Investigation in the WHARBOM case has determined that the subject was employed at the Shamrock Motel, Vidalia, La., and resided in Clayton, La., at the time of the disappearance. His abandoned automobile was found in Ferriday, La.

Since the principal suspects in this case are SDG members under investigation in the WHARBOM matter already, this case will be coordinated with WHARBOM. New Orleans is origin. An initial report will be submitted promptly.

Local authorities have never investigated this situation. Concordia Parish authorities only attempted to churn up the floating material so that it would not attract undue attention. This is about all that could be expected of the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office. Time wise, if JOSEPH EDWARDS' body had been placed in an old refrigerator or barrel as we suspect and submerged in Deer Park Lake, it would have attained a state of decay BOOTH described by the time the incident occurred in Deer Park Lake.

We have made a survey to determine what expenses would be entailed in arranging for scuba divers to work the lake bottom. We have located a diving team and have been assured of MILTON BOOTH's cooperation and assistance for relatively nominal expenses. We feel that the operation would probably require less than one day's diving and entail an expenditure of less than \$200, probably considerably less. If the Bureau agrees and will authorize this expenditure of up to \$200 to make a survey of the lake bottom in Deer Park Lake, Louisiana, it could be done on Thursday, August 24, 1967. This is the first date the divers will be free from their normal business responsibilities and able to assist us.

In view of the importance of establishing the corpus delecti in the EDWARDS case, we feel that this diving should be done. It could be handled very inconspicuously, but if we do effect a recovery, the activity could be a matter of considerable public interest.

It is recommended that the Bureau authorize us to proceed with the diving program outlined above and to incur up to \$200 expenses for this purpose.



FULLER was head of the Klan Bureau of Investigation (KBI) of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) in Louisiana during the period around July, 1964. FULLER had previously been head of the KBI of the OKKKK when ROYAL YOUNG of the Shreveport, Louisiana, area was the head of the OKKKK in the Fall of 1963, and when ROYAL YOUNG was deposed from his position of leadership around January, 1964, FULLER continued on as head of the KBI of the OKKKK through 1964, during which period MURRAY MARTIN, Winnsboro, Louisiana; GRADY WILDER, Jena, Louisiana; HENRY IRVING BAYLES, West Monroe, Louisiana; and ROBERT FULLER, were leaders of the OKKKK.

SIDNEY MURRAY, Mayor of Vidalia, Louisiana, was apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

Mayor MURRAY stated he had no knowledge concerning JOSEPH EDWARDS until he was recently contacted by TATE POOLE for information concerning POOLE's date of termination with the Police Department. POOLE told him that he needed the information in connection with an inquiry by the FBI into the disappearance of EDWARDS.

MURRAY stated he considered the incident of EDWARDS' disappearance very strange in that no information concerning the matter came to his attention until three years later.

JOHNNIE "BUD" SPINKS, the Marshal of the Town of Vidalia, did not report on the matter at any time until one day last week when SPINKS told him of his recent interview by Special Agents of the FBI. MURRAY stated that SPINKS seemed very concerned over the inquiry. The Mayor stated that SPINKS was currently hospitalized and it was the Mayor's opinion that his illness, to a large degree, was a result of SPINKS' concern regarding the FBI's investigation in the EDWARDS case.

MURRAY was unable to give any specific basis for this belief except that SPINKS' attitude at that time was very different from his usual demeanor.

The Mayor was unable to furnish any information about the specific manner in which the Vidalia patrol cars were equipped with regard to the emergency lights. He advised that the town has been leasing vehicles from McPhail Motors, Natchez, since 1962 or 1963. He advised that he would order the City Clerk to make available to the FBI all records concerning the patrol cars and the personnel of the Police Department.

JOHN LEWIS, 408 North Fifth Street, Ferriday, Louisiana, was contacted at that address and advised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

He advised that he purchased a 1958 white over green Buick, four-door sedan, from Purvis Motors, Ferriday, about January or February, 1965.

He noticed nothing unusual about the car, nor had he heard anything about the prior owner of the vehicle. He noticed no bloodstains in or on the car at the time he purchased it.

All the windows were in good condition until a storm broke off a limb from a tree over his driveway which smashed the windshield of the car.

During December, 1966, he sold the Buick for \$100 to a young white man by the name of SMITH from Columbia, Louisiana. He was unable to furnish any additional information about the vehicle or the successive owner.

but did not care to sign the waiver form; however, he would
be willing to discuss matters of interest to interviewing
Agents, at which time he volunteered the following information:

Klan in either December of 1964 or 1965, exact year unrecalled, because he thought it would be a money-making proposition.

HORTON stated he attended only two or three meetings acting in the capacity as a guard, however, never actually attended any of the meetings. HORTON stated he never took the oath of the klan and shortly thereafter, realizing no money could be made, he discontinued attending any meetings and has not attended any type of klan activity since.

When queried as to more specifics with regard to membership and attendance of any individuals meeting, HORTON stated he did not desire to discuss this particular matter any further.

HORTON, after being asked if he was knowledgeable of any incident of violence or foul play directed toward JOSEPH EDWARDS, stated he had never heard of this nor was he acquainted with JAMES GOSS. HORTON stated that the only interracial incident of which he was knowedgeable involved a Negro male who was apparently caught in the room of a white female at the Maple Courts Motel in Vidalia, however, did not know anything about what happened to either of the individuals involved.

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When queried as to the bombing of WHARLEST JACKSON, HORTON stated he was aware of an intensive investigation being conducted by the FBI but was not cognizant as to who may have been responsible for the bombing. HORTON, when asked if he was acquainted with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, advised he had ridden to work at the Armstrong plant with GLOVER for two years in GLOVER's pickup truck and was a very close friend of GLOVER, as well as KENNETH HEAD. HORTON advised he knew both men well, and for a long time, however, was not able to furnish any information pertaining to their personal interests or activities. HORTON advised that in his estimation, both individuals were fine people and could not believe that they would act or engage in any form of violence. HORTON advised he was not aware of any clubs or organizations such as the Ku Klux Klan to which these individuals may belong.

When queried as to his knowledge of the Silver Dollar Group or its membership, HORTON stated he had never heard of the Silver Dollar Group or the Silver Dollar Club or any individuals who may be members. When asked if he carried a silver dollar, HORTON stated that the only silver dollar he knows of is one that his wife had several years ago.

When asked about attending a fish fry at the residence of FRED LEE in Wildsville, Louisiana, during June of 1965, HORTON advised he did attend this fish fry as well as many other fish fries. He advised that he and his family were at the LEE fish fry for a period of two to three hours, at which time they left, which, to the best of his recollection, was in the midafternoon.

HORTON denied any participation in an alleged attempt to manufacture and detonate any explosives.

HORTON, when asked if he had ever heard of an organization called the Minutemen, stated that the only time he had come across information regarding the Minutemen was through a newspaper

article he had read about a year ago in New Orleans. He advised he knows of no efforts to establish a Minutemen group in the Vidalia area.

The following description of HORTON was obtained through observation and interview:

Mr. HEZZIE RYLES, Barber, Ferriday Barber Shop, Louisiana Avenue, Ferriday, Louisiana, after being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the investigation being conducted, furnished the following information:

RYLES, when queried as to any knowledge he may have concerning JOSEPH EDWARDS, advised that he was unfamiliar with EDWARDS or anything about the person or the incident involving the disappearance of EDWARDS. RYLES stated he had never heard of EDWARDS nor does he recall ever seeing the Buick driven by EDWARDS at the time of his disappearance abandoned on the Vidalia - Ferriday highway.

RYIES advised that he is not presently a member of the Ku Klux Klan and when asked if he ever was, RYLES stated only that he is not a present member.

RYLES advised that any information he may have pertaining to the klan would be of the past and of no use to the FBI.

RYLES, when asked if he had ever heard of the Minutemen organization, stated he had only gained information regarding its activities through newspaper articles. He was not aware of any pistol and rifle club being recently chartered in the Ferriday - Vidalia area, adding that he has little cause for rifle and shotgun use because of a shoulder injury.

Mrs. ANN CURLEE, Secretary, Louisiana Department of Revenue, was recontacted at her place of employment, advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the investigation being conducted, at which time she furnished the following information:

CURLEE stated that she was formerly employed at the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office and terminated her employment to obtain a Civil Service job with the State Department of Revenue. CURLEE advised that while employed at the Sheriff's Department, she was the only female employed there and acted in the capacity of a radio dispatcher.

She stated that during her tenure, she recalls receiving a 10-28 (Request for Vehicle Owner Registration) for an abandoned vehicle located at the bowling alley between Vidalia and Ferriday, and was to have the car towed to Beatty's Gulf Service. CURLEE advised that she could not recall the car being registered to a JOSEPH EDWARDS but to the best of her recollection, believes the car was registered to (First Name Unknown) GRAVENBURG.

CURLEE advised that since last contacted, she had gone over to the Sheriff's Office and searched for her radio logs and further details which she believed were retained by the Sheriff's Department. However, she was unable to locate the records.

CURLEE advised that various Deputies, namely, BILL OGDEN, FRANK Delaughter and IKE COWEN were friendly with members of the Ku Klux Klan and they would often imply through conversations overheard by CURLEE that they were involved in racial matters. CURLEE stated that she was unable to recall anything specific in terms of particular incidents or individuals involved.

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CURLEE, when queried as to any conversations overheard pertaining to the JOSEPH EDWARDS case, was unable to recall anything in particular but vaguely remembers general talk regarding the disposition of EDWARDS. CURLEE reiterated that if anyone had something to say, it would probably include OGDEN, COWEN or DeLAUGHTER.

When asked about any white 1964 unmarked vehicles utilized by the Sheriff's Office, CURLEE advised that the only automobiles she could recall that were white and unmarked were a Dodge sedan driven by RAYMOND KEATHLEY and a personally owned automobile driven by JUNIOR HAYS, described as a late model white Oldsmobile. CURLEE stated that when HAYS commenced employment with the Sheriff's Office, he sold the car to the department and it was equipped with a police radio. CURLEE was unable to recall whether the car had one or two whip antennae, but it did not have a light mounted on the roof of the car. She stated that she believed the Sheriff's Office would furnish dashboard-mounted beacon lights for emergency use.

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Deputy Sheriff BILL OGDEN, Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office, advised that he had not recalled any additional information since he was last interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI concerning the disappearance of JOSEPH EDWARDS.

He stated that he believes that his only contact with EDWARDS was at the side of the Shamrock Motel swimming pool when a Negro believed by him to be EDWARDS was involved in recovering the body of an infant who drowned in the pool.

OGDEN stated that to his knowledge, he has had no other contact with EDWARDS.

With regard to EDWARDS' vehicle, which was abandoned near the bowling alley on the Vidalia - Ferriday highway, OGDEN stated he radioed for a 10-28 (a radio request for a license records check for the identification of the owner) and was advised that the owner was listed as (First Name Unrecalled) GRAVENBURG. He stated he makes numerous requests for 10-28's but the only reason he recalls this particular one was because GRAVENBURG was a former Louisiana State police officer whom he disliked. OGDEN stated he did not inspect the car. He is of the opinion that the car had a flat tire at the time and was parked in a bend in the road between the Plaza Club and the bowling alley.

He directed that Beatty's Gulf Station tow the vehicle in. Subsequently, Purvis Motors, Ferriday, claimed the vehicle.

OGDEN denied any knowledge of an incident where he chased a Negro over the levee in the vicinity of the bowling alley or anywhere else.

MC GRAW stated that he recently heard a rumor being discussed outside of Babe's Place, Louisiana Avenue, Vidalia, Louisiana, by a number of Negro persons whose names he could not recall. MC GRAW stated that according to the rumor, JOSEPH EDWARDS, the Negro porter who disappeared from the Shamrock Motel, Vidalia, Louisiana, was arrested at a gas station in Vidalia, and taken to the Vidalia jail where EDWARDS was killed. EDWARDS' body was then disposed of by GEORGE WEST of West Funeral Home, Natchez, Mississippi. MC GRAW could furnish no other details concerning the rumor.

After rumors reached her that EDWARDS had disappeared, she never saw him again nor did she know why he had disappeared. She stated that she heard from unrecalled sources that EDWARDS vehicle was found along the road somewhere between Vidalia and Ferriday, Louisiana. She advised that she had no additional information concerning EDWARDS or his disappearance.

CLAIBON stated that in 1964, she was a maid at the Shamrock Motel, Vidalia, Louisiana. GLAIBON stated that she did not hear of any incident wherein a Shamrock porter came into the kitchen and alleged that a guest had pulled a gun on him. CLAIBON stated that she had never heard of an incident at the Shamrock wherein a Negro porter had insulted a white female Shamrock employee. CLAIBON stated that she had never heard that a Negro porter at the Shamrock had dated a white girl.

BEATRICE LAMBERT, a waitress at the Albert Pick Motel, was advised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

She stated that she recalls JOSEPH EDWARDS as a former dishwasher at the Albert Pick. She formed the opinion that EDWARDS was "sort of a fresh boy" but she has never known him to have insulted anyone nor to have been involved with white girls.

She advised that EDWARDS' position at the Albert Pick Motel would have provided him with little, if any, opportunity to have met or associated with any white female employees or guests.

She advised that she had no information having any bearing on EDWARDS' disappearance.

ADDIE BINGHAM, Route 4, Box 366, Natchez, was contacted at her place of employment, the Rendezvous Restaurant, 114 Main Street, Natchez, and was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents. She provided the following information:

BINGHAM stated that a few years ago she was employed as a supervisor in the kitchen at the Albert Pick Motel, Natchez, Mississippi. She stated that she recalled a Negro named JOSEPH EDWARDS who worked in the kitchen and who she sometimes brought to work in her Volkswagen along with some other Negro kitchen help.

BINGHAM stated that EDWARDS had worked for Mr. SMITH at Swift and Company, Canal Street, Natchez, and that SMITH asked BINGHAM to give EDWARDS a job. She stated that EDWARDS never gave her any trouble at all.

She stated that to the best of her recollection, EDWARDS never got caught in a room at the Albert Pick with a white female guest. She stated that she did not recall why EDWARDS quit working at the Albert Pick.

BINGHAM stated that EDWARDS left the Albert Pick and went to work at the Shamrock Motel, Vidalia, Louisiana. Shortly thereafter, EDWARDS disappeared. After EDWARDS disappeared, BINGHAM talked to SMITH about EDWARDS. SMITH told BINGHAM that EDWARDS had gotten smart with a white girl at the Shamrock and that EDWARDS had not been seen since that time.

BINGHAM stated that some of EDWARDS' fellow kitchen employees at the Albert Pick were DOROTHY BRIGGS, LOUISE CARTER, ALMA HARRIS, ADA TERRELL and DOROTHY GRIFFIN.

BINGHAM also stated that she recalled that EDWARDS wore a watch with a gold wristband. The watch was round, it had round blue stones for 12, 3, 6, and 9 p.m., and rectangular red stones in between the blue stones.

CLINTON AUSTIN, 1111 Peach Street, Vidalia, Louisiana, was contacted at his place of employment, Swift and Company, 413 South Canal, Natchez, Mississippi, and was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents. He provided the following information:

AUSTIN stated that he was a co-worker a few years ago at Swift and Company of a Negro named JOSEPH EDWARDS.

AUSTIN stated that a Vidalia, Louisiana, mailman named JACK MILLIGAN, 421 Myrtle Street, told AUSTIN a year or so after EDWARDS disappeared that a body had been found in the Mississippi River by unidentified persons, that it was taken to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, by unidentified persons in an unidentified manner, who brought the body back to an unidentified "Sheriff's place" where the still unidentified body was buried. A marker was put on the grave which read "Headless Joe".

CLINTON AUSTIN, 1111 Peach Street, Vidalia,
Louisiana, was contacted at his place of employment,
Swift and Company, 413 South Canal, Natchez, Mississippi,
and was advised of the identities of the interviewing
Agents. He provided the following information:

AUSTIN stated that he was a co-worker a few years ago at Swift and Company of a Negro named JOSEPH EDWARDS.

AUSTIN stated that EDWARDS also worked at the Albert Pick Motel, Natchez, at the same time. AUSTIN stated that he was told by EDWARDS on one occasion that EDWARDS had been participating in sexual activities in a back room at the Albert Pick for 25 cents with a Negro female employee of the Albert Pick who needed the money to make payments on her 1956 Chevrolet and who lived on Broadway Street, Natchez. EDWARDS also told AUSTIN that other Negro kitchen help at the Albert Pick acted as lookouts while EDWARDS and the Negro female conducted their activities in the back room.

VERNON E. SMITH, Superintendent, Swift and Company, Natchez, Mississippi, who is a resident of 104 McGreggor Way, Natchez, was apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

employed as a stock worker by Swift and Company during late 1963 or early 1964. SMITH related that EDWARDS was a good worker but was not dependable in that he failed to report for work on many occasions. On the last occasion, he related that his son had broken his leg and had to be taken to a specialist at a hospital in Monroe, Louisiana. SMITH sought proof of this claim and found that EDWARDS had lied about the incident. EDWARDS was, therefore, dismissed from his job. SMITH stated that he recommended EDWARDS, however, to Mrs. ADDIE BINGHAM, supervisor of the kitchen, Albert Pick Motel, Natchez.

EDWARDS was known to be employed at the motel for at least several months but during that time, SMITH employed him occasionally for odd jobs at SMITH's residence, then located at 419 Lynn Street, Vidalia, Louisiana.

Subsequently, SMITH received an inquiry from JOSEPH EDWARDS' mother as to whether he had seen her son recently. He, thereafter, heard rumors to the effect that EDWARDS' vehicle was found and that he apparently met with foul play. As to the source of these rumors, SMITH identified WILLIE KEYS, a Negro stock worker at Swift and Company, and CLIFTON AUSTIN, a white worker in the cooler at Swift and Company.

WILLIE H. KEYS, 623 Stiers Lane, Natchez, Mississippi, who is a receiving clerk at Swift and Company, Natchez, was apprised of the identities of the Special Agents and the nature of the contact.

KEYS advised that he was acquainted with JOSEPH EDWARDS as a co-worker at Swift and Company. During that time, he found EDWARDS to be somewhat stupid and inclined to be promiscuous with girls of the Negro race.

KEYS stated that he is also a Negro although many people believe him to be a person of the white race but EDWARDS had never indicated to him that he was having affairs with girls of the white race. One of EDWARDS' girl friends was ANNA FLEMING, who resided on Oak Street, Natchez, and was employed in the kitchen at the Albert Pick Motel.

On one occasion, EDWARDS told the laborers at Swift and Company that he had relations with a Negress employee of the Albert Pick Motel in the wash room of the motel while one of his co-workers acted as a lookout. EDWARDS related that he paid this girl twenty-five cents and she was engaging in this activity in order to make payments on her 1956 Chevrolet. KEYS was unable to identify this girl other than describing her as a heavy-set girl with several gold teeth.

According to KEYS, EDWARDS was not known to have gotten into any difficulties over his affairs with Negro girls and he heard of no involvement on EDWARDS part with girls of the white race. Neither did he have any information indicating that EDWARDS was arranging prostitution dates through NELLIE JACKSON or anyone else.

After EDWARDS terminated his employment at the Albert Pick Motel, he was employed for a short time at the Shamrock Motel in Vidalia, Louisiana. KEYS has no recollection that EDWARDS visited his former co-workers at Swift and Company during his employment at the Shamrock Motel.

Mr. ROBERT MARTIN, General Delivery, Clayton, Louisiana, after being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents, furnished the following information:

MARTIN advised that he was a cousin of JOSEPH EDWARDS and has known him since boyhood, however, has not seen him for approximately three years. MARTIN stated that he knew EDWARDS, prior to his disappearance, was working in Vidalia, Louisiana, at the Shamrock Motel as a porter.

MARTIN stated that EDWARDS, at the time of his disappearance, was married to ORGREE TAYLOR and that TAYLOR had given birth to two children by EDWARDS while living in a common law relationship.

MARTIN, when queried as to when first apprised of EDWARDS evanescence, stated he had learned that EDWARDS was missing through neighborhood sources, however, was unable to recall precisely from whom.

MARTIN advised that SCRUGGS, who is the local "law," never made any mention as to the whereabouts of EDWARDS to him at any time.

MARTIN advised that EDWARDS was a "lady's man" and whenever he had the opportunity to date a woman, he would do so with little reservation. MARTIN stated that EDWARDS frequently made mention of having several girl friends, however, never mentioned any names of girls whom he was dating, where they worked, or whether they were white or Negro. MARTIN advised that he was not knowledgeable of any white females EDWARDS might have had relations with or made advances toward anywhere in the Vidalia - Ferriday, Louisiana, area.

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MARTIN advised that the only individual who may know of EDWARDS' personal activities outside of his immediate family was DAVE CARTER, who used to run a gambling shack in back of SMITH's store.

Chief J. T. ROBINSON, Natchez Police Department, made available a Missing Persons Report Number 2827-C. This report shows that JOE EDWARDS then resided at 52 Oak Street, Natchez; was reported missing by his mother (no name stated) to Patrolman W. MARTIN at 10:30 a.m. July 21, 1964. JOE EDWARDS was described as a Negro male, age 24, 5'6" tall, weighing 165 pounds. The report stated that he had been missing since July 12 and was last seen on that date.

Chief ROBINSON stated that the case was handled as a routine Missing Persons case. A short time later, he learned from either the FBI or another law enforcement agency that EDWARDS' car was found near the Plaza Club, Ferriday, Louisiana. ROBINSON stated that he examined EDWARDS' vehicle, an old Buick, but saw no blood, broken glass, bullet holes, or other evidence of violence. The only thing out of the ordinary was that a man's belt had been looped through the steering wheel and the driver's door handle. ROBINSON stated that he is not sure of the site where he inspected the car. It may have been at a service station in Ferriday or near the Plaza Club. ROBINSON stated that he is of the opinion that it was the latter place. No further investigation was made in that EDWARDS' car was found well outside the jurisdiction of the Natchez Police Department and there was no evidence to indicate that any crime occurred in Natchez.

Chief ROBINSON stated that he heard a rumor sometime around that period from unrecalled sources. According to this rumor, HUBERT RUSHING (a cab driver) and his wife resided at the Shamrock Motel. EDWARDS was making prostitution dates for Mrs. RUSHING. EDWARDS was rumored to have been having relations with Mrs. RUSHING in a motel room at the time her infant child fell and drowned in the motel swimming pool.
