A second source advised on May 20, 1969, that the OKKKK continues to be active within the State of Louisiana, and that the aims and purposes of this organization continue to be to promote Americanism, the supremacy of the white race and the furtherance of segregation between the races.

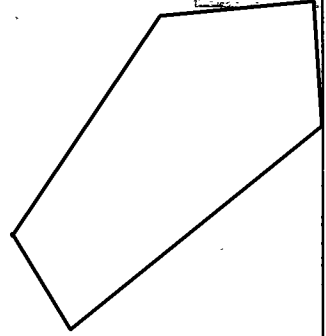





About six years or more ago, he received a phone call about 2:00 a.m., from the Concordia Parish Hospital, Ferriday, Louisiana, stating there was an emergency room patient there who needed care. When he arrived at the hospital, he discovered the patient was a white male (First Name Unknown) [redacted] and Deputy FRANK E. DE LAUGHTER, Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office, and another Concordia Parish Deputy, name unrecalled, had brought [redacted] to the hospital. The nurse on duty, [redacted] had prepared the history of [redacted] injuries before he arrived at the hospital and while DE LAUGHTER was present. DE LAUGHTER was present while he examined [redacted] who had a number of lacerations of the scalp which required sutures. He cannot recall what other injuries [redacted] had. The injuries were severe enough to warrant emergency care. Neither [redacted] nor DE LAUGHTER or the other deputy discussed with him how the injuries to [redacted] took place and his only recollection of the history as taken by [redacted] was that [redacted] had fallen in some way.

He prepared no separate report or other document regarding his care of [redacted]. He completed the emergency room record at the hospital. He kept a copy of that record, as is his usual practice, but a search of his files failed to reveal the document. He never saw [redacted] again.

He recalled this incident because a few weeks afterwards, he was interviewed by a SA [redacted] of the FBI and when he saw DE LAUGHTER a few days after that interview, he asked DE LAUGHTER why the FBI came to see him.

Since these incidents six years ago or more, he has not discussed [redacted] with anyone, including DE LAUGHTER, EDWARD FULLER, "BLACKIE" DRANE, or [redacted]. The following investigation was conducted by SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] on March 6, 1972:

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At Ferriday, Louisiana

[redacted] advised that he clearly recalls that the nurse on duty at the time he was called in to attend victim was [redacted] and he described her as a large heavy-set woman with a glass eye. She has not worked at the hospital for at least two or three years, and he understands that she has left the Concordia Parish area.

[redacted] Medical Records Librarian, Concordia Parish Hospital, advised that [redacted] and her husband have moved from Concordia Parish to unknown location. [redacted] left her employment with the hospital about three years ago. Her husband is [redacted], who was employed three years ago by the town of Vidalia at an unknown job.

The current phone book for Concordia Parish shows no listing for [redacted] or [redacted]

[redacted] MD, Huntington Plaza Medical Center, Ferriday, Louisiana, who was aware of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, was shown a series of color photographs of [redacted] and stated he could not identify these photographs as being pictures of anyone he has known or treated and the injuries pictured are not those he recalled previously.

[redacted] advised he had located his copy of the emergency room record concerning the patient that he had thought was called (first name unknown) [redacted] and showed SA [redacted] this record, which identified the patient as [redacted] a married white male, age [redacted] and residing at [redacted]. The record showed the patient came to the emergency room at 3:59 a.m., on [redacted] 1965, was ambulatory, [redacted] was injured in Ferriday, and was injured when he "fell and struck head on unknown object." The responsible party was listed as FRANK DE LAUGHTER, and the record bore the notation, "Bill to FRANK DE LAUGHTER \$15." Patient's condition upon admission was shown as good, and the record was signed by nurses [redacted].

[redacted] advised the above information was in [redacted] writing, and the rest of the record was in his. His diagnosis was two lacerations of the scalp, for which one suture was applied; loosened front teeth; and contusion of right temporal and mandibular area. His treatment was to examine close the lacerations of the scalp and administer tetanus injection. He never saw this patient again.

It was not the practice of the police authorities to be billed personally as DE LAUGHTER was for this patient's care for he had the impression that [redacted] was DE LAUGHTER's prisoner.

After considerable reflection about the matter, he realized that the assumption had been built up in his mind that [redacted] was the man that DE LAUGHTER was being charged in Federal Court with beating, for this was his only white male patient apparently connected with DE LAUGHTER that he associated with an FBI investigation and this was reinforced by his recollection

of his interview with SA [redacted] six or more years ago, for at that time, [redacted] told him he was conducting a civil rights investigation and referred to the victim by some name other than [redacted]. At that time he had located [redacted] record because [redacted] had been able to furnish him the date of his examination at the Concordia Parish Hospital emergency room. He is not sure how he associated the name [redacted] with [redacted] but about two years ago, DE LAUGHTER made the passing comment to him that DE LAUGHTER was "getting ready to go before Judge DAWKINS in Monroe, Louisiana" about some type of beating, and he got the impression from DE LAUGHTER that the victim was the same man he treated under the name of [redacted]. This was merely an impression he got from a few words of bating back and forth between himself and DE LAUGHTER.

After his secretary had located [redacted] record following his previous interview by FBI Agents, he called upon [redacted] who is his personal attorney, too, but did not show [redacted] record to [redacted]. He told [redacted] that the FBI had talked to him about a man named [redacted] or [redacted], and although he had no record of treating such a man, he did have a record of care of a man with a different name. [redacted] merely mentioned that [redacted] "used many aliases" but did not make any remarks as to what significance, if any, there was to Dr. [redacted] care of anyone. The purpose of his visit to [redacted] was to find out if he would be in legal trouble letting the FBI see the medical record and [redacted] said he should cooperate with the FBI. [redacted] did not ask for [redacted] name or ask to see [redacted] record.

[redacted] reiterated that a thorough search of his files showed no document pertaining to [redacted] or similar names and he could not recall caring for or seeing any such person. He was certain [redacted] record was the one he had reference to on the prior interview, for he had marked "F.B.I." on the back after [redacted] visit. He will continue to maintain custody of [redacted] record in the event it is needed in court. It is noted subjects were found guilty and sentenced on count one of a two-count indictment and have been sentenced. Count two resulted in a hung jury and the Department of Justice decided not to try the subjects again on count two.

[Redacted], Assistant United States Attorney, Western District of Louisiana, Shreveport, Louisiana, advised on November 1, 1973, count two of the indictment against the subjects will be dismissed in the near future. [Redacted] advised on November 19, 1973, count two of the indictment against the subjects was dismissed in United States District Court, Western District of Louisiana, November 12, 1973, and his file on the subjects has been closed.
