INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY

ZENNIE WILLIAM FULLER, also known as
ROBERT FULLER
EXTREMIST MATTER - KLAN

This investigation was based on information which indicates that the individual is engaged in activities which could involve a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 241 (Conspiracy against rights of citizens); Section 245 (Federally protected activities), Civil Rights Act of 1968; or related Civil Rights Statutes.

Robert Fuller was formerly the Grand Dragon of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA). The OKA is no longer in existence.

Zennie William Fuller, also known as Robert Ruller, is a white male, married, lives at 1500 Sunset, Monroe, Louisiana, and is self-employed as owner of Fuller Sanitation, also 1500 Sunset, Monroe, Louisiana.

In December 1973, the OKA had not held monthly meetings for several months prior to that time because of the illness of Fuller, who was reportedly suffering from cancer. In March 1974, the OKA held a meeting at the home of Fuller and the purpose of the meeting was to give membership cards to four new men who had formerly been associated with another Klan group. In October 1974, Fuller stated that the OKA was defunct and the reasons cited were a lack of interest by members and the sickness of Fuller. In October 1975, Fuller was still in poor health and the OKA remained defunct.

ORIGINAL KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC.
(LOUISIANA) (OKA)

The records of the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 3, 1974, that Houston Morris and Robert Fuller formed the OKA after splitting away from the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) in December, 1964. The source advised that the OKA has as its purposes the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and the maintaining of segregation.

The above source also advised that Robert Fuller assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in February, 1965, after Houston Morris left the organization. The source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside the State of Louisiana.

STATE MEETINGS OF THE OKA

NO T-1 and NO T-2 have advised that FULLER attends the OKA state meeting and that is the only official meeting of the OKA as meetings on the unit level are no longer held. NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that generally the OKA state meetings are held either each month or every two months, and in the past year the state meetings have been held only occasionally. NO T-1 and NO T-2 both advised that FULLER has attended the following state meetings in 1972 and 1973:

Sources NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that the format for the OKA state meetings is generally social in nature and usually involves a barbecue meal for fish supper and unit representatives give reports on conditions in their areas. Political matters take up most of the discussion and the other prime area of conversation concerns the operation of the OKA sponsored private school, the Monroe Baptist Academy. Wives and children are invited to attend the meetings where meals are served. Both sources advised that during 1973, few meetings have been held because of the wet weather in the winter and spring which made it difficult for the rural members to attend.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that there has not been an election in the OKA since May 7, 1971, when FULLER was unanimously re-elected as Grand Dragon. Both sources advised that there has been no move among the members to hold an election and that FULLER continues as Grand Dragon.

Another prime topic of discussion has been the support of the private school sponsored by the OKA and called the Monroe Baptist Academy. These sources advised that wives of members often attend the meetings and the main theme of the meetings is concerned with current political problems. The sources further advised that the meetings are generally social in nature and are often followed with a barbecue-type meal served.

III. MISCELLANEOUS.

NO T-1, NO T-2 and NO T-3 all advised that FULLER acted as master of ceremonies at a public Klan rally held at Oak Grove, Louisiana, on June 20, 1970. At this rally, FULLER spoke briefly and introduced the Klan leaders to the audience. These sources further advised that FULLER frequently holds impromptu Klan meetings at his residence whenever the OKA has political literature to be distributed.

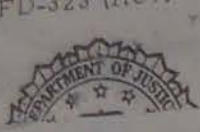



Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) on January 26, 1963, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnstoro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December of 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a result, a split in the OKKKK occurred. Houston Morris and Robert Fuller led the split and formed the OKA, according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that Houston Morris and Robert Fuller formed the OKA after splitting away from the OKKKK in December of 1964. The second source advised that the OKA has the same general purposes as the OKKKK; that is, the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and the maintaining of segregation.

The second source also advised that Robert Fuller assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in February of 1965, after Houston Morris left the organization. The second source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside of the State of Louisiana.

This second source advised on May 19, 1969, that the aims and purposes of the OKA remain the same with the exception that the OKA has several Klan units chartered in Arkansas, and the Arkansas Klan units are under the leadership of Robert Fuller, who continues to hold the position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana.

NO T-2 and NO T-5 advised that ROBERT FULLER was among a group of spectators at a public klan rally at Columbia, Mississippi, on May 12, 1967. The sources advised that FULLER in his speech urged that the klan try to build up the strength and he urged block voting by Conservatives.

On June 10, 1967, NO T-4 and on June 19, 1967 NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that FULLER had attended a public OKA sponsored rally at a drive-in theater at El Dorado, Arkansas on the night of June 10, 1967. NO T-2 and NO T-5 advised that ROBERT FULLER was among a group of spectators at a public klan rally at Columbia, Mississippi, on May 12, 1967. The sources advised that FULLER in his speech urged that the klan try to build up the strength and he urged block voting by Conservatives.

On June 10, 1967, NO T-4 and on June 19, 1967 NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that FULLER had attended a public OKA sponsored rally at a drive-in theater at El Dorado, Arkansas on the night of June 10, 1967. The sources advised that FULLER gave a brief talk in which he said that the OKA was a non-violent organization and would pursue goals of segregation in a non-violent manner.

NO T-1 advised on August 28, 1967 that FULLER had gone to Strong, Arkansas on August 23, 1967 with other Louisiana klansmen and had met with Arkansas klan leaders in order to expell an OKA member in Arkansas who had been speaking in favor of violence.

NO T-2 advised on September 1, 1967 that FULLER had attended the August 24, 1967 OKA meeting in Monroe, Louisiana, at the Monroe klavern, at which time a formal klan swearing in ceremony was held for all new OKA members who had come into the OKA in the last six months.

NO T-1 advised on September 7, 1967, that FULLER had attended the September 2, 1967 public rally sponsored by the OKA held at Oak Grove, Louisiana.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that ROBERT FULLER had attended the January 25, 1968 of Oak Grove OKA Units #1 and #2 and that the purpose of this meeting was to pass out new OKA membership cards.

II. CONNECTION WITH KLAN AND HATE-TYPE GROUPS

On June 20, 1966, NO T-2 advised that the Eudora Klavern of the OKA held a meeting on June 16, 1966, near Eudora, Arkansas. Approximately 35 members from the Oak Grove, Louisiana, klavern of the OKA were present, including FULLER, Louisiana Grand Dragon. The apparent reason for the Oak Grove visit to the Eudora klavern was to instruct the Eudora group in klancraft and procedures. FULLER was critical of the group for not using the proper handshake.

On June 20, 1966, NO T-2 advised that FULLER attended a meeting of the OKA near Oak Grove, Louisiana, on June 18, 1966. Approximately 250 people were present. Following a dinner at this meeting, a business meeting was held and initiations conducted. FULLER stated that when Klansmen are talking about the number of members in the Klan, they should greatly exaggerate the number of people actually in the Klan.

On June 24, 1966, NO T-8 advised that FULLER attended a Klan meeting of the OKA held in Eudora, Arkansas, on June 16, 1966. A discussion was held, and it was pointed out that the Eudora members should help in the OKA's efforts to elect JOHN HUNT for Public Service Commissioner.

Source further advised that on June 21, 1966, DAVID REEVES, a former Exalted Cyclops of the West Monroe UKA Unit, met with FULLER and other Klansmen as REEVES stated he was interested in bringing his former group into the OKA. FULLER explained to these Klansmen that the OKA was a political action group and did not condone any violence. On June 23, 1966, REEVES was taken into the OKA and stated that he would attempt to have a unit ready to be sworn into the OKA.

On June 25, 1966, NO T-4 advised that FULLER attended a public rally at El Dorado, Arkansas, on June 25, 1966. Approximately 70 robed Klansmen were present and 350 spectators. FULLER emphasized to the group that the Klan does not believe in violence but if other groups resorted to violence, the Klan would do so too.

On July 1, 1966, NO T-3 advised that HOUSTON MORRIS, King Kleagle of the UKA, stated at a UKA Exalted Cyclopes meeting on June 27, 1966, that members of the West Monroe Unit #1 of the UKA had joined the OKA, the latter group being under the leadership of FULLER.

On July 8, 1966, NO T-1 advised that GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL, head of the American Nazi Party (ANP) accepted an invitation to speak before Klan members in Monroe, Louisiana, on July 7, 1966. Efforts were made to use the Monroe OKA klavern, but FULLER would not permit this and informed the UKA leaders that he wanted nothing to do with ROCKWELL. FULLER said he would not meet with ROCKWELL and feels that an individual such as ROCKWELL should not be allowed in the area.

NO T-10 advised on July 13, 1966, that MARVIN PARDUE, a resident of West Monroe, Louisiana, and leader of a small Klan group, would get even with FULLER and LOY SCARBOROUGH, who according to PARDUE, had collected money to be used for the

defense of PARDUE's son. PARDUE's son is now serving time at the Louisiana State Penitentiary at Angola, Louisiana, in connection with an assault and battery charge. PARDUE stated that SCARBOROUGH and FULLER had kept the money collected rather than turn it over for the purpose it was originally intended. No mention is made of how PARDUE is to get even with FULLER and SCARBOROUGH.

On July 15, 1966, NO T-5 advised that MARVIN PARDUE was the leader of a Klan group which meets on Friday nights in West Monroe. This group was formerly affiliated with the OKA under the leadership of FULLER. PARDUE broke with FULLER in the OKA because FULLER and LOY SCARBOROUGH had double-crossed the Klan in that they had taken money intended for Klan use.

On July 18, 1966, NO T-2 advised that FULLER attended a public rally of the OKA at El Dorado, Arkansas, on June 25, 1966. There were about 200 Klan members present and an estimated 1200 spectators. ROBERT FULLER was able to sign up several new members.

On July 18, 1966, NO T-2 advised that the Eudora klavern of the OKA held a meeting on June 30, 1966, at Eudora, Arkansas. FULLER and his wife were among several Klansmen present. The purpose of this meeting was to organize a women's auxiliary unit. This women's unit was formed.

On July 18, 1966, NO T-6 advised that the regular monthly meeting of the OKA was held July 10, 1966, near Monroe, Louisiana. There is much dissatisfaction over the inaction of ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon. Many local Klan leaders feel that FULLER is holding them down and not allowing them to be more aggressive. E. L. MC DANIELS, a Klan leader from Natchez, Mississippi, was there and is attempting to have the Louisiana OKA merge with his group.

On July 18, 1966, NO T-2 advised that the Eudora Klavern held a meeting on June 30, 1966, near Eudora, Arkansas. Details of this meeting have been discussed in a previous paragraph of this report.

On July 25, 1966, NO T-5 advised that the regular weekly meeting of the independent Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana

was held on July 22, 1966. This Klan group is lead by MARVIN PARDUE who has an extreme hatred for FULLER and LOY SCARBOROUGH. PARDUE and other members of the group feel that FULLER and SCARBOROUGH have collected money for the Klan but have used the money for their personal use.

On July 25, 1966, NO T-7 advised that in June, 1966, JERRY HAYES who had broken away from the OKA after a dispute with FULLER, stated that he was organizing the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in Louisiana.

On August 9, 1966, NO T-9 advised that FULLER attended the Oak Grove OKA Unit meeting on August 2, 1966. The meeting dealt with the final plans for the rally at Oak Grove to be held August 6, 1966.

Source further advised that FULLER attended the Oak Grove rally of the OKA held August 6, 1966. Nine crosses were burned at this rally site and the rally lasted for two hours without any incidents. JACK SAUCIER gave a speech in which he stated the Communists were behind the civil rights movement in the United States.

NO T-8 advised on August 10, 1966, that a state meeting of the OKA was held August 7, 1966. E. W. PACE stated he was quitting the OKA because he differed with the political candidates which the OKA was touting. PACE stated that he did not believe that one man, referring to ROBERT FULLER, should dictate to the entire organization as to who the group should support. FULLER told the Klansmen present that if the Klan did not support one man completely, the group would have no political strength.

Source further advised that FULLER attended the OKA rally at Oak Grove on August 8, 1966. FULLER spoke denouncing integration and the civil rights movement in the United States. FULLER stated that the civil rights movement is backed by the Communist Party. Approximately 75 Klansmen and 300 spectators were present at this meeting.

On August 15, 1966, NO T-6 advised that the state meeting of the OKA was held August 15, 1966, at Monroe, Louisiana. FULLER was present although attendance was very poor. Very

little of importance was discussed because the Klan is widely split over recent political developments. Klansmen are almost in complete agreement about major candidates for Federal positions, but there is no agreement as to who the Klan should back politically on the local level.

On August 21, 1966, NO T-3 advised that an attempt was made to hold a UKA Titan Committee meeting on August 15, 1966. This committee had scheduled meetings for Monday nights in August in an attempt to get greater participation from members. On September 7, 1966, NO T-3 advised that on September 5, 1966, FULLER was at an initiation ceremony at

which time two former members of the UKA were taken into the OKA.

NO T-5 advised that the regular weekly meeting of the independent Ku Klux Klan, headed by MARVIN PARDUE, held a meeting on July 29, 1966. It was stated at this meeting that ROBERT FULLER had supposedly been contacted by a DOROTHY SNYDER of Monroe, Louisiana, for the purpose of having FULLER whip a Negro man, named ISAAC JACKSON. It was indicated at this meeting that FULLER would take some action against JACKSON, but the exact details are not known.

On July 18, 1966, NO T-3 advised that the independent Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana, which is lead by MARVIN PARDUE, met on July 15, 1966. PARDUE was formerly associated with FULLER, leader of the OKA.

On September 8, 1966, NO T-6 advised that FULLER attended an open meeting at the Masonic Lodge, Slidell, Louisiana, on September 4, 1966. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the possibility of opening a private segregated school. First speaker was FULLER who was introduced as being from Monroe, Louisiana. FULLER suggested that individuals from Slidell identify the parents of the Negro children and contact employers to have the Negroes dismissed from their jobs. This is the procedure that had been put into effect in Monroe, Louisiana.

On September 12, 1966, NO T-9 advised that the OKA held a monthly state meeting on September 11, 1966, in Monroe, Louisiana. Approximately 40 Klansmen were present, including FULLER. A RAY MORGAN stated that the security of the OKA should be increased and that all members should be contacted to have them pay their back dues.

On September 15, 1966, NO T-1 advised that FULLER attended a meeting of the Monroe OKA Unit #1 on September 12, 1966. A practice ceremony was held regarding the swearing in and initiation ceremonies of the OKA.

Source further advised that FULLER attended the OKA Oak Grove meeting on September 13, 1966. FULLER spoke and

On August 15, 1966, NO T-17 advised that FULLER recently paid HOUSTON MORRIS, a UKA Klan leader, \$21 for a printing bill which FULLER owed MORRIS.

On September 28, 1966, NO T-11 advised that ROBERT FULLER told a group of Klansmen that he wants ROYAL YOUNG to become active in the Klan and help organize the OKA in the Shreveport, Louisiana, area.

On September 29, 1966, NO T-12 advised that the Klan in the Tallulah, Louisiana, area is presently divided into two groups. One group is headed by BILL and WAYNE PRESLEY and the second group is headed by ROBERT WEEMS. WEEMS has stated that he has joined with ROBERT FULLER.

On September 30, 1966, NO T-8 advised that the OKA held a rally near Bastrop, Louisiana, on September 24, 1966. There were approximately 50 Klansmen present and 900 spectators. ROBERT FULLER spoke against the Federal Government interfering with the integration in the south.

On October 3, 1966, NO T-9 advised that the OKA held a state meeting on October 2, 1966, at Monroe, Louisiana. About 35 Klansmen were present at this meeting. Discussion centered around a recent news release by Monroe Chief of Police JAMES KELLY concerning UKA records which came into his possession. FULLER spoke out in favor of the action taken by KELLY and said that KELLY had no choice but to release the information.

NO T-7 advised on September 23, 1966, that on September 16, 1966, JERRY HAYES, leader of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana told members of his organization that the OKA membership card held by GERALD GATES, a former OKA member, should be obtained and returned to ROBERT FULLER.

On September 23, 1966, NO T-13 advised that FULLER is planning to have 300 men at a football game in Tallulah, Louisiana, on September 16, 1966. These Klansmen are to be present to keep Negroes away from the game should they attempt to come into the area of the game.

Louisiana. FULLER was among approximately 35 OKA members present. E. W. PACE of Rayville, Louisiana, appeared at the meeting and stated that he was interested in coming back into the OKA and felt he would be able to convince the old Rayville Unit to rejoin the OKA.

On November 10, 1966, NO T-9 advised that several leaders of the OKKKK are dissatisfied with the leadership of MURRAY MARTIN. Although no official plans were made, these leaders stated that it may be possible to influence LOY SCARBOROUGH, an OKA leader, to convince FULLER to merge with what remains of the OKKKK if MURRAY MARTIN is willing to give up his position as Grand Dragon. No definite date was set to contact leaders of the OKA.

On November 17, 1966, NO T-1 advised that the OKA held a state meeting on November 6, 1966, in Monroe, Louisiana. Details of this meeting have been discussed in previous paragraphs of this report.

On November 17, 1966, NO T-8 advised that ROBERT FULLER attended a meeting of the East Carroll OKA Unit. FULLER gave a short talk to the members on how to obtain new members and the process of investigating these prospective members.

On November 21, 1966, NO T-15 advised that the Junction City, Louisiana, klavern of the UKA is not meeting. An individual known as SHORTY PYLE was talking to several members of this unit and told JESSE PEPPER that he would talk to him at a later date about ROBERT FULLER. The exact nature of this conversation is not known.

On November 30, 1966, NO T-1 advised that the OKA held a rally at Edwards, Mississippi, on November 19, 1966. FULLER was among approximately 100 Klansmen who attended. An attorney by the name of NICK HAMILTON of Oak Grove, Louisiana, spoke about the need for the preservation of the segregation of the races.

On November 30, 1966, NO T-1 advised that the Bastrop, Louisiana, OKA Unit met on November 22, 1966. ROBERT FULLER displayed copies of the new Kloran and the Konstitution. FULLER stated that this material would go on sale at a dollar
