On May 31,1965, LEE HALLORAN made available to UKA Klansmen from the Monroe and West Monroe Units 1,000 "councilors" with literature to the same regarding the integration policies of the Paramont Theatre in Monroe, Louisiana. HALLORAN also stated that he recently purchased a printing press. He stated that an individual who lives in Sterlington, Louisiana, and belongs to the Sterlington Unit of the UKA works as a printer in Monroe. HALLORAN stated that this printer would be the individual who would run the printing press which would turn off Citizens Council and Klan-type literature. FOIA(b)(7) - (D)

On May 31, 1965,

tore down the three crosses which had been burn during the course of the rally. The above Klansmen also contacted on Gordon Avenue, Monroe, Louisiana, one W. A. HARRISON who is employed by the Columbia Carbon Plant and is originally from Franklin Parish, Louisiana, regarding his joing the Monroe Unit of the UKA.

TOMMY REAGAN was later contacted by the above Klansmen and stated that he was going to meet with a Negro by the name of ROBERT BEAL, who would be conducting anti-civil rights activities for the Klan during the forthcoming summer. ROBERT BEAL, a Negro, who works closely with the Klan, is giving the impression that Negroes are not interested in Civil Rights.

On June 2, 1965, at 7:30 PM, a meeting of six units of the

follows: Calhoun Unit Sterlington Unit **OKKKK Unit 504** This was an emergency meeting called by TOMMY REAGAN regarding a letter written by the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) to the Negroes citizens of Monroe and West Monroe. This letter stated in essence that a freedom weekend would be held in Monroe and West Monroe, on June12 and 13, 1965. The purpose of this freedom weekend was to test all public facilities, accommodations and churches in the West Monroe and Monroe, Louisiana area. REAGAN stated that he called this meeting for the purpose of discussing Klan policy regarding the forthcoming Negro integration drive. It was decided at this meeting to have 35,000 circulars printed at TOM GATES' Printing Establishment located on Oliver Road, Monroe, Louisiana, at a cost of \$85.00. These circulars would state in essence that the Negro citizens should stay at home over the weekend of June 12 and 13, 1965 and to use their own facilities. It urged not to go to any planned CORE demonstrations and to worship at their own church in their own way. This circular also warned Negroes that OORE was made up of outside Communists agitators and would only lead the Negro citizens

of Monroe and West Monroe into trouble. It was decided that beginning on Monday, June 7, 1965, a unit of the UKA would begin spreading these circulars throughout the Monroe and West Monroe, Louisiana area During the succeeding five days a new unit would replace the unit which had spread the circulars on the previous day. These circulars would be spread throughout the Negro neighborhoods and marticularly concentrated on Negro churches. It was also decided to contact white and Negro ministers regarding the forthcoming integration drive and to offer the services of the Klan to turn away any CORE attempts to enter the churches.

It was further proposed at this meeting to stage a Ku Klux Klan sit-in at the Walgreen Drug Store located on DeSiard Street, Monroe, Louisiana. Following the sit-in which would last from 11:00 to 2:00 PM on June 10, 1965, a circular would be left at the drug store which would state in essence that the UKA understood that public accommodations had to comply with the Civil Rights Acto of 1964 but that the UKA would boycott any establishment which wilfully encouraged integration as did the Walgrees Drug Store.

It was also discussed the circulars which would be distributed regarding the Paramont Theatre in Monroe, Louisiana. These circulars are scheduled to be distributed in the week of June 7 through June 11, 1965. These circulars would state in essence that the Paramont Theatre has previously encouraged

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Negroes to sit in the white section. This is only encouraging racial tension. Think before you buy a ticket. It was decided that a meeting would be held at the maidence TOMMY REAGAN also brought up the fact that Doctor JAMES

of TOMMY REAGAN on the following Wednesday, June 9, 1965. It was decided that UKA and the OKKKK wold co-ordinate the activities over the weekend of June 12 and 13, 1965. It was decided that the sections of Monroe and West Monroe would be broken down into jurisdictional areas covered by either the UKA or the OKKKK. Klansmen with Citizens Band Radio cars would then drive throughout their various jurisdictional areas and watch what the Monroe and West Monroe Police Departments were doing about the attempts by

the Negroes to integrate public accommodations and facilities in the Monroe and West Monroe, Louisiana area. It was decided that a definite policy as to what the Klan was going to do would be decided on June 9, 1965. EDWARDS, Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana, had contacted him and the units of the UKA throughout the State of Louisiana, stating that there would be gigantic Klan march through the streets of Natchez, Mississippi on June 12, 1965. E. W. McDANIEL, Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana, requested that 4,000 Klansmen from the States of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama meet in Vidalia, Louisiana, at 11:00 AM on June 12, 1965, and then drive across the Mississippi River to Natchez, where they would park their cars and proceed with their march through the streets of Natchez. He did stated that one delegate, BILL WINDAM, would represent the Monroe and West Monroe Units at this march. REAGAN stated that he would send out a request for all UKA Klansmen in Northeast Louisiana to come to Monroe, Louisiana on June 12-13, 1965, On June 3, 1965, a meeting of the Grater Ouachita Parish TOMMY REAGAN, COY NEAL and BILL WINDAM decided that it

for the purpose of participating with the UKA Units in Ouachita Parish in watching what the Negro Civil Rights groups would be doing as far as integration is concerned. Citizens Countil was held at the Ouachita Parish Library, located in West Monroe, Louisiana. There were approximately 35 to 40 individuals in attendance at this rally. ROBERT FULLER through his Lieutenant EDDIE HORTON, and invite them to the forthcoming Wednesday night meeting, June 9, 1965. REAGAN stated that he felt that FULLER's men in conjunction with UKA Klansmen could prevent Negroes from entering churchers, swimming pools and restaurants throughout Monroe and West Monroe, Louisiana area.

On June 3, 1965, a meeting of the Monroe Unit of the UKA was held on the property of ED BOLTON. Present at this meeting were the following:

NEAL stated that in view of the forthcoming Negro integration drive in Monroe, on June 12, 13, 1965, an order would be issued by TOMMY REAGAN cancelling all Klan participation from Northeast Louisiana at the Natchez, Mississippi march. He did state, however, that it was decided that BILL WINDAM from the Monroe Unit would attend this march at Natchez.

NEAL stated that all Klansmen going to Vidalia, Louisiana at 11:00 AM in order to meet prior to going over to Natchez, would have Rebel flags tied to their radio atennas. This would be an indication to anyone else that the individual would participate in the parade and would be a Klansmen.

NEAL stated that the policy as to what the Klan would do on the weekend of June 12, 13, 1965, would be decided at a meeting at TOMMY REAGAN's house on June 9, 1965. NEAL stated that to date it has been decided that if the Monroe Police Department does not take action against the Negro demonstrators that the Klan would take license numbers and descriptions of the Negroes participating in integrationist type activities and then at a later date take retribution against these individuals.

NEAL stated that a Klan sit-in was set for Thursday, June 10, 1965, at Walgreens Drug Store located in downtown Monroe,

About one month ago, CHARLES LUM of the Junction City, Arkansas UKA Unit started an OKKKK or Original Klans of America, Inc. Unit at Norphleet, Arkansas. This Unit now has 9 members and LUM stated that this was the only OKKKK Unit invited to participate in the rally to be held May 8, 1965, at Junction City.

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JOE MURPHY, Exalted Cyclops of the Crossett Unit recently had some Klan cards printed at Eudora, Arkansas. These are the standard cards reading "Thousands of Klansmen watching, waiting, KU KLUX KLAN, Let Your Conscience Be Your Guide." They were printed by the same man who prints the newspaper in Eudora, a former alcoholic, who may be a Klan member. MURPHY stated that 1,000 of these cards were printed. At least 5 different sizes and colors of this type card has been printed by separate Klan Units over the past few years. In the first part of 1964, HOUSTON MORRIS had 2,000 of these cards printed for MURRAY MARTIN at Bryan & Bryan Printing Co. in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. All of these cards were turned over to MARTIN by MORRIS. MORRIS is not known to have taken any similar cards to Arkansas at any time.

R. Q. SIMMONS of Little Rock, Arkansas, is believed to be a Klan member but his affiliation at this time is unknown. He has phone number LO 5-2050.

NO T-2 advised the following:

On May 15, 1970; May 22, 1970; May 29, 1970; and June 5, 1970, subject attended Klan meatings near Lake Concordia, Louisiana. During the meeting of June 5, 1970, subject was given the assignment to distribute Klan pumphlets in Clayton, Louisiana. During the meeting, it was discussed about killing off some individuals in the Ferriday-

> Vidalia, Louisiana, area, but he helped in talking down this idea as he wanted to get in good with the influential people in the area before any action was taken.

On July 5, 1970, State Fire Marshal LLOYD PERKINS, Waterproof, Louisiana, advised that the fires at Posternack Hardware and at Cornet's Restaurant undoubtedly was arson. He doubted that the blacks were responsible for the fire at Cornet's Restaurant and stated he suspected the subject of being implicated in the arson but had no proof.

On June 19, 1970, NO T-3 advised that a meeting was held on June 5, 1970, at the subject's home. This meeting was a meeting of the OKKKK although this unit had no known connection with any state-wide group. Meetings were scheduled for each Friday and mention was made that there were a lot of pamphlets to be passed out. Some of the individuals present made a contribution to the fund for the subject's defense concerning his arrest for passing out Klen literature.

NO T-2 advised on June 18, 1970, that a Klan meeting of the Concordia Parish Unit was held on June 12, 1970. Immediately after the meeting, the subject was elected Exalted Cyclops of the unit.

On July 6, 1970, NO T-2 advised that a meeting of the Klan was held June 26, 1970, in Concordia Parish, Louisiana, and was attended by the subject. Subject made the statement he was upset about the subpoena he had received from a Fire Marshal in Concordia Parish, Louisiana, and stated that the Magroes could burn down the whole city and the Klan would get the blame.

NO T-2 advised on July 17, 1970, that a meeting was held at the subject's residence in Concordia, Louisiana, ou July 10, 1970, wherein a discussion was held where it was decided the entire group should split into Louisiana and Mississippi factions. It was later decided that the subject would head the Louisiana faction.

On July 31, 1970, NO T-4 advised that mention was made that subject was selling his property in Concordia Parish, Louisiana, and was going to move to Morgan City, Louisiana. NO 157-3611 FDM: jpb

On Jugust 10, 1970, NO T-4 advised a discussion was overheard, mentioning the subject was moving some explosives from some place in Ferriday, Louisiana, since too many people knew about the explosives. No definite plans were made.

On October 1, 1970, NO T-3 advised that the subject had moved to Morgan City, Louisiana, where he reportedly bought a part interest in a business. NO T-3 advised subject is currently inactive in the Klan.

On October 19, 1970, NO T-3 advised that the KLan organization which the subject formed about three months prior to this date has not been able to hold regular meetings since the subject moved. This Klan unit was not connected with any state or national Klan group but was made up of former OKKKK members.

He still lives at Houte 1, Clayton, Louisiana, at the home of his mother, which is located in Catahoula Parish on a gravel road between Clayton and Sicily Island, Louisiana. He remains single, and he works at Fortenberry Drilling Company, Natchez, Mississippi, as an oil field worker. His brother, JAMES E. "BILL" ELANEY, who lives in Natchez, Mississippi, also works for Fortenberry. He advised his mother has a telephone at her house, which is 318-389-5885. His personal car is a 1969 white Pontiac Catalina, four-door sedan, with current Louisiana license, number unrecalled. His mother's vehicle is a 1963 white Chevrolet pick-up truck with current Louisiana license plate. This vehicle has cattle racks, but these racks have not been used in the truck for several months. He has two uncles who live between Sicily Island and Harrisonburg, Louisian on the Doty Road. One of these is DEWEY BLANEY, his father's brother, whose car is a 1966 Pontiac sedan, white in color, and according to his mother, DEWEY ELANEY also had a Volkswagon sedan, color unknown, which DEWEY ELANEY's wife wrecked recently The other uncle is a half-uncle, his father's half-brother, J. M. BLANEY, who drives a pick-up truck and some type of automobile, but he is unaware of what kind. He has never borrowed any vehicles from J. M. BLANEY or DEWEY BLANEY, and it has been four or five months at least since he has seen either of them. He hasn't been to or through Sicily Island, Louisiana, since them either.

He recalls the fire in Ferriday when the Cornet Restaurant was burned, for he had been at home, which can be vouched for by his mother, when the fire took place. He usually leaves home at about 5:30 a.m. to go to Natchez to work, and as he passed Cornet Restaurant, he noticed a a _____

This was because it was claimed they ware throwing klan pamphlets out the window of his car. He does not know if the klan printed these pamphlets or not. A night or two bafors the incident, a man whose voice he could not recognize asked him to pick up a bundle of the pamphlets on the layes outside Perriday and to distribute them, and he did. This was because the pamphlets ware against Communism, and he is against Communism

No one has ever asked him to join the Minuteusa or 219 klan organization, and he has never belonged to any such organization.

He has no interest in what goes on in Sicily Island or Fermiday and does not care what the blacks and whites do to each other. He has no information indicating who set any of the first in those towns.

Following interview, Mr. BLANEY was observed to be driving a 1969 white Pontiac Catalina four-door sedan with 1870-71 Louisiana license 69 E 355. / 3 NO 157-5553 JAP-sd

They have also deter mined that Dewey Blaney, another uncle, who also lives on the same road as J. M. BLANEY is still married to LINDA MORACE, the daughter of E. D. MORACE, and they have one child. They have lived in Natchez, Mississippi, the past two years. BLANEY has lived at his present address in Natchez, the past fourteen months and prior to that lived on the 700 block of Rankin Street, in Natchez. He is employed as a roughneck for Fortenberry Drilling Company. Highway 61, Natchez.

BLANEY owns and drives a 1967 blue Mercury, bearing a Mississippi license plate, the number unrecalled by him.

BLANEY denied knowing anything at all about the klan and denied he has recently or ever attended a klan meeting. He denied knowing anything at all about any house or houses having been burned in the Sicily Island, Louisiana, area. He denied knowing anyone who drives a white colored Volkswagon and said he has never been inside a Volkswagon car.

Mr. KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was advised of the identities of Special Agents JOHN A. PFEIFER and JAMES A. WOOTEN, and Special Agent PFEIFER advised him of the nature of the interview after which Mr. HEAD furnished the following information:

He knows nothing about what caused the fires in Ferriday, Louisiana, and Sicily Island, Louisiana, but he is sure the blacks started them and has furnished the Fire Marshal with a list, which is about two years old, of the blacks that are trouble-makers in Ferriday. The source of this list was "investigation" conducted by "some of his friends."

He stated he has one child that attends school, and this child goes to the Concordia Christian Academy. This costs him about \$68 per month, and is a severe economic problem for him. His daughter is married to JOHN KAHL, and they live on the Ferriday-Vidalia Highway, but they do not have any children of school age as yet. He, himself, continues to work at New and Hughes Drilling Company in Natchez, Mississippi, and he and his family live on Lake Concordia, outside Ferriday.

He and several of his friends have decided to take precautions to protect themselves and their families in the event the blacks in Ferriday run wild, and he is sure this is going to happen "sooner or later," because of the way the Communists are taking over the country. He and his friends are not Minutemen, nor is their group really organized or to be considered a klan group. He has passed out rigid orders to all of them that they are not to be involved in any trouble between blacks and whites, but are to protect themselves and their families if directly endangered. He has no faith in the ability of the Sheriff's Office and the City Police to keep order, and when the blacks "run wild," they are expected by him "to run right over the Ferriday Police and the Sheriff's deputies."

He knows RALEIGH JACKSON "RED" GLOVER and sees him every now and then, but he is certain GLOVER has had no connection with the fires.

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He has a number of ancient, inoperative cars at his home, but the ones he and his family use are as follows: his vehicle is a New and Hughes Drilling Company truck, dark graysih brown in color, with a flatbed and a winch on the back, which he uses to go to and from work. He also drives a 1968 yellow Ford pick-up truck with white top and open bed. (This vehicle was observed to have 1970 Louisiana license 268-445.) His wife uses a 1965 Oldsmobile Starfire, four-door sedan, navy blue in color with a silver stripe. (This vehicle was observed to bear 1970 Louisiana license 69 E 023.)

He has lived now and for the past two months at a furnished apartment at the end of Ashburn Avenue in Natchez, Mississippi, and his landlady is Mrs. H. K. WILKERSON. He still works at Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, Natchez, Mississippi, on the midnight to 8:00 a.m. shift, and he usually goes home on weekends to Kentwood, Louisiana, where his real home is located. His wife's son is JAMES WATTS, whose family lives in Natchez, Mississippi. They have only one child of school age, a boy, but he was not able to start school because he put out one of his eyes in an accident while playing with a pen-knife.

He has only heard vaguely about the recent fires in Ferriday, Louisiana, and does not believe he has heard about any fires in Sicily Island, Louisiana. It has been six years since he has been in Sicily Island, and he usually does not go near Ferriday, for he has no interest in the place or in what the whites or blacks do there.

He knows "BILL" BLANEY as the son-in-law of the deceased ED MORACE, but he has not seen BLANEY for "quite a while." He usually sees KENNETH NORMAN HEAD about once a week. The last time he saw him was about one week ago, at J. B. TEMPLE's store, Temple Auto Parts, in Vidalia, Louisiana. HEAD made no mention of the fires in Ferriday or Sicily Island, then or previously.

He still buys auto parts from J. B. TEMPLE, and in the past month or two has bought about \$300 worth of auto parts from him.

He stated he believed the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) had tried to implicate him in a burglary at

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Tumminello's Grocery in Ferriday two or three years ago, that he is being spied on by personnel at his place of employment, and that he is sure they are writing down his car license numbers and the identities of his associates and that the FBI is "always talking to me every time a nigger gets burned up or blown up." Special Agent PFEIFER assured Mr. GLOVER he was mistaken about the above assumptions.

Mr. GLOVER stated he works with blacks and does not cause them any trouble, but because they always seem to make trouble for him one way or another if he associates with them, he tries to stay clear of them at all times.

He denied belonging to any Minutemen or klam type organization and stated he has no interest in what the whites or blacks do to each other.

Mr. GLOVER was observed to be a white male, aged about 48, five fest nine inches tall, blue eyes, 165 to 170 pounds, reddish hair, balding forehead, pale complexion, wearing clear plastic lensed glasses.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD continues to reside on Lake Concordia, Ferriday, La., and is employed by the Hughes and New Oil Co., Natchez, Miss. HEAD reportedly was recently involved in a new klan type organization being formed in the Ferriday, La., area; and, in the past, has been reported to have been in possession of automatic weapons and explosive material.

DETAILS

Characterizations of the Silver Dollar Group (SDG) and the Minutemen are attached in the Appendix Section of this report.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

On April 24, 1970, NO T-1 advised that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD continues to reside on Lake Concordia, Ferriday, Louisiana.

B. Employment

NO T-1 advised the same date that HEAD is presently employed by the Hughes and New Oil Company, Natchez, Mississippi.

This document contains neither recommendations our conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and to lorned to your agency; it and its contains are not to be distributed outside your agency.

C. Automobile Data

NO T-1 additionally advised on April 24, 1970, that HEAD operates a 1959 white Ford stationwagon, Louisiana license number unknown.

D. Position in Klan

None. Sources advise that HEAD is an inactive member of the SDG and the Minutemen and is involved at that time in the formation of a new klan type organization at Ferriday, Louisiana.

II. CONNECTION WITH KLAN OR HATE-TYPE GROUPS

NO T-1 advised April 23, 1968, that HEAD had indicated during April, 1968, that he desired to activate a klan type unit in the Ferriday-Vidalia, Louisiana, area to be ready in the event the Negroes revolt during the coming summer. HEAD was overheard to state that he was in possession of a carbine rifle and was ready for any kind of trouble.

NO T-2 advised on June 11, 1968, that HEAD and other members of the SDG met at HEAD's residence on June 2, 1968, and discussed the racial situation. It was mentioned that SDG members should shoot any Negroes who cause trouble at Natchez, Mississippi, outside the business district.

NO T-3 advised June 18, 1968, that members of the SDG met on June 16, 1968, at the residence of NORMAN HEAD. During this meeting HEAD was overheard to state that he had purchased eight pounds of gunpowder and another member had used it to begin to load .30 caliber carbine ammunition.

NO T-2 advised August 21, 1968, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, from Lake Concordia, has been inactive in the klan and the SDG, but has had some contact in the recent past with SDG members.

NO T-4 advised September 25, 1968, that he had no information indicating that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was active with any klan unit within the State of Mississippi.

NO T-2 advised October 15, 1968, that an SDG member was in possession of a Russian made "burp gun" which was espable of being fired as a full automatic weapon. Source stated that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD attempted to loosen the bolt on this weapon, but was unable to do so. Source also advised that around this same time HEAD was overheard to state that he desired to join the Minutemen organization.

NO T-2 advised December 11, 1968, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was overheard to state on November 28, 1968, that he had converted a carbine rifle for someone else in a manner that would make it fire full automatic. HEAD mentioned that he and another individual had broken into a car and stole a shotgun and some molds which were used to make rifle slugs.

NO T-3 advised January 30, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD is presently inactive in the klan and the SDG, but is presently a member of Minutemen Unit 1733 and intends to become active in that organization.

NO T-2 advised February 5, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was overheard to state on February 3, 1969, that he had joined the Minutemen organization and received his membership card and number within three weeks of that time. READ was also overheard to state that he was in possession of a kit which could be used to convert a carbine to a fully automatic weapon and that he was saving it to use on his own carbine.

NO T-3 advised June 4, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD on June 3, 1969, was in possession of a carbine which had a switch on the side indicating it could be operated as a full automatic weapon. This weapon did not have a normal rifle stock, but had a pistol grip and the overall length of the weapon appeared to be approximately 30 inches. HEAD referred to his weapon as an "alley sweeper."

NO T-3 advised June 30, 1969, that a meeting was scheduled at the residence of KENNETH NORMAN HEAD on July 28, 1969, by former klan leader at Vidalia, for the purpose of printing an anti-Negro - anti-Communist newspaper to arouse local residents against school integration. This meeting was subsequently called off.

NO T-2 advised August 19, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had been overheard to state that the Minutemen should remain in-active for a short period of time due to the arrest of their leader, ROBERT DE PUGH.

NO T-2 additionally advised August 19, 1969, that a meeting was held at Ferriday, Louisiana, on August 18, 1969, attended by members of the SDG and Minutemen, as well as a former klan official from this area. KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, a Minutemen member and SDG member, was identified as attending. The purpose of this meeting was to set up a new organization to be called the "Citizens for Constitutional Government," which would print a newspaper containing articles on communism and the like.

NO-157-3611

NO T-3 advised September 3, 1969, that SDC members held a meeting on August 30, 1969, during which KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was heard to comment that he was in possession of a new fully automatic weapon. During the meeting, HEAD also mentioned that four years previous he and another individual had burglarized an oil field supply place and obtained dynamite, dynamite caps and primer cord. HEAD stated that these explosives were turned over to a leader of the SDG who reportedly took them to Mississippi to hide.

NO T-2 advised September 3, 1969, that an SDG member was overheard to state that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was in possession of a Thompson .45 caliber sub-machine gun which had been purchased with a missing part, but HEAD had fixed it and only needed a clip in order to operate the weapon.

NO T-3 advised August 26, 1969, that he overheard KENNETH NORMAN HEAD state that he and another SDG member and his son-in-law burned down a train depot at Roxie or Meadville, Mississippi, date not mentioned. Source further stated that the Ferriday-Natchez Unit of the Minutemen was inactive at that time.

NO T-2 advised October 8, 1969, that he overheard a conversation on October 8, 1969, between KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and another SDG member, during which HEAD commented he had six boxes of .38 caliber ammunition and had also obtained a quantity of carbine ammunition, some 30-06 tracer ammunition and some explosive putty.

NO T-2 advised October 22, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was attempting to have an explosive container built. apparently for the purpose of storing explosives somewhere in Louisiana.

NO T-3 advised October 29, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD appeared concerned over the fact that there had been no meetings or activity by Unit 1733 of the Minutemen. Source stated that HEAD had not yet constructed an explosive storage container.

NO T-5 advised July 17, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, 502 Locust Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, telephone number 336-4970, reportedly submitted an application for membership in the Minutemen, exact date unknown. Source stated that HEAD indicated his age as 30 and his birthplace as Natchez, Mississippi. Indicated that his occupation was a construction millwright and He stated that his occupation was a construction millwright and that his skills and hobbies were old cars, guns, fishing and hunting. He stated he had completed the 12th grade in school hunting. He had two 1959 Ford stationwagons. Under the heading

"Organizations," HEAD advised he was a member of Local Union 1994 and was an ex-klansman. He indicated he had previously served in the U. S. Marine Corps and had attained the rank of corporal.

NO T-2 advised November 12, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and another SDG member meton November 12, 1969, and HEAD advised he had located a large supply of explosives which could be stolen easily. HEAD described these explosives as plastic putty, primer cord and dynamite caps. HEAD did not indicate exactly where these explosives were located, but inferred they were somewhere near Natchez, Mississippi, and that he intended to steal them when he had located a proper storage space.

NO T-2 advised November 19, 1969, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was heard to comment on November 16, 1968, that he planned to make some explosives utilizing 50 pounds of sodium nitrate (a fertilizer) and two gallons of diesel fuel which would be ignited by a regular dynamite blasting cap.

On December 9, 1969, source stated that HEAD had tested the above-described mixture on December 7, 1969, but it would not explode.

NO T-3 advised December 16, 1969, that as of December 11, 1969, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had not stolen the explosives he had described on November 9, 1969, but still intends to do so.

NO T-2 advised January 12, 1970, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and another SDG member were observed in a conversation with a third individual on that date and this third individual was in possession of two hand grenades. This individual indicated he had a supply of grenades for sale and HEAD indicated contact would be made with an SDG leader concerning money to buy some of these grenades.

NO T-2 advised January 19, 1970, that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and another SDG member were observed to bury a metal container on a ridge near the levee at Ferriday, Louisiana. Inside this container was a box of approximately 500 feet of black colored primer cord. They then buried another container about 30 feet away which contained a large quantity of dynamite sticks and explosive devices. Source stated that an SDG leader at Ferriday had suggested that these boxes be buried so it would be ready when HEAD and others steal additional explosives in the future. This SDG leader commented that although the persons involved in this operation were members of the Minutemen, it was to be considered an SDG operation.

On March 28, 1970, Louisiana State Police Trooper First Class JOHN E. BLUNSCHI, III, Louisiana State Police (LSP), Ferriday, Louisiana, advised he had arrested three individuals, including KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, for littering, speeding, reckless driving and attempting to outrun a pursuing police vehicle. The above arrest took place when he observed these individuals in an automobile throwing pamphlets in a residential section of Ferriday, Louisiana. A search of the vehicle indicated numerous pamphlets signed "Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Second Battalion, First Division, North Louisiana," which claimed the Federal Government was taking over the local school system and was being run by communists. Several firearms were located in the vehicle, including a Universal .30 caliber carbine, Serial Number 127045, which was believed to belong to KENNETH NORMAN READ. This particular firearm is a carbine, cut down to about a nine inch barrel, mounted on a special pistol grip and containing a banana clip, holding 22 rounds of ammunition.

Trooper BLUNSCHI stated that the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Unit (ATTU) at Monroe, Louisiana, had been notified concerning firearms obtained and that all three men were released on bond to appear in city court at Ferriday, Louisiana, on March 30, 1970.

It was subsequently determined that these men appeared in city court at Ferriday where HEAD had only been charged with littering. He was fined \$25.00.

Trooper BLUNSCHI, at the time of the arrest of the above individuals, stated he would test the carbine to determine if it was capable of full automatic operation. It was subsequently determined that this weapon was only capable of semiautomatic operation.

NO T-1 advised April 24, 1970, that in view of the death of the Minutemen squad leader, Unit 1733 of the Minutemen appears completely inactive and there is no plan to reorganize the unit at this time. According to source, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD of Ferriday, Louisiana, is still considered a member of Minutemen Unit 1733.

Source also advised that the SDG was completely inactive at that time.

NO T-4 advised April 20, 1970, that a group of individuals met at Vidalia, Louisiana, on April 11, 1970, and again on April 18, 1970, for the purpose of forming a new and again on April 18, 1970, for the purpose of forming a new klan unit and to consider whether they desired to become a part

of a national klan organization. KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was recognized as being in attendance at the April 18, 1970, meeting and indicated that he had six men who wanted to join the organization.

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NO T-4 advised April 29, 1970, that an additional meeting of this group was held near Vidalia, Louisiana, on April 28, 1970, for the purpose of organizing this new klan unit at Vidalia. KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was observed to be present at this meeting.

NO T-4 advised on May 8, 1970, that another meeting of this group was held on the levee in Concordia Parish on that date concerning organization of this new unit and again KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was observed in attendance.

MINUTEMEN

The Minutemen, whose headquarters are in Norborne, Missouri, was organized in June, 1960, by ROBERT BOLLVAR DE PUGH, who has been publicly identified as the National Coordinator of the organization since its inception. On September 8, 1969, he announced the appointment of his 23-year-old son, RALPH C. DE PUGH, to serve in this position while he completes a one year sentence in the U. S. Penitentiary for violation of the Federal Firearms Act.

Past statements by ROBERT DE PUGH and literature distributed by the organization indicate the purpose of the Minutemen to be the resistance to and exposure of, the spread of Communist influence within the United States; for the formation of a guerrilla or underground organization to combat the troops of any foreign powers which might eventually occupy this country; and resist passage of laws which would regulate private ownership of firearms.

A source, who in July, 1969, had access to some Minutemen records, estimated that approximately 2500 individuals have, in the past, expressed an interest in the Minutemen and have been considered as members by DE PUGH; however, source believes there are probably no more than 300 actual active members of the organization. A second source in October, 1969, advised that the Minutemen tend to grossly exaggerate the number of their members. The source estimated the actual membership to be no more than possibly 350 members.

In April, 1966, DE PUGH, in his book Blueprint For Victory, wrote the Minutemen organization was then dividing into two bodies; the Minutemen and the Patriotic Party. One group, the Minutemen, would be the resistance movement and the other, the Patriotic Party, whose proper function would be to serve as the political arm of a complete patriotic resistance movement.

Members of the Minutemen organization, including ROBERT DE PUGH and his chief assistant, WALTER P. PEYSON, have been arrested in the past on charges of violations of the Federal Firearms Act, Bank Robbery-Conspiracy, Illegal Possession of Firearms and Conspiracy to Commit Arson. They have also engaged in maneuvers utilizing guerrilla tactics, wherein machine gues, mortars, grenades and other firearms were employed.

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APPENDIX

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP

A source on April 4, 1967, and a second source on May 3, 1967, characterized the Silver Dollar Group as a hard-core action group made up of present and former members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM); the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA); and Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi and Louisiana.

On August 15, 1967, a third source advised that the Silver Dollar Group was formed approximately in May or June, 1964. The secret group within the Klan was formed to further Klan activities involving the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and maintaining total segregation. Klansmen were dissetisfied with the inactivity in their respective Klan groups. The members of the new secret action unit had to be trusted Klansmen and had to youch for each other.

A fourth source advised on May 26, 1969, that there is no formal organization in the Silver Dollar Group, but membership is obtained by invitation only, and upon receipt of a silver dollar from the group organizer. Raleigh Jackson Glover, membership is acquired. There have been no formal meetings or group sponsored activity by the Silver Dollar Group during the past year; however, those holding silver dollars still claim membership in the organization.

Subject is employed by the Dallas - Bass Company, Natchez, Mississippi.

Subject was seen on January 22, 1968, with a 1963 white Chevy II with Mississippi registration.

It should be noted the subject is also a mechanic and regularly buys and sells old-model vehicles.

D. POSITION IN THE KLAN

Subject is an active member of the Silver Dollar Group (SDG)

II. CONNECTION WITH KLAN AND OTHER HATE-TYPE ORGANIZATIONS

NO T-1 advised on May 30, 1967, NORMAN HEAD was recently observed at a meeting of the Vidalia, Louisiana, Unit of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) and was then acting as a guard.

NO T-2 advised on June 7, 1967, NORMAN HEAD had been converting M-1 carbines to fully automatic weapons and these rifles were then sold to Klansmen by RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

NO T-3 advised on June 27, 1967, NORMAN HEAD had converted a M-1 carbine to a fully automatic rifle and had sold it to another Klansman.

NO T-1 advised on June 20, 1967, KENNETH NORMAN HEAD has stated he had been victimized by R. J. GLOVER because GLOVER had told him the weapons he converted would remain in the hands of Klansmen and R. J. GLOVER had been reported to have sold them to anyone for a profit.

HEAD stated he wanted to see how things came out before any action was taken against GLOVER by other Klansmen.

NO T-1 advised on July 18, 1967, R. J. GLOVER had told KENNETH HEAD his arrest for the theft of farm equipment had been a "frame job" by the FBI.

NO T-1 advised on August 17, 1967, NORMAN HEAD had been asked to accompany several Klansmen to go to Winnsboro, Louisiana, to talk to MURRAY MARTIN, the state Klan leader, about reorganizing the Vidalia, Ferriday and Clayton units of the Klan.

NO T-1 advised on August 1, 1967, KENNETH HEAD had stated he was still planning to be closely associated with R. J. GLOVER as he thought GLOVER had reformed and would stop stealing.

NO T-4 advised on August 10, 1967, KENNETH HEAD had once remarked, while intoxicated, he, R. J. GLOVER and another SDG member by the name of PALMER THOMAS "BUCK" HORTON had killed a Negro man who had insulted a crippled waitress at the Shamrock Motel in Vidalia, Louisiana.

NO T-4 advised on September 12, 1967, NORMAN HEAD was one of the people who had burned REEF FREEMAN's night club. HEAD is supposed to have driven the car which carried all the Klansmen on that particular day. NO 157-3611 KGO:pd

NO T-1 advised on September 19, 1967, KENNETH HEAD spoke of a planned meeting at his house on September 24, 1967. Former Klan members would also be invited and they would discuss why the FBI has been questioning so many people in the area.

NO T-3 advised on September 26, 1967, some SDG members met at the residence of NORMAN HEAD on Lake Concordia, Louisiana, on September 24, 1967. One of the purposes of this meeting was to show the FBI they could still operate even "with the pressure on them."

NO T-2 advised on November 1, 1967, some of the SDG members met on October 29, 1967. NORMAN HEAD stated he had either 5,000 or 10,000 empty hulls and these should be reloaded in the future and the ammunition stored for future use.

NO T-4 advised on November 7, 1967, NORMAN HEAD had stated when the "Feds" became interested in carbines, he had pawned his at Honest John's Pawn Shop in Natchez, Mississippi, but had not yet gotten it back.

NO T-5 advised on November 10, 1967, NORMAN HEAD had been complaining the FBI had been constantly coming to see him and were accusing him of being the automatic weapons expert in Louisiana. HEAD stated the "Feds" had accused him of murder, arson and manufacturing automatic weapons, to which HEAD replied to the effect he was a patroit of his country.

NO T-5 advised on November 15, 1967, some of the SDG members had some target practice at the residence of JAMES LEE SCARBOROUGH. KENNETH HEAD fired a .22 Remington rifle and a German-made P-38 pistol.

NO T-2 advised on December 7, 1967, he had heard KENNETH HEAD had spent the past several weeks in St. Louis, Missouri, on a business trip for his employer.

NO T-1 advised on December 27, 1967, R. J. GLOVER told KENNETH HEAD he, GLOVER, did not want any SDG meetings and was going to try to support a group called the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APRW).

NO T-4 advised on January 16, 1968, HEAD had complained the FBI had been questioning him and knew all about the deal to convert the carbines to automatic rifles. HEAD also said BUD SPINKS, Chief of Police, Vidalia, Louisiana, was talking to the FBI and could not be trusted. HEAD stated he would be working near the Venice, Louisiana, area for about a month.

NO T-4 advised on February 19, 1968, NORMAN HEAD had expressed an interest in a new unit of the OKKKK or the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA), which JAMES SCARBOROUGH wanted to start. HEAD said he still has empty carbine hulls which can be used.

NO T-6 advised on March 28, 1968, NORMAN HEAD was still believed to be a member of the SDG but had not been known to be presently active on any special Klan project.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was contacted at his residence on the waterfront at Lake Concordia, Ferriday. He was apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact. At the outset an attempt was made to advise him of his constitutional rights by exhibiting a form setting forth these rights. He declined to read the form, stating that he had been contacted numerous times by Special Agents of the FBI and he knew what his rights were and he had told the Agents all he knew about everything.

Nevertheless, he did furnish the following information:

The name JOSEPH EDWARDS is unknown to him. He does not know anything about a missing Negro Shamrock Motel porter and he was not involved in any such incident. He stated that should the FBI have any information indicating his involvement in any violence or violation of Federal law, they should take him to court. He stated that he would not hesitate to go to court, as he had done nothing wrong.

HEAD stated that he is no longer working for a subsidiary company of the International Paper Company at Natchez. He is working as a mechanic on industrial engines for the Dallas-Bass Incorporated, Highway 61 North, Natchez. In his new job he will travel extensively with no definite schedule. His wife, BEVERLY HEAD, will continue to work as a sales clerk at Lane's Drug Store, 506 Carter Street, Vidalia.

HEAD advised that they will continue to reside at Lake Concordia. They are purchasing the house.

HEAD stated that "Buck" HORTON is a close friend and they used to ride to work together. HEAD stated that he does not know HORTON to be a member of any Klan-type organization nor involved in violence.

During an attempt to contact the subject for reinterview at his residence, near the levee at Lake Concordia, Ferriday, Louisiana, on 1/26/68 SAS WAYNE A. MILLWARD and MERRIMAN D. DIVEN observed Deputy Sheriff FRANK DELAUGHTER and Deputy Sheriff BILL OGDEN talking to two men near the entrance to the subject's residence. The deputies advised that they were giving all residents in that area final notice of eviction in that the houses were built on property to which the residents did not have clear title. The deputies denied knowing the subject, but a moment later indicated that he was the only resident in the area that had good title.

One of the two men to whom the deputies were speaking was HEAD's next door neighbor. This man stated that the Federal Government bought all that property a number of years ago in order to build the levee. He purchased his house and land for \$1,200 from an individual and he could not see why HEAD's title would be good and his own title defective. He added that this eviction has been in progress for the past 16 years.

The other person present identified himself as RUSSELL WESTBERRY. He was driving a blue Oldsmobile sedan bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 56F244. WESTBERRY advised that he was a former co-worker of HEAD as a construction employee at the International Paper Company, Natchez. He advised that he had stopped by to visit HEAD, but found that HEAD had already departed from his residence that day.

The above information is being furnished for the information of the Jackson Office in view of their insumost in the subject as a Silver Dollar Group mensage and high current employment by Dallas-Bass, Inc., Highway el, Nergh Natchez.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was contacted at his residence. He was reminded of the identities of the Special Agents and his rights as stated on a form entitled "Interrogation; Advice of Rights."

HEAD advised he was aware of his rights but declined to sign a waiver of his rights. He volunteered the following information in response to questions.

He is still a member of the Concordia Rifle and Pistol Club, but only attended one meeting many months ago. He stated the organization is affiliated with the National Rifle Association and is still organized although they have not held any meetings recently. He explained that during hunting season you can not get the members together for a meeting in that any spare time they have would be spent in hunting. HEAD advised that JAMES SCAROBOROUGH is still one of the leaders of the rifle club. He last saw SCAROBOROUGH before the past Christmas.

HEAD advised that he last saw "RED" GLOVER about a week ago. HEAD advised that GLOVER has given him some information and help in his attempt to obtain employment at the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, Natchez, Mississippi. HEAD advised that he has been to the employment office several times, but he has not received any indication that he will be hired at the present time or the near future. HEAD said that if he obtains a job he will make less money than he currently receives at Dallas-Bass, Inc., but at least he would not have to leave home and travel to other states to rebuild industrial engines.

HEAD stated that his wife is not currently working at Lane's Pharmacy in Vidalia, Louisiana, in that she has the "flu." His daughter is also sick at the present time.

HEAD stated that he has never been sworn out of his

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klan organization, which he declined to identify. He stated that he still advocates the principles of the organization and would not divulge the identities of his fellow members. He claimed that they are anti-communist and would be the first to rally to protect this country, but they are continually investigated by the FBI. He claimed that he is opposed to violence. He stated that the persons who bombed WHARLEST JACKSON in Natchez did not help the cause of the white people, but actually benefited the civil rights organization by hundreds of thousands of dollars.

HEAD claimed that the knew nothing of the disappearance of JOSEPH EDWARDS a Negro porter at the Shamrock Motel until he was questioned about it by Special Agents of the FBI. Thereafter, he made inquiry about the incident and Patrolman JOHN HENRY of the Vidalia Police Department told him that the Negro was one who had been a porter of the Shamrock Motel. HENRY said nothing else about the incident.

HEAD stated that he would be glad when these cases go to trial so that he can clear up any doubt about his innocence.

On Sunday, December 3, 1967, JAMES HORACE "SONNY" TAYLOR, visited the Klan hunting lodge which is located near the Mississippi River levee between Ferriday and Vidalia, La., and found that the gate was locked. TAYLOR also visited the Cornett Cafe in Ferriday, La., and learned that no Silver Dollar Groupmeeting was to be held that day.

JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR has made numerous attempts to contact Silver Dollar Group member and well known Klan leader, from Ferriday, La., JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, without success. TAYLOR has heard that SCAROBOROUGH is staying away from R. J. GLOVER and E. D. MORACE as he is afraid that these two men might get him into serious trouble.

Silver Dollar Group member BLUE HOLLOWAY told JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR, that he had been staying home minding his own business. HOLLOWAY indicated to TAYLOR that he had not been invited to attend any recent Silver Dollar Group meetings.

JAMES "BILL" BLANEY visited JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR on Dec. 7, 1967, and told TAYLOR that he had been in St. Louis, Mo., during the past several weeks with Silver Dollar Group member KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, working for the Dallas-Bass Engine Company of Natchez, Miss. BLANEY is completely inactive and TAYLOR has previously been told by E. D. MORACE not to invite BLANEY to any Silver Dollar Group functions.

R. J. GLOVER has not been in contact with JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR during the past several weeks nor has TAYLOR heard of his presence in the Vidalia-Ferriday, La., area.

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THE REPORT OF CALL AND THE OWNER

No effort was made to steal anything from this location at this time and it is unknown whether GLOVER ever actually stole anything from this place.

On June 2, 5 and 7, 1967, BILLY BLANEY stated that he and BLUE HOLLOWAY had discussed at length the fact that R. J. GLOVER had been selling Klansmen automatic rifles and making a big profit on them. He stated that they knew that GLOVER was obtaining these rifles from Officer JOHN HENRY in Vidalia, Louisiana, that NORMAN HEAD was converting these weapons to fully automatic, and GLOVER was then selling them to Klansmen for \$96.00 each. BLUE HOLLOWAY had stressed that these were cheap surplus carbines and from the way HOLLOWAY talked, he obviously had purchased one of these fully automatic rifles from GLOVER.

In the fall of 1966, GLOVER brought the fully automatic carbine in his possession to the home of SONNY TAYLOR in Harrisonburg, Louisiana, and GLOVER and TAYLOR subsequently

(OKA) are contained in the appendix section of this report.

On April 4, 1967, JN T-8 and on May 3, 1967, JN T-6 described the "Silver Dollar Group" as a hard-core action group made up of present and former members of the WKKKKKOM, UKA, and the OKKKK from Louisiana and Mississippi. No formal organization format has been adopted by the group.

Membership is attained by invitation and upon receipt of a silver one dollar coin from the group organizer, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

On March 1, 1967, SA's JOHN A. PFEIFER and JOHN D. BRADY determined that the subject presently resides at 502 Locust Street, Vidalia, Louisiana.

B. Employment

On April 11, 1967, Mr. JOHN WILSON, Assistant Personnel Manager, International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, advised that subject is presently employed as a millwright on construction work by Papco, Inc., a subsidiary of the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, and has been employed in this capacity since August 30, 1966.

C. Current Position in Silver Dollar Group

On March 3, 1967, JN T-3 advised that the subject is a member of the Silver Dollar Group, a renegade Klan-type group in the Natchez, Mississippi - Vidalia, Louisiana, area which is prone to violence. Additional information concerning this affiliation and the subject's membership in other Klan-type organizations is set out hereafter in another section of this report.

D. Automobiles

A 1956 Buick Special, two door, orange over white, bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 41X-785, which vehicle he contemplates purchasing.

A 1927 Ford Model T Roadster, no license plates, cab area painted green, vehicle in excellent running condition.

A 1959 light blue and white Ford Country Sedan Station Wagon, bearing 1964-65 Louisiana license 36X-056.

A 1959 light blue Ford sedan, bearing 1965 Louisiana license 791802, owned by Centreville Motor Company, Centreville, Mississippi.

On May 17, 1967, the subject was observed by SA's THOMAS W. KELTY and CHARLES W. CHURCH to be driving a 1959 white Ford Country Sedan Station Wagon, bearing 1967 Louisiana license 46E618.

It is to be noted that the subject is also a mechanic and regularly buys, trades and sells old model vehicles.

II. AFFILIATION AND ACTIVITIES WITH KLAN OR HATE-TYPE ORGANIZATIONS

On March 3, 1967, JN T-3 advised that the Silver Dollar Group, which is a renegade Klan group in the Natchez, Mississippi - Vidalia, Louisiana, area, was formed in the latter part of 1965 by KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and other Klansmen. JN T-3 stated that individuals picked as members of this group were supposed to be "action men." JN T-3 stated in his opinion HEAD should be considered a prime suspect in the murder of WHARLEST JACKSON, as he is a type of individual capable of committing such a crime.

On March 2, 1967, JN T-8 advised that on February 20, 1967, HEAD was at the Chef Truck Stop Cafe X in Vidalia, Louisiana, together with another Silver Dollar Group member from Vidalia, Louisiana, and others.

On March 14, 1967, JN T-8 advised that HEAD had a silver dollar; however, the markings on this silver dollar were not known.

JN T-8 advised that the subject also attended a fishfry at the home of another Klansman, together with & other Klansman.

On March 7, 1967, JN T-2 advised that the Silver Dollar Group was composed of 15 members and that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was a member of this group in Louisiana and that members of the Silver Dollar Group must have proven themselves prior to being accepted as a member.

On March 14, 1967, JN T-9 advised that HEAD and another Klansman indicated that there are two parts of the socalled Silver Dollar Group, part of it consisting of individuals from both the Vidalia, Louisiana, and Natchez, Mississippi, area who do not participate in any acts of violence and who gather at various restaurants in the Vidalia-Ferriday, Louisiana, area. On March 17, 1967, JN T-9 advised that the subject is from Ferriday or Clayton, Louisiana, and was in the Old Originals and the Silver Dollar Group.

JN T-3 on March 28, 1967, advised that HEAD is close to RED GLOVER, a real radical toward Negroes, and that the sight of a Negro infuriates GLOVER to no end.

On March 17, 1967, JN T-4 advised that he was acquainted with HEAD and felt reasonably certain that HEAD was a member of the Klan in the Natchez, Mississippi Vidalia, Louisiana, area.

On March 29, 1967, JN T-2

On March 28, 1967, JN T-8 advised that RED V GLOVER suspected that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD is the informant in the Silver Dollar Group.

On April 11, 1967, JN T-8 advised that the subject is a member of the Silver Dollar Group but no longer attends meetings.

On June 2, 1966, JN T-1

advised that HEAD lives for nothing but the Klan, works at Gibson's Department Store in Natchez, Mississippi, lives in Natchez, but is from the Vidalia area, and still goes to Klan meetings in the Vidalia, Louisiana, area.

On March 3, 1967, JN T-1 advised that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD is a member of the Original Knights in Vidalia, Louisiana, is constantly seeking an office within the Vidalia Unit, and is striving for recognition as a leader by the members of the unit. JN T-1 advised that HEAD

could be led into any act of violence by anyone and would participate alone when he felt the violence was justified.

JN T-1 stated that for several months during 1963 and 1964 HEAD watched the residence of a Negro in Vidalia, Louisiana, and the residence of a white woman with whom the Negro was reportedly having an affair, with the intention of beating one or both of them if he could catch them alone and unobserved. JN T-1 advised that HEAD is constantly agitating for some action of some kind by members of the Vidalia Unit or someone else.

JN T-1 advised that through 1963 and 1964 members of the Vidalia Unit never called on members from another town or parish to do any jobs for them. JN T-1 stated that it was a hard rule in those days that no Klansman participate in any act of violence in his own immediate town. JN T-1 advised that because of this he could not justify the planned action of NORMAN HEAD as previously described.

On March 8, 1967, JN T-3 advised that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD is a member of the Silver Dollar Group and resides in the Vidalia-Ferriday, Louisiana, area.

On February 28, 1967, JN T-3 advised that HEAD /O should be a prime suspect in the murder of WHARLEST JACKSON in Natchez, Mississippi.

On March 9, 1967, JN T-5 advised that HEAD was /3 a member of the WKKKKOM in Adams County, Mississippi.

On March 29, 1967, JN T-2 advised that the subject is a member of the Silver Dollar Group in the / Natchez, Mississippi - Vidalia, Louisiana, area.

On March 31, 1967, JN T-7 advised that the 19 subject is unknown to him but that he had heard the subject's name.

On April 11, 1967, JN T-8 advised that HEAD is definitely a member of the Silver Dollar Group but no longer is attending Klan meetings.

On April 22, 1967, JN T-6

JN T-6 stated that GLOVER advised this Klansman that the informant was HEAD.

JN T-8 on April 18, 1967, advised that on November 1, 1965, at a meeting of the Clayton Unit of the OKKKK, charges were brought against a Klansman for divulging Klan secrets and this Klansman was brought to trial. The trial, according to JN T-8, was held on November 2, 1965, at the place where the Clayton, Louisiana, Unit meets. JN T-8 advised that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD and other Klansmen, all of whom wore white robes with white hoods, were requested to attend this trial so that they could carry out the sentence imposed against this Klansman should he be found guilty. JN T-8 advised, however, that the trial was postponed for three days to give this Klansman time to prepare his defense. JN T-8 stated that this trial was never held after it was agreed, following the request of other Klan members, to demote this Klansman from his Exalted Cyclops position and gradually ease him out of the Klan.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was interviewed at his home, 502 Locust, Vidalia, Louisiana. At the outset SA JOHN A. PFEIFER advised HEAD that he was being questioned concerning his possible involvement in a Federal criminal violation and read to him a written statement of his rights. HEAD read this same written statement of his rights, waiver of his rights, and signed the waiver of his rights.

He advised that he has been employed by the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, for the past six months doing construction work there. On Monday, February 27, 1967, he had left his house at approximately 6:30 a.m., alone, and driven directly to the plant, arriving there in approximately 20 minutes. Since that time, however, it has been his habit to leave at approximately the same time but to go in the company of a friend named W. G. WILSON, who presently lives in the Vidalia Trailer Park, Vidalia, Louisiana.

He always drives a 1956 Buick Special, two door, orange over white, bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 41X785 which he is in the process of obtaining from a man named DON ELLIS who lives in Vidalia, Louisiana, and who works for L. J. Denny Construction Company, Ferriday, Louisiana, as an independent truck driver. This was the vehicle he was using on February 27, 1967, and the vehicle and the plates are still registered in the name of DON ELLIS because the deal on the automobile has not been finalized.

He advised he remained at work until approximately 3:30 p.m., on February 27, 1967, at which time he drove, alone, directly home, arriving just before 4:00 p.m. He recalled it was raining heavily that day and when he arrived home he met his daughter there, whose name is MARGARET. He had previously agreed to help MARGARET prepare a display

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for school which consisted of a simulated electric motor. Since no real work had been done on this project by him up until this time and since the project had to be turned in at school by his daughter the next day, he almost immediately left home again with MARGARET and drove her to the Western Auto Store in Vidalia, Louisiana, where he inquired of Mr. SLEDGE about obtaining two necessary parts that he did not have at that time. These parts were a throw-switch and a small wire commonly used for making doorbell connections and which he described as a doorbell wire.

Mr. SLEDGE sold him the switch but advised he had none of that type of wire available and recommended that he contact Mis-Lou Electrical Company in Vidalia, Louisiana, to purchase it.

Since some batteries were also required for the project, he left MARGARET at Lane's Drugstore in Vidalia, Louisiana, which is also the place where his wife is employed, to purchase these batteries. He and his daughter had made various tests prior to that time and determined that the most effective type of batteries were the small, nine volt transistor radio batteries and these were the type she was to buy at Lane's Drugstore.

He then drove directly to Mis-Lou Electric Company where he contacted one of the workmen, whose name he does not not recall, who worked in the back of the shop, and asked him for some doorbell wire. This man gave him a small coil of wire believed to be approximately 40 or 50 feet in length and told him there would be no charge for the wire. Mrs. DUNCAN, wife of the owner of the business, was present during at least part of his conversation with the shop man.

He then drove back to Lane's Drugstore, picked up MARGARET and drove her home.

Earlier that morning when his wife had gone to work in a 1956 Buick similar to his, she had apparently stalled the automobile about one block from their home and after getting MARGARET home he went to the automobile and

attempted to determine why the automobile had stalled. When his wife had left the automobile she had apparently removed the keys from the ignition but left the ignition in the "on" position and he first thought that the battery had run down. However, he also noticed that the battery cable might be loose and thinking he might need some help in working on the automobile returned home and telephoned WILSON, who drove to his home in a few minutes and went with him back to the automobile where they were able to jump the batteries and start the automobile. At that time he drove the automobile back to his home and WILSON left in a few minutes after that time.

He then spent about 15 to 20 minutes securely bolting down the loose battery cable and determined that was the real reason the automobile had stalled. He finished this work by approximately 6:00 p.m. or shortly before that time and either at that time or just before then his wife had returned home from work.

At approximately 6:00 p.m., he started to work on MARGARET's project, ate supper and after supper continued to work on the project until approximately 9:00 p.m. when he prepared to get ready to retire for the night. He made no trips outside of his home on that day that are not described above. He had no visitors to his home that day except for WILSON and had no visits to anyone else's home or any meetings with anyone that day.

He was advised by SA PFEIFER that he did not have to furnish a sample of the doorbell wire that he had been given at Mis-Lou Electric Company but he advised that he had nothing to hide and voluntarily furnished a piece of this wire that he cut from the original roll using a wire cutter on a large pair of pliers taken from his personal tool chest.

This interview was conducted outside his home and he advised that WILSON was visiting inside his home at that time. Parked in the driveway of his home was an old model brown Chrysler sedan bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 43E233 which he identified as being WILSON's automobile.

Also parked in his driveway was a 1956 Buick bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 41X785 which he advised was the automobile he was negotiating with DON ELLIS to obtain.

A 1927 Ford Model T Roadster, which he advised was in excellent running condition and which was observed to be unpainted except for the cab area which was painted green and which bore no license plates, was also parked in his driveway and he advised this automobile was owned by him and registered in his name.

Parked at the curb in front of his home was a 1959 light blue and white Ford Country Sedan stationwagon with 1964-65 Louisiana license 36X056. He identified this as an automobile that his other daughter, ALYCE ANN, had purchased as junk from Commercial Credit Company in Natchez, Mississippi.

Also parked at the curb in front of the house was a 1959 light blue Ford sedan bearing 1965 Mississippi license, Wilkinson County, 791802. He advised this automobile was owned by Centerville Motor Company, Centerville, Mississippi, and that he had been approached by ALTON HALL of that company in an effort to sell the automobile to him.

He advised these automobiles and the 1956 Buick that his wife operated were the only ones that were used by him or any other members of his family.

Mrs. BEVERLY HEAD, nee WOOD, was interviewed at her rasidence, 502 Locust Street, Vidalia, Louisiana. She was apprised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and thereafter furnished the following information:

She has been married to NORMAN HEAD for the past 17 years and she knows him very well, further stating that "if he kills a nigger it'll be with his fists and because of something done to his wife or children." She hoped that the Agents would put this in their report.

She is employed at Lans's Pharmacy in Vidalia, Louisiana, and having previously been employed by Sears, Rombuck and Company. She quit her job at Sears around December 12, 1966, due to the fact that she did not like waiting on "niggers," especially having to try on clothes on "filthy niggers."

On February 27, 1987, she arrived for work at the pharmacy at about 8:35 a.m. baving driven to work in her vehicle, a white over yellow Buick. She drove to work alone as her husbandhad Laft for his work at about 5:30 a.m., on the same day. She could not recall whether NORMAN drove alone to work in his white over orange Suick or whether "BUTTERALL" (w. G. WILSON) had picked him up on that day.

She returned home from the pharmacy at about 11:00 a.m., for her lunch period. Her husband was not home for lunch as he always takes his lunch to work. She was not exactly sure, but believes that she returned to work on Henday; February 27, 1987; at about 12:05 pum.

After completing the remainder of her work day at the pharmacy, she returned to her home about 5:30 p.m. She may have stopped at the shop N' Save for some milk on her way home and if so, she would have arrived at her house proved 5:35 to 5:40 p.m. She returned from work alone in her buick and drove it directly to her house.

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The recall that about 4:30 p.m. while she was at work she called her husband at home and discussed the science project of her daughter. She and her husband wore well source for sometime that the project was due at the school on February 28, 1967.

Later, NORMAN and her daughter, MARGARET, came to the store in order to get some batteries for the science project. MARGAPET picked out two batteries, which she herself placed on their charge at the pharmacy. As far as she can recall, hur husband had also purchased at that time a double switch at the Mestern Auto Store and a spool of copper wire from the electrical company on the Vidalia Highway. NORMENted last PARGARET at the pharmacy for about 15 minutes while he want to get the wire and switch.

From 5:40 p.m. on she had dinner with her family and after dinner NORMAN and MREARET worked on the science project. For husband worked on the project until about 10:00 p.m.

She does not know GERALD FORD of Sicily Island, Louisians. END GLOWER is a friend of her husband, however, she cannot recall GLOWER being at the house in the past few months. KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, 502 Locust Street, Vidalia, was contacted at his residence and was advised of the identity of SA WILLIAM E. DENT, JR., as HEAD was previously advised of the identity of SA BRADY. Thereafter, HEAD furnished the following information:

On February 27, 1967, he now recalls, that RED GLOVER stopped by his house at about 7:00 p.m. He failed to mention this before, but it had completely slipped his mind. As he recalls RED was there for a very short period of time. GLOVER came to the house to advise him that GLOVER's brotherin-law was unable to determine if some tin and lumber were available from a house being torn down on the Government Fleet Road in Natchez, Mississippi. At the time GLOVER stopped by the house, his family had completed supper and he and his daugher were working on the science project. After staying a short period of time GLOVER jeft and as he can now best recall GLOVER also returned to see him on the following Sunday night.

On this Sunday night GLOVER had stopped by his house to talk to him about repairing a couple of holes in the front fenders of his old GMC pickup truck. He also believes that GLOVER had mentioned something about the gas can and a hand power saw that he had loaned to GLOVER. As he recalls, GLOVER stated he had possibly lost the gas can and saw; however, he is now of the opinion that RED GLOVER has the can and the saw is definitely missing.

HEAD further stated that last night he and RED GLOVER took an old GMC pickup truck to Natchez, Mississippi, and it was his understanding that a young white boy at the Texaco Service Station across from the Jefferson Davis Memorial Hospital purchased this vehicle. He stated the truck was left with this boy and he does not know the identity of this young man.

When questioned concerning the Silver Dollar Group of the Ku Klux Klan, he stated he knew nothing about such a group; however, he formerly had a silver dollar. About two

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years ago he got a silver dollar while he was running the service station at Vidalia, Louisiana. He cannot recall how he came by this silver dollar and he was sure no one had given him this dollar, but he does recall that the silver dollar was worth \$1.20 as it was rather old, bearing the date 1886.

HEAD was asked if he had attended a fish fry over a year ago at the home of JAMES LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana. HEAD said he could not recall attending such a fish fry and he did not recognize the name of JAMES LEE; however, he might recognize this person by sight as there were several people he knows by sight and not by name.

HEAD again was questioned concerning his klan affiliation and known association with klan members. He advised that as he had previously told FBI Agents, he has never been a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any other such klan-type organization and that the only organization of which he is a member is the Mathodist church of Vidalia, Louisiana.

At this point it was pointed out to HEAD that he is known to participate in klam activities and again HEAD stated he is not a member of the klam. When asked whether or when he got out of the klam, HEAD merely stated he did not want to say anything more about the matter.

He advised that he would tell the FBI if he heard of any information about an act of violence or about the bombing in Natchez. HEAD was told that it was felt by interviewing Agents that he would never furnish this information to the FBI and MIAD stated that he was sincere and he would if such a situation should arise.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD was interviewed at his home, 502 Locust, Vidalia, Louisiana. At the outset SA JOHN A. PFEIFER advised HEAD that he was being questioned concerning his possible involvement in a Federal criminal violation and read to him a written statement of his rights. HEAD read this same written statement of his rights, waiver of his rights, and signed the waiver of his rights.

He advised that he has been employed by the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi, for the past six months doing construction work there. On Monday, February 27, 1967, he had left his house at approximately 6:30 a.m., alone, and driven directly to the plant, arriving there in approximately 20 minutes. Since that time, however, it has been his habit to leave at approximately the same time but to go in the company of a friend named W. G. WILSON, who presently lives in the Vidalia Trailer Park, Vidalia, Louisiana.

He always drives a 1956 Bulck Special, two door, orange over white, bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 41X785 which he is in the process of obtaining from a man named DON ELLIS who lives in Vidalia, Louisiana, and who works for L. J. Denny Construction Company, Ferriday, Louisiana, as an independent truck driver. This was the vehicle he was using on February 27, 1967, and the vehicle and the plates are still registered in the name of DON ELLIS because the deal on the automobile has not been finalized.

He advised he remained at work until approximately 3:30 p.m., on February 27, 1967, at which time he drove, alone, directly home, arriving just before 4:00 p.m. He recalled it was raining heavily that day and when he arrived home he mat his daughter there, whose name is MARGARET. He had previously agreed to help MARGARET prepare a display

for school which consisted of a simulated electric motor. Since no real work had been done on this project by him up until this time and since the project had to be turned in at school by his daughter the next day, he almost immediately left home again with MARGARET and drove her to the Western Auto Store in Vidalia, Louisiana, where he inquired of Mr. SLEDGE about obtaining two necessary parts that he did not have at that time. These parts were a throw-switch and a small wire commonly used for making doorbell connections and which he described as a doorbell wire.

Mr. SLEDGE sold him the switch but advised he had none of that type of wire available and recommended that he contact Mis-Lou Electrical Company in Vidalia, Louisiana, to purchase it.

Since some batteries were also required for the project, he left MARGARET at Lane's Drugstore in Vidalia, Louisiana, which is also the place where his wife is employed, to purchase these batteries. He and his daughter had made various tests prior to that time and determined that the most effective type of batteries were the small, nine volt transistor radio batteries and these were the type she was to buy at Lane's Drugstore.

He then drove directly to Mis-Lou Electric Company where he contacted one of the workman, whose name he does not not recall, who worked in the back of the shop, and asked him for some doorbell wire. This man gave him a small coil of wire believed to be approximately 40 or 50 feet in length and told him there would be no charge for the wire. Mrs. DUNCAN, wife of the owner of the business, was present during at least part of his conversation with the shop man.

He then drove back to Lane's Drugstore, picked up MARGARET and drove her home.

Earlier that morning when his wife had gone to work in a 1956 Buick similar to his, she had apparently stalled the automobile about one block from their home and after getting MARGARET home he went to the automobile and
attempted to determine why the automobile had stalled. When his wife had left the automobile she had apparently removed the keys from the ignition but left the ignition in the "on" position and he first thought that the battery had run down. However, he also noticed that the battery cable might be loose and thinking he might need some help in working on the automobile returned home and telephoned WILSON, who drove to his home in a few minutes and went with him back to the automobile where they were able to jump the batteries and start the automobile. At that time he drove the automobile back to his home and WILSON left in a few minutes after that time.

He then spent about 15 to 20 minutes securaly bolting down the loose battery cable and determined that was the real reason the automobile had stalled. He finished this work by approximately 6:00 p.m. or shortly before that time and either at that time or just before then his wife had returned home from work.

At approximately 6:00 p.m., he started to work on MARGARET's project, ate supper and after supper continued to work on the project until approximately 9:00 p.m. when he prepared to get ready to retire for the night. He made no trips outside of his home on that day that are not described above. He had no visitors to his home that day except for WILSON and had no visits to anyone else's home or any meetings with anyone that day.

He was advised by SA PFEIFER that he did not have to furnish a sample of the doorbell wire that he had been given at Mis-Lou Electric Company but he advised that he had nothing to hide and voluntarily furnished a piece of this wire that he cut from the original roll using a wire cutter on a large pair of pliers taken from his personal tool chest.

This interview was conducted outside his home and he advised that WILSON was visiting inside his home at that time. Parked in the driveway of his home was an old model brown Chrysler sedan bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 43E233 which he identified as being WILSON's automobile.

Also parked in his driveway was a 1956 Buick bearing 1966-67 Louisiana license 41X785 which he advised was the automobile he was negotiating with DON ELLIS to obtain.

A 1927 Ford Model T Roadster, which he advised was in excellent running condition and which was observed to be unpainted except for the cab area which was painted green and which bore no license plates, was also parked in his driveway and he advised this automobile was owned by him and registered in his name.

Parked at the curb in front of his home was a 1959 light blue and white Ford Country Sedan stationwagon with 1964-65 Louisiana license 36X056. He identified this as an automobile that his other daughter, ALNCE ANN, had purchased as junk from Commercial Credit Company in Natchez, Mississippi.

Also parked at the curb in front of the house was a 1959 light blue Ford sedan bearing 1965 Mississippi license, Wilkinson County, 791802. He advised this automobile was owned by Centerville Motor Company, Centerville, Mississippi, and that he had been approached by ALTON HALL of that company in an effort to sell the automobile to him.

He advised these automobiles and the 1956 Buick that his wife operated were the only ones that were used by him or any other members of his family.

As HEAD handed the card to SA AEPS, a silver coin fell out of the wallet onto the ground. SA MC FALL reached to pick it up, but HEAD brushed aside his hand and said he would retrieve it himself. SA MC FALL noticed as HEAD picked up the coin that it was a silver dollar and that it hid some sort of mark impressed on the obverse side of the coin.

SA MC FALL asked HEAD 12 the coin was some sort of "lucky piece". HEAD replied that it was just an old silver dollar he carried in his wallet for a long time. HEAD said that he thought it might be of some value to a collector some day, but that he doubted it would be since the coin had been "disfigured".

HEAD voluntarily handed the silver dollar to SA MC FALL at this time. SA MC FALL inspected it and noted that the coin was an 1878 Liberty Head silver dollar. On the obverse side it was noted that a mark had been made on the coin, centered in the face of the head of Liberty. The mark was an "and" or "ampersand" sign approximately { inch in size. It appeared to have been made by a metal die punch, as the impression was very clear and distinct. On the reverse side it was noted that the mint mark "O", indicating the New Orleans mint, appeared.

SA MC FALL also noted that a small notch had been made on the edge of the coin, but because of its rough appearance. It did not seem to have been machine made or die cut.

EA MC FALL returned the silver dellar to HEAD, who then placed it back into bis wallet, together with the drivers license which was returned to him by SA ARPS.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, 120 Danny Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, was informed of the identity of interviewing Agent, was advised he was not required to furnish any information, and was told that anything he said could be used against him in a court of law. HEAD advised he has never been a member of the Hu Klux Klan and has never been appreached to join the Klan. He caid he is a member of the Citizen's Council and recoives the "Councilor" official publication of the Louisiana Citizen's Council. He said he has never received any Elan literature through the mailor directed to him as an individual, but has read some of the threwayaya distributed by the Klan in his neighborhood on occasion.

HEAD stated ho knows of several persons ho believes may belong to the Elan, but has no positive prof, and therefore he preferred not to identify these persons. He stated the knows J. B. TEMPLE, operator of Vidalia Auto Parts, having purchased most of his parts from TEMPLE when he, MEAD, used to operate a DX Service Station in Vidalia, and he still buys parts from TEMPLE occasionally. He said he has no knowledge that TEMPLE is a member of the Klan. HEAD stated he also knows JACK TEMPLETON, who lives on Murray Lane near his residence, but has no knowledge TEMPLETON is a member of the Klan. He stated TEMPLETON tried to interest his in changing his votor registration from Democrat to Republican last fall, but HEAD declined to do so because he folt it would limit his opportunities to vote. He stated TEMPLETON appeared to be active in trying to promote the Republican Party in the Vidalia area.

READ stated he formerly operated the DX Service Station on Cartor Street, Vidalia, in partnership with one CLEM STEELE. STEELE got out of the partnership

Subsequent to leaving the service station, HEAD went to work for the B. F. Goodrich Company, 44 E. Franklin Street, Natchez, where he is currently employed. He also formerly worked for six and a half years in Morgan City, Louisiana, for Echlumberger Well Survey Corporation, as a unit maintenance man. In this work he had experience in the use of electrical shape charges, used to perforate well holes, but did not handle dynamite.

HEAD stated he has a brother, CHARLES HEAD, living in Natchez, Mississippi, who is unemployed due to an ailment involving a glandular condition. He stated CHARLES nover worked at the DX service station in Vidalia.

HEAD stated he had no knowledge of any persons responsible for the dynamite bombs found in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 20, and 21, 1965, and that he himself did not go to Alabama during that time. He advised further that he had read about the Negro shee alop operator. FRAME MOERIE, in Ferriday, who was burned to death in a fire in December, 1964, but he had nothing to do with this and does not know who started the fire, or whether the Klan was involved.

HEAD stated that should he learn of any contemplated acts of violence by the Klan or anyone else, he would be willing to furnish this information to the FBI. He stated he does not condone acts of violence to preserve segregation, even though he is an admitted segregationist.

BUCK HORTON is a radical who works for Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, was working on the night shift the night the bomb was planted in the automobile of GEORCE METCALFE, and many people in the Vidalia area believe he knows all about that bombing.

Informant advised that when the Vidalia Mlavern of the OKKKK was chartered in mid-1963 there were 53 members in the Klavern. He advised that he knows the Klavern to be still active but does not know how many members there are now or if it is still the OKKKK.

Informant advised that HERMAN GREEN, a former Vidalia, Louisians policeman, and now a state or Federal game warden, who lives on Eleanor Street, in Vidalia, was a member of the Vidalia Klavern in 1963 and 1964 and probably still is.

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The man who runs the wholesale grocery business across from the Shamrock Motel in Vidalia, is presently a member of the Vidalia Klavern.

Informant advised that on the day of the bombing of a newspaper in Laurel, Mississippi, a Sunday in the early summer of 1964, J. B. TEMPLETON, a tall man named PRICE who works at Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, BUCK HORTON and a man "with no chin" who works at Armstrong Rubber Company, Natchez, stopped at Brookhaven en route to Laurel. He advised these men were most anxious that the police or Highway Patrol have no reason to stop them. Informant advised that he has no proof but feels these individuals were in some manner connected with the bombing of the newspaper in Laurel. Informant advised he was in the Vidalia Unit with all of above and knows they are capable of doing such.

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
