## **Franklin Negro** Killed By Truck MEADVILLE – A Franklin

MEADVILLE — A Franklin County Negro died late Wednesday afternoon when he was struck by a truck on a county road near Meadville.

Bailey Odell, 74, was killed about 5 p.m. Wednesday on Bunkley Road about five miles southwest of Meadville. L. L. Forman, District Attory ney of Franklin County, said Odell was stepping out of his vehicle to cross the road to talk to a friend when a truck driven by James Seales struck him.

Forman said the accident was unavoidable and no charges have been filed.

ROBERT KING, COLORED MALE, AGE SEVENTY-THREE, INTERVIEWED AT FRANKLIN COUNTY SHERIFFS OFFICE, MEADVILLE, MISS THIS DATE BY BUAGENTS AND FURNISHED SIGNED STATEMENT THAT AT ABOUT FIVE P.M. ON JUNE EIGHT SIXTY-SIX HE WAS TALKING WITH BAILEY ODELL, COLORED MALE, AGE SEVENTY-FOUR WHO WAS STANDING ON SIDE OF BUNCKLEY ROAD FIVE MILES SOUTH OF HIGHWAY EIGHTY-FOUR WHEN A PICK-UP TRUCK HIT ODELL. PATROLMAN BERNIESE BEASLEY MHSP WENT TO SCENE ABOUT SIX FIFTY P.M. AND TALKED TO SEALE; AT WHICH TIME SEALE TOLD HIM HE WAS DRIVING DOWN BUNCKLEY ROAD SIXTY TO SIXTY-FIVE MPH AND AS HE PASTED BAILEY ODELL. WHOSE BACK WAS TURNED TO WARD THE ROAD, ODELL TURNED AND STEPPED INTO THE SIDE OF TRUCK HITTING HEAD ON LEFT FRONT CORNER OF WINDSHIELD. 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SUBJECT: KKK ACTIVITY FRANKLIN COUNTY RM - KLAN

> Deputy Sheriff, KIRBY SHELL, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, on 5/12/66 furnished the following information re Klan activity in that area:

SHELL advised that there is no current Klan organization meeting in Franklin County to his knowledge. He advised that JAMES SEALE, JACK DAVIS (Constable at Roxie), WALTER GENE HALL and one or two others have started attending UKA meetings in the Natchez, Miss. area.

He advised that DALE MC LEMORE and two or three of his friends are going to meetings at the Unit of Preacher MC LEMORE (brother of DALE) in the Hazelhurst, Crystal Springs area. He advised these meetings are WKKKKOM.

SHELL advised that CLYDE WENTWORTH, the local Dodge auto dealer is not now currently attending Klan meetings, is however concerned that the Federal Government will remove him from the local Selective Service System as they did JACK HELM in New Orleans.

SHELL advised that WALTER GENE HALL and DON SEALE are currently driving tank trucks for Miller Transportation in Natchez, Miss., hauling gas and oil from the area oil fields. He advised that JAMES SEALE is currently working at the Moran Tank Company, along the Miss. River just below Natchez. He does not know just what type of work he is doing.

SHELL advised that he has heard nothing of the APWR in the Franklin County area in many months and does not believe it is actually meeting now. He assumes it will start just before school begins in September as they have in the past years.

SHELL advised that CLYDE SEALE, comes into Meadville for the Little League ballgames, does not now attend Klan meetings of any type in the Franklin County area. He advised he may go to Jackson or Natchez for such, but does not attend in Franklin County, from what he can determine. He advised that CLYDE SEALE will not discuss going over to the UKA as two of his sons apparently have.

SHELL advised that ARCHIE PRATHER is still very close to CLYDE SEALE, but to his knowledge has not attended Klan type meetings in several months. He advised that most of the older Klan members stopped going to meetings during the period when so many FBI Agents were in Franklin County investigating the death of EARL HODGES.

SHELL advised that to his knowledge BERNICE BEASLEY does not associate with any current known Klan members in the Franklin County area, other than JACK DAVIS, the constable in Roxie, and possibly one or two other local constables. He advised that BEASLEY is very careful not to be seen conversing with any known Klansmen.

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SHELL advised that he has heard nothing of BILLY BUCKLES being active in the Klan in the Franklin County area during the past several months. He advised that he has heard that BUCKLES is now active in the Natchez area, but does not know if he is now active in the WKKKKOM or the UKA.

Synopsis:

JAMES FORD SEALE still resides at Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi. On or about February 1, 1966, SEALE lost his job with JOHN MC PHAIL for whom he drove a truck. Informant on April 12, 1966, advised JAMES FORD SEALE was supposed to go to work for Red Ball Truck Line, Natchez, Mississippi. SEALE resigned from WKKKKOM and on or about November 29, 1965, joined the UKA, Inc., at Natchez, Mississippi. SEALE holds no office in UKA, Inc. Informant reports JAMES FORD SEALE has made statement to him that he was going along with policy of UKA, Inc., to have no violence.

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#### **DETAILS:**

RESIDENCE

On April 25, 1966, Sheriff WAYNE HUTTO, Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi, advised that JAMES FORD SEALE still resides at Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi, in the Bunkley Community, next door to his father, CLYDE SEALE.

#### EMPLOYMENT

On February 1, 1966, AUBREY LINDSEY, Patrolman, Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, McComb This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBL. It is the property of the FBL and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Mississippi, advised SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE that he had arrested JAMES FORD SEALE three times for speeding and reckless driving in the truck of JOHN MC PHAIL and that as a result of these arrests, SEALE has lost his job as truck driver for JOHN MC PHAIL.

On April 12, 1966, JN T-1 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE told him that he, SEALE, was supposed to go to work for Red Ball Truck Line, Natchez, Mississippi.

## CURRENT POSITION IN ORGANIZATION

On November 29, 1965, JN T-2 advised that in conversation with JACK SEALE at the home of CLYDE SEALE, he was told by JACK SEALE that his brother JAMES SEALE had now joined the United Klans of America, Incorporated. This source further advised that recently CLYDE SEALE had advised him that his son JAMES SEALE was going to join the United Klans of America, Incorporated.

On November 30, 1965, JN T-1 advised that JAMES SEALE has been officially inducted into the United Klans of America, Incorporated, but this source stated he does not know what effect this will have on CLYDE SEALE, the father of JAMES and JACK SEALE, coming into the United Klans of America, Incorporated.

On April 12, 1966, JN T-1 stated that JAMES SEALE holds no position either in the state or in the local Klavern of the United Klans of America, Incorporated.

#### AUTOMOBILE

On April 25, 1966, Sheriff WAYNE HUTTO, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, advised his

records show JAMES F. SEALE, Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi, has the following 1966 Mississippi registrations for the vehicles indicated:

F/5 26060, 1965 Chevrolet half-ton pickup truck.

ACTIVITY OF SUBJECT

On July 20, 1965, JN T-3 advised that on Saturday, June 26, 1965, a fish fry was held at the home of JAMES LEE on the Lismore Road south of Wildsville, Louisiana. There were about 20 persons in attendance at this fish fry and all that were present were believed to be members of the Ku Klux Klan in the State of Louisiana or Mississippi. It is further believed that each person present was a member or was being considered for membership in the "Silver Dollar" group. It is believed that members of the "Silver Dollar" group are the ones responsible for most of the acts of violence that have occurred in the Natchez, Mississippi, and Ferriday-Vidalia, Louisiana, areas.

Present at this fish fry were JIMMY SCARBROUGH, E. D. MORACE and WOODROW "BLUE" HOLLOWAY, all known to be Klan members at Ferriday, Louisiana; "BUCK" HORTON, NORMAN HEAD and R. J. GLOVER of Vidalia, Louisiana; T. L. TORGENSON, ERNEST FINLEY (deceased), ERNEST PARKER, ERNEST AVANTS, JACK and JAMES SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi, and "SONNY" TAYLOR, Harrisonburg, Louisiana.

Those in attendance attempted to make black powder; however, they were not successful.

On September 5, 1965, JN T-4 advised there are two separate Klan groups in Franklin County, Mississippi. He stated that one of these groups is referred to as the "River Group" and the other is referred to as the Meadville Group. This source stated that among the individuals in the "River Group," of which CLYDE SEALE is the Exalted Cyclops, that JAMES SEALE, the son of CLYDE SEALE, is a member.

On September 21, 1965, MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE advised SA JAMES O. INGRAM that his brother, JAMES SEALE, said he would never submit to an interview unless the agency had a warrant because he did not trust any law enforcement officer.

On October 8, 1965, JN T-5 was exhibited a photograph of JAMES FORD SEALE, and this source remarked that SEALE appeared familiar. This source stated he believed he may have observed SEALE or a person resembling SEALE within the Varnado, Louisiana, area or at stock car races in Neil, Mississippi, in the past.

On October 26, 1965, JN T-2 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE is an active member of the Number Two unit of Franklin County, Mississippi, of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM). This source pointed out that JAMES FORD SEALE's father is CLYDE SEALE, who is the Province Giant and also Exalted Cyclops of the Number Two unit in Franklin County, Mississippi. This source stated that he strongly suspects that JAMES FORD SEALE has been involved in acts of violence, but that he has no definite information or evidence which would substantiate this suspicion.

On October 21, 1965, JN T-1 advised that to his knowledge, JAMES FORD SEALE has received a subpoena to appear before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D. C., on October 10, 1965.

On November 30, 1965, JN T-1 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE has been officially inducted into the United Klans of America, Incorporated (UKA), but that he does not know what effect this will have on his father, CLYDE SEALE, coming into the organization.

On November 29, 1965, JN T-2 advised that he had been informed by JACK SEALE, brother of JAMES SEALE, that JAMES SEALE had now joined the UKA, Incorporated.

On January 25, 1966, JN T-1 advised that he had heard of no Klan activity on the part of JAMES SEALE since he swung over to the UKA, Incorporated, but that JAMES SEALE had told him that he was going along with the policy of the UKA, Incorporated, to have no violence.

On March 10, 1966, JN T-6 advised that on March 5, 1966, the State Election Convention of the UKA, Incorporated, for the State of Louisiana began at approximately 10:00 a.m. at the Francis Hotel, Monroe, Louisiana. There were 75 delegates present who had voting rights and there were approximately 110 individuals in all present.

The following day on March 6, 1966, the convention began at approximately 9:00 a.m. and terminated at 3:30 in the afternoon. This source stated that among the individuals he recalled as being present at this convention was JAMES SEALE.

This source stated that JAMES SEALE and (First Name Unknown) GILBERT have been accused by Mississippi

Klan leaders of furnishing information to the House Committee on Un-American Activities. A meeting was set up on March 13, 1966, at Vicksburg, Mississippi, between HOUSTON P. MORRIS, W. J. KIDD, JAMES SEALE, (First Name Unknown) GILBERT and HOUSTON EVANS to determine what to do about these accusations.

Characterizations of the WKKKKOM and the UKA, Incorporated, are included in the appendix of this report. Also included is a characterization of the OKKKK.

## ANTI-COMMUNIST CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION (ACCA), ALSO KNOWN AS ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 13, 1965, that the ACCA was formed February, 1965, when members of the OKKKK residing in the Sixth Louisiana Congressional District broke away from the State organization in the Fall of 1964.

The source stated members were told that even though the organization's name had been changed to ACCA they should still consider themselves to be Klansmen and that they would continue to operate as Klansmen.

In February, 1965, ACCA filed Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State's Office in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Source advised that the purpose of the ACCA is to promote Americanism, white supremacy and to maintain segregation.

A hearing was held in the United States District Court, Eastern District of Louisiana, New Orleans, during the week of September 11, 1965, wherein the ACCA and various individuals were held to answer a Justice Department petition seeking a temporary injunction against interference with the activities of civil rights workers in the Bogalusa, Louisiana area.

Charles H. Christmas of Amite, Louisiana, identified as the Grand Dragon of this organization, told the court that the Klan went out of existence four months previously and was succeeded by the ACCA. In reorganizing, ACCA retained as its officers the existing Klan officers, bylaws, and basic organization, according to Christmas. He further told the court that the ACCA membership was restricted to the Sixth Congressional District of Louisiana. Every oath in the ACCA was the same as that of the Klan, and the meeting places were often the same.

#### APPENDIX

#### UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, the Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on August 4, 1965, that the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several southern states. This source said that Robert M. Shelton is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was last elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source said that the activity of the UKA is increasing, and that the national office remains in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

#### APPENDIX

## WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on October 6, 1965, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and The official constitution and other directives violence. of the organization do not show any advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the state is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as of October 6, 1965, of 1500 to 2000 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964.

MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Miss., reportedly the Grank Knight Hawk, UKA, Natchez, aduised SA INGRAM on 9/21/65 that he engaged his father CLYDE SEALE and brother JAMES FORD SEALF Meadville, Miss., in conversation on Sunday, 9/19/65 regarding their interview by the FBI. He told them both he had epent quite sometime with the FBI in Natchez and feels he fully understands the racial situation in regard to Klan activities and the role of the FBI.

JAMES said he would never submit to an interview unless the agency had a warrant because he did not trust any lawenforcement officer. His father agreed with JAMES and said he did not want to be bothered by the FBI and especially the State Police, whom he has a deep hatred.

JACK SEALE advised that he travels all over the State for the UKA but in the event the FBI desires to contact him he will make himself available as boyg as the FBI does not harass him to the extent he would have to stop seeing the agents.

He said he and the UKA are making inquiries re the bombing and in the event he obtains information regarding any suspects he will furnish this info. to the FBI.

MIRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALS, 172 Booker Road, Natches, Miss., was contacted by SA JAMES O. INORAM on 9/17/65 at which time SEALE was questioned concerning possibly waking his brother JAMES SEALE and his father GLIDE SEALE available for interview. He said "Are you trying to get me killed." It was explained that if we could make arrangements for JAMES to come to the FBI Office and discussed matters of mutual interest "cooler heads would prevail". The paties could have a designated time and placexamp for themsetings. SEALE Sold He has not approved of the wethods used by the FBI and the MHSP toward his family and he truly hoped that some arrangements could be made in the future concerning interviews of his family as well as friends.

He explained that he has never been friendly toward the FBI and has refusized to talk with the FBI on occasions, however, he actually enjoyed the long session with SA's THOMPSON BERRY WBBB and INGRAM on 9/15/65 and believes he understands more clearly the Racial Situation in the State of Miss. He said he will make himself available at anytime in the future as long as he is treated in a manner that any citizen should be treated.

SEALE said he could not promise to arrange for interviews of his family, however, he would discuss this with his father CLIDE and JAMES this coming weekend. He said he would have to handle this matter in a roundabout manner explaining that he talked with the FBI the past week and would explain his position. He said his brother JAMES is a suspect in everything that happends and he maybe able to convince him it is better to keep the FBI advised of his activities.

JAMES FREDRICK LEE was interviewed at his residence in the Lismore Community, Ferriday, Louisiana, after being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and after being advised by SA FRANK B. WATTS that he did not have to make a statement, that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law and that he had the right to consult with an attorney before making any statement. No threats or promises of any sort were made to him in connection with this interview.

LEE stated that he resides in the Lismore Community of Ferriday, Louisiana, with his wife and four children and is employed in Department 23 of the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, Natchez, Mississippi, currently on a 12 midnight to 8 A.M., shift. He advised that he has been employed at Armstrong in this capacity for the past seven years.

LEE stated that on August 26, 1965, he arrived at the plant in Natchez and punched in at about 11:15 P.M. He stated he left the plant on August 27, 1965, punching out at about 8 A.M. LEE advised that he travels in a car pool from his residence in Ferriday, Louisiana, to the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company in Natchez each day he is employed. He advised that the other employees in his car pool are D. R. NOLAN, EDDIE JONES and T. RENFRO.

LEE advised that he was not absolutely sure who drove on August 26 - 27, 1965, to the Armstrong Plant but believes that he drove himself. He stated that when it is his time to drive, he drives his personally owned car, a 1962 blue Tempest, four-door, with Louisiana license 36X850. He stated that he, as well as other drivers in his car pool, always park in the rear parking lot of the plant behind the big warehouse. He advised that they always drive through the front gate as they are not permitted to go or come from the rear gate.

The Jackson Office has no objection to any of the above named 46 persons appearing before HCUA.

SULLIVAN advised that this is a tentative list and there may be a few changes before HCUA hearings actually begin about September 1, 1965.

Jackson Office has pending files on each of the above 46 individuals and up-to-date summary reports have been submitted on all but a few of those listed. All summary reports on these Klansmen will be completed by July 30, 1965. SULLIVAN advised on July 12, 1965 that HCUA hearings have definitely been set for Washington, D. C. and will not be held in Mississippi or in other southern states.

SULLIVAN is aware that the FBI has photographs of recent Klan activity in Mississippi and has requested that HCUA be loaned these photographs or that a copy be provided for them.

This request by SULLIVAN refers to 2-100 foot, 16 MM color reels of film taken by Bureau Agents at a Klan rally at Natchez, Mississippi on June 12, 1965. SULLIVAN'S request also refers to 35 MM color slides taken at the same Klan ralley.

Bureau is requested to advise whether HCUA can be provided these films or copies of these films; and if so, the manner in which it should be done.

Mr. SULLIVAN of HCUA further requested a photograph, if available of persons to be called to testify by HCUA.

Special Agents of the Jackson Office are currently preparing public source-type information on the above mentioned Klansmen who will testify before HCUA.

FBI Agents at Jackson are also in the process of recontacting former FBI informants to determine if they are willing to testify before HCUA. It is noted that most of the former informants have made it clear they would not testify under any conditions before any type hearing.

SULLIVAN, HCUA Investigator, has obtained numerous newspaper clippings on Klan activity or violence in Mississippi during the past year. Bureau is requested to advise Jackson if there is any need for the Agents to duplicate these newspaper clippings, which are known to be in SULLIVAN'S possession.

In passing, SEALE apparently recognized the Agents and waved and announced on the loud speaker that he would extend his invitation to the FBI to likewise attend this rally. SA DUKES called to SEALE, "We will see you later."

JAMES FORD SEALE, born 6/25/35, Meadville, Miss., presently resides Route 2, Meadville, Miss., and is employed by JOHN MC PHAIL, McPhail Oldsmobile, Natchez, Miss., driving a tractor-trailer truck from Haltom Lumber Company, Roxie, Miss., to Crown Zellerbach, Bogalusa, La. U. S. Army records disclose SEALE was inducted into U. S. Army on 7/21/55, under serial number 53235040 and entered on active duty on the same date in Jackson. Miss. He was honorably released from active duty on 10/18/55, as a private and was transferred to the U. S. Army Reserve for completion of his military obligation. Army records do not show SEALE acquired in military service any specific training or knowledge in the field of demolitions, explosives or firearms. Informants identified SEALE as member of WKKKKOM. One informant described SEALE as a "mental case." SEALE was arrested for murder on 11/6/64, by MHSP, however, charges have been dismissed. In another incident, SEALE has charged officers MHSP with assault. Informants have reported SEALE involved in acts of violence or his making statements advocating violence. SEALE has been interviewed on three occasions by FBI Agents and has either furnished no information or has become hostile.

# I. BACKGROUND

A. True name and aliases

On October 24, 1964, JAMES SEALE was interviewed by SAs PETER R. DURLAND, LENARD A. WOLF and PATRICK COLLINS and stated his name is JAMES SEALE.

When arrested by Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol (MHSP) on November 6, 1964, JAMES SEALE have his name as JAMES FORD SEALE.

A review on January 21, 1965, by Investigative Clerk NOEL L. BAKER of the Military Service Records at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, show the name of JAMES SEALE to be JAMES FORD SEALE.

B. Residence address and mailing address

Upon interview by SAs PETER R. DURLAND, LENARD A. WOLF and PATRICK COLLINS on October 24, 1964, JAMES FORD SEALE gave his address as Route 2, Meadville, Mississippi.

ELLA ATKINS, manager, Credit Bureau of Natchez, Natchez, Mississippi, on December 2, 1964, exhibited records to SA PETER R. DURLAND showing a credit statement dated October 23, 1964, which lists the residence of JAMES FORD SEALE as Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi.

C. Marital Status

ELLA ATKINS, manager, Credit Bureau of Natchez, Natchez, Mississippi, on December 2, 1964, advised SA PETER R. DURLAND that the records of the credit bureau show JAMES FORD SEALE is married and has three children.

D. Occupation or Business

On October 24, 1964, JAMES FORD SEALE was interviewed

by SAs PETER R. DURLAND, LENARD A. WOLF and PATRICK COLLINS at which time SEALE advised he is employed as a truck driver at a stud mill, Roxie, Mississippi.

On June 28, 1965, ROBERT HALTOM, owner Haltom Lumber Company, Roxie, Mississippi, advised SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE that JAMES FORD SEALE drives a tractor-trailer truck for JOHN MC PHAIL, McPhail Oldsmobile, Natchez, Mississippi, but is paid by the Haltom Lumber Company.

E. Employment address

On June 28, 1965, ROBERT HALTOM, owner, Haltom Lumber Company, Roxie, Mississippi, advised SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE that JAMES FORD SEALE drives a tractor driven truck for JOHN MC PHAIL, McPhail Oldsmobile, Natchez, Mississippi, but is paid by the Haltom Lumber Company, Roxie, Mississippi. HALTOM pointed out that in order to review records of his employment it would be necessary to contact officials of the Haltom Lumber Company whose business address is merely Roxie, Mississippi.

F. Education

A review on January 21, 1965, by Investigative Clerk NOEL L. PAKER of the Military Service Records (MSR) at the Military Personnel Records Center (MPRC), St. Louis, Missouri, show JAMES FORD SEALE has an eighth grade education.

G. Citizenship Status (Birth)

A review on January 21, 1965 by Investigative Clerk NOEL L. BAKER of the MSR at the MPRC, St. Louis, Missouri, show JAMES FORD SEALE was born June 25, 1935, at Meadville, Mississippi.

H. Military Record

A review on January 21, 1965, by Investigative Clerk NOEL L. BAKER of the MSR on file at the MPRC, St. Louis,

Missouri, disclosed JAMES FORD SEALE, Serial Number 277 73 70 enlisted in the U. S. Naval Reserve July 14, 1952, and served in inactive status until July 13, 1960, at which time he was honorably discharged.

While serving in the above period of service, SEALE was inducted into the U. S. Army, July 21, 1955, under Serial Number 53 235 040, and entered on active duty on the same date at Jackson, Mississippi. He was honorably released from active duty on October 18, 1955, as a private at Camp Chaffie, Arkansas, and transferred to the U. S. Army Reserve for completion of his military obligation. He served in U. S. Army Reserve in inactive status from October 19, 1955, to June 30, 1963, at which time he was honorably discharged.

The service records do not show SEALE had any specific training or knowledge in the field of demolition, explosives or firearms while in the military service.

By communication received in the Jackson Division December 16, 1964, the FBI Identification Division advised that JAMES FORD SEALE, no FBI number assigned, was arrested November 6, 1964, by the State Highway Patrol, Jackson, Mississippi, on a charge of murder.

Records of the Identification Division describe SEALE as 5 feet 9½ inches, weight 155 pounds, hair brown, place of birth Meadville, Mississippi, address Route 2, Meadville, Mississippi,

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in 1964, occupation laborer.

The fingerprint classification as furnished by the FBI Identification Division is as follows:

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J. Local criminal check

On December 3, 1964, SA PETER R. DURLAND checked the records of the Natchez Police Department, Natchez, Mississippi, which contain no information identifiable with JAMES FORD SEALE.

On June 2, 1965, Sheriff ODELL ANDERS, Adams County Sheriff's Office, Natchez, Mississippi, advised SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE that he had no record on JAMES FORD SEALE.

On June 17, 1965, Sheriff WAYNE HUDDO, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, advised that he had no record on JAMES FORD SEALE.

K. Credit Check

On December 2, 1964, Mrs. ELLA ATKINS, manager, Credit Bureau of Natchez, Natchez, Mississippi, made available to SA PETER R. DURLAND the credit file on JAMES FORD SEALE which disclosed as follows:

Credit report dated February 8, 1963, indicated SEALE, wife SHIRLEY, resided 2814 Itaska Drive, Natchez. He was listed as 28, white, married with wife, three children, selfemployed in cattle business for one year, buying home, wife earning \$225 monthly for Tower Loan Company where employed for three years.

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Credit report dated June 1, 1957, indicates SEALE 24, married, residing 808 State Street, Natchez, employed as linotype operator for "Natchez Democrat" for one year, estimated net worth, \$4,000, earn \$85 per week. They have lived in Natchez a number of years.

File contains a credit statement made out by Mrs. SEALE with address of Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi. Statement dated October 23, 1964. She states is 29, married, works as secretary-bookkeeper for Tower Loan Company, her net worth estimated, \$6,000 to \$8,000, income \$30 per week. Owns real estate, "Mid State Homes, Tampa, Florida," has banking connections with City Bank (Natchez,) and Bank of Franklin (Meadville). She states her husband was hurt in an oil field five years ago and he is just returning to work.

Report as of October 23, 1964, JAMES SEALE employed one month as driver, at \$90 per month for sawmill. Formerly in U. S. Army. Credit generally slow to satisfactory.

L. Automobile

On December 1, 1964, SAs PETER R. DURLANL and LENARD A. WOLF reviewed the Franklin County 1965 car registration records at the Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi. A registration was located in the name of JAMES FORD SEALE showing JAMES SEALE, Meadville, having > 1964 Pontiac Tempest sedan, 1965 Mississippi License 19-516; 1952 Studebaker, two door, 1965 Mississippi License 19B 148.

M. Available weapons

On October 20, 1964, Sheriff ODELL ANDERS, Adams County, Natchez, Mississippi, advised SAs ROBIN O. COTTEN and PETER R. DURLAND that sometime during 1963 a car operated by "civil rights workers" was fired into at Fayette, Mississippi. Sheriff ANDERS stated that according to a confidential source of his,

this shooting was done by JACK and JAMES SEALE with a 38 caliber pistol. He stated JAMES SEALE has kept this pistol hidden until recent weeks and at the present time is carrying this pistol. Sheriff ANDERS stated that this gun could possibly be at the home of JAMES SEALE. Sheriff ANDERS further advised that with respect to the dynamiting of the "Blue Flame at Bude, Mississippi, approximately three months ago, his source identified JAMES SEALE and others as being responsible for this dynamiting.

JN T-1 on November 12, 1964, advised that on November 11, 1964, RALPH DAY was going to work and ran into JAMES and DON SEALE in their truck as they were en route from Roxie, Mississippi, to Bogalusa, Louisiana. This meeting by RALPH DAY with JAMES and DON SEALE took place at 98 Truck Stop located a few miles east of McComb, Mississippi, on State Highway 98, which goes from McComb to Tylertown, Mississippi.

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On October 21, 1964, MHSP Investigator FORD O'NEAL (NA), advised that information had been received from a MHSP source

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that JACK and JAMES SEALE are close associates of EARNEST HENRY AVANTS, JAMES KENNETH GREER, JOHN WILLIAM BARBER and FRANK HYMAN THURMAN. O'NEAL advised that according to his source AVANTS, GREER, BARBER and THURMAN are allegedly involved in the assault of BRUCE LLOYD PAYNE, a civil rights worker at Port Gibson, Mississippi, and that AVANTS, GREER and JACK SEALE are allegedly involved in the shooting into automobile of BRUCE LLOYD PAYNE and GEORGE GREENE, near Fayette, Mississippi.

## II. CONNECTION WITH WKKKKOM

Characterization of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi and the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana are being set forth in the appendix of this report.

JN T-1 on September 14, 1964, advised that JAMES SEALE is a member of the Franklin County Unit 2 of the WKKKKOM and that his father, CLYDE SEALE is the Exelted Cyclops of this unit.

On October 12, 1964, JN T-1 identified JAMES SEALE who resided in the Bunkley Community, near Meadville, Mississippi, as a member of the Franklin County Unit Number 2. In addition JN T-1 furnished the identity of the other members of this unit which have been set forth under paragraph Q, captioned Associates, in the earlier portion of this report.

JN T-1 on October 6, 1964, advised that both MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, who resides in Natchez, Mississippi, and his brother JAMES SEALE, who resides in the Bunkley Community near Meadville, Mississippi, have both stated that FBI Agents can die as well as anyone else. Informant stated he felt that both JACK and JAMES SEALE are both "mental cases."

On October 20, 1964, FORD O'NEAL, Investigator, Identification Bureau of MHSP advised SAsWILLIAM F. DUKES and THOMPSON BERRY WEBB that as a result of contact with confidential informant of MHSP, he received information that MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, L. C. MURRAY and JAMES SEALE bombed JOHN NOSSER's home

as well as the residence of WILLIE WASHINGTON at Natchez, Mississippi.

This source advised that approximately six months before, a friend of the source who the source did not identify, found a case of 60 % dynamite in a junked car, gave it to informant, who in turn gave it to JAMES SEALE. This informant stated that fifteen of these sticks of dynamite were used in the dynamiting of the Blue Flame Cafe in Bude, Mississippi, in the Spring of 1964. Informant stated that he could not furnish the identity of the other individuals who were in on this bombing but that he was sure that JAMES SEALE was involved.

This same source according to FORD O'NEAL furnished the dynamite to be used in the bombing of the Negro meeting place in Louisiana, across the Mississippi line. The place was guarded by Negroes resulting in a shooting scrape with both klansmen and Negroes being injured.

On February 17, 1965, JN T-1 advised that he knew of no activity on part of JAMES FORD SEALE since January 1, 1965.

On June 3, 1965, JN T-2 advised that he had been told by HAROLD SAUCIER that a klan organization exists in the Meadville, Mississippi area and SAUCIER admitted to JN T-2 that he was a member of this organization. Source stated among those individuals attending meetings of this organization are JAMES SEALE.

# III. STATEMENTS OR ACTION CONCERNING VIOLENCE; OR ACTS OF VIOLENCE

On October 6, 1964, JN Tol advised that both MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, who resides at Natchez, Mississippi, and his brother JAMES SEALE, who resides in the Bunkley Community near Meadville, Mississippi, have both stated that FBI Agents can die as well as anyone else. JN Tol stated he felt that

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both JACK and JAMES SEALE are "mental cases."

On March 18, 1965, JN T-3 advised that JAMES SEALE who resides in Franklin County, Mississippi, and who was arrested during the fall of 1964, as a participant in the murder of two young Negroes in Franklin County, Mississippi, approached a group of known klansmen in Natchez, Mississippi. He told these individuals that in event any FBI Agent made inquiries regarding SEALE, that the Agent was to be directed to the SEALE home in Franklin County, Mississippi. SEALE stated he had something he wanted to try on the Agents. He then described the purchase and training of a large vicious dog which he said would take car of any Agent which came on his property.

On June 21, 1965, JN T-4 advised that about a week ago it was common knowledge in Meadville, Mississippi, that the klan member who had sworn out a warrant against Investigator SNODGRASS of the MHSP in Natchez, Mississippi, after SNODGRASS had arrested him recently, had told people in Meadville he was going to kill the governor of Mississippi. JN T-4 stated he thought the man involved was a SEAIS but he could not be sure.

JN T-3 advised on June 10, 1965, that JAMES SEALE, Franklin County, Mississippi, has stated that recently two FBI Agents went to his employer at Roxie, Mississippi, and informed his employer that SEALE and a companion were believed to be carrying guns in the course of their employment. SEALE and his companion drive a sawdust truck from Roxie to Bogalusa, Louisiana. After the Agents left the employer told SEALE that he would be fired if he did not cease carrying his gun while driving the truck.

SEALE stated that if he is fired, he fully intends to bring suit against his employer and attempt to learn the identities of the Bureau Agents and bring suit against them. An attorney at Natchez, Mississippi, by the name of BILL RILEY would handle these suits and has acted as SEALE's attorney in the past.

#### IV. MISCELLANEOUS

An article appearing in the local newspaper on June 15, 1965, "The Natchez Democrat", Natchez, Mississippi, under an article captioned "Charges filed against Patrol," reports that charges of assault and battery, false arrest and assault have been filed against two special investigators for the Mississippi Highway Patrol by JAMES F. SEALE, a resident of Franklin County.

The affidavit filed by SEALE indicated the incident occurred in District Five of Adams County on Saturday.

ARMSTEAD and SNODGRASS have been released under \$500 bond and trials by jury set for June 19, at 9:30 a.m.

On July 8, 1965, records of the MHSP, Jackson, Mississippi, were checked by SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE and disclose that JAMES FORD SEALE was arrested November 6, 1964, by the MHSP on a charge of murder in connection with the murders of HENRY HEZEKIAH DEE and CHARLES EDDIE MOORE, which case has been dismissed.

On January 18, 1965, JN T-1 advised that a conversation with JAMES SEALE and JACK SEALE determined that these individuals are upset over the dismissal of charges which were pending against JAMES SEALE and CHARLES EDWARDS. The reason for their being upset was the fact that in the request for dismissal of the charges the statement was made that additional individuals were involved and that further investigation was being conducted. JAMES SEALE stated that he had been planning on suing the State of Mississippi and perhaps the FBI for mistreatment but that at the present time he and JACK SEALE were reconsidering such action.

V. INTERVIEWS OF SUBJECT

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- EFERAL BURLING OF INVESTIGATION

Dote October 27, 1964

Mr. JAMES SEALE was interviewed near his residence Special Agents PETER R. DURLAND, PATRICK COLLINS AND ENARD A. WOLF who identified themselves as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. SEALE was informed of the nature of this investigation and was advised that he was entitled to a lawyer, that he did not have to say anything and that anything he said might be used against him in a court of law.

Mr. SEALE stated that he had never been a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any related organization and stated he had n information regarding the Klan. He further stated that he had never participated in any violence including bombings or beatings and states he had no information regarding these matters.

He advised that he did not care to state his opinion as to whether or not he condoned bombings, beatings or other violence in regard to the issue of integration or to the racial situation. He stated in this connection that he and other people in Franklin County were "getting sick of being interviewed and bothered by FBI Agents", and stated he did not wish to say anything else to the Agents and at this point discontinued the interview.

During the above interview the following background information was obtained:

#### FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date November 6, 1964

At 5:10 a.m. on November 6, 1964, JAMES FORD SEALE was apprehended on the charge of murder by Mississippi Highway Patrol officers NAT TROUT and FORD O'NEIL at SEALE's residence in the Bunkley community on Rural Route 2, Meadville, Mississippi. Special Agents EDWARD JOHN PUTZ and LENARD A. WOLF were present at the time of the apprehension.

Special Agents PUTZ and WOLF accompanied Mississippi Highway Patrol officers TROUT and O'NEIL in transporting JAMES FORD SEALE to Jackson, Mississippi.

En route to Jackson, JAMES SEALE answered general questions not pertaining to the murders. He remained mute at direct questions that were asked him about the murders with the following exception which is set out here verbatim:

SA WOLF: We know that on Saturday afternoon May 2, 1964, you picked up in your car HENRY DEE and CHARLES MOORE, two Negro boys from Roxie. You and CHARLES EDWARDS and others took them to some remote place and beat them to death. You then transported and disposed of their bodies by dropping them in the Mississippi River. You didn't even give them a decent burial. We know you did it, you know you did it, the Lord above knows you did it.

JAMES SEALE: Yes, but I'm not going to admit it; you are going to have to prove it.

When questioned further relarding this remark he said "I'm not going to say anything more".

SA EDWARD PUTZ, Officers NAT TROUT and FORD O'NEIL all heard the above conversation. SA PUTZ noted that the time that SEAME made the above statement was at 5:40 a.m.

JAMES FORD SEALE, residing Route 2, Mendville, Mendville, Mendshippi, was interviewed on Highway 98, Pike County, Alssippi. He was advised of the identity of the Agents is SA DARYL R. HARRELL and the nature of the inquiry. In immediately remarked "I got nothing to say to any of you". He asked SA HARRELL if he had a warrant and indicated he would talk only if the Agents had a warrant is his arrest. When he was advised that there was ap yourant he repeated that he had nothing to say and drave any in his truck.

# ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (LOUISIAN) (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 25, 1963, that in December, 1960, a group was organized at Shreveport, Louisiana, known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK). The purpose of this organization was to promote Americanism, white supremacy, and the maintaining of segregation.

This source further advised on October 25, 1963, that the OKKKK continues to be active and that the aims and purposes continue to be the same.

# WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI

A source advised that on February 15, 1965, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight communism and to extend the dignity, heritage and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on February 4, 1965, that the present membership of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) is between 1,000 and 1,500 members and the organization has continued to operate in the State of Mississippi as an independent Klan organization with the same aims and purposes as when it was created in February, 1964.
