Several klansmen paid membership dues, which amount to \$2.00 a month. There was a discussion of plans for a Klan rally to be held on Old Bastrop Road at Bastrop, Louisiana, on Friday night, October 18, 1968, beginning at 7:30 PM. This klan rally is sponsored by ROBERT FULLER's klan group, although members of WKKKKOL have been invited to attend the rally. It is expected that several members of WKKKKOL will attend the rally at Bastrop, Louisiana, on 10/18/68.

It was stated that BOBBY L. GARRETT was in Glenwood Hospital and was expected to have surgery for a ulcer on 10/10/68. The comment was made that GARRETT had been on a hunting trip with other members of the klan

group on 10/5/68, and he entered the hospital upon his return from the hunting trip. Members of WKKKKOL voted to send flowers to BOBBY GARRETT at the hospital.

A Klan rally sponsored by ROBERT FULLER's Klan group was held at Bastrop, Louisiana, on Friday night, October 18, 1968. There were about sixty to seventy-five people present at the rally, including sixteen or seventeen, in robes, of FULLER's Klan group; there were five members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana (WKKKKOL) present, but they were not wearing robes. There were five speakers on the platform at this Klan rally and those speakers were as follows:

ROBERT FULLER, who was wearing a robe and who spoke against unauthorized cross burnings and stated that Klansmen should cooperate with the police to avoid trouble.

Reverend H. L. DRISKELL, who has been active in the Citizen's Council and who has spoken at Klan rallies before .

E. S. BOLTON, who bills himself as the Chairman of the Constitution Party and who has spoken at Klan rallies on previous occasions.

An unknown individual, who holds the position of Grand Tital of ROBERT FULLER's Klan group.

JACK SAUCIER, who was not wearing a robe and who spoke about the Vietnam war situation.

There were no members of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) recognized at this rally.

The rally consisted of the usual Klan cross burning ceremony, using a cross about thirty to thirty-five feet tall. There were also the usual Klan speeches given by those on the platform.

It is noted that BOBBY L. GARRETT was released from the hospital on October 18, 1968; however, he did attend this rally.

No information regarding JOE ROWLAN is known subsequent to his quitting the WKKKKOL and moving to Eros, Louisiana, several months ago.

The regular weekly meeting of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana (WKKKKOL), was held on Wednesday night, October 16, 1968, at the residence of TOMMY REAGAN, on Hickory Street, West Monroe, Louisiana. There were only five Klansmen present for this meeting and they were as follows:

TOMMY REAGAN

BOGGIE HEARNE

JIMMY GRIFFIN

HAROLD GROSS

JIMMY WORKS

This was a short meeting, starting around 8:30 P.M., and terminating at 9:45 P.M.

It was announced that BOBBY L. GARRETT was in Glenwood Hospital for surgery because of an ulcer. It was stated that WKKKKOL was sending flowers to him.

HAROLD GROSS announced that there had been an explosion at Pardue's Bait Stand on Jonesboro Road, West Monroe, Louisiana. He indicated that the explosion had been within the last few days, and he stated that he helped PARDUE put the door to the place up and repaint it. There was no explanation of the alleged explosion, although according to GROSS, PARDUE suspected that Negroes had caused the explosion.

MARVIN PARDUE was formerly a member of WKKKKOL.

TOMMY REAGAN stated that J. E. LEE was working long hours and did not feel that he had time to attend Klan meetings. REAGAN stated that LEE was thinking about quitting the Klan.

It was announced that ROBERT FULLER's Klan group was holding a Klan rally at Bastrop, Louisiana, on Friday night, October 18, 1968, and members of WKKKKOL were urged to attend the rally. It was indicated that it was expected that several members of WKKKKOL would attend that rally.

MEETING OF MONROE OKA UNIT.

On November 21, 1968, the Monroe OKA Unit held a meeting at the home of KENNY EUBANKS on Dawnview Drive in Monroe, Louisiana. EUBANKS is the Exalted Cyclops of the Unit and he and ROBERT FULLER the Grand Dragon of the OKA presided over the meeting. HUGH MOORE who has been inactive the past few months in the OKA attended the meeting and said that he would become active and attend meetings regularly again. Others at the meeting included the following:

The principal purpose of the meeting was to discuss the proposed taxes that the Louisiana Legislature will be trying to pass in their special session. FULLER and EUBANKS urged that members be united in their opposition to any form of new

taxes and after some discussion it was decided that the Unit would send telegrams to all representatives and senators in Northeastern Louisiana asking them to oppose any new taxes. It was also decided that each member should call at least one State Representative and voice an opinion opposing taxes.

Other discussion centered the possibility of looking for a new Klavern site for the Unit. It was noted that since J. C. OLIVER is no longer active in the Unit and the Unit no longer has access to the old Klavern on his property that members should be on the lookout for a possible location for a Klavern for the Unit.

The next meeting was called for November 29, 1968, and ROBERT FULLER advised that he would be agreeable to having the next meeting at his house.

MEETING OF MONROE OKA UNIT.

On November 29, 1968, the Monroe OKA Unit held a meeting at the home of ROBERT FULLER, 1500 Sunset Drive, Monroe, Louisiana. Those present besides FULLER were the following:

HOUSTON KING,
WILLIAM FULLER,
JACK SAUCIER,
KENNY EUBANKS,
HUGH MOORE,
DAVID BARNES,
HUBERT SPRUILL,
BILL HEAD,
JOHN CASTLE,
JOE HOBBY,
T. B. CRUSE.

ROBERT FULLER the Grand Dragon of the OKA presided over the meeting and the first order of business was the wearing in of a new member HOUSTON KING, of Otis Street, West Monroe, Louisiana. KING is about 47 years of age and works as a dredger on the Mississippi River. His wife's name is RUTH.

The next item of business concerned arranging to send flowers to the father of JACK BARNES in Harrison, Arkansas. BARNES' father died during the week and FULLER stated that since it was too far to travel to attend the funeral that the Unit should take up a donation and sent flowers.

The remainder of the meeting was taken up with reading of an article which appeared in the Thunderbolt magazine in which a BOB MC COY of Mississippi claimed that he had been informant for the FBI. FULLER read the rather lengthy article in which MC COY claimed that he had been paid large amounts of money and MC COY claimed that his conscience convinced him that he should no longer work with the FBI and should tell his story to a newsman. Discussion on the article after it was read FULLER commented that he had met MC COY on two or three different occasions and said MC COY has probably exaggerated his story a great deal.

FULLER stated that he received the article earlier that afternoon from FERRALL MC CORMICK of Jackson, Mississippi, who met in Tallulah, Louisiana, after calling for and telling him that he wanted him to have the article. MC CORMICK stated that he remains inactive in the klan and said that the klan has almost been put out of business in

the Jackson area because of the efforts of the FBI.

The meeting was closed with the announcement that the monthly OKA State meeting would be held on Friday night, December 6, 1968, at Oak Grove, Louisiana.

On December 6, 1968, the monthly Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America (OKA) meeting was held at the Oak Grove Klavern. This meeting began at approximately 7:00 p.m. and the grand dragon, ROBERT FULLER, presided over the meeting. There were approximately 30 klansmen present.

The meeting was opened with the opening prayer being given by Reverend JACK BARNES, who is the pastor of the Winnsboro Road Baptist Church, Monroe, Louisiana.

FULLER requested that unit dues be paid through the secretary and while the dues were being paid the meeting would carry on and FULLER introduced a visitor from Conway Arkansas, ROBERT BLACKWELL, who had very

long hair and another person with BLACKWELL, name unknown.

FULLER asked if there was a motion to change the state meeting place and time. SEDRIC SEAMANS made a motion that the meetings continued to be held on Friday nights at Oak Grove, and it was seconded by MONTEE BOYTE.

A report was given that eight new members had been received by the West Carroll Units.

FULLER announced that J. C. OLIVER, a former member of the OKA, had asked him if he wanted to begin meeting at the old klavern in Monroe again and if so he and his sons would be glad to become active again.

A brief discussion was held on the security of klan meetings and on security of klan members. It was suggested that if the klan state meetings are returned to Monroe, that a guard would be placed at the entrance of the road that goes to the klavern and this person would be required to check every man, woman and child thoroughly before he would be permitted to enter. Also, membership cards would have to be marked paid up as far as dues were concerned. If this person entering did not have proper identification at the gate, he would be held up until either cleared or verified by someone

who was at the meeting and was considered to be in good standing.

The Grand Dragon announced that the election for new Grand Officers for the OKA would be held the first Friday in May, 1969. He indicated that the present Grand Officers and Great Officers commissions were still good and also that the new Grand Officers or the old Grand Dragon would probably want to select and appoint appropriate his own leaders and officers.

OWEN DUNCAN then announced that he had recently been in Mississippi and talked to Mrs. ROBERT MC COY, who was formerly from Florence, Mississippi, and she indicated that her husband had recently received a lot of money, or that she had a lot of money and her husband was after it. DUNCAN stated that it was the general belief of the klansmen in Mississippi that ROBERT MC COY was an informant for the FBI and it had been reported that MC COY had been paid approximately \$80,000 for evidence that various homes had been planted with dynamite in Mississippi. He stated information indicated MC COY had tried to frame FARRELL MC CORMICK,

along with B. C. CUPSTID at the klavern in Jackson, Mississippi, which is located behind the JIM WALTER's home on Highway 80, West.

DUNCAN advised that the frame up of MC CORMICK and CUPSTID apparently happened approximately one and one ^{years} half ago.

FULLER stated that ROBERT BLACKWELL had indicated there were about 15 or 20 men in the Conway, Arkansas area who wanted to join the original klan and most of them had previously been members of the United Klans of America.

FULLER stated he would like to get with these men, but on his terms and he would like for this meeting to be as soon as possible. He told BLACKWELL to contact the men in Conway, and set a date and notify him.

BILL TURNER, the Grand Titan, gave a short speech concerning the security of the klan and the secrecy of its members, pointing out that members should be very careful on what they say and who they say it to.

JACK HAMILTON, a member of Oak Grove Unit Number Two, reported his unit had taken in three or four new members in the past two weeks and felt his unit would be growing much faster than it had in the past.

The meeting was then turned over to Reverend JACK BARNES, who gave a brief religious talk on the klansmen's purpose and stated that the Grand Dragon had now joined his church and was attending Sunday school regularly. He stated the Grand Dragon had quit drinking and felt that he had done a lot of good for the organization. The meeting was then closed by a prayer given by JACK BARNES.

Item #7 - West Carroll Exalted Cyclops reported they had taken in some new members and they had more prospects they were considering.

Item #8 - Ladies of West Carroll reported they were doing good.

Item #9 - Brother JACK reported how proud he was that the Klan had remembered him in his time of sorrow and thanked them for the flowers they had sent to his Daddy's funeral.

Item #10 - Grand Dragon had news clipping read of Klansmen who were actually in FBI who was under cover.

Item #11 - Meeting was adjourned by prayer on December 6, 1968, at 9:00 p.m.

On January 8, 1969, the Bastrop Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.; (OKA) Unit held a special meeting at the residence of C. V. FLOWERS. This meeting began at approximately 8:00 p.m., and ended about 9:30 p.m. There were eight Klansmen present as follows:

C. V. FLOWERS

WOODROW KELLY

OWEN DUNCAN

LOUIS MC KEE

FNU WILSON

BOBBY CHURCH

FLOYD STOCKS

JACK WATKINS

WOODROW KELLY presided over the meeting as Exalted Cyclops. JACK WATKINS gave the opening pray.

C. V. FLOWERS stated this meeting was called for the purpose to determine what every member that had been summoned or possibly would be summoned to give dispositions in the law suit which had been filed against the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club and the Klan in Bastrop. He also pointed out there should be a determination made as to what

questions the members would answer. A long discussion was then held on this matter and it was decided that each member who was summoned would take the fifth amendment and not answer any questions other than give their name and address.

FLOWERS stated that he was going to court to a hearing on January 9, 1969, and that he would take the fifth amendment because he did not know enough to answer questions other than GROVER STEPHENSON was a member of the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club about four years ago. He stated that STEPHENSON had been sworn out of the club about four years ago and about one month before he and WOODROW KELLY left the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club and came into the OKA.

WOODROW KELLY stated that he would not be able to say anything because he did not know what to say, and therefore would take the fifth amendment. KELLY stated that C. V. FLOWERS and RAY MORGAN had previously signed an affidavit admitting that they knew GROVER STEPHENSON was a member of the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club four years ago and knew that he was the secretary of the unit and he had left the Unit prior to the time when the booby trap went off.

C. V. FLOWERS then reported that he had heard that GROVER STEPHENSON had given attorney PAUL KIDD, who is the attorney for the BULLOCK family, approximately 33 names that were members of the klan.

OWEN DUNCAN stated that RAY MORGAN, C. V. FLOWERS, and WOODROW KELLY would not have to answer any questions unless their attorney was present at the time the dispositions were to be given. DUNCAN also stated that members of the unit should be aware that a newspaper in Bastrop had recently published an article stating that the schools in Bastrop and Moorehouse Parishes were to be integrated in the fall of 1969. He stated it was his belief that PAUL KIDD was actively fighting for the BULLOCK family, insomuch as he was trying to break up the Klan in Moorehouse Parish.

DUNCAN then told members present to contact those who were not at the meeting and tell them not to make any threats towards attorney KIDD that he was being paid by the BULLOCK family to do a job just like NICK HAMILTON, an attorney for the Klan. He further stated that it was not hurting the OKA as much as it was the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA) because members of the OKA have not advocated any type of violence, and the OKA has never been proved guilty of any crime other than not mixing with Negroes.

At the close of the meeting DUNCAN reported that the Grand Dragon of the OKA, ROBERT FULLER, wanted all of the OKA officers and any other OKA member to meet him at 2:00 o'clock on January 9, 1969, at the Moorehouse Parish Courthouse, prior to giving the dispositions.

The purpose of this gathering was to discuss what questions would be answered by the Klansmen in giving the dispositions in the law suit filed against the Klan. It was agreed that no questions would be answered other than giving name and address on the basis of the first, fifth, and fourteenth amendments of the constitution.

The Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, stated that he has never had any dealing with GROVER STEPHENSON, or members of the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club. He stated he possibly knew some of the members but did not know anything about their activities. He stated that the bombing at the Moorehouse Hunting and Fishing Club klavern was a stupid criminal act. He said the man that would do something like that should be put in a mental institution or jail. He stated he did not know anything about the bombing other than what he had heard of read in the newspapers.

It was learned that JACK HAMILTON, member of the Oak Grove OKA Unit 2, was driving a 1963 or 1964 Lincoln Continental, light green or gray, in color. License number 1968-69 Louisiana 84 F 832.

MEETING OF MONROE OKA UNIT

The Monroe OKA Unit held a regular weekly meeting on the night of January 23, 1969 at the home of ROBERT FULLER, 1500 Sunset Drive, Monroe, Louisiana with the following members present:

The major topic of conversation centered around the trial of two Negroes for the murder of a white woman in Monroe. FULLER stated that he did not want anyone from the OKA attending the trial since there had been rumors that the WKKKKOL was going to have men there to see that justice was done. FULLER said that the Sheriff's Office was alerted to the fact that some Klansmen might try to cause trouble and that they would be severely dealt with, so it was important that the OKA stay away from the trial. FULLER said he doubted that the WKKKKOL would be foolish enough to attempt to try anything especially since all their members are known to the Sheriff's Office, and also it was quite certain that the Negroes would be convicted anyway.

A collection for flowers for KENNY EUBANKS' father was then taken up as his father is in serious condition at a Monroe hospital.

FULLER said that Concordia Parish Deputy Sheriff FRANK DE LAUGHTER contacted him on the night of January 16, 1969 in Monroe after having appeared in Federal Court that day on a Civil Rights charge. FULLER stated that DE LAUGHTER was drinking pretty heavily at the Pla-Boy Lounge in Monroe and was apparently afraid that he might be sentenced to prison. He said that DE LAUGHTER also mentioned that a Monroe bar owner had a case against him and he was worried about that. DE LAUGHTER wanted to know where the Monroe bar owner lived but FULLER said he told him that he did not know and could not afford to get involved with the local police.

The meeting was adjourned after about 35 minutes when EUBANKS said that he had to leave to go visit his father.

The Grand Dragon stated that every house that comes up for sale in Monroe, Louisiana, was trying to be sold to a Negro.

The Grand Dragon explained how they were doing there cards for 1969.

The Grand Dragon requested our prayers for the sick that we have.

West Carroll reported they were doing fine.

The West Carroll Ladies reported that they were doing fine, just needed some new members.

There was a new Grand Chaplain appointed and the old Grand Chaplain will retain the post of Deputy Grand Chaplain.

Morehouse reported that they had not been doing too much lately on account of their trouble.

The Grand Dragon expressed his appreciation for the men that came to Bastrop for him.

There was a discussion on the organizing of a Third Party.

The new Grand Chaplain made a talk on how he felt we should improve our image, and how we could improve our-

selves, and how we should work together. He expressed his appreciation for the appointment.

The meeting was closed at 9:05 with a prayer and veil of secrecy."

The new Grand Chaplain reported in the minutes is JACK BARNES of Monroe, Louisiana, and the Deputy Grand Chaplain is MONTE BOYTE of Oak Grove.

MISCELLANEOUS

E. W. PACE is still a Grand Aide in the OKA and is still self employed as a farmer living on Highway 80, Post Office Box 16, Start, Louisiana, and he drives a 1964 white over blue Oldsmobile, four door with 1969 Louisiana License 80F049.

KEN EUBANKS is the Exalted Cyclops of Monroe OKA Unit and the Grand Kligrapp (Secretary) of the OKA. He lives at 1520 Dawniew Drive, Monroe, Louisiana, and continues to sell Life Insurance for the National Bankers Life Insurance Company. He drives a 1968 Mercury with 1969 Louisiana License 29X663.

CHARLES EDGAR RAYMOND is still active in the Oak Grove OKA Unit and it is believed that he still retains his secretary position in the Oak Grove OKA Unit number 1.

JAMES T. OLIVER has been inactive in the OKA in the past several months and no longer holds an active officers position in either the Monroe OKA Unit or the State OKA. OLIVER is not believed to have a propensity for violence. OLIVER has been in poor health and it is not anticipated that he will become active in the klan again. He still resides at Route 1, Box 90, Monroe, Louisiana, drives a 1966 Chevelle with 1969 Louisiana License 3F641 and is still employed by the Louisiana Highway Department.

JACK SAUCIER is a Grand Aide to the Grand Dragon of the OKA and also holds the position of Great Titan for Ouachita Parish. SAUCIER continues to reside at 809 Eighth Street, Monroe, Louisiana, and he is now employed as a foreman for Fuller Sanitation Service, 1500 Sunset, Monroe, Louisiana. Source will obtain automobile data on SAUCIER.

On February 14, 1969, the regular weekly meeting of the Bastrop Unit of the UKA was held at the residence of a member, M. E. CONRAD from 8:00 to 9:00 PM with seven present as follows:

The meeting was opened with prayer by MCLEMORE and SAM PAGE, Exalted Cyclops of the unit, presided.

The only business discussed at the meeting was the status of the civil suit which was filed in local court against members of this Klavern. The discussion centered around what attorney or attornies the members would retain to defend them in this court action and it was recommended that all members retain attorney, NICK HAMILTON of Oak Grove, Louisiana. No decision was made on this but all members agreed to meet with HAMILTON in the near future to discuss

this plan.

MCLEMORE stated that he had retained LEMMIE HIGHTOWER, an attorney from Bastrop and BUFFINGTON stated that he has his own attorney also.

It is noted that this is the first meeting of the unit that BUFFINGTON has attended in over a month. After the above lengthy discussion the meeting was closed with prayer by MCLEMORE.

After the meeting MORRIS and KIDD left early to meet with JEFF FONTENOT at Collingston, Louisiana, to discuss the matter of retaining the same attorney for their defense in the Bastrop case. FONTENOT stated that he would talk to NICK HAMILTON first but felt that he might retain his own attorney. It is noted that FONTENOT has not been active in the klan for some time.

It is also noted that on February 12, 1969, ROBERT FULLER, Grand Dragon of the OKA, contacted HOUSTON MORRIS, Grand Dragon of the UKA and suggested that everyone subpoenaed in the Bastrop civil suit case retain NICK HAMILTON, attorney of Oak Grove, inasmuch as this would be cheaper to have just one attorney. This matter is not settled but MORRIS and KIDD stated they have retained J. C. PARKERSON an attorney in Monroe

and it is known that other members have retained their own attorney's.



On February 7, 1969, the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) held its monthly State meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, Klavern. This meeting was called to order at approximately 8:00 P.M. with prayer being given by JACK BARNES the Grand Kludd of the OKA.

There were approximately 50 Klansmen present for this meeting. Those recognized as being present are as follows:

From the Bastrop Unit:

E. W. PACE was present from Richland Parish.

It was observed that BILL TURNER, THOMAS WYLIE of the Oak Grove Unit # 1 was absent as well as KENNY EUBANKS of the Monroe Unit.

The minutes of the previous State meeting were read and approved.

The Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, then began by saying that he was very proud to see a large turnout for this meeting and then had each representative from the various units to present a report from their units.

LOUIS MC KEE reported for the Bastrop Unit that everything was going pretty good even though there was a law suit filed against the Klan in Morehouse Parish.

He also stated he was surprised at the number of members from the Bastrop Unit in attendance.

OWEN DUNCAN was then given the floor and brought up the matter that the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, was behind in collecting for identification cards for the past year and for the current year. He stated that FULLER was in the red by \$37.50 for the identification cards.

DUNCAN suggested that a donation be taken up to take care of the old bills. A total of \$44.00 was then collected and donated to the Grand Dragon.

DUNCAN then reported that he was sorry that BILL TURNER of Oak Grove Unit # 1 was not present. He stated that one of TURNER's sons was in the hospital in Monroe, Louisiana.

DUNCAN also stated that KENNY EUBANKS could not attend the meeting because his mother was in the hospital.

DUNCAN then gave a report on the law suit filed against the Klan in Morehouse Parish and urged all of those present that they should take the law suit very serious as it could cost some of the members a large sum of money.

DUNCAN stated that he had learned GROVER STEVENSON had been released from the case as a defendant and felt this was very suspicious on his part. He stated that when the suit was filed, GROVER STEVENSON had requested some help and that DUNCAN obtained the services of NICK HAMILTON as well as having WOODROW KELLY, C. V. FLOWERS and RAY MORGAN sign an affidavit to the effect that GROVER STEVENSON was not connected with the United Klans at the time the boobie trap went off in October, 1967, or two years prior to that.

DUNCAN stated that STEVENSON has now been released of all liability in the suit even though the three men who signed an affidavit for his help are still named as defendants.

DUNCAN suggested that the Klan hire another lawyer to help defend the Klansmen in this law suit.

E. W. PACE, SR., of Richland Parish, was then given the floor and stated that the people in Richland Parish were giving OK. He stated that several men in Richland Parish were still using a Klan building and thought they might join the Original Klan in the near future.

BOYKIN MC LAIN, the Great Titan of West Carroll Parish, Louisiana, gave his report and stated all was well in West Carroll Parish.

The Grand Dragon asked SEDRIC SEAMANS if he had anything to say about the above and SEAMANS replied that he did not.

The meeting was then turned over to JACK BARNES who stated that he had been interviewed by the FBI recently and felt that someone had squealed on him, but did not believe it was a Klansmen that had furnished the information because he had not spoken at any rallies in the state and he had only spoken at the State OKA meetings. The meeting was then adjourned at approximately 10:00 P.M., with prayer being given by JACK BARNES.

On 2/4/69, the Bastrop OKA Unit held its regular meeting at the residence of E. W. PACE, JR., 1813 S. Elm St., Bastrop, La. The meeting began at approximately 8:00 PM, and ended around 9:30 PM. There were ten members present as follows:

BOBBY CHURCH

E. W. PACE, JR.

WOODROY KELLY

JACK WATKINS

OWEN DUNCAN

C. V. FLOWERS

LOUIS MC KEE

DAVID THOMAS

The opening prayer was given by JACK WATKINS and the meeting was presided over by the EC, WOODROW KELLY. After the opening ceremony, WOODROW KELLY opened the meeting for discussion on who the unit would support for the upcoming election for Mayor of Bastrop. OWEN DUNCAN suggested that the unit would back the present Mayor, JOHN TULLEY, and that the second choice would be EUGENE RICHARD, who is a plumber in the Bastrop area.

C. V. FLOWERS suggested that members approve of DUNCAN's suggestion and that no one should support Mr. COCHRAN, as he was not worth anything to be running for a position such as the Mayor.

LOUIS MC KEE then made a motion that all members of the unit support JOHN TULLEY for Mayor and RICHARD for the #2 position, should TULLEY not be the elected Mayor, and it carried 100%.

A motion was also made that CHARLIE PATRICK be defeated as one of the City Councilmen as he had been trying to demote the Fire Chief of Bastrop.

WOODROW KELLY then stated that the School Board in Morehouse Parish had received an order apparently to integrate the schools in Morehouse Parish in the Fall, 1969. He stated that the unit might as well get ready for a lot of trouble in the fall if the Federal Government started bringing in outside agitators and Negro kids to integrate the schools of Morehouse Parish. KELLY seemed to be afraid that the integration problem in Morehouse Parish would have to be settled in the streets. JACK WATKINS stated that he was ready for anything to happen and was very much against any integration in Morehouse Parish.

C. V. FLOWERS stated that he believed GROVER STEPHENSON had turned states evidence in the law suit filed against the klan in Morehouse Parish and that he believed STEPHENSON had given Chief KELLY of the Monroe, La. PD, and the FBI, the records of the Original Klan in 1962, when it broke up in Morehouse Parish and at that time it was known as the Morehouse Hunting and Fishing Club. FLOWERS stated that he had never been back to the klavern building since the split-up of the Original Ku Klux Klan and formed two separate organizations in Morehouse Parish as the

Original Ku Klux Klan of America and the United Klans of America. He stated it was his opinion that all of the current members of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America followed with ROBERT FULLER and that the rest had followed HOUSTON MORRIS and GROVER STEPHENSON and formed the United Klans and are using the klavern building on the Hamburg Rd. as their meeting place, which was formerly the meeting place of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America. FLOWERS also said that ROBERT FULLER had recently said that he had never been inside the klavern building on the old Hamburg Rd. since 1962, and felt that all members of the Original Klan should not be involved in the damage suit as they have not been members of the Morehouse Hunting and Fishing Club since about 1964.

The following paid dues as indicated to OWEN DUNCAN:

C. V. FLOWERS - \$24.00 for the complete year 1969.

E. W. PACE, JR. - \$12.00 for six months.

LOUIS MC KEE - \$6.00 for three months.

WOODROW KELLY - \$24.00 for one year.

Dues in amount of \$24.00 for one full year paid for E. G. LUCKY, who was not present.

OWEN DUNCAN - \$24.00 for one year.

FLOYD STOKES - \$4.00 for two months.

FLOYD STREETER - \$6.00 for three months.

BOBBY CHURCH - \$4.00 for two months.

HUBERT AULDS, who was not present, had previously paid \$12.00 for six months.

Just prior to the close of the meeting, DUNCAN advised everyone to attend the upcoming State meeting at Oak Grove, if possible, on 2/7/69. The closing prayer was given by JACK WATKINS and the meeting was adjourned.

JACK SAUCIER continues to reside at 809 S. 8th St., Monroe, La., and is believed to be employed with ROBERT FULLER in the sanitation business in Monroe, La. He is currently the Grand Aid to the Grand Dragon of the OKA. He is believed to own a Plymouth Valiant, license number unknown.

E. W. PACE continues to reside on Hwy. 80, near Start, La., and is self-employed as a farmer. He was last known to own a 1964, blue and white, Oldsmobile, license number unknown. He also was known to have the position of Grand Aid in the OKA.

On the morning of March 1, 1969, various members of WKKKKOL were at HAROLD GROSS' Garage near West Monroe, Louisiana. Among those present were:

HAROLD GROSS,

TOMMY REAGAN,

JIMMY WORKS.

Discussion among the klansmen indicated that HAROLD GROSS claimed to have received a telephone call from ROBERT FULLER on February 26, 1969, in which FULLER allegedly told GROSS that WKKKKOL had become involved in the civil suit at Bastrop, Louisiana, in which two young boys were injured in an explosion at the klavern building near Bastrop were suing various members of the klan for damages sustained in their injuries.

Comments made by TOMMY REAGAN indicated that he had been to Bastrop, Louisiana, on February 28, 1969, and had talked with GROVER STEPHENSON, a former klansman at Bastrop. REAGAN reported that STEPHENSON, an employee at the Chevrolet dealer location in Bastrop, was reluctant to discuss the klan except to say that he had not been connected with the klan in five years and that he wanted nothing whatever to do with the klan

at this time.

Comments by the klansmen at GROSS' Garage on March 1, 1969, revealed that TOMMY REAGAN had made arrangements for representatives of WKKKKOL to meet with CLARENCE BOYKIN in Bastrop on the night of February 28, 1969.

Further comments by klansmen at GROSS' Garage on March 1, 1969, revealed that HAROLD GROSS, TOMMY REAGAN, and LEE CRAWFORD had gone to Bastrop on Friday night, February 28, 1969, and had met with CLARENCE BOYKIN, after considerable difficulty in contacting BOYKIN. Comments by REAGAN and GROSS indicated that had had a long meeting with BOYKIN around midnight of ~~Friday~~ night, February 28, 1969, and had learned from BOYKIN that WKKKKOL had not been mentioned in connection with the civil suit in state court at Bastrop, Louisiana, in which the two boys that were injured at the klavern building at Bastrop, Louisiana, were suint members of the klan because of injuries sustained by the two boys. GROSS and REAGAN both appeared to be convinced that the report that WKKKKOL had now become involved in the suit at Bastrop, Louisiana, was unfounded. The discussion among the klansmen at GROSS' Garage on March 1, 1969, revealed that GROSS, BOBBY GARRETT and TOMMY REAGAN had been fishing together on February 28, 1969.

JIMMY WORKS, HAROLD GROSS, and TOMMY REAGAN discussed the fact that WAYNE WORKS had again been arrested late Friday, February 28, 1969, on charges arising out of the shooting into the residence of a local Negro leader around December 26, 1968. These klansmen stated that they did not understand why WAYNE WORKS had been rearrested after the charges had been dropped a couple of weeks earlier.

HAROLD GROSS commented that the rearrest of WAYNE WORKS was because of an informant in WKKKKOL, and he stated that the identity of the informant would now have to be revealed in connection with the prosecution of the charges against WAYNE WORKS.

JIMMY WORKS commented on March 1, 1969, that he still had the citizens band two way radio to be installed in his car; his comments indicated that he and TOMMY REAGAN had exchanged cars a day or two earlier so that REAGAN could install the citizens band radio in WORK's car; however REAGAN has not installed the radio.

The name BUCK ROBERTS of Bastrop, Louisiana, was mentioned by HAROLD GROSS as one of the Klansmen at Bastrop that might be contacted by WKKKKOL concerning the report that members of WKKKKOL might be named as defendants in the suit at Bastrop in which two boys that were injured at the klavern

building are suing various members of the klan.

TOMMY REAGAN and HAROLD GROSS commented that CLARENCE BOYKIN blamed GROVER STEPHENSON at Bastrop for furnishing BOYKIN's name to the court as the person to whom STEPHENSON had turned over klan records about five years ago when STEPHENSON quit the klan.

On February 13, 1969, the West Monroe United Klans of America (UKA) Unit held its regular weekly meeting at the West Monroe Klavern. This meeting began at approximately 8:00 p.m. and ended at approximately 9:00 p.m. with seven Klansmen present as follows:

LEE ALDERMAN,
JAMES WHEELER,
JAMES PAYNE,
FRED MARCHBANKS,
SAM JONES,
W. J. KIDD,
HOUSTON MORRIS.

FRED MARCHBANKS gave the opening and closing prayers and LEE ALDERMAN presided over the meeting as Exalted Cyclops.

SAM JONES gave a report of an article appearing in the Communist Newspaper, The Daily Worker, on the Boys Club and he reminded those present they should be on the lookout for this type of activity in the Monroe area.

W. J. KIDD who was appointed as the political educator of the unit gave a report on the organization of the American Independent Party in Louisiana. KIDD stated

that the party was being formed and there was to be an organizational meeting in Ouachita Parish at the Ouachita parish library on March 6, 1969.

A discussion was then had on the return of the lease of the Klavern Building to Mr. GUESS, the owner of the property in which the Klavern was located and a committee was then appointed to do this. Those appointed were:

LEE ALDERMAN,
JAMES WHEELER,
JAMES PAYNE,
KEITH HAMMONS, who was absent.

A long discussion was then held concerning the plans to build a new Klavern Building in West Monroe and to use this building during the daytime by the private school in West Monroe, named the Dixie Private School Corporation. After a long discussion on this matter it was decided to delay any action until later in the year.

A discussion was then held on the status of W. C. MAYES, a long-time member of the West Monroe Unit who was ill or in poor health and could not attend meetings regularly. A motion was then made and passed unanimously to make MAYES an honorary life member of this unit.

After the above matter had been discussed the meeting was then closed.

After the closing of the meeting it was learned that ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated (OKA) and HOUSTON MORRIS, The Grand Dragon of the United Klans of America had met at ROBERT FULLER's home on February 12, 1969 whereby they discussed the obtaining of an attorney to represent the Klansmen in the law suit filed against the Klan in Bastrop, Louisiana. Apparently NICK HAMILTON, an attorney from Oak Grove, Louisiana, was willing to represent some members of the UKA, but would not represent under any circumstances HARLAN MC LEMORE, DARWIN HAMILTON and SAM PAGE all of the Bastrop UKA Unit. Apparently HAMILTON was going to represent numerous members of the OKA in Bastrop in the law suit. It was learned that HOUSTON MORRIS had obtained the services of JOHN PARKERSON an attorney in Monroe, and that W. J. KIDD would have him as his attorney also.

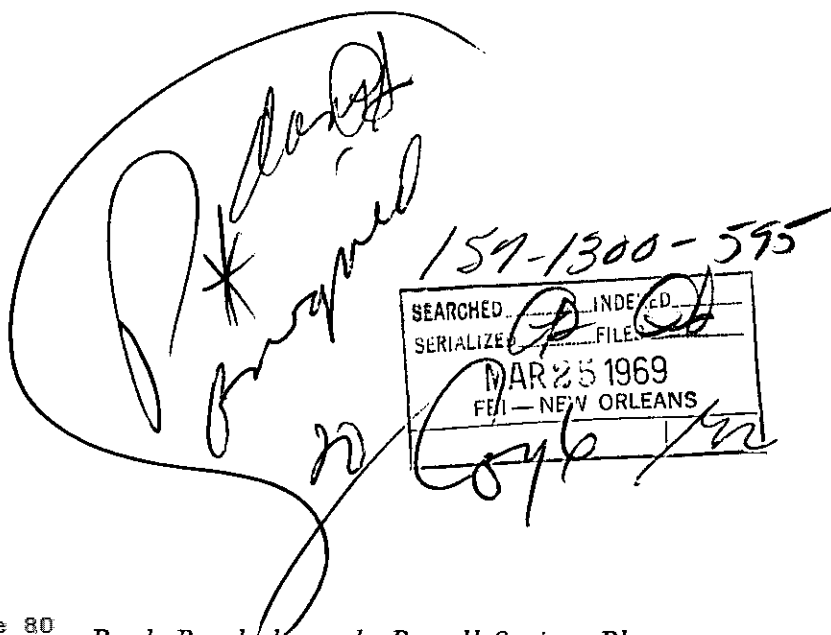

On February 18, 1969, the following group of OKA Klansmen met at Lucky's Lounge, Bastrop, Louisiana with attorneys NICK HAMILTON and DON CARROLL from Oak Grove, Louisiana, to plan strategy in the law suit filed against the Klansmen in Morehouse Parish, as a result of a booby trap explosion in October, 1967 at the UKA Klavern injuring two boys:

ROBERT FULLER, Grand Dragon

JACK SAUCIER

OWEN DUNCAN

LOUIS Mc KEE

C.V. FLOWERS

E.W. PACE, JR.

TOMMY WEEKS

CECIL CLIBURN

RAY MORGAN

JACK WATKINS

J.B. WILLIS

TILMON RINEHART

This meeting began 8 PM and the Grand Dragon of the OKA, ROBERT FULLER, was in charge. FULLER stated that he had contacted the Grand Dragon of the UKA, HOUSTON MORRIS, and

asked him to call all of his members in the UKA to have them meet at FULLER's home on February 12, 1969. FULLER indicated that MORRIS was the only one to attend this meeting. He stated the public was to determine if MORRIS wanted members of the UKA to be represented by NICK HAMILTON and DON CARROLL. He stated he had contacted OWEN DUNCAN about this meeting and DUNCAN told him he was against this idea of having members of the OKA and UKA to meet at the same time as the UKA had taken away from the OKA members its meeting place a few years ago and that another squabble would probably begin as a result of another meeting.

FULLER then turned the meeting over to NICK HAMILTON and DON CARROLL who then gave a run down on what the charges were against the OKA Klansmen and stated they would represent each OKA Klansman charged in the law suit for \$150 per member if they were certain they were not connected with the UKA for the last three years. He stated he would defend the OKA members as a group. HAMILTON indicated that he and CARROLL would refuse to defend SAM PAGE, DARWIN HAMILTON, M.E. CONRAD, and HARLAN Mc LEMORE because he had information they were meeting in the building used by the Bastrop UKA which is also known as the Morehouse Hunting and Fishing Club at the time the booby trap explosion occurred. He stated he did not want to be involved with those men.

HAMILTON related that he would attempt to bring the case to a quick trial and try to have it thrown out and if he did not fail, he would try to appeal the case into the Supreme Court. He stated he had heard that the attorney for the plaintiff, PAUL KIDD, had made a statement that he was not just fighting for the BULLOCK family, but primarily was fighting the Klan and was going to expose all of the Klansmen in Morehouse Parish.

ROBERT FULLER stated that he was going to hire a private investigator to investigate attorney, PAUL KIDD, because he had heard KIDD had defended a group of civil right demonstrators at Ruston and Shreveport, Louisiana areas.

J.B. WILLIS stated he had heard from a reliable source that KIDD belonged to an organization known as the American Youth Festible Community and that organization had been described by J. EDGAR HOOVER as a subversive youth group, communist inspired and had been named as a communist organization.

JACK SAUCIER stated he had heard KIDD belonged to the organization, Students For Democratic Society, which was also printed as a communist organization.

Prior to the close of the meeting, HAMILTON requested a count of those who desired his services, and all 12 Klansmen indicated they wanted his services.

RAY MORGAN stated he had visited with the Imperial Wizard of the UKA, ROBERT SHELTON, at the Federal penitentiary at Texarkana, Arkansas. He stated SHELTON told him that the United States Government and bunch of Negro lovers as well as the Federal Bureau of Investigation had intimidated him just like they always try to do. He stated SHELTON was apparently financially broke, however, he maintained high spirits and was more determined than ever to fight for the things he believed in. RAY MORGAN indicated that as soon as the current schoold year was over, he was going to move his family to Texarkana, Arkansas.

Just as this meeting began, HOUSTON MORRIS and CLARENCE BOYKIN, members of the UKA in Bastrop, attempted to gain interest to the meeting, but were turned away by the Grand Dragon of the OKA and NICK HAMILTON.

The meeting was presided over by the AXG, OWEN DUNCAN and the opening and closing prayers were given by JACK WATKINS.

OWEN DUNCAN introduced the visitors from Monroe to the members of the unit and then identified the new unit officers to the visitors for the up coming year.

It was announced by the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, and OWEN DUNCAN that a unit barbecue which would be open to the public, would be held on April 2, 1969, providing the

weather was O.K. It was suggested that OWEN DUNCAN contact various businessmen at Bastrop to obtain money or food for the barbecue and that any donations are to be sent to ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon at Monroe, Louisiana. The Grand Dragon stated that he had already accumulated \$364 to be used for the barbecue during the summer of 1969.

The Grand Dragon urged the members of the unit not to interfere with any activity of Mr. BULLOCK, the father of the boy that was injured as a result of a booby trap explosion at Morehouse Hunting and Fishing Club in October, 1967.

The Grand Dragon announced that the OKA state elections would be held in May, 1969, and urged those present to attend the up coming state meeting on March 7, 1969 at Oak Grove, Louisiana.

The meeting was then closed with prayers given by JACK WATKINS at approximately 9:30 PM.

C.L. COOK is believed to continue to be an active member of the Monroe OKA Unit. He resides at West Monroe, Louisiana, and is self-employed as a mechanic; his automobile is unknown.

MONTEE BOYTE continues to reside in East Carroll Parish, Louisiana, Highway 2, Route 3, Box 126, Lake Providence, and continues to be self-employed as a farmer and also drives

a school bus for the East Carroll Parish School Board. He is the Kloudd of Oak Grove OKA Unit Number 2. He owns a 1967 Chevrolet, two-door, yellow in color, bearing 1968-69 license 83 F 231.

BOYKIN Mc LAIN continues to reside at Forest, Louisiana, is self-employed as a barber in Oak Grove, Louisiana, and owns a 1965 Plymouth, four-door, blue in color, which has 1968-69 Louisiana license 83 F 405. He also owns a 1963 Chevrolet pickup truck, blue in color, which has license number 112-232. He continues to be the Great Titan of the OKA in West Carroll Parish.

5. West Carroll Unit 43 reported they were holding their grounds and were doing OK
6. At 7:40 P. M. security guards of the K.B.I. Entered Building and everyone was checked of their cards for identity. They also checked the building for information unknown.
7. West Carroll Unit #1 reported they were doing O.K. But have had a lot of sickness.
8. Grand Dragon expressed that his line was tapped and to be careful what you say when you call him on the telephone.
9. Grand Dragon expressed he wanted Security guards at these meetings.
10. Monroe reported they were growing and doing fine.
11. Oak Grove announced they were having Revival on March 16, 1969, everyone was invited.
12. Monroe announced their revival would begin March 23, 1969,
13. Grand Chaplain expressed his concern for support in his up coming Revival. He expressed that a Klansman being a Christian with Gods Leadership couldn't be wrong.
14. Grand Chaplain stated that he appreciated the fact that we were searched tonight along with our building because he felt like we were being protected, Together we stand, Apart we fail.
15. Grand Dragon asked that we remember Barbecue at the park in bastrop on May 2, 1969.
16. Grand Dragon expressed that we had some good secret members that were helping our organization.
17. Meeting was closed at 8:50 P.M. with Prayer by the Grand Chaplain.

MINUTEMEN AND SILVER DOLLAR GROUP

On Thursday, March 20, 1969, about 6:45 PM, DON WILKENSON, Minutemen Network Commander from Natchez, Mississippi, contacted E. D. MORACE at MORACE's home at Vidalia, Louisiana. The two men talked of the effect of Minutemen Psy-War Project Number 51, and both men expressed disappointment that there was no publicity about the two rockets they shot. WILKENSON said that authorities were keeping the matter quiet.

WILKENSON said that he was expecting something big from Minutemen headquarters. WILKENSON said he had another smaller project and needs one pound of black powder and a foot of dynamite fuse. MORACE said he was fresh out of dynamite fuse and had not been able to locate any black powder. They talked of the black powder in possession of JAMES SCAROBROUGH and the fact that KENNETH NORMAN HEAD could get powder from him, as they were friends still. They made plans to contact HEAD on March 22, 1969, and have him obtain black powder.

WILKENSON asked MORACE to talk to R. J. GLOVER, as GLOVER seems disappointed in the Minutemen and needs some encouragement.

On March 21, 1969, R. J. GLOVER contacted E. D. MORACE at MORACE's house at Vidalia, Louisiana. GLOVER took MORACE to his, GLOVER's, pickup. From under the front seat GLOVER took an old newspaper in which was wrapped a Benson Fruit Cake Box. Inside the box was an explosive device which was red in color and seven inches long. This device was about three-fourths of an inch in diameter, and the inside device was filled with a blue-colored substance and had an electric cap and two red wires attached to it. It appeared to be an underwater explosive. GLOVER asked MORACE to keep this device for him and told him not to drop it or jar it.

GLOVER and MORACE talked of Minutemen Psy-War Project Number 51, and GLOVER said he had been sick or he would have helped shoot the rocket. MORACE said he shot it alone, and everything went all right.

MORACE asked GLOVER how he felt about the Minutemen, and GLOVER said he was disappointed. He said, when they started in the Minutemen, the organization was supposed to be able to furnish explosives, but it seemed to be the other way around. E. D. said the Minutemen was all they had left, and GLOVER said they still had the Silver Dollar Group (SDG). He said the weather had been too bad each weekend or he would have already called for a meeting of the SDG.

On Saturday, March 22, 1969, DON WILKENS and E. D. MORACE attempted to contact NORMAN HEAD at HEAD's home and at various bars in Ferriday, Louisiana but did not locate HEAD.

On Thursday, March 27, 1969, R. J. GLOVER contacted E. D. MORACE at the Ford Garage, Ferriday, Louisiana, where MORACE is employed. GLOVER was driving his old pickup truck. GLOVER said he had been to see ED FULLER about FULLER's forthcoming trial on a civil rights violation. He stated he wanted to help FULLER and was going to Monroe to see Klan leader ROBERT FULLER.

GLOVER talked about JOE HARDY, who is facing trial at Natchez for car theft. GLOVER said there will be Negroes on the jury, and he may be able to help HARDY. GLOVER said there is a Negro who works near him at Armstrong Tire Company in Natchez, and he has helped this Negro, and the Negro owes him a favor. GLOVER said that he might be able to work something out with this Negro and keep HARDY from being convicted.

On Saturday, April 5, 1969, R. J. GLOVER contacted E. D. MORACE at the Ford Garage, Ferriday, Louisiana. GLOVER called MORACE to his pickup truck and from the floorboard

took a carbine rifle and asked MORACE to keep it while he was gone to Monroe, Louisiana. GLOVER said a friend was coming by to take him to Monroe, and he would leave his pickup parked by the Ford Garage.

MORACE observed the carbine looked like the same one GLOVER had at the bar pit near Ferriday, almost two years ago, when MORACE had shot it and it fired fully automatic. GLOVER did not say whether it was the same carbine. The weapon is described as a U. S. Carbine, Caliber 30-M-2, Serial Number 7218764. On the action were the words "Inland Div.," and on the forward part of the barrel were stamped the words "Inland Division, General Motors." The weapon had a lever on the action, which lever usually regulates whether an M-2 carbine fires semi-automatic or fully automatic.

On April 6, 1969, R. J. GLOVER and E. D. MORACE met at the home of MORACE. GLOVER asked about his carbine, and MORACE said it was in a safe place. GLOVER said he would get it soon. GLOVER said he went to Monroe and contacted Klan leader ROBERT FULLER at FULLER's plumbing office. He said FULLER was going to help FRANK DE LAUGHTER, BLACKIE DRANE, and ED FULLER in their forthcoming trial. GLOVER was impressed with ROBERT FULLER and said FULLER had a big Klan

organization at Monroe. He suggested FULLER could help get the Klan reorganized at Ferriday, Louisiana. MORACE did not seem impressed with the idea, and no plans for reorganizing the Klan were made. GLOVER said FULLER showed him the material that MURRAY MARTIN had given the Congressional Committee in about 1966.

JAMES HORACE TAYLOR

JAMES HORACE TAYLOR contacted E. D. MORACE on March 31, 1969, and said he was trying to get his bills paid up. He said he still owes Pasternack Store in Ferriday, Louisiana \$125.00 and, if he gets this paid, he may move to South Louisiana, where his wife is from.

RESIDENCE OF R. J. GLOVER

On March 27, 1969, R. J. GLOVER advised E. D. MORACE that his wife has moved back to Natchez from Kentwood, Louisiana. GLOVER said his wife is now working at a drugstore in downtown Natchez, Mississippi on a part-time basis. He said they still visit their old home place in Kentwood, Louisiana some weekends. GLOVER said they are considering buying a house in Natchez but for the present are staying with his stepson and his wife's son, PETE, who lives in Natchez, Mississippi. Also, they stay some

nights with Mrs. GLOVER's sister, who lives on North Commerce Street in Natchez, just south of the Bienville Apartments.

JAMES CALVIN HARRIS

JAMES CALVIN HARRIS continues to reside in the Levens Addition, Ferriday, Louisiana, and HARRIS is still employed by the International Paper Company, Natchez, Mississippi. HARRIS still drives a 1963 Chevy II, two-door sedan. HARRIS is no longer a member of the Minutemen, as he was expelled by Squad Leader E. D. MORACE when MORACE took over the Minutemen in Louisiana in the fall of 1968.

On March 7, 1969, the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated (OKA) held its monthly state meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana Klavern. This meeting began at approximately 7:30 PM and ended around 9:45 PM. There were approximately 25 to 30 klansmen present. The meeting was called to order by the Deputy Grand Kludd MONTE BOYTE and the opening prayer was given by the Grand Kludd JACK BARNES. After the opening ceremony the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER made a few remarks about the attendance of those from the Monroe Unit and also the lack of attendance by members of Oak Grove OKA Unit 1 of which W. H. TURNER is the Exalted Cyclops. FULLER stated that apparently members of the Oak Grove Unit 1 had become disinterested in klan activities therefore had not been holding regular meetings nor were they attending state meetings. FULLER then asked representatives from the Bastrop Unit to give their monthly report. JACK WATKINS of the Bastrop Unit reported that the Bastrop Unit was growing and that several old time members had indicated they would become active again when the law suit against the klan in Morehouse Parish had been completed. He stated that JOE ENTRICAN had indicated he would join the

OKA when the trial was over. He also stated that CLARENCE BOYKIN, a former member of the UKA was thinking about joining the OKA.

WATKINS suggested to the members of the OKA that their meetings should be more secret in the future due to the fact too many people are aware of the klan's activities and the klan was supposed to be a secret organization. He also stated that too many people knew of the membership of the klan.

BOYKIN McLAIN, the Great Titan of West Carroll Parish gave his monthly report for Oak Grove OKA Unit 2. He stated that the Oak Grove Unit 2 was doing fine however, Oak Grove Unit number 1 was not doing too well. He stated that several members of both Units were not present at this meeting and he would attempt to find out why several members of these two units were not attending meetings.

McLAIN was interrupted in his report by several klansmen coming into the Klavern who were led by SEDRIC SEAMANS, the Klokan for the OKA to check the building for bugging devices. Those were accompanying SEAMANS in the search of the building were HUGH MOORE, C. V. FLOWERS, LOUIS McKEE, D. H. THOMAS, BOBBY CHURCH. They were carrying

guns. They checked each klansmen's identification cards and all the walls in the building as well as briefcases carried by some of the klansmen. It was believed these klansmen were looking for a transmitter or some type of recorder and when they had completed their search it was apparent they did not find any bugging device.

SEDRIC SEAMANS then gave a report of two Taverns in East Carroll Parish whereby the owners were allowing teenagers and Negroes to be served in the Taverns. It was pointed out that this matter should be reported to the local law enforcement authorities in case of any trouble arising out of the serving of Negroes and whites in the same Tavern.

OWEN DUNCAN made an announcement that a public barbecue would be held at the park in Bastrop, Louisiana, on May 2, 1969, and requested that all OKA klansmen attend this barbecue. The Grand Dragon suggested that the wives of the klansmen prepare some of the food especially potato salad and cakes.

The closing prayer was then given by JACK BARNES the Grand Kludd of the OKA.

There were four guest present at this meeting three from Monroe and one from Bastrop. The Exalted Cyclops, W. B. RUSSELL, Jr. was in charge of the meeting and the prayers were given by MONTE BOYTE, the Klud.

After the opening ceremony the meeting was turned

over to the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, who gave a report on how klansmen could be banished from klan organizations as follows:

Conduct unbecoming of klansmen,

Attempts to involve klan in personal affairs,

Misuse of klan funds,

Accepting applications and initiation fees from ones unworthy to become members.

Failure to teach and practice klan kraft.

Continuous efforts to induce klansmen to commit acts of violence.

Misappropriation of other klansmen's property.

Corporation with the enemies of CHRIST, race and nation.

Those are dedicated pimps and informers for the enemy.

FULLER reported that the above items were received by him in the form of a letter from the Imperial Office of the National Knights of Ku Klux Klan JAMES R. VENERABLE from Tucker, Georgia.

SEDRIC SEAMANS was then given the floor and made a report that two Taverns located just east of the West Carroll

Parish line were serving Teenagers and both Negroes and whites and that they could buy whiskey and beer anytime they had the money. SEAMANS felt that something should be done about this matter. The Grand Dragon then stated that he didn't know what to tell SEAMANS because he had changed from what he used to be in that he did not believe in any type of violence or any trouble. He stated that probably the local law enforcement officers should be advised of this matter so that they could take care of it, especially the serving of teenagers.

After a brief bull session the visitors were then excused from the meeting at approximately 9:00 PM and they returned to Bastrop and Monroe, Louisiana.

On April 4, 1969, the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., (OKA) held its regular state meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, klavern. This meeting began at approximately 8 PM and ended around 10:30 PM. There were approximately 20 klansmen present for this meeting. There were representatives from the Monroe OKA Unit, the Bastrop OKA Unit and both Oak Grove OKA Units #1 and #2, present. The following klansmen were recognized as being present:

Prior to the opening of the meeting the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER, announced that a Mr. TOWNSEND was present to show a movie that he had with him on LSD. It was explained that this movie was prepared to show to the military by the Navy Department. It was believed that this was a training film for the Navy. The film lasted for approximately one hour. After the film had been finished a donation of \$40 was collected and given to Mr. TOWNSEND.

The Grand Dragon then led the meeting and stated that all klansmen should teach their children against any form of intergration and also to stay away from Negroes and then a long discussion was held on the matter of intergration.

The Grand Dragon then asked for the reports of the various units and OWEN DUNCAN reported that the Bastrop Unit was doing fine and was holding up on any recruiting due to the law suit filed against the klan in Morehouse Parish.

The Grand Dragon reported that the Monroe Unit was in the process of taking in some new members. There were no reports given by the Oak Grove Units as the representatives from Oak Grove stated they did not have anything to say.

The Grand Dragon announced that the OKA state elections would be held at the next meeting at Oak Grove on May 2, 1969 and for each member to think about who they want to elect for the state officers before the next meeting.

Prior to the close of the meeting information was received that BILL TURNER the Exalted Cyclops of the Oak Grove Unit #1 had not been to a state meeting in approximately three months and that BILL RUSSELL, the Exalted Cyclops of the Oak Grove Unit #2 was absent. Information was received that members of both Oak Grove units were fighting among themselves and that several members of these units had not been to any unit meetings or state meetings in several months.

There was no other business to be discussed therefore the meeting was closed with prayer being given by the Deputy Grand Chaplain MONTEE BOYTE.

TROY WILLIAMS continues to be an active member of the Oak Grove OKA Unit #2 and is the treasurer of this unit. He continues to reside at Route 3, Box 147, Lake Providence, Louisiana, and is self employed as a farmer in East Carroll Parish, Louisiana, and also he and his wife own a restaurant in Oak Grove, Louisiana, named HAZEL's Cafe. WILLIAMS continues to own a 1965 black over maroon Ford, four-door, which has 1968-69 Louisiana license 4F764 and a 1966 Ford pickup truck red and white with current Louisiana license number 564-862.

The main discussion at the meeting centered around the Head Start Program. Most of the members had expressed an opposition at using the Monroe City Schools in the program and especially the Ruffin School which is located near where most of the members live and which most of the members fear would be used by Negroes. FULLER stated that he has been talking to several people and claimed that he had inside information that the Monroe City School Board was not going to permit its schools to be used in the Head Start Program. This appeared to satisfy most of the members and the conversation on this subject dropped after FULLER stated that they would wait and see what happened at the Monroe School Board meeting before making any further plans.

The rest of the meeting centered around an introduction of the three new men and the meeting broke up after coffee was served.

On May 18, 1969 several members of the OKA gathered at the funeral home in Oak Grove, Louisiana, to pay tribute to HUBERT AINSWORTH a member of the OKA who had died of a heart attack the previous day.

MATT TAYLOR of one of the Oak Grove Units of the OKA was overheard to say that he had learned that GROVER STEPHENSON of Bastrop, Louisiana, was working with the FBI and that he had turned over the records of the klan to them. OWEN DUNCAN told TAYLOR that he understood the FBI had investigated GROVER STEPHENSON and it was a well known fact by OKA klansmen in Bastrop that STEPHENSON was an informer for the FBI.

MATT TAYLOR was also overheard to state to OWEN DUNCAN that JIMMY TURNER of Oak Grove, Louisiana, could not be trusted. He stated that JIMMY TURNER had purchased a new home, a new car and was employed at a job that was earning only \$35.00 a week. OWEN DUNCAN told TAYLOR that he knew nothing of JIMMY TURNER's activities but it would not hurt to watch him and check on him to find out what his activities were. DUNCAN stated that he knew that when JIMMY TURNER had been a KBI man for the OKA there were several bad things

reported on him.

MATT TAYLOR also stated that BILL TURNER's group had been having trouble and had intended to let BILL TURNER go because he had not attended any state meetings nor had he attended any unit meetings in several weeks. He stated that until TURNER had come to the state meeting on May 2, 1969 the Oak Grove units had voted to dismiss BILL TURNER from the OKA but since he came to the state meeting on May 2, 1969 they had postponed their action on TURNER.

SEDRIC SEAMANS a member of one of the Oak Grove OKA Units stated that he had made attempts to call C. V. FLOWERS, the Grand Klokan on several occasions and could never get him to come to Oak Grove and that he meaning FLOWERS always made an excuse not to come. SEAMANS stated that the units in Oak Grove had unanimously selected him to become the Grand Klokan should C. V. FLOWERS step down from this position. It was SEAMAN's opinion that FLOWERS should step down from the Grand Klokan positions because he hardly ever attended any state meetings. SEAMANS stated that he had not received the approval of the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER to become the Grand Klokan but thought he would receive the approval if FLOWERS would step down.

SEDRIC SEAMANS was also overheard to say that W.

B. RUSSELL, Jr. could not be trusted and that the Oak Grove Units were investigating him for some of his activities that he had conducted in the Oak Grove area. SEAMANS stated that RUSSELL had been replaced as Exalted Cyclops of the Oak Grove OKA Unit number 2.

At approximately 9:30 PM on May 18, 1969 the Grand Dragon of the OKA ROBERT FULLER and JACK BARNES the Grand Kludd of the OKA arrived at the funeral home at Oak Grove and talked with OWEN DUNCAN, BOYKIN McLAIN, MATT TAYLOR and W. B. RUSSELL, Jr. and four or five others who were talking in the group. FULLER stated that he had been able to get the Headstart program out of his neighborhood in Monroe, Louisiana, through talking with several politicians in Monroe. JACK BARNES stated that a representative of the Headstart program had contacted him and offered him a large sum of money for the use of the Winnsboro Road Baptist Church as a Headstart school but he stated he refused this man. BARNES stated that also a man came to his church with recommendations from a preacher from New Iberia, Louisiana, and told him that this preacher in New Iberia had told him the Winnsboro Road Baptist Church in Monroe was a klan meeting place. BARNES and ROBERT FULLER then stated they believe that the man who came to Monroe was planted there

by the FBI so they could investigate BARNES and his activities. BARNES stated that he believed there was someone watching him every day and every night.

After FULLER and BARNES went into the Funeral home to observe the body of HUBERT AINSWORTH they left the funeral home stating they were going to stop in Delhi, Louisiana, and gave no reason why they were going to stop in Delhi.

On May 2, 1969, the OKA held its monthly State Meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, Klavern. This meeting began at approximately 8:00 P.M. and adjourned at about 10:30 P.M. There were approximately 30 Klansmen present for this meeting, and the Monroe OKA Unit, the Bastrop OKA Unit and the two Oak Grove OKA Units were represented at this meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER and JACK BARNES, the Grand Kludd gave the opening prayer and led the veil of secrecy.

The Grand Dragon began the meeting by asking the members if they had any person picked out for the Grand Dragon's position, for the next year. OWEN DUNCAN then made a motion to nominate ROBERT FULLER for Grand Dragon. FULLER then asked if there were any other nominations and the Oak Grove Great Titan BOYKIN MC LAIN stated the Oak Grove Unit would vote to nominate ROBERT FULLER for the Grand Dragon.

LOUIS MC KEE from Bastrop, seconded the motion to elect FULLER as Grand Dragon and FULLER was elected unanimously for the Grand Dragon.

After the election of FULLER for the Grand Dragon's position for the next year, he made a recommendation

to the members that the current State Officers and Parish Officers continue for another year, and these positions were as follows:

KENNETH EUBANKS - Grand Kligrapp or Secretary

C. V. FLOWERS - Grand Klokkan

OWEN DUNCAN - Grand Kleagle

HUGH MOORE - Member of the KBI

JACK BARNES - the Grand Kludd or Chaplain

There was no opposition to the Grand Dragon's request or recommendation to retain the current state officers for another year.

The Grand Dragon asked the representative from West Carroll Parish, BOYKIN MC LAIN, to give his monthly report. MC LAIN stated that there had been no big changes in the West Carroll Unit.

The Grand Dragon asked C. V. FLOWERS if he had any comments on the KBI and FLOWERS replied he had nothing to add.

KENNETH EUBANKS gave a rundown on the activities in Ouachita Parish by saying there was a Head Start Program being started in a school approximately one block from the Grand Dragon's home, but did not think it would succeed.

The Grand Dragon reported that there was an informer in the Monroe area who drives a yellow colored Chevrolet and he had his license number, and if it could be proved he was an informer, more severe penalties would be placed on this person than had been place on Klansmen in the past who were identified as informers.

The Grand Dragon also reported that he had obtained a list of names of people who were employed by the State of Louisiana, who are merely dead heads and stated he had obtained this list from a long time city official of the Monroe, Louisiana, area.

LOUIS MC KEE then gave a report on the Bastrop OKA Unit. He stated that several new applications had been issued and received and these names would be checked out and investigated before they would be accepted.

A discussion was then had on the proposal that a barbecue be held for the public in the Oak Grove area. It was agreed to set the date for the barbecue on Saturday, May 24, 1969.

The Grand Dragon reported that he had obtained money which was donated by the Ford Company in Bastrop, Louisiana, which could be used towards financing the food for this barbecue.

BILL TURNER made a short speech and wanted to apologize for the activities of his unit. He had indicated

there were several members of his unit who had quit the Klan and that possibly there were only two or three members remaining in his unit. He made a suggestion that his unit merge with the other unit of the Oak Grove area.

No action was made on TURNER's suggestion.

The Grand Dragon then reminded all members to be able to recognize and to identify on the telephone all Klansmen. The meeting was then adjourned with a prayer given by MONTEE BOYTE.

There was no meeting of the Bastrop OKA Unit on May 6, 1969, as all members of the Unit had to work at the time the meeting was scheduled to be held.

The meeting was opened with a comment by ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA, that he felt the unit should band together and oppose the proposed plan to build a roadway-seawall

for Monroe, La. He advised that if this plan were adopted by the voters it would mean that several businesses such as Howard Griffin Motors and many others, would be torn down and he could see no real need for the construction. He also stated that he felt that taxes would be increased if this was passed.

All agreed that they should talk to their neighbors and any influential people they might know to encourage them to oppose the election.

JIM THORNTON, a new member of the unit, lives on South 7th St. in Monroe, is a truck driver, and his wife is reportedly a teacher in the Monroe school system.

Another new member is BILL MURPHY who reportedly works at Olin Mathieson and lives on Oregon Trail in Monroe.

The meeting was started off with ROBERT FULLER introducing three new members, HARVEY KELLIN who is a carpenter in Monroe; EARL ROUSE, JR., who works as a painter for his father; and JIM WILSON. These new men are all members of the Winnsboro Rd.

Baptist Church, and were brought into the unit because of their association with other members in the church.

The first order of business was a proposal by ROBERT FULLER to hold the meetings in the future on Wednesday nights after the brotherhood meeting of the Winnsboro Baptist Church. This proposal received unanimous support and starting in June, the Monroe OKA Unit will hold meetings after the brotherhood meetings of the church.

It was also discussed that the members be on the lookout for a suitable meeting place for the unit since FULLER stated that the membership is getting too big to hold meetings at his house.

Next discussion was on the OKA State Meeting to be held at Oak Grove, La., on 6/6/69, and all were urged to attend. FULLER announced that several cars would be leaving for the Oak Grove Klavern on Friday night to attend the meeting and that anyone who needed a ride could meet at his house at approximately 5:00 PM. FULLER stated that in the upcoming months, the leaders of the OKA have decided to try to vary the place of the State Meeting and to have the meeting occasionally in Monroe, and also in Bastrop, La. FULLER stated that he was looking around for a suitable meeting place should the State Meeting be held in Monroe.

It was also announced that a barbecue for the OKA is being planned for Oak Grove, La., on 6/14/69, at the Oak Grove Teen Center. Families of members will be invited and will be encouraged to attend the barbecue.

The meeting was concluded after about a twenty minute
bull session on the proposed roadway and seawall to be constructed
in Monroe, and all agreed that they would vote against the roadway
proposition in the special election on 6/10/69.

Other speakers at the rallies pointed out the need for segregation and warned of the Communist influence in the United States.

ORIGINAL KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC.
(LOUISIANA) (OKA)

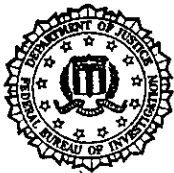
Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December of 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a result, a split in the OKKKK occurred. Houston Morris and Robert Fuller led the split and formed the OKA, according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that Houston Morris and Robert Fuller formed the OKA after splitting away from the OKKKK in December of 1964. The second source advised that the OKA has the same general purposes as the OKKKK; that is, the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and the maintaining of segregation.

The second source also advised that Robert Fuller assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in February of 1965, after Houston Morris left the organization. The second source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside of the State of Louisiana.

This second source advised on May 19, 1969, that the aims and purposes of the OKA remain the same with the exception that the OKA has several Klan units chartered in Arkansas, and the Arkansas Klan units are under the leadership of Robert Fuller, who continues to hold the position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana.

On June 24, 1969, the Bastrop OKA Unit held its regular meeting. This meeting was held at the Game Reserve north of Bastrop, Louisiana, near the Steel Kettle Gap. This meeting began at approximately 8:30 PM and ended about 10:00 PM and there were eight klansmen present as follows:

OWEN DUNCAN,
WOODROW KELLY,
JACK WATKINS,
E. H. THOMAS,
BOBBY CHURCH,
FLOYD STOKES,
LOUIS McKEE,
C. V. FLOWERS.

The members present used flashlights to check membership cards and to read the Kloran. The Exalted Cyclops WOODROW KELLY requested that OWEN DUNCAN act as Exalted Cyclops for this meeting inasmuch as KELLY could not read the Kloran by the flashlight. JACK WATKINS gave the opening and closing prayers.

The meeting was opened after prayer with a discussion by LOUIS McKEE that he had received word from ROBERT FULLER,

the Grand Dragon of the OKA to check a beer joint on Naff Street called The HUB in Bastrop. McKEE stated that the reports were several things have been going on at this beer joint. He stated that a bread man whose name was unknown that delivered bread in the area of the beer joint apparently observed teenage Negroes being served liquor. McKEE reported that he would check on the beer joint and find out who owned the place and what was actually going on and whether teenagers were being served liquor.

WOODROW KELLY then stated that the Grand Dragon had asked him to locate a building big enough in the Bastrop area to hold the State OKA meeting inasmuch as Bastrop would be a more central point for the OKA in the State. He also suggested that the building would be air condition if possible and that rent would run approximately \$80 or \$90 a month. Several suggestions were made from the floor such as a church or a skating rink, the VFW or American Legion Halls but no definite decision was made on any of these locations.

JACK WATKINS reported that the filling station located across the street from his home had been closed and that he was no longer having any difficulties with

the junk being piled up at the service station. WATKINS stated that members could understand that if a little talk in the right places was spread that something could be done.

OWEN DUNCAN reported that he would be going to Mississippi the following weekend or the holidays. There was no further business to be discussed therefore the meeting was adjourned.

On July 1, 1969 several members of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated, attended the School Board meeting of the Ouachita Parish School Board at Monroe, Louisiana. The purpose of the attendance by klansmen at this meeting was to protest the Health, Education and Welfare (HEW) guide lines handed down for school desegregation in Louisiana. Several members of the OKA brought with them posters to show their opposition to any type of desegregation except freedom of choice.

The following OKA klansmen recognized as being present at this School Board meeting were:

OWEN DUNCAN,

JACK WATKINS,

LOUIS MCKEE,

D. H. THOMAS, all from Bastrop.

ROBERT FULLER, Grand Dragon of the OKA

HUGH MOORE,

BOBBY BURNHART,

and an older son of ROBERT FULLER. All were from Monroe.

The klansmen were requested to attend this school

board meeting by the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER and were told not to bring any type of weapon with them and if anyone got out of line they would be dealt with severely.

The school board meeting went along smoothly although there was a lot of tension at the meeting since there were several Negroes present. There were a total of approximately 100 people inside the school board office to attend the meeting and then outside there were approximately 300 people who could not get inside due to lack of space.

LOUIS McKEE continues to reside at 404 Garfield Street, Bastrop, Louisiana, and is still employed at the International Paper Company, Bastrop, Louisiana. He continues to own a 1968 Ford Falcon, blue, two door hardtop with black vinyl top which has 1968-69 Louisiana License 49F698. McKEE continues to be an active member of the Bastrop OKA Unit as well as the Great Titan for Morehouse Parish of the OKA.

JACK BARNES resides on South Third Street, Monroe, Louisiana, and is the Pastor of the Winnsboro Road Baptist Church, Monroe, Louisiana, as well as being an insurance salesman. His position in the OKA is Grand Kludd or Chaplain of the OKA.

JACK SAUCIER continues to be a member of the OKA and is a Grand Aide in the OKA and owns a Dodge Dart, brown in color. He resides on South 28th Street, Monroe, Louisiana, and is an automobile salesman for Twin City Pontiac, Monroe, Louisiana.

FLOYD STREETER continues to reside at the Worley Trailer Park on McCrieght Street, Bastrop, Louisiana. He is self employed as a concrete finisher and owns a 1965 Dodge pickup truck, red and white in color. Current Louisiana License number unknown. He also owns a 1960 Dodge, four door, white in color which has 1968-69 Louisiana License number 62F451. STREETER continues to be a member of the Bastrop OKA Unit although he has not attended meetings regularly in the past several months. He was elected to the position of Klokan (Investigator) of the Bastrop OKA Unit, over a year ago although he has not performed his duties as Klokan since he has not been attending meetings regularly. No information has been received that STREETER has ever participated in any acts of violence nor is it known whether he has a propensity for violence.

On June 18, 1969, the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana (WKKKKOL) held its regular weekly meeting at a roadside park south of West Monroe, Louisiana approximately three miles on the Jonesboro Highway. This meeting began at approximately 8:00 p.m. and ended about 9:45 p.m. with six Klansmen present as follows:

HAROLD GROSS,
BUTCH COON,
TOMMY REAGAN,
LEE CRAWFORD,
LARRY CASSE,
BOBBY L. GARRETT.

The meeting was opened with a discussion of the previous weeks' activities by the members of the unit in which they burned crosses at various places within the city limits of Monroe. Everybody was happy that they did not get caught burning the crosses, and there was no comment for the lack of publicity that the crosses had been burned in Monroe.

HAROLD GROSS stated that he and WAYNE WORKS also a member of the unit, had received postal cards in the mail within the past week or two, which had on these postcards "We know you are in the Klan but you don't know

who we are", or something similar to this.

GROSS suggested that possibly ROBERT FULLER or someone like him probably sent the cards to him and WORKS. GROSS stated that he did not like the idea of someone sending these cards to him and WORKS and did not know what he was going to do about it.

A suggestion was made by GROSS that the unit meet twice a week, one week for activities such as burning crosses or harrassing Negroes and the other meeting to conduct regular business of the Klan. BUTCH COON then stated that it had been difficult to get everyone out once a week and suggested that members vote against having two meetings a week and this carried in the favor of COON's suggestion and it was agreed that meetings would continue to meet once a week as had been in the past.

WILLIAM TRUELOVE is believed to continue to reside in the Chatham, Louisiana area and is self-employed as a pulp wood hauler and was last known to own a 1968 Dodge Coronet, white over blue, which had 1968-69 license 26X956. He was last known to be the vice president of the Chatham Unit of the United Klans of America, Incorporated (UKA). No information has been received in the past few months that TRUELOVE continues to be a member of the Chatham Unit of the UKA. Also no information is known as to whether

he has a propensity for violence, nor is it known whether he ever participated in any acts of violence.

On June 6, 1969, the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, (OKA) held its regular monthly meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, Klavern. This meeting began at approximately 8:30 P.M. and ended around 10:30 P.M. There were approximately 35 Klansmen present for this meeting, with representatives from the Bastrop OKA, Oak Grove OKA Units 1 and 2, and the Monroe OKA Unit.

The following Klansmen were recognized as being present:

There were approximately 15 other Klansmen present, names unknown.

ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA, presided over the meeting and JACK BARNES, the Grand Kludd, gave the opening prayer and closing prayers.

Before members were admitted to the meeting place they were searched for their identification cards and membership cards. ROBERT FULLER stated that he was glad to see that the members of the Klan were checking on members to make sure that no one got into the meeting that was not a Klansman. He stated this was the way it should be and at every meeting in the future this will be done. He stated that he hoped no one would be offended by this action.

He stated the one responsible for this was OWEN DUNCAN who is the King or Grand Kleagle of the OKA and he had the responsibility of doing this.

The Grand Dragon then announced that the next OKA State meeting would held on July 11, 1969, and not on July 4, as July 4, would be a holiday.

The Grand Dragon then announced that he had received letters of apologies from the men who had made threatening remarks to the Grand Kludd, JACK BARNES, and that the letters of apologies would be all that would be necessary from those men who had made the remarks to BARNES.

KENNETH EUBANKS then read the minutes of the previous meetings and the minutes were approved and accepted with no comments.

The Grand Dragon then presented or exhibited a large book which was approximately 3" thick, that he claimed was a listing of all dead head employees on the payroll of the State of Louisiana. He stated that people listed in this book were paid approximately 2½ million dollars per year and were all dead head employees.

One of the Oak Grove Units then asked if Mr. BILL TURNER was on the dead head payroll. The Grand Dragon then looked in the listing for TURNER's name and said he could not find it. He stated that the only person in Oak Grove listed was a man named WOMACK.

The Grand Dragon reported that he had a new book on the way to him. He did not elaborate on how he was to obtain this book.

The Grand Dragon then announced that any Klansman of the OKA who spoke more than three words to an FBI Agent, he would be automatically kicked out of the Klan and banned from the OKA for life.

Reports were then given by the various units and LOUIS MC KEE gave the report for Morehouse Parish and stated he had some new members considering joining the unit and that everything was going fine.

BOYKIN MC LAIN gave a report for the Oak Grove Units and stated his units had been having some trouble getting people to attend meetings, but felt everything would move along fine in the future.

The Grand Dragon then announced that the OKA barbecue would be held at Oak Grove, Louisiana, on June 14, 1969.

The Grand Dragon then asked the Chief of the KBI, C. V. FLOWERS, if he had anything that he could report that would not put his crew on a spot. FLOWERS stated that he had nothing to report but everything he had was confidential.

Prior to the close of the meeting, OWEN DUNCAN announced that the OKA barbecue would be held at 3:00 P.M. in Oak Grove, Louisiana, on June 14, 1969, and would need some volunteer help to cook the chicken and barbecue the ribs.

The meeting was then closed with prayer being given by JACK BARNES.

After the meeting was closed it was learned that THOMAS WILEY, a member of the Oak Grove Unit, had returned to Arkansas.

On June 5, 1969, the following OKA Klansmen gathered at the residence of ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA, in Monroe, Louisiana, for the purpose of discussing the firing of the Grand Kludd, JACK BARNES, from his position with the Trans-World Life Insurance Company, Jackson Street, Monroe, Louisiana:

WOODROW KELLY

C. V. FLOWERS

OWEN DUNCAN

ROBERT FULLER

HUGH MOORE

KENNETH EUBANKS

The Grand Dragon reported that four insurance men who were employed with JACK BARNES were going with a 15 year old Negro girl and had been bragging about it in front of JACK BARNES.

FULLER reported that the men did not know that BARNES had recorded every word they had been saying to him. FULLER stated that the men found out that BARNES had recorded their conversation and were very mad and began cursing and calling BARNES all kinds of names as well as suspecting him of being a member of the Ku Klux Klan. FULLER stated the men told BARNES to tell him, ROBERT FULLER, about the incident and that they wanted to meet him anyway.

After FULLER reported to those present of the incident they drank coffee and then went to the insurance company, located on Jackson Street in Monroe, Louisiana, where they were met by JACK BARNES.

The Klansmen rode in two cars. In ROBERT FULLER's LTD Ford, WOODROW KELLY and OWEN DUNCAN rode with FULLER, and WOODROW KELLY followed in his Ford Falcon, also driving in the car was HUGH MOORE and KENNETH EUBANKS in EUBANKS new 1969 red Mercury Montego.

After arriving at the insurance company, FULLER stated that he had determined the four unknown men who had made the remarks to JACK BARNES had not arrived.

At approximately 11:00 A.M. one of the men came to the insurance office with receipts and reports. When this man arrived, ROBERT FULLER, JACK BARNES, KENNY EUBANKS and HUGH MOORE went inside. After the Klansmen were in the office for approximately 30 minutes, they returned to the outside. ROBERT FULLER then reported that a letter of apology would be given to him by the end of that day from the four men who had made the threats to JACK BARNES and that the Kln would not have any retaliation against these men.

FULLER then thanked the Klansmen from Bastrop for coming to Monroe to the aid of JACK BARNES and the Klansmen then departed and went home.

JACK WATKINS continues to be the Klokard of the Bastrop OKA Unit and resides at 1305 Van Avenue, Bastrop, Louisiana, and is employed by the Louisiana State Highway Department, Bastrop, Louisiana, and continues to own a 1953 white over green, four-door Plymouth, bearing 1968-69 Louisiana License 53F385.

During the course of the day a klansman, (FNU) WILLIS from Natchez, Mississippi told a group that the Klan in Natchez was still active and that he had recently talked to ERNEST GILBERT and JACK SEAL. WILLIS stated that ERNEST GILBERT was still living at Kings Plantation just out of Louise, Mississippi and that JACK SEAL is still in the Natchez, Mississippi area and had recently got out of trouble but was still on probation. He stated it cost SEAL quite a bit of money. WILLIS stated the reason he came to the Oak Grove rally was that HUBERT HUMPHREY and EDWARD KENNEDY had planned to be in Natchez, Mississippi to swear in CHARLES EVERS as the Mayor of Fayette, Mississippi and WILLIS stated that if anything happened in Natchez during that time that he had plenty of witnesses to prove his whereabouts. WILLIS further stated that the Klan in Mississippi had stopped having open rallies and had gone underground. WILLIS stated that the Klan was stronger now than ever in Mississippi and that there was a pretty good reward for anyone that destroyed CHARLES EVERS.

After everyone had eaten all they could the Grand Dragon of the OKA, ROBERT FULLER called everybody's attention and said that Attorney DON CARROLL, an attorney for the Klan in Oak Grove, Louisiana, had an announcement to make concerning school integration in East Carroll, West Carroll and Morehouse Parishes. CARROLL then gave the rundown on a survey of the schools in each of the above listed parishes. He reported that in Mer Rouge, Oak Ridge and Bonita, Louisiana areas there would have been approximately 75% Negroes and 25% white in these schools, if they are totally integrated. He stated that a Negro's I.Q. on the average was approximately 15% lower I.Q. than the white children. He said that it was impossible to bring the I.Q. of Negroes up to the level of white people therefore integrating 75% Negroes with 25% white would naturally lower the educational standards in Morehouse Parish. CARROLL continued by stating that the total of 10 acres south of Oak Grove, Louisiana had been donated for the purpose of building a private school. CARROLL stated that he had obtained pledges for a total of \$62,000 to build a private school and had enough land donated from the farm land to use in the private schools. He further stated that he had received applications to have

children from the first through the eighth grade which would bring the class, per student, to \$35.00 per month. He stated he had volunteers to work on the school. CARROLL predicted that by 1975 that there would be private schools in nearly every town in Louisiana. He stated that when each town had a private school that this would be the only way the children could receive a quality education and maybe the Federal judges would have no public schools to integrate.

On July 10, 1969, Klansmen from Monroe and Bastrop, Louisiana, attended school board meeting at Monroe, Louisiana, to voice their opinion against the Health, Education, and Welfare plan for integration in favor of freedom of choice plan.

ED S. BOLTON, Chairman of the Save Our Schools Committee, gave a brief run down on his organizations opposition to the Health, Education, and Welfare plan and requested that the State of Louisiana close down all public schools and accept no Federal funds, then lease the schools to the public for one dollar each and have a private school system. BOLTON further stated in his comments to the school board, the Federal Government did not have the right to intervene in public schools and that it was a Constitutional right to send your children to the school or church of your choice.

ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America (OKA), then made a brief statement to the school board stating that he believed the members of the school board should start voting and working for the people that voted for them to oppose

the Health, Education, and Welfare plan for school integration. FULLER stated a vote for anything except freedom of choice would be against the Constitution of the State of Louisiana. FULLER made a comment also that the Senators and Congressmen had publicly stated they had rather vote for integration and to hear the white people grumble a little to them, then to see the Negroes start a riot and tear up everything. FULLER stated that if freedom of choice was not given, that he would keep his children home and he would defy anyone in his organization to send their children to school under the Health, Education, and Welfare plan. He stated that he was ready to go to jail if necessary. FULLER stated that he had determined that 65 per cent of the white people in Louisiana were behind his proposal.

ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon, then made a statement thanking all the members who had come to Monroe the previous week to attend the school board meeting to show a force opposing the Health, Education, and Welfare plan for school integration.

The Grand Dragon then stated that the State Officers for the previous year would continue to hold their positions

After the announcement of the State Officers BOYKIN MC LAIN, Great Titan of West Carroll Parish, stated the the West Carroll Units had not done very much recruiting since the last State meeting.

MONTEE BOYTE gave a report on the forming of a private school in West Carroll Parish. He stated that a private school would begin in September, 1969, for the grades 1 - 8 and reported finances were coming in at a fast pace in order to build a building and obtain teachers.

BILL TURNER made a statement to the Klasmen that "he was sorry he had missed several meetings, but would try to make up for them in the future. He stated he had been very busy with his farming and that since the tomato crop

had been harvested he had more time to spend for Klan business. He stated he was glad to see several new faces and expressed appreciation to all those who came to the meeting.

LOUIS MC KEE and OWEN DUNCAN reported that the Bastrop Unit was doing well. DUNCAN stated that CLARENCE BOYKIN was now back with the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, however, he could not attend the meeting. DUNCAN reported that BOYKIN had closed his cafe in Bastrop to keep from serving Negroes.

The Grand Dragon then asked if there were any other announcements to be made, and no one made any additional announcements. Therefore, FULLER stated there would be two or three rallies planned in the latter part of the Summer and plans would be published and sent to all members in the near future.

The meeting was then closed with prayer given by the Deputy Grand Kludd, MONTEE BOYTE.

On 7/23/69 several members of the WKKKKOL gathered at HAROLD GROSS' garage during the afternoon and discussed the proposed public meeting at the Monroe Civic Center on 7/25/69, at which they had expected elected officials to speak in favor of Freedom of Choice plan of school desegregation. Their comments indicated that one of them, TOMMY REAGAN, had talked to BILLY BANKS and BERNIE VANN earlier in the day when public news reports carried the story that the Civic Center had previously been engaged for another meeting and would not be available for the public meeting regarding school desegregation on 7/25/69. VANN, BANKS and REAGAN had met at Olinkraft Cafeteria, and VANN had telephoned MELVIN MUNN, Life Line radio program in Dallas, Texas, that the meeting for 7/25/69 had been canceled. TOMMY REAGAN had talked to ROBERT FULLER about the cancellation of the Civic Center and FULLER said that he would check on the cancellation. He subsequently advised that arrangements had been made so that the meeting could still be held on 7/25/69 ; however, MELVIN MUNN advised that he had already made another engagement and could not appear as the speaker. Klansmen were very disturbed over these developments and they accused Chief KELLEY and Mayor HOWARD of using the news of the

The meeting of the school board was conducted in an orderly manner until one young man gave a short speech and presented a petition that he said had 900 signatures from Ward One to oppose any plan of the Health, Education, and Welfare and in favor of the Freedom of Choice for school integration. He requested that the school board present this list of names to Judge DAWKINS at the time the school board presented its plans to Judge DAWKINS.

Another person made a request that a public meeting be held at the Monroe Civic Center for all school boards in Louisiana and Public officials to show openly a protest to the Federal Governments intervention into the local schools, and also to give the public a chance to speak out on the issues.

A Klansman from the WKKKKOL, JIMMIE GRIFFIN, then made a statement that he was a graduate of Neville High School, Monroe, Louisiana, and was a Veteran of the Korean War, and held the second highest award for bravery in the country. He stated he had children and would not send his children to any school under the Health, Education, and Welfare plan for integration. GRIFFIN stated that he was

ready to go to battle for his children's freedom and when he made this statement, he received a loud applause from those in the audience.

ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA also made a brief statement and stated he was going to say about the same thing that JIMMIE GRIFFIN had stated; and, therefore, cut his speech short.

Klansmen discussed in detail plans for a public meeting to be held at the Civic Center in Monroe on 7/25/69 to which all elected officials in the area were to be invited to speak in favor of Freedom of Choice for school desegregation in the area. In a review of activities leading up to the arrangements for that meeting, it was stated that Klansmen TOMMY REAGAN, JIMMY GRIFFIN, PAUL CASSIDY, and HAROLD WOODRUFF met with BERNIE VANN, a Police Juror, on Friday morning, 7/18/69, and decided to contact the Mayor of Monroe to get him to make available the Civic Center for a meeting on 7/25/69 in support of Freedom of Choice. These

Klansmen talked with ROBERT FULLER by telephone and he agreed that his Klan group would support the effort to get the Civic Center for a public meeting. These Klansmen accompanied by BERNIE VANN went to the Mayor's Office on Friday morning, 7/18/69, to talk with him about getting the Civic Center and they found that he was expecting their arrival. Chief of Police J. C. KELLEY was in the Mayor's Office and the Mayor and Chief KELLEY said that they had been told that the Klan planned to pressure the Mayor into making the Civic Center available for a public meeting to support Freedom of Choice in school desegregation. A heated argument developed between Chief KELLEY and TOMMY REAGAN, and ROBERT FULLER was called in by Chief KELLEY during the argument. It was finally agreed by the Mayor that he would make the Civic Center available free for a public meeting on 7/25/69, at which elected officials would be given an opportunity to speak in favor of a Freedom of Choice plan for school desegregation. The Mayor insisted that Klansmen would not speak at the meeting nor would other radical groups in the area. ROBERT FULLER and TOMMY REAGAN agreed to the Mayor's stipulation and agreed to contact ED BOLTON and Reverend DRISKELL to get them to agree not to speak at the meeting on 7/25/69.

On Friday afternoon, 7/18/69, Klansmen HAROLD GROSS, PAUL CASSIDY, and TOMMY REAGAN met at HUGH MOORE's residence with ROBERT FULLER, KENNETH EUBANKS, and HUGH MOORE and there they discussed their plans for promoting the meeting scheduled at the Civic Center on 7/25/69. It was agreed to get BERNIE VANN and BILLY BANKS, members of the local Police Jury, to front for the organization of the meeting, and on 7/19/69 TOMMY REAGAN met with them after which meeting he stated that they had arranged to get MELVIN MUNN of the Life Line radio program to speak at the 7/25/69 public meeting. They planned to invite all elected officials in Northeast Louisiana and to have 20,000 handbills printed to advertise the meeting. Klansmen were to assist in distributing the leaflets advertising the meeting.

Klansmen appeared to be well satisfied with the arrangements for the meeting on 7/25/69 as they had been making great efforts to promote a Freedom of Choice plan for school integration in spite of the fact that the local School Board was under court order to submit a desegregation plan other than Freedom of Choice.

On July 21, 22 and 23, 1969, klansmen from the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated (OKA) and the White Knights of Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana (WKKKKOL) met at the residence of ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA in Monroe, Louisiana. The purpose of these meetings was to discuss plans on how to oppose the new desegregation orders on school integration in Louisiana. Plans were made to have a public meeting at the Monroe, Louisiana Civic Center to encourage the public to support the "Freedom of Choice" for schools in Louisiana.

At the meeting on July 21, 1969, ROBERT FULLER introduced TOMMY REAGAN, the Grand Dragon of the White Knights of Ku Klux Klan and three others who were present with REAGAN, HAROLD GROSS, J. E. LEE and another person believed to be LEE CRAWFORD.

ROBERT FULLER and TOMMY REAGAN then led discussion on how they were to obtain the Monroe Civic Center for a public gathering in support of freedom of choice. FULLER and REAGAN reported that Mayor JACK HOWARD of Monroe had requested them to come to his office in order to make plans to obtain the Civic Center. They reported the Mayor

told them they could not act as chairman or co-chairman or sponsorers of the public meeting. They also reported the Mayor told them they should not make any type of speech at the meeting and both stated they agreed not to make any speeches at the meeting.

Both FULLER and REAGAN stated the Mayor and Chief of Police J. C. KELLY of Monroe were holding both FULLER and REAGAN responsible for any outbreak or trouble that may be started at the public meeting on July 25, 1969 in the Monroe Civic Center. REAGAN and FULLER assured those present that they told Mayor HOWARD and J. C. KELLY there would not be any trouble from any of their people.

FULLER requested of the OKA klansmen present to talk to the members of their units and let them know what the score is and assure them that if any man regardless of his position causes any trouble or violence that they would be escorted from the building by police officers. OWEN DUNCAN of the Bastrop OKA Unit replied that he would inform his members and BILL TURNER, member from Oak Grove replied likewise. REAGAN then assured FULLER that his men would obey the commands given by the Mayor and Chief KELLY and that the White Knights would join with the OKA and work close in organization of the public meeting to

be held on July 25, 1969 at the Monroe Civic Center.

FULLER reported that OWEN DUNCAN, KENNY EUBANKS, C. V. FLOWERS, BOBBY BERNHARDT would be in charge of the OKA klansmen in case of any trouble.

TOMMY REAGAN stated that he would be able to handle JIMMY GRIFFIN without any problems. FULLER then requested those present to ask that all klansmen who attend the rally not to bring any guns inside the Civic Center.

LOUIS McKEE, member of the Bastrop OKA Unit gave a report that a group of young Negroes in Bastrop were going around to various stores in Bastrop trying to agitate or stir up some sort of trouble and that the police had been called to one of the drug stores and picked up these Negroes and charges were filed against them by the owner of the drug store. ROBERT FULLER then stated that it appeared that the people in Louisiana were now ready for almost anything to happen and that klansmen should be on the alert for any possible uprising by the Negroes.

KENNETH EUBANKS and BOBBY BERNHARDT then gave a run down on how they were coming in organizing the teen-

agers in Monroe to become members of the OKA. EUBANKS explained how and why he was organizing the teenagers and stated the teenagers were only being given the first two parts of the klan oath and they would not be charged any dues. He stated that only the 18 year olds held a card as members and that BOBBY BERNHARDT would swear in these teenagers. A motion was made and approved after some discussion that teenagers would be accepted into the OKA although they would not be given the complete klan oath, and they would not be told of any of the activities of the klokan.

The meeting was then adjourned with the request that FULLER had to get some papers and pamphlets printed up for the rally to be held on July 25, 1969 at the Monroe Civic Center for Freedom of Choice.

The final meeting of the klansmen in the OKA and the WKKKKOL met at the residence of ROBERT FULLER on July 23, 1969 to make final plans for the public meeting to be held on July 25, 1969 at the Monroe Civic Center, to oppose any type of integration except Freedom of Choice in Louisiana.

The meeting consisted entirely of discussion on how to keep people from having or causing any trouble at the public rally on July 25, 1969.

During the course of the meeting ROBERT FULLER reported that he had received several phone calls in the past few days concerning his activity in obtaining the Civic Center for the rally. He stated that several people had called him and asked him what he had on the

Mayor of Monroe and he stated he told him he didn't have anything on him except that the Mayor owed him a few favors. He also reported that a lady told him who was believed to be employed by the newspaper the Monroe Morning World, that she saw FULLER and TOMMY REAGAN go into the Mayor's Office together and ask the Mayor for the use of the Civic Center and she wanted to know why they had done this. FULLER stated that he told this person that the Mayor was a good man and he felt that the Mayor felt the same way as he did about how the Health, Education, Welfare people were trying to cram integration down the throats of the people.

FULLER passed around a letter to those klansmen present which indicated or tried to make people think that the person writing the letter was a Negro but all the klansmen present agreed after reading the letter that it was written by a white person. TOMMY REAGAN stated that he has also received a similar letter.

Before the close of the meeting ROBERT FULLER gave a brief run down on the organization of the teenagers in the OKA and stated that the OKA was beginning to start a great youth movement throughout the South.

FULLER then made a comment that the HEW school board and school faculty was trying to turn the children

against their own parents and teaching them not to obey their parents and trying to teach them that there is no line between the white and Black races. He stated that the school board and faculty were only confusing the minds of the young people as well as the people of HEW. FULLER also reported that several people in the Monroe area had tried every trick in the book to cancel the public meeting on July 25, 1969 but without any success, primarily to the thanks of Mayor HOWARD and members of the Ouachita Parish Police Jury. FULLER stated that he and REAGAN had been given permission by the Chairman and Co-chairman of the committee to sponsor the public rally to send telegrams to every Mayor, every Senator, every representative and to Governor McKEITHEN, Congressman of Louisiana for them to attend the rally at the Civic Center and through their attendance will show what people the white people should vote for in the next election. The meeting was then closed approximately 11:00 PM with prayer being given by JACK BARNES.

E. W. PACE continues to reside on U.S. Highway 80 near Start, Louisiana, and is self employed as a farmer. He was last known to own an Oldsmobile, white and blue in color, license number unknown. He is believed to con-

tinue to hold the position of Grand Aid in the OKA.

CHARLES EDGAR RAYMOND continues to reside in the rural area of Oak Grove, Louisiana, near the Fiske Union Community and is employed at the glove factory in Oak Grove Louisiana, which is called Wells Lamont Corporation. He is believed to continue to own a 1963 Ford pickup truck, white in color, current license number unknown. He continues to hold the position of Kligrapp in Oak Grove OKA Unit number 1.

MEETING OF MONROE OKA UNIT

The Monroe OKA Unit held a regular weekly meeting on the night of August 13, 1969 at the home of ROBERT FULLER, 1500 Sunset, Monroe, Louisiana. Those present were as follows:

The first part of the meeting was taken up with the introduction of new members which was handled by ROBERT FULLER. The new men were introduced as follows:

JOHN ARNOLD, who is FULLER's son-in-law and works for Monroe Concrete and is approximately 27 years of age.

BILL GORDAN, who is disabled and does not work and is about 48 years of age.

DICKY SCOTT, who is 38 years of age and works for Missouri-Pacific Railroad.

LEE COOK, who works at the International Paper Mill in Bastrop and is approximately 34 years of age.

JACK GRANT, who is a dragline operator at a construction project in Vicksburg, Mississippi, and who is approximately 33 years of age.

CHARLES CHANDLER, who is approximately 47 years of age and is self-employed delivering eggs.

BILL MURPHY, who is approximately 60 years of age and is believed to be retired.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Freedom of Choice Plan and ROBERT FULLER instructed all persons that they are to support the Freedom of Choice Plan but that they cannot do it at the present time, or

as ~~h~~ERNIE VAN is leading the drive in Monroe. FULLER stated that VAN has ~~dis~~conded with over \$1500 in funds that was taken in at the Freedom of Choice Rally at the Monroe Civil Center recently and stated that the OKA is not going to have anything to do with VAN until an accounting of the funds is made. It was then discussed that the unit should fully endorse any plan that Mayor HOWARD of Monroe comes up with as FULLER convinced those present that Mayor HOWARD had always done what was best for the majority of the people in the past and could be counted upon to do the same thing in the future.

E. W. PACE of Rayville, Louisiana, was present at the meeting and stated that he wanted to be included as a member in the Monroe OKA Unit since he could not get a unit together in the Rayville, Louisiana area.

After the meeting was adjourned, it was learned that the leaders of the unit planned to have CHARLES MUNHOLLAND sworn out of the unit as it is learned this his wife is recently out of Pineville Mental Hospital and she could cause some embarrassment to the unit. It is noted that MUNHOLLAND has only been in the unit a short time.

MISCELLANEOUS

Further information learned at the meeting was that MIKE MOODY and BUDDY MOODY who were sworn in as new members of the OKA were sworn out shortly after in a private meeting with some of the officers of the OKA. It was learned that they had applied for admission saying that they were 19 years of age, but when their father found out that they had become members he notified the officials of the OKA and told them that they were only 17 years of age. It was learned that BOBBY BERNHARDT was probably responsible for getting the two men in and when he was confronted with this information, he admitted that the boys were too young at age 17 to be members.

It was also learned that DAN WILSON suffered a serious injury at the Bastrop, Louisiana Paper Mill and he is presently confined to St. Francis Hospital in Monroe.

Two other new men are JIM THORNTON and BOB FINLEY both of whom are employed for Green Brothers Dairy. THORNTON is 31 and FINLEY is 28.

New member JACK GRUBBS of Oak Grove, Louisiana, is approximately 46 years of age and he runs an American filling station in Oak Grove.

The regular weekly meeting of the WKKKKOL was held at the residence of JIMMY GRIFFIN, near West Monroe, Louisiana, on Wednesday night, July 30, 1969. This meeting lasted from about 8:30 P.M. until 10:00 P.M. and the following ten Klansmen were present for the meeting:

At this meeting, TOMMY RUSSELL was sworn in as a new member of WKKKKOL. RUSSELL appears to be a quiet type of man, and he talked particularly about the possibility of a private segregated school. He mentioned the possibility of attending a meeting to organize a private school in Natchez,

Mississippi, the following weekend.

RUSSELL is about 26 or 27 years old.

Klansmen at this meeting expressed their disapproval of any kind of school desegregation plan other than a freedom of choice plan. Although Klansmen appeared to favor organizing a private segregated school, there was no specific plan advanced for such a school.

TOMMY REAGAN expressed disappointment at the results of the public meeting of July 25, 1969, at the Civic Center in Monroe, Louisiana, which meeting was held for the purpose of organizing public support for a freedom of choice plan of school desegregation, in spite of the Federal Court ruling that freedom of choice was unacceptable.

HAROLD GROSS was outspoken in his criticism of school desegregation. He made no specific proposal for action to prevent or interfere with school desegregation. JIMMY

JIMMY GRIFFIN announced that members of WKKKKOL were not to associate with ROBERT FULLER anymore. GRIFFIN stated that he disapproved of the views expressed by a preacher who spoke at the public meeting on 7/25/69, and he blamed ROBERT FULLER for arranging for that preacher to speak at that meeting.

It was proposed that members of WKKKKOL draw up a constitution, and it was indicated that a copy of the constitution of the UKA would be used as a model in drawing up a constitution for the WKKKKOL.

On August 11, 1969 a special called meeting of the Oak Grove OKA Unit was held at the Oak Grove Klavern with visitors from Monroe and Bastrop present. This meeting was called by the Grand Dragon of the OKA ROBERT FULLER. Prior to the opening of this meeting a closed meeting of the Grand Dragon C. V. FLOWERS the Grand Klokan and BOYKIN MC LAIN and SEDRIC SEAMANS both members of the Klokan Committee in West Carroll Parish was held. After this meeting the special called meeting which was attended by approximately 23 klansmen was held. This meeting began at approximately 8:30 PM and closed about 10:30 PM. The following klansmen were recognized as being present at this meeting:

The meeting was opened with prayer being given by JACK BARNES and the veil of secrecy was opened and the meeting began with the Grand Dragon presiding over the meeting. He stated that he felt better after what had gone on in the back room of the meeting with the Klokan and Klokan Committee of West Carroll Parish.

The Grand Dragon announced that from this date on that BOYKIN MC LAIN would be the leader of the Oak Grove OKA and that everything would have to go through him before it could be administered into

the unit. FULLER stated that if anyone did anything contrary to this demand it would not have the backing of the organization. He stated that everything would go through MC LAIN and MC LAIN would report it to BILL TURNER the second in command to the Grand Dragon who is the Grand Titan of the OKA. TURNER would then in turn report if necessary to the Grand Dragon.

The Grand Dragon stated that he his sole purpose for coming to Oak Grove for this meeting was to resign from the klan. He stated he had all of his records in two boxes and two brief cases in his automobile ready to turn over to BILL TURNER but he had changed his mind after the meeting prior to the special meeting. He stated that he would continue to be the Grand Dragon of the OKA and that the OKA would be run according to the OKA Kloran and constitution and everything would be enforced and all meetings would be conducted according to the book. FULLER further continued by stating that he would put down anytime the members could obtain a person to replace him and that they would ask him to resign. He stated until such a time he would continue as the Grand Dragon of the OKA. He stated that he still believed in America and in the white supremacy.

and that school should be free and segregated. He stated he did not believe in missing of the races.

The Grand Dragon then asked if anyone had any suggestions on what should be done to improve the organization. OWEN DUNCAN then made a motion that beginning with this meeting if anyone wanted to leave a meeting on an emergency only he would have to get the permission by raising his hand and asking the leading officer of that meeting for permission to leave. The leading officer would then give permission and the veil of secrecy would be closed to that klansman or any klans lady. DUNCAN stated that the klansmen that leave the building would be escorted to his automobile by the Knight Hawk or Door keeper and unless he received special orders of the leading officer the klansmen could not re-enter the building. DUNCAN also suggested that at each meeting the members should go through a part of the ceremony of a klan meeting. After DUNCAN made this motion it was seconded by BILL TURNER and all those who were present voted in favor of this motion.

BILL TURNER then was given the floor and he stated that he had been reminded about some of the things that had been causing him trouble in West Carroll Parish

especially with members of his Unit. He stated that most of the members present at this meeting knew that he was on the Board of the OEO in West Carroll Parish. He stated that it was better sometimes to be on the inside looking out rather than to be on the outside looking in. He stated he could do more good for the klan by being in a gathering information position on the OEO Board than being on the outside. TURNER stated he had learned a lot of the problems that were going on in West Carroll Parish by being on the OEO Board and would not have known about these problems had he not been on the Board. He stated that he was still a klansman and that he apologized for not letting his people know that he was a member of the OEO Board in West Carroll Parish but that he was continuing to look out for the members of the OKA in West Carroll Parish.

The meeting was then closed with prayer being given by JACK BARNES.

There were three or four men dressed out at this meeting in their klan robes as members of the Klokan Committee. Their identities were unknown but it was believed that one of them was C. V. FLOWERS and

another was a bodyguard of the Grand Dragon, name unknown.

It was also learned at this meeting that Oak Grove OKA Unit number Two had merged into Oak Grove OKA Unit number One therefore there was only one OKA Unit in West Carroll Parish.

On August 5, 1969, the Bastrop Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) Unit, held its regular meeting at the residence of LOUIS MC KEE. This meeting began at approximately 8:30 P.M. and ended around 10:00 P.M., and there were ten Klansmen present as follows:

LOUIS MC KEE

OWEN DUNCAN

D. H. THOMAS

JACK WATKINS

BOBBY CHURCH

FLOYD STOKES

FLOYD STREETER

E. W. PACE, JR.

TOMMY WEEKS

The meeting was opened with a prayer being given by JACK WATKINS and the veil of secrecy was opened, with OWEN DUNCAN presiding over the meeting as the Exalted Cyclops in the absence of the regular Exalted Cyclops.

The first matter taken up at the meeting was payment of dues. DAVID THOMAS paid \$4.00 dues for two months. JACK WATKINS paid \$4.00 for two months.

LOUIS MC KEE made a report that he had four or five people in mind for membership into the OKA Unit but he had not received any applications from them. He did not mention any names of these people he had in mind.

BOBBY CHURCH reported that DONALD WILSON, a former member of the OKA, at Bastrop, who currently resides in West Monroe, Louisiana, fell 30 feet from a building in West Monroe and crushed his legs and one of his arms and broke his back. He reported that WILSON would probably never be able to walk again. LOUIS MC KEE stated that members of the OKA had visited WILSON and that flowers had been sent to him. MC KEE stated that the Grand Dragon, ROBERT FULLER of the OKA, had given WILSON \$100 out of the Klan Treasury and asked that members of each unit make up enough money to help take care of WILSON and his family until he gets help from the insurance company.

A donation of \$30.00 was collected at this meeting to give to WILSON.

LOUIS MC KEE then led discussion on the way the Morehouse Parish School Board members conducted their integration of the schools in Morehouse Parish and all members agreed that they

would support any of the members in the next election, especially MAX DOLLAR and also O. L. HARPER, who is the current Superintendent of Schools in Morehouse Parish.

OWEN DUNCAN stated that he did not feel that members of the OKA should put all the blame on the School Board. He stated that most of the blame should be put on President NIXON or his Troopers that he sends out throughout the country, or even the modern-time carpetbaggers and Communist Agents in this country. Then other members agreed with DUNCAN.

BOBBY CHURCH stated that he had never taken part in any politics but said that he would walk from door-to-door and politic against every Police Juryman in Morehouse Parish and every yellowback School Board member in the next election.

JACK WATKINS stated that he would also help politic against these people in the same way as CHURCH.

It was then pointed out that most of the members belonged to different churches and different clubs and organizations such as the VFW, American Legion and the Masonic Lodge, and the members should persuade some of the people who are members of these organizations, especially the people of the various churches, to vote against a mongrelized nation. It was pointed out that these

people should be convinced and shown that the bible supports a separated race and the people are to go forth and bear fruit in their own kind and to stand up for what our country stands for and obey the laws of the land. LOUIS MC KEE stated that most of the white people have been staying home and obeying the law while the Negroes are out burning the town and killing people and also stealing and doing everything that possibly can be done against the law. MC KEE then stated that the FBI and the CIA and local law enforcement as well as all Federal carpetbaggers and scallywags, known as the Fifth Circuit Court Judges, who tell the elected officials what to do, and to give the Negroes what they want regardless of the majority thinking.

MC KEE stated that he just as soon be dead as to live in this kind of a country. He stated that it was worse than being a Communist. He stated that from what he can understand there were millions of people in this country who feel the same way as he did. MC KEE further stated that he felt that this kind of activity would not go on too much longer because it happened about 100 years ago almost identically as it is happening now and that all the white people are being disfranchised of freedom of speech and their rights.

DAVID THOMAS stated he did not know what the other members were going to do but he was going to keep his children home when school started, and not let them get brainwashed by a bunch of ignorant Government appointed Negroes and Communist agents.

FLOYD STOKES stated that he had eight children and said that his wife would probably teach them all she knows and that is about all the education they would probably get anyway if they went to school now.

OWEN DUNCAN then stated that his step-son who is 12 years old, stated to him recently that he was going to get his shotgun out and oil it up because he might need it pretty quick. DUNCAN stated he asked his step-son what he meant by this and he stated there would probably be a war with the Negroes real soon.

There was no further business to be discussed then the meeting was closed with a prayer being given by JACK WATKINS.

On July 23, 1969 the White Knights of Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana held its regular weekly meeting at the residence of TOMMY REAGAN in West Monroe, Louisiana. There were nine klansmen present as follows:

JIMMY WORKS,

TERREL FLOWERS,

TOMMY REAGAN,

HAROLD GROSS,

LEE CRAWFORD,

BUTCH COON,

J. E. LEE,

LARRY CASSE,

BOBBY L. GARRETT.

This meeting was presided over by TOMMY REAGAN the Exalted Cyclops of the Unit. BUTCH COON led a discussion on the payment of dues and reported some members were behind in payment of their dues.

It was then announced that members of the White Knights of Ku Klux Klan had been responsible for distribution of literature in the West Monroe area in support of the public meeting to be held at the Monroe

Civic Center on July 25, 1969 in support of the Freedom of Choice plan for school desegregation.

It was reported that TOMMY REAGAN and HAROLD GROSS were to contact the Chief of Police of the West Monroe Police Department to determine how the leaflets might be distributed without violating any laws.

The following four members reported that they had attended a meeting at ROBERT FULLER's residence who is the Grand Dragon of the OKA to make plans for the public meeting in support of freedom of choice and against the HEW plan for integration of schools: JIMMY WORKS, TOMMY REAGAN, LARRY CASSE and J. E. LEE.

Following the meeting these four members were to distribute more leaflets at the Olin Matheson Paper Mill in West Monroe in support of the freedom of choice plan for school desegregation which was to announce the meeting at the Monroe Civic Center for July 25, 1969.

J. E. LEE continues to reside on Washington Street, West Monroe, Louisiana, and is employed as an iron worker through the Iron Workers Local 710 Monroe, Louisiana. He continues to own a Chevrolet Sport Coupe 1965 model, yellow in color which has 1968-69 Louisiana License 59F146. LEE continues to be a very active member

of the White Knights of Ku Klux Klan of Louisiana which is a very militant klan organization in the Monroe, West Monroe, Louisiana area.

BILLY PARKER continues to reside just off of Highway 165 south of Monroe, Louisiana, Route 2, Box 39A, Monroe, Louisiana. He continues to be employed by the Mid South Supply Corporation, 3209 Breard Street, Monroe, Louisiana, and owns a 1961 Chevrolet pickup, green in color which has 1969 Louisiana license number 143-985. PARKER is no longer active in klan activities. He was formerly a member of the Charmingdale UKA Unit which was disbanded several months ago and PARKER has not become active in any klan activities since this unit was disbanded. No information has been received that PARKER has ever participated in any actual violence nor is it known whether he has a propensity for violence.

Opposing Statements Given On Issues In Local School

Group Reaffirms School Boycott, Officer Resigns

A decision to continue efforts to boycott the public schools here in Ouachita Parish was made Thursday night by a group of concerned individuals who "re-affirmed" their faith in the Save Our Schools Committee. The group is opposed to the court-decreed integration of public schools in both the Monroe and Ouachita Parish school systems.

E. S. Bolton, committee chairman, stated prior to the meeting that it may be the last meeting for his group, which has gone on record favoring abolition of public schools in favor of private institutions administered at low cost.

Bolton, who preaches forced school integration is a "Communist plot," urged the group to help support the boycott. He admitted the boycott is "not going too well."

Bolton also took opportunity to lash out at Ouachita Parish School Board President William Norris III. A petition is being circulated in Ward 5 for Norris' recall.

"I'm proud to see this recall petition," Bolton declared. "If we hadn't had traitors for school board members we wouldn't have had to have a boycott, and they would have done like lots of other school boards did and upheld the Constitution."

He said about six parish school board members wanted to oppose the court order for integration, but that Norris had suppressed the move.

"If Norris had fulfilled his responsibility, we wouldn't have had it (desegregation)," Bolton said.

Leadership Lack

The chairman, quoting from a news article, said Norris had "the audacity to say" the boycott failed because of "lack of good leadership and lack of organization by responsible people."

"No one slaps Ed Bolton in the face without an attempt by me to slap him back," said Bolton, attributing Norris' attitude to a personal grudge.

Later taking a dig at Congressman Otto E. Passman, Bolton said, "It would be nice to know what happened to all the petitions that people worked so hard to get signed. I'll bet they never reached Washington."

"I've voted for Passman for the last time," he said.

Bolton said public officials and others in the community have fought SOS because "they knew we had a winner. We still can win, but it will take longer."

"I'm against violence," Bolton declared.

"If you have backbone and nerve enough and love enough for your children, put your shoulder to the wheel and fight," Bolton urged. "It might be your last chance."

The next thing that's coming, he said, not naming the anticipated action, will "shock you worse than anything. When that comes along, you'll get your gun, and I won't have to ask you to do it."

Several of those at the meeting said "our children are out, and they are going to stay out." They said some 1,000 children are being kept out of schools, although school officials disclaimed any knowledge of an organized boycott.

"I wouldn't advocate picketing of schools," Bolton said. "But tonight I don't care what anybody does."

In lieu of SOS's proposal to abolish public schools, Bolton said "We are working on a plan to use computers in the schools. He said schools could

be operated at one-third of the cost of schools employing classroom teachers and the system would necessitate hiring only two teachers to 500 students.

When contacted today, the secretary of the Save Our Schools group, Robert Fuller, said he had resigned the position. "I withdraw my support in the boycott of all of our schools. I am not and will not be responsible for any boycott or picketing of the schools," he added.

Norris Answers Accusations By Group Leader

William Norris III, president of the Ouachita Parish School Board, today issued a statement in which he refuted earlier remarks by a member of the Save Our Schools Committee and defended the school board members in their actions.

E. S. Bolton, committee chairman, had hit at Norris, along with Congressman Otto E. Passman in a committee meeting Thursday.

Norris's statement read in full:

"I read the statements by Mr. E. S. Bolton in the newspaper today that concerned me personally. I originally did not intend to reply, but on the insistence of friends, I am issuing this statement.

"I make this reply and this will be the only one that I shall make in regard to this matter. After this, it will be considered closed.

"The first point is with regard to the charge by Mr. Bolton that members of the Ouachita Parish School Board are 'traitors.' I remind him that this is a most serious and slanderous charge which I personally resent on behalf of myself as well as on behalf of the other dedicated members of the Parish School Board.

"Secondly, with regard to the statement that I suppressed the votes of six parish school board

members, this is absolutely false. All 18 other members of the Ouachita Parish School Board are dedicated public servants, serving at a time when pressure from the federal courts and other groups is at an all-time high. They are intelligent people who vote their own convictions and I know of not one member who is controlled or suppressed by any other member.

"Third, the quote attributed by Mr. Bolton to me saying that I had stated the boycott failed because of lack of good leadership and lack of organization by responsible people is not a statement made by me. If it was attributed to me then this is erroneous. I have not commented on the alleged boycott or its leadership in any manner.

"Fourth, with reference to the statement made by Mr. Bolton and I—quote—'If Norris had fulfilled his responsibility, we wouldn't have had it (desegregation)'. I think the irresponsibility, inaccuracy and absurdity of this statement made by Mr. Bolton speaks for itself.

"And, last, in regard to the recall petition, this is a democratic process and, if the required number of signatures are obtained, I intend to answer the recall challenge and will be governed in the end by the voters.

"Mr. Bolton may be assured that I hold no personal grudge against him nor against anyone associated with him or his group."

The meeting was opened approximately 8:15 PM with prayer being given by the Grand Chaplain JACK BARNES and the veil of secrecy was opened. Then the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER presided over the meeting and requested that the Assistant Secretary of the OKA HUGH MOORE read the minutes of the previous month. These minutes were read by MOORE and were then approved by those present. OWEN DUNCAN made the motion that the minutes be accepted and BOYKIN MC LAIN made the second to the motion and everyone voted in favor of accepting the minutes as read.

Unit reports were then given by various representatives of the units that were represented. Giving the Monroe report was HUGH MOORE, giving the Bastrop report was OWEN DUNCAN and giving the Oak

Grove report was BOYKIN MC LAIN.

It was learned during the course of this meeting that Oak Grove OKA Unit number One and Oak Grove OKA Unit number Two had merged into one unit and there was only one unit in the Oak Grove area at this time.

The Grand Dragon then introduced four or five new members from Monroe, Louisiana, names unrecalled.

The Grand Dragon then made a brief speech concerning the organization as a whole in Louisiana and reported that as long as he was the Grand Dragon he would run the organization the way he saw fit. He felt there were too many chiefs and not enough Indians at all of the Unit meetings, and encouraged all of those present to work hard in order to rebuild the organization.

The Grand Chaplain then made a brief speech concerning the unity of the OKA and quoted some scripture from the bible concerning the organization.

It was noted that during the course of this meeting it was mostly a social affair as most of the klansmen had their wives and children present with them.

The meeting was closed approximately 10:00 PM with prayer being given by the Grand Chaplain JACK BARNES.

There were four or five members robed out and

were carrying their shotguns with them. One of them was believed to be the Grand Klokkan C. V. FLOWERS, another was believed to be JACK WATEINS and another was believed to be the new bodyguard for the Grand Dragon who is described as being approximately 20 years old, an old former football player from Monroe, Louisiana, who is about six feet eleven inches tall and 265 pounds. The other person dressed out in a rober was unknown.

OKA ACTIVITY REGARDING SCHOOL DESEGREGATION

During the week of August 24-31, 1969, the leaders of the OKA, ROBERT FULLER, Rev. JACK BARNES and KEN EUBANKS, met together to plan strategy in connection with the opening of schools. All three agreed that they had to avoid violence and that some of the demands of the members and other people sympathetic to the Klan were too drastic and would likely cause bigger problems. E. S. BOLTON had organized a committee called "SAVE OUR SCHOOLS COMMITTEE AND FRIENDS" and it was decided to support this committee as long as it did not advocate anything illegal. FULLER stated that he had been asked by Chief of Police J. C. KELLY of Monroe, Louisiana, to keep a close watch on BOLTON and make sure that he would not cause any problems for the schools. FULLER stated that KELLY warned him that anyone would be immediately arrested if they interfered with the opening of schools and that if any OKA Klansmen were involved then FULLER would be the first one arrested. FULLER was reportedly concerned over the matter and said that he knew that KELLY meant what he said and that he and

BARNES and EUBANKS had to convince their members not to interfere in any way. BOLTON presented a leaflet to the three OKA leaders and a copy of this original leaflet is attached. The OKA leaders then showed this leaflet to KELLY who advised them not to distribute it as it would likely cause problems. The leaders then crossed out some of the stronger wording on the leaflet as shown by the attached copy and a third leaflet (also attached) was agreed upon.

FULLER told BOLTON that he would have his members distribute the leaflet and then he met with BARNES and EUBANKS and they agreed that it would be too risky to pass out the leaflets since they would be testing Chief KELLY and would be inviting arrest. It was then decided that they would tell BOLTON the leaflets were distributed but they would not in fact distribute them.

HUGH MOORE was one of the OKA members advocating the boycott and he said that he was going to enroll his children in a private school, whereas the others in the OKA went along and sent their children to the public schools. It was decided that the members should keep a close watch on MOORE and at the next meeting a vote would be taken on whether or not he should be ousted from the OKA.

FULLER reported to the OKA members in Monroe that there had been no interference in the desegregation of schools in both West Carroll and Morehouse Parishes and that he was proud of the leaders of the OKA in those areas for following his orders and not interfering.

A new man taken into the Monroe OKA unit is R. G. "Bud" KAHMAR, JR., who sells insurance for First Fidelity and Mortgage Company in Monroe.
