A meeting of the officers of West Monroe UKA Unit # 2 was held from 8:00 P.M. to 8:45 P.M. at the residence of JAMES WHEELER near West Monroe, Louisiana. There were four officers of that Klan Unit present and they were as follows:

ARNOLD MANN, Exalted Cyclops

DONNIE MANN

JAMES WHEELER

JAMES SOWELL

ARNOLD MANN stated that he and WHEELER had a discussion with another Klansman that day concerning action that might be taken against school integration and that after thinking it over, he had concluded that it would be foolish to cause damage to school property and therefore the Klan Unit would not take any action against school property because of integration of the schools.



ARNOLD MANN stated that a member of that unit, GERALD MOODY, had been involved in a theft and that he would be subject to a special Klan trial.

ARNOLD MANN stated that there were members of West Monroe Unit # 2 who also held a membership in another UKA Unit, and he said that he planned to write to ROBERT SHELTON to ascertain whether action might be taken against Klansmen holding dual Klan memberships.

ARNOLD MANN stated that ROBERT FULLER has been working closely with the Chief of Police in Monroe and that he and his Klan Organization had a good working relationship with the Monroe Police Department; ARNOLD MANN proposed that contact be made with Chief MITCHELL of the West Monroe Police Department by a member of West Monroe Unit # 2 to propose to Chief MITCHELL that the UKA work closely with the West Monroe Police Department. He suggested that cooperation between the UKA and the West Monroe Police Department would put the FBI out of business.

ARNOLD MANN suggested that West Monroe UKA Unit # 2  
would use Citizens Band Radio and establish night patrols.

On Saturday night, September 16, 1967, ROBERT FULLER and ABE ALLEN, both members of the Ku Klux Klan, became engaged with one another in a fist fight at Sam's Roundup Bar, located on South Sixth Street in Monroe, Louisiana. Reportedly, ALLEN slapped ALLEN's wife for dancing with a bouncer employed at the bar by the name of SAM JOHNSON, at which time FULLER took issue with ALLEN, and the fight ensued.

On Sunday afternoon, September 17, 1967, the following vehicles were observed parked in front of Muhammad's Mosque, 2000 Conover Street, Monroe, Louisiana, during the regular meeting of the Mosque:

On 9/19/67, [ ] furnished the following information which should be carefully protected in order to protect LR informant:

On 9/10/67, THOMAS EARL WYLIE traveled from his home near Mer Rouge, Louisiana, to near Wilmot, Arkansas, where he met informant and together they traveled to near Portland, Arkansas, to visit one WILLIAM S. COLEMAN, former Exalted Cyclops of the Endora Klavern of OKA. COLEMAN was not at home, and his wife stated he would call informant upon his return as he was working away from home. Subsequent efforts to contact COLEMAN have proved negative.

During this visit, WYLIE informed informant that he has been attending meetings of the Oak Grove Klavern and invited informant down there to attend.

A few days prior to 9/19/67, ROBERT FULLER telephoned informant to learn if he had seen COLEMAN, but informant stated he had not and could not get in touch with him. FULLER then asked informant if he was going to attend the Oak Grove Klavern and added that there were only three persons from Arkansas he cared about, namely, informant, TOMMY WYLIE, and COLEMAN, and the rest could go to hell as far as he was concerned.

The meeting was opened with prayer at 2:25 p.m.

Mr. Martin told the Group that the Organization was to undergo a re-organization, starting at the Realm Level. He said that due to the resignation of the Chief K.B.I., that all K.B.I. cards are being revoked and are being picked up in order to prepare for re-organization of this department. Mr. Martin read a copy (he said it was) of the letter of resignation of the Chief K.B.I. to the Group. Mr. Martin told the Group that a temporary Chief K.B.I. would be appointed to fill this office until the end of this year.

Mr. Martin and Mr. Wilder told the Group that all Providence Giant Commissions were to be revoked and picked up for re-organization of this department. They said that Mr. Bayles and "some others" would be retained as Providence Giants. They told the Group that there were men (& too many of them) that claimed to be Providence Giants, Assistant and/or Deputy Providence Giants, but who do not have Commissions, or who were not so Commissioned, to hold these ranks. Mr. Martin and Mr. Wilder were asked what Commission was held by Mr. Robert Fuller. They told the Group they knew of no Commission held by Mr. Fuller, and if he had one of any kind, they didn't know what kind it was, or where or how he got it. Several of those present said that they had been told by Mr. Fuller that he had received his Commission from The Imperial Authority. Mr. Martin then took from his briefcase, a piece of paper (Commission) and said that if Mr. Fuller didn't have one like it he was not what he claimed to be. The Group was told by Russell Price that Mr. Fuller had told him that he had been given his Commission early by The Imperial Dragon, whereas he would have normally had to wait until the first of the year to get it.

The Group was told that a meeting of only the E.C.'s of the Units would be held on Saturday, Nov. 23, 1963 at 2p.m. in Columbia for the purpose of submitting names of persons qualified to be Commissioned as the Providence Giant. Mr. Wilder is to select the Providence Giant and his Deputies. It was requested by the presiding officers that Mr. Bayles and Mr. Fuller be contacted and told to attend this meeting.

The Group was told that problems arising would be forwarded to Mr. Martin & Mr. Wilder. Also, that minutes of each Unit's weekly meeting would be sent to Mr. Martin only, and not to Mr. Swenson too, as they are now being done.

Mr. Wilder told the Group that he had attended a meeting on the previous Thursday with the Imperial Dragon, and they (those at this meeting) were told that all Governing Action was to be through Mr. Martin.

Mr. Martin & Mr. Wilder told the Group that Deputy Giants (those so Commissioned) are for visitation and information purposes only. The prime boss of each Unit is the E.C. If higher authority is needed in the organization of the Unit, the E.C. will contact the Providence Giant, who will in turn contact the Grand Giant if he is needed.

In the event that problems arise that action needs to be taken on, the E.C. will contact the Grand Dragon, who will contact and instruct the Chief K.B.I.

The Group was told that when the Units got One-hundred (100) members, it was to quit taking new members, and a new Unit would be formed.

Money taken for robes will still be sent to Mr. Swenson. Transferring members will pay up all dues & fees to the Unit he belongs to, resign from the Unit, turn in his card and get a letter of approval from His E.C. to transfer. These men transferring may carry their robes.

The Group was told that if actions have to be taken that the burning of crosses is the highest piece of action a Unit can do without Higher Authorization. Units are not to make a move or take action (higher than cross burning) until properly notified by the Grand Dragon and The Chief K.B.I. The Units were told not to take any action that would break any laws. This type of action would be taken care of.

A motion was brought before the Group to burn crosses in front of all voting places the morning of election day, to see if negroes could be discouraged from voting and to remind some Whites to be careful of how they vote & that they are being watched. The motion was passed & agreed on by those in attendance.

A question came from the floor, as to whether or not the Organization was going to support the entire Jackson ticket. The Group was told that we had the election for the election of a candidate to support for Governor, but not necessarily his whole ticket.

The Group was told to drop a member from the roll if he missed three straight meetings and was absent on the fourth, unless he was absent due to death, illness and/or Organization work.

Mr. Martin & Mr. Wilder told the Group of a meeting they had held with Mr. Bill Dodd, candidate for State Superintendent for Education & that they thought the Organization may be able to work him for the betterment of the education of our school children.



Mr. Causey, who is also associated with a school system, told the Group what he thought of Mr. Dodd, that Dodd was being backed & financed by Mr. Victor Bussey, who has made the statement that he was with the Kennyds and their beliefs all of the way and would go to the brink of hell with them to prove it (&I hope they go there). Mr. Martin then told the Group to forget about Dodd and to vote for whoever they wanted, as long as he was a good man for the job. The matter was dropped.

It was decided that the next Providence #2 Meeting would be held on the 3rd. Sunday in January, 1964, at Jena. Units are to meet at Summerville Free Methodist Camp on Hwy 127, between Jena and Olla at 2 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m. with prayer.

The regular monthly meeting of the 5th Province of the UKA of Louisiana, was held on Tuesday night, 9/26/67, from 8:10 P.M. to 9:35 P.M. at West Monroe UKA Unit # 2 Klavern building. There were 12 Klansmen present for this meeting, and they were as follows:

E. M. BOYD, SR., Ferriday Unit;

IVY MORRIS SANFORD;

ARNOLD MANN, who was armed with a 25 caliber Beretta automatic;

O. K. HAMMONS;

W. E. BURGESS, who gave the opening and closing prayers for the meeting, and who had a pistol of some type in his pocket;

JAMES WHEELER, who was wearing a 22 caliber single action Colt revolver in a shoulder holster;

DONNIE MANN, membership number 15 in West Monroe UKA Unit # 2;

HARLON MC LEMORE, who was carrying a 22 caliber nine shot revolver, either Ruger make or High Standard; MC LEMORE was driving a red Ranchero Pickup truck, bearing 1967 Louisiana license 27-010;

SAMUEL PAGE of the Bastrop Unit;

W. J. KIDD;

HOUSTON P. MORRIS;

ED JARVIS.

In the business discussed, it was stated that the secretary of the Titan Committee of the 5th Province of the UKA in Louisiana would buy 50 stamped envelopes for use by the Titan Committee. E. M. BOYD, SR., the Great Titan, stated that a security guard meeting of the UKA would be held at the VFW Hall in Bastrop, Louisiana, at 2:00 P.M. on 10/15/67.

A collection of \$10 was taken up for flowers for the child of DANIEL BARR, a member of the West Monroe UKA Unit # 2. The child's legs were recently amputated as a result of accidental gun shot wounds.

O. K. HAMMONS stated that the treasury of the Titan Committee had only \$9.46.

HOUSTON MORRIS stated that ROBERT FULLER and his Klan group were supporting BILL DODD for State Superintendent of Education, instead of NED TOUCHSTONE, and also were supporting JOHN MC KIETHEN instead of JOHN RARICK for Governor. The indication is that all other Klan groups are supporting TOUCHSTONE and RARICK.

W. E. BURGESS talked about ten minutes against the use of profanity at Klan meetings. HOUSTON MORRIS requested RARICK for Governor posters from West Monroe Unit # 2, but ARNOLD MANN

stated that West Monroe Unit # 2 planned to distribute the posters on Saturday, 9/30/67, but if any were left over, they would be given to MCRRIS.

E. M. BOYD, SR. asked W. J. KIDD whether the Clinton Unit of the UKA was going to have a RARICK rally on Saturday, 9/30/67, and KIDD replied that the Clinton Unit was having a regular unit meeting on that night and not a rally.

E. M. BOYD, SR. got the names from HOUSTON MORRIS of the Exalted Cyclops (EC) and the addresses of the Units for Bastrop Unit and Chatham Unit. It is noted that MORRIS stated that GLENN HENSON was the EC of the Chatham Unit and that he had been the first EC of the Chatham Unit of the UKA.

ARNOLD MANN asked W. J. KIDD about the PA system of the 5th Province of the UKA, and KIDD replied that the PA system was mounted on a RARICK for Governor car. MANN stated that any use of this PA system should first be cleared with the Titan Committee of the 5th Province of the UKA. KIDD remarked that ROBERT SHELTON might come get the PA system, and MANN replied that SHELTON should not get the PA system and he said that if it were necessary, he would take the PA system off the car before SHELTON arrived to prevent his getting it. The meeting adjourned and ARNOLD MANN reached to get the \$10 donation for flowers for the child of DANIEL BARR, and O. K. HAMMONS protested that this money was taken up for the Titan Committee, and that, as secretary-treasurer of that committee,

he should have the money.

MANN insisted on taking the money and HAMMONS became angry and slammed the minute book shut; and handed the money to MANN and told him to "Take it and go to Hell."

UKA in Louisiana voted at the state meeting on September 23, 1967, that support would be given to JOHN RARICK, candidate for Governor of Louisiana, NED TOUCHSTONE, candidate for State Superintendent of Education and SIMPSON, candidate for State Insurance Commissioner. It was further announced the 5th Province had voted to offer the public support of the Klan for BILLY BROWN, candidate for State Senator from Oak Grove, Louisiana. In addition to the above, the Bastrop Unit voted to give the public support of the Klan to HUGHIE PERRY, candidate for re-election to the Office of Sheriff of Morehouse Parish, Louisiana, and T. T. FIELDS, candidate for State Representative.

The Bastrop Unit had also decided that they would vote for HOWARD GRIFFITH, candidate for State Senator, but would not campaign actively for GRIFFITH.

W. J. KIDD reported on the state meeting held at Ferriday, Louisiana, on September 23, 1967, and gave the results of the elections held there as well as made the announcement that J. C. BORSKEY had been elected King Kleagle. He had announced that HOUSTON MORRIS was being



considered for the office of Grand Dragon of Louisiana should ROBERT SHELTON, the Imperial Wizard, agree to a state election. Each member present was solicited individually and each agreed to back HOUSTON P. MORRIS.

DARWIN HAMILTON stated that he personally liked J. C. BORSKEY but he did not feel that BORSKEY was qualified to run the state UKA. He said that BORSKEY had talked to him about the same before, which BORSKEY wanted to do and HAMILTON did not feel that the Bastrop Unit would agree with.

FRED SIVILS spoke up and mentioned that HOUSTON MORRIS and W. J. KIDD had both completely organized Southern Arkansas and without their help there would never have been any UKA in Louisiana.

SIVILS stated that he felt that both KIDD and MORRIS were dedicated Klansmen and were very instrumental in keeping the organization together.

W. J. KIDD advised that ROBERT FULLER, Grand Dragon of the OKA, had contacted NED TOUCHSTONE in Shreveport, and advised him that he did not appreciate

the allegation being made against BILL DODD, present State Superintendent of Education. KIDD stated that FULLER had interferred with everything they had tried to do. He stated that he felt that an effort should be made to separate the unity of FULLER's OKA group, particularly the Bastrop Unit of the OKA. WESLEY BOYKIN stated that he would personally talk to some of the members of the Bastrop Unit of the OKA and would see if he could not persuade them into joining the UKA.

There was no further business conducted, the meeting adjourned.

INFORMATION CONCERNING OKKKK AND COOPA ACTIVITIES  
IN NORTHEAST LOUISIANA VIA CONVERSATIONS WITH MEMBERS

On September 16, 1967 DURWOOD WILHITE, the present Grand Klokard of the OKKKK advised that he had talked with a JOHN RANDELL at Newellton, Louisiana, concerning his taking the position of campaign manager for JOHN R. RARICK for Governor of Louisiana. This manager would be for the Tensas Parish area. WILHITE was in a conversation with ROBERT BARFIELD of Newellton, Louisiana, and GEORGE WILHITE of the same town. DURWOOD WILHITE further stated that he and MURRAY MARTIN, the present Grand Dragon of the OKKKK, had talked to Mr. ED MC DONALD of Newellton, Louisiana, on Friday September 15, 1967 concerning taking the job of campaign manager for RARICK and at that time MC DONALD told them he would not have the time to devote to such a project. MC DONALD further advised that he would be willing to help in the campaign whatever way possible, but he could not take the position of campaign manager. WILHITE advised that he would like to have somebody in every parish in northeast Louisiana as campaign manager for the campaign of JOHN R. RARICK. WILHITE further stated that there was to be a meeting in Monroe, Friday September 22, 1967 with RARICK prior to RARICK's appearance at the West Monroe, Louisiana, High School and this meeting was for the persons closely involved with the campaign of JOHN R. RARICK. DURWOOD WILHITE stated

he planned to be in attendance at this meeting.

On September 17, 1967 ROBERT BARFIELD, the former Exalted Cyclops of the Newellton Unit of the OKKKK and present member of the COOPA Unit from Tensas Parish, advised that he had not talked to JOHN RANDELL of Newellton, Louisiana, because he would not know whether Mr. MC DONALD was going to take the job as campaign manger for JOHN R. RARICK. He felt that he would wait and see whether or not MC DONALD was going to take the job as campaign manager before he made any efforts to contact RANDELL. He further advised that he was going to go all out in order to support RARICK in the area and he also wanted to be able to pick a campaign manager if Mr. MC DONALD did not want to take the position. BARFIELD stated that the COOPA unit of the Tensas Parish should do as much as possible to help the campaign of NED TOUCHSTONE as well as JOHN RARICK, because TOUCHSTONE and men like him can do more for COOPA than any other persons in Louisiana if they are elected. He stated that TOUCHSTONE can certainly do everything possible for the schools in Louisiana if he is elected as he stands for separate school systems. BARFIELD stated that the school problem is probably the most serious problem in Tensas Parish at the present time, however, there have been no efforts to desegregate the schools in this parish.

On September 18, 1967, ROY C. DAVIS, JR. advised that the COOPA unit of Tensas Parish should wait concerning

appointing a campaign manager for JOHN RARICK in Tensas Parish until Mr. MC DONALD of Newellton, Louisiana, made a decision as to whether or not he was willing to take this job. DAVIS stated that we must do everything possible to see that RARICK and TOUCHSTONE get elected in the primary election on November 4, 1967 due to the fact it is the only chance for conservative people to have a say in the Government of Louisiana in the future.

On Thursday, September 21, 1967, GEORGE WILHITE traveled from Newellton, Louisiana, to Gilbert, Louisiana, in order to attend a regularly scheduled meeting of the Wisner Unit of the OKKKK. WILHITE appeared at the Klavern building in Gilbert, Louisiana, and waited for several minutes; however, none of the members showed up and it was readily apparent that there was not going to be any meeting. It appeared that the political activity in the area has cut down the meetings of the OKKKK. WILHITE then proceeded to the vicinity of Pop's Cafe in Wisner, Louisiana, and determined that ERNEST "POP" KENNERLY no longer runs the cafe, but he is still living in a trailer home near the school in Wisner, Louisiana.

On Saturday, September 23, 1967, PETE CAMPBELL of Winnsboro, Louisiana, advised that the Winnsboro Unit of the OKKKK is still holding meetings and that they have a meeting approximately once a month. He stated that the meetings are being held in their klavern building located on the property

of LAMAR STEVENS and that the meetings are usually attended fairly well by the members. CAMPBELL stated that however there are some members who just will not come to the klavern to attend a regular meeting. CAMPBELL further advised that he feels that the OKKKK needs to be greatly reorganized after the elections on November 4, 1967, and that all efforts should be put forth to make this organization a good and productive working organization. CAMPBELL further stated that he feels sure that both CHESTER COKER and L. B. KNOX, members of the OKKKK, will win their election positions on November 4, 1967. COKER is running for representative for the State of Louisiana and L. B. KNOX is running for State Senator.

On Wednesday, September 27, 1967, BRUCE DARNELL, a local barber at Newellton, Louisiana, and member of the COOPA unit of Tensas Parish, advised that some people in the area have been taking down the CHESTER COKER signs around Newellton, Louisiana. He stated that he put these signs up and it is apparent that these signs are being torn down and in their place are being put signs for Dr. KING from Winnsboro, Louisiana. DARNELL stated that he is now thinking of going around taking down all of the KING signs in the area and replacing them with CHESTER COKER political campaign posters. DARNELL further advised that he hopes strongly that CHESTER COKER, NED TOUCHSTONE and JOHN RARICK all get elected in the primary election and then maybe the Citizens



Council will have a chance to succeed in Louisiana, however, if they do not, we had just as well forget about any further Citizens Council activity in the State of Louisiana. He stated that without such persons in elected positions there is little chance that the Citizens Council, the OKKKK or any other conservative organization will ever be able to function against the current Negro movement in this country.

On Wednesday, September 27, 1967, F. L. HARRIS, a former member of the Newellton Unit of the OKKKK and TV man at Newellton, Louisiana, advised that CHESTER COKER appears to be running a strong race in Tensas Parish and he believes that COKER will win as a State Representative in the area. He stated that he thinks NED TOUCHSTONE will also be successful in his candidacy for State Superintendent of Schools and that TOUCHSTONE will definitely be able to take some positive steps in order to correct the deplorable school situation at the present time in Louisiana. HARRIS also advised that he feels that Senator CHARLES BROWN from Tallulah, Louisiana, will also get re-elected because of the fact that the OKKKK and the Citizens Council is not working together in backing of L. D. KNOX from Gilbert, Louisiana. He stated that several years ago KNOX had all the support of the klan and he almost won in his race for Sheriff of Franklin Parish. HARRIS stated that the klan and the COOPA organization should further its

efforts in support of L. D. KNOX.

JAMES EARL SHIVERS of Tallulah, Louisiana, is no longer known to be active in OKKKK affairs.

HERMAN H. HARRIS of Jigger, Louisiana, is known to be active in the COOPA organization in Northeast, Louisiana, and is also a member of the Winnsboro Unit of the UKA.

RICHARD MARSHALL of 105 Johnnie Street in Tallulah, Louisiana, is currently active in the COOPA organization in Madison Parish. He was formerly the president of the District organization of COOPA but no longer holds this position. MARSHALL is employed as a newspaper distributor in Tallulah, Louisiana, and owns a 1960 Pontiac, Louisiana license 50F148 and also a 1957 Ford, Louisiana license 50F149.

The Tallulah Unit of the OKKKK has been inactive for several months and it is felt that this unit will not be reactivated in the immediate future.

Nothing is known concerning the possibility of JAMES B. GOSS, a probation officer from Tallulah, Louisiana, was ever a member of the Tallulah Unit of the OKKKK. The name JOSEPH EDWARDS is unfamiliar and there has been no talk within the area of Northeast, Louisiana, concerning a Negro by the name of EDWARDS who was involved in an incident with a white woman at the Shamrock Motel in Vidalia, Louisiana. It is known that the Tallulah Unit of the OKKKK in the past

has agreed to work with certain "jobs" between the Tallulah Unit and the Vidalia Unit of the OXKKK; however, certain big jobs would only come through the approval of the KBI man for the State of the OXKKK, who in 1964 was ROBERT FULLER of Monroe, Louisiana.

On October 2, 1967 the Charmingdale Nucleus, UKA Unit held its regular weekly meeting at the Unit's Klavern, located on the property of BILLY PARKER. This meeting began at approximately 7:00 PM and ended at about 9:30 PM with seven Klansmen present including the following:

W. J. KIDD

HOUSTON MORRIS

BILLY PARKER

IVAN BASTIAN

JACK EDMISTON

MIKE THOMPSON

BUTCH COON

After the opening portion of the meeting the members who had been behind in their dues was requested to pay up or they would have to be dropped from the rolls. It is noted that W. J. KIDD attended this meeting for the first time in about seven months and paid his dues of \$21.00 which was for seven months. BUTCH COON paid \$3.00 dues, BILLY PARKER paid \$3.00 dues, and MIKE THOMPSON paid \$1.00 who pays \$1.00 three weeks out of the month. THOMPSON pays his dues this way because he has a wife and two children and he does not make much money working for Mid-South Supply Company.

After the matter of dues had been taken care of a general bull session was held and BILLY PARKER stated that he had no use for ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA because of the way

FULLER takes Klansmen's money. PARKER stated that at one time FULLER had two hundred names on the rolls at the Klavern which meets on Moore Road, South of Monroe, Louisiana and is located on the property of J. C. OLIVER. It was the general consensus of all present that they had no use for ROBERT FULLER and did not trust him.

HOUSTON MORRIS then stated that he had recently contacted FULLER who told him that he had six OKA Units and that he had approximately 1000 members but MORRIS stated that he did not believe him. MORRIS then stated that he told FULLER that he had a total of 98 Units of the UKA in Louisiana with about 10,000 members.

MORRIS then stated that Chatham Unit of the UKA has scheduled a fish fry for Saturday, October 7, 1967 at the Luna Louisiana Fire Tower at 4:30 PM and everyone was invited.

BUTCH COON then stated that TOMMY REAGAN recently contacted him and told him that he has quit his job at the Monroe, Louisiana Civic Center and now only has a job on weekends working for KNOE Radio Station at the Stations Radio Tower located at Riverton, Louisiana. COON stated that REAGAN asked him if he could join the Charmingdale Unit of the UKA as he had an interest in becoming active in Klan activities again. REAGAN did not actually make an application to become a member of the Charmingdale Unit but it is believed that he may in the near future.

During the general bull session members of the Unit continued to work on the Unit's Klavern building and installed two doors and one window which were both donated by HOUSTON MORRIS. It is believed the only thing left to do on the building is to level the floor.

The remainder of the meeting was taken up with further discussion of the political candidates scheduled for election in the primaries in November, and it was decided that after the meeting, all those who would volunteer, would go out and help set up posters supporting the candidates which had been approved by the unit for their support in their meeting of 10/5/67.

MEETING OF OAK GROVE UNITS 1 AND 2 ON NOVEMBER 21, 1967

Both of the Oak Grove Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated (OKA) Units held a combined meeting on the night of November 21, 1967, at the Oak Grove Klavern with wives of members invited. The special meeting was called as a result of the death of Representative VAIL DELONY, in order to decide which candidate to support for Representative, as a special election to fill the vacancy is expected. ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA, was invited to attend, and he gave a short speech suggesting that anyone who knew the feelings of the Representative candidates should speak out since the units had sponsored DELONY and, apparently, knew little about the others.

After some discussion, it was decided that the best man to support in the special election would be VINING, and both units agreed to work in support of VINING, as he appeared to be the most qualified and would probably work for the cause of segregation.

BILL TURNER brought up the subject of the proposed Negro subdivision in Oak Grove and said that the members were wondering on the best approach to the problem. ROBERT FULLER

suggested that all the members write their elected officials and tell them that they were opposed to the Negro subdivision within the city limits of Oak Grove.

The only other business discussed centered around the monthly OKA State meeting and the need to improve attendance at the meetings. FULLER said that the November meeting represented the poorest showing of the OKA in the past two years and that a few meetings as poorly attended as that one could break up the organization in no time. FULLER praised the Oak Grove members for their enthusiasm in the OKA and said that the OKA would indeed be weak without the support and strength of the members from the Oak Grove area.

MEETING BETWEEN GRAND DRAGON OF LOUISIANA ORIGINAL KU KLUX  
KLAN OF AMERICA, INCORPORATED, (OKA) AND GRAND CHAPLAIN OF  
NATIONAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

On December 3, 1967, M. H. SMITH, 2218 Pryor Road, Atlanta, Georgia (telephone number 627-2522), who claims to be the Grand Chaplain of the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, met in Monroe, Louisiana, with the Grand Dragon of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Incorporated (OKA), ROBERT FULLER, at FULLER's home. SMITH said that he was representing JAMES VENABLE and was making a trip throughout the South trying to get various Klan organizations to join the National Knights. He said that he had met with BOOTS JOHNSON of Cullen, Louisiana, on the previous day and tried to get JOHNSON's interest, but JOHNSON had told him that there was little interest in the Klan in his area and that he would not be able to be of any help. SMITH said that his next stop would be in Jackson, Mississippi, where he planned to contact FERRALL MC CORMICK and attempt to interest MC CORMICK in having his Klan group join with the National Knights.

The meeting lasted about two hours with FULLER telling SMITH that he did not want to join with the National Knights because he could not see any benefits in doing so and the OKA members had previously decided not to attempt to join any other groups or to expand in any way. FULLER said that they had several months ago voted to sever all ties with MC CORMICK and his Klan group and the only connection the OKA has out of Louisiana is with a small group of five or six Klansmen in Arkansas who generally attend the OKA monthly meetings in Monroe. FULLER said that he would look forward to coming to the National Knights annual rally in September at Stone Mountain but that the OKA did not wish to have any other dealings with any other Klan group.

SMITH did not say if he was having any success on his trip in getting other Klan groups interested in the National Knights, but he did indicate that interest in the Klan seemed at an all time low. FULLER told SMITH that he agreed with him that Klan interest is indeed low and that it is harder than ever to get new members.

The main topic of conversation was the proposed Negro housing subdivision for Oak Grove. The site is reportedly between Oak Grove and Forest, Louisiana, and MONTE BOYTE stated that the

big fear among the members is that if the subdivision goes up in that location then the Negroes living there would be in the white school district. Most of the complaints centered around the fact that the Negroes would probably attend the white schools and ROBERT FULLER was called to lend advice to the members on what course of action to take. FULLER advised that absolutely no violence could be considered and stated that he felt that Senator ADCOCK and Congressman PASSMAN should be consulted to encourage them to see what they could do about relocating the subdivision. FULLER said that he would try to arrange an appointment for some of the members with ADCOCK and PASSMAN. He said that PASSMAN is in Washington now and it would probably be at least until after Christmas before they could get to see either legislator. FULLER's idea seemed to be taken enthusiastically by the members and discussion centered around who would be selected from the unit to meet with ADCOCK and PASSMAN. MONTE BOYTE said that he would like to meet with them and suggested that they choose two or three other members to go with him.

Two new members were at the meeting and it was learned that they were recently sworn into the unit. These men are ANDY PATRICK, who drives a milk truck, and HUBERT AINSWORTH, who is a contractor.

There was other discussion at the meeting concerning the election for State Representative. The Unit had previously voted to back VINING but now that NICK HAMILTON is running as a

Republican the Unit has decided to review their decision further before endorsing a candidate. HAMILTON has previously been friendly to the Unit and has spoken at Klan rallies in the past.

He said that he lost his job as a result of his activities in the Klan and he does not believe he can devote anymore time to the Klan.

It was learned that the latest area under proposal for the subdivision is now near Darnell, La., and it appears that the leaders of the unit and the members are not really clear as to the location of the proposed subdivision, and whether or not anyone is actually planning to build a Negro subdivision.

Other discussion at the meeting centered around the race for State Representative from the West Carroll - East Carroll area, and it appears from the conversations that the Unit will back VINING instead of NICK HAMILTON.

The meeting lasted approximately 45 minutes, and was closed with prayer.

Information has been received that Arkansas klaverns of UKA have sent no money to the national office since September, 1967, and ROBERT SHELTON is becoming very impatient with Arkansas. ROBERT SHELTON phoned Grand Dragon GEORGE A. McNEELY during the previous week and indicated he wanted to do something to promote interest in the Klan in Arkansas to build up the membership. He indicated he wanted to hold a public rally soon. He also wants to send someone to Arkansas, possibly a Grand Titan, to organize for the Klan. He also wants to make all old members who come back into the Klan pay all back dues, which in some cases would amount to \$36.00. SHELTON wanted Arkansas to put up the money for the Grand Titan to come to Arkansas to recruit new members.

Grand Dragon McNEELY reportedly rejected these proposals, telling SHELTON he was not going to do anything until next Spring, since by that time they could better analyze the political situation and better know what action they should take. He assured SHELTON that they could carry Arkansas for GEORGE WALLACE for President, and this appeared to encourage SHELTON.

The Hamburg Klavern has not completed construction of its meeting hall. DOYLE SIVILS stated he could get no one to help and they may put it off until next year. FRED SIVILS got out of the Klan at Bastrop, Louisiana, and may re-join at Hamburg, Arkansas by special dispensation of McNEELY.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D)

Information received that the Klan at Monroe, Louisiana, has organized its own church and the various Klan members are quitting their former churches to join this church. It appears that most of them are quitting their churches because of the affiliation of those churches with the National Council of Churches.

ROBERT FULLER's organization in Louisiana is reportedly about to fold up, and JACK HELM of Louisiana is anxious to come to Arkansas and take over the Klan up here.

The Strong Klavern wants to come back into UKA, and there is some indication they may be permitted to do so.

The Monticello Klavern is now meeting once a week. EC HENRY LYTAL claims to have the materials and is desirous of building a Klan meeting hall somewhere on the highway west of Monticello, Arkansas.

There has been no further activity by the group at Dermott, Arkansas, which group was attempting to organize a klavern last summer.

He explained that BILL TURNER of Oak Grove would be the logical choice for Grand Titan since the Oak Grove area had requested representation in the Titan position.

FULLER also noted that of those present at the meeting only C. L. COOK would be eligible for the position of Exalted Cyclops of the unit since he was the only member at the meeting other than himself and RENFROE who had been in the Klan for over three years.

Source advised attended an APWR speaker meeting at the home of JOE DENVER HAWKINS on Monday night wherein the following individuals were present:

BILL PICKEL  
ERNEST GILBERT  
JOE & JOHNNIE HAWKINS

ROY & JOE CAMPBELL  
BESSIE CHAPPEL

The general conversation was concerning phone calls having been made by an unknown party to JOHNNIE HAWKINS, alleging that ELAINE SMITH was pregnant and this condition was caused by JOE DENVER HAWKINS. JOHNNIE HAWKINS stated she had advised the caller that she hoped this was true and that maybe ELAINE SMITH would give her the baby as she and JOE DENVER had been wanting one. A lot of talk centered around these phone calls and the group is making a big joke out of it, rather than taking it seriously. They believe the FBI is having individuals make these phone calls and this is the reason why they are not taking it seriously.

BILL PICKEL had a lot to say regarding the tactics being used by the FBI to cause dissention among members of the APWR, and the fact the FBI is continually harassing him.

At this point ERNEST GILBERT told the group that he was tired of hearing the FBI discussed continuously and stated that nothing was accomplished at these meetings other than hearing the same stuff hashed over regarding tactics used by the FBI. BILL PICKEL took issue with GILBERT regarding this at which time GILBERT told the group that even though he too is harassed by the FBI, he does not make it an issue at the meetings nor does he talk about it. GILBERT told this group that on prior occasions he has told them that if he helped the APWR organization, it could have an adverse effect publicity



wise inasmuch as he is a Klansman first and will remain a Klansman until he dies. He further advised the group they would be unable to accomplish anything through the APWR without the support and help of the Klan. He stated that hereafter he will be willing to assist in any way; however, he will not take a leading part in the functions of the APWR.

Source stated it was his opinion that JOE DENVER and JOHNNIE HAWKINS, in addition to BILL PICKEL were relieved over the fact that he was not going to take a leading part and this gave them an opportunity to put ASA CARTER in the lead.

Jackson, Mississippi  
January 23, 1968

Source stated he has determined that ERNEST GILBERT and JACK SEALE made a trip to Louisiana and were in contact with ROBERT FULLER, who is the Grand Dragon of the OKA in the State of Louisiana. GILBERT turned over to FULLER 500 OKA dues cards and collected \$50 for these cards.

During the meeting with FULLER, FULLER advised GILBERT that at the next state meeting of the OKA in Louisiana, which will be held on February 4, 1968, FULLER will ask for the approval of the Klansmen gathered at this meeting to promote ERNEST GILBERT to the position of Imperial Dragon of the OKA for the States of Louisiana, Mississippi and Arkansas. FULLER asked GILBERT to present this idea to the Mississippi OKA at their next state meeting, to be held on February 11, 1968. FULLER stated the OKA for these states needs a man of GILBERT'S caliber to take over and direct activities of the Klan and through publicity, speeches and personal appearances, get the word to the people concerning the "new image" of the Klan. FULLER stated he feels that GILBERT is just the man for the job.

Source stated that GILBERT was in contact with JOE OUR of Greenville and JIMMY KING from the Delta. This group, including JACK SEALE, was in contact with (FNU) SYNDER, who operates a barber shop in Clarksdale, Mississippi and SYNDER allegedly told them that he would let these individual know when he was to have the first meeting of a unit of the OKA at Clarksdale.

Source advised he had learned that a group of Klansmen were considering running ERNEST GILBERT for Congressman in the Third District in the State of Mississippi for the position vacated by Governor JOHN BELL WILLIAMS. The Klansmen became upset when they learned that CHARLES EVERS, NAACP leader, had announced his candidacy for this position.

Source stated he does not believe this to be a good move on the part of the Klan at this time, and that he will attempt to convince the Grand Dragon of this fact.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP AND  
ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

There were no meetings of the SDG during the past week, but several SDG members attended an organizational meeting of a new Klavern of the OKKKK at Natchez, Mississippi, on Sunday, January 21, 1968.

The meeting was in the afternoon and JACK SEALE seemed to be in charge. The following persons attended:

1. JACK SEALE
2. C. D. FREEMAN
3. CHARLES D. SMITH
4. E. D. MORACE
5. PEANUTS CARNELL, a large white male who operates a repair shop on Highway 61, Natchez, Mississippi.
6. CLAUDE FULLER
7. REGGIE CARTER, who has a service station on Pine Street or Pine Road in Natchez, and has a small knot on his forehead.

The meeting was held about five miles Southeast of Natchez, at the old UKA lodge on the property of a doctor and near ERNEST PARKER's property.

SEALE said the man who was to head the new Klavern of the OKKKK was not at the meeting as he had to go to Brookhaven, Mississippi. SEALE was overheard to ask E. D. MORACE if ROBERT FULLER of Monroe, Louisiana, was still at Monroe, and source assumed SEALE wanted to make contact with FULLER, perhaps about the new Klavern.

SEALE explained the purpose of the new organization and stated the Klavern would not take part in any violence, and that any violence, if necessary, would be done by members as individuals. SEALE said the organization would disown the members if they were caught. SEALE said the head man of the organization, who was not identified, said that if any member were caught doing violence, he did not do the job well enough.

CLAUDE FULLER spoke of the need for violence to keep Negroes in line. CHARLES D. SMITH said the organization would carry on business as usual, but that the only difference was that the violence would be done by individual members and not discussed openly in meetings.

E. D. MORACE made a talk about the changing times, and that the Klan could not kill people at will as they had in the past. MORACE suggested the main task was educating the public to resist integration.

SEALE said the main task of the organization was to educate against Communism, but in case of any mass



violence by Negroes the organization would be ready and can cope with it. SEALE made a talk about members talking against each other. He said they must stop and if this happens, they will hold a trial and if convicted, the offending member would be whipped by the others. E. D. MORACE was overheard to tell SEALE he would probably be the first offender and the first one whipped as SEALE would get drunk, and SEALE did not appreciate this thought.

It was decided there would not be any \$10.00 fee to join the group, and members would start paying membership fees of \$2.00 a month, one dollar to stay in the local and one dollar to go to state headquarters.

SEALE said that at each meeting each member should bring a can of food and this would be distributed to needy families, white and Negro. SEALE said that he, CARTER and SMITH had gotten together on Sunday, January 14, 1968, about the new organization.

SMITH spoke about the weaknesses of past Klans and the reason was that members did not understand the oath. He suggested 30 minutes of study of the OKKKK manual at each meeting and that all members must obey the rules. SEALE said that dues must be paid on ten members to hold a charter, but that one man could hold a charter if he paid dues on ten members.

It was decided that another meeting would be held on Sunday, January 28, 1968, and that many former members would be asked to attend.

The Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., (OKA) held its monthly State meeting on January 7, 1968, at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, Klavern, marking the first time that the State meeting has been held at a location different from the Monroe, Louisiana Klavern. There were 26 members present and three visitors from the El Dorado, Arkansas Klavern, namely BILL HAZEN, ANDY DUGALL, and PREACHER WILLIAMS. ERNIE GILBERT of Mississippi was also present as a guest having been invited by LOUIS BLACK of the Oak Grove Unit. Those present from Louisiana included the following:

unit. The above five units are the only active units at the present time in the OKA. At the State meeting it was reported that Richland Parish was not present due to sickness. Richland Parish actually is not a unit and is just one man, E. W. PACE, but for purposes of impressing the visitors it was announced that Richland Parish would not be able to make a report due to sickness. The same is true for Slidell, Louisiana, as that unit has not been active and it was reported that they sent their dues but this was also false and reported to create the impression that the OKA is bigger than it actually is.

The main purpose of the meeting was to name the officers for the State for the coming year and these are contained in the minutes of the meeting which are as follows:

#### State Meeting

Meeting opened January 7, 1968. Grand Chaplain opened meeting at 2:05 p.m. with Prayer. 26 members were present at the meeting.

1. Oak Grove expressed appreciation for attendance and thanked Mississippi for attending.
2. Grand Dragon acted as Chairman.
3. Grand Dragon thanked the Secretary of Oak Grove for the good job he is performing.

4. Grand Dragon opened Meeting explaining that New Membership Cards would be issued to all members; he explained the ways these cards would be helpful to the Organization.
5. New Cards were approved and would be issued.
6. Grand Dragon and some of the Members would meet with Mississippi, January 14, 1968.
7. West Carroll expressed that the Units were doing fine and were showing progress and closed out 1967 with a good job, and hoped 1968 would be better.
8. The Titan of Bastrop expressed that Bastrop was climbing, and doing good work.
9. Richland Parish could not be here because of sickness.
10. Slidell had sickness, but sent their dues.
11. G. D. asked Miss. to work with Slidell, and the Titan of Miss. hoped for a close relation.
12. Ouachita Parish reported that they were proud to be here. He stated that he was having trouble and asked for help from the K.B.I. He asked for support of the new appointed E.C. He stated that too much talk was being expressed, and that it had to be stopped. Also, some of the drinking had to be cut out since it was affecting some of the duties.



13. He expressed that some of the cards would be pulled because they were affecting the growth of the organization.
14. Grand Chaplain expressed that he has enjoyed his relations with the organization in 1967 and appreciated the progress that has been done.
15. El Dorado reported that he would go along in support of the report of Ouachita Parish. He explained the importance of being a Klansman. He stated a Klansman should stand up and follow his oath. He reported that the Klan had a help in breaking up dope peddlers in El Dorado, Arkansas. El Dorado explained that this organization was going to grow with good members.
16. Strong, Arkansas, reported that he was having trouble in collecting dues, but expressed that he believed it was going to change and things would be straightened out.
17. Grand Dragon named the new officers for 1968. They will be as follows:

22. Grand Dragon thanked all for being here and meeting was closed with Prayer at 4:00 p.m.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP (SDG) AND  
ORIGINAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (OKKKK)

JAMES SCAROBROUGH and E. D. MORACE met on January 27, 1968, and discussed the new group of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) that would meet at Natchez, Mississippi, on January 28, 1968. MORACE later said that SCAROBROUGH was interested in the new group and might join, but wanted to wait and see how it developed. MORACE was to report to SCAROBROUGH later on whether or not the new group was worthwhile.

R. J. GLOVER and E. D. MORACE met on January 27, 1968, and discussed the OKKKK unit that was forming at Natchez, Mississippi. GLOVER said he was not sure the unit would be worthwhile and he could not attend the meeting on January 28, 1968, as he was going to Kentwood, Louisiana, to check on his wife. GLOVER said the OKKKK was going to have everything out in the open and nothing would be accomplished.

At the meeting of the OKKKK at Natchez, Mississippi, on January 28, 1968, CHARLES D. SMITH stated JAMES LEE had hurt his back at the mill and could not be at the meeting. According to SMITH, immediately after LEE was hurt, he was put in the hospital, but the FBI had a Negro put in his room. So, LEE got up and put on his clothes and went home.

There was a meeting of the new Klan unit at Natchez, Mississippi, on January 28, 1968, from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., at the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) lodge five miles southeast of Natchez, Mississippi. The head man of the Klan for the whole state was there and this man was ERNEST S. GILBERT, JR., of Jackson, Mississippi. He said he was the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK in Mississippi and passed out literature, which showed his title and showed his address as Post Office Box 22487, Jackson, Mississippi, telephone 362-9561.

Most of the meeting was spent in listening to GILBERT talk. GILBERT said this organization would be active in Mississippi, Arkansas, and Louisiana. He said it was the same organization which ROBERT FULLER, of Monroe, Louisiana, headed and that the men from Louisiana should contact FULLER if they wanted to start a Klan unit and FULLER would come to see them. There was not any explanation of why FULLER called his organization the Original Klans of America (OKA) and GILBERT refers to it as the OKKKK.

GILBERT said a collection is now underway to get groceries for SAM BOWERS, JR., and the other nine men who were recently arrested in Southern Mississippi.

GILBERT said members must not talk about each other, that violence must not be discussed at meetings, that canned goods would be brought to each meeting and would later be passed out to needy families, and that broken toys would be collected and later repaired and passed out at Christmas.

The men seemed to like GILBERT's ideas. GILBERT said they must win through educating the people about

communism and by voting. He said they will build an organization that will stand up and it will still serve to combat mass violence in case such breaks out.

GILBERT said the organization will have emblems for the business places and cars of members, and rings for members. He said nothing will be carried on by the Klan which is illegal and it would not hurt if the FBI attended the meetings.

It was announced that REGGIE CARTER would be the Exalted Cyclops of the local Klavern as he already held a charter for ten members. It was announced that a state-wide meeting would be held in Monroe, Louisiana, on Sunday, February 4, 1968.

A. STATE MEETING:

Source made available a mimeograph sheet of the minutes of the January 14, 1968 state meeting of the OKKKK and these minutes are set out as follows:

Meeting opened and called to order by the Grand Titan-Honorable Jimmy King of Louise, Mississippi.

The Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag by the State Chaplain-Honorable Harold Robertson - of Louisville, Mississippi.

Minutes of the last State Meeting were read and approved by all delegates, the Minutes were read and explained by the Honorable Charles Williams - State Secretary, of Jackson, Mississippi.

State Secretary turned the meeting over to the Grand Dragon-Honorable E. S. Gilbert Jr. of Jackson, Mississippi, who introduced Jack Seale, Klansman of Natchez, Mississippi. Mr. Seale got a standing ovation from all present.

New and important issues were discussed pertaining to new Guide Rules and By Laws, each were thoroughly discussed, understood and Voted on by all Delegates, there was no opposition to any. The new dues cards and the method of paying dues was discussed, understood by all and voted on by all delegates present. There was no opposition.

Available Literature for Educational purposes was discussed, handed out and was agreed that it would be taught in the Klavern Meetings for the coming Month. It was also agreed that the Constitution of the Original Knights of the Ku-Klux-Klan would be studied at least fifteen minutes of each meeting by each Klavern. The pass word for 1968 will be "Unity", the Counter Sign will be "Forever Forward". The word was passed that all the Klans of Mississippi were coming together.

The next State Meeting will be the Eleventh day of February 1968 at the same place, procedures to begin at exactly 12:00 Noon. Only two Chartered Units were absent and it is understood that this was due to very hazardous driving conditions on the State Highways.

The following appointments were made by the Grand Dragons Office and all appointees were introduced, discussed and Voted on by all Delegates present, there was no opposition. 1-Grand Titan-Jimmy King, Louise, Miss. - 2-State Chaplain Harold Robertson, Louisville, Miss. 3-State Secretary-Charles Williams, Jackson Miss. 4- State Treasurer-Billy Means, Popkville, Miss. 5- King Klingle-Jack Seale of Natchez, Miss.

Defense Fund was introduced - opposed by all Delegates. A Unit fund was set up to help needy Klansmen and other people, also Food and Toys are to be brought to Klavern Meetings each week to build a store house for needy people in each Klan Community.

\$400.00 was donated for thirty minutes of Television time for the ORIGINAL KNIGHTS of the Ku-Klux-Klan which is to be refunded as soon as Funds are Available or if the program does not go through.

Cecil Prentiss of Gulfport was appointed as Honorable Master of Ceremonies for the following State Meetings, Motion was made to adjourn, seconded. The Benediction was given by the GRAND DRAGON.

Source also made available a three page memorandum to all Klansmen from ERNEST S. GILBERT, JR. and this memorandum is set out as follows:

To All Klansmen:

Beginning Jan 14 th 1968, The Office of the Grand Dragon Rents Of Mississippi, will be Governed by the E.C.s of all the units in good standing in the State. In other words the E.C.s of all the units in good standing will be a Governing Board - or State board which ever way you wish to put it.

There will be a State meeting the second Sunday of each month, to take care of all the affairs pertaining to the State, all the E.C.s are unanimously urged to attend these meetings to help run the Organization and it's affairs.

The Grand Dragon, E.C.s, and all other Officers and Members will at all times and in all things "Obey to the Constitution And Laws Of The Original Knights Of The Ku-Klux-Klan".

It is already decided that each master will pay \$1.00 per month to the State. It should be decided by the units to set an amount of dues to be paid into the unit treasury's. Not to exceed \$1.50 per month, the units should pay the expense of those going to State meetings, and on other assigned Klan duties, from their unit.

All units are to meet once each week to carry out the affairs and programs set forth. Thirty minutes of each meeting should be devoted to the study of the Constitution and Laws of the Original Knights of the Ku-Klux-Klan. Thirty minutes or more should be devoted to the study of Communism, who they are and how they work to destroy all of us and our Nation, and effective ways planned in your area to prevent and combat the Spread of Communism. Another thirty minutes should be devoted to the study of current events locally, State, and National. This is the duty of the E.C.s and Klansmen's of each unit to provide this for the members, every member of every unit must have a thorough and complete knowledge of what he is a part of, and what it's purpose's and aims are, and a place must be found for each member to fit into the machinery of our Organization. He joined to become a part of something worth while, it is the duty of the unit officers to see that the Organization is effective, and the members active in those things they are best qualified to do.

We must surely know our enemy, who they are and how they operate. "The Communists are Our Enemy" Briefly Their Tactics Are As Follows,

- 1- Divide the citizens of any country, create enough hate among them to start an internal state of Turmoil, Anarchy, and eventual War.
- 2- Create the appearance of popular support of their cause. By fooling the stupid, the uneducated, and the very young people to support them, by gaining control of certain branches of a Nations Government, by gaining control of a Nations Press, T.V., and Radio, also gaining control of the printing of books, magazines, and other important literature that is read by the young and ignorant, To in every way break down patriotic ideals and beliefs, and create panic and confusion.
- 3-To precipitate Mob Violence- By getting ignorant people to demonstrate, loot, burn, and kill, and to defy local law and order, to despise and belittle law enforcement Officers, To create Mobias, if anyone gets hurt or killed to blame it on the law, or some patriotic organization, and in many case's to kill one of their own at the right time, and the right place, for the publicity to further their cause, and to further confuse the people by keeping the truth from them, everything that they do is based on deceit, and lies, and hate, it is a rotten core of a evil.
- 4-To Radicalize the opposition- To get every citizen to believe that any Patriotic is a killer, an extremist, a hate monger or worse, by labeling them as such in news papers, on T.V., on Radio, in books and magazines, and by word of mouth, to turn Patriotic against the law, and turn the law against all Patriotics.
- 5-To create the semblance of a revolution- By getting the ignorant outlaws elements such as dope addicts, hard core criminal killers, and young fools who were improperly brought up- to fight the patriots in open combat, and to get both elements at odds with the law, thus there is a revolution between the people of a Nation while the communist sit back and look their chops and let us destroy each other.

Your State Office Realm Of Mississippi Is In the process of obtaining for you the material necessary for a thorough education on "The Butchers" which is the communist party. From this day forward never refer to the communist as communist, refer to them as butchers, killers, rats, filth, source of evil, or something worse. Never call the Name Communist unless you have to, It gives them too much advertisement.

The following is a list of books that each unit should obtain and teach in the Klavern. It should be done consistently, this is the greatest blow you could ever strike against the "butchers" 1- Masters Of Deceit, By J. Edgar Hoover, 2- The True Story Of Civil Rights, By Allen Stagg, 3- The Web Of Subversion, By James Burnham, 4- The Bondage Of The Free, By Kent R. Steffgen, If you obtain these mentioned books and study them well, and teach them well, the year 1968 will be gone before you finish, but you and your members will have a good education on our enemy and their methods and what many of them are. We can not continue in a hap-hazard fashion and ever expect to be effective against such a powerful and determined force. There will never be a more important time to start to wait any longer will surely be too late.

No Klansman, regardless of rank or position will ever again talk about, or start rumors on another Klansman In the Original Knights Of The Ku-Klux-Klan- together you can bring charges against another member of this organization "In badging" Signed by you and two other members in good standing. He will be tried on the evidence acquired by the State K.B.J. Office, and if found guilty will be punished according to his crime. If he is found innocent - his accusers will be tried for false accusation of another Klansman, and punished accordingly. Any member caught starting rumors- about the Organization, or another member, is automatically banished from the Organization, and his Name will be posted throughout the Klan Nation to all Organizations, we can not fight each other and the enemy too. We are all human and make mistakes, look at all the ones you have made next time before you start on someone else.

Beginning January 14 th 1968, any man who does not carry a paid up dues card in his possession can not be a member of the Original Knights Of The Ku-Klux-Klan-

At the State meeting Jan 14 th 1968 each E.C. will receive the exact same amount of dues cards-as he pays dues on at \$ 1-00 per member for the month of Jan, 1968. In addition he will receive the exact same amount of stamps for Jan 1968, but if a member pays his dues six months in advance, that particular member will receive six stamps, Marked -Jan, Feb, March, April, May, June, or if a member pays his dues twelve months in advance, He will receive twelve stamps, marked for the twelve months of the year. Etc- therefore the E.C.s are responsible for acquiring proper dues cards for their members. Dues will be paid only at State meetings from now on, and dues cards will be issued as only at State meetings from now on, Reme will be sent through the mail.

A member of the Original Knights Of The Ku-Klux-Klan- in good standing is- a gentleman at all times, A man who is proud of Mississippi and America, and what both of them stand for. He is kind and courteous at all times-and in all places. He is neat and clean, inside and outside. He knows when to say something to further our cause, and when to keep his mouth shut. He is never a loud mouth coward or liar. He stand for something wonderful and good, and in his heart he knows it. He smiles at times when he had rather curse or cry. He never argues or picks, but if forced to defend himself he does it with the fury of a lion, and ends it there as a man. He works quietly but consistently with an unheard of determination. He carry's a paid up dues card. He will never be put down by any enemy. This very great man is my blood brother. I will stand by him with my life, he is the last true American left. "Are you One?"

A unit in Good standing in the Original Knights of The Ku-Klux-Klan- Is, a body of these men working together to save our State and Nation( And they will.)

If a member in good standing does not miss a Klareen meeting for 52 consecutive weeks ~~consecutive~~, He will receive a citation from the Grand Dragon And his dues will be paid by the State Office for Three Months.

Every member in Good Standing who brings six new members into his unit- or in any unit in good standing - and if the new members pay their State dues six months in advance, the member responsible for bringing them in will have his dues paid by the State office at the following State meeting for Six Months,

Every member in good standing who brings ten new members into his unit- or ten new men to create a new chartered unit will have his dues paid by the State office at the following State meeting for twelve months.

Every Klansman In good standing, who renders service to his fellow Klansman, or to mankind in general, above and beyond the call of ordinary duty, will receive upon petition from four of his fellow Klansmen-" The Original Klan Rod of Honor- And Shall Be Given A Special Robe that only he and others like him will be allowed to wear. A special State meeting will be called in his Honor, all the other State's will be invited. In all things this office will forever strive to make The Original Knights Of The Ku- Klux- Klan- the most respected, and Honored Patriotic Organization in this entire Nation, Not just to say it is so- Rather it is my duty to do so, first to uphold my oath to you the members, and because it must be done if we are to save ourselves and our Country for our Children.

We will win this fight if we do it as a team- any other way spells defeat, I'm with you all the way- only you and "GOB" know where you stand, Or how long you will stand there.

Now is the Time to find the places and set the dates for your Klan rally next Spring Don't set any before March 15 th 1968 - and don't set any on Sunday, Lets have one on every night somewhere.

ERNEST GILBERT - JACK SEALE:

Source advised that he had learned the following information regarding the travels of ERNEST GILBERT and JACK SEALE:

On the morning of January 23, 1968, JACK SEALE drove from Natchez, Mississippi to Jackson, Mississippi and met with ERNEST GILBERT. These two individuals then drove to Tallulah, Louisiana to meet with ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK in Louisiana. They took FULLER 500 dues cards for the OKKKK. FULLER wants GILBERT to speak at the Louisiana state meeting on February 4, 1968 at 2:00 PM. Source stated he thought the meeting would be in the vicinity of Monroe, Louisiana. Source stated FULLER also wants GILBERT to explain at the state meeting to the Klansmen present how the dues to the organization can be handled at state meetings rather than on an individual basis.

Source stated that ERNEST GILBERT had a discussion with FULLER about GILBERT becoming the Imperial Dragon of the OKKKK which would be over the states of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Source is of the opinion that GILBERT will probably accept this position.

Later in the day SEALE and GILBERT drove to Rolling Fork, Mississippi, where they formed a new Klan unit. From there they drove to the home of JIMMIE KING, who resides in Straight Bayou, Mississippi, however, KING was not at home. From KING'S house they drove to Greenville, Mississippi, where they talked briefly with JOE OUR, who is a member of the Greenville OKKKK unit. After talking to OUR they talked with DR. EVERETT MITCHELL, who is the Exalted Cyclops of the OKKKK unit in Greenville. The conversations with OUR and MITCHELL were about the organizing of the OKKKK.

Source stated he learned that SEALE and GILBERT spent the night of January 23, 1968 in Jackson, Mississippi.

On the morning of January 24, 1968, GILBERT and SEALE drove back to the residence of JIMMIE KING. Source stated that KING has brought four units into the OKKKK from the Delta. KING, SEALE and GILBERT then drove to Greenville, Mississippi and again talked with JOE OUR about organizing this organization. After that discussion all four of these individuals then drove to Clarksdale, Mississippi and formed a new Klan unit. After forming this new unit SEALE and GILBERT returned to Jackson, Mississippi.

Source stated he heard that ERNEST GILBERT and BENNY WALDRUP of Jackson, Mississippi went to see SAM BOWERS in Laurel, Mississippi during the past week. GILBERT wanted to talk to BOWERS about bringing the WKKKKOM into the OKKKK. GILBERT told the source that BOWERS told him that he would talk to the members of the WKKKKOM and determine if they wanted to join the OKKKK. If they did not want to become part of this organization, he assured GILBERT that they would fully cooperate with his organization.

RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER:

Source stated he saw RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER on January 25, 1968 at the Shamrock Motel, Vidalia, Louisiana. GLOVER told the source about leaving the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company plant in his Oldsmobile and about the time he arrived at the AB Motor Company in Natchez, he detected an odor which indicated to him that his automobile was on fire. He stated he parked his automobile there and called the fire department. GLOVER indicated to the source that he did not know the origin of the trouble with his vehicle.

GLOVER told the source about being given a traffic ticket during the past month by a member of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol (MHSP) because he had been driving about 85 miles an hour in a 45 mile per hour zone.

GLOVER asked the source to accompany him to the residence of KENNETH NORMAN HEAD, which he did. GLOVER and HEAD sat around and drank beer and jokingly talked about stealing. The subject of money came up and GLOVER commented that if HEAD and SEALE would accompany him, they would have money in their pockets within one hour. GLOVER did not indicate where they were going to get this money.

OKKKK, ADAMS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI:

Source advised that on January 21, 1968, the following individuals met at the old meeting place of UKA, Unit 719, which is just outside of Natchez:

Source stated that these individuals met in order to talk about organizing the OKKKK in Adams County, Mississippi.

He stated that there would be another meeting of this group of January 28, 1968 at the same meeting site.

JOE DANIEL HAWKINS:

Source advised that JOE DANIEL HAWKINS and his group were now members of the OKKKK. He stated they were also members of the WKKKKOM.

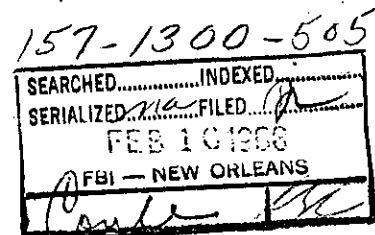

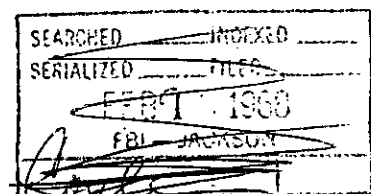

Source was in contact with FERRALL MC CORMICK, SR., on 1/30/68 and determined at that time that MC CORMICK is not actively engaged in activities of the Klan at the present time. This is due to his wife's recent illness wherein she suffered a nervous breakdown. Source stated he feels that MC CORMICK will become more active in the Klan activities as soon as his wife's health improves.

On 1/31/68 source learned that ERNEST GILBERT was in contact with BENNY and CLARA WALDRUP at which time they related to him circumstances surrounding the incident with JOE DANIEL HAWKINS, wherein HAWKINS had a confrontation with FBI Agents in front of his (HAWKINS') house.

Source stated he had learned that W. L. ELLIS from Lexington, Mississippi, was in contact with ERNEST GILBERT at which time ELLIS related that JAMES THORNTON had just left his residence and that THORNTON was still attempting to "bad mouth" ERNEST GILBERT. THORNTON allegedly contacted ELLIS to pick up the UKA Charter from ELLIS.

Source determined that GILBERT was in contact on 2/1/68 with JESSIE EARL GIVENS, 625 Cherokee Street, Brookhaven, Mississippi, at which time GIVENS was made Exalted Cyclops of Lincoln County Unit Number 556 of the OKKKK.

CARL SMITH, Route 1, Box 42, Monticello, Mississippi, was made Exalted Cyclops of Lawrence County Unit 530, which meets at Monticello, Mississippi. WATSON was formerly the Exalted Cyclops of this unit.

Source stated he had determined that ERNEST GILBERT had left Jackson on 2/3/68 en route to Monroe, Louisiana, where he met JACK SEALE at the Travel Lodge. JACK SEALE had two women with him, one being seven months pregnant and the other one the girl friend of JACK SEALE. JIMMY KING from the Delta was also in attendance at this meeting.

Source determined that ROBERT FULLER met the above individuals and during the conversation they discussed finances of the Klan. FULLER stated that information had gotten to him to the effect that the UKA in Louisiana and other individuals were after him. He also stated that information had gotten to some of his members to the effect that since he was in contact with JACK SEALE and ERNEST GILBERT, they intended to start "holy hell" in Louisiana and Mississippi.

Source stated that on Sunday, 2/4/68, JACK SEALE, JIMMY KING, and ERNEST GILBERT attended the State meeting of the OKA of which ROBERT FULLER is Grand Dragon. Source stated that on the way to the meeting, FULLER kept ranting and raving about W. J. KIDD, HOUSTON MORRIS, and others causing him trouble in Louisiana. FULLER stated he believes these individuals are working for the FBI and he continued complaining about how much he has lost financially because of his activities in the Klan and bragged about how secret they were in Louisiana and how they had to stay that way to accomplish their goals.

Source stated there were only about twenty individuals at the first meeting which included four ladies and the representatives from Mississippi. The meeting itself was a bit of confusion, as they did not have any system of order in conducting a meeting. There were no representatives present at this State meeting from the State of Arkansas.

Information was furnished that the State of Arkansas has been captured by the UKA, Inc., of Louisiana, and the OKA of Louisiana is not active in the State of Arkansas.

Source stated the primary purpose of this State meeting and having the Mississippi representatives present was to decide whether or not ERNEST GILBERT of the OKKKK in Mississippi would be elected to the position of Imperial Dragon of the States of Mississippi,



Louisiana, and Arkansas. After discussing the situation with ROBERT FULLER and anticipating the trouble and dissension that FULLER would cause, source stated that ERNEST GILBERT had decided not to even consider taking this position and he would remain as the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK in Mississippi.

ERNEST GILBERT made a talk at this State meeting wherein he explained to the group the system that he is using in forming the OKKKK in Mississippi, explaining to them the way he is handling the dues-paying cards and explaining the bylaws of the OKKKK. During his explanation of these facts, ROBERT FULLER objected to his way of handling it several times during his speech. Source stated he believes this is one reason why GILBERT decided not to accept or pursue the position of Imperial Wizard over the three States.

Source stated that he has determined FERRALL MC CORMICK was formerly the Grand Dragon of the OKA in Mississippi. At the election held at Polkville on 12/7/67, ERNEST GILBERT, who was then the State Kleagle of the UKA, was elected to the position of Grand Dragon replacing MC CORMICK in this position.

ERNEST GILBERT, in his reorganization of this group, named it the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK), which replaces the OKA in Mississippi. Source stated that at this time there is no organization in the State of Mississippi known as the OKA. He further stated that the Mississippi organization is not affiliated with any National group nor are they affiliated with the organization from Louisiana. The Mississippi Klan is an independent self-supporting organization

which hereafter will be known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Source stated he has determined that at present there are approximately two hundred dues-paying members in the OKKKK and this number is increasing every week.

COMMUNITY DEFENSE FORCE (CDF)

There are no meetings scheduled for this group in the near future.

Source made available a pamphlet which will be distributed in all of the small towns by members of the OKKKK. A copy of that pamphlet is attached hereto.

Klansmen present discussed the fact that they had tried to contact JIMMY GRIFFIN to get him to attend the meeting, but they had been unable to contact him.

One discussion concerned the OKA, which is headed by ROBERT FULLER, and Klansmen present expressed their opinions as to whether the OKA is active, and

particularly whether the OKA was active in Arkansas, but from comments made, it was apparent that none of those present knew to what extent the OKA is active at this time.

There were general discussions of the need to increase the membership of the WKKKKOL, and the position of the members of the WKKKKOL in opposition to the proposed school tax to be voted on on February 6, 1968, was discussed.

Nothing else of significance was discussed at the meeting.

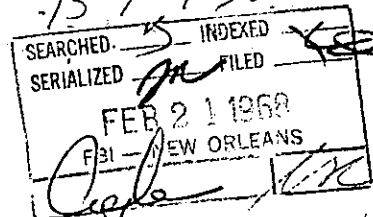

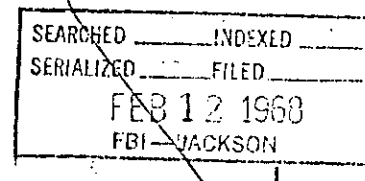

OKKKK, REALM OF MISSISSIPPI:

Source advised that ERNEST GILBERT, Grand Dragon of the OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi; JACK SEALE, and JIMMY KING met with ROBERT FULLER in Monroe, La., on 2/3/68. GILBERT and KING traveled together to this meeting and they met SEALE in Monroe. Source advised that they had a brief discussion with FULLER on 2/3/68 about organizing the OKKKK. They met FULLER again at 12:30 p.m. on 2/4/68 and traveled to a state meeting of FULLER's organization which took place in a new tin building which is located about five miles north of Oak Grove, La. Source stated that mostly those who were invited to the meeting were state officers and titans and he assumed that there were probably 25 to 30 individuals present at the meeting.

Source advised that there was some discussion at this meeting about ERNEST GILBERT taking over as the Imperial Dragon of FULLER's organization, but nothing definite was decided about this change in leadership. Source stated that the OKKKK in Mississippi would have its state meeting on 2/11/68 at Morton, Miss., and officials of FULLER's organization would attend this meeting and further discussion would be hand regarding GILBERT taking over FULLER's organization.

Source stated he understood that HARRY KELLEY, Jackson attorney; and ASA CARTER, both would speak at the 2/11/68 meeting.

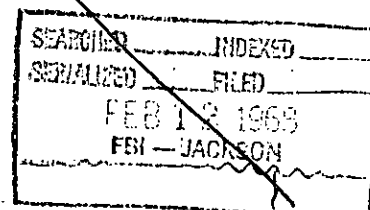
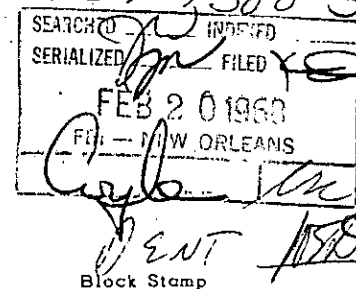

OAK STATE MEETING  
OAK GROVE, LA., 2/4/68

There was an OKA State Meeting on La. Highway 15 about five miles north of Oak Grove, La., on 2/4/68. The meeting began at approximately 2:00 P.M. and terminated about 3:30 P.M. There were approximately 36 individuals present. Five units from Oak Grove were represented, two units from Monroe were represented, and five or six other units were represented from parishes in that area. Source advised that ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of this organization, called on the Exalted Cyclops present at the meeting to brief those present as to what had transpired in their unit since the last meeting. Source advised that the following individuals from Mississippi were present at this meeting:

ERNEST GILBERT, Grand Dragon, OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi;  
MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE, State Kleagle, OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi;  
JIMMY KING, Titan, OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi.

Source advised that GILBERT talked to the group and told them about the OKKKK which was being formed in the State of Mississippi.

Source advised that ROBERT FULLER told him at this time that he is of the opinion that HUSTON MORRIS of Monroe, La., is an informant for the FBI. MORRIS was formerly with the OKKKK in Louisiana and for some period of time he was a member of FULLER's organization.

OKKKK, REALM OF MISSISSIPPI  
STATE MEETING 2/11/68

There is to a state meeting of the OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi, at Morton, Miss., on 2/11/68. Source has heard ASA CARTER, HARRY KELLEY, and possibly JIMMY SWAN, will speak at this state meeting.

JAMES FREDERICK LEE

JAMES FREDERICK LEE visited the source at his residence one night during the past week and told the source that he is contemplating joining the OKKKK, Realm of Mississippi. LEE stated that he is not going to attend any meetings of this group if TOMMY LEE JONES is present. LEE told the source that the first chance he got he is going talk to JONES. Source stated from the tone of LEE's voice, he did not think LEE planned to talk to JONES but probably had in mind of giving him a beating or something worse. Source stated that LEE is of the opinion that JONES has furnished information to the FBI and he wants nothing to do with him.

R ALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER

Source advised that he talked with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER in Natchez, Miss., on the night of 2/6/68. GLOVER and source drove to the home of KENNETH NORMAN HEAD but on arriving there, they learned that he was not home. Source stated GLOVER had been drinking and all he talked about was stealing things. GLOVER stated he wanted to steal some windows to put in his barn. Source pointed out to GLOVER that he did not need windows for a barn but GLOVER indicated that he might need them and then made the statement that it made no difference because the windows belonged to a Negro anyway. GLOVER did not indicate to the source the location of these windows that he wanted to steal.

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP MEETINGS

Source stated he had heard no mention of Silver Dollar Group meetings in the recent past. He stated he was confident that there had been no SDG meetings in the past couple of months.

MEETING OF MONROE OKA UNIT

The Monroe OKA Unit held a regular weekly meeting on the night of 2/8/68, at the home of ROBERT FULLER with eight members present as follows:

The main item of discussion at the meeting centered around the new law adopted in the OKA at the last State Meeting held in Oak Grove, La., on 2/4/68. The new law was discussed by ROBERT FULLER who stated that it has worked out very well in Miss. He explained the law by saying that if a member desires to bring charges against another member, suspecting him of being an informant or for any other reason, then he must have two additional people sign the complaint against the suspected member. After this is done, an investigation will be held and if it is determined that the suspected member is indeed an informant, or if the charges against him are proven to be true, then the suspected member will

be ejected from the OKA. If, however, the charges are proven to be false, then the three members who signed the complaint against the suspected member, will themselves be ejected from the OKA. FULLER explained that this should increase security in the OKA and should reduce idle talk and gossip against other members.

Other discussion at the meeting was led by C. L. COOK, who stated that he had formerly worked as an undercover agent for a Government agency. COOK stated that this training was for a period of ten years and he knows all of the operations of the Federal Government. Source advised that he is certain COOK has never worked as an undercover agent for any Government agency and, to him, it was obvious that COOK was making up a big story trying to impress the younger members of the unit.

The only other item discussed at the meeting centered around the loss of the OKA-sponsored candidate in the race for State Representative in the E. Carroll - W. Carroll Parish area. Some of the reasons for this loss were discussed at the meeting.

On February 4, 1968, the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., (OKA) held its monthly state meeting at the Oak Grove, Louisiana Klavern, located on the property of J. V. JONES. This meeting began at approximately 2 PM and ended about 4:30 PM. There were a total of about 50 klansmen and their wives present.

The meeting was opened with the opening prayer by the Grand Kludd MONTEE BOYTE and then after the opening prayer the meeting was turned over to the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER, who is the Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana. FULLER then recognized all units that were present and the following Louisiana units were represented:

Bastrop OKA Units 1 and 2

Oak Grove Units 1 and 2

Monroe Unit

After the units were recognized, all units paid their dues to the acting State Secretary, who was an unknown person acting in the place of the regular Grand Secretary KENNY EUBANKS, who was absent.

There were three visitors from Mississippi as follows:

ERNEST GILBERT, Grand Dragon of the OKKKK, formerly known as the OKA in Mississippi.

JIMMY KING, from Louise, Mississippi, and

JACK SEALE of Natchez, Mississippi.

It was learned that ROBERT RENFROE is the Deputy Grand Klokand or the body guard for the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER.

It was learned that BOYKIN MC CLAIN is Exalted Cyclops of Oak Grove Unit #2.

When the dues were paid during the meeting it was observed that someone had sent dues for OSCAR ANDERSON of Slidell, Louisiana, although he was not present at the meeting.

After the introduction of all units at the meeting ERNEST GILBERT was introduced by the Grand Dragon ROBERT FULLER as the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK Realm of Mississippi, who gave a brief speech; and GILBERT talked to group and told them of the organizations of the OKKKK being formed in the state of Mississippi and that the Mississippi OKKKK delegation was requesting that someone from the Louisiana OKA attend the State meeting being held in Polkville, Mississippi, on February 11, 1968.

GILBERT also spoke in favor of forming a national organization for the OKKKK in the three states of Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Whenever GILBERT mentioned this the Grand Dragon of Louisiana stated that he would not go along with this thinking at this time. Following GILBERT's talk, the Grand Dragon of Louisiana introduced the Exalted Cyclopes of each unit who gave a brief rundown on each unit's activities since the last meeting.

Those from the Louisiana who gave brief talks were BILL TURNER, who gave a brief talk of the OKA in Louisiana as a whole, W. B. RUSSELL, JR., the Exalted Cyclops of West Carroll Unit #1, E. W. PACE, SR., O.L. DUNCAN of the Bastrop Unit #1, who spoke against any type of violence and that he was against having any women as being KBI members.



It was learned during the meeting from GILBERT that by the end of 1968 he would have a very large organization in Mississippi and that they were going to begin coming out in the open in order to obtain more members, although he was not going to advocate any type of violence whatsoever in his organization in Mississippi.

ROBERT FULLER stated that he was opposed to coming out in the open in Louisiana and therefore he was against this form of obtaining members.

February 15, 1968  
Monroe, Louisiana

On February 6, 1968, the Bastrop Unit of the OKA #1 held a meeting at the residence of LOUIS MC KEE, 404 Garfield Street, Bastrop, Louisiana. This meeting lasted for approximately one hour from 8 PM until about 9 PM and there were six klansmen present. Those present were as follows:

LOUIS MC KEE, who is the Great Titan of Morehouse

A discussion was held on whether the OKA would support having an Imperial Dragon in the OKA in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. No decision was made as to whether the unit would support such a move.

OWEN DUNCAN stated at the meeting that he was apposed to any form of adultery of klansmen in the OKA in Louisiana and that he was proposing that any klansmen in Louisiana caught running around with another klansman's wife, that he would be banished from the OKA.

On February 7, 1968, ROBERT FULLER, the Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana, discussed with OWEN DUNCAN, the King Kleagle of the OKA, about the policies of the OKA

in Louisiana and how to build it into a fine non-violent organization with reputable people. The following points were discussed:

1. Doing away with any forms of adultery and running around with other klansmen's wives. Anyone caught doing any violence by any two members will be tried and banished or sworn out of the OKA. They discussed that they knew there were some people in the OKA that were bad and that they would try to have them banished once their identities were known.
2. Another point discussed was that FULLER stated he was not in favor of coming out in the open as they are doing in Mississippi.

February 15, 1968

On February 11, 1968, three OKA klansmen from the State of Louisiana attended an OKKKK stated meeting at Polkville, Mississippi. Those from Louisiana attending this meeting were:

BILL TURNER of Oak Grove, Louisiana

W. B. RUSSELL, JR., from Oak Grove, Louisiana

OWEN L. DUNCAN from Bastrop, Louisiana, who is sometimes called BILL DUNCAN.

The Louisiana klansmen stopped at the cafe in the center of Polkville to meet Mississippi klansmen who were then directed to the meeting site for the State meeting of the OKKKK. In order to arrive at the meeting site you drive approximately one to two miles south of Polkville, turn left on a gravel road and go to an old church in an area about one half a mile off of the main. It is noted that this church is not painted. Upon arriving at the scene of the meeting place for the state meeting, it was observed that there were approximately 30 klansmen present for the state meeting. Those recognized as being from Mississippi were:

HENRY KELLEY, an attorney from Jackson, Mississippi

ACE CARTER, who was a campaign manager for JOHN

This meeting began at approximately 2 PM and ended around 4 PM. The speakers at this meeting were HENRY KELLEY who gave a brief political speech and stated in order for the klan to obtain its goals, the best way for it to obtain its goals would be through political means. Also ACE CARTER gave a brief talk on how the klan was organized from its beginning to the present date.

ERNEST GILBERT, the Grand Dragon of the OKKKK, gave a speech on how he was forming the OKKKK in Mississippi on a non-violent basis and that in order for it to gain its goals it would have to be through political means and also having a strong organization within the state, whereby it could have some political pull.

ERNEST GILBERT introduced the two representatives from Louisiana BILL TURNER and OWEN DUNCAN, who then expressed their appreciation for being invited to attend the Mississippi State meeting.

WILLIE WEBB of Bastrop, Louisiana, is no longer active in the OKA and was kicked out of the OKA prior to Christmas 1967.

  20. The Miss. G.D. made a trial outling some by-laws that they had adopted in his State. There were some arguments pro & con on these by-laws. The main portion of the meeting was the discussion of whether or not the OKA in La., would associate with a National organization. The belief is that eventually the OKA will associate with a National organization, but a decision was not made at this meeting. It was decided that the OKA will wait 30 days before making a decision on whether to become associated with a National organization.

Prior to the close of the meeting, E. W. PACE made a motion to change the form of the klan robe worn by the OKA. After he made his motion, discussion was held on his motion and this motion was voted down.

During the meeting, MONTEE BOYTE and OWEN DUNCAN gave brief pep talks to those present and encouraged them to build up their units so that the OKA in La., would have a strong political force for the upcoming elections in the State in 5/68.

FULLER stated that he expected to get posters during the coming week and he would assign areas in which the posters are to be displayed. FULLER stated that he does

not expect too much of a problem in getting the incumbents re-elected although he said that BERT ROOT who is running for Finance Commissioner may draw a large following and would probably be the toughest competition. FULLER said for the men to come to next week's meeting prepared to go out and put up posters. No other Klan business was discussed other than a brief discussion on the failure of the recent sales tax to go through. FULLER said that he had been getting calls from irate teachers blaming the Klan for helping to defeat the sales tax. After drinking coffee for about 30 minutes, the meeting then broke up.

MONROE OKA UNIT MEETING

The Monroe OKA Unit held a regular weekly meeting on the night of March 14, 1968, at the garage in West Monroe owned by C. L. COOK. Those present were as follows:

The principal item of discussion which was led by ROBERT FULLER concerned ways the unit could help in the re-election campaign of Monroe Mayor JACK HOWARD and his two Commissioners without letting the public know that the Klan was supporting the Mayor. It was discussed that since the Klan has been having such poor success in backing political candidates that it would be better for the Klan not to openly support the



Mayor since the open support might be more of a hindrance. FULLER stated that he did not yet get the posters for the candidates but said that he would distribute them as soon as he got them to the members and would advise each member of what sector he would have in which to display the posters. FULLER stated that there was a large Negro vote in Monroe and they could expect that the Negroes would support the Mayor so it was necessary that the Negroes not know of the Klan also supporting the Mayor. Those members present seemed to agree with FULLER's ideas and no one spoke of supporting either of the other candidates.

FULLER displayed a photo of a huge Klan rally in Washington in 1925 and said that the Klan in Georgia had sold these as post cards and had made quite a lot of money out of the sale and he was considering ordering some for sale in Louisiana.

No other Klan business was discussed and the meeting broke up after about 45 minutes.

7. Distribution of leaflets and posters for the political candidates supported by the unit.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that the meetings on October 19, 1967, December 28, 1967, January 4, 1968, and February 15, 1968, were held at the home of ROBERT FULLER.

These sources advised that the format for the state meetings is that each Exalted Cyclops or Great Titan from a particular area will give a report on conditions in their areas. Other topics generally discussed at these meetings include discussion of various political candidates and which candidate should be supported by the OKA. Following are some of the other items of discussion at the meetings:

1. Discussion on whether voting in the OKA should be one vote per unit or one vote per man. This topic was not resolved.
2. Contributions were requested to build a defense fund for two former OKA klansmen who were indicted for murder in Tallulah, Louisiana.
3. Discussion on fact that drinking of alcoholic beverages would be outlawed at public rallies and at all OKA meetings.
4. Discussion on religious beliefs to be considered in initiating new members.
5. Discussion on bylaws and a measure designed to increase security which stated that any member making a complaint on informant charges against another member required the signature on a complaint of two other members. If the charges proved to be true then the suspected member would be expelled from the OKA and if the charges were false then the three members who signed the complaint would be expelled from the OKA.

NO T-1, NO T-2, and NO T-4 all advised that ROBERT FULLER was unanimously nominated to serve as Grand Dragon for one more year without any opposition at the April 1, 1967 state meeting in Monroe, Louisiana.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that at the January 7, 1968 meeting at Oak Grove, Louisiana, ROBERT FULLER was named as Grand Dragon for another year and there was no opposition to his candidacy.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that ROBERT FULLER attended meetings of Oak Grove OKA Unit #2 on the following dates:

The sources advised that these meetings were held at the Oak Grove, Louisiana, klavern and at the June 1, 1967 and October 12, 1967 meetings ROBERT FULLER gave a speech to the members on the hottest political topics of the day. At the June 1, 1967 meeting FULLER spoke in favor of the proposed sales tax for Northeast Louisiana and explained the benefits of the sales tax to the members present. At the October 12, 1967 meeting, the wives of members were present and FULLER gave a talk on the pro's and con's of the various candidates in the state elections in Louisiana and told the members which candidates he thought they should support. FULLER counseled the members to seek an appointment with their congressman in order to present their views against the development of a Negro subdivision in Oak Grove. At the January 16, 1968 meeting the principal item of business was the election of the new officers in the unit.

BASTROP, LOUISIANA, OKA UNIT

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that FULLER attended the February 20, 1967, March 13, 1967, April 10, 1967, June 1, 1967, July 31, 1967, December 26, 1967, and February 28, 1968 meetings of the Bastrop, Louisiana, OKA Unit. Sources advised that the reason for FULLER attending these meetings was as a political adviser and that he assisted them in establishing and building the Bastrop Unit. NO T-1 advised that the February 20, 1967 meeting, ROBERT FULLER told the unit that the OKA in Louisiana was not to have anything further to do with the Mississippi OKA klan inasmuch as that group had been taking action without first conferring it with the Louisiana OKA. Among a group

of Louisiana klansmen who attended the January 22, 1967 Arkansas OKA State meeting. At this meeting the Grand officers for the Arkansas OKA for the coming year were elected.

On January 27, 1967, NO T-2 advised that ROBERT FULLER had traveled to Wisner, Louisiana, and had met with klansmen in that town and attempted to interest them in forming a unit in Wisner for the OKA.

NO T-1, NO T-2, and NO T-4 all advised that FULLER was among a group of Louisiana klansmen who attended the Arkansas State OKA meeting held at Conway, Arkansas, on February 26, 1967. At this meeting a new Great Titan for Arkansas was elected and integration of schools in Arkansas was the main topic of discussion.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised on March 22, 1967, that FULLER had attended a meeting in Madison Parish, Louisiana, on March 15, 1967 at the home of AARON HEBERT. This was supposed to have been a Madison Parish OKA Unit meeting, but visitors came to HEBERT's house and no meeting was held as a result. On March 28, 1967, NO T-1 and NO T-4 advised that FULLER was among a group of Louisiana klansmen who attended an OKA fish fry held at Strong, Arkansas. The sources advised no klan business was discussed at the fish fry.

NO T-1, NO T-2, and NO T-4 advised on May 4, 1967 that FULLER was among a group of Louisiana klansmen who had attended the April 30, 1967 Arkansas state meeting. At this meeting, the present state officers of the OKA in the state of Arkansas were renamed for another year in office.

NO T-2 and NO T-5 advised that ROBERT FULLER was among a group of spectators at a public klan rally at Columbia, Mississippi, on May 12, 1967. The sources advised that FULLER in his speech urged that the klan try to build up the strength and he urged block voting by Conservatives.

On June 10, 1967, NO T-4 and on June 19, 1967 NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that FULLER had attended a public OKA sponsored rally at a drive-in theater at El Dorado, Arkansas on the night of June 10, 1967. The sources advised that FULLER gave a brief talk in which he said that the OKA was a non-violent organization and would pursue goals of segregation in a non-violent manner.

NO T-1 advised on August 28, 1967 that FULLER had gone to Strong, Arkansas on August 23, 1967 with other Louisiana klansmen and had met with Arkansas klan leaders in order to expell an OKA member in Arkansas who had been speaking in favor of violence.

NO T-2 advised on September 1, 1967 that FULLER had attended the August 24, 1967 OKA meeting in Monroe, Louisiana, at the Monroe klavern, at which time a formal klan swearing in ceremony was held for all new OKA members who had come into the OKA in the last six months.

NO T-1 advised on September 7, 1967, that FULLER had attended the September 2, 1967 public rally sponsored by the OKA held at Oak Grove, Louisiana.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that ROBERT FULLER had attended the January 25, 1968 of Oak Grove OKA Units #1 and #2 and that the purpose of this meeting was to pass out new OKA membership cards.

A P P E N D I XORIGINAL KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC.  
(LOUISIANA) (OKA)

Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December of 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a result, a split in the OKKKK occurred. Houston Morris and Robert Fuller led the split and formed the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that Houston Morris and Robert Fuller formed the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc. (OKA) after splitting away from the OKKKK in December of 1964. The second source advised that the OKA has the same general purposes as the OKKKK; that is, the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and the maintaining of segregation.

The second source also advised that Robert Fuller assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the OKA in February of 1965, after Houston Morris left the organization. The second source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside of the State of Louisiana.

This second source advised on September 1, 1967, that the aims and purposes of the OKA remain the same with the exception that the OKA now has four Klan units chartered in Arkansas, and the Arkansas Klan units are under the leadership of Robert Fuller who continues to hold the position of the Grand Dragon of the OKA in Louisiana.

3. Discussion on fact that drinking of alcoholic beverages would be outlawed at public rallies and at all OKA meetings.
4. Discussion on religious beliefs to be considered in initiating new members.
5. Discussion on bylaws and a measure designed to increase security which stated that any member making a complaint on informant charges against another member required the signature on a complaint of two other members. If the charges proved to be true then the suspected member would be expelled from the OKA and if the charges were false then the three members who signed the complaint would be expelled from the OKA.

NO T-1, NO T-2, and NO T-4 all advised that ROBERT FULLER was unanimously nominated to serve as Grand Dragon for one more year without any opposition at the April 1, 1967 state meeting in Monroe, Louisiana.

NO T-1 and NO T-2 advised that at the January 7, 1968 meeting at Oak Grove, Louisiana, ROBERT FULLER was named as Grand Dragon for another year and there was no opposition to his candidacy.

At the October 12, 1967 meeting, the wives of members were present and FULLER gave a talk on the pro's and con's of the various candidates in the state elections in Louisiana and told the members which candidates he thought they should support. FULLER counseled the members to seek an appointment with their congressman in order to present their views against the development of a Negro subdivision in Oak Grove. At the January 16, 1968 meeting the principal item of business was the election of the new officers in the unit.

BASTROP, LOUISIANA, OKA UNIT

NO T-1, NO T-2, and NO T-4 all advised that FULLER was among a group of Louisiana klansmen who attended the Arkansas State OKA meeting held at Conway, Arkansas, on February 26, 1967. At this meeting a new Great Titan for Arkansas was elected and integration of schools in Arkansas was the main topic of discussion.

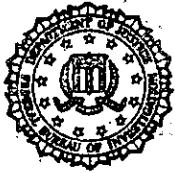

The principal purpose of the meeting was to decide on a place and time for a public Klan rally to be sponsored by the two units and to be held in April. Also discussed were names of possible speakers and it was decided that ERNIE GILBERT of Mississippi, whose name was mentioned by LOUIS BLACK,

was too controversial and he would not be invited to speak. The tentative date set was for Saturday night April 27, 1968 but this was referred to the property committee to make sure that they could get a location for that night. It was decided to wait two weeks to give the property committee time to make final arrangements and then get a firm place and time and have some posters printed up. ROBERT FULLER stated that he could probably get the posters printed up at the Delhi, Louisiana Dispatch office as the editor there has done Klan work in the past and will probly give the group the best price. Also discussed were the best locations to publicize the rally and a three man committee was named for publicity purposes. FULLER said that he would make a report in two weeks to the units on what speakers would be available.

No other Klan business was discussed and the remainder of the meeting was a general bull session on racial matters throughout the country.

The principal item of discussion centered around what could be done to help the Oak Grove Unit in their plans for a public rally at Oak Grove in April. ROBERT FULLER stated that

he would make the printing arrangements with a printer in Delhi, Louisiana after the date and site were firm and then the Unit could assist in putting up the leaflets announcing the rally. He stated that he hoped to get posters for the campaign of Mayor HOWARD in Monroe also and if they could get them then the Unit could put up both at the same time although FULLER cautioned the members that it would not be wise to put up the two near each other so that HOWARD would not get publicly associated with the Klan. A vote was taken to see if the Unit backed the Monroe City administration and it was unanimous that all members were in favor of re-electing the present administration. No other klan business was discussed and after a brief bull session the meeting was adjourned.
