down, then a further appeal will be made to the United States Supreme Court.

The time required for all these legal maneuvers will probably extend up to or past the time of the 1968 elections. As that time approaches, we can determine further how the national organization will be effected.

This continued legal effort depends, of course, on the continued financial support of our members. It is very expensive but we feel worthwhile to exhaust every possible legal maneuver to keep three important leaders of the organization free and active in their present duties.

Item 4. During the past few months we have received a record number of new membership applications. In many areas the processing of these new members is far behind schedule. This bulletin (or copies of it) will be received by many new members who have not heard from us before. From these people we ask continued patience so that you may be contacted in another manner as soon as possible.

Item 5. It is very important that all communications to National Headquarters include your identification number. We have many thousand of membership files divided up among several secret locations. All of them are listed by number and not by name. If we receive a letter that does not have an identification number (or has the number given incorrectly) it is almost impossible for us to locate that member's file.

Every week we get letters from people asking why they have not yet received some material that they ordered. When we check into it we usually find that their original order did not include their correct I.D. Number. For example, we are still holding several sets of M.G. Plans because we can't find the proper address to send them.

If you are not certain of your I.D. No. please write giving the approximate date you joined the organization and to what address your application was submitted.

Item 6. A considerable number of new pieces of literature is now in preparation. Samples will be sent to all members in a special bulletin from our new Director of Propaganda in a few days.

Item 7. A third edition of Blueprint for Victory will be available soon. This new edition has additional material and revisions emphasizing the concept of total resistance and outlining the future plans for combined political-military resistance to the forces of tyranny.

Item 8. We have extra copies of some old organizational bulletins that might be of interest to our newer members. These, along with books for recommended reading are available through the national organization and may be ordered on this month's Report Form.

FROM: 001300, Director of Recruiting and Training

Item 1. WINTER TRAINING. Excellent locations have been selected and most of our plans are complete for two winter sessions in cold weather operations and survival. The number of members desiring to attend these sessions has been considerably greater than expected. It is doubtful if our instructors can take time off from their regular employment for a third session but we will try to arrange it if possible. Even if a third session can be arranged we will only be able to accommodate less than half of those that have indicated a desire to attend. We will try to give preference to those who will later be in the best position to pass what they have learned on to a maximum number of other members.

Item 2. INTELLIGENCE TRAINING. The curriculum of our summer school on espionage and infiltration has been expanded to a full three-months course including a broad selection of subjects relating to resistance warfare and clandestine operations. Here too, the number of students already waiting for our 1963 summer sessions is approaching the maximum number we can have. Preference will continue to be given to younger members who are planning to return to college in the fall or those who seek full time employment with the Minutemen organization. Those desiring to attend next summer's training should write to this department to make reservations without further delay.

Item 3. CORRESPONDENCE TRAINING. Some of our newer members may not be familiar with the correspondence training courses given by our organization. The preliminary course includes five phases as follows:

- Phase I - Policies of the Minutemen organization
- Phase II - Intelligence
- Phase III - Security
- Phase IV - Propaganda
- Phase V - Recruiting

We have been out of some of this material for the last few weeks but a new supply is being printed. Phases I, II, III and V are available now. Phase IV will be ready in a few days.

Only Phase I of the advanced training course has been printed. I hope to make it one of my first projects to finish the additional four phases of the advanced course and get them printed. Further announcement will be made on this as soon as possible.

Item 4. TRAINING TAPES. The organization has had a number of hour-long tape recordings for use in training sessions on different subjects of guerrilla warfare. During the past year we have not offered these for sale as some of the material has become rather obsolete. I feel that these tapes did serve a very good purpose. The old tapes are presently being revised and new training tapes will be made available soon.

Item 5. NEW APPLICATION FORM. The organization has recently adopted a more detailed membership application form and the initial membership fee has been increased to \$10.00. Both of these steps will enable us to make a better security check on new people before admitting them to the organization. Anyone desiring a supply of these blank application forms should write to their regular mail drop with a separate envelope enclosed marked to the attention of this department.

From Network Director

As we face the challenge of a new year we must all resolve to do our best to strengthen the Minutemen organization, to help achieve its objectives and prepare ourselves to defend our Constitutional Republic against those who would corrupt it into a socialistic dictatorship.

As Director of this network, I am resolved to meet my responsibilities with renewed vigor. I'm sure that all of you are anxious to take a more active part in organizational affairs. In every way possible I am determined to do my part and with your cooperation we can build this network into an effective unit of a fighting organization.

READ BULLETINS CAREFULLY. The Bulletins which you receive both from National Headquarters and from this network contain much information of value to every member--they should be read completely. Every month the workers at our national headquarters and various area headquarters must take precious time away from other activities to answer questions from our members that have already been answered in various bulletins. If each member of this network will read their monthly bulletins carefully it will help save time and improve our understanding of the organizations current programs and policies.

ORGANIZATIONAL OBJECTIVES. While we are speaking of programs and policies, we should remember that our own personal objectives may not always be the same as those of the National organization.

For example, one member recently said that he joined the organization because he thought his home was in danger because of the race riots and he thought the Minutemen would help protect it. He later decided that the organization wouldn't be of much help to him personally so he decided to resign.

The main objective of the Minutemen organization is this: "To create a secret underground army equipped and prepared to resist any form of dictatorship that may be imposed on the American people from either within or without our national boundaries."

The Minutemen organization IS achieving this objective. This should be your main reason for belonging to the Minutemen.

NEW LITERATURE SOON. As a Network Director, I have just received advance samples of several new pieces of organizational literature. This is really quality printing which will give everyone who sees it a good impression of the Minutemen organization. Our general membership will soon be receiving samples also from national headquarters with an order form by which you can receive additional supplies.

IN CASE OF RIOTS. Martin Luther King, Jr. recently said that 10 major cities would soon experience riots far worse than anything we have seen so far.

At this time it seems advisable to repeat the thinking and policy of the national organization so far as these conflicts are concerned.

(a) Race riots are an obvious danger to lives and property in the areas involved but they do not constitute any real threat to the national security.

(b) For the Minutemen to become involved in these conflicts would further identify our membership, would compromise our security and waste ammunition. We would simply complicate the situation for the regular police forces and probably hinder them more than we would help.

(c) Members who live in areas where race riots are likely should make preparations to quickly evacuate their families to safer localities at the first sign of trouble.

(d) Members living outside of the areas of conflict should not enter such areas unless absolutely necessary to rescue some other member who may be in serious danger.

(e) No member is to become involved in any type of racial violence except as a very last resort to save himself or those in his immediate vicinity from physical harm.

This policy is believed to be in the best interests of the organization in helping to achieve its ultimate objectives.

We have selected approximately 30 pages of this bulletin which would be of special interest to any person that might have to conduct interrogation of prisoners or who might someday be the victim of such interrogation. Source advised that he inquired of SCARBOROUGH why the letter had arrived wrapped in a piece of carbon paper. SCARBOROUGH stated that this was a safety precaution and that the carbon paper would prevent X-raying by the "Feds" to determine its contents.

Source advised that also during the past week he received a letter postmarked Independence, Missouri, January 17, 1968. Included in this letter were small stickers with a picture of the American flag thereon, a short recitation, and then "Minutemen". Also within the letter was the January network bulletin to members of Network 1733. Finally, within the letter were a January bulletin and a special bulletin from the Minutemen. 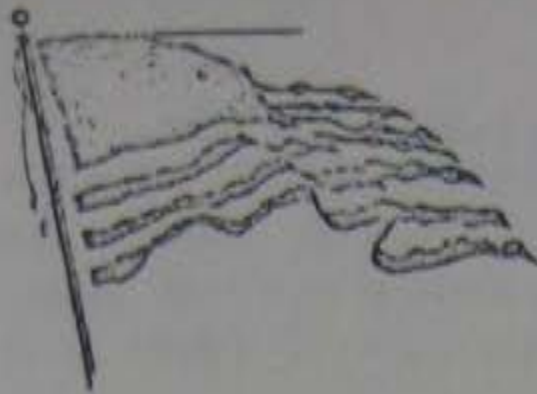

NO T-4 advised on January 29, 1968, that as of January 29, 1968 SCARBOROUGH expressed an interest in joining a new Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan group which was being planned, but SCARBOROUGH finally decided he would wait until he could see if the group could be organized.

NO T-4 advised on February 5, 1968 that JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH desired the leader of the OKA from Jackson, Mississippi to come to the Vidalia-Ferriday area of Louisiana in order to make a speech and recruit members for the OKA. SCARBOROUGH thought this was a good idea because the OKA organization would be a good one from which he could recruit future members for the Minutemen.

NO T-20 advised on January 31, 1968 that on January 28, 1968 SCARBOROUGH was contacted by the leaders of the OKKKK. The purpose of the contact had to do with plans to reorganize or set up a new OKKKK unit at Ferriday, Louisiana, but SCARBOROUGH, when asked if he was ready to get the Ferriday unit back in operation, replied that they are now having so much trouble with the law and FBI in the Ferriday area, that SCARBOROUGH did not think that this was a good time for a new Klan unit to start meeting. SCARBOROUGH commented that several things had occurred near Ferriday and Natchez to cause increased pressure from the FBI in this area and that it is best at present, in the area to let things cool off.

NO T-1 advised on January 29, 1968 that SCARBOROUGH a member of the SDG, was overheard trying to secure an outboard motor for use in Minutemen activities. SCARBOROUGH claimed that this motor could be used to further frustrate the "Feds" electronic bugging devices.

SCARBOROUGH is now advocating that the Minutemen begin a very determined recruiting program both in Louisiana and Mississippi. The Minutemen membership applications are

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sent to Post Office Box 37, Independence, Missouri. The following is a copy of a Minuteman application form in order to give some idea of the searching background information that they expect from an applicant.

CAUTION: When writing to any known address of the Minutemen organization, do NOT

SCARBOROUGH also had information that his unit has now been designated as Minuteman Unit Number 1733. Future plans call for the recruitment of younger men in the organization. SCARBOROUGH now admits that his rifle club was refused an NRA charter, allegedly because the "Feds" had been after him and they were watching his every move. According to NO T-1 it is well known that SCARBOROUGH's pistol club was being used as merely a front for Minutemen organizations and recruitment. Apparently the "Feds" have really "bugged" SCARBOROUGH because according to NO T-1 SCARBOROUGH claims that recently the "Feds" had sprayed something on the vehicle of a friend and thereafter they had impounded the friend's truck. SCARBOROUGH was probably referring to the truck of RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER because he also stated, "I know what they were after; a machine gun!" SCARBOROUGH described his Minuteman organization as being stronger and better organized in Louisiana than in Mississippi. NO T-1 attributed this to the organizing ability of SCARBOROUGH. SCARBOROUGH, at this time, is apprehensive because he thinks TOMMY LEE JONES and ERNEST AVANTS have enough information about SCARBOROUGH's activities and possible violence in connection with the Klan, that JONES and AVANTS could put him behind bars.

On the evening of January 31, 1968 SCARBOROUGH and others started to hold a Minuteman discussion out near a hunting camp and they left their automobiles to talk because SCARBOROUGH has a fear of eavesdropping. SCARBOROUGH instructed those present that in the future that all individuals interested in the Minutemen should now communicate with Post Office Box 57, Independence, Missouri, Zip Code 64051. Thereafter National headquarters will notify SCARBOROUGH, as organizer, to contact any of these individual who are interested in membership.

The following is a copy of a letter concerning this which apparently was made up on instructions of Minuteman National Headquarters.

DEAR FELLOW AMERICANS:

AS EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW, OUR COUNTRY, FREEDOM IDEALS AND EVERYTHING WE HAVE INHERITED FROM THE SPILLED BLOOD OF OUR GENERATIONS BEFORE US, IS IN TERRIBLE CHAOS. AND WILL BE TAKEN FROM US IF WE IN THIS GENERATION DON'T USE THE SAME FEARLESS DETERMINATION THAT THE ENEMY AMONG US ARE USING TO TAKE IT FROM US.

UNLESS THE DESERVING PEOPLE OF THIS GREAT NATION START BANNING TOGETHER UNDER A COMMON CAUSE, TO SAVE THEIR FAMILIES AND LOVED ONES. AND STOP LOOKING FOR THE HOPLESS, OUT NUMBERED FEW LOYAL REPRESENTATIVES IN WASHINGTON TO SAVE THEM. THE DAY IS COMING VERY SOON THE FALSE HOPE WILL TURN INTO DESPOTISM. THEN WHAT YOU COULD BE LEARNING AND DOING NOW, THAT HAS WORKED THROUGH THE AGES WILL BE CLOSE TO IMPOSSIBLE.

THE MINUTEMEN HAS A PROGRAM TO TRAIN MEN AND WOMEN HOW TO PREPARE THEMSELVES FOR ANY TYPE SITUATION, TO HOLD TO OUR IDEALS AND POSSESSIONS. TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILIES IN PARTIAL OR TOTAL BONDAGE OR TAKE THEM BACK IF EVER TAKEN AND SURVIVE WHILE WE ARE FIGHTING TO TAKE THEM BACK.

WHEN SHALL WE BE STRONGER. NEXT WEEK, NEXT YEAR; WILL IT BE WHEN WE ARE TOTALLY DISARMED. TIED HAND AND FOOT, WITH A GUARD AT EVERY DOOR. SHALL WE BE STRONG BY INDECISION AND INACTION.

NO T-1 advised on February 5, 1968 that although the Concordia Piston and Rifle charter has been refused by the NRA national headquarters, WILLIAM GUTHRIE is still receiving mail from the national organization. JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH has now resigned from the club and he suggested that VIRGIL WRIGHT also resign since SCAROBOROUGH is convinced that the NRA charter for the club was turned down because the FBI has been investigating both SCAROBOROUGH and WRIGHT. SCAROBOROUGH has definite plans to join the OKKKK which has recently been reorganized in Natchez, Mississippi. SCAROBOROUGH expects to hold a position near the top of the OKKKK and SCAROBOROUGH plans to run the Klan organization himself and thereafter to appoint DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON as his Lieutenant in the Minutemen. On February 5, 1968 SCAROBOROUGH allegedly appointed JEWEL LEE BURT as a Minuteman team captain to be responsible for recruiting new Minuteman members. Anyone that BURT recruits is to be screened by SCAROBOROUGH's lieutenant, WILKINSON. As of this date the only known members of the Minutemen Unit 1733 in Louisiana and Mississippi are VIRGIL WRIGHT, WILLIAM GUTHRIE, JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and DONALD WILKINSON. During early February, 1968 SCAROBOROUGH and DONALD WILKINSON decided that WILLIAM GUTHRIE is nonviolent and SCAROBOROUGH commented about GUTHRIE, "He hasn't killed any niggers like we have." SCAROBOROUGH was quite disturbed because he alleged that the FBI was trying to pin the FRANK MORRIS killing on him. SCAROBOROUGH and WILKINSON now appear to be running the Minuteman Unit because at this time they have been traveling around some of the neighboring parishes to acquaint themselves with the terrain. SCAROBOROUGH is still apprehensive about possibly having to go to jail because he has picked out WILKINSON to be his heir apparent in the event that anything happens. This is further substantiated because SCAROBOROUGH is making certain that WILKINSON becomes acquainted with some of his confidential Klan, SDG and Minutemen contacts in Concordia and in some of the neighboring parishes. SCAROBOROUGH bewails the fact that at one time this area had 170 good Klansmen in Louisiana, but some, "Fat s.o.b.", messed it up and caused its disorganization. At this time there are indications

that WILLIAM GUTHRIE wants out of the Minuteman organization and SCAROBOROUGH, therefore, is disenchanted with GUTHRIE. SCAROBOROUGH apparently distrusts and possibly fears GUTHRIE because SCAROBOROUGH seems to be concentrating on making GUTHRIE, "break ice". This phrase, "break ice", is interpreted to mean that GUTHRIE would be asked to kill somebody in order to prove himself. SCAROBOROUGH is still firmly convinced of an upcoming Negro revolution and he has established an area in Union Parish, Louisiana where the Minutemen can retreat to when the revolution comes. The area SCAROBOROUGH has in mind is in the neighborhood where there are numerous gas wells and quonset huts. With respect to this area SCAROBOROUGH recently stated that, "once we get up there they will never get us out." Recently DONALD WILKINSON is supposed to have recruited EDWIN LAMAR LEWIS, also known as, "TINY" into Minuteman Unit 1733. LEWIS resides at Route 5, Box 168, Natchez, Mississippi, phone number 445-9234, Social Security number 425-01-6255. LEWIS is married with two children, he is 52 years of age and his Mississippi driver's license number is 32686. LEWIS drives a 1963 Chrysler and belongs also to Americans for the Protection of the White Race (APWR). LEWIS's Minuteman serial number is S01518026 (obtained from a \$10 bill he used for payment of membership dues). As of February 8, 1968 it was ascertained that now SCAROBOROUGH thinks that GUTHRIE may be an informant because GUTHRIE recently has been asking too many questions. He may keep GUTHRIE near him in the future, however, because GUTHRIE has both a typewriter and a mimeograph machine it is needed by the Minuteman organization. SCAROBOROUGH considers DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON now to be his right-hand-man and is giving WILKINSON wide exposure to SCAROBOROUGH's confidential Klan and SDG contacts. Recently SCAROBOROUGH has been appointed as a special game warden in Louisiana and he plans to use the power of this position to be able to search "niggers" homes for weapons and contraband. SCAROBOROUGH along with REGIE CARTER, and JACK SEALE are the ones credited with the recent reorganization of the OKKKK in the Natchez, Mississippi area.

NO T-4 advised on February 19, 1968 that as of mid February, 1968 SCARBOROUGH was admittedly engaged in contacting people about the organization of a new unit of the OKKKK but as yet no arrangements have been made by an organizational meeting.

NO T-4 advised on February 26, 1968 that recently SCARBOROUGH's primary interest has been the organization of the OKKKK unit, and that he has made little or no mention recently of his Minuteman unit among his close associates. There have been no organized meetings, recently, of the SDG and none have been specifically planned for the foreseeable future, because all the emphasis has been directed towards the Klan unit and also the formation of an OKA unit. In the event an OKA unit is formed it is expected that its leaders would include JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, and E.D. MORACE. At one time in the past JAMES SCARBOROUGH was allegedly one of three SDG members who assigned PAUL TOLBERT the task of checking a Negro house of prostitution in Ferriday, Louisiana. At the time this occurred, TOLBERT had been a member of the Ferriday - Clayton OKKKK unit since early 1964 and was active in that group. Subsequent to this TOLBERT has been incapacitated as a result of a "stroke", and is expected to be able to go to work again in the summer of 1968. TOLBERT has not been active in any Klan group since the Ferriday OKKKK group stopped meeting over one year ago.

NO T-3 advised on February 20, 1968 that there have been no organized SDG meetings during the recent past, nor are any meetings of this group planned. It is known that SDG leader RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER and SDG charter member JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH of Ferriday, Louisiana are still active. GLOVER and SCARBOROUGH are in the process now of organizing an OKKKK unit in the Vidalia - Ferriday - Clayton, Louisiana areas.

NO T-4 advised on March 4, 1968 that SCARBOROUGH has now decided that he would rather organize an OKKKK unit on the Louisiana side of the Mississippi River in the Ferriday -

Vidalia area, in the Klan organization headed by MURRAY MARTIN, which is the OKKKK in Louisiana rather than to try to set up an OKA unit in Natchez, Mississippi, which would be under OKA Grand Dragon, ERNEST GILBERT. As of the end of March, SCAROBOROUGH is apparently directing his organizational talents to the formation of an OKKKK unit in the Vidalia - Ferriday, Louisiana area and his activities with respect to SDG and Minutemen activities during recent weeks have been subdued.

NO T-1 advised on February 19, 1968 that SCAROBOROUGH is presently carrying a sawed-off shotgun in his car while in Louisiana and he also has in his possession a .380 caliber automatic which he also carries in Louisiana. For some reason or other SCAROBOROUGH does not carry these weapons on his person when he comes to Mississippi.

During mid February of 1968 an anonymous caller telephonically advised SCAROBOROUGH's wife that her husband was out with a RUTH (LNU) a barmaid at the Fountain Lounge and that SCAROBOROUGH was sleeping with RUTH. SCAROBOROUGH's wife was extremely upset by this information. When she questioned SCAROBOROUGH, in order to account for his time away from home and that fact that his car had been observed parked in front of the Fountain Lounge, told his wife that he had left the car parked there while participating in some Klan activities like he had done previously, in the old days. When SCAROBOROUGH returned for his car on February 17, 1968 he found that he had two flat tires and he blamed the FBI for the flat tires. SCAROBOROUGH was very incensed over the flat tires and was overheard to threaten to kill the persons responsible for letting the air out of his tires. SCAROBOROUGH and his Minuteman lieutenant appear to be working on the new OKKKK unit being set up in the Vidalia - Ferriday area because recently they were in contact with a Mr. MARTIN of Winnsboro, Louisiana who wanted to meet them for the purpose of trying to reorganize the Klan. SCAROBOROUGH has likewise been disturbed recently because his close Minuteman associate, WILLIAM GUTHRIE, was recently interviewed by the FBI. GUTHRIE told SCAROBOROUGH

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about the interview and GUTHRIE was extremely concerned about what the FBI knows and he has told SCARBOROUGH that he is afraid that the FBI is now aware of the Minuteman activities in Louisiana and Mississippi. SCARBOROUGH, when he heard this from GUTHRIE, cooled him down and told him he was too shook up. Later, SCARBOROUGH indicated to trusted associates, he was going to have to ease GUTHRIE out of the Minuteman organization. SCARBOROUGH was very angry that GUTHRIE had talked to the FBI agents and thinks that maybe GUTHRIE told the agents everything he knows about the Minuteman organization. GUTHRIE also indicated that the Minutemen had plans to build a hunting camp on the other side of Sicily Island on a location near the residence of VIRGIL WRIGHT of Ferriday, Louisiana. As of February 14, 1968 there were indications that SCARBOROUGH does not desire to have RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER as a Minuteman member. Recently GLOVER was contacting trusted people and claiming that he had a job to do which would require three or four good men. Among those contacted was DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON, SCARBOROUGH's number one Minuteman. WILKINSON told GLOVER that he would be glad to help, provided SCARBOROUGH gave him his approval to do so. WILKINSON has recently recruited a new member into the Minuteman organization by the name of DONALD J. CRAFT. CRAFT is also an APWR member married with two children and drives a 1964 Oldsmobile. His age is 39 and is employed by International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi. CRAFT has an eleventh grade education. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED] As of late February, 1968, SCARBOROUGH, before some of his associates, reaffirmed his intentions to run the Minuteman organization in Louisiana and Mississippi through his lieutenant, DONALD WILKINSON, and also to accept a top position in the reorganized Klan unit of OKKKK. SCARBOROUGH is actively recruiting for both organizations and there are indications that he has also made contacts with SDG members in an effort to recruit them into the reorganized OKKKK. SCARBOROUGH's intentions seem to be to keep the membership of the Klan and the Minutemen separate. And he has determined that no one can belong to both organizations at the same time. SCARBOROUGH recently commented that if they put

SAM BOWERS, a Mississippi Klansman, under Federal prosecution in Meridian, Mississippi in jail that the Minutemen and the Klan would go to Meridian and break BOWERS out of jail.

NO T-1 advised on March 8, 1968 that SCARBOROUGH's Minuteman unit consists of the following individuals:

JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH
VIRGIL WRIGHT
DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON
DONALD CRAFT
E.L. LEWIS
WILLIAM G. GUTHRIE
WAYNE REED
JEWEL LEE BURT

The most recent meeting of Unit 1733 was held on February 4, 1968 at SCARBOROUGH's home. At this meeting there were four in attendance including SCARBOROUGH and it was noted that VIRGIL WRIGHT was absent and that he has not been attending Minuteman meetings for several months. SCARBOROUGH talked to the group and commented that they are having trouble getting this organization off the ground. He stressed that the members present should increase recruiting efforts in order to boost the membership. He also noted that his number one man, WILKINSON, was the only one who had been able to recruit new members. At this time, SCARBOROUGH and his girlfriend RUTH RAND, a barmaid from the Fountain Lounge in Ferriday and DON WILKINSON, are considering making a trip to some of the neighboring parishes to further introduce WILKINSON to SCARBOROUGH's confidential contacts and also to further acquaint WILKINSON with the terrain. SCARBOROUGH claims that Unit 1733 of the Minuteman will be operated primarily by himself DON CRAFT and DON WILKINSON. Both WILKINSON and CRAFT have been designated by SCARBOROUGH to participate in both the Minutemen and the attempt to reorganize the OKKKK. SCARBOROUGH has instructed his trusted Lieutenants that WILLIAM GUTHRIE,

the future will be a Minuteman in name only and no one in the organization is to give GUTHRIE any information about the plans or dealings. At this time SCAROBOROUGH appears to be convinced that GUTHRIE is an FBI informant, but at the same time, SCAROBOROUGH cannot afford to oust GUTHRIE from the Minutemen. SCAROBOROUGH's Concordia Rifle and Pistol club has had no meeting since early February, 1968 and it is believed to have broken up due to the pressure being put on the area by the FBI investigation.

During early March, 1968 SCAROBOROUGH, MURRAY MARTIN, the OKKKK Grand Dragon had done some traveling together to attend meetings and functions of the OKKKK. SCAROBOROUGH is favorably impressed with MARTIN's organization and considered joining up with him. SCAROBOROUGH is having woman trouble with other than his wife. He had a recent falling out with his girlfriend RUTH RAND the barmaid from the Fountain Lounge. SCAROBOROUGH telephoned her during early March, 1968 and she rebuffed him by telling him that she could not see him because she already had company. This was very upsetting to SCAROBOROUGH but he still has ideas of taking her on a trip along with WILKINSON to some of the neighboring parishes. Since then, SCAROBOROUGH has been observed in the company of DON CRAFT, DON WILKINSON and RUTH RAND, along with several other unidentified females at both the Fountain Lounge and Morgan's Restaurant in Natchez, Mississippi. SCAROBOROUGH's wife DOTTIE appears to be a trusting soul because she reportedly believes his explanations for his many nights away from home. He tells her that he has been out meeting Klansmen and Minutemen in these places in order to avoid having suspicion passed on him and his family. SCAROBOROUGH, at this time, believes that there are at least three or four FBI agents who are checking on him at all times and he is so nervous about this that he is convinced that everyone he sees wearing a suit of clothes is an FBI agent. It is due to this feeling that now SCAROBOROUGH is refusing to drive his auto into Mississippi any more.

During 1967 SCAROBOROUGH was thoroughly convinced that a fellow SDG member, TOMMY LEE JONES, was an FBI informer.

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SCARBOROUGH's mistrust of JONES was because JONES was "shooting off his mouth" and also, JONES was spending too much money. During March, 1968 SCARBOROUGH claimed that he had found out the source of JONES' money and that he was no longer worried about JONES being an FBI "fish".

NO T-20 advised on March 20, 1968, that DURWOOD WILHITE was overheard to make the statement that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH from Ferriday, Louisiana, had accompanied OKKKK Grand Dragon MURRAY MARTIN to a meeting of the 6th Province of the OKKKK, which was held on February 25, 1968, in Zachary, Louisiana. NO T-20 up to this time had no further information on this and did not know why SCAROBOROUGH and MARTIN had made the trip.

NO T-4 advised on March 18, 1968, that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH still lives in the same house at 332 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, and SCAROBOROUGH is still employed as a welder at International Paper Company in Natchez, Mississippi. As of this time SCAROBOROUGH was not reported as being active but SCAROBOROUGH is making plans to start a new OKKKK Unit in the Ferriday-Vidalia area of Louisiana. SCAROBOROUGH now has two vehicles; one is a 1966 or 1967 Dodge sedan, brown in color, while the other is a black 1957 GMC pickup truck. NO T-4 mentioned that SCAROBOROUGH has never owned a 1963 Rambler stationwagon but that such a vehicle is owned by WILLIAM GUTHRIE, a close associate of SCAROBOROUGH, and this vehicle is often parked at SCAROBOROUGH's house. NO T-4 further mentioned that during the past year SCAROBOROUGH is not known to have participated in acts of racial violence; but in the past prior to the last year, he has been involved in acts of racial violence and is therefore considered prone to racial violence.

NO T-3 advised on March 12, 1968, that on March 9, 1968, some of SCAROBOROUGH's SDG associates were trying to get in touch with SCAROBOROUGH and when they went to his residence, SCAROBOROUGH's wife indicated that her husband was at a hunting camp located on the Mississippi River between Ferriday and Vidalia, Louisiana. These associates thereafter attempted to locate SCAROBOROUGH at the hunting camp but found no one there, and it was subsequently ascertained that although SCAROBOROUGH's wife thought she knew where he was, SCAROBOROUGH was out probably chasing girls. It was the opinion of the associates after this that SCAROBOROUGH was merely using the excuse of going to the hunting camp as a means to get away from his wife.

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NO T-7 advised on March 21, 1968, that during early March of 1968 SCAROBOROUGH still had the same 1956 or 1957 black GMC pickup truck and the same 1965 or 1966 Dodge sedan. NO T-7 has never known SCAROBOROUGH to own a Rambler. During a recent contact by NO T-7 with SCAROBOROUGH, SCAROBOROUGH did not mention anything about any type of Klan organization or his Minutemen activities.

NO T-19 advised on March 15, 1968, that SCAROBOROUGH still resides at the same address on Iowa Street in Ferriday, Louisiana, and still has the same job at the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi. NO T-19 described SCAROBOROUGH as currently being a board member of the private school at Ferriday, Louisiana, but claimed that nothing has been heard about any of SCAROBOROUGH's current Klan, SDG, or Minutemen activities.

NO T-4 on March 25, 1968, advised that on March 20, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was pushing efforts to reorganize a unit of the OKKKK in the Ferriday-Vidalia area of Louisiana. SCAROBOROUGH claimed that MURRAY MARTIN, the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK, has plans to make a strong comeback and to have a strong reactivated Klan organization. SCAROBOROUGH, although he appears to be inactive in the Minutemen and SDG, has not changed. He is still a militant, racial segregationist, who has a propensity to use violence to attain his ends. SCAROBOROUGH is still occupied with finding 30-06 ammunition and blasting caps and he has been on occasion overheard to claim that he knew where he could buy a 45 caliber machine gun. SCAROBOROUGH is still closely associated with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, an avid racist and the founder of the SDG. During the past few months, SCAROBOROUGH has taken up with a girl friend in Natchez, Mississippi, and his close associate, GLOVER, when he hears of this, seems to be amused.

NO T-3 advised on March 26, 1968, that during mid March of 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was not seen in his regular haunts near his home and it was learned from SCAROBOROUGH's son that SCAROBOROUGH was out of town on business.

NO T-3 later on March 26, 1968, advised that as of March 20, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was against joining the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA), group in Mississippi, and claimed that he and his SDG and Minutemen associates would be better off staying in their same old groups in Louisiana. SCAROBOROUGH is still very interested in securing ammunition and has suggested to some of his close associates that they secure all the ammunition they can and keep it for a time when it would be needed. SCAROBOROUGH is imbued with the idea of getting everyone in the Klan and in his groups outfitted with a United States Army carbine of the same caliber so that they could all use the same type of ammunition. NO T-3 indicated that the reason SCAROBOROUGH wanted to stay out of the Mississippi OKA organization and remain close to the OKKKK in Louisiana was that at least they could trust the Louisiana group because they had not revealed any secret information as yet.

NO T-21 advised on March 22, 1968, that on or about March 16, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH and his paramour and DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON made a trip to the Bastrop, Louisiana vicinity, which is in Union Parish, for the purpose of furthering Minutemen activities in this area. At about this time SCAROBOROUGH was overheard to brag that he and some of his associates were preparing for a "revolution" and that they have weapons and explosives hidden all over Union Parish in Louisiana. While in Bastrop, SCAROBOROUGH visited his parents and he introduced RUTH RAND, the paramour, as a friend. It was likewise learned that SCAROBOROUGH's present wife, DOROTHY, is not well liked by his parents. SCAROBOROUGH is apparently estranged from his wife because he considers her to be a "religious nut" and he has indicated that he plans to leave his wife and return to his old family home in the Bastrop area. SCAROBOROUGH has other relatives in this area, such as a nephew, SONNY SCAROBOROUGH; a brother, JOE SCAROBOROUGH; and a brother-in-law, CECIL ROBERTS. All of these family members are personally close to JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH and according to NO T-1 the family members are also believed to be in the Minutemen. Recently SCAROBOROUGH was observed shooting targets and he was using a 22 magnum pistol, a 3-A automatic, and a 357 magnum revolver. SCAROBOROUGH is certainly a gun fan and claims

to have ordered a Thompson submachine gun from an unknown source, which he has not yet received. SCAROBOROUGH is so sure of a future Negro revolution that he is also talking about buying a two-way police radio for his car so that he then would be able to monitor police and FBI radio traffic. NO T-21 had no information that he has as yet taken definite steps to monitor this radio traffic.

NO T-1 advised on March 18, 1968, of the above mentioned trip of SCAROBOROUGH, RUTH RAND, and DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON to Bastrop, Louisiana, on some type of Minutemen business. As of this time SCAROBOROUGH is planning to disassociate himself with Minutemen Headquarters so that he can keep the usual \$10.00 entrance fees in his local treasury and thereafter spend this money for travel expenses and training maneuvers. SCAROBOROUGH still devotes the major portion of his Minutemen activities to that of recruitment. He also uses his two lieutenants, DONNY CRAFT and WILKINSON, as assistants in recruiting. As of this time Minutemen VIRGIL WRIGHT and WILLIAM GUTHRIE were designated to do the paper work for SCAROBOROUGH's Minutemen Unit. SCAROBOROUGH has the idea that the three recruiters in the future should not discuss membership or the identities of applicants with others in the Minutemen Unit. This is either done as a security measure or possibly to enable SCAROBOROUGH to convert the \$10.00 initiation fees to his own use without the rest of the Minutemen knowing of this. SCAROBOROUGH is still close to RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER of the SDG and during the latter parts of March, 1968, when SCAROBOROUGH remarked to GLOVER they had a need for a mimeograph machine and a typewriter, GLOVER volunteered to procure this equipment for the Minutemen by his usual economic method, namely, to steal them. SCAROBOROUGH now believes that TOMMY LEE JONES, who earlier was suspect in Minutemen and SDG circles, is not now and never has been an FBI informant. In view of this change of attitude toward JONES, SCAROBOROUGH has again indicated the desire to admit JONES into membership in the Klan or the Minutemen in Louisiana. SCAROBOROUGH has now "mended his fences" with WAYNE REED, a former close Minutemen associate, with whom he had a falling out. REED is still in the Ferriday vicinity and is reportedly planning to take over management of the Bonanza Club in Ferriday, Louisiana.

NO T-4 on April 9, 1968, advised that SCAROBOROUGH apparently had some sort of meeting on Sunday before last and two former close SDG associates were not invited. When confronted with this, SCAROBOROUGH claimed that the meetings were just those of the Concordia Parish Rifle Association and of little importance. But later it was heard that the meeting had to do with the Minutemen. NO T-4 received information that the two omitted associates have now ascertained that SCAROBOROUGH's meeting did involve something to do with the Minutemen. SCAROBOROUGH at this time is still making preparations for what he alleges is to be a Negro revolution which is coming soon. SCAROBOROUGH is so sure of this that recently SCAROBOROUGH's wife had purchased a whole case of soup and a case of canned beans to be stocked at his hunting camp. SCAROBOROUGH has been claiming he still knows where he can buy machine guns but now the price of the guns has gone up from \$100 to \$165. SCAROBOROUGH is still promoting the Klan and has been having some of his friends and associates tack up Klan posters along the highways near Ferriday, Louisiana.

NO T-3 advised on April 17, 1968, that as of the middle part of April, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH, although still working at organizing a new Klan unit at Ferriday, Louisiana, has claimed that he had been otherwise busy and has not made too much progress. SCAROBOROUGH at this time still thinks the FBI is watching his every move and are watching his girl friend as well, and this investigation according to SCAROBOROUGH makes it hard for him to recruit Klan or Minutemen members. SCAROBOROUGH is firmly convinced that there will be trouble from the Negroes during the summer of 1968 and that it is necessary the white people will have an organization ready to strike when the Negroes start the revolution.

NO T-1 advised on April 1, 1968, that SCAROBOROUGH to date has not made much progress in increasing membership of Minutemen Unit 1733. Unit 1733 is no longer connected with Minutemen National Headquarters because SCAROBOROUGH feels that all the money they collect for dues should remain in the local unit where it could be used more effectively. At this time SCAROBOROUGH believes that if all his members of the Minutemen discover that they are no longer connected with the Minutemen national organization

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in Kansas City, it might cause trouble. Now he plans to obtain a mimeograph machine and thereafter reproduce some of the national headquarters material which has been sent to him during past months so that it can be sent to new members to make them believe they are still recognized by national headquarters. The following are the current members of Unit 1733 of the Minutemen:

During recent meetings SCAROBOROUGH has emphasized that it is necessary to keep the identity of the newly recruited members a secret. To date only a few people handpicked by SCAROBOROUGH are supposed to know this. SCAROBOROUGH is supposed to have been in recent contact with the head of the Minutemen organization, ROBERT DePUGH. He claims that DePUGH wants each unit to keep up recruiting so that the organization will be able to channel its displeasure and that of the general public and the Federal government in the right direction. Apparently SCAROBOROUGH's contact with DePUGH was by letter because it indicated that although DePUGH was being sought by Federal authorities DePUGH has been personally contacting his network commanders and DePUGH allegedly expects to be able to visit each Minutemen Unit. NO T-1 however, had no concrete information concerning DePUGH's whereabouts and is not sure about why

SCAROBOROUGH tells this sort of story to his Minutemen members in order to make himself look big. Recently, it is believed that SCAROBOROUGH and his girl friend have had a serious dispute. SCAROBOROUGH has been overheard to claim that the girl friend, RUTH RAND, is crazy and SCAROBOROUGH now does not want to have anything to do with her. SCAROBOROUGH stated that if RUTH RAND persists in bothering him, he is going to burn her car up. According to NO T-1, SCAROBOROUGH, if pressed hard financially, could very well resort to criminal activity. Recently SCAROBOROUGH is known to have converted \$10.00 in dues money from a Minuteman to SCAROBOROUGH's own use. SCAROBOROUGH would not be above committing a robbery in the event he ran short of funds.

NO T-3 advised on May 1, 1968, that SCAROBOROUGH's reason for wanting to keep the SDG separate from any OKKKK organization in the past was based on the fact that SCAROBOROUGH claimed he knew that SDG members were trustworthy but he could never be sure about all other Klan members.

NO T-4 advised on April 22, 1968, that during mid April, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was engaged in loading carbine ammunition and SCAROBOROUGH claimed he had found a place in the hills where the Klan could hide out when the Negro revolt occurred. SCAROBOROUGH, however, was not specific as to the location of this place but he did indicate that it was somewhere near where SCAROBOROUGH's parents reside, which is in Bastrop, Louisiana.

NO T-1 advised on April 16, 1968, that there was an informal meeting of the Minutemen held on April 23, 1968, in Natchez, Mississippi. JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, the other members of his Minutemen group, plus two candidates for membership, DON LEE and PAUL WISE, attended. SCAROBOROUGH has apparently discarded his old girl friend, RUTH RAND, because he has been seen with a new one, FRANCES DOWNING. At this time SCAROBOROUGH may have a little competition for DOWNING because DONALD CRAFT, a Minutemen member, is also interested in her. SCAROBOROUGH and his trusted Minutemen are planning to hold another meeting in the future to determine what disposition they are going to

make of the money in the treasury left over from the now defunct Concordia Pistol and Rifle Club. SCAROBOROUGH is anxious to get his hands on that money and he will probably try to talk the Pistol Club group into letting the Minutemen leaders use this money for "expenses." A new member, JAMES SWILLIE of Natchez, Mississippi, has recently been recruited into the Minutemen. Recently SCAROBOROUGH became all shook up because ERSHEL BOYD has been exhibiting a silver dollar in public and making the comment, "You can get a dollar if you kill a nigger." Apparently SCAROBOROUGH thinks ERSHEL BOYD is trying to impersonate an SDG member or is talking about "private things" in public. The Minutemen will have to give BOYD a "beating" if he continues showing off the dollar in this fashion. SCAROBOROUGH is still on good terms with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER. GLOVER recently has been attempting to raise money for "The Legal Defense Funds for Hinds County White People." The tickets for this function contain the following information printed on the ticket:

"Koon Supper, April 28, 2:30 p.m., \$10.00
supper cooked in ex-dynamite pit, built courtesy of
the Feds. Benefit for the Legal Defense Funds for
Hinds County White People. Chicken and fish for
those who do not like Koons-wives and girl friends
invited."

NO T-4 advised on May 7, 1968, that recently SCAROBOROUGH claimed his wife had received an anonymous letter, accusing him of running around with a barmaid at Natchez, Mississippi, while he was pretending to go to Klan and Minutemen meetings. SCAROBOROUGH at this time claimed that he was convinced that his wife and the FBI had sent the letter and that it was not true. Some of his close associates discussed this letter bit after SCAROBOROUGH left the group and they all concluded that SCAROBOROUGH was lying because if he had received such a letter, he would have shown it. His good friend, RALEIGH GLOVER, claimed at this point that he would not trust SCAROBOROUGH as SCAROBOROUGH is a liar and all SCAROBOROUGH wanted to do was to talk with big men who did not know him well but SCAROBOROUGH was afraid to take any action (meaning afraid to directly do something to Negroes).

NO T-1 advised on May 2, 1968, that now that the Concordia Pistol Club has broken up, SCAROBOROUGH and his Minutemen members have recently decided to put the remaining Pistol Club money into loading equipment and a trailer to pull behind the car. At the time the Pistol Club broke up, there was supposed to be over \$200 in the treasury. As of May 5, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was overheard to recommend archery instructions be given to Minutemen members. SCAROBOROUGH claimed that he has a crossbow of his own and that it is the logical weapon to use at night since there is no noise and it has good killing power. SCAROBOROUGH wanted new member JAMES SWILLIE to begin instructing members and other young people in archery. SCAROBOROUGH was again all shook up because he told some of his associates that recently his wife had received an anonymous letter, accusing him of running around with the barmaid from the Fountain Lounge. At this time SCAROBOROUGH was worried that whoever sent the letter will send his wife more detailed information or information which she could possibly check out. SCAROBOROUGH claimed he managed to convince his wife that this poison-pen letter was sent to her by some of his enemies; but SCAROBOROUGH is also afraid that if she receives any more letters, she might begin to believe them.

NO T-1 advised on May 16, 1968, that a meeting of Unit 1733 of the Minutemen was held on May 12, 1968. SCAROBOROUGH again told his members to get as much ammunition and guns as they could since this was the year when the Minutemen were going to be forced to fight in the streets. The Minutemen on May 8, 1968, had in Washington, Mississippi, and in Natchez, Mississippi, painted the Minutemen warning sign called the crosshairs on several business establishments. The individuals involved were JOHN BOSTIC, the driver of the truck; JEWEL LEE BURT, who acted as a lookout; and JAMES SWILLIE, who did the painting. Later the mother of JAMES SWILLIE notified DONALD WILKINSON that the FBI had interviewed her son, JAMES, about this and the information about SWILLIE's interview was finally filtered up to JAMES SCAROBOROUGH. When SCAROBOROUGH heard about the interview, he was visibly shaken and overheard to comment that they would have to stop any activity that they had planned for the future

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until things "cooled down." The following day SCARBOROUGH gained his composure and then was claiming that the FBI does not know what is going on and that they are merely worried about a job that they think the Klan is going to pull. SCARBOROUGH cautioned his Minutemen that they would have to stick together and that in the future some of his group should conduct any activities without his approval. As of May 25, 1968, the Minutemen Chapter Number 1715 was estimated to have 11 members. This included the names of new members CALVIN HARRIS and JAMES SWILLIE. The following is a sample of some of the current literature being put out by the Minutemen in connection with the recruitment of members:

SPECIAL BULLETIN

TO: All Members

FROM: 001500, Director of Training and Recruiting

During the past years our National Coordinator and his Executive Assistant have carried much of the load during our summer training sessions. The fact that they will not be available for such activity this coming summer will place a special handicap on this department.

I expect, however, to press forward with their plans. If humanly possible we will hold all of the various training programs as originally scheduled.

STUDENT TRAINING PROGRAM -- This program will begin about June 10th and will last approximately six weeks. It is designed especially for high school and college students as well as others who plan to work with such groups or conduct similar training in their own areas. Strong emphasis is placed on espionage techniques, communications, and psycho-political warfare but also includes more general training in resistance warfare techniques, small arms practice, recruiting, security, etc.

The cost of this program to the organization is at least \$100.00 per student.. Where possible the students will be asked to pay at least part of this cost themselves, however, a limited number of full scholarships are available to students who seem most likely to put this training to good use.

RESISTANCE WARFARE TRAINING -- Two different sessions will be held each lasting ten days. The first will run from July 2nd to July 13th. The second session will run from July 15th to July 26th.

Each session will be complete in itself but those wishing to attend both could do so most profitably. The first session will place special emphasis on such subjects as leadership, organization, propaganda, communications, intelligence, and small unit combat tactics. The second session will place greater emphasis on night combat, guerrilla warfare strategy and tactics, demolitions and booby traps, map reading, mountaineering techniques, etc.

The fee will be \$40.00 for each session or \$75.00 for both. This may be reduced or eliminated for a few members qualified to instruct in certain subjects or who will come in two or three days early to help set up camp.

Those wishing to attend the training sessions this summer should make reservations as soon as possible by completing the appropriate sections of their May Report Form and sending these to their last assigned mail drop or to P.O. Box 57, Independence, Missouri. A \$10.00 deposit must accompany each reservation if you wish to have it definitely confirmed and a space held open for you.

Subject: CONTACT BY GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

We regret the fact that the F.B.I. and similar government agencies now spend more time harassing patriotic citizens and organizations than they do in fighting communism. We must not be discouraged or confused by this state of affairs. It is simply one more example of the degree to which our federal government has been infiltrated and controlled at the top by hidden communists and their fellow travelers.

As mentioned in a previous "Special Bulletin", there are many ways that the F.B.I., A.T.T.U. or other investigative agencies may learn or suspect that you are a member of the Minutemen.

Both the organization and each member should make every effort to maintain secrecy. At the same time, each member should recognize that his possible identification is a calculated risk. If, by error or bad luck, the fact becomes known that you are a member of this organization, it is certainly no reason for panic. It does not necessarily mean that you are going to be arrested, fired from your job and stoned by your neighbors. Neither does it mean that your value to the organization has ended.

In fact, there are several situations in which a member can actually be of greater value once he begins to operate openly and doesn't have to spend so much time hiding his identity. Naturally, such workers must continue to respect the personal security of other members and not jeopardize their identity by careless or avoidable contacts with them.

IF YOU ARE CONTACTED by government agents there are several possible courses of action you can take:

I. Simply refuse to talk to them which you have a constitutional right to do. This is often wisest, as even the most innocent seeming information might someday get you indicted for conspiracy. This may seem ridiculous but some of our members have found out to their sorrow how true it is.

II. Tell them you are not a member but have received some literature from us... don't know anything else about anything.

III. Be careful not to reveal but fictitious facts about other people who might be (but aren't) members.

IV. Tell them you did join but the organization turned out to be different than you expected so you haven't been active recently.

If they ask you to cooperate with them to infiltrate the organization further, you should agree (with or without a suitable show of hesitation) to do so.

If you do this then you must expect that they will watch you very closely day and night as they will be very skeptical. They will make every effort to determine if you are really working for them or just pretending to. For your own protection, you should notify this department of your intentions as soon as possible then have no further contact until advised accordingly.

This quotation from Patrick Henry surely describes the situation in our organization today.

National Coordinator Robert DePugh and his assistant, Walter Peyson are now being hunted frantically by the F.B.I. stooges. They went underground, not because they were guilty of the charges against them, but simply because they refused to waste any more of the organization's money on lawyer fees and bail bonds.

They have been joined by several others who have also left behind their jobs, their homes and their families to help prepare for the fight ahead. Except for their very lives, these men have given all they have to the cause of freedom.

Each of us who are still able to work at our regular job, enjoy our homes, our families and our friends, should ask ourselves most sincerely if we are really doing all we can to help.

Our Director of Training and Recruiting has put his house up for sale. His wife and children plan to live on that money so he too can quit his job and spend full time preparing for and conducting this summer's training programs. Certainly our other members can at least take time to attend one of these programs, learn all they possibly can from it and help prepare themselves to provide the trained leaders that this movement needs so badly.

World events continue to move according to the communist plan. The last gold backing has been removed from our currency. Martin Luther King has been killed (without doubt by a communist agent) to spur the Negroes on to greater violence. Johnson sits in the White House just hoping for a chance to declare martial law and suspend our Constitution before his term of office is over. A disgraceful surrender is being negotiated for Viet Nam that will leave 20,000 American boys who died for nothing. NO T-1 on June 10, 1968, advised that during early June, 1968, JAMES SCAROBOROUGH told his Minutemen members that they could make plans in the near future for a regional Minutemen meeting and he has discussed plans and the feasibility of conducting maneuvers in the area. The anonymous letter mentioned above to SCAROBOROUGH's wife concerning his extra-marital activities has caused SCAROBOROUGH to stay pretty close to home since the letter was received. SCAROBOROUGH apparently feels that his wife will certainly leave him if he starts running around again at night. As of May 31, 1968, the Minutemen had still not received the balance in the treasury from the Pistol Club. SCAROBOROUGH thereafter contacted VIRGIL WRIGHT, who told him that he would send him a check for the full amount and thereafter SCAROBOROUGH could use the money in any way he saw fit. Some consideration has been given to having a Minutemen meeting in the future to determine how to use this money.

NO T-4 advised on June 11, 1968, that SCAROBOROUGH on June 1, 1968, got all excited because he heard about some type of racial incident in Natchez, Mississippi, and he was known to call some of his associates, asking them to stand by in the event the Negroes were rioting in the Natchez business district so that he would have men available to go to Natchez and shoot the Negroes. On June 1 several of the Minutemen and SDG members, including SCAROBOROUGH, met at the residence of NORMAN HEAD and discussed the Negro situation. They decided that in the future they would only shoot Negroes in Natchez who caused trouble outside the business district, but they were perfectly willing to let the Natchez Police Department handle Negro rioters in the business district. SCAROBOROUGH was still on the alert over this and instructed several of the members to stand by each weekend to be available on call. In the event those on standby did leave home, they were to leave a phone number where they could be reached in the event there was Negro trouble in Natchez.

NO T-1 advised on June 24, 1968, that there have been no meetings or activities of Unit 1733 of the Minutemen since sometime early in June, 1968, because JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH is on vacation. SCAROBOROUGH reportedly took his family to Bastrop, Louisiana, for several weeks

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in an attempt to get back in his wife's good graces. As
of this time the following are members of Unit 1733:

NO T-4 advised on July 24, 1968 that as of late July, 1968, SCAROBOROUGH was upset and was trying to find one of his SDG associates, JACK SEALE. The reason SCAROBOROUGH was upset was because he had been told that JACK SEALE has been talking about him but he did not reveal who told him this. SCAROBOROUGH's source could possibly have been RALEIGH H. GLOVER because GLOVER and SCAROBOROUGH had been observed together recently. SCAROBOROUGH was still reloading ammunition and he always seems to be looking for brass for his reloading project. SCAROBOROUGH was overheard bragging about how he harassed a Negro a few days earlier. A Negro had accidentally driven a car into a ditch somewhere near SCAROBOROUGH's home and when the Negro went to SCAROBOROUGH's front door to get help, SCAROBOROUGH claimed that he turned two mean police dogs out and they took good care of the Negro.

NO T-4 advised on July 30, 1968 that on July 31, 1968 SCAROBOROUGH was still upset about JACK SEALE and claimed that the SDG may have to do something about SEALE. It seems that SEALE recently purchased a pickup truck and used a fellow Klansman, who works at International Paper Company in Natchez, as a cosigner on the note to pay for this truck. SEALE has now skipped out and is not making the payments, and the bank is apparently looking to the cosigner for payment. SCAROBOROUGH had suggested once SEALE's whereabouts are ascertained that a group of Klansmen should visit SEALE and collect for the payment on the truck as well as to stop SEALE from "shooting off his mouth." Apparently SCAROBOROUGH has "cooled off" some on organizing the Ferriday-Clayton OKKKK Unit because no one seems to know when SCAROBOROUGH will hold a meeting. On July 27, 1968 a former member of this unit was trying to find out when the next meeting would be held and the best information he could develop was that a meeting was expected soon but that it was not definite until somebody could find and talk to SCAROBOROUGH.

NO T-1 advised on July 22, 1968 that due to the inactivity of JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, Unit 1733 of the minutemen has not had any meetings or carried out any projects during the last six weeks. It is apparent that SCAROBOROUGH is not leaving his residence to participate in the Klan and/or minutemen activities because of his wife and family. D. H. WILKINSON, one of the minute men under SCAROBOROUGH, now realizes that SCAROBOROUGH no

longer wields the authority or influence that he once did and WILKINSON is slowly attempting to take over this unit of the minutemen. WILKINSON has plans for minutemen meetings in the near future for members and those interested in joining. WILKINSON, during early July, has been taken in to the SDG group, which is lead by RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER. A few days after his joining, a silver dollar as a token of membership in the SDG was conferred upon WILKINSON by RALEIGH J. GLOVER, and at this time GLOVER instructed WILKINSON on how to identify himself to other SDG members by the casual or almost accidental exhibition of this dollar to the party in the SDG that he encounters and who needs to know that WILKINSON is a SDG member.

NO T-4 advised on August 6, 1968 that some of the SDG members think that R. J. GLOVER, the SDG leader, is losing his mind because now GLOVER feels that he can trust no one and that everyone is against him. WAYNE REED, a former close associate of SCARBOROUGH in both the minutemen and the SDG, recently has moved from Ferriday, Louisiana to another state. The opinion that GLOVER is losing his marbles (mind) was concurred in by one close associate, who had last contacted GLOVER personally during early August and by another, who has frequent contacts with GLOVER. These two and others were of the opinion that recently GLOVER does not seem to be rational. GLOVER has been upset and disgusted with SDG members and claimed he could not trust anyone anymore. His fellow workers at International Paper Company have also noted GLOVER's recent actions and they too are inclined to not trust him. GLOVER likewise was disgusted with the inactivity of JAMES SCARBOROUGH and he is inclined to be talking tough all the time. GLOVER thinks some of his close friends have sold him out. GLOVER was upset because SDG members had not been buying ammunition from him when GLOVER told his supplier that he would take all the ammunition and stuff the man could get. He is still unhappy and looking for JACK SEALE, who has been saying harsh things about him. GLOVER claims that SCARBOROUGH had promised to get him a machine gun in July of 1968, which he could not produce and therefore GLOVER considered SCARBOROUGH a big "windbag." He criticized SCARBOROUGH because he claimed that SCARBOROUGH, in the past, has tried to make him, GLOVER, believe that SCARBOROUGH and two other SDG men were responsible for putting the Negroes in the Mississippi River when he, GLOVER, knows better. GLOVER said all SDG members had agreed not to talk to the

FEDS, but TOMMY LEE JONES had sold out, and JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, when he was interviewed, was cozy with one FBI agent and thereafter SCAROBOROUGH was scared to death. GLOVER was also disturbed because he had heard that some SDG members in the past became scared and had thrown away silver dollars, which he had given them and it was revealed that now WAYNE REED's wife has left him and during June of 1968 filed for a divorce. When this happened she made REED move out of the house. REED, during July of 1968, finally left Ferriday and moved to a northern state not otherwise identified to obtain work.

NO T-1 advised on August 13, 1968 that recently JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH and his Lieutenant DONALD HOUSTON WILKINSON were having difficulties in collecting dues from five minutemen members. SCAROBOROUGH's lieutenant is currently upset over the way the unit is being operated and claims that SCAROBOROUGH should be holding regular chapter meetings of Unit Number 1733 and planning a suitable program of activities so that the members would not be bored and lose interest. WILKINSON even confronted SCAROBOROUGH and claims that inasmuch as SCAROBOROUGH is now relatively inactive, the minutemen will need a new leader. SCAROBOROUGH squelched this idea by indicating that he was in complete charge of the unit and could do anything with it that he pleased. The unit recently paid about \$250 to SCAROBOROUGH for ammunition loading equipment. Some of the minutemen members are beginning to distrust SCAROBOROUGH because they are not given an accountability for the units money, which he collects to be used for minutemen activities. SCAROBOROUGH is still mystified because he is now under the impression that one of his lieutenants has been a member of the SDG under RALEIGH GLOVER for a considerable time, but he had only learned of this three or four weeks ago. There seems to be considerable descension in segments of the SDG group because at this time GLOVER and WILKINSON are partially convinced that SCAROBOROUGH may likewise be a security risk to them and to the SDG. Although nothing has occurred within the minutemen unit to pin-point the present location of minutemen national leaders, ROBERT DE PUGH or WALTER PEYSON, who are Federal fugitives, the members did receive the following bulletin addressed to all members from the National Coordinator dated June 15, 1968.

SPECIAL BULLETIN

To: All Members
From: National Coordinator

June 15, 1968

Walter Payson and I have now been fugitives for over four months. The FBI and ATTU have assigned a sizable part of their organizations in an all out effort to find us. The fact that we are still free and still able to manage the organization's affairs in a fairly normal manner is, I think, quite significant.

It demonstrates, for one thing that our security is much better than most people have believed. It also indicates that our knowledge of the abilities and limitations of those who oppose us (both officially and unofficially) is fairly exact. Our present circumstances and sacrifices prove one thing more - they prove just how phoney those people are who have spread rumors of poor security, corruption and selfish interests within the national organization.

For many years our enemies have used a fairly successful form of psychological warfare against us - designed to paralyze our members into inactivity by making them believe that it was impossible to "get away with anything" without the FBI knowing all about it. They have sought to convince our members that the organization was infiltrated, even at the very top, to such an extent that having anything to do with it would surely lead to personal ruin.

The past four months have proven all this untrue. Everyone that has been part of the national headquarters complex knows where I am today. If the FBI had an infiltrator anywhere near the top of the organization I would have been in jail weeks ago. What greater proof could I have as to the loyalty of my associates in the national organization?

Not only do I carry on an active correspondence with hundreds of people, but I have traveled far and wide during the past four months. Couriers come and go daily at our underground headquarters, to carry mail to other states and bring in reports from area coordinators. No one has turned me in. No one has revealed the location of our underground headquarters.

Where was I yesterday? Where will I be tomorrow? Who is the secretary who will type this bulletin from my long-hand notes? Where is the photographic laboratory where the negatives will be developed and the printing plates made? Where is the printing plant where this bulletin and much other literature is being printed? Who are the couriers that will pick them up and carry them to regional headquarters? Who are the area coordinators who will remail these bulletins from 25 different cities?

For many months now the FBI has made a frantic effort to learn the answer to these questions. They have not answered one of them! The importance of this should be impressed on every member. The rumors of poor security in the national organization simply are not true!

Where have such rumors come from? Some have been spread by disgruntled ex-members who were kicked out of the organization because they did not meet our high standards themselves. Some have been spread by a competitive and supposedly right wing organization that is secretly financed by the CIA to draw members and prospective members away from the Minutemen.

This bulletin is being sent to our currently active members so that they can avoid being influenced themselves by such rumors. It is also being sent to many ex-members and those who are no longer active.

To those of you who have dropped out of the Minutemen because of such rumors. Now I'm asking you to review the facts in your own mind and see if you haven't been misled. You are still needed in the fight to restore our constitutional republic. An inquiry as to how you can be reinstated would be welcome.

I know that some of you to whom this bulletin is being mailed have been tricked into joining that competitive organization. You have been sold a bunch of lies as to what amateurs the Minutemen were and have been invited (in great secrecy) to join the real "professional" underground. I hope that by now you realize how badly you have been fooled. I hope all who have been tricked in this manner will write to me now through the mail drop stapled to the front of this bulletin and give us all the details as to how this happened to you. Those who have not been approached in this way, be on your guard and report any such contact at once to the national headquarters.

Our members must not be brain washed into thinking that our enemies are all knowing and all powerful. Such a mistaken belief would prevent us from ever taking effective action against the enemy. It would reduce us to the level of other "debating society" types of conservative societies.

A few weeks ago we distributed a number of "Traitors Beware" cards to some of our members to be mailed to reds in their areas. One member sent the cards back saying that it looked to him like a scheme to trap him on a charge of "sending threatening literature through the mail". That is nonsense! If a person can't mail a few letters without getting caught at it - what chance will he have to survive at all under complete "police state" conditions?

All of our members need to do small things like this— even if they are technical violations of the law— in order to build up their own self confidence and to prove to themselves that we can out wit and out maneuver those who oppose us.

It is also a mistake to think you can avoid arrest by always staying within the law. When the time comes that the government parasites decide they must get rid of you, they will not hesitate to frame you on some charge of which you are completely innocent.

We must not be fooled by enemy propaganda designed to make us lose confidence in our own organization. We must not be misled by rumor campaigns spread by agents provocateur.

The slogan "The best defence is a good offence." applies as well to resistance warfare as it does to conventional warfare.

NO T-4 advised on August 13, 1968 that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH continues to live at 322 Iowa Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, and continues to be employed as a welder for International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi. At this time NO T-4 claimed that SCAROBOROUGH has been completely inactive in the Klan for about six months and he has been practically inactive in the Silver Dollar Group. At this time SCAROBOROUGH still pretends to be the head of a small group of minutemen, Unit 1733, but during recent weeks SCAROBOROUGH and the minutemen unit has almost been inactive.

NO T-4 advised on August 21, 1968 that as of August 20, 1968, RALEIGH GLOVER is still down on JAMES SCAROBOROUGH and GLOVER continues to criticize SCAROBOROUGH as being anything but a talker. GLOVER complained SCAROBOROUGH pretends to be involved in the fire death of FRANK MORRIS during the shoe shop burning in Ferriday in the past, but GLOVER never did say how he knew SCAROBOROUGH was involved. With respect to the minutemen organization, SCAROBOROUGH recently claimed that he did not know when they might meet again and SCAROBOROUGH claimed that his group of riflemen had not been active recently and had nothing definite as to when the now defunct concordia rifle and pistol club would have target practice again.

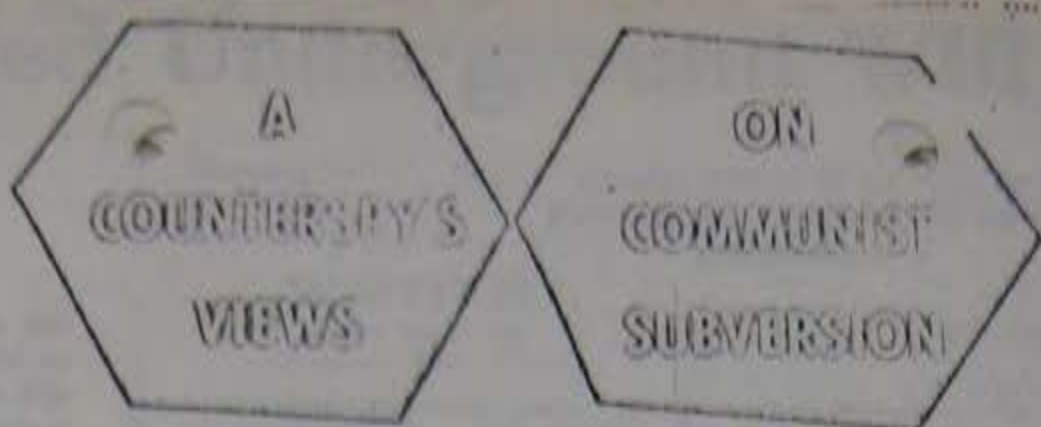

EXTREMISTS!

During the past few months, this country has been deluged by a barrage of planned and vicious propaganda attacks against the patriotic Americans who are actively fighting the Communist threat.

This smear campaign, directed by an assortment of Communists, professional liberals and self-serving political opportunists, is resorting to derisive and venomous language in accusing patriotic individuals and groups. Names such as right-wing extremists, fascists, and Klanners are being tossed around quite loosely by these smear artists. The name callers stem from Gus Hall, the convicted Communist, down to Drew Pearson, the columnist, who is known to play very loosely, at times, with the truth. Regrettably, even our President lowered the dignity of his Office by getting into the act.

In most instances, political opportunists, who have joined the ranks of name-callers, did so to create a smoke screen to cover some of their own political failings.

This loud barrage is by no means the spontaneous wail the Communists, fellow travellers and their dupes would have you believe. The "shouting" campaign, which has been joined by a large section of our press, radio and television, was actually organized in the Kremlin; then funneled down through usual Communist channels into every nook and corner of the United States. This "Call of the Kremlin" has been so successful, that many non-Communists are actually outshouting the Reds in the name-calling department. It is no wonder that Khrushchev and his band of cut-throats are laughing with glee.

There is a very practical reason why the Communists launched the bitter campaign against the American patriotic groups. The past 28 years of appeasement by our Government leaders, culminated by the loss of Cuba to the Communists — only ninety miles from our shores, has awakened many Americans to the fact that the Red danger is getting uncomfortably close.

The fact that we have been losing ground to the International Communists with our "policy of appeasement" is of concern to many Americans. They realize that we must take a firm stand against International Communism or face destruction. It is these patriotic forces who pose the real threat to the Communists. The Red conspirators and their sympathetic allies cannot stand exposure. It is for this reason that patriotic forces are being so viciously maligned.

Long ago, as I mention on Page 55 of "THE BIG DECISION", Lenin, one of the founders of murderous Communism said: "Destroying all opposition by invective, slander, smear and blackmail is one of the techniques of Communism". To watch some American politicians, editors, and self-styled liberals ape the Reds in this libelous technique, is indeed shameful.

Recently in Los Angeles County, a series of nuisance bombs were exploded in front of Community Party Headquarters, a United Nations organization office, and the homes of two liberal ministers. Overnight the cry went up from Communist and other sources: "It's those right-wing extremists

— they planted those bombs."

Despite the fact, that up to this writing no one has been apprehended by the law, the two ministers who were the victims of the "bomb" incidents, spent 25 minutes of valuable television time blaming the bombings on "the right-wing extremists". Marsha Hunt, a Hollywood actress of some dimension, joined in the snide accusations. Possibly, these accusers never heard of the Bible's reference to "rash judgment".

The Hollywood-Citizens News, usually a fine paper, now under new management, editorialized the bombings with these words, quote their editorial of February 7, 1962; — "formerly the violence connected with extremism usually came from the left. Now the right is getting into the despicable act." Drew Pearson devoted an entire column blaming "those right-wing extremists." All these accusations from so-called reliable people and sources, despite the fact, and I repeat, that up to this writing, no police authority has apprehended even a shadow of a suspect.

It may be worthwhile to explain for the benefit of the self-styled liberal block in this country, that one of the techniques of the Red conspirators is to go in for just such skullduggery, to wit: Toss a bomb in front of someone's door; distribute some anti-Catholic, anti-Negro or anti-Jewish leaflets in the neighborhood, and presto — "THE FASCISTS ARE AT IT AGAIN."

Several years ago in Louisville, Kentucky, a bomb was planted under the trailer home of a negro family. The bombing was followed by a planned propaganda barrage, blaming "those fascists." The professional liberals, egged on by the Reds, had their days of name-calling. Finally the real culprits were apprehended. Lo and behold, they turned out to be two notorious Communist agents, who were convicted and sentenced to a long term in the penitentiary. Unfortunately, the United States Supreme Court, which ruled that it is illegal for a State to defend itself against sedition, saw to it that these Reds did not have to serve out their sentences.

Another such incident occurred while I was posing as a Communist for the F.B.I. The Communists organized a riot against one of their own meetings. Several people, including some Party members were hurt in the ensuing embroglio. The next morning the Communists and their stupid allies blamed it on, you guessed it, "those fascist Pittsburgh police."

Many of us who have been the targets for the vicious slander, name-calling and intimidation, because we are in the fight to preserve our Republic and our Freedom, have no intention of letting an assortment of Red agents, self-appointed liberals and political hacks dissuade us from our work.

We can best answer all the character assassins by expanding our activities; organizing more study groups; opening more patriotic bookstores and information centers; utilizing the press, radio and television to reach millions of un-informed Americans with the Truth about the Communist threat. Let us not waste our valuable time answering the name-callers and character assassins. Let us instead re-double our efforts to bring the message of FREEDOM to our neighbors, our fellow-workers, and most of all, our students.

How U.S. Red Underground Will Operate

Third Phase of 'Operation Storm' Takes over All Of Party's Functions

Shortly after the Supreme Court ordered the Communist Party to register as a foreign agent—and to submit, to the Justice Department, a list of all its members—a secret meeting was called at a downtown New York hotel. Present were Gus Hall, nominal head of the CPUSA, "Comrade X" (an inconspicuous official of the Soviet UN delegation who represents the secret police), members of the party's ominously powerful Control Commission, and activists of the Red underground.

Purpose of the meeting: To put into full effect Operation Storm, plans which have been maturing since 1931 for putting the Communist Party on a "war footing"; to mobilize the Soviet Union's paramilitary apparatus in this country; and to resist the lawful efforts of the Justice Department to control the party's 60,000 "open" members, its 100,000 collaborators, and its "sleeping apparatus" (size unknown) which implements directives in non-Communist and even anti-Communist groups.

Operation Storm was given its dramatic name by Joseph Stalin. Despite the focus-pocus of "de-Stalinization" under Soviet dictator Nikita Khrushchev, the same and the strategy it covers have remained a fixture of Communist thinking in the United States and the rest of the free world.

Hall the Fall Guy

At the highly significant New York meeting, it was decided that Gus Hall would be the "fall guy" if the Justice Department stopped brooding over its law books and swung into action. For Hall, this was no surprise. Extensive training at the Lenin School of Revolution in Moscow—and his entire career as a Communist activist had prepared him for the role of "martyr" in the Red war against freedom. As early as 1934, Hall had boasted in a Minneapolis court that "when the times comes" he would proudly fight the American government.

That same year, he had led "terror groups" in the bloody Teamsters strike. In the 1937 "Little Steel" strike he set up a dynamite squad to frighten non-strikers and Republic Steel into submission. When he was arrested, the then-Red-infiltrated CIO paid his \$500 fine. In 1941, he served 90 days in the Youngstown jail for party-ordered election fraud.

The rest of the Communist Party and its hidden satellites in the U.S. were or-

ordered to put "Operation Storm—Phase Three" into effect. Phase One was ordered shortly after the Cold War began. Phase Two was push-buttoned when the leaders of the Communist Party were indicted under the "force and violence" clause of the Smith Act in 1948.

Worldwide Directive

The Outline of Operation Storm is not new. It was sketched in by a theoretician of destruction, B. Vassiliev, in 1931 as a directive to the worldwide Communist network.

In Phases One and Two, Vassiliev directed, the party must find hiding places for vital archives; organize illegal printing plants at which to print party organs and directives after legal party papers had been shut down; organize a corps for the distribution of party literature and propaganda; set up another corps of top-level activists which could quickly disappear into the underground; acquire houses, some for mail drops and espionage work, others in which underground leaders could meet and hide; establish a plan for liaison between legal and illegal functionaries; set up riot and sabotage groups; train a hard core of party workers able to run the illegal presses, handle codes, and organize agitation for Communists and their allies who tangle with the law.

Today Phases One and Two are fully in effect.

In 1946, shortly after Stalin scrapped the hypocritical pretensions of his wartime "alliance" with the West, the CPUSA began putting Operation Storm into practice. A careful security check of all party members was conducted. The Control Commission issued a questionnaire which every party member was ordered to complete. Designed to probe his past, his party history, the seamy side of his life, it was far more wide-ranging than any employment forms devised by the Office of Strategic Services or the Central Intelligence Agency. It gave the Control Commission a view into the member's reliability and his underground potential, afforded a handle for blackmail should he seek to defect, and offered a possible means for identifying FBI "plants" in the underground.

These questionnaires were micro-filmed and are now part of an extensive system of dossiers filed with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Moscow—for the use of the Soviet secret police, the Red Army's Fourth (Intelligence) Bureau, and the Prague-headquartered International Union of Students at No. 3 Vozlovskaya St. (a front for worldwide riot and sabotage operations).

grown soft during the 1941-46 "honeymoon" with the West, were reactivated. These units had first been organized in 1934 and had held regular training sessions (judo, riot tactics) at a summer "adult camp" in upstate New York.

Operation Peekskill

In September of 1949, the party leadership decided on a "practice drill" of these combat units. Some 2,500 activists of the "security guard" were ordered to provoke a riot in Peekskill, N. Y., in "defense" of the Communist Negro baritone Paul Robeson. A Westchester County grand jury which investigated the episode reported:

"Their leader wore the uniform of a United States Army lieutenant. They were stationed in military formation, shoulder to shoulder" around the grounds. "The security guard was a disciplined force and conducted itself in a military manner under the direction of its leaders."

Since the Peekskill baptism of fire, the combat forces have stepped up their training. Lessons learned in the attempted coup d'etat which gutted Bogota during the 1948 Inter-American Conference, in Red China and Korea, in the Latin-American riots planned and directed by the International Union of Students during Vice President Nixon's trip, in Guatemala and Cuba, and in the jungles of Southeast Asia—these have been incorporated in the training.

Sabotage of Defense

"Industrial concentration" also became a slogan. During the period of the Hitler-Stalin Pact, the party had learned that wildcat strikes at key points could accomplish far more than a thousand New York mass meetings. (In January, 1941, 50 party members had shut down the Allis-Chalmers plant—holding up \$45 million in defense contracts, block-

ing the production of jet engines, and shutting down the Ford Company's aircraft engine plant.) Party intellectuals were ordered to give up their bookish ways, don overalls, and get jobs in industries which were involved in the national defense. With the growing emphasis on missile warfare, the party has sent its members into this field, with a concomitant rise in strikes and unrest.

In 1947, also, the party began "submerging" its own members. Non-Communist statisticians of party strength were fed information that membership was sharply declining, and this was happily broadcast as an indication of Communist impotence. The underground party was broken up into roughly 4,000 fragments, the base being a cell of no more than ten members. (Since then, these cells have been subdivided.)

Party Cards Destroyed

In Operation Storm's Phase Two—after the Smith Act indictments—all party cards were ordered destroyed. Dues payments receipts were banned.

The party's financial structure was reinforced. Millions of dollars collected by "front groups" for Spanish Relief, Negro lynch cases, anti-Nazi groups, and other causes into which naive liberals poured funds, had been invested in legitimate enterprises: real estate, a perfume house, record companies, mail-order firms, World War II defense plants, electronics businesses, night clubs, bookshops, machine-tool manufacturing, a doll factory, etc. Large printing firms purchased paper, portable printing equipment, mimeograph machines, and ink—to be stored for future use.

Under Phase Two, some of these holdings were liquidated by the dummy corporations set up by the party. At a closed meeting of the Politburo, the party's organizational secretary reported that he had at his disposal "a reserve fund of

several million dollars to carry on our work no matter what happens." A member of the "sleeper apparatus" kept \$500,000 in his bank account for immediate use.

Systematic Basis

Beginning in 1947, and repeated each year since then, moreover, the party carried out detailed surveys of defense plants, transportation facilities, food and water supply lines in the big cities, and the automotive and electronics industries. (Recently, experimental facilities and research activities were added on a systematic basis, though the party had always kept an eye—and a microfilm camera—on U.S. science.)

Now that Phase Three has been ordered, a kind of "radio silence" has descended over the CPUSA. The "open" membership has virtually disappeared. The "illegal apparatus" ordered by Vassiliev has taken over all party functions. Contacts among its leadership have been reduced to a minimum—and only for vitally important matters. The underground railway, running from New York to Washington to Mexico City and down to Latin America to the Soviet Union's "communications center" in Montevideo, is traveled only by the most trusted couriers.

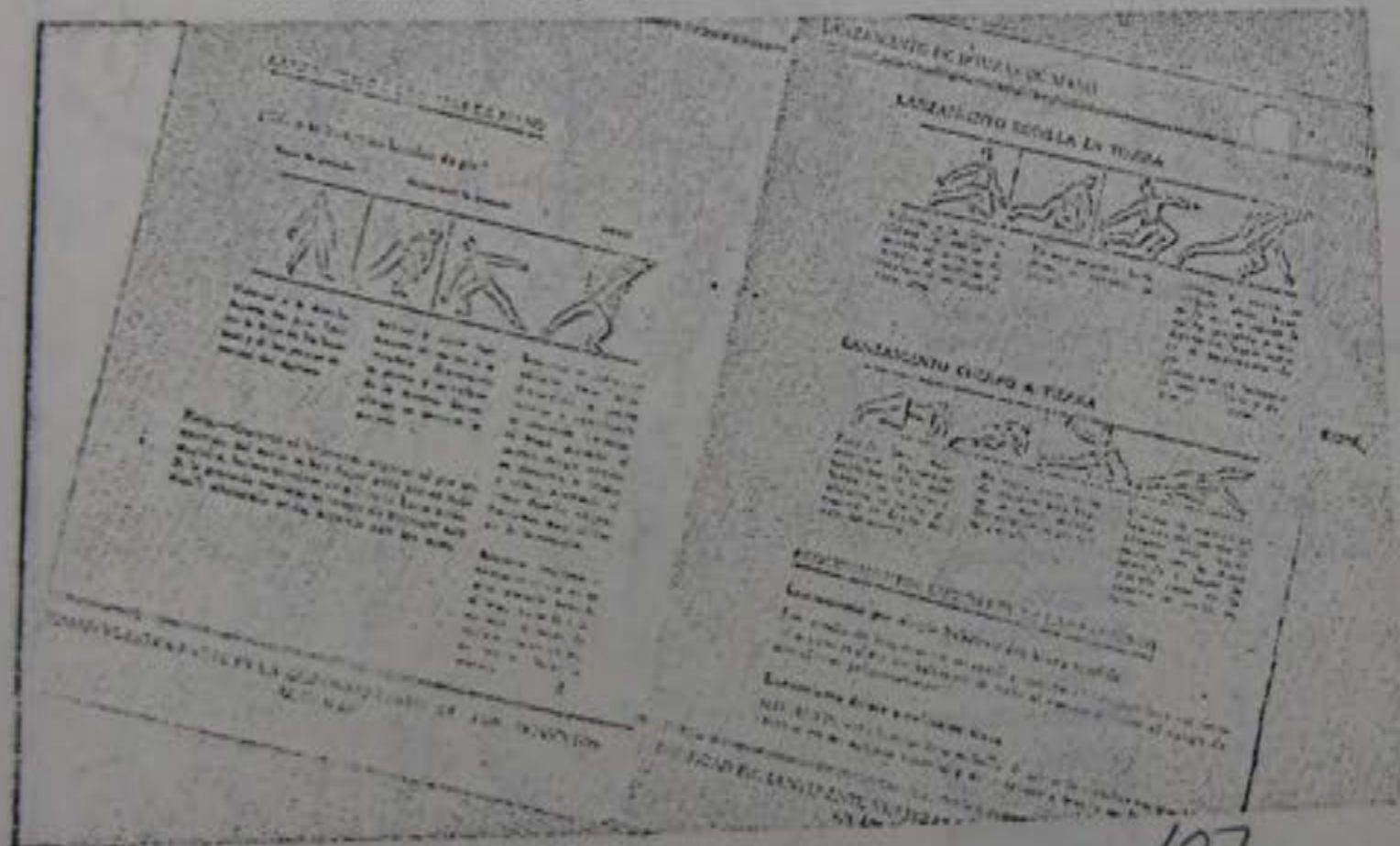
Party presses are busily turning out forged Social Security cards and other identity papers. New backgrounds, personalities, even faces (through the use of plastic surgery) are being created for those too valuable to risk in a possible FBI dragnet of Communist activities. With forged passports and phony driver's licenses, the party can quickly provide escape for any member it deems essential. At the last count there were close to 40 illegal party presses at work.

New Precautions

A top-level directive, dated April 30, 1951—issued when the CPUSA thought that Phase Three was imminent—has been updated. It reads—and this writer saw it in its original form: "Leaders elected to replace those imprisoned are to work as secretly as possible from places already designated . . . Presses and newsprint . . . should be known only to those charged with the printing of literature . . ." An order has gone out that all mail drops are to be changed weekly, all couriers are to be under thorough surveillance and shifted frequently. (These precautions were taken in 1951, then dropped.)

But what is Phase Four in the Communist operations manual? It should come as a jolt to those who regard the CPUSA with amusement: To sabotage industry, spread panic, and seize communications media at the moment of Soviet sneak attack. That attack may never come, but the Communists are ready for it if it does.

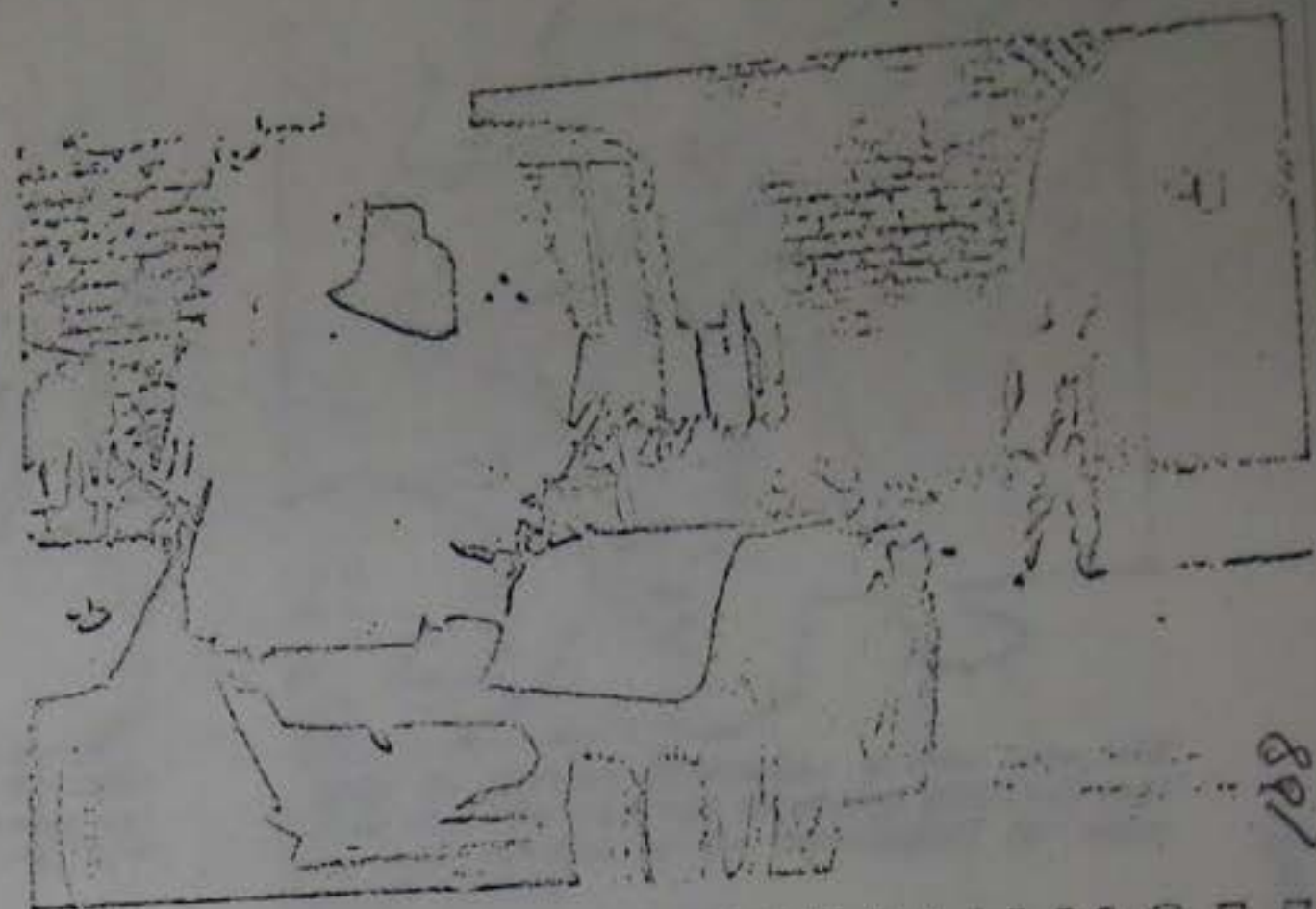

Throughout history, every dictatorship has eventually taken whatever steps were felt necessary to perpetuate itself. This has been true regardless of whether it was a dictatorship by an individual or dictatorship by a bureaucracy.

If the dictatorship feels its existence is threatened, then every possible activity which might lead to its destruction will sooner or later be declared illegal. If those people who live under dictatorships restrict their actions to purely legal activity, then they may be assured that whatever they are doing is not effective.

Effective opposition to a dictatorship must sooner or later involve illegal action.

If the course of history continues in its present path, then it is only a matter of time until the American people live under a complete dictatorship. If the actions of the Minutemen organization are effective then we can be certain that they will eventually be declared illegal and the organization itself will be outlawed either directly or indirectly.

When that time comes, then our members will each face a difficult choice. Either they will have to resign from the organization and beg the dictator for forgiveness or they must expect to resist with violence whatever force the dictator uses against them.

The tragic thing about such situations is that it always places one group in conflict with other groups of their own fellow countrymen.

Until the dictatorship is finally destroyed, it will have control of the regular armed forces. The time may come when American troops may be forced to hunt down members of the Minutemen organization or else be court martialed themselves.

By that time, our own position may be very difficult. We will need desperately to reach our fellow citizens with our propaganda message, and our facilities for doing so will be most limited.

Members of the armed forces will, of course, not be told that the Minutemen are a patriotic organization. They will be told, instead, that we are bandits or perhaps even that we are communists. We will need some means of letting our fellow Americans know what we really stand for. If American soldiers are told that Minutemen are bandits or communists and are sent out to hunt us down, then it might make them stop and think if they found posters like the one enclosed tacked up along their route of march.

To make certain that such material is available when needed most it is going to have to be printed and stockpiled well in advance. It may prove just as valuable to stockpile propaganda material as to stockpile guns and ammunition.

YOU -- AND THE F.B.I.

Lawyers Advise Citizens Of Rights

In view of recent developments, it seems appropriate to repeat some sound legal advice to Southerners. The following resolution was adopted in 1960 by the Leflore County Bar Association at Greenwood, Miss.:

"In view of the public interest in possible investigations under Civil Rights legislation of various local affairs by the Attorney General of the United States, the Leflore County Bar Association feels that as a public service it should inform local citizens of their individual rights if they should be approached or questioned by FBI or other agents in connection with such investigations.

"A citizen is under no legal obligation at any time to answer any questions asked by any investigator about anything except in a court hearing or at a court-connected proceeding.

"For example, if an FBI agent or other investigator contacts a citizen at home, at work, on the street, or elsewhere, such citizen can, if he wishes, advise the investigator that he does not wish to answer any questions and can legally refuse to do so.

"In expressing this opinion, the Bar Association does not imply that information in any real criminal investigation should be withheld from any investigating officer. The FBI is a very efficient ~~and reliable~~ law enforcement organization, and the Bar Association urges that all citizens cooperate with it fully in its endeavors against crime and subversion.

"On the other hand, we do point out that when the FBI or other agency is ordered to make an investigation, not against a criminal or against a subversionist, but under Federal Civil Rights legislation, a citizen can legally stand silent and refuse to assist in that investigation by refusing to answer any questions of any kind, harmless as such questions may appear, about voting, schools, employment, or anything whatsoever."

III INTERVIEWS WITH SUBJECT

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date November 28, 1967

JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH, 332 Iowa Street, immediately acknowledged the identity of the interviewing Agent, stated that he had no desire to consult an attorney, that he was completely aware of his rights, and had no objections whatsoever to talking to the interviewing Agent.

SCARBOROUGH advised that he has learned of no information whatsoever concerning the GEORGE METCALVE or WHARLEST JACKSON bombings in Natchez, Mississippi. He again stated that he had no prior knowledge of these acts and could furnish no information whatsoever as to who might have been responsible for these bombings.

SCARBOROUGH advised that at the present time, the only activity or membership he has in any organization is with the National Rifle Association (NRA) in the Ferriday, Louisiana, area. He stated he is interested in this organization only because the use of firearms is a hobby of his and he desires to learn as much as possible about firearms. SCARBOROUGH stated that he has no present Klan activity himself and that he knows of no Klan member who is presently associated with the NRA. SCARBOROUGH further volunteered that he does not know of any Klan activity taking place in the Ferriday, Louisiana, area.

SCARBOROUGH denied any knowledge of the Minutemen organization. He advised that he had recently been told by a fellow employee of his, TOMMIE LEE JONES of Natchez, Mississippi, that he had received a Minutemen emblem through the mail. SCARBOROUGH advised that JONES accused him of sending this emblem to him. SCARBOROUGH emphatically denied sending this emblem to JONES and commented further that he had no information as to who might have sent this to JONES nor why.

SCARBOROUGH concluded by stating that he knows of no Klan activity at the present time in the Ferriday, Louisiana, area and stated further that if any Klan group was organized or re-organized in this area, he would have nothing whatsoever to do with it.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date 11/3/67

1 JAMES EARL SCARBOROUGH was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and was interviewed at his home on Iowa Street. Special Agent JOHN A. PERLBERG advised him that he had heard that SCARBOROUGH was making the remark that "the FBI is bugging" the place that he and the other Minutemen have been using as a meeting place, and, if this were true, SA PERLBERG wished to admonish him and make clear to him that the FBI does not use that type of technique to conduct investigations.

He advised that he had never made any such remarks and asked the Agent to recontact the person making such allegations and tell that person that "he's a damn liar."

He denied that he was a member of any Minuteman organization or that there was one in the Concordia Parish area or that he knew of anyone associated with that organization. He admitted that he had received some reading material from the Minutemen, and that he had it in his house, along with many other books and material about Communism. One of these was "Masters of Deceit" by J. EDGAR HOOVER, which he enjoyed greatly.

He advised that many stories seemed to be circulating about him and that some of these were "terrible, immoral, horrible" stories, none of which were true, and that he had had a number of long discussions about these charges with Special Agent FRANK WATTS and told SA WATTS the same thing.

He advised that "the FBI can bug any place I go," because he had nothing to hide.

He again was reminded that this is not the Bureau's procedure, and SA PERLBERG showed him a card bearing the picture of a silver dollar and wondered if, as KEB CLOVER had told SA PERLBERG, this card would have any meaning for SCARBOROUGH.

He advised it did not mean anything to him except it was a picture of a silver dollar.

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He advised he could not spend a lot of time talking to agents every day or two, but if SA PEPPER wanted to talk to him about anything in the future, he could phone him at his home phone, which is 757-3476.

SCARBOROUGH had been dressed in gray work clothing during the interview, and as agent drove up to his residence, he had been talking to a slim white male, about six feet tall, dressed in the same manner, who had immediately walked into SCARBOROUGH's house before agent could see his face. A black Ford Pickup truck was parked in SCARBOROUGH's driveway during the interview, which was conducted at the gate of the hurricane fence that surrounds the house.
