Nrs. MARSHALL MARTIN, who admittedly uses her maiden name, MARSHALL FARIER, when working at motels and restaurants, was contacted at her residence, 515 Penick Street, Pineville, Louisiana.

EDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGAT

After being apprised of the official nature of the contact, she advised as follows:

She was employed at the Shamrock Motel,

Vidalia, Louisiana, for a short time ending just before school was out in the Spring of 1963. At that time, there was an elderly Negro porter, name unrecalled, employed there. She advised that the only registration clerks she could recall were VERA POWELL, CLARA DUNLAP, and a male night clerk, name unknown, who had portions of fingers on one hand missing.

She further stated that JOSEPH EDWARDS, as well as KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, HOMER "BUCK" HORTON, and RALEIGH J. "RED" GLOVER were unknown to her. She advised after viewing a photograph of JAMES GOSS, that he was unknown to her. Neither was she acquainted with any registration clerk by the name of IONA PERRY, who wore braces on her legs.

Mrs. MARTIN admitted having a personal dislike for a female registration clerk who claimed not to be part Negro. MARTIN said she requested a trustworthy deputy sheriff for Adams County, Mississippi, to ascertain whether her suspicions about this registration clerk were correct. When it was verified that this clerk had about ten children, half of whom were Negroes, she informed MIKE NC DONOUGH, the motel owner, of this fact. MARTIN said she quit her position when MC DONOUGH accused her of fabricating this allegation.

She stated that she did not compromise JOSEPH EDWARDS and she was unable to suggest anyone at the Shamrock who was capable of setting up EDWARDS for a date in order to trap him for punishment at the hands of racists. She stated that she knew of no members of a Klan-type organization.

Natchez. She has since remarried. Her former husband, CHARLES POWELL, works for the Holsum bread company in Natchez and he lives in a trailer (location unknown).

DORIS (last name unknown) - She was a waitress, had red hair, and her husband was in the service. She had three children. On one occasion, she disappeared for a month and it was later learned that she had gone to Lafayette, Louisiana, with some other man. Her sister works at the C & G Grocery in Vidalia, Louisiana.

DIANNE (last name unknown) - She worked at the switchboard in the coffee shop and helped out at the bar. She was formerly of Jonesville, Louisiana, . and presently works as a telephone operator in Natchez, Mississippi.

JOANN CROSS - She worked as a bookkeeper. Her husband is J. B. CROSS, 908 Corridor Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, telephone 336-5779.

WILEY BROWNE - He worked as a bookkeeper. He lives at 503 North Pearl Street, Natchez, Mississippi.

Mr. EDDIE B. KIMBLE, 715 Smith Lane, Natchez Mississippi, advised that he was formerly a porter at the Shamrock Motor Motel in Vidalia, Louisiana, but was not working at the motel at the time of the disappearance of JOSEPH EDWARDS, a colored porter who disappeared from the Shamrock Motor Motel during the Summer of 1965.

He said to the best of his knowledge, JOSEPH EDWARDS prior to his employment with the Shamrock Motor Motel, worked as a porter for the Albert Pick Motel in Natchez, Mississippi, and resided on Homochitto Street in Natchez.

KIMBLE stated he heard of EDWARDS' disappearance, but later heard EDWARDS had been located in jail in Vidalia, Louisiana. He stated he could not recall the source from whom he received his information.

During 1964, this coverage for the Shamrock Motel was placed with the South Carolina Insurance Company through the Agency Management Corporation, Florida Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

On June 27, 1964, a child, DAVID ANTHONY DODD, was drowned in a swimming pool at the Shamrock Motel. The parents of the child were L. B. DODD, Jr. and LAURA PHILLIPS DODD. At the time of the claim, the child's mother was married to HUBERT RUSHING, Route 1, Box 593, Yuma, Arizona.

Mr. SCHIELE stated that his files contained no other record of this matter other than the settlement check paid to the Laird Funeral Home, Natchez, Mississippi. He stated that the settlement was handled by the General Adjustment Bureau, now located in the Lewis Shopping Center, Natchez, Mississippi.

EASLEY advised that the Emergency Room Records of the Jefferson Davis Hospital contained the following information:

> Record Number 10057 shows that JOE EDWARDS, Box 53, Clayton, Louisiana, then 23 years of age, was treated by Dr. BENOIST on May 16, 1963 at 6:45 PM. This record shows that the patient was discharged.

Record Number 13092 shows that one JOE EDWARD, Clayton, Louisiana, was examined by a Dr. BENOIST at 2:30 AM on February 17, 1964. The diagnosis was shown as apparent Psychoneurosis. He was referred to Charity Hospital and discharged from Jefferson Davis Hospital.

Record shows that patient number 905396 is one JOE EDWARDS, 52 Oak Street, Natchez, Mississippi, then age 23 years, with telephone number 9448, and worked for the Albert Pick Motel. He was given medication, N A Luminal G R $\frac{11}{11} + M$.

He was treated by Dr. HENDERSON and advised to go to Dr. AMIS' office on April 18, 1964. EDWARDS card also had the notations: 98.2, 80, 20, and 140 80.

Mr. EASLEY advised that he had no other information identifiable with JOE EDWARDS.

Doctor E. L. MC AMIS, 103 Main Street, Natchez, Mississippi, advised that he has made a thorough search of the files of his office without finding any record pertaining to JOSEPH or JOE EDWARDS.

With regard to the emergency room treatment at the Jefferson Davis Hospital on April 16, 1964, by Doctor HENDERSON indicating that the patient was furnished sodium luminal and advised to go to Doctor MC AMIS on April 18, 1964, Doctor MC AMIS stated as follows.

Sodium luminal is given to patients for nausia or tension. It is not a pain killer and would not be given to the patient for any bone fractures. Apparently, the patient felt better and decided not to follow Doctor HENDERSON's advice to see Doctor MC AMIS on April 18, 1967, as there is no record of such a visit.

It indicates that EDWARDS purchased a yellow gold men's Sanford wristwatch (an item sold exclusively in Busch stores) for \$45.49 on May 2, 1959. It also indicates that EDWARDS purchased a Polaroid Land camera on June 8, 1959.

'On June 13, 1961, the account was turned over to Judge LUSCOMBE for collection. As of this date, \$103 plus interest is yet unpaid.

BARBARA WILCOXSON, Bookkeeper, Purvis Pontiac-Buick-Rambler, Inc., Ferriday, Louisiana, advised that the records of her office show that JOE EDWARDS, Box 53, Clayton, Louisiana, purchased a 1958 Buick, Serial Number 5E6018081, from that company on July 6, 1964. This vehicle was further described as a used car, four-door Sedan, eight

cylinder Buick. The amount of the sale was \$495, and was financed through the General Motors Acceptance Corporation, Alexandria, Louisiana.

This vehicle was sold to EDWARDS by their former salesman, FRED GRADES who is currently operating White's Appliance Store, Ferriday, Louisiana.

Mrs. WILCOXSON advised that her records show that this vehicle was again sold by their company on January 20, 1965, for \$150 cash to Mrs. JOHN LEWIS, Ferriday, Louisiana.

FLOYD BUFORD, 720 6th Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, Tow Truck Driver and Mechanic for Purvis Pontiac-Buick-Rambler, Inc., stated that he recalls towing a 1958 Buick which had been abandoned on the Vidalia--Ferriday Highway sometime during 1964. He stated that he recalled this vehicle because it was

one sold by his company a short time prior, and recalls that it was later sold to JOHN LEWIS of Ferriday.

BUFORD stated that at the time he hooked his tow truck to the abandoned Buick, the highway had not been enlarged, and it was a single lane in each direction. He is of the opinion that the car was headed toward Ferriday, but he could not be absolutely certain of this fact. The car was not on the bowling alley parking lot, but was merely pulled off the side of the road. He does not recall the exact location of the car, nor whether it was in fact near the bowling alley.

He advised that to the best of his recollection, there were no broken windows on the car, all the tires were inflated, and he observed no blood in or on the vehicle. He made no attempt to determine whether the vehicle was in a running condition.

In order to prevent damage to the transmission, he towed the vehicle backwards. In order to prevent the front wheels from turning, the steering wheel was tied in the center with a rope.

BUFORD stated that JOSEPH EDWARDS is unknown to him and he has no information indicating the circumstances for the car being abandoned.

HAMMETT stated that MORALES is half Mexican and half Negro and resides across the railroad tracks a short distance from the bowling alley. He has no recollection of having observed any unusual activity in the bowling alley or on the parking lot, nor any abandoned white over green 1958 Buick towed away from the area during July, 1964.

Sheriff RICHARD C. (J. Y.) MC GUFFEE, Catahoula Parish, Louisiana, advised that he had a vague recollection that soon after he took office as the sheriff in May, 1964, that someone brought some substance to the sheriff's office that this person had found while fishing.

Sheriff MC GUFFEE advised that there was no reason to believe that this suspect substance was anything but an animal carcass.

Sheriff MC GUFFEE said he was unable to locate any records pertaining to the incident and he had no recollection of the final disposition of the matter although he believes he referred the material or information to the Sheriff of Concordia Parish, which agency had jurisdiction over the area where the material was found.

Sheriff MC GUFFEE made available Deputy Sheriff SHELBY BEASLEY whom the sheriff indicated had personally handled the matter.

The following investigation was conducted by SA MERRIMAN D. DIVEN on August 11, 1967, in Vidalia, Louisiana:

Deputy Sheriff WAYNETTA COCKRAN advised that the ... Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office had no record pertaining to any report from the Catahoula Parish Sheriff's Office sending matter suspected of being fleshlike to the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office. Neither was she able to locate any record of this material being found by MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH nor an arrest of BOOTH on a charge of trespassing based on a complaint by "JUGHEAD" JONES.

Deputy Sheriff D. W. CLARK, Jailor of the Concordia Parish Jail, stated that he had no record pertaining to the arrest of MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH, but he recalled that about two or three years ago the sheriff and some deputies acted on a report of BOOTH's finding of this material, but apparently the investigation was concluded with negative results.

Deputy Clerk PATSY FUGLER, Clerk of Court, Concordia Parish, advised that she could find no record of

the arrest of MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH either during 1962 or 1964. Miss FUGLER advised that while records were maintained by the former Clerk of the Court, no indexing of these records had been made prior to 1966.

WILLIAM L. KOERBER, Attorney, 309 Texas Street, advised that he has represented MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH in connection with numerous minor legal difficulties. KOEREER stated that there is a record showing a letter to "JUGHEAD" JONES making reference to an arrest of BOOTH on a charge of trespassing on October 5, 1962.

MILTON BOOTH, generally known as "ODIE" BOOTH, was contacted at his place of business, a commercial fish store located under the bridge in Harrisonburg.

After being apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the official nature of the contact, BOOTH advised as follows:

He, his brother (OTIS "TUCKER" BOOTH), JAMES WEEKS, and JESSIE WEEKS were dragging a fish seine across a body of water at Deer Park, Louisiana, which he refers to as Deer Park Lake, when the net became snagged on some large object. He was beginning to dive down and untangle the net when one of the other men gave the net a great tug. The object, believed by him to be a refrigerator or steel drum, apparently turned over and a large air bubble about four feet in diameter broke the surface. Large balls of material which appeared to be "dingy" or dark brown flesh surfaced with this bubile. Immediately a terrible sickening stench came from the area. He estimated that collectively this material would have weighed approximately eight pounds.

Since the net was free and the stench was so

sickening, they moved from the area but not before they took a sample of the "dingy" material. He later furnished this material to the sheriff's office located in his home town. BOCTH stated that he took this action because in his opinion the material was human flesh. He has not heard the results of the investigation, if any, of the material.

BOOTH stated that he would point out the spot where this incident took place as soon as he could deliver some fish to FRANK DE LAUGHTER's Chicken Shack Restaurant in Clayton, Louisiana.

En route to Deer Park, Louisiana, BOOTH statedthat he recalled that he discovered the material about one month after he was arrested for cutting a fence which blocked his usual path to the body of water in Deer Park. He advised that he was arrested on the complaint of "JUGHEAD" JONES a few days before the squirrel season of 1964, which he believed started on October 2. After his arrest he called the district attorney of the parish, who talked with Sheriff NOAH CROSS. CROSS became angry and refused to let him call his wife. BOOTH obtained the services of WILLIAM L. CORBIN (phonetic) of Vidalia, Louisiana, and the charge was withdrawn.

At Deer Park, BOOTH pointed out a spot north of "JUGHEAD" JONES' boat landing. He estimated that the object on which his net became entangled was about 140 feet from the shore line at low water from a point on the shore presently located between a float mounted on drums and a tree leaning in the water. BOOTH explained that the incident occurred when the water was very low and at the present time, when the water was high, this object would be about 175 to 180 feet from the water's edge instead of 140 feet as it was at the time of the discovery. Furthermore, the water was about 14 feet deep at that time and now it would be approximately 26 feet deep at the point where the

object is located.

BOOTH stated that he could go within two feet of the object if he had a boat as he had a reference point on the shore. He further advised that he has Johnson air pumps for diving and would assist the FBI in an attempt to investigate the object.

JAMES WEEKS was contacted at the fish market of his brother-in-law, MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH, located near the bridge in Harrisonburg, Louisiana.

WEEKS stated that a few summers ago, he had been seining with his brother-in-law, ODIE BOOTH, and a few other men in the waters adjacent to Jughead's Place in Deer Park, Louisiana.

The seine had been placed near the west boundary of the channel. The seine became entangled and efforts to free the seine resulted in turning over a heavy object in the water. A water bubble then appeared on the surface. An odious putrifying stench was then detected. Bits and balls of matter which appeared to be black in color then appeared on the surface of the water.

BOOTH advised that his records reflect that he purchased the car on October 14, 1964. BOOTH advised that it is his wife's opinion that BOOTH discovered the flesh between October 14 and 25, 1964.

MILTON "ODIE" BOOTH, commercial fisherman, who found the flesh-like matter during the latter part of 1964, advised that the depth of the river where the diving operations were made on the preceeding day had receded about one foot during the night. He expects that the water will continue to fall and after two or three weeks, the depth at the spot where his net tangled with a submerged object will be approximately the depth it was at that time, about fourteen feet.

BOOTH advised that the river was part of the old Mississippi River but the northern end was blocked off when the river was straightened. Water enters the old part of the river from its southern connection with the Mississippi River and, therefore, the old river has little current capable of sweeping a heavy object like a refrigerator cabinet along the bottom. Furthermore, with the water lower, boat traffic will stir the bottom with the result of a reduction in silt.

WHARBOM summaries beginning on 8/11/67, called to your attention the JOSEPH EDWARDS case. The WHARBOM summary teletype on 8/14/67, reported the discovery of a catch of which appeared to be human flesh by MILTON BOOTH, a commercial fisherman, in Deer Park Lake, Concordia Parish, Louisiana.

The interview with BOOTH by Bureau Agents strongly indicated that BOOTH did encounter a sealed container of some type which apparently contained human remains. BOOTH is convinced that he can show us precisely the area where this incident occurred even though this was probably in October, 1964. We feel that there is considerable merit in examining the lake in the vicinity where the action occurred for the purpose of determining if there are any skeletal remains.

Local authorities have never investigated this situation. Concordia Parish authorities only attempted to churn up the floating material so that it would not attract undue attention. This is about all that could be expected of the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office. Time wise, if JOSEPH EDWARDS' body had been placed in an old refrigerator or barrel as we suspect and submerged in Deer Park Lake, it would have attained a state of decay BOOTH described by the time the incident occurred in Deer Park, Lake.

We have made a survey to determine what expenses would be entailed in arranging for scuba divers to work the lake bottom. We have located a diving team and have been assured of MILTON BOOTH's cooperation and assistance for relatively nominal expenses. We feel that the operation would probably require less than one day's diving and entail an expenditure of less than \$200, probably considerably less. If the Bureau agrees and will authorize this expenditure of up to \$200 to make a survey of the lake bottom in Deer Park Lake, Louisiana, it could be done on Thursday, August 24,

1967. This is the first date the divers will be free from their normal business responsibilities and able to assist us.

In view of the importance of establishing the corpus delecti in the EDWARDS case, we feel that this diving should be done. It could be handled very inconspicuously, but if we do effect a recovery, the activity could be a matter of considerable public interest.

It is recommended that the Bureau authorize us to proceed with the diving program outlined above and to incur up to \$200 expenses for this purpose.

FULLER was head of the Klan Bureau of Investigation (KBI) of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) in Louisiana during the period around July, 1964. FULLER had previously been head of the KBI of the OKKKK when ROYAL YOUNG of the Shreveport, Louisiana, area was the head of the OKKKK in the Fall of 1963, and when ROYAL YOUNG was deposed from his position of leadership around January, 1964, FULLER continued on as head of the KBI of the OKKKK through 1964, during which period MURRAY MARTIN, Winnsboro, Louisiana; GRADY WILDER, Jena, Louisiana; HENRY IRVING BAYLES, West Monroe, Louisiana; and ROBERT FULLER, were leaders of the OKKKK.

He advised that this was the address of ALBERT BROWN, who, he believed, is the brother-in-law of PAULINE BROWN, but stated he had not seen PAULINE BROWN nor ALBERT BROWN in the Monroeville area for several days.

The following investigation was conducted by SA GEORGE F. BENZ and SA WILLIAM B. WOOD on October 25, 1967:

Reverend J. N. SCANLON, 503 Texas Avenue, Vidalia, Louisiana, advised that the last address he had for PAULINE BROWN was 5B-Z Johngasee, 2613 Vienna, Austria.



Mrs. LANE L. NUNNERY, 1211 Peach Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, advised that PAULINE BROWN is married to her

brother, CHARLES BROWN, and that PAULINE BROWN is back in the United States and living with CHARLES BROWN again. She provided the following address:

JULIUS KNOTTS, 723 Morgan Avenue, Morgantown, advised that he did not know the present whereabouts of HUBERT RUSHING. KNOTTS stated that WHITE knows the address of HUBERG's sister, MONET (LNU), and that MONET (LNU) should have the present address of HUBERT RUSHING.

SIDNEY MURRAY, Mayor of Vidalia, Louisiana, was apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

Mayor MURRAY stated he had no knowledge concerning JOSEPH EDWARDS until he was recently contacted by TATE POOLE for information concerning POOLE's date of termination with the Police Department. POOLE told him that he needed the information in connection with an inquiry by the FBI into the disappearance of EDWARDS.

MURRAY stated he considered the incident of EDWARDS' disappearance very strange in that no information concerning the matter came to his attention until three years later. JOHNNIE "BUD" SPINKS, the Marshal of the Town of Vidalia, did not report on the matter at any time until one day last week when SPINKS told him of his recent interview by Special Agents of the FBI. MURRAY stated that SPINKS seemed very concerned over the inquiry. The Mayor stated that SPINKS was currently hospitalized and it was the Mayor's opinion that his illness, to a large degree, was a result of SPINKS' concern regarding the FBI's investigation in the EDWARDS case.

MURRAY was unable to give any specific basis for this belief except that SPINKS' attitude at that time was very different from his usual demeanor.

The Mayor was unable to furnish any information about the specific manner in which the Vidalia patrol cars were equipped with regard to the emergency lights. He advised that the town has been leasing vehicles from McPhail Motors, Natchez, since 1962 or 1963. He advised that he would order the City Clerk to make available to the FBI all records concerning the patrol cars and the personnel of the Police Department.

JOHN LEWIS, 408 North Fifth Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, was contacted at that address and advised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

He advised that he purchased a 1958 white over green Buick, four-door sedan, from Purvis Motors, Ferriday, about January or February, 1965.

He noticed nothing unusual about the car, nor had he heard anything about the prior owner of the vehicle. He noticed no bloodstains in or on the car at the time he purchased it.

All the windows were in good condition until a storm broke off a limb from a tree over his driveway which smashed the windshield of the car.

During December, 1966, he sold the Buick for \$100 to a young white man by the name of SMITH from Columbia, Louisiana. He was unable to furnish any additional information about the vehicle or the successive owner.

When queried regarding any of these individuals having ownership of a white Oldsmobile with two whip antennae mounted on the rear fenders, WEST advised that the car previously owned by JAMES SEALE was a white Oldsmobile which had whip antennae mounted on the trunk deck. She stated that SEALE owned this Oldsmobile prior to his current car which she believes is a blue Ford. WEST advised that JAMES SEALE's wife currently drives a white Oldsmobile with a Citizens Band radio antennae mounted on the roof.

Mr. HOMER THOMAS HORTON, also known as "Buck", 713 Lynn Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, after being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents, was furnished a "Your Rights" waiver form which was read and understood by HORTON. HORTON advised that he understood his rights

but did not care to sign the waiver form; however, he would be willing to discuss matters of interest to interviewing Agents, at which time he volunteered the following information:

HORTON advised he considered joining the Ku Klux Klan in either December of 1964 or 1965, exact year unrecalled, because he thought it would be a money-making proposition. HORTON stated he attended only two or three meetings acting in the capacity as a guard, however, never actually attended any of the meetings. HORTON stated he never took the oath of the klan and shortly thereafter, realizing no money could be made, he discontinued attending any meetings and has not attended any type of klan activity since.

When queried as to more specifics with regard to membership and attendance of any individuals meeting, HORTON stated he did not desire to discuss this particular matter any further.

HORTON, after being asked if he was knowledgeable of any incident of violence or foul play directed toward JOSEPH EDWARDS, stated he had never heard of this nor was he acquainted with JAMES GOSS. HORTON stated that the only interracial incident of which he was knowedgeable involved a Negro male who was apparently caught in the room of a white female at the Maple Courts Motel in Vidalia, however, did not know anything about what happened to either of the individuals involved.

When queried as to the bombing of WHARLEST JACKSON, HORTON stated he was aware of an intensive investigation being conducted by the FBI but was not cognizant as to who may have been responsible for the bombing. HORTON, when asked if he was acquainted with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, advised he had ridden to work at the Armstrong plant with GLOVER for two years in GLOVER's pickup truck and was a very close friend of GLOVER, as well as KENNETH HEAD. HORTON advised he knew both men well, and for a long time, however, was not able to furnish any information pertaining to their personal interests or activities. HORTON advised that in his estimation, both individuals were fine people and could not believe that they would act or engage in any form of violence. HORTON advised he was not aware of any clubs or organizations such as the Ku Klux Klan to which these individuals may belong.

When queried as to his knowledge of the Silver Dollar Group or its membership, HORTON stated he had never heard of the Silver Dollar Group or the Silver Dollar Club or any individuals who may be members. When asked if he carried a silver dollar, HORTON stated that the only silver dollar he knows of is one that his wife had several years ago.

When asked about attending a fish fry at the residence of FRED LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana, during June of 1965, HORTON advised he did attend this fish fry as well as many other fish fries. He advised that he and his family were at the LEE fish fry for a period of two to three hours, at which time they left, which, to the best of his recollection, was in the midafternoon.

HORTON denied any participation in an alleged attempt to manufacture and detonate any explosives.

HORTON, when asked if he had ever heard of an organization called the Minutemen, stated that the only time he had come across information regarding the Minutemen was through a newspaper



article he had read about a year ago in New Orleans. He advised he knows of no efforts to establish a Minutemen group in the Vidalia area.

RYLES, when queried as to any knowledge he may

have concerning JOSEPH EDWARDS, advised that he was unfamiliar with EDWARDS or anything about the person or the incident involving the disappearance of EDWARDS. RYLES stated he had never heard of EDWARDS nor does he recall ever seeing the Buick driven by EDWARDS at the time of his disappearance abandoned on the Vidalia - Ferriday highway.

RYIES advised that he is not presently a member of the Ku Klux Klan and when asked if he ever was, RYLES stated only that he is not a present member.

RYLES advised that any information he may have pertaining to the klan would be of the past and of no use to the FBI.

RYLES, when asked if he had ever heard of the Minutemen organization, stated he had only gained information regarding its activities through newspaper articles. He was not aware of any pistol and rifle club being recently chartered in the Ferriday - Vidalia area, adding that he has little cause for rifle and shotgun use because of a shoulder injury.

Special Agents, en route from Ferriday, Louisiana, to Natchez, Mississippi, recognized the 1959 blue and white Ford station wagon belonging to KENNETH NORMAN HEAD disabled along Highway 68, outside of Vidalia, Louisiana. After

stopping to make inquiry as to whether the owner was HEAD, KENNY SCAROBOROUGH identified himself as the owner, advising that he had purchased the automobile approximately one week ago from HEAD for \$50.00.

SCAROBOROUGH advised he was the son of JAMES SCARO-BOROUGH and stated that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD had been laid off from his job at International Paper Company and was presently working offshore. SCAROBOROUGH stated he did not know where HEAD is presently employed.

SCAROBOROUGH advised he was aware of the FBI's interest directed toward his father and HEAD, and expressed a vehement dislike for the FBI and its investigative purposes. He refused to furnish any information in addition to the above.

Mrs. ANN CURLEE, Secretary, Louisiana Department of Revenue, was recontacted at her place of employment, advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the investigation being conducted, at which time she furnished the following information:

CURLEE stated that she was formerly employed at the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office and terminated her employment to obtain a Civil Service job with the State Department of Revenue. CURLEE advised that while employed at the Sheriff's Department, she was the only female employed there and acted in the capacity of a radio dispatcher.

She stated that during her tenure, she recalls receiving a 10-28 (Request for Vehicle Owner Registration) for an abandoned vehicle located at the bowling alley between Vidalia and Ferriday, and was to have the car towed to Beatty's Gulf Service. CURLEE advised that she could not recall the car being registered to a JOSEPH EDWARDS but to the best of her recollection, believes the car was registered to (First Name Unknown) GRAVENBURG.

CURLEE advised that since last contacted, she had gone over to the Sheriff's Office and searched for her radio logs and further details which she believed were retained by the Sheriff's Department. However, she was unable to locate the records.

CURLEE advised that various Deputies, namely, BILL OGDEN, FRANK DELAUGHTER and IKE COWEN were friendly with members of the Ku Klux Klan and they would often imply through conversations overheard by CURLEE that they were involved in racial matters. CURLEE stated that she was unable to recall anything specific in terms of particular incidents or individuals involved.

CURLEE, when queried as to any conversations overheard pertaining to the JOSEPH EDWARDS case, was unable to recall anything in particular but vaguely remembers general talk regarding the disposition of EDWARDS. CURLEE reiterated that if anyone had something to say, it would probably include OGDEN, COWEN or DeLAUGHTER.

When asked about any white 1964 unmarked vehicles utilized by the Sheriff's Office, CURLEE advised that the only automobiles she could recall that were white and unmarked were a Dodge sedan driven by RAYMOND KEATHLEY and a personally owned automobile driven by JUNIOR HAYS, described as a late model white Oldsmobile. CURLEE stated that when HAYS commenced employment with the Sheriff's Office, he sold the car to the department and it was equipped with a police radio. CURLEE was unable to recall whether the car had one or two whip antennae, but it did not have a light mounted on the roof of the car. She stated that she believed the Sheriff's Office would furnish dashboard-mounted beacon lights for emergency use.

Deputy Sheriff BILL OGDEN, Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office, advised that he had not recalled any additional information since he was last interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI concerning the disappearance of JOSEPH EDWARDS.

He stated that he believes that his only contact

with EDWARDS was at the side of the Shamrock Motel swimming pool when a Negro believed by him to be EDWARDS was involved in recovering the body of an infant who drowned in the pool.

OGDEN stated that to his knowledge, he has had no other contact with EDWARDS.

With regard to EDWARDS' vehicle, which was abandoned near the bowling alley on the Vidalia - Ferriday highway, OGDEN stated he radioed for a 10-28 (a radio request for a license records check for the identification of the owner) and was advised that the owner was listed as (First Name Unrecalled) GRAVENBURG. He stated he makes numerous requests for 10-28's but the only reason he recalls this particular one was because GRAVENBURG was a former Louisiana State police officer whom he disliked. OGDEN stated he did not inspect the car. He is of the opinion that the car had a flat tire at the time and was parked in a bend in the road between the Plaza Club and the bowling alley.

He directed that Beatty's Gulf Station tow the vehicle in. Subsequently, Purvis Motors, Ferriday, claimed the vehicle.

OGDEN denied any knowledge of an incident where he chased a Negro over the levee in the vicinity of the bowling alley or anywhere else.
