Source advised that ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, Tuscaloose, Ala., will meet with the Mississippi UKA State Officers in Jackson, Mississippi on the night of 9-27-66 to discuss various problems in the Mississippi organization. Source stated the meeting would be held at the Airways Motel, Highway 80 in Jackson.

Informant advised that MC DANIEL felt that he would have to at least make a news comment about the possibility of going to Grenada to save face for as late as the state meeting on 9/18/66 he had been criticized for his "do nothing" policy. Informant said he knows MC DANIEL has no intention of going to Grenada unless pressure becomes greater than presently, that he will try to go alone from Natchez and will advise prior to leaving Natchez.

A state meeting of the UKA, Realm of Mississippi, was held at Natchez on 9/18/66. The "do nothing" policy of E. L. MC DANIEL was discussed after which it was generally agreed that a "non-violence" approach, as MC DANIEL'S, was the policy to follow. Several Klaverns represented, included BILLIE MEANS as Exalted Cyclops of the Puckett Klavern, did not go along with the above, indicated they might pull away; however, they did not have the opportunity as their charters were pulled.

E. L. MC DANIEL was re-elected Grand Dragon; L. C. MURRAY, Secretary; and JACK SEALE, Colonel in Charge of the Security Guard.

With the news comments by MC DANIEL on this date which in effect indicated he was going to take a number of Klansmen to Grenada if MARTIN LUTHER KING was permitted to stay at Grenada and agitate, was explained by MC DANIEL that he felt issuing such a statement would cause United Klansmen to stay away from Grenada until such time as he requested them to go with him. MC DANIEL indicated that he had really no plans to go to Grenada, that there was nothing the UKA could accomplish there. He said, however, that if Klansmen insisted on going, he would go in order to give leadership in an effort to prevent violence, ie he would make anti-violence speeches there, have a parade, and the like to give Klansmen a vehicle to let off some of "their steam." MC DANIEL confided to me that he hoped KING would leave very shortly as he feared some violence might erupt and the UKA would be blamed.

I am aware that MC DANIEL attempted to reach ROBERT SHELTON in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, on 9/19/66 and was advised SHELTON was some place in North Carolina (and obviously not holding a Grand Dragon Conference in Tuscaloosa that date).

MC DANIEL is trying to get a job with Red Ball Freight, his former employer, while L. C. MURRAY is trying to get a job with Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company at Natchez but have been unsuccessful to date.

Source furnished the following information regarding the state scating of the UKA near Natchez, Miss., on 9/18/66:

E. L. MC MANIEL, during his speech, after being re-elected Grand Diagon of the UKA told those present that the UKA had members who were working for the Federal Government's Anti-Poverty Program in many parts of the state. He advised that members should not criticize those people if they have to work with the Negroes since they are working for the URA and obtaining information that will be of value to the UKA in the future. He did not explain how this would be of value and rambled on at length on the subject. He advised that two members in Tylertown, Miss., a WINLIAM ANDREWS and a RALPH BALL would be of great assistance to the UKA. He stated BALL owns a hardware store, will get into the Anti Poverty Program and be of great assistance to the Klan. He advised that WILLIAM HUNT of Kosciusko, Mana, and a Mr. HORNESS (Phonetic) of Magnolia, Miss. , should be assisted by all members in any way possible. An individual, stating he was from Magnolia, Miss., and would halp HORMESS, if he knew him, told MC DAVIEL that he did not know anyone in Magnolia, Miss., by that name. MC VANDER appeared embarassed by the consent of this man and did not answer him. From the Loughs contrating from the section of MC DANIEL'S ST THE AUPPORTSES, the informant doubts that such individues descended above by MG DARIER actually exists, or if so, is in any way associated with the UKA.

Columbus, Mississippi 9/7/66

On 9/7/66, the informant was contacted at Columbus, Miss., at which time he furnished three written reports regarding three weekly meetings of the Lowndes County Klavern #740 of the UKA and one written report of a Special Meeting of the Lowndes County Klavern #740 held on 9/2/66 regarding school desegregation in Columbus, Miss. The informant also furnished a handwritten report regarding the open rally sponsored by the Lowndes County Klavern #740 held at Jacks² Truck Stop, Highway 82, Columbus, Miss. on 8/27/66. These written reports are set forth below. It is noted that these written reports were discussed with the informant and additions were made for clarification and to determine the full identities of those persons referred to and these additions have been indicated by parenthesis:

"(On) August 23, 1966, a meeting of the United Riens of America (Lowndes County Klavern #740 was beld at the Hunt Club, New Hope Community, Lowndes County, Miss. 24 members present).

"Meeting opened by EC, Mr. (DURELL) Fondern. Prair by Mr. Pete Goodman. Mr. Fondern stated let's get down to business. We have lots to do to set up our rally. Saturday knight will come fast. Gorection reading of the August 16 Meeting Minutes were was also ropening.

"Thes continued with setting up committees to set sign for Arguar 27 (open) rally. The committies The set of the last too have committees for the set of the tar cutting grass, moving the sound truck and stting it up and extra securty guards in case other units didn't show with securty guards and a committee to hand out firey cross papers, also a committee to sell books at the book table. Then the adv. committee Mr. (James F.) 'Slim' Atkins and Mr. Pete Goodman got that job. Then we discused the amount we should spend After the discussion we came up with the figure of one hundred and fifty dollars. Mr. Goodman and Mr. Atkins agreed to split it with WCBI WACR (local radio stations). Also two adds in the paper <u>Camerical</u> Dispatch forty five dollars with the paper fifty two dollars and fifty cencs with WCBI and sixty seven dollars and twenty cents with WACR.

"Mr. Fondern told us that Mr. (E. L.) McDaniels called the rally off and he called Mr. Shelton and Mr. Shelton said go on with plans. He had a speaking appontment in Wisconsin and he would call it off and speak at our rally. Mr. Fandern said we have our committies. I don't know whos on what but all that volunterd know that your job is so I'm counting on you to do it. Then we closed prair by Mr. Kimbrew (KIMEROUGH)."

"(On) August 27, (1966, Lowndes County Klavern #740 sponsored an open) Rally (held at 7:30 p.m. at Jack's Truck Stop, H'way 82, Columbus, Miss.)

"A conversation was over heard by Mr. Earocst Gilbert. He stated that Mr. Sexton, Mr. Shelton, Mr. McDaniels, Mr. Seals, Mr. Fondern, was down at the motel trying to straighten this mess out. Mr. Gilbert stated 1 look for Mr. Shelton to abolish the state office or either apoint Mr. Fondern the new Grand Diaget.

"Mr. Fills of froted that he was a Rissman and be the forme to clay a Rlansman. <u>H was</u> going the more and a class of y way they could state but way

to kill him. He stated that every thing South of Jackson, Miss. had stoped paying dews and he was the only man that could get them back in the United Klans of America. He stated that just about all of them was still together but had stoped paying dews on account of Mc the Grand Dragon and Mr. Seals. Mr. Gilbert asked about Don Nevins. He said he would just have to hear his side of the story before he could believe he hade gone completely bad. He said Nevins and Mr. Walton (Dale Walton) ask for a trial and was refused. Mr. Gilbert said they were intitle to a trail rgardless of the situation. Mr. Gilbert said they would never do him that way if they did he it would be over his dead body. Mr. Mc. call our August 27 rally off and all other rallys off but he was up here after. Mr. Fondern got in town with Mr. Shelton and got him to speak for the sole purpos of taking the collections and he did, and left Klavrn to pay out of their pockets a \$164.50 adv. bill. No body knows just how much was colected it wasn't counted."

"(On) August 30th (1966) meeting of the United Rlans of America (Lowndes County Rlavern #740 was held at Hunt Club, New Hope Community, Lowndes County, Miss. 28 members present). Meeting was opened by Mr. (Durell) Fondern the EC. prair by Mr. Pete Coodman.

"We sware in two new members. Mr. B. H. Morrison (MORRISON), Mr. J. B. Morrison (MORRISON), Mr. (H. J.) Flady was sick (but present at the meeting) and (be) ask Mr. "J. F." Atkins, 'Slim' to take his part in the sermony. After the sermony Mr. Chartes Sell instructed the new members on rules and signs.

"(On) Sept. 2 (1966) (a) special meeting of the United Klans of America (Lowndes County Klavern #740 was held at the Hunt Club, New Hope Community, Lowndes County, Miss., 27 members present).

"The meeting was opened by Mr. Fondern, the EC of Klavern #740. Mr. (Durell) Fondern ask if any body had any thing to report on nigers in schools.

"Mr. J. T. Taylor said there were a sizeable number of <u>Negers</u> in Joe Cook School but there were no way of knowing until they were all registered. Then Mr. (T. C.) Yeatman said he knew there were at least ten in Franklin but he expeted the number to be higher after the are all registered. Mr. (J. F.) 'Slim' Atkins said his youngest daughter saw three teenage nigers at Calwell, Mr. Atkins asked his daughter if it was possible they might work there so his daughter said no the had on teenage school clothes but no body knew if they registered or not.

"Mr. Ed Richardson said he heard the Nigers were going to boycott the stores that didn^Tt employ <u>Nigers</u> in their stores but he didn^Tt want to call any mames until he knew for some.

"Then Mr. JAMES F.) "Slim" Atkins said be weared to sail what cames that the Jews had made a string at slas, cat all South Market Street and that

we shouldn spend one penny with a Jew that is all the Jews can understand of their money and that will bring them around. Then Mr. Ray Robinson (Robertson) said he was ready to do something about the school situation he held up his 38 and said we should start at the head of the school board and shoot every one of them that that would stop this think of intergration. Mr. (JAMES F.) 'Slim' Atkins said I'll go along with that since the school board has sold us out.

"Then Mr. Pete Goodman got up and said the only way we could get action was to around the public, get over to the public that something had to be done if we are to keep America white. Then just about every body had a little bite of poping off that they were ready to start shooting.

"Then Mr. Fondern said all will not take any action until we have all the facts. Then Mr. (T. R.) Dashill got up and said gent. that violence woulden get us any place thate we were sepose to smarter than the <u>Niger</u> that is the way the Communist want to act then they will have acomplished their mission. Then every body agreed and quited down and every seemed happy after they had let of steam. Then prair by Mr. Lan Clemons and dismissed."

"Sept. 6, 1966, meeting of the United Klans of America (Lowndes County Klavern #740 - Hunt Club -New Hope Community, 24 members present).

"Meeting opened by the EC Mr. (Durell) Fondern prair by Pete Goodman, the chaplin. Then Mr. Fondern asked if any of the committees had a rport. Slim Atkins, Chairman made a rport on Caldwell School. He stated there were no <u>Nigers</u> in Caldwell and said Mr. Yeatman had a <u>rport on Franklin</u>. Mr. Yeatman said there were thirteen <u>Nigers</u> in <u>Franklin</u> $|\operatorname{FO}(A_i(0))^{(i)}| = |\langle (1)\rangle|$

and he said he didn't know just how many more there would be after they finished registing. Then Mr. J. T. Taylor said there were four Nigers at Joe Cook School. Then it was reported no Nigers at Stakes Beard and Bearrier and Demonstrations. Then it was time for the new candidate. C. E. O'Callaghan was was the canadate. After the sermony Mr. Fondern gave us his usual talk that we should arm our selfs that we were going to need arms in the near future. Then he stated that there was going to be a state meeting at Natchez Sept 17 and Mc (E, L, McDANIEL) was resenting then and that Mr. Shelton had call him and ask him to take it and he rejected it.

"Then he said if no one was elected he would operate Miss. out of the National Office until one could be elected or appointed. Then Mr. Fondern asked that every<u>one</u> should attend and if there was any one that didn't have a way he would make arrangements for any one. Then Mr. (PETE) Goodman showed some plates that were bought from The John Burch Society that read Wallace for President and the would sell for \$1.10 each. The meeting was closed proir by Mr. Lon Clemons.

"(J.E. Toylor's correct name is J. T. TAYLOR.)

"(Buddy Yeager is unknown and this individual is not in any way connected with any Klan activity in the Columbus, Miss. area."

Source advised he had learned that the following individuals in the Vicksburg, Warren County, Mississippi area were members of the WKKKKOM:

> DAVE ELLISON, believed on disability retirement from Rederal Government service; E. R. WRIGHT; J. G. PURVIS; LONNIE FRITH.

Source continued that this group of men he had heard are worked up over some recent action taken by the Federal men in Visksburg, and he could only presume they were referring to FBI Agents. They indicated something ought to be done about the Federal man, no plans were mentioned, nor what action they thought they should take.

A Mr. TINGLE, whose son or sons run a store, who has previously been mentioned, is a part of the above in their thinking.

Source stated he visited Natchez, Miss. and determined that L. C. MURRAY is attempting to find a job but since he can work only in a clerical capacity as he knows no trade, is having difficulty. He learned that Jack Seale wants additional work as his garbage collections are off and is not making sufficient money to send his daughter to college and live like he would like to.

STATE OFFICERS MEETING, UKA, INC., NATCHEZ, MISS., 8/14/66

On 8/23/66, source advised that a State Officers Meeting of the UKA, Inc., was held at the State Office in Natchez, Mississippi, on Sunday, 8/14/66.

Informant advised that approximately 50 individuals were present throughout the State of Mississippi, and that this meeting was presided over by E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon, UKA, Inc., Realm of Mississippi.

Informant advised that at this meeting a vote of confidence was taken concerning E. L. MC DANIEL remaining as Grand Dragon and that of the 30 delegates voting, the vote was 28 - 2 in favor of MC DANIEL remaining as Grand Dragon.

Informant stated that a discussion was had concerning moving of the State Office in Natchez, Mississippi, to the home of MC DANIEL in order to save money, thereby granting salary and expenses to officers throughout the state.

Informant advised that dues of all units throughout the State of Mississippi were paid up at this meeting.

Informant stated that there was considerable discussion concerning the moving of the State Office from Natchez, Mississippi, to either Jackson or Meridian, Mississippi. Informant stated that MC DANIEL advised the group that a vote on this would be taken at the next meeting, possibly in 30 days.

MEETING OF LEAKE COUNTY UKA, INC., CARTHAGE, MISS., 8/16/66

On 8/23/66, informant advised that there was a meeting of the Leake County Unit of the UKA, Inc. held at Carthage, Mississippi, on 8/16/66. The informant stated that there were approximately 45 individuals present and the EC, JAMES THORNTON, presided over this meeting.

Informant advised that the principal speaker was A. J. BURNS, a resident of Meridian, Mississippi, who spoke on non-violence and urged the group present to take no action in regard to use of dynamite and instructed the group to have no activity in regard to harassment of Negroes and to cooperate, as far as possible, with law enforcement in the Leake County area.

Informant advised that the EC, JAMES THORNTON, advised the group that there was considerable trouble in the Harmony Community south of Carthage, Mississippi, and that he was very much concerned over this community and the possibility that someone was going to be killed. THORNTON advised the group at this meeting that several months ago approximately 40 individuals of this unit of the UKA, Inc., in Carthage, had broken away and that they were presently meeting under another name and meeting somewhere close to the Pearl River south of Carthage. THORNTON advised the group that he was afraid that these individuals who are all ex-Klansmen would possibly take matters into their own hands and blame their "dirty work" on the UKA in Carthage.

Informant advised that A. J. BURNS suggested to the group that they attempt to bring these individuals back into the UKA, Inc. or form a new unit south of Carthage, Mississippi, to encompass this Pearl River area and thereby being able to control these individuals.

Informant advised that the group decided on forming a new unit south of Carthage, Mississippi, in order to control these individuals and that EC JAMES THORNTON recommended that BILL DOUDY, a Constable at Madden, Mississippi, be contacted to see if he would serve as EC of this newly formed unit.

Informant further advised that A. J. BURNS gave a report on the State Officers Meeting held at Natchez, Mississippi, on 8/14/66.

According to the informant, JAMES THORNTON advised that there was a dire need at the present time to gain more membership in the Leake County area in order to control all individuals in that area.

The informant advised that THORNTON announced to the group that the UKA, Inc. unit in Carthage, Mississippi, would meet every Tuesday night of each month.

Informant advised that immediately at the conclusion of this meeting, he conversed with JAMES THORNTON, at which time THORNTON advised him that he (THORNTON) was planning to run for Sheriff of Leake County next year and that he was very much concerned over any violent acts that the UKA, Inc. might do in that area. He stated that he did not want to get blamed for any violent acts, thereby losing votes in the Leake County, Mississippi, area. According to the informant, he did desire, however, the complete support of the UKA in Leake County.

UKA, INC. RALLY, PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI, 8/20/66

On 8/23/66, informant advised that there was a UKA, Inc. rally held at a baseball field in Philadelphia, Mississippi, on Saturday night, 8/20/66.

Informant advised that CARLTON SMITH, the Grand Lecturer of the UKA, Inc., Realm of Mississippi, Was the Master of Ceremonies, and principal speakers were E. L. MC DANIEL, the Grand Dragon, and A. J. BURNS, the Grand Chaplain of the UKA, Inc. in Mississippi.

Informant advised that many Klansmen wore robes at this rally, that the need for additional membership was stressed, as well as the need for everyone to financially support the operation of the UKA, Inc. in Mississippi.

Informant advised that MC DANIEL, BURNS, and SMITH voiced disappointment at the turnout for this rally.

COLLINSVILLE UNIT, UKA, INC.

Informant advised that TOMMY TOUNDSEND is the acting temporary EC of this unit and they are planning to meet on Saturday night, 8/27/66.

Source stated a meeting was held by the State Officers of the United Klans of America, Inc., of Miss. with the Exalted Cyclops, at Natchez on August 14, 1966. There were 23 ECs and about three representatives of ECs present. W. J. "BILLY" MEANS, EC at Puckett apparently has been trying to undermine the leadership of Grand Dragon E. L. MC DANIEL, claiming that he does not coming running to the assistance of various klaverns when they call on him. CHARLIE MERCHANT of Morton and BEN PULLEM from Jackson seemed to be the only support of accusations that MEANS had. Generally everyone at the end indicated their support in the future of McDANIEL, however JACK SEALE, Chief of the Security Guards and Grand Klowed, and L. C. MURREY, Secretary of the State Office at Natchez resigned their state positions but will continue UKA membership.

SEALE said klan activities were taking too much of his time without reimbursement so he was being forced to get an additional job to his garbage collections to get his daughter through MSCW. MUHRAY indicated that his pay as Secretary was not enough to get by on in spite of his wife working and that he was having to get another job and could not spend all his time in UKA headquarters.

ROY ARNOLD who is a salesman with MARX & SCHARFF Inc., a wholesale tobacco firm in Natchez, and ERNEST FINLEY, JR. son of klansman ERNEST FINLEY, both attend public rallies of the UKA but have not joined.

Source advised that the son of W. O. WALLACE is a member of the UKA Adams County Unit. W. O. WALLACE prior to his deather was manager of the Borden Milk Company in Natchez, and the son was believed to have been, at that time, also employed at Bordens but source was not positive.

Source did not know a JOE DICKINSON or JAMES T. DICKERSON but reported that BOB DICKERSON who is employed at the Gilcrest Trailer Company in Natchez is a member of the Adams County units of the UKA.

Source did not know of anyone by the name of STEVENS or STEPHENS connected now or in the past with the UKA.

Source said that a Charles Smith who lives on Melrose Street in Natchez, an employee of Armstrong Tire & Rubber Co. is a white male about 35 years of age.

Soume reported that JAMES SEALE is no longer a welder with the tank company south of Natchez and that now his brother JACK is attempting to gain employment there but in spite of rumored vacancies there. JACK has not been hired.

Source advised that he heard that during the week of 7/25/66, E. L. McDANIEL and JACK SEALE went to Philadelphia, Miss., and got seven sticks of dynamite from a UKA member there and turned the dynamite over to Agents of the FBI in Meridian, Miss.

Source advised that McDANIEL and SEALE talked to a UKA member in Louisville who had two sticks of dynamite and CARLTON SMITH, Grand Klokard, UKA, was instructed to get this dynamite and turn it over to the FBI Agents in Meridian.

SAM HOLLOWAY BOWERS, JR.

The ku klux klan originated in Mississippi approximately five years ago in Natchez, being first affiliated with the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in Louisiana. Douglas Byrd was head of the klan in Miss. at first. Myron Wayne "Jack" Seale was an early Grand Kleagle who while organizing in Laurel, Miss. swore in Sam Bowers. Bowers for sometime sat in the rear of the meetings and said nothing, with very little being known about him, such as that he was not married, or that he had a partner in his pinbell business named Larrison. Considerable controversy arose in Louisiana and Miss. over klan funds and its disbursement in Louisiana. Dôlglas Byrd was kicked out of the leadership of the Original Knights. At a State meeting in Brookhaven, Miss. the leadership was split up, with about 22 units in the southern portion of the state being of one faction, and 14 units of the north making up another faction. Sam Bowers who had been quiet at previous meetings talked up another state meet and since he was attempting in what he said to keep the klan together, he was shrewd enough to get himself elected Imperial Wizard. Someone suggested that a new constitution and organization be formed whereupon Bowers got up taking from his pocket a constitution he had already drawn up. From then on he was in the driver's seat of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Realm of Miss.

Bowers is a smart cunning individual who claims to have attended a college in California for two years, which he said was communistic. He at one time had large pictures of CASTRO and STALIN covered with a sheet on one of his walls. When questioned about this he commented they were there to remind him what he was fighting for.

Note that in the recent slayings of Ben Chester White in Natchez area that it is rumored that Ernest Avants of Natchez supposedly flew to Laurel to see Sam Bowers on a couple of occasions prior to the murder. A few days after the murder Bowers and his attorney reportedly were in Natchez, and Bowers is supposed to be in town tonight.

The United Klans of America is bitter over this uncelled for murder by members of the White Knights Ernest Avents and Claude Fuller with Jones for the reasons that the press merely mentioned it was done by the klan and mentioned the crime happened in the home town of El.McDaniels, Grand Dragon of the UKA in Miss.

White, Knights in Franklin County, Miss. James Seale of the Bunkley Community has left the White Knights coming into the UKA in Adams County under the influence of his brotherJack. He has quieted down considerably but still has a ways to go. There is no indication the White Knights are meeting in that county and the klen, both outfits are believed to be defunct.

White Knights, Waren County, Miss.

I know Rex Pierce, Jr. and a number of klansmen by face but not by name. Have heard nothing of any activity there for sometime.

United Klans in Warren County, Miss.

Mr. Martin of the Martin Tire Co. who was holding open meetings at his home-place of business, followed by steak-fries, talked so much that it caused embarrasment to some of the membership, that activity has dwindled to nothing.

Klen in Rankin County, Miss.

Bill Sullivan at Pearl who heads the United Klans, in my opinion never left the White Knights but merely uses the UKA as a cover. He has a big mouth and uses others to get things done. He particularily has been a bad influence on Danny Joe Hawkins of Jackson. Sullivan has insisted on running his klavern as if he were still in the White Knights.

Violence Suspects in Natchez

Reggie Carter does not have the intestinal fortitude to commit acts of violence but he will talk others in his clique into same. The leadership of the UKA in Natchez has tried to influence Carter into laying off, particularily in the harassment given the Burger Chef, but to no avail. The end result is that Carter and his little group have been "bad-mouthing" E. L. McDaniels and L. C. Murray over klan funds and anything else about which they could complain. McDaniels instructing Carter to quit surveiling customers at the Burger Chef made Carter hostile. Carter's group is made up of JOE HARDY, MARION BEASWELL (an older man who has a grocery and who lives on Pine Ridge Road), JIN WHITE, CHARLES DAVIDSON and a red-headed boy named Kepper from the Kingston Community. Charles Dávidson was a good boy until he came under the influence of CARTER but JIENY WHITE is the most likely one in the group to commit violence.

Another clique of the group in Netchez is made up of "Big Mac" Mckinney and his brother and Ed Fuller (gambler in La. who is a brother to Claude Fuller - chargerd in the murder of Ben Chester White) Ed was the EC of a klavern of White Knights. They are not United.

Source advised that CLAUDE W. FULLER tried to get into the UKA in the past but his application was turned down. He was formerly in the WKKKKOM. Source did not know his Klan status at the present time.

Source advised that WILLIAM L. RILEY, Natchez attorney for the UKA, went to the home of E. L. MC DANIEL on the night of 6/14/66 and told MC DANIEL that he had been contacted to represent FULLER. He was concerned about representing FULLER and the UKA, at the same time. He did not want to give the UKA a bad name. MC DANIEL supposedly told RILEY he would have to use his own discretion about the matter.

UNSUBS; BURGER CHEF DRIVE-IN, NATCHEZ, MISSISSIPPI

Source advised that the circular regarding the Burger Chef Drive-In which was circulated in the Natchez area during the past few days was not authorized by the UKA even though it indicated on the circular that the UKA had put these items out. Source learned the following information regarding the printing and handling of these circulars.



The circulars were printed on a Mimeograph machine of Unit Number One, UKA, Adams County, Mississippi, which had been borrowed by R. P. "REGGIE" CARTER. JOE HARDY and CHARLES DAVIDSON and possibly R. G. CARTER, distributed the circulars. The circulars were rolled and stapled at the residence of DAVIDSON by the wives of HARDY and DAVIDSON. Mrs. HARDY has the stapler, according to the source.

Source stated these individuals are renegades in Unit Number One, Adams County, UKA, running around causing trouble on their own. Source stated that Unit Number Two, UKA, in Adams County is a secret unit made up of local businessmen. One Exalted Cyclops is head of both units.

ENFORCEMENT OF VOTING RIGHTS ACT OF 1965

Source stated that UKA has no plans to do anything to cause the Negroes not to want to vote in the upcoming elections.

JACK SEALE - L. C. MURRAY

Source advised that JACK SEALE and L. C. MURRAY were upset over the fact that the newspapers had printed the name of E. L. MC DANIEL and the fact that he lives in Natchez, Mississippi, and is the Grand Dragon of the UKA at the end of the article about ERNEST HENRY AVANTS, CLAUDE W. FULLER, and JAMES LLOYD JONES being arrested for the murder of BEN CHESTER WHITE. Source stated that JACK SEALE had made the comment that if these individuals had murdered WHITE, they should "fry." SEALE had made the statement when these individuals were arrested that they, the UKA, should telephone the FBI and advise that organization that those arrested are not members of the UKA.

Source stated SEALE and MURRAY feel that any act of violence hurts the image that the UKA is trying to portray, so, consequently, they are against violence.

Source stated he is of the opinion that if JACK SEALE and L. C. MURRAY were contacted by the FBI that they would be glad to furnish information regarding individuals who are prone to commit acts of violence and also they would furnish any information regarding acts of violence.

Informant advised that there was a Privince Two meeting held at Greenville, Miss., on 4/2/66 at 7 p.m. Informant indicated that the meeting was actually held in a building on property operated by Bob's Flying Service at Greenville, Miss. Informant advised that representatives were present from Greenwood, Miss. klavern, Greenville Klavern, Ripley Klavern, Ashland Klavern, and Falkner, Miss. units. Informant advised that individuals he recalls attending the various units were as follows:

WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD--member of the Benton Co., Ashland, Miss. Klavern

Informant advised that the following state officers of the UKA, Inc., were in attendance at the Province Two meeting:

E. L. McDANIEL--Grand Dragon

JACK SEALE -- State Knight Hawk

L. C. MURRAY--State Secretary

JOHN DAWSON--State Treasurer

The informant advised that the general theme of the meeting was to pull various klan units together, and to encourage recruitment of new members. During the course

of the meeting, McDANIEL condemned JIMMY KING and ERNEST GILBERT for pulling away from the UKA. Informant indicated that all individuals present at the meeting made a vote of confidence to McDANIEL and UKA.

Informant advised that prior to the meeting commencing at Greenville, McDANIEL and SEALE called him aside and asked him to be at Louisville, Miss., the next date. According to McDANIEL, ERNEST GILBERT was forming a new organization called by the informant to be USSA, possibly the USA, planning for a United Selective School Association or possibly the United Schools Association. Informant indicated that McDANIEL told him that there might be trouble at the meeting which had been called by GILBERT when he wanted the informant to be present.

Informant advised that he along with BOBBY BYRD and WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD of Ashland, Miss., were at Louisville the following day at request of McDANIEL and all were armed with weapons at McDANEIL's request, Informant advised that they met McDANIEL at the post office in Louisville; and they subsequently traveled to the Nanih Waiya State Park where the meeting of the klansmen was to Informant advised that McDANIEL skeptical on take place. attending the meeting, but the encouragement of JACK SEALE he did, in fact, go to the meeting. Informant advised that ERNEST GILBERT and JIMMY KING were on the platform at the Informant advised that GILBERT made a talk about meeting. the new organization being formed, which from all indications was not a klan-type organization. Each new member of this organization was to be charged a \$1 a month fee with such money to stay in the county from which the money was collected from unless needed by the state office. The purpose of the organization was to collect money, thereafter build a private school in each county. Informant advised that approximately 180 individuals attended the meeting at Louisville with GILBERT's primary interest apparently being the recruitment of klansmen into his new organization, Informant advised that at one point

SILBERT commented that he had the support of ROSS BARNETT, ex-governor and the State Representative, CHARLES BLACKWELL.

In regard to the Province Two meeting held at Greenville the prior day, the informant advised that he engaged JACK SEALE and L. C. MURRAY in a conversation. Informant indicated that SEALE and MURRAY were discussing guns, and at one point SEALE and MURRAY indicated that they had two Thompson Submachine guns and two Aircraft type .50 Caliber Machine guns which they had spent considerable time reactivating. Informant advised that SEALE and MURRAY inquired of him as whether or not he could obtain ammunition for these type weapons. Informant pointed out also that SEALE and MURRAY mentioned that they had considerable trouble and spent a considerable amount of time in reactivating the weapons, bringing the informant to believe that they had been obtained at a deactivated status.

Informant advised that during the course of the Province Two meeting in Greenville, WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD was introduced to the group as the victim of the house burning incident in Benton County, Miss. Informant advised that in connection with the house burning incident, DUDE BOWDEN EC in Benton County, Miss, had furnished him with a bundle of leaflets to be distributed to McDANIEL. Informant advised that he turned over approximately 2,000 copies of these pamphlets to McDANIEL in effect indicated that the BYRD residence had been burned down by local authorities and also depicted a picture of WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD, along with his wife and child. standing in front of the burned residence. Informant indicated that the purpose of the pamphlets were to be distributed throughout the state and thereafter collections taken by the klan units for the BYRD family,

In this regard, informant advised that the BYRD's apparently feel that they will not be prosecuted by Federal or State authorities in regard to the shooting incident at FBI agents on the night of 1/3/66.

Informant advised that the name JACK CAIN was unknown to him, but it was his opinion that this person was probably identical with JIMMY KING, Anguilla, Miss.

Informant advised that he had learned three members of the Ripley, Miss. Klavern of the UKA had quit or resigned from the klan unit. Informant identified these individuals as follows:

WILLIAM EARL VICK C. E. WINGO LEE EARL LUNA

Informant advised that a new member had been sworn into the Ripley, Miss., Klavern in April, 1966. Informant identified this individual as E. J. RHEA of Potts Camp, Miss. Informant advised that he is 21-23 years old, is employed at the Strattford Furniture Co. in New Albany, Miss.

Informant advised that one GEORGE RUTHERFORD had been sworn into the Falkner, Miss., klavern of the UKA in March of 1966.

Informant advised that BOWDEN, EC at Ashland, Miss., gave him the letter, that he, BOWDEN, had received from E. L. McDANIEL. Informant advised that this letter was on the letterhead stationery of the KKK, UKA, Inc., Realm of Miss., and it was addressed as follows:

"Dear Brother Bowden,

"I will be in Ashland on Sunday night, April 17, with a lawyer to talk to Mr. Byrd. Please inform Brother Byrd to this matter and have the witness so we can contact him. Please send me the name of a motel as soon as possible in Ashland.

"Looking to see you then, I am

"For God and Country E. L. McDaniel Grand Dragon"

Informant made available this letter to the interviewing agent.

Informant made available a bulletin addressed to all klanspeople and a special bulletin that had to do with klansmen questioned or interrogated by Federal or State officers. Informant made available these two bulletins indicating that they had come into his possession. These bulletins are set forth as follows:

Special Bulletin.

The following resolution was presented and adopted at the E. C. 's meeting on Oct. 9, 1965 and must be adhered to by all members of the United Klans of 'merica Inc., Realm of Mississippi.

Ne it recolved, that no Klansman ellow himself to be questioned or interrogated by a Federal or State Officer without said officer or officers produce a warrant or affidavits.

Be it further resolved, in the event an individual is presented a warrant for his errect, that said individual must give only his name unless the State Lawyer or this persons private lawyer is present to advise this person.

Be it further recolved, in the event that this person should choose to bring his private lawyer in on the case, then this person will incurr

Informant advised that BOWDEN EC at Ashland, Miss., told him that McDANIEL and an unidentified attorney from Natchez, Miss., had come up to Ashland, Miss., and talked with WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD regarding the house burning incident. Informant advised that according to BOWDEN his lawyer anticipated filing a suit against the authorities in the very near future on a percentage basis.

Informant advised that the public klan rally to be held at Falkner, Miss. on the night of 5/28/66, would be held on the farmland owned by RUSSEL RICHARDSON, Falkner. Informant advised that RUSSEL RICHARDSON is a secret member of the Falkner Klavern and indicated that the previous klan rally held in Falkner in the Fall of 1965, was also held on the RUSSEL RICHARDSON farmland. Informant advised that helunderstands that McDANIEL will be the speaker at the Falkner Rally:

Informant advised that he learned the identity of the following individuals as being members of the Falkner Klavern, UKA:

> EIMER MISKELLY WILLIAM MISKELLY WILBUR CRUM SPECK RUTHERFORD DOYLE GRIFFIN GEORGE W. CAMBURN

Informant advised that in the course of his contact with BOWDEN of Ashland, Miss., BOWDEN never made reference to the incident involving the Negro Civil Rights worker, HENRY REAVES.

Informant advised that he received a telephone call from CHICK AUTRY, a member of the Benton County Klavern, Ashland, Miss., on the previous Wednesday, night. Informant indicated that AUTRY called him at about 12 midnight and wanted to buy a .45 caliber pistol. According to CHICK AUTRY, things were rough in Benton County and he needed a gun for protection. Informant advised that there was no question in his mind that AUTRY was intoxicated at the time of the telephone call.

Informant advised that in a recent contact with ROBERT HUDSPETH, a member of the Benton County Klavern, Ashland, Miss., it was learned that HUDSPETH has either four or five 7.62 Russian Bolt Action rifles. Informant advised that according to HUDSPETH, the weapons were purchased in Tupelo, Miss., and they had been in HUDSPETH's possession for the last three or four months. HUDSPETH made a comment to the effect that if he ever had to use one of the guns, he could throw it away and it would never be missed. Informant advised that HUDSPETH is prone to do a lot of talking and he questions whether or not the HUDSPETH would in fact use the weapons.

Informant advised that the Ripley Klavern of the UKA currently holds its meetings on Friday nights at an abandoned house, the property of BOBBY YOUNG in the Western portion of Tippah County, Miss.

Informant advised that he recently learned that the Benton County Klavern at Ashland, Miss., is holding its meetings on Saturday nights somewhere near the Benton-Tippah County line.

Informant advised that the Ripley Klavern of the klan is down to a few active members with most of the members not showing up for meetings and falling behind in dues. Informant identified the active members of the Ripley klavern as follows:

Informant advised that EARL CARDWELL has not been attending klan meetings, although he is considered a member of the klavern. Informant advised that BUDDIE PANNELL of Ripley, Miss. is not a member of the klan. Informant advised that PANNELL

Informant advised that CURTIS RICHARDSON is not a member of the klan. The informant pointed out that CURTIS RICHARDSON is a school teacher in Falkner, Miss., and the klan public rallies are never held on land owned by CURTIS RICHARDSON. Informant indicated that the property which the klan holds its public rallies on in Falkner, Miss., is owned by RUSSELE RICHARDSON, secret member of the Falkner Unit.

Informant advised that BOBBY H. RICHARDSON is no longer a member of the klan in Tippah County, Miss. Informant advised that RICHARDSON has resigned his membership.

Informant advised that GENE JOHNSON and JUNIOR JOHNSON are father and son respectively and are members of the Falkner Klavern of the UKA.

May 18, 1966 Lafayette County, Miss.

Informant advised that there was a public rally held at Pontotoc, Miss., on 5/14/66, which he estimated approximately 200 persons attended. Informant advised that JACK HAAS, EC of Greenwood Unit, was present at the Pontotoc rally and was dressed in a klan robe. Informant advised that in addition to HAAS, the HUBERT PATTON and WALLACE BUDINE TURNER, both members of the Ripley Klavern, were present at the rally in Pontotoc, Miss., and were also dressed in klan robes. Informant advised that E. J. RHEA and CARLOS SHOFFNER, JAMES COUSAR, and JAMES MARTIN, all members of the Ripley Klavern, were also observed at the Pontotoc Rally. Informant advised that GENE JOHNSON and JUNIOR JOHNSON are members of the Falkner Klavern and were also noted as being in attendance at the Pontotoc Rally as well as BRUCE SEAWRIGHT is also a Falkner Klavern member.

Informant advised that he observed no individuals from the Benton County klavern or the Holly Springs, Miss. klavern of the UKA in attendance at the public rally.

Informant advised that JACK SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, and JOHN DAWSON were present at the public rally with McDANIEL.

Informant advised that after the Ripley, Miss. public rally scheduled for 5/20/66, the next rally will be held at Booneville, Miss., on 5/29/66.

Lafayette Co., Miss. 5/31/66

Informant advised that previously he had discussed with E. L. McDANIEL theridea of Ashland, or Benton County unit, Holly Springs Unit, the Falkner Unit, and the Ripley Unit of the Klan, holding a joint meeting periodically in an effort to increase interest in the klan and increase membership. According to the informant, McDANIEL approved of the idea and thought it to be a good one. Informant advised that in this regard, a joint meeting was held between the units of Ashland, Falkner, and Ripley, Miss., on the night of 5/27/66, at Ripley, Miss. Informant advised that no contact had been made with the Holly Springs Unit, therefore, they were not represented at the joint meeting held at Ripley.

Informant advised that during the course of the joint meeting, it was decided to hold a joint meeting of all klaverns every fourth meeting and to invite the Holly Springs, Miss., Unit to attend the next joint meeting. Informant estimated that there were approximately 30 members of various klan units in attendance at the joint meeting and he identified these individuals to the best of his memory:

Informant advised that primary discussions at the meeting concerned the klan being more active in Northern Miss. and obtaining more members.

Informant advised that during the course of the meeting, he was in a position to overhear TATE RUTHERFORD, the EC of the Falkner Unit, comment concerning a white male by the name of ERNEST McMILLAN of Falkner, Miss. Informant advised that RUTHERFORD indicated that McMILLAN was the son of a banker of Falkner, Miss., and that McMILLAN was shacking

up with a white girl in Ripley, Miss., by the name of MONA HAMILTON. RUTHERFORD commented that something ought to be done about McMILLAN and HAMILTON.

Informant advised that the following day, they received information indicating that six identified klansmen cleared out a trailer which HAMILTON resides in in Ripley, Miss., and apparently warned her to quit shacking up with McMILLAN. The informant indicated that the six unidentified klansmen were dressed in klan robes. Informant indicated that he does not know who the klansmen were that actually went to HAMILTON's trailer and talked with her, but he feels certain that TATE RUTHERFORD, along with other members of the Falkner Klavern were the individuals responsible for the incident.

Informant advised that he learned from E. L. McDANIEL that the rally at Booneville, Miss., which met 5/28/66, had been canceled along with two or three other public rallies not identified. According to the informant, McDANIEL advised him that there was "nigger trouble coming up." Informant advised that he did not know what McDANIEL had reference to as McDANIEL did not further elaborate.

Informant advised that he had been approached by two individuals from Ripley, Miss., by the name of BILLY CARTER and CARL BARKLEY, both of these individuals indicating that they had attended the rally at Falkner, Miss., on 5/28/66, and that they had filled out or completed application for membership in the Ripley Klavern as secret members. Informant advised that CARTER and BARKLEY both requested to work as secret members of the kłavern.

Informant advised that at the joint meeting of the klaverns, he talked with BOBBY BYRD briefly and BOBBY BYRD commented that DALE WALTON of the KGF, Tupelo, Miss., had come to Ashland, Miss., and brought \$50 for WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD's burned residence. Informant advised that

WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD had recently constructed a new residence that he and his wife are now residing, and advised that this new home is located near WILLIAM ALLEN BYRD's father's home in Benton County, Miss. .

CURTIS CREER, known as JUNIOR GREER, lives in the Topisaw Community and is probably one of the officers. He carries a White Knight card, with a series of punches in it which either designates attendance or Klan rank. GREER

Informant advised that on a recent trip to the Natchez - Vidalia area he was able to determine that J. B. TEMPLETON, NORMAN HEAD, JACK SEALS and JAMES SEALS, are still very active Klansmen, who have and would resort to violence. He advised that NORMAN HEAD lives for nothing but the Klan, works at the Gibson Discount Store in Natchez. lives in Natchez, but is from the Vidalia area and still goes to Klan meetings in the Vidalia area with HORTON, J. B. TEMPLETON runs an auto parts shop in Vidalia, Louisiana. is a radical who works for Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, was working on the night shift the night the bomb was planted in the automobile of GEORGE METCALFE, and many people in the Vidalia area believe he knows all about that bombing.

Informent advised that when the Vidalia Klavern of the OKKKK was chartered in mid-1963 there were 53 members in the Klavern. He advised that he knows the Klavern to be still active but does not know how many members there are now or if it is still the OKKKK.

Informant advised that HERMAN GREEN, a former Vidalia, Louisiana policeman, and now a state or Federal game warden, who lives on Eleanor Street, in Vidalia, was a member of the Vidalia Klavern in 1963 and 1964 and probably still is.

. Se On April 29, 1966, VAN HOWELL, telephonically contacted TOMMY REAGAN and advised him that all cross burnings in the city of Monroe, Louisiana, scheduled for May 1, 1966, had been called off by Grand Dragon JACK HELM.

. .

On April 30, 1966, a cross burning rally of the UKA was held outside of Baton Rouge, Louisiana. HENRY CLAYTON SALLEY, JESSE LEE, BUTCH COON, and CALVIN GULETT, drove to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in BUTCH COON's automobile. BUTCH COON was accompanied by his wife. JAMES WHEELER and COY NEAL drove to Baton Rouge from Monrce and NEAL's automobile.

After arriving at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the Monroe Klansmen checked into the Holiday Inn. The security guard meeting of the State of Louisiana was scheduled to be held at the Holiday Inn, but only CALVIN GULETT and TOMMY REAGAN showed up.

Following the UKA cross burning rally a security guard meeting was held at the Holiday Inn with 22 Klansmen present. Recognized as being present at this meeting was:

TOMMY REAGAN,

CALVIN GULETT,

AL CAMERON, and

DENLEY INGRAM from the Kenner, Louisiana Unit, HENRY HEBERT from the New Orleans, Unit,

JAMES WHEELER from West Monroe Unit #2, were also present. All of the other individuals present were unidentified.

REAGAN gave a speech on the purposes and goals of the UKA Security Guards to furnish protection and security at all public functions of the UKA. He stated that on May 21, 1966, a meeting would be held at Monroe, Louis iana, at which time all interested individuals should be present to determine who would be the Southern Louisiana Major in Charge of Security Guards. He stated that all security guards should conduct themselves in a proper decent manner and that no violence whatsoever would be tollerated.

Prior to the cross burning rally Klansmen from Louisiana met in the room of ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA who had come to this rally in company with the Imperial Secretary, first and last name unknown. Recognized as being present in SHELTON's room was LARRY DOBSON, member of the Baton Rouge Unit and approximately 5 to 6 other individuals from this unit. Also coming to this room was E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon UKA,

State of Mississippi, JACK SEALE, believed to be chief security guard in Mississippi, L. C. MURRAY, BILL WINDHAM, Assistant Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana, JACK HELM, Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana. During this meeting in which SHELTON was briefed on the forthcoming rally to be held at 7:30 P.M. and also briefed that the UKA was organizing itself into a strong cohesive Unit in the State of Louisiana under the leadership of JACK HELM, BUTCH COON, was assigned to guard JACK HELM during the rally. Following this meeting a car calvacade of approximately 20 cars was lined up in front of the Holiday Inn and then proceeded to the rally site.

This rally began at 7:30 P.M. and terminated at 9:30 P.M. There were approximately 1500 spectators present and 31 robed Klansmen. There was approximately 13 security guards present. These security guards included JAMES WHEELER, JESSE LEE, TOMMY REAGAN, CHARLES BAILEY from the College Unit, BUTCH COON, DAVE HANEY and two other individuals from the Ferriday Unit, two from the Chatham Unit including JAMES TRUELOVE. There were 6 to 8 security guards from the State of Mississippi. The following Klansmen were recognized as being present:

Alexandria, Louisiana, area.

CARL TEAL and JOHNSON attempted to persuade ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, to attend a May 7, rally at Hineston, Louisiana. SHELTON and JACK HELM turned down this request stating that since the Hineston Unit had broken away from the UKA that the National and State UKA organization would have nothing to do with any function sponsored by this independent Klan group.

The principal speakers at this rally were ROBERT SHELTON, JACK CANNON, Grand Dragon, State of Texas, JACK HELM, and E. L. MC DANIEL. The Master of Ceremonies at this rally was BILL WINDHAM.

Following the speeches COY NEAL who holds position of State Secretary of the UKA led the UKA cross burning ritual. Following this rally the security guard meeting was held at the Holiday Inn, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and the Monroe, Louisiana, Klansmen returned to Monroe.

On May 1, 1966, VAN HOWELL telephonically advised TOMMY REAGAN that three members of the College Unit of the UKA had been arrested by the Monroe Police Department charged with burning a cross on public property. This arrest had been made by the Police Department against the three College Klansmen at the Intersection of Highway 80

and Sterlington Road in Monroe, Louisiana. The three Klansmen were being held on \$500 bond a piece at the Monroe City Jail and HOWELL had been unsuccessful in even talking to Chief of Police, J. C. KELLY, who had arrested the Klansmen. The three Klansmen arrested were CHARLES BAILEY, REAGAN WILSON and BILLY BRYANT.

TOMMY REAGAN after conferring with VAN HOWELL at the Monroe Police Station learned that the three klansmen had probably arrested on information furnished by an informant. TOMMY REAGAN conferred with Chief of Police KELLY for four hours and then managed to have the three Klansmen bonded out. VAN HOWELL stated that he believed that the three Klansmen were arrested based on the information furnished by BILL WINDHAM.

MEETING OF THE CHARMINGDALE UNIT OF UKA

On May 4, 1966, a meeting of the Charmingdale Unit of the UKA was held at the residence of BILLY PARKER in South Monroe, Louisiana. There were 11 Klansmen present at this meeting including BILLY PARKER, ARRON WADE, BUTCH COON, and TOMMY REAGAN. The remaining Klansmen present were unidentified.

The Exalted Cyclops (EC) of this Unit TOMMY LIPSCOMB and another member GLENN HYDE were not present.

The Charmingdale Unit discussed the fact that three members of the College Unit of the UKA had been arrested by the Monroe Police Department and that the rumor was that this arrest had been made on information furnished by an informant. It was also rumored and discussed by this unit that VAN HOWELL was in hot water with Grand Dragon JACK HELM because he had not informed the College Unit that no crosses were to be burned in the city limits of Monroe.

The unit decided that if GLENN HYDE, who has three months back dues due, does not show up at the next meeting that they would have him dismissed.

The next item of business was that BILLY PARKER stated that they must use the money in the treasury to make a down payment on a Klavern. He said that it is necessary for the Klan unit to meet in a Klavern rather than at peoples' houses.

There are six security guards from this unit including AARON WADE, BILLY PARKER and the secretary of this unit. The other three are unknown. Following this discussion the meeting terminated.

On May 3, 1966, the regularly scheduled meeting of West Monroe Unit #1 was not held as no members except

B* (COVER On May 7, 1966, BILL WINDHAM, in company with COY NEAL, drove to Winnsboro, Louisiana, and picked up petitions from HUBERT HOLLANDSWORTH, member of the Winnsboro United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) Unit. These petitions were signed by citizens of Franklin Parish, Louisiana, demanding that the Grant-in-Aid to private schools, which was passed by the Louisiana Legislature some years ago, not be defeated as a law. There seems to be a move presently to have this law eradicated from the books.

WINDHAM and NEAL then drove to the Eola Hotel in Natchez, Mississippi. Recognized as being present from the State of Mississippi were the following Klansmen:

E.L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon

L.C. MURRAY and MURRAY's father

JACK SEALE

First Name Unknown DAVIS

First Name Unknown SMITH, believed to be from Meridian, Mississippi, who was elected to position of Conductor.

DUVAL FRONT, McComb, Mississippi, believed elected to position of Inner Guard.

JIM MING, elected to position of Outer Guard, believed to be an accountant from Jackson, Mississippi. Another individual not present believed to be from Meridian, Mississippi, elected to the position of Chaplain.

This convention began at approximately 10:15 A.M. The position of Grand Dragon, held by E.L. MC DANIEL was not open for election. The positions of Secretary and Treasurer of the UKA of Mississippi were also not open for election. The minutes of this election convention were taken by L.C. MURRAY.

A general conversation was entered into regarding this election, in which the above captioned individuals were nominated then elected. There were no individuals contesting the nominees.

This convention started at 10:30 and terminated at 12:30 for lunch.

ROBERT SHELTON gave a speech, in which he urged the UKA representatives in Mississippi to settle their differences and stop fighting among themselves. He stated that the Klan would either collapse in the Summer of 1966 or continue to exist stronger than ever.

E.L. MC DANIEL then gave a speech, in which he reported on the finances of the UKA in the State of Mississippi. He stated that a resolution would be

introduced to charge each new member an additional \$5.00 for the purpose of contributing towards the UKA Defense Fund in the State of Mississippi. He stated that he intended to increase state dues to \$.50 per member per month. He stated that each organizing Kleagle would receive \$3.00 per member for each new member sworn in. He stated that a resolution would be introduced to have a complete audit of the UKA books twice a year.

MC DANIEL advised that \$19,800.00 had been collected from dues, rallies and other means of obtaining money in the year 1965. He stated that \$18,400.00 had been paid out. He advised that \$11,000.00 of this \$19,800.00 had been collected from rallies and donations received at rallies. He advised that \$3,000.00 was received in dues and the remainder was received from the sale of literature in the State of Mississippi.

He advised that \$1,600.00 was spent for the rental of a State UKA Office. The Grand Dragon was paid \$4,800.00 salary for the year.

MC DANIEL advised that there was \$1,058.00 left in his account for the year.

Following the break for lunch, JACK HELM and COY NEAL contacted E.M. BOYD and C.B. NORWOOD at Vidalia,

Louisiana, BOYD and NORWOOD are members of the Ferriday Unit of the UKA. These two individuals want JACK HELM to visit this unit.

On the afternoon of May 7, 1966, the Mississippi Election Convention reconvened at 2:00 PM at the Eola Hotel. The names that had been nominated in the morning for election were elected by acclaimation by the members present. All resolutions introduced by E.L. MC DANIEL were passed by 3:30 PM. It was announced that a banquet would be held that night at the Eola Hotel at \$5.00 per ticket.

Confidential source estimated approximately 90 Klansmen present at this convention and 13 voting units present.

FRANK DELEVERTER, Deputy Sheriff, Concordia Parish, Louisiana, and DAVE HANLEY, member of the Ferriday UKA Unit, stated they would attend the UKA cross burning rally at the Liberty Ball Park, Natchez, Mississippi, on the night of May 7, 1966.

A banquet was held on the 7th floor of the Eola Hotel with approximately 90 people present, including 40 wives. Recognized as being present at this banquet

Following this banquet a cross burning rally was held at the Liberty Ball Park, Natchez, Mississippi, beginning at 8:00 PM.

JACK HELM gave his standard speech, in which he criticized the Federal Government and particularly Congressman JIMMY MORRISON of the Sixth Congressional District of Louisiana and HALE BOGGS, Congressman from New Orleans, Louisiana, for applying pressure on his employer, forcing his employer to fire HELM for his Klan connections.

E.L. MC DANIEL spoke and stated that the UKA was getting stronger each year in the State of Mississippi and criticized Governor PAUL JOHNSON and the Federal Government in general.

ROBERT SHELTON gave his standard speech, wandering all over the circumference of the globe in his attacks against the Federal Government.

Source further advised that EARL MC CURLEY, who owns a grocery store on Highway #28, outside of Fayette, Mississippi, was formerly a member of the WKKKK.

On the night of May 7, 1966, a banquet was held on the 7th floor of the Eola Hotel by members of the UKA in the State of Mississippi. This banquet began at approximately 5:45 PM and terminated at approximately 7:25 PM.

There were approximately 150 individuals present,

WEBB, that he had to make no statement either oral or written, that any statement he did make might be used in a court of law against him, and of his right to an attorney or person of his choosing prior to interview.

SEALE indicated that he would make no statement concerning his activities except that he was on this date sandblasting and preparing to paint a truck to be used in United Klans of America rallies in the near future in Mississippi. He was observed to discuss this work with E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon of the United Klans of America, Realm of Mississippi, and L. C. MURRAY, Office Manager of this organization.

Subject was interviewed by SA BENJAMIN F. GRAVES & the writer on 5-12-66 and FD-302 submitted.

A spot check of his residence on 5-17-66 indicated that he was not at home, and apparently accompanied Grand Dragon E. L. McDANIEL on UKA Klan rallies scheduled at this time.

In connection with SEALE's being the Grand Knighthawk (chief of security) of the UKA, and his wearing a uniform, more recently with the insignia of a full colonel, it was pointed out to EAL.MC DANIEL by SA WEBB & GRAVES that there is a section of the Civil Rights Act pertaining to "actingunder color of law". It was noted that McDANIEL made a note to himself on this point. McDANIEL was emphatic in stating that he had not instructed the security guard to check the identity of anyone in public places but that the security guard was at the Eola Hotel, Natchez during their recent rally only to assist their guests in direction to their meeting room.

MEETING OF KLAN LEADERS AT COUSHATTA, LOUISIANA

On March 18, 1966, JACK HELM, Grand Dragon of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), State of Louisiana; COY NEAL, State Secretary of the UKA; BILL WINDHAM, Assistant Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana; and W.J. KIDD, Exalted Cyclops of the Swartz Unit of the UKA, drove to Coushatta, Louisiana, for the purpose of meeting with Klan leaders of an independent Klan group in that city.

The Klansmen met at the Coushatta Municipal Building, meeting M.L. CONLEY, who is the City Clerk of Coushatta, Louisiana. This meeting was conducted at the Municipal Building, where drivers license@exams are given. Also present at this meeting was RICHARD L. HANNA. PHILLIP H. MORGAN, the Grand Dragon of this independent Klan group, did not show up. This was due to the fact that he was allegedly sick. There was another individual present from the Coushatta, Louisiana, area, a white male, age 60 to 62.

M.L. CONLEY stated that he was Exalted Cyclops of the Coushatta Unit and that there were 22 men in his
unit. He said that there were four units in East Texas attached to this Klan group and five units in Louisiana. He stated that the units were interested in affiliating themselves with a National organization, since their break with the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, whose home office is in Georgia. He stated that he was extremely impressed with JACK HELM, as was PHILLIP MORGAN. He stated that a meeting would be set up with representatives of all the units from Texas and Louisiana on March 29, 1966, so that leaders of the UKA could explain their organization to these representatives. He stated that each unit would have one to three men representing the unit at this meeting. He further advised that undoubtedly the representatives would return to their units, following the speeches by the UKA leaders in Louisiana, and have the individual units vote on whether or not to join up with the UKA. Following this meeting, the Monroe Klansmen returned to Monroe, Louisiana.

UKA RALLY AT FERRIDAY, LOUISIANA

On March 19, 1966, COY NEAL, in company with his wife SHIRLEY NEAL and BILL WINDHAM and wife PAULINE, accompanied by JACK HELM, drove to Ferriday, Louisiana,

arriving there at 4:00 PM. The above Klansmen and their wives checked in at the local motel in Ferriday, Louisiana. COY NEAL called E.M. BOYD, who is the UKA contact man at Ferriday, Louisiana, who picked the Klansmen up and drove them to the rally site. Following an inspection of this site, the Klansmen ate at the Magnolia Cafe in Ferriday, Louisiana. Showing up prior to this rally was Mrs. LLOYD BARNETT without her husband. She was accompanied by two children. She drove to Ferriday, according to a statement overheard, in order to see JACK HELM.

Mrs. BARNETT further said that the Kenner Unit of the UKA, the Covington Unit of the UKA, and the New Orleans Unit of the UKA would pull out of the UKA organization if money was not received in order to supplement the Kenner Relief Fund. This Kenner Relief Defense Fund is for the purpose of providing money for the defense of four Kenner UKA Klansmen accused of shooting a Negro in Kenner, Louisiana, in the early part of March, 1966. According to Mrs. BARNETT, no money has been furnished to this unit in order to hire attorneys and pay bail bond fees.

At approximately 7:30 PM, a rally of the UKA was held off of U.S. Highway 15, outside of Ferriday,

Louisiana. The following Klansmen were recognized as being present:

AL CAMERON, from the Kenner, Louisiana, Unit. CHESTER LETEFF, State Treasurer of the UKA and member of the North Baton Rouge Unit, who was extremely intoxicated.

HUBERT HOLLANDSWORTH, from the Winnsboro Unit of the UKA.

HENRY HEBERT, member of the New Orleans Unit. PAUL CLAY, member of the Winnsboro Unit.

FLOYD COOK,

DAVID REEVES and

TOMMY REAGAN, all members of the West Monroe Unit #1.

E.M. BOYD, member of the Ferriday UKA Unit. J.D. NOLAN, member of the Ferriday Unit, who is a resident of Jonesville, Louisiana. W.E. BURGESS, member of the Mangham Unit. JAMES TRUELOVE, accompanied by his wife, who is a member of the Chatham Unit. DARWIN HAMILITON, from the Bastrop Unit. LARRY DOBSON and wife, from the North Baton Rouge Unit.

DOYLE DUMAS, Exalted Cyclops of the Lake Charles Unit.

JIMMY LEGERE, member of the Lake Charles Unit. JACK HELM

BILL WINDHAM

ROBERT WEEMS, accompanied by his wife from the Tallulah Unit.

There were two or three representatives from the Chatham Unit unidentified. There were no representatives from the Alexandria or Covington areas of Louisiana.

The two principal speakers at this rally were JACK HELM and E.L. MC DANIEL. JEFF FONTENOT, UKA State Chaplain, gave the opening and closing prayer. BILL WINDAM, Assistant Grand Dragon, was the Master of Ceremonies at this rally.

Another individual recognized following the beginning of the speeches was J.C. ARNOLD, who attends meetings at Chatham, Louisiana, but is a resident of Abbeville, Louisiana.

J.C. ARNOLD advised that VERNON BARBY advised him that JAMES EDWARDS intended to stay in the UKA Klan organization.

This rally, which began at approximately 7:30 PM, ended at approximately 10:15 PM.

JACK HELM, one of the principal speakers, spoke regarding the fact that he had been fired from his job in New Orleans, Louisiana, because of his affiliation with the Ku Klux Klan. He further stated that he had been relieved of his duties as Chairman of the Selective Service Board in New Orleans, Louisiana, because of this affiliation. He went on to state that the Federal Government's interference in local affairs is destroying the United States.

E.L. MC DANIEL, the Grand Dragon of Mississippi, spoke regarding the Negro Civil Rights activities in Natchez and Fayette, Mississippi, criticizing the Federal Government for backing these agitating groups.

Following the speeches, a UKA cross burning ceremony was conducted with approximately 36 Klansmen in robes. There were between 1,000 and 1,200 people in attendance.

On March 20, 1966, a meeting was held at the motel in Ferriday, Louisiana, between JACK HELM, BILL WINDHAM, COY NEAL, E.M. BOYD, two more individuals from the Ferriday Unit and TROY GUICE, who owns the local Chevrolet dealership in Ferriday, Louisiana, and is campaigning for United States Senator. GUICE contacted the Klan and wanted to know what position he should take, which would enable him to obtain the Klan vote in the forthcoming Democratic Primary.

Following this meeting, BILL WINDHAM, JACK HELM, COY NEAL drove to the State UKA Headquarters at Natchez, Mississippi. The Louisiana Klansmen met with a (First Name Unknown) NORMAN, DOYLE MURRAY, The State Treasurer of the UKA in Mississippi, and E.L. MC DANIEL. The

reason for this meeting was to advise the newly elected Louisiana Klan officers the methods whereby the Mississippi Klan maintains its state records. COY NEAL was furnished an instruction by the State Treasurer on how the UKA books were kept in Mississippi.

During this instruction, E.L. MC DANIEL stated that his Klan group was having trouble in Mississippi maintaining its organization. He said there was much trouble in Tupelo, Mississippi, from a Klan group known as the Knights of the Green Forest, which seems to be cutting in roads into the UKA in Mississippi. During the course of this instruction, E.L. MC DANIEL waved towards a map on the wall, stating that there were 35 Klan units in the State of Mississippi. Confidential source feels that MC DANIEL is exagerating tremendously, inasmuch as it appears there seems to be much discord in the State of Mississippi among UKA members.

Following this meeting, the Louisiana Klansmen returned to a barber shop located on the right side of the road between Vidalia, Louisiana, and Ferriday, Louisiana. There is a Shell Service Station located approximately 1/4 of a mile before you reach this barber shop. This

barber shop is no longer in use and is empty. A member of the Ferriday Unit resides behind the barber shop. This is a green building with a circle driveway in front.

MEETING OF THE FERRIDAY UNIT OF THE UKA

A meeting of the Ferriday Unit of the UKA was held at 2:30 PM on March 20, 1966, at a building formerly used as a barber shop.

There were nine present from this unit, including E.M. BOYD; J.D. NOLAN, who is a Kleagle and is from Jonesville, Louisiana. E.M. BOYD commented that the regular treasurer of this unit was ill. He stated that the acting treasurer of this unit is the resident of the building used to meet by the Ferriday Unit.

There was a (First Name Unknown) DAVIS; a (First Name Unknown) ROBINSON; a (First Name Unknown)CARTER, present at this meeting.

COY NEAL, BILL WINDHAM, JACK HELM gave the members present the UKA Klan oath. This unit is Unit #567 and will have its official election within 60 days from this swearing in ceremony. COY NEAL gave the unit instructions on how to pay dues. E.M. BOYD stated there were 27 members in this unit. E.M. BOYD resides at 140 Crestview Drive, Ferriday, Louisiana.

E.M. BOYD paid to COY NEAL \$20.25 towards state dues and \$13.50 toward National dues. Following this payment, BILL WINDHAM and COY NEAL returned to Monroe, Louisiana.

During the course of this drive, BILL WINDHAM advised that the Womens Auxiliary Units in the State of Louisiana were required to pay \$.10 per member per month to the state and \$.10 per member per month to the National.

MEETING OF THE TALLULAH UNIT OF THE UKA

On March 21, 1966, a meeting of the Tallulah Unit of the UKA was held at the Tallulah Klavern, located outside of Tallulah, Louisiana. Present from Monroe, Louisiana, were COY NEAL and BILL WINDHAM.

This meeting began with the swearing in ceremony of a M.C. SPEARS. J.E. HARRIS was not present at this meeting, as his mother was in the hospital at Monroe, Louisiana. HARRIS is the Exalted Cyclops of this unit. FRANK JOHNSON and TOMMY ANDERSON, members of this unit, were not present, as they both had to work. Recognized as being present from the Tallulah Unit were:

ROBERT WEEMS

L.Q. HARDIN

RAY LEE JEAN

This meeting began at 8:00 PM and terminated at 9:30 PM. The Tallulah Unit purchased 2,000 'Fiery Crosses," which is the UKA Klan newspaper. They paid COY NEAL the sum of \$25.00 for these 2,000 papers, that is, \$12.50 per thousand. COY NEAL urged the unit members to increase their recruitment drive in order to get 25 members, which would enable them to receive a UKA Klan charter.

A confidential source advised that, during the course of the UKA Klan Rally at Ferriday, Louisiana, CHESTER LETEFF, in company with (First Name Unknown)COWARD, a member of the North Baton Rouge Unit, were arrested by the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office, charged with resisting arrest and entering into a gun fight with a local resident of that parish. LETEFF and COWARD were also booked for being drunk and disorderly. According to confidential source, both Klansmen were being held in the Concordia Parish Jail on \$4,500.00 bond.

Confidential source further advised that the Mangham Unit of the UKA was holding a barbecue on April 22, 1966.

MYRON WAYNE SEALE still resides 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Miss., and is still self employed in a sanitation business which he owns and operates. SEALE holds position of Grand Knight Hawk, a State Office in the UKA, Inc. and is also a major in the Security Guard of the UKA, Informants report SEALE continues to attend Klan Inc. functions of UKA, Inc., however, no information had been received in recent months indicating SEALE possibly involved in any acts of violence until information received from Informant on 4/13/66 that efforts were being made to deliver two dynamite caps to JACK SEALE and this source overheard an individual state that a business in Natchez, Miss., would not burn and the source assumed from this that JACK SEALE and a group were going to use the caps to dynamite this business in Natchez. Upon interview 9/16/65, SEALE admitted membership in UKA, Inc.

DETAILS:

Residence

On April 18, 1966, Chief of Police J. T. ROBINSON, Natchez, Mississippi, Police Department, advised that MYRON WAYNE SEALE still resides at 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Mississippi.

Wind agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed suitable wind.

A check of the current telephone directory for Natchez, Mississippi, discloses that MYRON W. SEALE resides at 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Mississippi.

Employment

On April 18, 1966, Chief of Police J. T. ROBINSON, Natchez, Mississippi Police Department, advised that MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE still holds a contract with Adams County, Mississippi, for the picking up and disposal of garbage in the subdivisions which lie outside the city limits of Natchez, Mississippi, Chief ROBINSON stated that to his knowledge this continues to be the sole business enterprise of MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE.

Current Position in Organization

JN T=1 on July 15, 1965, advised that MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE is the Grand Knight Hawk of the UKA, Inc., which is a State Office of the UKA, Realm of Mississippi.

JN T=7 on January 13, 1966, advised that at a rally of the UKA at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, on January 8, 1966, three car loads of Mississippi UKA Security Guards showed up at this rally. Among them was the major in charge of the Mississippi Security Guard by the name of JACK SEALE who is also a member of the Mississippi UKA State Board.

Automobile

On January 24, 1966, Mrs. JUANICE DRUETTA, Adams County Sheriff's Office, Natchez, Mississippi, advised from records that MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, has a 1964 Malibu Chevrolet automobile bearing 1966 Mississippi Registration 1B-2405.

Activity of Subject

On June 17, 1965, JN T-1 advised that on Saturday, June 5, 1965, he attended a "Conservative Rally" at Natchez, Mississippi, which was held at the Liberty Park Baseball Stadium. JN T-1 pointed out that this rally, referred to as the Conservative Rally, was actually sponsored by the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) and was attended by many members of Klan groups.

JN T-1 stated that he arrived at the rally late at which time only the officers of the APWR were left at the ball park. JN T-1 stated he spoke to JACK SEALE, ERNEST PARKER, ERNEST FINLEY (deceased), L. C. MURRAY, and a few others, names not recalled, who were just leaving the grounds.

JN T-1 stated that later during the evening of June 5, 1965, he located JACK SEALE who was with L. C. MURRAY in the automobile of JACK SEALE and these two were listening to Natchez, Mississippi Police Department Broadcasts on a variable frequency receiver which had been installed in the automobile of JACK SEALE.

JN T-1 stated that following the rally at Natchez, Mississippi, on June 5, 1965, that he had gone to the home of JACK SEALE where he found, in addition to JACK SEALE, CLYDE SEALE, Father of JACK; JAMES SEALE, Brother of JACK, and also son of CLYDE; L. C. MURRAY, and possibly ERNEST FINLEY. JN T-1 stated that in talking to JACK SEALE and the others present he gained the impression that these individuals appeared to be confused and did not know whether or not the rally had been a success.

On July 1, 1965, JN T-1 advised that on June 26, 1965, JACK SEALE had contacted him and had indicated that if he could find a job he would work on an off-shore drilling rig.

On July 15, 1965, JN T-1 advised that at a State Officers meeting of the UKA, Inc. held at the Holiday Inn Number 2 - Suite 731, at 9 a.m. on July 10, 1965, at Meridian,

Mississippi, among those present was JACK SEALE.

On July 21, 1965, JN T-2 advised that at a State Officers meeting held July 10, 1965, at Meridian, Mississippi, in Suite 731, of the Holiday Inn, among those present were JACK SEALE, Grand Knight Hawk, and that this meeting was presided over by EDDIE L. MC DANIEL.

On August 2, 1965, JN T-1 advised that JACK SEALE was present at the UKA Rally at Greenville, Mississippi, on July 22, 1965.

On August 2, 1965, JN T-1 advised that at a rally of the UKA held on July 17, 1965, at Crossroads, Mississippi, he observed JACK SEALE and L. C. MURRAY of Natchez, Mississippi, both robed out and walking on the streets. JN T-1 pointed out that JACK SEALE and L. C. MURRAY were the center of attraction.

On July 20, 1965, JN T-3 advised that on Saturday, June 26, 1965, a fish fry was held at the home of JAMES LEE on the Lismore Road, South of Wildsville, Louisiana. There were approximately 20 persons in attendance and all that were present were believed by this source to be members of the Ku Klux Klan in the State of Louisiana or Mississippi. This source further believed that each person present was a member or was being considered for membership in the "Silver Dollar Group". This source stated it is believed that members of the "Silver Dollar Group" are the ones responsible for most of the acts of violence that have occurred in the Natchez, Mississippi and Ferriday - Vidalia, Louisiana area.

Present at this fish fry were JIMMY SCARBROUGH, E. D. MORACE, and WOODROW "BLUE" HOLLOWAY, all known to be Klan members at Ferriday, Louisiana; "BUCK" HORTON, NORMAN HEAD, and R. J. GLOVER of Vidalia, Louisiana; T. L. TORGESEN, ERNEST FINLEY (deceased), ERNEST PARKER, ERNEST AVANTS, JACK and JAMES SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi, and SONNY TAYLOR of Harrisonburg, Louisiana.

Those in attendance attempted to make black powder, however, they were not successful.

This source advised that it is believed that each member of the "Silver Dollar Group", carries a silver dollar with an ampersand stamp on the face of "Liberty" on the front or heads side of the dollar.

This source advised that TOMMY JONES of Natchez, Mississippi, was arrested in Ferriday, Louisiana, while en route to the fish fry held at the home of JAMES LEE.

On August 17, 1965, JN T-1 advised that on August 12, 1965, he observed time the room of EDDIE MC DANIEL in the Airways Motel, Jackson, Mississippi, the following individuals:

EDDIE MC DANIEL

JACK SEALE

ERNEST S. GILBERT

ROBERT SHELTON

DR. (FNU) CRAIN

This source stated that he later observed these individuals at a rally of the UKA held at Brandon, Mississippi, on August 12, 1965. This source further stated that on the following day, August 13, 1965, the individuals mentioned above proceeded to Eldorado, Arkansas, where a rally of the UKA, Inc. was held the night of August 13, 1965.

This source further stated that following the rally at Eldorado, Arkansas, that these same individuals left Eldorado on August 14, 1965, and proceeded to Brownsville, Tennessee, where another rally of the UKA was held on the afternoon of August 14, 1965.

This source stated that on August 15, 1965, this same group together with others arrived at Brookhaven, Mississippi, and proceeded to the Holiday Inn, McComb, Mississippi, where an officers meeting of the UKA was held. This source stated that among those present at this officers meeting at McComb, Mississippi, on August 15, 1965, were the following:

EDDIE L. MC DANIEL

PAUL FOSTER

E. S. GILBERT

JOHN DAWSON

S. B. BRYANT

B. W. WALDROP

HENRY NEESE

JACK SEALE

This source stated that ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, was present at the general meeting on August 15, 1965, at McComb, Mississippi, but that SHELTON did not attend the officers meeting.

On August 30, 1965, JN T-1 advised that recently JACK SEALE was overheard making the statement that he does not believe in violence. This source stated that from information he had received, he was of the opinion that JACK SEALE was actually a changed man as it was well understood that JACK had in the past been involved in actual violence but that from his attitudes and actions since joining the UKA, it appeared that JACK SEALE was truthful in stating he did not believe in violence.

On October 7, 1965, Special Agents JAMES W. AWE and JAMES O. INGRAM appeared at the UKA Headquarters, 114 Main Street, Natchez, Mississippi. These agents walked into the office after knocking since the office is on the second floor. E. L. MC DANIEL, JACK SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, and ERNEST PARKER were huddled on the floor around the tape recorder. JACK SEALE was wearing a holster with a .38 caliber snubnose in the holster. Upon observing the agents, SEALE took his gun from his holster and placed the gun in a desk.

All four men appeared friendly and MC DANIEL said they had just been advised that CURTIS L. COLLINS, Chancelor, Adams County, Natchez, Mississippi, had issued a modification order on October 7, 1965, concerning the city injunction against the UKA, Inc. MC DANIEL said with this order the UKA can peacefully walk in twos on the public sidewalks in Natchez. He said this motion was filed by the Claims Attorney, WILLIAM RILEY of Natchez. He stated he plans no marches in Natchez at this time and that they would rather wait to see if U. S. District Judge COX rules against any further marches by the NAACP.

On September 23, 1965, JN T-1 advised that rallies throughout the State of Mississippi by the UKA, Inc., such as the rally at Crossroads, Mississippi, are being set up by JACK SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi.

It is pointed out that following the furnishing of the foregoing information, JACK SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi, made available to an agent of the FBI a list of all of the rallies schedules for the next two-week period by the UKA.

This source stated that among those present on September 12, 1965, at the Airways Inn, Jackson, Mississippi, for a Kleagles Meeting of the UKA, the following individuals were present:

E. L. MC DANIEL, Natchez, Mississippi JACK SEALE, Natchez, Mississippi SLIM ATKINS, Columbus, Mississippi E. S. GILBERT, Brookhaven, Mississippi DON NEVINS, Columbus, Mississippi VERNON HOLLOWAY, Mathiston, Mississippi BILLY AMBROSE, Ripley, Mississippi WAYNE ROBERTSON, Meridian, Mississippi (FNU) ROBINSON, Meridian, Mississippi HOUSTON EVANS, Greenville, Mississippi

On September 22, 1965, JN T-1 advised that the following individuals were in the UKA Headquarters at Natchez, Mississippi, and that it appeared that L. C. MURRAY of Natchez, Mississippi, was running the office:

EDDIE MC DANIEL

ERNEST GILBERT

JACK SEALE

L. C. MURRAY.

This source stated that from conversation among those individuals in the UKA Headquarters on September 22, 1965, it appeared that JACK SEALE was supposed to go to Canton, Mississippi, the night of September 22, 1965, and then to Meridian. Upon leaving Meridian, JACK SEALE and EDDIE MC DANIEL were to proceed to the Gulf Coast to see C. J. SEALE with the possible chance that C. J. SEALE might be put out of the UKA by EDDIE MC DANIEL.

On October 11, 1965, JN T-4 advised that JACK SEALE had told his father, CLYDE SEALE, that a man was coming over from Alabama to teach the UKA members at Natchez, Mississippi, about explosives.

On October 13, 1965, JN T-4 by way of background information advised that among those individuals present at the first organizational meeting held at Wilkinson County, Mississippi, on or about May 11, 1963, by the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan Of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), among those present were TOMMY JONES, JACK SEALE, DOUGLAS BYRD, E. L. MC DANIEL, "TINY" LEWIS, PAUL FOSTER, "SHORTY" BREELAND, and others. At this meeting officers chosen in the beginning were Grand Giant E. L. "TINY" LEWIS; Grand Kleagle JACK SEALE; Grand Chaplain HOWARD MC LEMORE and State Investigator (FNU) COWART.

On October 13, 1965, JN T-4 advised that in connection with the whipping of ARCHIE CURTIS, the operator of a Negro funeral parlor at Natchez, Mississippi, he had received information that the following individuals were actually involved in this whipping:

JACK SEALE

EDDIE MC DANIEL

ERNEST PARKER

This source pointed out that he had no information by which he could substantiate this information and it was merely information that had been told to him and it was possible foregoing information was not correct.

On October 26, 1965, JN T-4 advised that MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE who was formerly a member of the WKKKKOM has withdrawn from the WKKKKOM and is presently the Grand Knight Hawk of the UKA, Inc.

On October 31, 1965, JN T-1 advised that the following individuals had received subpoenas to appear before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) in Washington, D.C. on October 10, 1965:

JACK SEALE

ERNEST PARKER

E. L. MC DANIEL

JAMES SEALE

JOHN DAWSON,

On November 8, 1965, JN T-1 advised that JACK SEALE had been reaffirmed as Grand Knight Hawk of the UKA, Inc. at a rally held at Canton, Mississippi, on November 7, 1965.

On November 12, 1965, JN T=5 advised that at a Province meeting of the UKA, Inc. for the 4th District, was held at Canton, Mississippi, on November 7, 1965. Those in charge of this meeting were ERNEST GILBERT and JACK SEALE and the purpose of this meeting was for the election of a Great Titan for the UKA, Inc., 4th District. This source pointed out that the 4th Congressional District of the State of Mississippi is comprised of the following counties:

On November 12, 1965, JN T-6 advised that a Province meeting of the 4th District of the UKA, Inc. was held in Canton, Mississippi, on November 7, 1965, and that among those present was JACK SEALE. This source stated that a meeting or convention of this type concerning a province is known as a Klonverse. He stated the purpose of this Klonverse was for the election of a Great Titan, the highest officer of the Province.

This source stated that ERNEST GILBERT and JACK SEALE were in charge of this meeting.

On November 29, 1965, JN T-4 advised that during the Thanksgiving Weekend, JACK SEALE and his wife came to visit the father of JACK SEALE who resides in the Bunkley Community near Meadville, Mississippi. During this visit JACK SEALE stated that the State officers of the UKA, Inc. Wanted to have a \$25.00 a plate dinner at Natchez, but his wife, Mrs. JACK SEALE, who is a member of the UKA, Inc. Auxiliary, made the statement that she did not feel such a dinner would be successful.

On February 1, 1966, JN T-8 advised that recently E. L. MC DANIEL and JACK SEALE had been seen in the Columbus, Mississippi area and that he had determined that these individuals were concerned about money which DON NEVINS had failed to send to MC DANIEL at Natchez.

On December 24, 1965, JN T-2 advised that on December 18, 1965, a group of individuals met at the UKA Headquarters, Natchez, Mississippi, and that present at this meeting were four State Officers who were on full time with the UKA, Inc. along with the Exalted Cyclops of each unit in Province 4, and one delegate from each unit. This source advised the four state officers on full time employment with the UKA are E. L. MC DANIEL, L. C. MURRAY, ERNEST GILBERT, and JACK SEALE.

This source stated that during the course of this meeting it appeared that E. L. MC DANIEL and the other state officers appeared "scared to death" about having to go to Washington, D. C. and testify before the HCUA and that they were definitely showing signs of fear in their conversations and their actions. It was brought out at this meeting that the UKA did not have enough money to operate and that the officers do not feel that they now have the backing of the general public.

On January 12, 1966, JN T-2 advised that a meeting of State Officers of the UKA, Inc. was held on January 9, 1966, at the Airways Motel, Jackson, Mississippi, and that among those present were JACK SEALE, E. L. MC DANIEL, and L. C. MURRAY.

On January 10, 1966, JN T-1 advised that JACK SEALE has stated he was going to resign as a state officer but would continue to work as a member of the Natchez Unit. This source was of the opinion that SEALE would not actually resign and he pointed out that no date has been set for the resignation of SEALE.

This source stated JACK SEALE carries a gun at all times as does L. C. MURRAY and he felt SEALE would not be any particular problem but that MURRAY is a source of trouble that "keeps SEALE fouled up all the time".

On January 31, 1966, JN T-1 advised that JACK SEALE and E. L. MC DANIEL are concerned that the acts

of the other Klan officers throughout the State of Mississippi in setting up new organizations and that they are attempting to place the blame on other officers.

On January 17, 1965, JN T-9 advised that at a meeting on Sunday night, January 13, 1966, of the UKA Unit recently formed in Yazoo City, Mississippi, there were 14 members present of which five were from Natchez and nine from Yazoo City. Among those present from Natchez was E. L. MC DANIEL, JACK SEALE, and L. C. MURRAY.

On January 20, 1966, JN T-10 advised that at a meeting of an unchartered unit of the UKA, Inc. at Yazoo City on January 9, 1966, among those present were E. L. MC DANIEL and JACK SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi. At this meeting MC DANIEL stated that the UKA maintains a file on Council Of Federated Organizations (COFO) and Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) workers and that they have the home addresses of some of these individuals or places where they can be This source stated plans were made to send letters reached. to a number of these people indicating that their assistance was needed in Yazoo County. The letters were to be sent out using the names of local Negroes and the purpose of the letters was to stir up trouble in Yazoo County and therefore create a more favorable climate in which the UKA could obtain additional members.

On February 28, 1966, JN T-6 advised that JACK SEALE attended a UKA meeting with E. L. MC DANIEL at the Holiday Inn Number 2, Meridian, Mississippi, on February 19, 1966.

On March 21, 1966, JN T-11 advised that a rally of the UKA, Inc. was held at Ferriday, Louisiana, on March 19, 1966, just off of Deer Park Road, (U.S. Highway 15), at Ferriday, Louisiana. This source stated six deputy sheriffs from the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office were present at this rally and assisted Klansmen in parking their vehicles.

The principal speakers at this rally were JACK HELM of New Orleans, Louisiana, and E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Mississippi.

This source stated that among those present at the rally which he estimated to be a crowd of approximately 1000, there were 12 to 15 UKA Security Guards both from Mississippi and Louisiana; he estimated there were approximately 60 to 70 UKA Klansmen robed out and that among those he recognized was JACK SEALE, a member of the UKA of Natchez, Mississippi.

On March 23, 1966, JN T-12 advised that at a UKA rally held just off U.S. Highway 15 at Ferriday, Louisiana, that among those present was JACK SEALE who is a security guard and holds the position of Knight Hawk with the UKA.

On March 30, 1966, JN T-12 advised that he had received information based directly on statements made by both L. C. MURRAY and DOYLE MURRAY, both members of the UKA in Natchez, Mississippi, that among those individuals who are members of the UKA in Natchez, is one JACK SEALE.

On April 13, 1966, JN T-3 advised that on April 13, 1966, JIMMY SCARBROUGH, Former Exalted Cyclops of the Ferriday, Louisiana Unit of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan was endeavouring to have someone pick up two dynamite caps and deliver them to JACK SEALE in Mississippi. This source overheard SCARBROUGH make the statement that a business establishment in Natchez, Mississippi, would not burn and from this statement this source assumed that JACK SEALE and his group were going to use the caps to dynamite a busi= ness establishment in Natchez.

Interview of Subject

Date September 29, 1965

MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE of 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Mississippi, appeared at the home of ERNEST BUCHANAN PARKER, Rural Free Delivery Natchez, during the course of interview of PARKER. Special Agents identified themselves to SEALE and he voluntarily joined the Special Agent's conversation with PARKER.

SEALE admitted his membership in the United Klans of America at Natchez, that he had attended the rally of the United Klans of America in Natchez in May, 1965, volunteering that the program of the rally was poor and failed to maintain the interest of those in attendance. He explained that a tape recording which could not be heard was played in place of having a live speaker, and that he had been overruled by others as he had been against playing the recording.

SEALE maintained that the United Klans of America are against violence in racial matters and said that he had talked to his father (CLYDE SEALE) and his brother (JAMES FORD SEALE) about the United Klans of America and those of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi. SAM HOLLOWAY BOWERS, Imperial Wizard of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi, Laurel, Mississippi, was discussed and SEALE indicated a loss of understanding as to how BOWERS, who had been raised a Catholic and obviously an opportunist, could lead this group with success. He suggested that BOWERS income should be checked, and when asked how anyone operating a coin-operated vending machine business could loose money year after year, he stated this was almost impossible.

In connection with his whereabouts on August 27, 1965 at the time the automobile of GEORGE METCALFE was bombed in Natchez, Mississippi, SEALE stated that shortly after lunch he had been contacted by Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol

Investigator REX ARMISTEAD of Jackson who could verify his presence in Columbus, Mississippi, for a United Klans of America Rally. He stated he and others had been or were in the process of making the rounds of five United Klans of America Rallies in Mississippi. He did not return to Natchez for about one week after this.

With reference to the shooting of Reverend DONALD THOMPSON in Jackson, Mississippi, on the night of August 22, 1962, he stated he definitely was not in Jackson, had no direct information pertaining to this matter but could check his diary if necessary to determine actually. where he was on this date.

SEALE stated he had no information that this father and brother were involved in the bombing of GEORGE METCALFE's car, that he would contact them in an effort to have them submit to interview by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

SEALE attempted to question agents concerning his possible appearance before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D.C., and whether travel, lodging expenses etc. would be paid by the Federal Government and he was referred to Mr. JOHN SULLIVAN of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, Vicksburg, Mississippi.

ANTI-COMMUNIST CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION (ACCA), ALSO KNOWN AS ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (OKKKK)

A source advised on October 13, 1965, that the ACCA was formed February, 1965, when members of the OKKKK residing in the Sixth Louisiana Congressional District broke away from the State organization in the Fall of 1964.

The source stated members were told that even though the organization's name had been changed to ACCA they should still consider themselves to be Klansmen and that they would continue to operate as Klansmen.

In February, 1965, ACCA filed Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State's Office in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Source advised that the purpose of the ACCA is to promote Americanism, white supremacy and to maintain segregation.

A hearing was held in the United States District Court, Eastern District of Louisiana, New Orleans, during the week of September 11, 1965, wherein the ACCA and various individuals were held to answer a Justice Department petition seeking a temporary injunction against interference with the activities of civil rights workers in the Bogalusa, Louisiana area.

Charles H. Christmas of Amite, Louisiana, identified as the Grand Dragon of this organization, told the court that the Klan went out of existence four months previously and was succeeded by the ACCA. In reorganizing, ACCA retained as its officers the existing Klan officers, bylaws, and basic organization, according to Christmas. He further told the court that the ACCA membership was restricted to the Sixth Congressional District of Louisiana. Every cath in the ACCA was the same as that of the Klan, and the meeting places were often the same.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, the Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on August 4, 1965, that the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several southern states. This source said that Robert M. Shelton is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was last elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source said that the activity of the UKA is increasing, and that the national office remains in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

APPENDIX

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on October 6, 1965, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not show any advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the state is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as of October 6, 1965, of 1500 to 2000 dues-paying members of this organization. The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964.

On March 11, 1966, a meeting of the Spearsville Unit of the UKA was held at the Spearsville Klavern, located in the vicinity of Taylortown, Louisiana. There were a total of six Klansmen present at this meeting including ELLIS TAYLOR, JOE SMITH, Exalted Cyclops, and W. J. KIDD, Exalted Cyclops of the Swartz Unit of the UKA. There was also a heavy set bald individual present. Another individual present was described as about 6' to 6'4", extremely ignorant with spaces between his two front teeth. This meeting began at approximately 7:45 and terminated at approximately 9:15 P.M.

W. J. KIDD urged the members present to contact old members of the unit and have them come to a meeting. He stated that real effort will be made in the future to reassure the old members that the UKA intends to do something about the integration problem in the South.

KIDD stated that if by April 15, 1966, this unit is not up to charter strength, which would be 25 members, that its charter would be pulled temporially and the unit would be considered a nucleus. This would mean in effect that the unit would not have to pay

dues on 25 members and would give it a chance to accumulate money and also to build up its membership.

KIDD stated that he would attend the forth coming meeting on March 18, 1966, to determine the progress that was being made.

On March 12, 1966, JACK HELM, Grand Dragon for the UKA, State of Louisiana, in company with W. J. KIDD drove to Natchez, Mississippi, and met with leaders of the UKA in that state. The meeting began at about 10:30 A.M. and lasted approximately 1 hour. The following Mississippi Klansmen were recognized:

JACK SEALE, the Grand Secretary, and three other unidentified individuals. The main topic under discussion was the forth coming trial of a Klansman from Tupelo, Mississippi, who had been banished from the UKA by E. L. MC DANIEL. The master of ceremonies for this rally was CHESTER LETEFF, from the North Baton Rouge Unit of the UKA. There were 19 robed Klansmen in attendance, 7 being men and 12 women. It is noted that Deputy Sheriffs would not permit the Klansmen to direct traffic and consequently the size of the crowd was cut down due to the fact that they could not find parking space.

JACK HELM spoke regarding Governor JOHN MC KEITHEN and Congressman JAMES MORRISON. He critized the above two legislatures stating that they were not fighting the take over of the Federal Government in the State of Louisiana.

Following this speech, the rally terminated.

It was the consensus of opinion by Klansmen from North Louisiana that the rally was a complete failure.

On March 13, 1966, HOUSTON P. MORRIS, in company with W. J. KIDD, met at Vicksburg, Mississippi, with

HOUSTON EVANS and HANK MURPHY of the Greenville UKA Unit, and ERNEST GILBERT, from Brookhaven, Mississippi. The three Mississippi Klansmen stated that the UKA in Mississippi is breaking up due to the policies of E. L. MC DANIEL, who is the Grand Dragon, State of Mississippi.

According to the three Mississippi Klansmen, MC DANIEL is banishing Klansmen for no reason whatsoever. He seems to be establishing a dictatorship for himself and refuses to help Klansmen when they get into trouble.

ERNEST GILBERT was formerly the Kleagle Coordinator for the State of Mississippi, but resigned and intends to join another Klan organization called the Knights of the Green Forest.

GILBERT also heads what is called the United Conservatives, which is a front group for the Klan. According to GILBERT the UKA will completely fold in Mississippi if E. L. MC DANIEL is not removed from office.

KIDD and MORRIS urged that E. L. MC DANIEL be removed from office and charges be brought against him. KIDD stated to GILBERT, EVANS and MURPHY that

ROBERT SHELTON is aware of the situation in Mississippi and wants MC DANIEL to be removed from office.

It was settled once and for all that HOUSTON P. MORRIS and W. J. KIDD had not said anything about ERNEST GILBERT going behind closed doors with the HCUA investigator at Washington, D. C., and furnishing them information about the Klan.

A confidential source advised on March 14, 1966, that TOMMY REAGAN, Great Titan for the Fifth Province of Louisiana, would not run for this position in the forth coming election.

MEETING OF THE SWARTZ UNIT OF THE UKA

A meeting of the Swartz Unit of the UKA was held at the Swartz Klavern located in Swartz, Louisiana. This meeting began at 7:45 P.M. and terminated at 9:30 P.M. Recognized as being present at this meeting were the following Klansmen:

W. J. KIDD, the Exalted Cyclops, discussed the recent elections of the UKA and stated that the State Board which is now running the State of Louisiana would accomplish mush more than the previous State Board. He also discussed the rally at Folsom, Louisiana, on March 12, 1966, and stated that it has not been a success.

KIDD stated that a Titan election would be held in the near future and that VAN HOWELL would probably be elected as he was unopposed.

W. J. KIDD further advised the members present at the Swartz Klavern that the Titan election for the Fifth Province would be held on April 3, 1966.

On March 16, 1966, a meeting between COY NEAL, JACK HELM, JEFF FONTENOT, HOUSTON P. MORRIS, and W. J. KIDD regarding the position of the UKA in the Eighth Congressional District, was held at the Holiday Inn in Monroe, Louisiana. According to reports received from the Eighth Congressional District of Louisiana, the UKA Klan organization in that area has completely folded. Units which had formerly been members of the UKA have completely disbanded or else joined another

Klan group being organized by former UKA Grand Dragon JAMES EDWARDS. Reports from that area reflect that this area is extremely unhappy over the method used to elect the Grand Dragon JACK HELM over Grand Dragon JAMES EDWARDS.

Also discussed was a current break down of the UKA in the State of Mississippi, and JACK HELM requested that JEFF FONTENOT accompany him to that State in order to try to straighten the situation out.

On March 18, 1966, JEFF FONTENOT, BILL WINDHAM, COY NEAL, and JACK HELM drove to Coushatta, Louisiana,

The above klansmen met with M. L. CONLY and Exalted Cyclops of the Coushatta Unit, FNU TYLER. This meeting began at 8 P.M. and terminated at 9:45 P.M.

The principal topic under discussion was the merger of the UKA with this independent Klan group headed by PHILLIP MORGAN and M. L. CONLY.

CONLY stated there was a tremendous amount of decension in his Klan group and that the men wanted to join with the National organization. He stated they were formerly affiliated with the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan but now wanted to join with the UKA.

CONLY stated that PHILLIP MORGAN, the leader

According to confidential source, ETHEL MURRAY tends to exaggerate her statements when it comes to the Klan.

A brother-in-law of L. C. MURRAY by the name of WENDELL TEW is employed at the Post Office in Natchez, Mississippi, and although he is not an open member he is a secret member of the UKA. Confidential source advised that L. C. MURRAY is constantly contacting people to become secret members in the UKA so that in the event they would be placed on a jury panel they would be able to vote not guilty if a Klansman was brought to trial. WENDELL TEW has been seen often conferring with his brother-in-law, L. C. MURRAY.

According to confidential source, there is a woman who works in the Western Union Office in Natchez, Mississippi, who is a close personal friend of ETHEL MURRAY. She is constantly advising ETHEL MURRAY regarding telegrams that pass through her office. Further, every Klansman who was notified by telegram by the House Un-American Activities Committee (HUAC) was aware of this telegram message believed to be through this woman, prior to the time he or she received the message.

On March 19, 1966, a rally of the UKA was held off Highway 15 at Ferriday, Louisiana. Recognized as being present at this rally were the following:

There were approximately 400 to 600 individuals present at this rally. The principal speakers at this rally were JACK HELM, E. L. MC DANIEL and an unidentified Baptist preacher from Louisiana.

R. L. MC DANIEL criticized the Federal Covernment and President JOHNSON.

JACK HELM spoke regarding his being subpoenaed to Washington, D. C., to appear before the HUAC and the fact that he had lost his job because he was a Klansman.

A cross burning ceremony was led by DOYLE MURRAY from Natchez, Mississippi.

JACK SEALE, who is a Security Guard and also holds the position of Nighthawk, was also seen at this rally, which terminated at 9:05 PM.

BILLY SKIPPER, Chief KBI Investigator under MURRAY MARTIN, Grand Dragon of the OKKKKK in the State of Louisiana was overheard to state that he, SKIPPER, had never been on the Louisiana payroll. SKIPPER made this statement at Denham Springs, Louisiana on March 15, 1966. SKIPPER remarked that there were three to four active OKKKK units in the Denham Springs, Louisiana area. According to SKIPPER, MURRAY MARTIN, LOY SCARBOURGH, JAMES EDWARDS, former Grand Dragon of the UKA, and ROBERT FULLER, Grand Dragon of the OKA Klan organization are all receiving money from the State of Louisiana. This money is to induce the leaders of the Klan to maintain a policy of non violence.

SKIPPER expressed an interest in affiliating himself with JACK HELM, Grand Dragon of the UKA in the State of Louisiana

SKIPPER was furnished the name of CHESTER LETEFF, Exalted Cyclops of the North Baton Rouge, Louisiana Unit of the UKA, as a contact man. LETEFF would be instructed to contact SKIPPER with the thought in mind of possibly having SKIPPER pull units of the OKKKK into the UKA.

On March 16, 1966 a meeting was held in the room of JACK HELM at the Holiday Inn, Monroe, Louisiana.

A general discussion was entered into by the Klansmen present regarding the finances of the UKA in the State of Louisiana. According to COY NEAL, GIL HARRIS former State Secretary of the UKA, had advised him following the state election on March 5-6, 1966 that the UKA had \$300 in the Bernice Bank, Bernice, Louisiana. Inasmuch as HARRIS and BOBBY GENE KELLEY did not produce the State Secretary and Treasurer records there was no way in which NEAL could check HARRIS' statement regarding the financial situation of the UKA. The Klansmen present decided that HARRIS and KELLEY had actually hidden the books from COY NEAL because they did not wish for NEAL to see how they had mismanaged Klan funds.

COY NEAL then called ROBERT SHELTON and requested SHELTON to determine if he had received the \$300 that FO(A P)¹¹ - (11

HARRIS stated was in the Bernice Bank and was due and owing ROBERT SHELTON at Tuscaloosa, Alabama. SHELTON stated he had not received any money from the State of Louisiana. COY NEAL then attempted to call GIL HARRIS at Bernice, Louisiana and when unsuccessful contacted BOBBY GENE KELLEY, former State Secretary. BOBBY GENE KELLEY stated that he had sent the check to ROBERT SHELTON and was advised by NEAL that this check had never been received. NEAL told KELLEY to stop payment on this check and that he, NEAL, would come to Bernice, pick up the money and then get a money order sending it to SHELTON.

Following this conversation COY NEAL left.

HOUSTON MORRIS and W. J. KIDD then had a conference with JACK HELM regarding the current internal strife in the State of Mississippi. JACK HELM promised to contact E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon of the UKA, regarding the internal problems being faced by that state. According to MORRIS Klansmen in the State of Mississippi are unhappy with the dictatorial method by which MC DANIEL is running the Klan in the State of Mississippi.

RALLY OF THE UKA AT FERRIDAY, LOUISIANA, MARCH 19, 1966

A rally of the UKA was held off of Deerpark Road, (US Highway 15) at Ferriday, Louisiana on March 19, 1966.

This rally began at approximately 7:30 P.M. and terminated at approximately 9:30 P.M.

Six deputy sheriffs from the Concordia Parish Sheriff's Office were present at this rally and assisted Klansmen in parking their vehicles. The principal speakers at this rally were JACK HELM and E. L. MC DANIEL. BILL WINDAM, Assistant Grand Dragon, State of Louisiana, was the Master of Ceremonies. JEFF FONTENOT was introduced as a Baptist Minister and he gave the opening and closing prayer.

BILL WINDAM, the Master of Ceremonies, gave a short speech and thanked local law enforcement for their assistance on parking cars off of the highway.

E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon State of Mississippi, spoke for approximately 30 minutes in which he critized the Federal Government and stated that the Klan was not going to stand for trouble in Natchez that it stood for in the previous Summer from Negro civil rights groups. MC DANIEL did not elaberate on what the Klan intended to do should the Negroes continue to demonstrate.

JACK HELM spoke for about 35 minutes before he lost voice. HELM has a bad case of laryngitis.

HELM spoke regarding the fact that he had been fired as the chairman of the New Orleans Selective Service

System. He urged all individuals present to sign up with the Ku Klux Klan. He also talked about his appearing before the HCUA in Washington, D. C., and the fact that he had lost his job in New Orleans because he was a Ku Klux Klansmen.

There was approximately 1000 people present at this rally and from 12 to 15 UKA security guards both from Mississippi and Louisiana. There was approximately 60 to 70 UKA Klansmen robed out.

"BOB" DUKE drives a 1963 Rambler, 4 door, 1966-67 Louisiana license 24F262. DUKE resides at 1612 South Ninth Street, Monroe, Louisiana. The motor number to this vehicle is G187959.

On 2/14/66, Miss EUNICE JOHNSON came to the Natchez RA and advised that she is a sister of FORREST JOHNSON and that both she and her brother are attorneys who share offices at 103 S. Nall St., Natchez, Miss. Miss JOHNSON also pointed out that her brother, FORREST JOHNSON, is very closely associated with the Miss-Lou Observer," a newspaper which is financed by her brother.

Miss JOHNSON stated that on Saturday, 2/12/66, she had been a defendent in a case brought by BILLY BEANE in which she was being sued for "malicious foreclosure" on a piece of property. Miss JORNSON stated that during the course of the trial, individuals whom she believed to be klansmen inasmuch as these six individuals were weering "Never" buttons in the lapels of their clothes, and since she recognized two of them as being EDDIE McDANIEL and L. C. MURRAY, she believed that the entire group were klansmen. She identified a third individual as being dressed in blue jeans with jumper and couboy hat and mose belt buckle was a large square buckle and this individual kept on his head a black cowboy hat at all times. She stated this individual impressed her as giving the appearance that he thought he was a movie star. (It is believed this individual was JACK SEALE). Miss JOHNSON stated that these six individuals took seats at the back of the courtroom and that she observed them winking, waving, and smiling at the jury. Miss JOHNSON stated that she felt the activities of these six individuals were out of. order in the court, but that Judge BONDS, who was sitting on the bench took no action whatsoever regarding the activities of these individuals at the back of the room.

Miss JOHNSON stated that she had been followed in her car by an individual driving a blue automobile (66 LN 182405), when she believed was identical with the individual whose name she could not call, but who was wearing blue jeans with a blue jumper and cowboy hat who eat in the courtroom referred to above. Miss JOHNSON stated that she resides on Fourth St. in Natchez, next door to the Dean Printing Company, and that one night a few weeks ago she heard an object hit the roof of her house, which sounded to her like a beer can striking the roof and that when she went to the front door and raised the shade, she observed this individual who had been following her in the blue atuomobile and whom she had seen in the courtroom on 2/12/66, standing across the street directly in front of her home.

Miss JOHNSON stated that she feels she is being harassed by the klan and that she was merely reporting the foregoing information to make it a matter of record in the event anything should happen to her, but she went on to explain that she was not actually fearful for her life but was merely reporting the information as a precautionary matter.

Miss JOHNSON was asked if she had related the foregoing information to the Chief of Police in Natchez and she stated she had not as yet done so as she was fearful that the chief would report the matter to his officers, who in turn would advise the klan and in this way the klan would know that their harassment tactics were apparently successful in that she had reported the matter to the police. It was then suggested to Miss JOHNSON that she report the matter to the Chief of Police and that she should explain to the chief her concern that the matter would be related by officers of the PD to the klan and that it was felt that the Chief of Police in Natchez would use good discretion and insure that the matter did not leak back to the klan.

Miss JOHNSON was further asked if she had reported this matter to the Natchez Bar Association in view of the

fact that she herself was an attorney and a member of this association and she stated that as yet she had not reported the matter to the local Bar Association but that she would discuss the matter with her brother and other attorneys; and if they should so recommend, she would then present the matter to the local Bar Association.

Miss JOHNSON was advised that her comments would be made a matter or record.

ROYCE MC PHAIL, Grand Dragon, State of Texas, advised there would be a rally sometime in the near future at Johnson City, Texas. This rally lasted from 8:15 to 9:30 P. M., January 8, 1966.

It was noted there were approximately 6 50 10 individuals from Hineston, Louisiana present at this rally.

DENLEY INGRAM advised they were representatives from Covington, Louisiana present.

Also recognized as being present at this rally was CLARENCE COBB, Exalted Cyclops of Jonesboro Unit #1, and JAMES WHEELER, Investigator of West Monroe Unit #2. On January 10, 1966 BILL WINDAM and HENRY SALLEY swore in approximately 16 members into the Rayville Unit of the UKA.

EILL WINDAM and COY NEAL met W. L. MC CANN and BOBBY MORGAN, formerly held position of Exalted Cyclops. at Tioga Unit, and First Name Unknwom ALEXANDER, who now holds position of Exalted Cyclops in the Tioga Unit.

BOBBY MORGAN is a member of the Tioga Unit but stepped down due to the fact he was accused of misappropriation of donations collected at a UKA rally in the Alexandria, Louisiana area.

The following is a description to the Unit meeting place from Monroe, Louisiana to Alexandria, Louisiana:

Driving on US Highway 165 South through Pollock, Louisiana towards Alexandria. Drive one and one quarter miles past the Grant-Rapides Parish line towards Alexandria turning to the left on a black top road. MALONE before reaching this sharp curve. There will be two large pine trees located on this curve. It is further noted that 3 security guards were located outside the Klavern meeting place. All three security guards had walkie-talkie radios and were speaking on Channel 10 of these radios. The first security guard was located near the Klavern door, the second security guard was located on a hill about 100 yards from the Klavern and the third security guard was located at the cattle gap or entrance to the road leading to the Klavern.

There were two cars with citizen band radio antenas parked outside the Klavern building. One of these vehicles was a 1955 Cadillac with a light tan bottom and a white top. The other was a white 1963 Chevwolet two door.

COY NEAL spoke to the Unit regarding the current pass word and new membership cards. NEAL learned that the unit did not know the current pass word nor did they have the new membership cards. NEAL furnished membership cards to the unit.

W. L. MC CANN' stated that BOB DANIELS, Nighthawk on the UKA State Board, had done nothing in the recent past to organize the klan in this measures. MC CANN stated this individual should be replaced.

MC CANN advised that the Colfax Unit meets on January 15, 1966 at 6:00 P. M. in Coldax, Louisiana.

W. L. MC CANN advised that MARVIN BRISTER is carried as a member of this unit but is scheduled to transfer to another unit in the Alexandria, Louisiana area in the near future.

COY NEAL, the Investigator of the Monroe Unit of the UKA, stated that he would attempt to return to this unit in the near future. W. L. MC CANN advised that the units in Alexandria, Louisiana had received no help whatsoever from the UKA State Board and they were highly appreciative of NEAL's efforts in that regard.

NEAL and stated that the Exalted Cyclops, BOB DEAN, had held a meeting of the Monroe Unit on the night of January 11, 1966 in DEAN's office and had sworn in a new man into the unit, who is employed at the Southern Equipment Company Monroe, Louisiana.

On January 13, 1966 TOMMY REAGAN contacted COY NEAL and stated that he had just returned from testifying before the HCUA committee investigating the Ku Klux Klan and had learned that they would begin receiving testificary from klain members in Mississippi in the near future, but would return to Louis iana and consentrate on this area inasmuch as WILLIS is a congressmen from Louisiana. NEAL advised TOMMY REAGAN that the UKA had sworn in units from Mangham and Rayville, Louisiana.

On January 13, 1966 JAMES EDWARDS accompanied by BOBBY GENE KELLY and GIL HARRIS inferred with COY NEAL regarding their testimony which they furnished to the HCUA. EDWARDS stated he was extremely satisfied with the way the hearing had turned out and that the Klan had received much good publicity.

LESTER BURLEW, the Assistant Exalted Cyclops, advised that a new man is ready to be sworn into the Winnsmoro Unit by the name of LAWRENCE ROE

LESTER BURLEW advised that the unit was presently investigating CLAUDE BINGHAM from Sicily Island, Louisiana, who had expressed an interest in joining the unit.

COY NEAL advised this unit that the Mangham Unit of the UKA had just been sworn into the organization and that this unit could attend meetings with them if they so desired.

Source advised that each person present was a "member" or being considered for "membership" in the "Silver Dollar" Group. Source advised that he believed that the "members" of the "Silver Dollar" Group were responsible for most of the acts of violence that had occurred in the Natchez, Missistippi and Ferriday - Vidalia, Louisiana areas. Source advised that he believed that those who are part of the group carry a silver dollar with an ampersand stamped on the face of the silver dollar. Source advised that those in attendance st this fish fry attempted to make black powder; however, they were not successful. He stated none of the group would take with them to Washington any of the requested information or records.

MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE of 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Mississippi, appeared at the home of ERNEST BUCHANAN PARKER, Rural Free Delivery Natchez, during the course of interview of PARKER. Special Agents identified themselves to SEALE and he voluntarily joined the Special Agent's conversation with PARKER.

SEALE admitted his membership in the United Klans of America at Natchez, that he had attended the rally of the United Klans of America in Natchez in May, 1965, volunteering that the program of the rally was poor and failed to maintain the interest of those in attendance. He explained that a tape recording which could not be heard was played in place of having a live speaker, and that he had been overruled by others as he had been against playing the recording.

SEALE maintained that the United Klans of America are against violence in racial matters and said that he had talked to his father (CLYDE SEALE) and his brother (JAMES FORD SEALE) about the United Klans of America and those of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi. SAM HOLLOWAY BOWERS, Imperial Wizard of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi, Laurel, Mississippi, was discussed and SEALE indicated a loss of understanding as to how BOWERS, who had been raised a Catholic and obviously an opportunist, could lead this group with success. He suggested that BOWERS income should be checked, and when asked how anyone operating a coin-operated vending machine business could loose money year after year, he stated this was almost impossible.

In connection with his whereabouts on August 27, 1965 at the time the automobile of GEORGE METCALFE was bombed in Natchez, Mississippi, SEALE stated that shortly after lunch he had been contacted by Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol

Investigator REX ARMISTEAD of Jackson who could verify his presence in Columbus, Mississippi, for a United Klans of America Rally. He stated he and others had been or were in the process of making the rounds of five United Klans of America Rallies in Mississippi. He did not return to Natchez for about one week after this.

With reference to the shooting of Reverend DONALD THOMPSON in Jackson, Mississippi, on the night of August 22, 1962, he stated he definitely was not in Jackson, had no direct information pertaining to this matter but could check his diary if necessary to determine actually where he was on this date.

SEALE stated he had no information that this father and brother were involved in the bombing of GEORGE METCALFE's car, that he would contact them in an effort to have them submit to interview by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

SEALE attempted to question agents concerning his possible appearance before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D. C., and whether travel, lodging expenses etc. would be paid by the Federal Government and he was referred to Mr. JOHN SULLIVAN of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, Vicksburg, Mississippi

MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, 172 Booker Road, Natohez, Miss., reportedly the Grank Knight Hawk, UKA, Natchez, advised SA INGRAM on 9/21/65 that he engaged his father CLYDE SEALE and brother JAMES FORD SEALE Meadville, Miss., in conversation on Sunday, 9/19/65 regarding their interview by the FBI. He told them both he had spent quite sometime with the FBI in Natchez and feels he fully understands the racial situation in regard to Klan activities and the role of the FBI.

JAMES said he would never submit to an interview unless the agency had a warrant because he did not trust any lawenforcement officer. His father agreed with JAMES and said he did not want to be bothered by the FBI and especially the State Police, whom he has a deep hatred.

JACK SEAIE advised that he travels all over the State for the UKA but in the event the FBI desires to contact him he will make himself available as Dogg as the FBI does not harass him to the extent he would have to stop seeing the agents.

He said he and the UKA are making inquiries re the bombing and in the event he obtains information regarding any suspects he will furnish this info. to the FBI.

MIRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, 172 Booker Road, Natchez, Miss., was contacted by SA JAMES 0. INGRAM on 9/17/65 at which time SEALE was questioned concerning possibly making his brother JAMES SEALE and his father CLIDE SEALE available for interview. He said "Are you trying to get me killed." It was explained that if we could make arrangements for JAMES to come to the FBI Office and discussed matters of mutual interest "cooler heads would prevail". The parties could have a designated time and placezant for themeetings. SEALE Said He has not approved of the methods used by the FBI and the MHSP toward his family and he truly hoped that some arrangements could be made in the future concerning interviews of his family as well as friends.

Re explained that he has never been friendly toward the FBI and has refused to talk with the FBI on occasions, however, he actually enjoyed the long session with SA's THOMMSON BERRY WEBB and INGRAM on 9/15/65 and believes he understands more clearly the Racial Situation in the State of Miss. He said he will make himself available at anytime in the future as long as he is treated in a manner that any citizen should be treated.

SEALS said he could not promise to arrange for interviews of his family, however, he would discuss this with his father CLYDE and JAMES this coming weekend. He said he would have to handle this matter in a roundabout manner explaining that he talked with the FBI the past week and would explain his position. He said his brother JAMES is a suspect in everything that happends and he maybe able to convince him it is better to keep the FBI advised of his activities.

SEALE advised he wanted to make it clear that his brother would not submit to an interview if a State Police Investigator was present since he and his family have a deep hatred for this agency. He also considered the meeting place would have to be awgy from the FBI Office since his brother and father have stated in the past they would never be taken to an FBI Office unless this agency had a warrant.

He said JAMES is a "hothead" and he would probadly want to set the terms of meeting with the FBI but he believed that he would impress upon JAMES this might be one of the best things JAMES has ever done." HANES also could probadly request he be contacted by only one agent but he was told no commitment could be made on this point since it has never been requested.

He stated he should be consocied Honday afternoon 9/20/65 and he would have the results of his talks with his family.

Upon parting SEALE stated " Send my check for my work to my address since you guys work well through pimps".
