CHARLES EVERS INAUGURAL BALL

On Thursday, 6/26/69, about 1:00 PM, R. J. GLOVER of Natchez, Miss., contacted E. D. MORACE of Vidalia, La., at the Ford Garage, Ferriday, La. The two men were observed to have lunch together at Brocado's Cafe. GLOVER told MORACE that the two plans previously discussed to disrupt the inaugural ball of CHARLES EVERS at Natchez, Miss., on 7/7/69, had been discarded. These plans were to pour gasoline in the storm drainage ditch near the City Auditorium and to string primacord on the sidewalk and set it off.

GLOVER said he had decided on the following action:

1) Have two men to pour five gallons of gasoline each on the two bridges across St. Catherine Creek on U. S. Highway 61, North, and U. S. Highway 61, South, in Natchez, and light fires during the ball. This would not cause much damage, but would be something for the Negroes to remember.

2) Have someone with a rifle shoot out the transformer which furnished electric power to the City Auditorium in Natchez, during the ball. GLOVER does not know where the transformer is located and this action is a thought rather than a plan.

3) Build a time bomb with two or three sticks of dynamite and an old alarm clock and set it off about two blocks west of the City Auditorium on the bluff where there are no houses or people. GLOVER stated he had the men to do the gasoline job, but he and MORACE would have to set the time bomb. GLOVER said he would be on vacation until 7/6/69, and would work on 7/6/69and 7/7/69, from 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM.

On Saturday, 6/23/69, R. J. GLOVER and E. D.MORACE went to the residence of KENNETH NORMAN HEAD on Lake Concordia, near Ferriday, La. GLOVER told HEAD about the time bomb he needed and asked how to rig a blasting cap, alarm clock and dynamite. HEAD explained how to build the bomb, but GLOVER could not understand it. HEAD told GLOVER to come over some evening and they would build one and test it on the river levee. On the way back to MORACE's house, GLOVER instructed MORACE to obtain an old alarm clock, not to buy a new one as it might be traced, and to build a time bomb. MORACE said he could build the bomb, but he was not an explosives expert and was afraid of dynamite.

GLOVER told MORACE he would be in Kentwood, La., on vacation for several days, but would recontact MORACE by 7/7/69.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP & MINUTEMEN

On 6/28/69, E. D. MORACE and R. J. GLOVER went to the home of JAMES SCAROBROUGH in Ferriday, La. SAMMY BUTLER, a former klansman, was there, but was to one side during the Conversation. GLOVER asked SCAROBROUGH if he still had the item he sent to him, indicating that it was the Russian Burp gun. SCAROBROUGH said he had the item, but had not been able

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•to get it to function properly. GLOVER asked if SCAROBROUGH still had his fast-talking weapon, meaning his automatic carbine, and SCAROBROUGH said he did. GLOVER told him to pass both of these on to a friend. GLOVER said this was the way to build trust, that he has passed his Russian Burp gun to several people and all had proven trustworthy.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP

On 6/28/69, about 5:00 PM, R. J. GLOVER telephoned E. D. MORACE and asked him to come to the home of SDG member BUCK HORTON in Vidalia, La., as HORTON was sick. MORACE and GLOVER took HORTON to Jeff Davis Hospital in Natchez, where it was found he had a very sore throat and a virus. They took HORTON back home that night. HORTON asked MORACE and GLOVER to go to the Concordia airport, Vidalia, La., and put his airplane in a hanger. HORTON said that he has been having some trouble with JAMES SEALE, a former klansman and SDG member from Mississippi. A Jackson, Miss., company has the lease on the Vidalia airport and SEALE is working for that company. The company that operates the Alexandria, La., airport wants to get the lease and HORTON is helping that company.

GLOVER and MORACE went to the airport after dark on 6/28/69, and told JAMES SEALE they wanted to put HORTON's airplane in a hanger. SEALE said he did not know about that and GLOVER exhibited a .38 caliber revolver with a two inch barrel, which was tucked inside his belt. SEALE then became easy to get along with and the plane was put in the hanger.

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On the night of 6/30/69, GLOVER and MORACE attended a meeting of the Concordia Parish Police Jury at the request of BUCK HORTON. The police jury was considering whether to give the lease to the airport to the Jackson, Miss., company or to the Alexandria, La., company. JAMES SEALE was present with ERNEST PARKER, a klansman from Natchez, Miss., and about ten other former klan members from the Natchez area. PARKER appeared mad and asked MORACE if he was there for BUCK HORTON. MORACE said that he was and also were his five friends, exhibiting a Smith and Wesson five shot revolver. PARKER told MORACE he was there only as an observer and soon left.

JAMES FORD SEALE was observed standing on the corner of Franklin and Commerce Streets, Natchez, Mississippi, at approximately 6:10 p.m.

He readily admitted his identity and he was reminded of the official and personal identity of the agent. SEALE advised that he was waiting for a friend who was shopping in the National Furniture Store at that location. He was later joined by a white male about 35 years old, self-identified as IKE WILLIAMSON, and the pair departed in a blue Dodge Dart sedan, bearing current Mississippi license 19-1785.

Before leaving SEALE stated that he had been falsely accused of several acts of violence. He stated that he is not traveling in the same circles as he had formerly associated, but was devoting his efforts to earning as much money as he could and improving his property. He denied any knowledge of the bombing of WHARLEST JACKSON and other acts of violence in Mississippi.

SEALE stated that he was then working at the Natchez Pulpwood and Timber Company, Natchez, Mississippi.

<u>Serial 3</u> Informant advised on 9/24/64 that since 9/15/64 JAMES SEALE has been talking about a church burning he was in on which was surrounded by an electrical fence and one of persons was severely shocked. Informant was not aware of whether story was true. Informant pointed out that he did not know whether this was a story that had been made up by JAMES SEALE in an attempt to trap the informant. Information should not be disseminated.

Serial 4 which led up to the dynamiting of JAKE FRISHMAN's place at Natchez, Miss., on 8/15/64. Those involved were JAMES SEALE, JACK SEALE, ERNEST FOSTER, CHARLES FALVEY, RALPH DAY, (FNU) HALL, and (FNU) EDWARDS. Information should not be disseminated.

<u>Serial 25</u> CASKEY, Professor, Miss. College, Clinton, Miss., being a member of klan. Background of Klansman GRADY NEWELL and information concerning Lincoln Co. Unit 1 of the WKKKK set forth but no information re JAMES SEALE contained in this serial.

Serial 28 advised that on 4/10/65 JACK SEAL, a son of CLYDE SEALE, had come to his brother JAMES SEALE asking JAMES to approach their father regarding joining the UKA.

Serial 61 On 5/11/68, advised on night of 6/7/66, banquet was held on 7th Floor of the Eola Hotel, by members of the UKA of Miss., and those present included JAMES SEALE and his wife.

Serial 74 On 6/4/66, advised that a few months ago collection was made at Armstrong Tire and Rubber Co. for JAMES SEALE. SEALE was about to lose his home and car. This info incorporated into a report.

Serial 75 On 6/8-9/66, that that he talked with JAMES SEALE on the night of 6/8/66 after SEALE had been involved in an automobile accident in which a Negro had been killed. Source stated that SEALE told him that he had been driving toward his home in the Buckley Community in Franklin County about 5:00 p.m., and passed a tractor which was parked on the side of the raod. The Negro stepped out from behind the tractor and walked into the side of his truck. SEALE swerved to the right to miss the Negro and the right front fender of his truck struck the Negro's truck which had been parked on the right side of the raod. Source stated SEALE told him that he had know this Negro for a number of years and that the Negro had lived in the area. This info incorporated into a report.

Serial 76 On 7/7/66, advised JAMES SEALE of the Bunkley Community has left the White Knights coming into the UKA in Adams County under the influence of his brother JACK. This info incorporated into a report.

Serial 84 On 1/4/67, advised subject observed with his family visiting at home of ERNEST GILBERT in Brookhaven, Miss., on Christmas Day.

Serial 85 On 3/2/67 and 2/28/67, Former ______advised that he had heard that JACK SEALE had not seen his brother, JAMES, in approxi ately three months. As far as he knows, SEALE is still commuting from residence to welding job in Baton Rouge, La.

Serial 86 On 3/3/67, advised that subject is not a member of the Silver Dollar Group to his knowledge.

Serial 88 On 3/9/67, Former dvised JAMES F. SEALE still lives in Bunkley Community and commutes daily with DON SEALE to Baton Rouge, La., where they are welding on the old river bridge. This is about 90 miles one way from where they live. JAMES has a 1966 Dodge Coronet, grey, 1967 Miss. License 19-1341; has a 1965 Oldsmobile license 19-1340, which is white which his wife drives to work in Natchez daily. There seems to be no doubt that JAMES SEALE and JACK DAVIS of Roxie went to the APWR meeting in the court house about 7:30 p.m., to at least 8:30 p.m., and then left Meadville on 2/27/67.

V. ACTIVITIES OF SUBJECT

JN T-1 advised on February 3, 1968, that he was not aware of any activity on the part of JAMES SEALE and stated he believed that the WKKKKOM in Franklin County, Mississippi, is currently inactive.

JN T-2 on February, 21, 1968, advised that JAMES FORD SEALE is formerly a member of the WKKKKOM, but later changed over to the UKA, Inc.

JN T-3 advised on March 21, 1968, that he believed JAMES SEALE will eventually get out of the WKKKKOM, as he does not agree with the policy of violence advocated by its leader, SAM HOLLOWAY BOWERS.

On May 8, 1968, JN T-2 advised that on April 20, 1968, BILLY D. BUCKLES contacted JAMES SEALE, former WKKKKOM member in Franklin County, Mississippi. SEALE told BUCKLES he is no longer in the White Knights and that he was looking out for number one. JN T-2 stated SEALE feels lucky that he was not sent to the penitentiary for his past acts of violence of which he would not be specific.

JN T-3 advised on May 3, 1968, that JAMES SEALE appeared to be disenchanted with the Klan.

JAMES SEALE, Route 2, Meadville, Mississippi, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the inquiry at the outset of the interview. SEALE stated some of these individuals are neighbors and fellow employees either of the International Paper Company or the Armstrong Company in Natchez, Mississippi.

SEALE stated that there has been no organized activities of the WKKKK in Franklin County for several years.

He said he knows S. E. MOORE, JR., known to him as JUNIOR MOORE who lives in Roxie, Mississippi and expressed the opinion that MOORE had nothing to do with the burning of the Roxie Headstart Center or the other church burnings in Franklin County such as the Spring Hill Baptist Church.

SEALE stated he believed that LLOYD FORMAN, JR., DAVID WAYNE WILLIAMS, and JESSE SMITH and JACKIE ARNOLD were responsible for the burning of the Roxie Headstart Center and described them as youths who were never affiliated with the Klan.

He remarked that the WKKKK actually ran the Congress of Racial Equality and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee out of Adams County, Mississippi and committed numerous other acts of violence which he would not be specific, but stated they had been blamed for a number of things which they were "not guilty".

JAMES SEALE denied knowledge or participation in the bombing of WHARLEST JACKSON in Natchez, Mississippi. He stated he could honestly state that he had no personal knowledge of the WHARLEST JACKSON bombing.

SEALE remarked that he is trying to make a living, is no longer affiliated with the WKKKK and has no desire to become affiliated with any klan group in the future.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP

A source on April 4, 1967, and a second source on May 3, 1967, characterized the Silver Dollar Group as a hard-core action group made up of present and former members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM); the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA); and Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi and Louisiana.

On August 15, 1967, a third source advised that the Silver Dollar Group was formed approximately in May or June, 1964. The secret group within the Klan was formed to further Klan activities involving the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and maintaining total segregation. Klansmen were dissatisfied with the inactivity in their respective Klan groups. The members of the new secret action unit had to be trusted Klansmen and had to vouch for each other.

No formal organization format has been adopted but group membership is obtained by invitation only and upon receipt of a silver dollar coin from the group organizer Raleigh Jackson Glover.

APPENDIX

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with Units in several Southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the Original Knights and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the WKKKKOM are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

The same source advised on May 23, 1968, that the WKKKKOM is an unincorporated, secret org^nization existing in the State of Mississippi and formed for the sole purpose of preserving white supremacy regardless of The the cost and including the use of force and violence. official constitution and other directives of the organization do not openly advocate the use of force or violence; however, it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the salvation of the white man regarding his relationship with the Negro race. The WKKKKOM is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and state officers. The state is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership as of May 23, 1968, of 400 to 600 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. L. E. Matthews, Jr., of Florence, Mississippi, was elected February 11, 1968, at a state meeting to succeed Sam Holloway Bowers, Jr., as Imperial Wizard.

Mr. ZUMBRO stated he had never been a member of the White Kuights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKCM) or any other Klan organization but had been invited to join the Klan on two occasions during the past. He stated insofar as the WKKKKOM is concerned in Franklin County, they are "dead." He said that he had heard that CLYDE WENTWORTH was the Exalted Cyclops of one unit and CLYDE SEALE had been in the past the Exalted Cyclops of another unit which formerly operated in Franklin County.

Mr. ZUMBRO pointed out that he has not heard of any Klan activity in Franklin County since about 1965. At one time the Klan was strong in Franklin County, but after the death of EARL HODGE the Klan "fell apart."

Mr. ZUMBRO was not aware of any current activity on the part of JAMES or CLYDE SEALE.

FRANK ALLEN, Smithdale, Mississippi, Route 1, the president of the Board of Supervisors for Franklin County, Mississippi, was advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the inquiry at the outset of the interview.

Mr. ALLEN advised that he joined Unit Number Two of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), Franklin County, sometime during 1963 but never attended a meeting. He pointed out that during this time the Klan was strong in Franklin County, and it was politically expedient to belong to the Klan at this time.

Mr. ALLEN stated that he had no personal knowledge of any violence committed by Klansmen in Franklin County. He stated that he is opposed to violence in any form and said that the WKKKKOM is inactive at the present time.

Mr. ALLEN said that he had never heard anything about the murder of EARL HODGE, on or about August 14, or August 15, 1965, except that he was allegedly murdered by Klansmen. He stated that he is opposed to violence in every form, and in the event he learns of any Klan activity in Franklin County he will immediately notify the FBI.

Mr. ALLEN pointed out that the Klan had been inactive for at least three years and believed that the killing of EARL HODGE more or less broke the backbone of the Klan. He pointed out that HODGE was a former Klansman and sentiment was aroused in the county when he was murdered. (57-950-139)

Mr. ALLEN stated that CLYDE WENTWORTH was the Exalted Cyclops of one of the units of the WKKKKOM and CLYDE SEALE was the Exalted Cyclops of another unit in Franklin County.

Mr. ALLEN knows of no recent Klan meetings, has no knowledge of any explosives or gun caches in Franklin County, and to his knowledge the Klan is dead.

Mr. ALLEN stated he was unable to furnish any information regarding the WHARLEST JACKSON case or the GEORGE METCALFE bombings.

Mr. ALLEN was shown the photographs of the principal suspects in the Jackson, Mississippi, bombings and stated that he was not aware of the identity of anyone appearing in the photographs.

JAMES FORD SEALE presently unemployed but continues to reside at Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi. The following vehicles and 1968 Mississippi licenses are registered to SEALE: a 1965 white Oldsmobile bearing 1968 Mississippi registration 19-1407; a 1966 gray Dodge Coronet bearing 1968 Mississippi license 19-1785. No information developed to date that SEALE is an officer in a Ku Klux Klan group but informants report that SEALE is a member of the Silver Dollar Group. Latter group has been described as a hard core action group composed of present and former members of the WKKKKOM, UKA, and the OKKKKOL.

DETAILS:

Characterizations of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, United Klans of America, and the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are included in the appendix of this report.

On April 4, 1967, JN T-1 and on May 3, 1967, JN T-2 described the "Silver Dollar Group" as a hard core action group made up of present and former members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi, United Klans of America, and the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan from Louisiana and Mississippi. No formal organizational format

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has been adopted by the group. Membership is obtained by invitation and upon receipt of a silver one dollar coin from the group organizer, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

I. RESIDENCE

KIRBY SHELL, Deputy Sheriff, Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi, advised December 21, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE continues to reside at Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi, in the Bunkley community.

II. EMPLOYMENT

KIRBY SHELL, Deputy Sheriff, Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi, advised December 21, 1967, that to his knowledge JAMES FORD SEALE is presently unemployed.

III. CURRENT POSITION IN ORGANIZATION

Contact with the various sources has developed no indication that JAMES FORD SEALE has ever held an office in the Klan.

JN T-8 advised September 20, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE was a member of the Silver Dollar Group and source was of the opinion that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER is the individual who had given SEALE his silver dollar.

IV. AUTOMOBILES

A 1965 white Oldsmobile F-85 model, Vehicle Identification Number 336695M202491, bearing 1968 Mississippi license 19-1407; a 1966 gray Dodge Coronet, Vehicle Identification Number WE41B67252846, bearing 1968 Mississippi license 19-1785.

V. ACTIVITIES OF SUBJECT

JN T-1 advised June 6, 1967, that E. D. MORACE indicated that sometime during the summer of 1966 JAMES SEALE, ERNEST PARKER, and L. C. MURRAY came by his residence in Ferriday, Louisiana, traveling in PARKER'S red Ford or Mercury. MORACE was told by SEALE that they were interested in getting the Silver Dollar Group together and asked MORACE'S assistance. MORACE told SEALE that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER would be the proper person to see. SEALE then said that they had tried to see GLOVER but could not find him.

JN T-2 advised June 21, 1967, that an occasional meeting of the Silver Dollar Group was held sometime in 1965. Present at the meeting were R. J. GLOVER, JAMES F. LEE, JAMES SEALE, and CLYDE SEALE. All of these individuals displayed silver dollars as a sign of unity for an upcoming local trial of JAMES SEALE.

JN T-3 advised May 22, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE had attended an Original Knights of America rally at Laurel, Mississippi, on May 20, 1967.

JN T-4 advised July 21, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE, of the Bunkley community, is candidate for sheriff in Franklin County, and general rumor is that he will win because he is capitalizing on Federal Government intervention into various phases such as the Office of Economic Opportunity, Federal registrars for voting, etc.

JN T-5 advised July 18, 1967, that ERNEST GILBERT has been in touch with JAMES FORD SEALE in the recent past at which time the main topic of their conversation was the political situation in Mississippi.

JN T-6 advised August 15, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE attended a meeting of the Silver Dollar Group sometime in late 1964 or early 1965. Individuals present beside SEALE were L. C. MURRAY, WALTER GENE HALL, JACK SEALE, and ERNEST PARKER.

JN T-6 again advised on August 15, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE had attended the fish fry meeting of the Silver Dollar Group on June 26, 1965, at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE at Wildsville, Louisiana. Accompanying SEALE to the meeting were L. C. MURRAY, ERNEST PARKER, JACK SEALE, and ERNEST FINLEY. During the afternoon charcoal, saltpeter, and some other ingredient were ground up in a coffee grinder in an effort to make an explosive powder. Their attempt to do so met with failure.

JN T-7 advised August 15, 1967, that sometime during 1964 shortly after the Silver Dollar Group had been organized by RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, JAMES FORD SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, and ERNEST BUCHANAN PARKER were taken into the group.

JN T-7 continued that the first meeting of this group that he attended was held on the sandbar of the Homochitto River near the bridge beyond Meadville, Mississippi. This was approximately one month after organization of the group by GLOVER. Present at this meeting were the following: L. C. MURRAY, JACK SEALE, JAMES FORD SEALE, ERNEST FINLEY, R. J. "RED" GLOVER, JAMES FREDERICK "RED" LEE, JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH, WALTER GENE HALL, and possibly ERNEST B. PARKER.

This source advised that the following members of the Silver Dollar Group were present at the second meeting which he attended: TOMMIE LEE JONES, T. L. TORGERSEN, L. C. MURRAY, JACK SEALE, JAMES SEALE, WALTER GENE HALL, ERNEST FINLEY, RALPH CHARLES SALVEY, RALPH DAY, LUTHER HART, "RED" GLOVER, JAMES F. "RED" LEE, JIMMY SCAROBOROUGH, and NORMAN HEAD. The trunk of SALVEY'S car was loaded with possibly twenty to thirty bologna type sticks of dynamite.

This source continued that on June 26, 1965, a fish fry was held at "RED" LEE'S home in Wildsville, Louisiana.

Attending the meeting in ERNEST PARKER'S red Ford automobile were JACK SEALE, JAMES SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, and ERNEST FINLEY. Also in attendance at the meeting were THOR L. TORGERSEN, "RED" LEE, "RED" GLOVER, NORMAN HEAD, SONNY TAYLOR, E. D. MORACE, and BUCK HORTON.

JN T-5 advised August 24, 1967, that the following individuals were actively engaged in activities and were members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKKOM) in the McComb-Natchez, Mississippi, area during 1964: CHARLIE SALVEY, CLYDE SEALE, JACK SEALE, JAMES SEALE, RALPH DAY, ERNEST GILBERT.

JN T-7 advised September 5, 1967, that JAMES SEALE had returned to work at the Moran Tank Company, Natchez, Mississippi, after he lost his bid to become sheriff of Franklin County, Mississippi, in the election on August 8, 1967. Source stated that JAMES SEALE had a shoulder separation and was to have an operation at the Natchez General Hospital on the following day. Source continued that SEALE is unable to work in any place where it is very hot.

JN T-8 advised September 20, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE was a member of the Silver Dollar Group and source was of the opinion that RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER was the individual who had given SEALE his silver dollar. Source advised that SEALE attended a meeting of the Silver Dollar Group which was held on a sandbar on the Homochitto River in Franklin County, Mississippi, and he attended the meeting of this group at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE in the summer of 1965. Source identified the additional following individuals as being members of the Silver Dollar Group: JACK SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, ERNEST PARKER, ERNEST FINLEY (deceased), THOR LEE TORGERSEN, TOMMIE LEE JONES, CHARLES SALVEY, RAEPH DAY, WALTER GENE HALL, E. D. MORACE, JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH.

JN T-8 continued on September 20, 1967, that there is no active Klan in Franklin County, Mississippi, at the present time. Source advised that the Klan in Franklin County had been totally inactive since 1964 when JAMES FORD SEALE and CHARLES MARCUS EDWARDS were arrested by the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol and FBI Agents. Source stated that the arrest of these two individuals frightened the other Klansmen so that they lost interest in Klan activities.

JN T-7 advised September 29, 1967, that he had conversed with JAMES FORD SEALE on September 28, 1967. They observed JAMES WHITE, and the source commented that there is the pheasant breeder. JAMES SEALE replied, "Is that him?" Source commented he was the individual who had put BBs in TOMMIE JONES. SEALE commented, "Yeah, if he hadn't shot a picket (of a fence) off he would have gotten WALTER GENE (HALL)". They commented that WHITE no longer had the sign on his vehicle about the pheasants.

This source again advised that JACK SEALE had attempted to get JAMES SEALE to attend a Silver Dollar Group meeting on October 1, 1967. JAMES SEALE declined invitation as he did not have the funds to travel to the meeting. JAMES SEALE stated that his only transportation available to come to Natchez was with his wife's, SHIRLEY'S, vehicle when she comes to work at the Tower Loan Company.

JN T-7 advised October 17, 1967, that he had no knowledge that JAMES SEALE ever possessed any kits to convert M-1 carbine to M-2 carbine.

JN T-8 advised October 19, 1967, that JAMES FORD SEALE had been a member of Unit Number 1 of the WKKKKOM of Franklin County in about 1962. Source continued that this unit broke up very shortly after SEALE was arrested in November, 1964.

JN T-6 advised November 6, 1967, that JAMES FREDERICK LEE and JAMES FORD SEALE had visited in the home of L. C. MURRAY on November 3, 1967. The subject of conversation was the identity of individuals furnishing information to the FBI. LEE was of the opinion that E. D. MORACE had furnished information. Source stated that JAMES SEALE commented that he did not think MORACE is furnishing information to the FBI because "he had been down that road". Source stated that he thought this comment meant that 'SEALE knew that MORACE had committed some type of act of violence in the past and this is the reason he did not think MORACE was talking to the FBI.

JN T-7 advised November 8, 1967, that JAMES SEALE had told BILL RILEY, Natchez, Mississippi, attorney, that he had been interviewed by Agents of the FBI and the Agents wanted him to attend meetings of the Silver Dollar Group and furnish information he learned about this group to the FBI. Source stated that JAMES SEALE also told RILEY that JACK SEALE was attending meetings of this group.

IV. INTERVIEW OF SUBJECT

JAMES FORD SEALE was contacted near Highway 98, approximately three miles west of Meadville, Mississippi, as he and an unknown individual were preparing a pickup truck for use in SEALE's campaign for Sheriff of Franklin County. He was advised that the interviewing Agent would like to talk with him for a few minutes.

SEALE, who knows the identity of the interviewing Agent, stated, "I will not talk to the God damn FBI now or ever".

SEALE, immediately after the above statement, turned his back and walked toward a house some 70 or 80 feet from the roadside where he was contacted.

APPENDIX

ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (LOUISIANA) (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 25, 1963, that an organization known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) had been organized in the State of Louisiana at Shreveport, Louisiana, in December of 1960.

A second source advised on August 12, 1966, that the OKKKK continues to be active within the State of Louisiana, and that the aims and purposes of this organization continue to be to promote Americanism, the supremacy of the white race, and the furtherance of segregation between the races.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with Units in several Southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the Original Knights and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the WKKKKOM are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

The same source advised on August 25, 1967, that the WKKKKOM is an unincorporated, secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and formed for the sole purpose of preserving white supremacy regardless of the cost and including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not openly advocate the use of force or violence; however, it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the salvation of the white man regarding his relationship with the Negro race. The WKKKKOM is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and state officers. The state is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership as of August 25, 1967, of 400 to 600 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. Sam Holloway Bowers, Jr., Laurel, Mississippi, continues to be the Imperial Wizard.

This case is being placed in a pending inactive status, however, under the new rule, it is about time for a memorandum to be submitted to the file or a letter to the Bureau.

In view of the retirement of SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE, it suggested this case be reassigned.

Serial 27 SA HELGESON memo to Jackson, 10/12/64. On 10/12/64, SA TIMOTHY J. CURTIN telephonically requested a driver's license check for all available background information on JAMES SEALE, Bunkley Community, Meadville, Miss.

Serial 138 FD-302, interview with JAMES SEALE, 10/24/64, at Meadville, Miss. SEALE stated that he had never been a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any related organization and stated he had no information regarding the klan. He further stated that he had never participated in any violence including bombings or beatings and states he had no information regarding these matters.

He advised that he did not care to state his opinion as to whether or not he condoned bombings, beatings or other violence in regard to the issue of integration or to the racial situation. He stated in this connection that he and other people in Franklin County were "getting sick of being interviewed and bothered by FBI Agents", and stated he did not wish to say anything else to the Agents and at this point discontinued the interview.

Further, it was reported that shortly before the NOSSER bombing, a brown 1963 or 1964 Chevrolet and a white Volkswagon were seen circling the block around the mayor's home. Informant reported that his source of this information came from a member of the klan, who is a friend of the NOSSERS.

Informant reported that a civil rights worker's car was shot into near Fayette, Miss. about six months ago; that JAMES SEALE did this with a .38 calibre pistol owned by "JACK" SEALE, his brother. JACK was the driver of the car at the time. Cover Pg. F Approximately 6 months ago a friend of the informants, who he would not identify found a case of 60% dynamite in a junked car and gave it to informant, who in turn gave it to JAMES SEALE. Fifteen of these sticks were used in the bombing of the Blue Flame Cafe in Bude, Miss. in the Spring of 1964. While informant could not furnish the identity of others in on this bombing, JAMES SEALE was.

JAMES SEALE furnished the dynamite to be used in the bombing of a Negro meeting place in Louisiana, across the Miss. line. The place was guarded by Negroes resulting in a shooting scrape with both klansmen and Negroes being injured.

DAY advised that he introduced himself at the HESTER residence by telling him that he has heard of him through his wife, who was born and reared some three miles from his residence and has known HESTER all her life.

DAY advised that he offered to sell HESTER an automobile, should he need one in the near future, at a very good price. DAY advised that he was unable to get HESTER to converse with him at all on either occasion.

He advised that on the afternoon of July 4, 1967, HESTER dragged an old pickup truck from the front of his house across the highway to the rear of his father's house with his tractor. He stated that "Try as I may, I could not get HESTER to converse with me."

No formal organizational format has been adopted by the group. Membership is attained by invitation and upon receipt of a silver one-dollar coin from the group organizer, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER.

JAMES FORD SEALE, wife - SHIRLEY, and children continue to reside at Route Two, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi, in the Bunkley Community. His neighbors continue to be his father, CLYDE SEALE, and family; ARCHIE PRATHER and family; and CHARLES MARCUS EDWARDS and family. Each of the above neighbors, during the course of other investigations, have been positively identified as members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM).

II. EMPLOYMENT

JN T-1 advised on May 22, 1967, that JAMES SEALE is unemployed at this time but is spending full time campaigning for the position of Sheriff of Franklin County, Mississippi. Source expressed the opinion subject will be the next Sheriff.

MURPH H. KYLE, Comptroller, Moran Tank Company, Incorporated, Natchez, Mississippi, advised SA BENJAMIN F. GRAVES on June 2, 1967, that company records reflect JAMES F. SEALE, Social Security Number 426-56-4902, was employed by his firm as a mechanic from April 12, 1966, to August 31, 1966, when he left to find a better job.

On March 29, 1966, JN T-1 advised SEALE was working for an off-shore drilling firm, ten days on the job and seven days off.

Mrs. SEALE has been observed to commute daily from the Bunkley Community in rural Meadville to Natchez where she is employed by Tower Loan Brokers, 610 Franklin Street.

PROSPERE at the Post Office, Natchez, Mississippi, at which time she advised that her husband, JAMES FORD SEALE, had been fired from his job at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where he was working as a welder. Mrs. SEALE stated that she and her husband felt that FBI Agents were responsible for her husband losing his job since the Agents came to his job in Baton Rouge on two occasions in an effort to interview JAMES SEALE. Mrs. SEALE stated that her husband had only recently gotten to the point where he felt he could be interviewed by Bureau Agents.

Mrs. SEALE pointed out that her husband had previously been arrested by FBT Agents and investigators of the Mississippi Highway Fatrol on which occasion her husband had been mistreated. She stated for this reason her husband did not wish to be interviewed by Bureau Agents. Mrs. SEALE stated that through the efforts of her husband's brother, "JACK" SEALE, he had been persuaded to cooperate and talk to FBI Agents; however, after he had lost his job in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, he was again in the position where he did not wish to be interviewed by Bureau Agents.

JACK DAVIS, barber and constable at Roxie, Mississippi, was reminded of the identity of Special Agents, the nature of the investigation, and that any statement he m might make could be used in court.

DAVIS indicated he was aware of his rights and stated he desired to cooperate in any manner possible. He stated that on the night of February 27, 1967, he had gone to Meadville, Mississippi, bumped into JAMES F. SEALE on the streets, and they had a cup of coffee at the City Cafe. They then went at 7:30 across the street to the Franklin County Court House where they at attended a meeting of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race until 8:30 p.m. or so. Mrs. M. A. FORMAN, owner of Forman Market and Grocery Store, located on Louisiana State Route 565, Wildsville, Louisiana, was recontacted at her place of business. Mrs. FORMAN advised that JAMES FREDERICK LEE and his family moved into her two story house which is located next door to her grocery store in about May, 1965, and shortly after they moved in they had a number of individuals come to their house for a fish fry. She states she was not invited to the fish fry and she would not have attended had she been invited. She stated to her knowledge none of her neighbors were invited to this fish fry. She stated she did not know anyone who attended the fish fry and she did not know any of her neighbors who had any information regarding the fish fry.

Mrs. FORMAN was shown photographs of MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, JAMES FORD SEALE and L. C. MURRAY and she stated she did not know these individuals, she did not know if they attended the fish fry at LEE's residence in the Summer of 1965 and she could not recall these three individuals coming into her grocery store on the date of the fish fry to make any purchases. Mrs. FORMAN was asked specifically if she could recall the above three individuals coming into her store on the day of the fish fry to purchase grease or lard and she reiterated she could not recall these individuals being in her store on the day of the fish fry or any other day.

JN T-3 advised that he had heard that JAMES SEALE and JACK SEALE were in on the killing of two Negro boys around 1965, whose bodies were found in a river. He had no direct information concerning the particular case.

JN T-4 advised on June 2, 1967, that on a recent trip to Natchez, Mississippi - Vidalia, Louisiana, he had determined to his satisfaction that JAMES and JACK SEALE are still active Klansmen, who, in his opinion, would resort to violence. No further explanation was offered.

JN T-5 on May 9, 1967, reported that the question as to who the FBI's source was concerning the fishfry held in June of 1965 and which has been a focal point of current FBI investigation (pertaining primarily to the bombing and death of National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Secretary, WHARLEST JACKSON) was discussed.

GLOVER pointed out that it did not necessarily have to be anyone from the Silver Dollar Group furnishing this information. GLOVER recalled that during the fishfry, they ran out of grease and JACK and JAMES SEALE, along with ERNEST FINLEY, went to the store next to the JAMES LEE residence to obtain grease. While at the store, two Klan cards were left by these individuals. GLOVER pointed out that this woman's son, who runs the store, is a Louisiana State Game Warden; she could have told him of this; and he may well have taken license numbers of those present at the fishfry.

JN T-5 advised a fishfry was held at the home of JAMES LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana, about one and a half years ago and was attended by approximately twenty persons. At this fishfry, was one individual from Mississippi, who was reported to be an informant for either the FBI or other law enforcement agencies. Source advised this person was unknown to him; however, he was at the courthouse in Adams County, Mississippi, about two years ago on the day that JAMES SEALE was arrested in Natchez, Mississippi, for taking a photograph of a local police official. Source named as being at the Silver Dollar Fishfry JAMES and JACK SEALE from Mississippi, who had three other individuals with them who were unknown to the source, one being the person previously referred to as owning the black Mustang and who was present when JAMES SEALE was arrested on the occasion mentioned above.

Extensive investigation of various Klansmen in the Natchez area has failed to develop anyone who had a black Mustang at the time.

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JN T-9 advised on April 13, 1967, that JAMES SEALE continues to reside in Meadville, Mississippi, and that he was formerly in the OKKKK, WKKKKOM, and the UKA.

JN T-10 advised on April 15, 1967, that he had heard nothing about JAMES SEALE from Meadville in many months. Months ago, someone at the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company was taking up a collection for SEALE as he supposedly was about to lose his car or something. The results of this solicitation were not known to the source.

JN T-11 advised on April 13, 1967, that he recognized a photograph exhibited to him of JAMES SEALE and identified him as a Klansman. He reported nothing further of pertinent value.

(8) T. L. TORGERSEN - She has known him three to five years, met him and his wife with TOMMIE LEE JONES and his wife at the Moose Lodge in Natchez, Mississippi. He has visited the GLOVER residence in Vidalia on occasions.

(9) MYRON WAYNE SEALE - Unknown

(10) JOE DANIEL HAWKINS - Unknown

(11) "BUCK" HORTON - a good friend of her and her husband. His family visited at the GLOVER residence in Vidalia frequently. His wife worked with her at the Ben Franklin Store in Natchez, Mississippi.

(12) TOMMIE LEE JONES - a good friend of her husband. She met him and his family at the Moose Hall in Natchez, Mississippi. He has visited the GLOVER residence in Vidalia, Louisiana, on occasions.

(13) L. C. MURRAY - Unknown

(14) JAMES E. BLANEY - Unknown

(15) O. C. POISSOT - Unknown

(16) ELDEN GLEN HESTER - a good friend of her husband who did live near Baskin, Louisiana. He and his family have visited the GLOVER residence in Vidalia, and the GLOVERs have visited at his residence near Baskin, Louisiana, on several occasions.

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(17) WALTER GENE HALL - Unknown

(18) DONALD HOLLAND - Unknown

(19) JAMES H. TAYLOR, JR. - She advised he lives "way out in Louisiana," and is a good friend of her husband. She has known him some four to five years. Her husband hired him to help them move to the Kentwood, Louisiana area as he had a commercial driver's license and could drive the "U-Haul It Truck."

(20) KENNETH NORMAN HEAD - a friend of the GLOVER family whom she has known some six to seven years. They have visited "back and forth" many times in the past.

(21) RAYMOND SCOTT WRIGHT - Unknown

(22) JEWEL LEE BURT - her uncle who resides near Fayette, Mississippi. She and her husband are not close to JEWEL LEE BURT and his family.

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CI advised that the person employed by the telephone company at Ferriday, Louisiana, who was probably involved in checking on FBI Agents at the Patricia Motel several months ago was O. C. HOUSE and not JOE WHEAT. Source stated that HOUSE is similar in appearance to WHEAT and is known to be secretly on the payroll of Sheriff NOAL CROSS of Concordia Parish, Louisiana. JOE WHEAT was a member of the Ferriday Unit of the OKKKK. HOUSE lives on the Doty Road in Ferriday, Louisiana.

Concerning packages taken across the river into Mississippi by the source, source related that he could not recall ever taking a package across into Mississippi other than the one he had previously mentioned, this being a bag of groceries that he and his wife took to Mrs. AVANTS. Source stated that he had been requested previously by JAMES SCAROBOROUGH of Ferriday, Louisiana, to take a package to JACK SEALE in Natchez; however, he did not do so when he found out the contents of the package was blasting caps.

Source stated that in viewing a picture of a group of individuals in Natchez, Mississippi, on September 18, 1965, the person in the photograph with the straw hat and glasses was known to him as R. B. SHARP of Deer Park, Louisiana. Source stated that SHARP is an elderly, well-to-do farmer, who is not known to have any Klan affiliation.

Source further referred to this same photograph and indicated that the person standing in the center with a blue plaid sports shirt was known to him as an individual who formerly worked in Natchez, Mississippi, for the Aetna Finance Company and who is now employed at the Arn strong Tire Plant. Source stated that he does not know the name of this person but knows he is a member of the Silver Dollar Group and was one of the unknown persons at the fishfry at

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the home of JAMES LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana, in June of 1965.

Source further viewed four color photographs and stated that the three photographs of a light blue GMC pickup truck with a cattle rack on the bed and bearing Louisiana license 583-332, was the truck belonging to the junkman. Source stated that the junkman is known to him as ELTON HESTER from Meadville, Mississippi. Source stated that the photograph of the man walking toward this pickup truck appeared similar in height, weight, and appearance to HESTER; however, he could not make a positive identification from this particular photograph.

Source advised that it is his personal impression that the junkman acquired his name due to the fact he was a person in the Klan who possessed explosives. Source stated he has heard several persons refer to the junkman as also being the scrapman. Source stated that R. J. GLOVER told him that the names were just nicknames and GLOVER did not provide any further details.

Source also related that he has heard members of the Silver Dollar Group refer to the junkman, these being SONNY TAYLOR, JAMES LEE, RED GLOVER and BLUE HOLLOWAY.

Concerning the fishfry at the home of JAMES LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana, on June 26, 1965, source stated that JAMES and JACK SEALE were present at this fishfry. When source was questioned further about the fishfry and in reference to what ingredients were used to make black powder, source stated that SONNY TAYLOR and JAMES LEE left the fishfry at one point in the truck of TAYLOR and subseauently returned with a large stick of dynamite, two empty dummy hand grenades, and two rolls of fise, one roll being dynamite fuse and the other was pink in color and similar in diameter to a cigarette. Source stated that the stick of dynamite was large, about two feet in length.

Source stated that JACK SEALE touched a match to the dynamite fuse and it slowly burned out, this being a section of about one foot cut from the roll. Later SEALE tried to put a match to the pink colored fuse and immediately TAYLOR told him that if he lit this fuse "We'd all be blown up."

Source stated that an attempt to make black powder was had by cutting up the dynamite, mixing the ingredients with charcoal, sulpher and borax. Source stated that this mixture was then placed in the dummy grenades with a dynamite fuse stuck in the end. This fuse was lit and the mixture did not explode. The ingredients of the black powder and the fuse were taken from the fishfry by GLOVER and source has not seen these items since that time.

Source stated that RED GLOVER has a girl friend in Vidalia, Louisiana, who works; with GLOVER at the Armstrong Tire Plant. This girl works as a panner at the plant and is known to be a widow. Source stated that the girl's name in unknown to him, however, he feels that GLOVER's wife knows about this girl friend as GLOVER has indicated to him that his wife has been receiving anonymous telephone calls about his association with this particular girl.

On Saturday, March 18, 1967, RED GLOVER came to the home of E. D. MORACE of Ferriday, Louisiana, at about 11:00 AM. GLOVER requested that MORACE ride with him to his recently purchased home in Kentwood, Louisiana, as he had to deliver a load of plywood and other lumber at this howee. MORACE and GLOVER left in the green For pickup truck of GLOVER and proceeded to Natchez, Missist ippi. GLOVER drove to the Highway 61 Bypass and stopped at the Barbecke Pit, a known hangout for Klansmen in the Natchez area. Here GLOVER and MORACE had lunch and GLOVER talked briefly with the operator of this Barbecke Pit, TINY, concerning the raffle of tires to provide money for the defense of the three Klansmen who are to go on trial shortly in Natchez, Mississippi.

GLOVER and MORACE left and proceeded toward Meadville, Mississippi. After traveling six or seven miles on the road to Meadville, GLOVER stopped briefly at a dairy located on the left-hand side of the road. MORACE questionned GLOVER about this stop and GLOVER told him that this was the dairy that the "higger" worked at who had recently caused a white boy to lose his job. MORACE stated that he did not want to fool with any "nigger" at that time and GLOVER stated that he did not desire to do anything at that time either. GLOVER made no mention as to whether he wanted to do anything in the future about this individual at the dairy.

GLOVER proceeded down the road another two to three miles and stopped at the home of JAMES SEALE.

SEALE and GLOVER, along with MORACE, held a conversation about the current FBI investigation of the bombing at Natchez, Mississippi. GLOVER and SEALE discussed the questions that the FBI were asking and SEALE stated that the worse enemy of any person is his mouth. SEALE and GLOVER then briefly talked about politics and SEALE gave GLOVER and MORACE a campaign card bearing a photograph of JAMES F. SEALE, who is running for sheriff and tax collector of Franklin County, Mississippi.

SEALE and GLOVER further decided that GLOVER should contact each individual in the Silver Dollar Group and advise him to keep his mouth shut. In particular, GLOVER stated that these persons should talk to the FBI only on the first visit of the FBI and then only to tell them necessary personal data type information. Any succeeding visit by the FBI, these persons should tell the Agents that they do not desire to talk and if the Agents have anything on them they should arrest them or leave the premises.

GLOVER further stated that he was very upset over the fact that T. L. TORGERSEN had told him that he had advised the FBI about the fishfry at JAMES LEE's house in Wildsville, Louisiana, in June of 1965. JAMES SEALE stated that he feels that the FBI wants to know all of the names of those present at the fishfry and both he and GLOVER feel that the FBI could then charge these persons with a conspiracy due to the fact that the dynamite, hand gernades and black powder were at this fishfry.

GLOVER stated that TORGERSEN and TOMMIE JONES were real close friends and that he was upset and disturbed at both of them, giving the impression shat either one might have talked too much to the FBI. GLOVER stated that since TORGERSEN has told the FBI about the fishfry, it would now not be necessary for the FBI to produce their informant. GLOVER stated that this is why we should not tell the FBI anything from now on. GLOVER further suggested that the Silver Dollar Group Should meet in groups of two or three at the most and should be very careful in whom they confided any pertinent information. GLOVER was definitely very mad at TORGERSEN and JONES and suggested that he would tell these two that they had better not speak any more about the fishfry and in particular had better not get any other persons involved with the FBI. GLOVER stated that he would tell these two that if they wanted to hang themselves it was okay with him but they better not involve anyone else. SEALE and GLOVER discussed no particular action taken by the Silver Dollar Group in the past, nor was there any mention of any activity planned. for the future. 2.24.5 建建建立管理

GLOVER and MORACE then proceeded to Kentwood; Louisiana, to drop off the lumber supplies at the home of This house is located on the main highway and GLOVER . has no other homes in the immediate area other than a house on the opposite side of the road about 400 to 500 yards away. Source stated this house is a rather typical farm house and GLOVER indicated he had recently acquired. this home. After unloading the lumber, GLOVER proceeded back toward Natchez, Mississippi.

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On the way MORACE inquired as to whether they should stop by at Meadville, Mississippi, and drink coffee with the scrapman. GLOVER thought this was a good idea and stopped at the home of the scrapman and a young son of the scrapman told GLOVER that his father was not home and indicated he may be visiting at the hospital in Meadville. GLOVER and MORACE proceeded to the hospital and when they could not find the truck of the junkman, GLOVER stated that probably he had not returned from work and, thus, they proceeded back toward Ferriday, Louisiana.

MORACE asked GLOVER if the junkman still had the explosives in his home. GLOVER merely stated that all had been taken care of and indicated that these explosives were not now in the home of the junkman; however, he offered no suggestion as to their present whereabouts.

Source also related that when JAMES SEALE and RED GLOVER were talking previously SEALE wanted GLOVER to make contact with LEEANDER PEREZ of Plaquemine Parish, Louisiana, concerning PEREZ making some bumper stickers captioned "Perez for Governor". GLOVER indicated that he would think about this but did not state he would definitely contact PEREZ.

Source advised that all the members of the Silver Dollar Group feel that RED GLOVER is the leader and inspirational force of this group. Even the Mississippi members have this same feeling, however, at one time JACK SEALE was thought to be the next in command under GLOVER. Source now has the impression that JAMES SEALE currently holds the next in command position. Source further stated that he had personally seen RED GLOVER give silver dollars to BUCK HORTON of Vidalia, Louisiana; E. D. MORACE of Ferriday, Louisiana; SONNY TAYLOR of Harrisonburg, Louisiana; and JAMES LEE of Wildsville, Louisiana.

Source stated that GLOVER and MORACE returned to Ferriday, Louisiana, at about 7:00 PM on March 18, 1967,
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GLOVER stating that he would be in touch with MORACE in the immediate future.

Mrs. JAMES SEALE who is employed at the Tower Loan Company, Franklin Street, Natchez, stopped SA CLARENCE G. PROSPERE at the Post Office, Natchez, Mississippi, at which time she advised that her husband, JAMES FORD SEALE, had been fired from his job at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where he was working as a welder. Mrs. SEALE stated that she and her husband felt that FBI Agents were responsible for her husband losing his job since the Agents came to his job in Baton Rouge on two occasions in an effort to interview JAMES SEALE. Mrs. SEALE stated that her husband had only recently gotten to the point where he felt he could be interviewed by Bureau Agents.

Mrs. SEALE pointed out that her husband had previously been arrested by FBI Agents and investigators of the Mississippi Highway Patrol on which occasion her husband had been mistreated. She stated for this reason her husband did not wish to be interviewed by Bureau Agents. Mrs. SEALE stated that through the efforts of her husband's brother, "JACK" SEALE, he had been persuaded to cooperate and talk to FBI Agents; however, after he had lost his job in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, he was again in the position where he did not wish to be interviewed by Bureau Agents.

JACK DAVIS, barber and constable at Roxie, Mississippi, was reminded of the identity of Special Agents, the nature of the investigation, and that any statement he might make could be used in court.

DAVIS indicated he was aware of his rights and stated he desired to cooperate in any manner possible. He stated that on the night of February 27, 1967, he had gone to Meadville, Mississippi, bumped into JAMES F. SEALE on the streets, and they had a cup of coffee at the City Cafe. They then went at 7:30 across the street to the Franklin County Court House where they at attended a meeting of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race until 8:30 p.m. or so. He stated he presumed he left the courthouse around 8:45 and thought that SEALE had left at that time and presumed he went home. He could not specifically recall whether or not Mrs. CLYDE SEALE was in her Volkswagon or with JAMES. He said he learned of the bombing and death of JACKSON the next morning when told by someone whose identity he did not recall, pointing out that he had not looked at TV or heard radio early that morning before opening his shop.

Description and background of DAVIS has previously been obtained, however, his license for his black Chevrolet truck is F/6-320815.

On February 26, 1967, the following members of the Bogalusa, Louisiana unit of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (WKKKKOM) travelled to Monticello, Mississippi, to receive instructions on the location of an alleged state meeting of the WKKKKOM: DEWITT MIZELL, PAUL COONE, SAXON FARMER and COLON WARNER.

These individuals arrived at the Monticello hospital parking lot at 1:30 PM where they were contacted by ROBERT WILSON, a state officer of the WKKKKOM. There was another vehicle containing four unknown white males at the parking lot. The description of this vehicle is not recalled. WILSON told the occupants of both cars to travel to MART SANDIFER's store located north of Jayess, Mississippi, where the meeting would be held.

The meeting began at approximately at 3:00 PM with wAs a total of 15 persons present. The meeting opened and /run by SAM BOWERS, the Imperial Wizard of the WKKKKOM. There was no set program and everyone there was invited to give a talk.

BOWERS talked for 30 to 45 minutes. His speech was religious in nature and it appears that BOWERS attempts to justify his actions through references to the bible and he appears to be a religious zealot. He told those present that if they believed in the Lord that nothing was impossible and that the Klan would be the eventual victors if everyone stuck together and believed in the Lord. BOWERS said that for the Klan to gain its objectives, it would be necessary to put pressure on the politicians in order that the politicians would keep working for the white people. He said that this pressure should be in the form of handbills, telephone calls, letters to local papers, etc.

During his talk, BOWERS was asked about the DAHMER case. BOWERS related that the FBI was not able to pin anything on him in the Dahmer case and as a result was attempting to implicate him in the "Neshoba County" case. BOWERS said that it was expected that the Grand Jury which was meeting in Jackson would report on their findings in both cases in the next day or so. BOWERS said that it is rumored that the FBI is not satisfied with the way their cases are going before the Grand Jury. BOWERS made no other comment.

ROBERT WILSON then gave a short speech similar in nature to that given by BOWERS. His talk had a religious connection and WILSON was introduced as "our secretary". WILSON said that if the members believed in the Lord nothing was impossible and all obstacles would be overcome. WILSON used the following expression throughout his talk, "me and the Lord make a majority".

SAXON FARMER gave strictly a political talk on the importance of getting politicians elected to office who would do the Klan the most good. He said that it would be necessary to attempt to get the politicians to work together instead of normally fighting each other.

Other persons gave short similar talks.

CLYDE SEALE was at this meeting and SEALE is a white male about 55 years of age. SEALE claimed he had a son, not further identified whom the FBI had assaulted in the past and that his son was presently running for Sheriff in the county in which they lived. He claimed this son is currently working on the Mississippi River bridge at Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He informed that "someone" not further identified, had started a Clyde Seale Foundation to raise money to help his son pay expenses of campaigning for Sheriff.

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ROBERT WILSON urged those in attendance to renew their subscriptions to the Southern Review newspaper at a cost of \$3.00. He said that in the near future, the cost of this newspaper would increase to \$5.00 per year.

There was another man who was present whose identity is unknown who stated that he was the "collection agency" for his Klan unit. He said that he had been successful in getting delinquent members to pay their back dues by harrassing them through phone calls to them in the early morning hours or personally visiting them at their residences.

A collection was taken up to help BYRON DE LA BECKWITH pay expenses in his political campaign. About \$15 was collected.

The following individuals were observed at this meeting:

SAM BOWERS, SAXON FARMER, PAUL COONE, COLON WARNER, DEWITT MIZELL, ROBERT WILSON,

MART SANDIFER,

There was no talk of violence at this meeting and the meeting concluded at about 5:00 PM.

DETAILS:

Characterizations of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR); Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK); United Klans of America, Incorporated (UKA); and White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), are included in the appendix of this report.

I. <u>RESIDENCE:</u>

On October 31, 1966, Sheriff WAYNE HUTTO, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, advised that JAMES FORD SEALE still resides at Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi.

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II. EMPLOYMENT:

On September 2, 1966, JN T-1 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE is no longer a welder with the Moran Tank Company, Natchez, Mississippi, and that now his brother, "JACK" SEALE, is attempting to gain employment at the Moran Tank Company.

On September 29, 1966, JN T-2 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE is working as a welder in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and commutes daily to his place of employment from his home in Franklin County, Mississippi. JN T-2 advised he did not know the name of the business where SEALE is employed in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

III. CURRENT POSITION IN ORGANIZATION:

On October 31, 1966, JN T-2 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE has at no time ever held an office in the UKA.

IV. AUTOMOBILES:

On october 31, 1966, Sheriff WAYNE HUTTO, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, advised that JAMES F. SEALE, Route 2, Box 94, Meadville, Mississippi, has the following 1966 Mississippi registrations for the vehicles indicated:

Sheriff HUTTO advised that he was presently in the process of selling 1967 Mississippi registrations, but that he had been unable to maintain a running index of the 1967 registrations and that he would be unable to check the 1967 registration of JAMES F. SEALE at this time.

V. ACTIVITIES OF SUBJECT:

On April 12, 1966, JN T-3 advised that on March 28, 1966, ERNEST GILBERT, Brookhaven, Mississippi, addressed a small group of people at an APWR meeting in Meadville, Mississippi, who are attempting to get a private school started. JN T-3 stated CLYDE SEALE, father of JAMES F. SEALE, has been elected president of this group and JACK DAVIS is the vice-president. The president and vice-president, together with JAMES F. SEALE and a fourth unknown individual, constitute the board of this school.

On May 11, 1966, JN T-4 advised that a rally of the UKA was held at the Liberty Ball Park, Natchez, Mississippi, on May 7, 1966. This rally began at 8:00 p.m. and terminated.at about 10:00 p.m. There were between 1500 and 1800 spectators present and approximately 70 robed Klansmen. The principal speakers at this rally were ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA; JACK HELM, New Orleans, Louisiana; and E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon, UKA, Realm of Mississippi.

Among those recognized as being present at this rally was JAMES SEALE and his wife.

On May 12, 1966, Deputy Sheriff KIRBY SHELL, Franklin County, Meadville, Mississippi, advised that there is no current Klan organization meeting in Franklin County to his knowledge. SHELL stated that JAMES F. SEALE, JACK DAVIS, WALTER GENE HALL, and one or two others, have started attending UKA meetings in the Natchez, Mississippi area.

SHELL advised that JAMES F. SEALE was currently working at the Moran Tank Company, Natchez, Mississippi.

On May 3, 1966, JN T-3 advised that JAMES FORD SEALE is currently employed by the Moran Tank Company in Natchez, Mississippi, and is spending his time endeavoring to raise money for a private school in Meadville, Mississippi.

On June 4, 1966, JN T-5 advised that a few months ago a collection was made at the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company for JAMES SEALE. Supposedly, SEALE was about to lose his home and car. JN T-5 stated that the collector, whom he did not know, walked up to the employees and handed them a typewritten note which inquired if they wanted to contribute to the SEALE collection.

On July 7, 1966, JN T-1 advised that JAMES SEALE of the Bunkley Community, Franklin County, Mississippi, has left the WKKKKOM and joined the UKA in Adams County under the influence of his brother, "JACK" SEALE. JN T-1 stated JAMES SEALE has quieted down considerably but still has a long way to go. This source stated there is no indication the WKKKKOM are meeting in Franklin County and that it is his belief that both the UKA and the WKKKKOM are both now defunct.

On July 29, 1966, L. L. "PETE" OGLESBY, Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, advised SA WILLIAM W. PRICE, JR., that he was born and raised in Franklin County, near Meadville, Mississippi. OGLESBY stated that when the Klan was first organized in Franklin County, several years ago, JAMES SEALE took him off in a car and invited him to join the Klan. OGLESBY stated he told SEALE he would not be interested in joining the Klan and thereafter nothing further was said to him about the Klan.

APPENDIX

AMERICANS FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE WHITE RACE (APWR)

The records of the Secretary of State, State of Mississippi, Jackson, Mississippi, reflect that the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) was granted a charter of incorporation on June 25, 1963, at Jackson, Mississippi. According to the charter of incorporation, this organization was formed for bettering the conditions and improving the welfare of the white race and to insure peaceful co-existence between the races of the South, maintaining law and order at all times and to provide for the general welfare of the physical, mental and moral condition of mankind, and to promote the cultural, social, literary and mental welfare of its members.

A source advised on August 9, 1966, that the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) is definitely not dominated by any Klan organization, is not a branch of any Klan organization and does not engage in violence. Many of the members of the APWR belong to various Ku Klux Klan organizations; however, only one of the national officers of the APWR is known to be a member of any Ku Klux Klan organization and no Ku Klux Klan organizational funds are designated or used by the APWR.

This source advised that the APWR is primarily concerned with providing private schools for the white children of Mississippi and is engaged in various money raising projects for this purpose. This source also noted that members of the Ku Klux Klan support the APWR by engaging in the money raising activities. Roland N. Scott, Natchez, Mississippi, continues as National President of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race.

ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (LOUISIANA) (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 25, 1963, that an organization known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) had been organized in the State of Louisiana at Shreveport, Louisiana, in December of 1960.

A second source advised on August 12, 1966, that the OKKKK continues to be active within the State of Louisiana, and that the aims and purposes of this organization continue to be to promote Americanism, the supremacy of the white race, and the furtherance of segregation between the races.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U.S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa. Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON. Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states).

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the national cifice was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on August 10, 1965, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not showing advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceled among the members that in the end force and violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Klex Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the state is divided into distriges and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as a August 10, 1966, of 800 to 1000 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. Sam H. Bowers, Jr., Laurel, Mississippi, continues to be the Imperial Wizard.

CARL SCHULTZ, US Dept. of Agriclture, Meadville, Miss. on 8/16/66 furnished the following information to the writer ma regarding matters set forth below:

)

BURNING OF THE TASTYE FREEZE, MEADVILLE, MISS., 8/11 or 12/66

GROVER NETTLES, a carpigenter who resides on Mile Branch Raod, and who is currently building a new house where the BASS house burned behind the courthouse in Meadville, on Sunday 8/14/66 told him that the day before the above burning JAMES SEALE contacted two relatives of his, Uncle JACK XM WACTOR, and AUNT MARY, who live across the highway from the Tasty Freeze and asked each if they had observed the people at the Tasty Freeze serving whites and negroes from the same window.

SCHULTZ, advised that NETTLES is mad at the Klan in that area due to a recent indident wherein some several hundred dollars worth of tools were stolen from him. He advised that NETTLES was recently building a home for the BASS couple who have been burned out on two occasions during the last year. After NETTLES had all the windows and doors on the BASS home he left all his tools in the house over a week-end. Only NETTLES, and the two BASS's had keys to the house and MR. BASS was away on a drilling rig. When NETTLES came back to work on Monday morning all his tools were gone. He knew (as does most of Meadville) that MRS. Bass has been having affairs with numerous men while her husband is out in the Gulf, went to several Klan members and told them he was carrying a gun and if he found any of his tools he intended to use it.

SCHULTZ advised that he feels certain NETTLES would furnish the same information to the FBI, but requested that his identity be conceled.

SEARCHED ALLANDERED 157-(KRK PRANKLIN CO.) SERIALIZED +157-950 (JAMES SEAL) 8 1966 1-157-(EARL HODGES) -JADKSON FBI-1- 157-BURNING OF TASTY FREEZE, HEADVILLE, BALT 150-

CROSS BURNING, Residence of ALFORD MORTON and EUGINA BREAZEALE EDDICETON, MISS.

SCHULTZ advised that on the night on May 9, 1966, when numerous crosses were burned across the state, onewas burned in the driveway of the **memaixkeen** rural home on ALFORD MORTON, age 75, who resides four or five miles east of Eddiceton on Highway 84. He advised that some few weeks after the Burning he heard that that cross was burned due to the fact that the 50 year old step-daughter of MORTON, EUCINA BREAZEALE, who is the Supervisor of Mursess at the Brookhaven, Hospital, had recently hired three or four negor girls as nurses aids and was actually allowing one or two of them to ride to work with her. The Klan had heard of this and burned the cross in front of the house in an effort to scare hor. He adv sed that MISS BREAZEALE followed the men in the car from her home to Mc Calls Creek, however he does not know if she was able to get a descripton of the car of the plate number.

SCHULTZ went to the MORTON residence after he heard of above and obtained the cross. It was observed by the writer on 8/16/66, is some 8 or 9 feet tall, made of green poplar poles, with a 14 inch by 24 inch base, it did not burn, and was very poorly constructed.

EARL HODGES MURDER

SCHULTZ advised that during the course of the FBI investigation of the above murder, one BOB STOREX, of Bude, Miss., left the Franklin County area, went up north where he stayed for some 8 or 9 months. He returned to the Natchez, Miss., area about two months ago, is now a **frameworkheavy** drinker, comes to the Bude-Meadville area on week-ends, and has been heard during his drunken stuper fix stating that he is going to be killed because of the EARL HODGES murder, that he may have to leave the area again, and many other comments about the HODGES murder, all while he is drunk. Before he left some 8 months ago he was a regular worker, who was not known to drink at all.

JOHN ISHEE, Miss. State Forrester, Roxie, Miss.

SCHULTZ advised that ISHEE recently told him that the boys from the Bunkley Klan had been to see him at the Roxie Fire tower, told him that when they needed that tower thay were prepared to take it for their own use, that they wanted to let him know ahead of time. ISHEE could not explain what they wanted with the tower and has not heard from them since, however he has started carrying a gun and advised SCHULTZ that no one from the Klan would get in the tower. For general information the following is reported regarding SCHULT2:

KIRBY SHELL, Deputy Sheriff, Franklin County, has advised the writer in the past the many people are concerned about the actions of SCHULTZ of late. Recently two very young boys came to the home of SCHULTZ selling magazines door to door. When they knocked at the home of SCHULTZ, SCHULTZ who was at home alone invited them in, told them to be seated, went into the other room got his shotgun and held in on the two boys for about two hours. His wife finally came home and talked him into letting the two boys go. On another occasio n recently SCHULTZ and another man were r ading the newspaper at the Cafe, got into an argument over something, much to the suprise of everyone SCHULTZ left the cafe, went home, got his shotgung came back to the cafe and for several minutes it appeared SCHULTZ was going to shot up the maxim entire cafe.

NATCHEZ RA, at Meadville contact GROVER NETTLES, obtain names of his relatives contacted by JAMES SEAL re the Tasty Freeze, interview for all details if so contacted. Consider neighborhood in vicinity of Tasty Freeze if not already conducted.

NATCHEZ RA, at Natchez contact BOB STOREY at garage where he is employeed (Known to SA PROSPERE)

NATCHEZ RA, at Roxie contact JOHN ISHEE re his statments a bout the Klan taking over the Roxie Fire Tower if needed.

On 7-25-66, L.L. (PETE) OGLESBY, MHSP, advised that he was born and raised in Franklin County, near Meadville, Miss., and that he has known HOWARD and DALE MCLEMORE all his life. HOWARD McLEMORE is considerably older than OGLESBY, but he has hunted and fished with him in the past. As a matter of fact HOWARD McLEMORE invited him to go deer hunting with him last year, but he did not go. OGLESBY said that he does not know if HOWARD McLEMORE is affiliated with the Klan, but that he suspects he is. He said that DALE McLEMORE "is a lot of fun", but that he has always figured he belongs to the Klan.

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OGLESBY said that when the Klan was first organized in Franklin County several years ago, JAMES SEALE took him off in a car and invited him to join the KLAN. He said he told SEALE he would not be interested in joining, and thereafter nothing further was said to him about the Klan.

OGLESBY said that since he has been stationed in Crystal Springs he had occasion to stop a car with one light, and found the car occupied by a light colored Negro boy known as "Hot Shot", and two other boys, all from the Meadville area. "Hot Shot" told OGLESBY that they had been run out of Meadville and that they were on their way to Chicago. "Hot Shot" said he did not know what they were accused of, but that they had been informed they had better not be in the Meadville area by that night. The boys would not tell OGLESBY who had run them off.

Mr. ROBERT KING, Route 2, Box 111, Meadville, Mississippi, was interviewed at the Franklin County Sheriff's Office and after being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents furnished the following signed statement:

> "June 9, 1966 Meadville, Miss.

"I, Robert King, Route 2, Box 111, Meadville, Mississippi, furnish the following information to Richard H. Hamilton and Benjaming F. Graves, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have been advised that this statement may be used in a court of law, and no threats or promises have been made to get me to make this statement.

"I was returning from Ned Weathersby, where I had had my tractor repaired, about 5 0'clock PM on Bunkley Road about 5 miles South of Highway 84. Mr. Bailey Odell, who was headed toward Bunkley, stopped on the right side of the road and crossed the road to my tractor to talk about his sister who he had just visited at the hospital.

"Odell was standing at the left rear wheel of my tractor, which was still running, when I saw a pickup truck, headed away from Meadville toward Bunkley, just an instant before it struck Odell. After the truck hit Odell it <u>swearved</u> and hit the left side of Odell's truck. Odell was knocked about 15 feet back of my tractor.

"The pickup truck stopped immediately and it was then that I recognized the driver as James Seales, who I have known for 20 years. Seales tried to call for an ambulance on his truck radio, but could get no answer and some individual in the area called for an ambulance on the telephone.

"Odell was taken to the Franklin County Hospital where he died several hours later.

"I cannot read and this statement was read to me by SA Hamilton. This statement is true to the best of my knowledge.

KING advised that he has known JAMES SEALE for twenty years and knows of no trouble in the past between SEALE and ODELL. He further advised that BAILEY ODELL was not active in civil rights activities in the Meadville area.

BERNICE BEASLEY, Mississippi Highway Safety Patrolman, was contacted at the Franklin County Sheriff's Office, Meadville, Mississippi. He advised he went to the scene where JAMES SEALE had been involved in an accident about 6:50 P.M. with Sheriff WAYNE HUTTO. He stated the accident occurred 5.1 miles south of Highway 84 on the Bunkley Road. This would be about six miles southwest of Meadville, Mississippi.

BEASLEY stated that SEALE, JIMMY DEAN BYRD, age 18, and ROBERT KING were at the scene when he and the Sheriff arrived. He stated SEALE told him he had been traveling south on the Bunkley Road in his 1965 Chevrolet truck at 60 to 65 miles per hour. When he was about to pass BAILEY ODELL, who was standing with his back to the road talking to ROBERT KING, Negro age 73, who was sitting on a tractor on the left side of the road, ODELL turned and stepped out into the side of his truck. ODELL's head hit the left end corner of the front windshield. He stated SEALE told him his truck then hit the left door of ODELL's truck which had been parked on the right side of the road.

BEASLEY stated JIMMY DEAN BYRD, who lives with ARCHIE PRATHER, in the Bunkley Community, was a passenger in SEALE's truck and he furnished substantially the same information regarding the accident as did JAMES SEALE, with the exception he stated SEALE was driving about 55 miles per hour.

BEASLEY furnished the following information regarding the ownership and description of the vehicle being driven by SEALE:

He furnished the following information regarding the ownership and description of the other truck at the scene:

BEASLEY stated that his investigation at the scene reflected that ROBERT KING's tractor was parked off the blacktop on the left side of the road facing north. ODELL's truck was parked on the right side of the road, facing south, a few feet south of the tractor and seven feet off the blacktop. This left twelve feet between the tractor and ODELL's truck. The road is nineteen feet wide. SEALE stopped his truck thirty-two steps from the point of impact. It was eighteen steps from the point where ODELL's truck was hit to where it stopped after rolling in a ditch on the right side of the road.

BEASLEY stated the only witnesses to the accident were ROBERT KING, JAMES SEALE and JIMMY DEAN BYRD.

WAYNE HUTTO, Sheriff, Franklin County, Mississippi, advised he received a phone call from the Meadville, Mississippi, Town Marshal at about 5:30 P.M., June 8, 1966, concerning an automobile accident in which JAMES SEALE of the Bunkley Community had been involved and in which the other party BAILEY ODELL, a Negro male, also of the Bunkley Community, had been seriously injured and taken to the Franklin County Hospital in Meadville. HUTTO advised he proceeded to the Franklin County Hospital to determine ODELL's condition and went from there to the scene of the accident on Bunkley Road with Mississippi Highway Safety Patrolman BERNICE BEASLEY.

HUTTO advised that from interviews with SEALE, JIMMY BYRD, a passenger in SEALE's vehicle, ROBERT KING, a witness to the accident, and his observations at the scene of the accident, he had reconstructed it in the following manner:

ODELL had stopped his 1963 Chevrolet pickup truck on the right hand side of Bunkley Road headed south, and had crossed the road on foot to talk with ROBERT KING, who had stopped his farm tractor on the other side of the road headed north. As JAMES SEALE, who was driving his 1965 Chevrolet pickup south on Bunkley Road, attempted to pass between KING's tractor and ODELL's truck, ODELL turned from his conversation with KING and stepped into the side of SEALE's truck. After SEALE's truck stuck ODELL he swerved to the right and collided with ODELL's truck, causing damage to the right front fender of his truck and damaging the left rear fender and left door of ODELL's truck. HUTTO advised he did not take any notes at the scene of the accident as Highway Patrolman BEASLEY had done so.

Scale told the source that as he passed the tractor, Balley Odell stapped into the side of his truck. This source learned mothing further regarding the accident from Scale.

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NAYNE HUTTO, Sheriff, Franklin County, Mississippi, advised he received a phone call from the Meadville, Mississippi, Town Marshal at about 5:30 P.M., June 8, 1966, concerning an automobile accident in which JAMES SHALE of the Bunkley Community had been involved and in which the other party BAILEY ODELL, a Negro male, also of the Bunkley Community, had been soriously injured and taken to the Franklin County Hospital in Meadville. HUTTO advised he proceeded to the Franklin County Hospital to determine ODELL's condition and went from there to the scene of the accident on Bunkley Road with Mississippi Highway Safety Patroless BERNICE BEASLEY.

HUTTO advised that from interviews with SEALE, JIMMY BYRD, a passenger in SEALE's vehicle, ROBERT KING, a witness to the accident, and his observations at the scene of the accident, he had reconstructed it in the following manner:

ODELL had stopped his 1963 Chevrolet pickup truck on the right hand side of Bunkley Road headed south, and had crossed the road on foot to talk with ROBERT KING, who had stopped his farm tractor on the other side of the road headed north. As JANES SEALE, who was driving his 1965 Chevrolet pickup south on Bunkley Road, attempted to pass between KING's tractor and ODELL's truck, ODELL turned from his conversation with KING and stepped into the side of SEALE's truck. After SEALE's truck stuck ODELL he swerved to the right and collided with ODELL's truck, causing damage to the right front fender of his truck and damaging the left rear fender and left door of ODELL's truck. BUTTO advised he did not take any notes at the scene of the secident as Righway Patrolman BEASLEY hed door so.

He stated the accident occurred 3.1 miles south of Highway 84 on the Bunkley Road. This would be about six miles southwest of Meadville, Mississippi.

BEASLEY stated that SEALE, JINNY DEAR BYRD, age 18, and ROBERT KING were at the scene when he and the Sheriff arrived. He stated SEALE told him he had been traveling south on the Bunkley Road in his 1963 Chevrolet truck at 60 to 65 miles per hour. When he was about to pass BAILEY ODELL, who was standing with his back to the road talking to ROBERT KING, Negro age 73, who was sitting on a tractor on the left side of the road, ODELL turned and stepped out into the side of his truck. ODELL's head hit the left end corner of the front windshield. He stated SEALE told him his truck then hit the left door of ODELL's truck which hed been parked on the right side of the road.

BEASLEY stated JIMMY DEAN BYRD, who lives with ARCHIE PRATHER, in the Bunkley Community, was a passenger in SEALE's truck and he furnished substantially the same information regarding the accident as did JAMES SEALE, with the exception he stated SEALE was driving about 55 miles per hour.
