He stated that they are for a "Christian Civilization" and so is the KKK. That they are bitterly opposed against the Communists and so is the KKK. He stated that they will kill Communists, and although he is not a "bloodthirsty man" he might be in favor of killing Communists. He did state that the ANP is a bloodthirsty organization and that they "are full of vengeance", and according to BOWERS "WENGEANCE IS MINE SAITH THE LORD".


This expenditure has never been authorized by the board and I would appreciate your useing the enclosed return envelope to advise whether you are in favor of this expenditure or not.

He advised that BOUTWELL lives in Jackson and allegedly has some type of job with the Government, either state or Federal. BOUTWELL's relatives live in Wesson and he comes down to Wesson quite frequently.

Informant advised that he had learned that GARLAND WHITE was the leader of the Brookhaven unit of the WKKKK and that WHITE has some type of connection with a man named W.D. HAYNES who lives in Danny's Trailer Court on Highway 51 about two miles north of Brookhaven, Mississippi. W.D. HAYNES is a relative of Curtis Davis' wife and is a heavy equipment operator.

Informant advised that he had learned that C.R. BEARD and SAM CASE who reside at Heucks Retreat, Lincoln County, Mississippi, were Klansmen

Informant also learned that JOHN BERRY, the son of ED BERRY, the banker in Wesson, had brought the special Presidential edition of "The Klan Ledger" down to Wesson from Jackson for distribution in Wesson. Informant advised that ED BERRY, SR., the banker, knows his son brought this literature down from Jackson. Informant stated that ED BERRY, SR., was upset when the literature about CURTIS DAVIS and DR. FRIEDMAN was distributed in Wesson as he did not want his son, JOHN, to be blamed for this distribution. Informant advised that ED BERRY, SR., is a rabid segregationist but he did not know if he was a Klansman. Informant advised that JOHN BERRY has a brother named ED BERRY, JR., who lives in Jackson and works for the Bruce Furniture Polish Company. ED BERRY, JR., is not in agreement with his father or brother JOHN. ÷., ,

Informant advised that BOBBY BRITT, the brother-in-law of JAMES A. ASHLEY, and a relative of CURTIS DAVIS, knew beforehand about the literature in connection with CURTIS DAVIS and the fact that it would be distributed in Wesson, Mississippi.

Informant advised that RAY "Dago" SANDERS tried to recruit an individual named J.T. MYERS into the Klan. He advised that MYERS works at the Cablevision plant in Brookhaven and lives in Wesson. He advised that MYERS refused to join.

Informant also advised that W.B. CARLISLE, the night Marshal at Wesson, had received some harassing phone calls after last week's interview by FBI Agents at Wesson.

Informant also advised that the following incident occurred at Wesson about three or four months ago:

Copiah County Deputy Sheriff L.J. WEEKS was riding in his car in the area of Co-Lin College. His son L.J. WEEKS, JR., was with him. They noticed a cross burning on the campus of Co-Lin College and they also noticed a pick-up truck pulling away from where the cross was burning. Weeks and his son chased the pick-up truck and informant had heard that some shots were exchanged but the pick-up truck got away.

A few days later a man in a 1959 green Oldsmobile with a Louisiana tag stopped MARVIN WEEKS in Wesson and told him that his father better stop chasing the Klan. Informant advised nothing had happened to WEEKS since this incident.

On this same date it was reported that ROSS WEATHERS and LAWLER SHARP would attend a state meeting of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), to be held on May 2, 1965, in Perry or Jones County. It was reported that ROSS and LAWLER would leave at 4:00 a.m. to attend the meeting.

There was some indication that this information might have been reported to see if anyone would be found observing the residences of ROSS WEATHERS and LAWLER SHARP at that hour of the day, to trace any leaks in the Klan.

WHITE has told me that he has recently taken CARL WOODWARD, who operates an auto body shop on South Market Street, and R. W. POE, who is employed by NOLAN SMITH, into the Klan. They have not been to a meeting so far as I know and will presumably be sworn in at a meeting later.

I was back in Biloxi, Mississippi and rechecked the location of the meeting which took place there recently. I was wrong in reporting that it was off Cowan Road. It was in a wooded area on a sand road going west from Popps Ferry Road in Biloxi near the Back Bay.

On April 4, 1965 I stopped at the restaurant at Sharps Truck Stop in Gautier. I saw FRANK HERNDON there. He said he operates this place now. We talked about the Klan and his getting in at Pascagoula. He said the FBI is watching him too closely and he cannot be active now.

I have received the impression that all members of the WKKKKOM are dissatisfied with the organization and that none are actively participating in the Should any further attempts be made to organization. reactivate the WKKKKOM it is felt that the organizers would have a difficult time because the individual members, although not changing their beliefs, have begun to believe that an organization of this type can only cause harm to the individual members in that when some radicals take over, the actions of these radicals do not speak for the feeling of the entire group and also the fact that so many people are talking to the FBI, that they are afraid that even casual participation would cause deep involvement in an FBI investigation.

KEMPER COUNTY KLAVERN

During my active participation in the Klan, I had no knowledge of a Klavern in the Kemper County, and with the knowledge that RANDOLPH PICKETT was an active Klansman and because of this was removed from his active participation in the Miss. National Guard, I did not hear any other information concerning any activities or membership in this Klavern. 💀

UKA, INC.

I have recently learned that both WAYNE ROBERTS and LEE ROBERTS are actively campaigning to recruit members into the UKA, I learned that WAYNE ROBERTS approached HURBERT ODOM at his place of business and I was present and overheard LEE ROBERTS attempting to pursuade several individuals including myself to actively join in the UKA operations in the NW 35233 DocId: 34274209 Page 37 ROBERTS gave the impression that

the organization was beginning to find itself in this area and that members of the White Knights were being attempted to be swayed over to UKA.

CHARLES BARFIELD

I know CHARLES BARFIELD to be personally involved in the WKKKKOM and at one time was considered an honorable member but because of a drinking problem and a violent temper accompanying this, the membership felt that BARFIELD was too dangerous to be included in plans or supplied with information.

DEWITT SMITH

At the time of my active participation in the WKKKKOM, SMITH was the secretary-treasurer of the Lauderdale County Klavern.

DOCTOR E. B. ROBINSON

Doctor ROBINSON was obligated into the WKKKKOM at the same time that I was and although he attended several meetings, his main purpose was to furnish the Klan with any information of pertinent that he might receive as a private individual or as a professional man.

A. L. LONG

LONG is not known to me personally but I recall conversation at several Klan meetings that they were planning to obligate LONG into the WKKKKOM and there was a great deal of joking about it because they mentioned that LONG was the father of State Representative BETTY LONG and that although he was at first

reluctant to join, they felt that they may have a step in the right direction concerning the state legislature should LONG become a strong member. I do not know how involved LONG became in the activities of the WKKKKOM.

LAUDERDALE COUNTY KLAN MEMBERS

CONVERSATION WITH B. L. AKIN AND BILLY BIRDSONG

On May 3, 1965, source advised that on Saturday, April 30, 1965, he telephonically contacted B. L. AKIN to notify AKIN of a proposed meeting of the Lauderdale County group of the United Klans of America, Inc., at which time AKIN told source to give him about 30 minutes time and for source to then come to his office at AKIN Trailer Sales, Tom Bailey Drive, Meridian, Mississippi. Source said that after a lapse of about 30 minutes, he drove out to AKIN's office and when he walked in, BILLY BIRDSONG was there talking with AKIN. Source said that he immediately confronted BIRDSONG with information to the effect that BIRDSONG has stated on several occasions that source was responsible for the beating received recently by BIRDSONG. BIRDSONG immediately went on the defensive by saying that he had never made such comments and what he had actually said was that assailant had some characteristics which were similar to source. Source said that after a lengthy and heated argument, BIRDSONG offered to shake hands with source but Source related that BIRDSONG then admitted source refused. that he had been to see officials of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol at Jackson, Mississippi at that agency's request and merely answered questions that were asked of BIRDSONG said that he did offer his services to that him. agency in order to help them get SAM BOWERS of Laurel, Mississippi, WALLACE MILLER of Meridian, Mississippi, and JIM JORDAN, who has confessed to the FBI in connection with the civil rights slaying case at Philadelphia, Mississippi.

Source said that after conversing with BIRDSONG, he asked B. L. AKIN if he could talk with him alone in another room. AKIN agreed and source asked AKIN if he was coming to the meeting of the United Klans of America, Inc. on May 1, 1965 and AKIN said that he would attend with other klansmen from his group and would meet source at the Spot Restaurant in Meridian at 3:30 p.m. on May 1, 1965.

SMALL GATHERING OF UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA AT MERIDIAN, MISSISSIPPI

On May 3, 1965 source advised that on May 1, 1965, B. L. AKIN did not meet him at the prearranged place on that date and neither did Preacher DELMAR DENNIS show up as agreed. Source said as he was leaving the Spot Restaurant, with AUSTIN McCRARY in the car with him, they happened to pass TOMMY HORNE, also of Meridian, on the street and flagged HORNE down. HORNE, McCARY and source then drove to the home of W. S. TORRANCE and the only ones present at that residence were TORRANCE and CECIL KILLEN.

Source said that the five of them then had a short meeting and the only things discussed were prompt payment of dues and the fact that the FBI was now concentrating on breaking up the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (WKKKK) to put SAM BOWERS out of business.

TOMMY HORNE

TOMMY HORNE commented to source on May 1, 1965 that he was going to Birmingham, Alabama on May 3, or May 4, 1965 to take a plumbing job in that city. HORNE commented that he would return to Meridian, Mississippi on the weekends. HORNE told source that the Exalted Cyclops, DELMAR DENNIS, wanted to see source.

LEE ROBERTS

Source said that on May 1, 1965, in the late afternoon, he stopped by the home of LEE ROBERTS and had dinner with ROBERTS and ROBERTS' family. He related that he only had idle conversation with ROBERTS.

GATHERING OF UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA AT NATCHEZ, MISSISSIPPI ON MAY 2, 1965

Source said that on May 2, 1965, he left Meridian, Mississippi at about 9:00 a.m. with AUSTIN McCARY in source's car en route to the gathering of the United Klans of America. Inc. Source said that he and McCARY arrived at the ball park in Natchez at about 1:30 p.m. as the festivities were just getting underway. He said that he listened to a couple of speeches and talked briefly with E. L. McDANIEL of Natchez. Source said that McDANIEL appeared pleased that source had come to Natchez and told source that he wanted source to be thinking about some arrangements for a possible klan rally in Meridian, Mississippi at some future date whereby Mr. SHELTON would preside over the rally. E. L. McDANIEL further related to source that he was going to send about six hooded klansmen to Meridian. Mississippi to walk up and down the streets of Meridian clad in hoods and robes, but he would let source know when to expect these men. McDANIEL also told source that he, McDANIEL, was going to be busy and tied up for about the next two weeks, however, in about two weeks, he was going to hold a State Meeting of the United Klans of America, Inc. of Mississippi whereby state officers would be elected.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. BLACK LIST

On May 10, 1965, source advised that at the request of W. S. TORRANCE, Exalted Cyclops, Lauderdale Klavern, United Klans of America, Inc., he was obliged to assist in preparation of a so called black list of persons and establishments in the Meridian, Mississippi area who have in the past exhibited a moderate approach to the current racial problems in the area. Source said that he is not aware of any overt racial activity on the part of any persons, whose names were included in the list.

> Source said that on the evening of May 8, 1965, he went to the home of LEE ROBERTS, Patrolman, Meridian, Mississippi Police Department, and collaborated with ROBERTS and ROBERTS' wife in an effort to prepare the "Black List." Source said that he contributed some of the names for the list, ROBERTS contributed some and ROBERTS' wife suggested others. Source said that the list was typed on a typewriter belonging to ROBERTS. Source then went to the home of DELMAR DENNIS, Exalted Cyclops of the Underground Unit of the United Klans of America, Inc., and borrowed a mimeograph machine to run off a sufficient number of copies of the list to distribute around the City of Meridian, Mississippi. He said that he then took the mimeograph machine and the stencil of the black list to the home of AUSTIN McCARY, another member of the Lauderdale Klavern, and at McCARY's home, they ran off numerous copies of the black list.

Source said that on Sunday evening, May 9, 1965, he got together with AUSTIN McCARY, and HAROLD CRENSHAW, at which time they drove all over the City of Meridian distributing the list in the doorways of various business establishments.

B. L. AKIN

Source advised that W. S. TORRANCE indicated to him on May 8, 1965 that the Meridian men in the Lauderdale Klavern, should get together and banish B. L. AKIN from membership in the United Klans of America, Inc. because of his association with BILLY BIRDSONG.

MAYOR HENRY BURNS, MERIDIAN, MISSISSIPPI

Source said that he has learned through general conversations among klan members that if Mayor HENRY BURNS

of Meridian, Mississippi was re-elected to office, then the klan was going to see to the fact that SAM KELLER, Sergeant on the Meridian Police Department, was appointed Chief of Police. ٩.

May 12, 1965 Pascagoula, Mississippi

The man who has called himself NEWMAN called May 10, and said there was to be an important meeting Tuesday night, May 11, 1965 at the home of B. L. WHITE in Gautier.

TINY FRAZIER showed up at the meeting with JOE TURNER and LEE MCINTOSH, a man who is from Laurel, but is now living in Pascagoula and working at the shipyard. Present at the meeting were also W. E. SNOWDEN, Mr. LACEY, B. L. WHITE, the man known as NEWMAN and ERNEST J. PITTMAN, who lives at 1101 - 11th Street in Pascagoula.

NEWMAN advised us that his real name is VINCENT PURSER. He is from Gulfport, Mississippi. He said he had invited ERNEST J. PITTMAN on the recommendation of Mr. CROW of Picayune. I don't know CROW.

TINY FRAZIER told Mr. LACEY that he had investigated JOE TURNER and LEE McINTOSH. LACEY asked PITTMAN to leave the room then he had all the others raise their hands and take the oath. PURSER read the constitution. He then told all those present that Mr. LACEY is from Laurel and that he is Grand Dragon of the Klan. I am not sure whether Mr. LACEY is MARVIN LACEY of Gulfport or not.

We discussed the selection of a full slate of officers. B. L. WHITE is the Exalted Cyclops. LEE McINTOSH will be the Sergeant at Arms. He has training in Judo and agreed to teach Judo to other Klan members.

Mr. LACEY told TINY FRAZIER that he had been recommended for the office of Province Giant. FRAZIER agreed to accept this office.

· ~ .

WHITE's wife was not at home and she was expected at about 9:00 p.m. WHITE wanted everyone to leave before she arrived. The meeting didn't last more than an hour and was finished before 9:00 p.m.

It was decided that the next meeting would be held in a trailer located behind the Hideaway Lounge on Telephone Road which is operated by W. E. SNOWDEN.

It looks like TOM THRASHER is really out of the Klan. He was invited to this meeting and refused to go.

WHITE and LACEY said that they have information that Negroes are going to attempt a wade-in on the beach at Pascagoula this coming Sunday. They urged all the members to go to the beach and to take car license numbers and otherwise identify persons participating in this wade-in. They said that Klan members were not to touch these people at the beach and were not to take any weapons with them to the beach.

Both LACEY and WHITE said they would be unable to be in Pascagoula Sunday. PURSER said he would be there.

I have received no information indicating that there are any plans for the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (WKKKK) to associate itself with any other Klan group except on a cooperative basis to achieve specific ends from time to time as the need may arise.

B. L. WHITE is supposed to be an Assistant Manager of General Building Supply Company at Gulfport.

Klavern Meeting, 5/17/65 at Pascagoula, Miss.

At about 7:30 PM, 5/17/65 I attended a meeting of the WKKKOM, Pascagoula Klavern. The meeting was held in a trailer house behind the Hide Away Lounge on Telephone Road in ^Pascagoula. There was an election of Officers and "Tiny" FRAZIER was elected Assistant E.C., LEE MCINTOSH was elected Treasurer, JOE TURNER was elected Master At Arms, FRANKIE LARSON and JAMES BALIUS were elected rear guards. B.L. WHITE is E.C.

Several other new members were voted on for admission to the Klan, but I did not get their names. "Tiny" FRAZIER, in addition to being Assistant E.C. of the Pascagoula Klavern is supposed to be made Floating Kleagle by the State Organization, that means he can go anywhere in the State and recruit new members. The Klan treasury has \$26.00 in it and during the last two meetings about \$100 has been collected by the E.C. for the defence fund for the persons indicted in the Civil Rights murders in Neshoba County, M.ss.

A decision was made to burn numerous crosses in the Pascagoula area at midnight some night during the week of 5/23/65, details are to be developed at a later meeting.

WHITE said that the Klan has a "contact" man at the Columbia, Miss. National Guard Armony, and a burglary of the Armory was discussed. McINTOSH was mentioned as the person to pull the burglary, but he refused to do it until he had a chance to see the set up. WHITE said they needed guns and ammunition, and burglarizing the Armory was the best way to get it. WHITE said he would make arrangements for McINTOSH to look the Armory over. WHITE also said that LOUIS DE SALVO is selling guns, which could be purchased by Klansmen. Some of the members are considering buying guns.

The next scheduled meeting is for Monday, 5/24/65 at the VCM Club in Pascagoula. About 12 new members, all of whom work at Ingall's Shipyard are to be initiated. I do not have their names yet.

VINCENT PURSER and BILL SNOWDEN also attended the meeting.

At the above meetings a collection was taken up for the survivors of Klansman REESE BRACY, now deceased. The only business dealt with a discussion about a white man and white woman who were committing adultery (names not recalled).

The Varnell Klavern of the WKKKKOM met on April 19, 1965, at the Packwood House, south of Packwood Lake, south of REESE BRACEY's Store, and the following were in attendance:

ALVIN RANDALL and ALTON RIMES did most of the talking and the discussion was about Bogalusa, Louisiana, and the fact that Klansmen in the southern part of Walthall County, and the southern part of Marion County, had joined in with the Bogalusa Klansmen.

On May 12, 1965, RUFUS MIDDLETON, Wesson, Mississippi, furnished the following information to SA THOMAS E. O'CONNOR:

He advised that he is the former Mayor of Wesson, Mississippi. He stated that he was a former member of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) in Mississippi in 1920 but in 1921 he left this organization.

He advised that though he has no direct information, the following citizens of Wesson, Mississippi are rumored to be members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (WKKKK):

had been driving around the area of Wesson, Mississippi, and he had an accident with his car. He advised that the Wise Motor Company of Hazlehurst, Mississippi, was called and they came out to EARLS' car and towed it in. He felt that EARLS possibly had something to do with the distribution of this Klan type literature on that night.

He advised that an individual named KENNETH McCLENDON of Hazlehurst, Mississippi, was a former policeman in Wesson. He advised that McCLENDON had been invited to join the WKKKK but had declined the invitation. He stated that McCLENDON has some Klan type literature which he felt might have come from the automobile of GEORGE EARLS on the night that it was towed in by the Wise Motor Company. He advised that McCLENDON would be cooperative toward the FBI and that he might have some information in regards to the WKKKK in either Hazlehurst or Wesson, Mississippi.

He also stated that JAMES ASHLEY, who runs the Ashley Supermarket of Wesson, has a mimeograph machine. He stated that he did not know if the Klan type literature which was distributed on the night of May 1, 1965 had been printed on ASHLEY's mimeograph machine, but he advised that he would try to obtain some sample pieces of paper which had been printed on ASHLEY's machine.

He advised that the following might be the possible source of trouble between CURTIS DAVIS and the other townspeople of Wesson, Mississippi:

He advised that an individual named WILMER NEWMAN, who is rumored to be in the Klan, used to spend a lot of time around DAVIS' Shell Service Station in Wesson. He stated that he had heard that NEWMAN used to tell any customers who would come into DAVIS' Shell Station for mechanical work to go to his brother, JOHN NEWMAN, who is a mechanic, rather than bring JN 157-1985

their automobiles into DAVIS' Station. He stated that DAVIS heard about this and that DAVIS then told NEWMAN to quit hanging around the service station. He advised that after this happened, DAVIS began to have his problems.

He advised that a waitress who works in the Wesson Cafe, which is the only cafe in Wesson, named DOT PICKETT, might be the possible source of the rumor that MIDDLETON's wife was contributing to the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). He advised that PICKETT is friendly with the ASHLEY brothers and other members of their association. He advised that this group thought he might seek re-election as mayor of Wesson, and he felt that they started the rumor about his wife contributing to the NAACP in order to downgrade his name in the community. He advised that there was no truth to this rumor.

BILLY RUFFIN

BILLY RUFFIN is evidently still holding meetings of the auxiliary police in Philadelphia, Mississippi. On one occasion during the week of May 10, 1965, RUFFIN commented to source that source had been missed at the last meeting of the auxiliary police.

Source said that on one occasion in the late summer of 1964, BILLY RUFFIN called the auxiliary police together at a meeting in Philadelphia, Miss., at which time he made an announcement to the group that all auxiliary police would parade in line through the colored section of Philadelphia to show the colored people the strength of the auxiliary police. Source said that about 15 to 20 cars joined in the parade as requested by RUFFIN. RUFFIN also stated that the parade would serve to harass the colored people and the FBI if the FBI was around to observe.

POSSIBLE KIAN MEETING AT PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI, ON EVENING OF MAY 11, 1965

Source said that he was on the street of downtown Philadelphia, Miss., on the evening of May 11, 1965, and observed BOB HOWELL on the Courthouse square steps standing around as if he were waiting for someone. Source then observed PETE JORDAN drive by at about the same time with another individual in the car as if they were beginning to gather for a klan meeting. Source said that he also observed LELAND KINAORE in the area at about the same time. Source said that in view of the fact all of the persons mentioned above are known to him as klansmen, then he assumed that they were gathering for a klan meeting.

SHERIFF LAWRENCE RAINEY

Source said that he has recently seen Sheriff LAWRENCE RAINEY conversing with CLAYNON LEWIS and CLYDE PARKER. He said that in view of the fact they are all known klansmen, he assumes they were probably discussing klan business.

FOTA(h) (C) FOÌA(b)(7)

Source said that at about the time or shortly after RAINEY was arrested by the PRT, RAINEY was commenting to source about EDGAR RAY WILLEN'S Incern over who to hire as his attorney in the civil rights slaying case and was apparently pestering RAINEY over the matter. RAINEY commented to source "KAU IN is going to get us all in the pen if he doesn't settle form with his attorney."

BILLY WAYNE POSFY

Source said that through his observations in the recent past, he has note t that there appears to be a very close association between DEWKY SMARRE and BILLY WAYNE POSEY.

Source advised that during a conversation with BILLY WAYNE POSEY during the week of May 10, 1965, POSEY advised source that a for a worker recently drove into POSEY's Phillins to service station at which time POSEY waited on him, not knowing that he was a COFO worker. POSEY said that after he had to viced the COFO worker's car, the man presented believe him very mode that he had already serviced the man's car before knowing that he was a COFO worker.

POSEY further related to source that he knew of a COFO worker who recently accessed in downtown Philadelphia, Miss., barefooted and wearing a goatee. This COFO worker supposedly asked some person on the street what a person could do in Philadelphia for recreation in his spare time. POSEY commented that it was his understanding that someone took that man and pulled his goatee out with wire pliers. POSEY also commented that the COFO worker was supposedly from South Carolina.

Source said that he drove past the Adelphia Motel just outside of Philadelphia in an attempt to verify the fact that persons from South Carolina were possibly in the area. Source said that he observed two cars at that motel bearing South Carolina license, however, he did not make a note of the license numbers.

Source said that it is rumored in the Philadelphia, Miss., area that BILLY WAYNE POSEY has been having marital troubles and it is felt that POSEY's wife has possibly been unfaithful to POSEY. He said that it has also been rumored that POSEY and his wife have been attending some wild drinking parties in the Meridian, Miss., area.

> UNKNOWN MAN FROM CRYSTAL SPRINGS, MISS., BELIEVED TO BE A BROTHER-IN-LAW OF BILLY WAYNE POSEY

Source said that he had previously reported an incident about a trip that he, POSEY, JERRY SHARPE, and an unknown man from Crystal Springs, Miss., made to \ Louisville, Miss., to contact the owner of the Rebel -Restaurant relative to organizing a klan klavern in that area. Source said that he now recalls that while en route to Louisville, the man from Crystal Springs commented about how frightened he was at the time of his first participation in an act of violence where there was bloodshed. He also spoke of how sick it made him to dispose of the bloody clothes after this first crime was committed. Source said that he could recall no other details of the conversation but described the man from Crystal Springs as a white male, about 35 years of age, 200 pounds, and a brother-in-law of BILLY WAYNE POSEY. Source said that he seems to recall that this man was supposed to have been the Imperial Wizard or some other klan official in Crystal Springs, Mississippi.

KLAN LEADERS IN PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI AREA

Source said that the core of the klan in the Philadelphia, Miss., area appears to center around the following persons, who are all known to him and are friendly with him:

> BILLY WAYNE POSEY JERRY SHARPE PETE JORDAN CLYDE PARKER

Source also commented that SHARPE appears to be the "daredevil" of the group in that he will do most anything on a dare from other persons.

J. E. WATKINS

Source said that he now recalls J. E. WATKINS of Philadelphia, Miss., as having been present at one of the Neshoba Klavern Klan meetings in the past; however, he cannot recall which meeting he recalls having seen WATKINS.

FNU KENNEDY

Source advised that he recalls also that one (FNU) KENNEDY, a Mississippi State Tax man, was in attendance at one of the Neshoba Klavern Klan meetings. He stated that as best as he can recall, KENNEDY's appearance was probably at the Bloomo School Cymnasium just outside of Philadelphia, Miss.

> RICHARD TINSLEY, COFO WORKER, PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI

Source advised that a Mrs. HERRING, wife of the jailer at Philadelphia, commented recently that a white girl came to the jail at Philadelphia to visit the colored

COFO worker being held in that jail on a felonious shooting of another COFO worker charge. Mrs. HERRING commented that the white girl will never get into the jail to visit that man.

DEFENSE FUNDS FOR THE CIVIL RIGHTS SLAYING DEFENDANTS

Source said that BILLY WAYNE POSEY recently commented that the men who had promised money for the civil rights slaying defendants had now refused to contribute and this made POSEY very upset. Source said this statement, to him, meant that the klan had not come up with the money they had promised.

Source said that through general conversations with klansmen in the Philadelphia, Miss., area he has come to the conclusion that the Neshoba County Defense Fund has not been doing too well.

DEPUTY SHERIFF CECIL PRICE

Source said that he has heard rumors in the Philadelphia, Miss., area in the past that CECIL PRICE has had a girl friend, name unknown, from somewhere in the Philadelphia, Miss., area.

RICHARD ANDREW WILLIS

Source said that he recalls that in about September, 1964, RICHARD ANDREW WILLIS told source that if he ever heard of anybody talking, he would personally put a bullet through the head of the person who did the talking. Source said that he took this statement to concern anyone who talked to authorities concerning the civil rights slaying case, even though WILLIS did not directly mention that case.

KLAN ACTIVITY, COLUMBUS, MISSISSIPPI

Source said that during his short stay in Columbus, Miss., he has received no indication of any klan type organization in that area.

MAID OF REVEREND HOWARD L. BENSON, PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI

Source advised that he had recently learned through Reverend HOWARD L. BENSON, 435 Columbus Avenue, Philadelphia, Miss., that BENSON's maid knew something about the whipping of the Negroes at the Mt. Zion Church, which church was burned prior to the slaying of the three civil rights workers in Neshoba County.

CHIEF BILL RICHARDSON, PHILADELPHIA, MISSISSIPPI

Source advised that Chief of Police BILL RICHARDSON, Philadelphia, Miss., was very instrumental in getting the auxiliary police started in Philadelphia. He said that he does not know how RICHARDSON feels about that organization at the present time.

JERRY SHARPE


Source said that during his trips to the Philadelphia, Miss., area, he has noticed a close association between JERRY SHARPE and BILLY WAYNE POSEY.

LAWRENCE RAINEY

On 5/12/65, source advised that he had recently talked with AUSTIN MC CARY and while in the presence of MC CARY, he heard MC CARY ask Patrolman LEE ROBERTS of the Meridian Police Department as to how well ROBERTS knew Sheriff LAWRENCE RAINEY of Philadelphia, Miss. MC CARY said that his reason for asking was because of the fact that E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Miss., wants to meet with RAINEY in an effort to get the Neshoba Klavern of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) into the United Klans of America, Inc. ROBERTS commented that he knew RAINEY quite well.

Source said that AUSTIN MC CARY has been working in Natchez, Miss., and has been conversing on occasion with E. L. MC DANIEL.

LEE ROBERTS AND ALTON WAYNE ROBERTS

Source said that W. S. TORRANCE told him recently that LEE ROBERTS, Patrolman on the Meridian, Miss., Police Department, was obligated as a secret member of the United Klans of America (UKA) on Saturday night at the home of W. S. TORRANCE in Meridian, Miss.

On 5/24/65, source said that the information he previously received from W. S. TORRANCE concerning LEE ROBERTS¹ secret membership in the UKA was apparently a misunderstanding since he was talking with ROBERTS on Saturday, 5/22/65, at which time ROBERTS said that he and his brother, ALTON WAYNE ROBERTS, were not yet members of the UKA, but would probably be sworn in on Sunday, 5/23/65, as secret members, at the home of W. S. TORRANCE.

JACK JONES AND LEE ROBERTS

Source advised on 5/13/65 that on a Saturday night, believed to be 5/12/65, he saw LEE ROBERTS and JACK JONES at the home of W. S. TORRANCE in Meridian, Miss., and he assumed at the time that JACK JONES was also obligated as a member of the UKA, Inc., since there was some klan conversations carried on in the presence of JONES. Source said that he recalls JONES commenting that the klan in the Meridian area needed a bazooka and spoke of how effective a bazooka could be for distance. LEE ROBERTS then spoke up and said that he thought he might be able to get a bazooka from some member of the Hinds County Klavern.

UKA, INC. MEMBERSHIP IN MERIDIAN, MISS.

On 5/19/65, source said that W. S. TORRANCE commented to him that as of Friday night, 5/14/65, he had collected dues from 22 persons who have been obligated as members of the United Klan in Meridian.

TEN MEN FROM LAUDERDALE KLAVERN TO BE TROUBLE SHOOTERS

On 5/13/65, AUSTIN MC CARY told source that E. L. MC DANIEL had told MC CARY that he wanted the Lauderdale Klavern to try to line up about 10 men who could be used as trouble shooters and who could go from Lauderdale County into other areas of the state in the event of trouble in those areas.

E. L. MC DANIEL COMMENTS CONCERNING FBI INTERVIEWS

Source said on 5/13/65, that he recalled that in a recent conversation he had with E. L. MC DANIEL, that MC DANIEL commented that he had been interviewed by FBI Agents on several occasions in the past and that on each occasion he had agreed to the interview without hesitation. MC DANIEL said that he has now made up his mind to refuse to submit to interview by Agents in the future.

FNU PEEBLES

Source said that on 5/15/65, he learned that FNU PEEBLES was possibly sworn in recently as a member of the UKA, 'Inc. by W. S. TORRANCE. Source said that PEEBLES works for the General Box Co. in Meridian, Miss.,

and lives at Suqualena, Miss. PEEBLES supposedly drives a white Falcon automobile and lives in the house right where one would turn left off Route 19 at Suqualena.

W. L. HOWINGTON

Source said on 5/13/65 that he had heard through W. S. TORRANCE that W. L. HOWINGTON was recently obligated as a member of the Lauderdale Klavern of the UKA, Inc. Source said that he did not know where HOWINGTON lives or works.

CLARENCE DEARMAN

Source advised on 5/13/65, that in a recent conversation with CLARENCE DEARMAN, DEARMAN commented that he had received information to the effect that there were supposedly two men who work at the Flintkote Company in Meridian, Miss., who are on the FBI payroll.

Source stated on 5/19/65 that on 5/15/65 he approached DEARMAN about the whereabouts of the dynamite DEARMAN supposedly has buried and whether or not DEARMAN wanted any help in disposing of the dynamite. DEARMAN stated that he did not want to handle the dynamite and that he wanted to leave it where it is now buried.

W. C. SIMS

On 5/13/65, W. S. TORRANCE told source that he' was going to obligate W. C. SIMS' unit of the WKKKKOM into the UKA, Inc., at sometime in the near future.

On 5/19/65, W. S. TORRANCE told source that he was going to obligate W. C. SIMS' unit into the UKA, Inc., on Saturday night, 5/22/65.

On 5/24/65, TORRANCE advised source that SIMS[®] unit was not obligated into the UKA, Inc., on 5/22/65 as was planned.

WAYNE ROBERTS

On 5/19/65, source said that he had talked with WAYNE ROBERTS on either 5/15 or 5/16/65, at which time ROBERTS commented that he had recently talked with Sheriff LAWRENCE RAINEY of Philadelphia, Miss., and RAINEY said that he had been contacted by the UKA and RAINEY spoke as if the Neshoba Klavern of the WKKKKOM was going to switch from the WKKKKOM and join the UKA.

Source said that while talking with WAYNE ROBERTS, the subject of the Mt. Zion Church burning case came up and in connection with that church burning, ROBERTS said "BILLY BIRDSONG jumped the niggers without authority."

ROBERTS, on the same occasion, commented to source that sometime ago, he went to B. L. AKINS Trailer Sales Company warehouse and after arriving at that warehouse, he noticed that BILLY BIRDSONG was already there. ROBERTS said that while talking with AKIN and BIRDSONG, BIRDSONG commented about the fact that WAYNE ROBERTS pulled the trigger on the two white men and ROBERTS said that this statement on the part of BIRDSONG made him mad and he really "chewed BIRDSONG out."

AUSTIN MC CARY

Source said on 5/21/65 that AUSTIN MC CARY was at that time in Meridian, Miss., and had been for several days. MC CARY was supposedly working as of 5/21/65 on some construction project at St. Joseph Hospital in Meridian.

E. L. MC DANIEL AND LAWRENCE RAINEY

On 5/24/65, source advised that W. S. TORRANCE had told him on 5/22/65, that E. L. MC DANIEL went to see LAWRENCE RAINEY sometime during the week prior to 5/24/65 about getting the Neshoba Klavern of the WKKKKOM into the UKA, Inc. TORRANCE said that he felt that the contact was favorable and that the Neshoba group would join the UKA, Inc.

MARCH OF ROBED KLANSMEN AT MERIDIAN

*****, , , ,

W. S. TORRANCE told source on 5/22/65 that he had talked with E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Miss., and that the robed march of klansmen was not to occur until such time as the UKA, INC, could arrange for a klan rally at Meridian. TORRANCE said that such a rally had not yet been arranged; however, after such arrangements are made and ROBERT SHELTON is set up as the main speaker, then the robed klansmen will be designated to march up and down the streets of Meridian on the same date. TORRANCE said he would notify source as soon as any rally arrangements have been set up.

UNITED KLAN CALLING CARDS

On 5/22/65, W. S. TORRANCE gave source about 6 or 8 calling cards, which cards TORRANCE supposedly obtained from E. L. MC DANIEL with instructions to distribute the cards in the Meridian area by leaving them under a coffee cup in restaurants. The calling card, on the front, reads as follows: "You have been patronized by a member of the United Klans of American, Inc. Knights of the KKK. Anyone interested in affiliation with above organization write to; Post Office Box 1341, Natchez." On the back of the card, the following information appears "The only reason you are white today is because your ancestors believed in practicing segregation."

JULIUS HARPER CALL TO ROBERT SHELTON

On 5/24/65, source said that he had received information from W. S. TORRANCE to the effect that on Sunday, 5/16/65, ROBERT SHELTON, while visiting in Natchez, Miss., received a telephone call from JULIUS HARPER at Crystal Springs, Miss. HARPER, according to W. S. TORRANCE, was supposed to have said that he realizes that the WKKKKOM is all "busted" and that HARPER and all of his followers want to join forces with the United Klans of America, Inc.

NEWTON, MISSISSIPPI KLANSMEN

Source advised that both JOHN SHARP HENRY and KEITH HENRY of Newton, Miss., are unknown to him.

McINTOSH is not sure exactly where the meeting is to be held, he thinks it is to be in Jackson, Miss., but it might not be. He is to take B. LINDSEY WHITE, VINCENT PURSER and another man from Biloxi whose name I do not recall.

He belonged to a Klan group in North Louisiana in the 1920s but this group disbanded shortly after he joined.

He does not know anything about the White Christian Protective and Legal DGanse Fund. He denied ever receiving a request from anyone to appear on television and radio on behalf of the subjects arrested in connection with the slaying of the three Civil Rights workers during June, 1964.

He was advised by SA BENJAMIN F. GRAVES that he could consult with an attorney prior to furnishing any information.

He was exhibited a copy of a leaflet which had been distributed in and around Wesson on the morning of May 1, 1965, which was captioned "CITIZENS OF WESSON" and the first paragraph read, "We, the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi, are a Christian organization, dedicated to work against evil of integration and communism".

ASHLEY advised that he had read the leaflet but he had no information to who caused this leaflet to be circulated and he did not know the identity of those who circulated the leaflets.

ASHLEY advised that he was not a member of the klan and he had never been a member of the klan. He stated he had been approached by an individual from Brookhaven, Mississippi, to join the klan about a year ago. He refused to identify the individual who approached him to join the klan.

ASHLEY advised that he is a substitute mail carrier for the Wesson, Mississippi, Post Office. He stated he operates a dairy and a washateria and he stated he had no time to devote to organizations such as the klan.

Hattiesburg, Miss. May 19, 1965

May 17, 1965, the Trailways Bus left the parking lot on corner of East Peire and Market St. at 5:20 p.m., Hattiesburg, Miss., and went straight to the colesium in Jackson where the meeting was opened by the WILLIAM J. SEISAMORE, Administrator for State Citizens Council, who acted as master of ceremonies. Where different officials were introduced, among them was Lt. Gov. CARROLL GORTIN, Attorney General JOE T. PATTERSON, Commissioner of Agriculture CORLEY, and State Senator GEORGE YARBROUGH from Red Banks. Also former Gov. HUGH WHITE. Sheriff JESS CLARK from Selma was introduced, and received a standing ovation from the crowd.

Then ROSS BARNETT was introduced and after making a short speech in regard to Gov. WALLACE, he introduced WALLACE, who opened his remarks in regard to the National press and news media, for being unfair to the South in regard to the reporting of the news. Then he went on to the school situation and that the public health and education was going to cause chaos in the South, trying to push to fast. Told about the feeling on the Civil Rights Bill cooling down some since the trouble in the East. And after this summer it would be about 50 - 50.

Talked about the students having the demonstrations on the campuses of several colleges in regard to the Viet-Nam war. He said if that was tried in Alabama they would be expelled because they would be commiting sabotage against the United States of America that the people of Alabama still loved their country even if they had been slapped on the wrist for things they did not deserve. The reactions from the people were mixed, most of the racket was made on the left side of the speaker where the people from Bogalusa, Greenwood, and Millsapps College were seated.

The conversation going up on the bus, was mostly in regard to this summer and trying to get at least 400 marchers for Citizens Council in Forrest County. So they could get around the seg of the schools. The arrangements for the trip were handled by Mr. HAMILTON and that is who the money was paid to. The fare was \$3.54 plus dinner at Dennery's after the speaking - According to a statement made there was approximately 15 members of the right church on the bus (KKK). I believe I picked about all of the men that went. 1. LAWLER SHARP, 2. JOHN MANBERG, 3. ACE WEATHERS, 4. Mr. ROGERS who operates Pine Sol, 6. Mr. KETRELL who is mechanic, 7. LEE MYRICK and 8. his brother 9. Mr. LEE who works for Komp Equipment Co. very large. 10. Mr. PRESCOTT, 11. Mr. HAMILTON and 12. son, 13. Mr. WALLACE? I.C. Freight Office.

They have decided on a bus to go to Natchez on June 5 for a rally over there, and expect people from Louisiana, Alabama, Arkansas, Mississippi, Georgia, Tennessee. This will be on Saturday afternoon. Other people seen at Jackson were Mr. and Mrs. BEN GAMELL of 4th St. Mr. and Mrs. SAUL (plumber), Dr. and Mrs. BYRUM, Dr. SMITH (makes balloons and antiseptics). Mrs. NAN FRANCES, a Mrs. HERRINGTON and Mrs. LEE MYRICK, and another Mrs. MYRICK. Understand quite a few others were there but did not know them. The Mr. FARMER you was asking about who belongs to <u>Church</u> lost a leg, he is a logger. Also a Mr. FOSHER from Lamar County works for Gulf Refining Co.

They are taking the members in the church (KKK) now five at a time. and if their names leak out they are dropped so they won't know any more of the members until they have been tested. Otherwise they are really trying to find leak.

SUBJECT: WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSI PPI (WKKKKOM) RM

Investigator JOE PRICE (NA), Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, Gulfport, Mississippi, a native of Pearl River County, Mississippi, advised on 5/20/65 that from recent inquiries he has made of what he believes to be reliable sources, it appears that the Ku Klux Klan in Pearl River County, Mississippi is at least inactive at the present time, and may very well be disbanded.

Mr. DOYIE HOLLIDAY, Chief Criminal Deputy Sheriff, Washington Parish, Bogalusa, Louisiana, contacted on another matter 6/4/65 at Bogalusa, advised that he has reliable Klan sources in the Bogalusa area, located only a fewmiles west of the Crossroads community in Pearl Riger County, Mississippi. HOLLIDAY advised that according to his sources, the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (MKKKKEM)X of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) in Pearl River County, Mississippi has become virtually inactive, and there is no indication that any of the se individuals has participated in recent racial violence in the Bogalusa area.

HOLLIDAY advised that he would be alert in contact with his sources, and immediately advise on receipt of any information indicating activity on the part of any Pearl River County Klan group.

RECOMMENDATION: For info and file. The above info substantially corroborates info from to the effect that the Klan in Pearl River County (WKKKKOM) is now virtually non-existent, and has not partic pated in recent racial violence in Bogalusa, Louisiana area, believed to have been precipated by the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, or possibly by the National States Rights Party (membership card of this organization found in possession of ERNEST RAP HAEL MC ELVEEN, suspect in shooting of deputy sheriff at Bogalusa, Louisiana in JN File 44-1084).

FOIA(b)(7) - (D)advised W. C. DOLLAHITE at Gulfport, Mississippi, told him recently that he read in the newspapers where the FBI had revealed knowledge of the fact that SAM BOWERS is the "top man of the White Knights" (WKKKKOM). DOLLARHITE expressed the belief that if the FBI knows who the top men in the klan are in Mississippi, that it will in all probability be impossible for the klan to function effectively. DOLLARHITE said he had not been to any meetings at Gulfport and that the only activity he knew at Gulfport at the present time was the fact that VINCENT PURSER has been going to meetings at Pascagoula, Mississippi, and that PURSER recently went to a demonstration by whites at Bogalusa, Louisiana in protest of Negro demonstrations at Bogalusa to implement integration of public facilities there. DOLLARHITE did not indicate whether anyone went with PURSER or not, but informant expressed the belief that MARVIN LACY probably accompanied PURSER, inasmuch as it is informant's belief that PURSER and LACY at the present time constitute probably the entire active klan in the Gulfport area.

Informant advised that he heard that one HOLLIMAN, a member of the Gulfport Klavern and operator of a grocery store north of Gulfport, had not only resigned from the klan, but had left the Mississippi Gulf Coast area, his present whereabouts being unknown.

Informant advised he had no information whatever concerning this theft and further had no reason to believe that the klan in the Gulfport area at the present time has any explosives.

Informant advised that he has been in contact with VINCENT PURSER and MARVIN LACY on several occasions recently and had renewed his interest in reaffiliating with the Klan in the Gulfport area. He stated that both PURSER and LACY have indicated they are continuing efforts to revive the Klan but have stated to informant that interest is lagging and that the group is inactive at the present time. Informant is of the opinion that this is probably true.

RE BUFORD POSEY

Informant was alerted to the fact BUFORD POSEY reportedly will arrive in the Gulfport, Mississippi area on 5/19/65 for an estimated stay of one week's time. Informant recalls in the summer of 1964 having seen POSEY depicted on television in the course of interview of POSEY by newsmen in Neshoba County, Mississippi, concerning the death of three civil rights workers. Informant has never seen POSEY, was not aware that he had any relatives in the Gulfport area, and stated he has never heard any members of the Klan (WKKKKOM) in the Gulfport area indicate any interest in POSEY one way or another.

SAM BOWERS AND E. L. MC DANIELS

Source advised that he has informed BOWERS and MC DANIELS that he has returned from his trip to South Carolina and that he is ready to assume any and all klan assigned tasks.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.

Source advised that he has received a personal invitation from MC DANIELS to attend a meeting of the United Klans Of America (UKA), Inc. to be held in Natchez, Mississippi, on May 15, 1965. Source indicated that he would attend the gathering on the 14th and 15th, however, due to previous commitment, it would be necessary for him to leave Natchez on the evening of the 15th. However, the source feels that he can adequately cover this meeting. Also the source indicated that W. S. TORRANCE would be in attendance and in all probability his brother, DEXTER TORRANCE, both active United Klansmen in the Meridian, Mississippi, area.

WAYNE ROBERTS

Source repeated that ROBERTS did not effect any rendezvous with SAM BOWERS during the early part of May, 1965. ROBERTS has many pressing problems at hime. He is unable to get a job and is living off of 'hand outs" from B. L. AKIN. Source indicated that his wife is the breadwinner in the family - she works as a nurse at a local hospital. The source indicated that he feels that ROBERTS is not too interested in the activities of the klan and is disquested due to his inability to secure steady employment. He blames the FBI for this because they let it be known that he was dishonorably discharged from the U. S. Marine Corps.

TOMMY HORNE

HORNE secured a "tear gas bomb" which in reality is a "rat and mice poison" device consisting of a glass jar in a can and when the two different contents in the containers mixed together they exude a caustic fume which is supposed to eliminate rats and mice. This device, common to the exterminating and pest control men, was secured according to the source from ED FRASIER, a local politician and professional exterminator. HORNE related that he has given this device to W. S. TORRANCE and there was talk that he was going to release it in one of the restaurants in the Meridian area which complied with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, regarding the Public Accommodations Section.

DEXTER TORRANCE

Source advised that TORRANCE picked up a mimeograph machine from him about 9:30 p.m. on May 9, 1965, and stated that he had compiled a "black list" and was going to run it off and effect distribution throughout Meridian, Mississippi. Source advised that TORRANCE had three men in the car with him when he came by to pick up the machine. (He could not identify these men)

JERRY BARFIELD

BARFIELD was in telephonic contact with the source and stated that he would be by to see the source later in the week.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.

The following is a letter received from E. L. MC DANIEL Grand Dragon, UKA, Inc., addressed to all "E. C." (Exalted Cyclops). This letter was received from the source on May 10, 1965, and is as follows:

> "P. O. Box 1341 "Natchez, Miss. "May 4, 1965

"To A11 E.C.:"

"It seems that you have forgotten to notify the State office of the number of persons who are planning to attend our State Klonvocation. This is of most importance that every Klansman who is not working or sick be present.

"Please forward by return mail the number of members in your Unit that is coming. I have to notify the Hotel in order that preparations can be made.

"Bro. Matt Murphy, Imperial Klan attorney, will be our guest speaker at the banquet. Everyone should hear him.

"If you are not present and laws are passed which you do not go along with, you can blame only yourself. I sincerely hope we have a good turn-out because we have to elect officers.

"See you May 15th and 16th at the Eola Hotel in Natchez, Miss.

Sometime during the night of 6/8 and early morning of 6/9/65, copies of "the Klan Ledger" for April, 1965 were distributed in Vicksburg, Mississippi. This was a Special Presidential Edition and written as if sent to President Johnson, Washington, D.C. With the Klan Ledger was a reproduction of the front page of the "Vicksburg Citizens' Appeal" May 24, 1965 issue dealing with the 800 Negro vote which reportedly decided close results in local primary election in Vicksburg, Mississippi.

In the middle of the reverse page of the Klan Ledger there appears the sentence, "You, Mr. JOHNSON, now stand in a very great and real danger of both body and soul".

Additional interviews are contemplated with Klan members, and persons suspected of being Klan members, when SA WILSON returns to Vicksburg from special assignment in Alabama.

How know this, yet you seek to smear the Christian Klansmen overywhere in one stroke, in typical communist fashion. And you are the one that is accusing us of tar and feathers !!!! Why do you always pounce upon the Christian Klan at every opportunity, Mr. Johnson? Is it because the atheistic communists who own and control you have CREENED yo to persecute and destroy us? Is it because you and they know that no atheistic enery of America is safe while we live? Is it because that, like all agents "'of Satan, you abhor and despise a Christian witness for Jesus Christ?



Non-Influential Votes

Now that few registered Negroes in Vicksburg have had their say about who is to serve in the city government for the next four years,

it is time to ask: how much did their 800 votes do to influence the course these newly-elected officials will follow?

The honest answer is 'not much.' And the reason is simple. No white man can represent the interests of Negroes - not even of those who can be pursuaded to vote for him. We saw some plain talk written down shortly before the election that goes to prove this point. The candidates, addressing the Women for Constitutional Government, all went on record as being against two things they ought, if they represented Negroes, to be for.

URBAN RENEWAL AND SEGREGATED SCHOOL SYSTEM

Urban renewal is badly needed in this decaying town, where more and more Negroes are being forced out of their homes to make way for bigger roads. But all our prospective aldermen were against it 100%. The city's segregated school system would be laughable if Negro children were not the subjects of the joke. Still, the candidates for tax assessor figured we could all tighten our belts some--white and black alike--and support to the end the system's good two tone uniformity against the Federal government's integration rulings.

In this case, as always, the winners were the white people of Vicksburg. The Negroes were the losers as usual.

There is a difference between having voice in the city government and having a voice in choosing the people who will govern your city. This time, some Negroes had the second; but this time like all the times before, no Negro had the first. At the rate politics are going in Vicksburg, on both sides of the tracks, it may be well past next election by the time that first voice is heard

EARLS advised that he would have talked to the Agents on May 5, 1965, when they contacted him on the street in Wesson, but he was working at the time and had to terminate the interview.

EARLS advised that he knows nothing about the leaflets which had been distributed in and around Wesson on May 1, 1965. He stated he first saw one of the leaflets about 10:00 to 10:30 a.m. on the morning of May 1, 1965, when he made a grocery delivery to a local customer. EARLS denied that he had circulated any of these leaflets.

EARLS advised that about 7:15 p.m. on April 30, 1965, he picked up his girl friend, DIANA MC GREW, who resides in Enterprise, Mississippi, and he stated he took her home about 11:00 p.m. that night. He stated that after he took his girl friend home he checked on some set hooks which he had set out in his brother RANDOLPH EARLS' pond. He stated his brother resides about five to seven miles out of Wesson. He stated that he talked to his brother and sister-in-law while he was at the pond. He stated that he was at the pond from about 12:15 a.m. to 2:40 a.m. on the morning of May 1, 1965. He stated that as he was driving to his home in Wesson he fell asleep and drove into the ditch at the residence of WILKINS BARLOW, who resides a couple of miles Northeast of Wesson.

EARLS advised that following the accident he walked into Wesson and awoke EDWARD ASHLEY. He stated that he and ASHLEY were on ASHLEY's porch when JIMMY HODGES and JOHN BLACK.

CURTIS DAVIS, owner, Shell Service Station, Wesson, Mississippi, was contacted at his place of business and he furnished the following information after he was advised as to the identities of the Agents and that any information he furnished could be used in a court of law:

He was shown a leaflet captioned "CITIZENS OF WESSON" which contained the following excerpt, "We, the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Miss. are a Christian organization, dedicated to work against the evils of integration and communism".

"It was brought to light a few months back that the manager of the Shell Service Station in Wesson, Curtis Davis, was having an affair with a Nigger women. At that time he was given a warning, but apparently he paid no attention. Since that warning he has continued his activities with the NIGGER woman. Do you think any man like this could have any morals? We don't! This man is unworthy of having a business establishment in Wesson. We think that all decent upright citizens of this county should refrain from trading with this establishment."

DAVIS was asked if he knew about the leaflet and if he bal any information as to the identity of the individuals who might have circulated this leaflet in the Wesson area.

DAVIS advised that a copy of this leaflet was brought to his attention abour 8:30 a.m. on May 1, 1965, by ANDREW HARTLY, the Day Marshal of Wesson. He stated that HARTLY brought a copy of the leaflet to his service station. He stated that de of the leaflets had been located at his residence which is Route 2, Box 297, Wesson, later in the day on May 1, 1965.

Re advised that he had heard that JAMES ASHLEY and his brothers, EDWAED and BILLY, are members of the klan. He stated that EDWARD and BILLY work in JAMES ASHLEY's Supermarket in Wesson.

DAVIS advised that he had heard that GEORGE EARLS, who works in Ashley's Supermarket, wrecked his automobile in the early morning hours of May 1, 1965, on the Beauregard Road leading from Wesson to Beauregard, Mississippi. He surmised that EARLS' accident occurred about the time that the leaflets supposedly were being circulated.

DAVIS advised that RUTH GLASPER, a Negro murse, mentioned in the leaflet, is the sister of ROBERT CLAY, a Negro employee of his who works at his station. He stated RUTH GLASPER is a customer of his at the service station. He denied having any relationship with GLASPER except that between a customer and a service station operator.

DAVIS advised that one night in August, 1964, he received a telephone call at his residence, from an unknown individual, advising him that a Mr. SMITH, who he did not know, was stranded out of Wesson and was in need of gasoline for his automobile. DAVIS advised that he took gasoline to the location which had been given him and on arriving at the location five hooded individuals beat him into unconsciousness. He stated one individual seemed to be the spokesman for the group and that individual held a shotgun on him before he was advised to lie on the ground and they began beating him. He stated he thought he recognized this individual's voice as being that of THOMAS EARL HENNINGTON, a 23-year-old son of a local restaurant owner.

He advised that the only automobile he recalls seeing at the scene was a black Falcon. He advised the only black Falcon in Wesson is owned by JOHN RICE, the owner of Rice's Cafe, which is located North of Wesson on Highway 51.

SAM SAVELL was interviewed at his residence located on Tank Road approximately three miles east of Terry, Mississippi. He was advised that he did not have to make a statement, that any statement he made could be used against him in a court of law, that he had the right to an attorney and that no force, threats or promises would be made to him to induce him to furnish any information. He advised as follows:

There was a meeting at his house during March 1965, which was attended by about 20 men.

These men were strangers to him and he did not ask them who they were.

He did not know if they were Klansmen.

He did not know what went on at the meeting.

He is not a member of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan and has never been asked to join.

He does not know any members of this organization.

KKK activity, Walthall County - informant stated he believes the Klan in Walthall County is about nonexistent along with the Klan in Lawrence County;

A.C. HERRINGTON - informant stated that he had received information that HERRINGTON is the Kleagle at Large for the southern half of the State of 'Mississippi;

LOUIS COWART - informant stated that LOUIS COWART as far as he can determine is still in Louisiana living at a fishing camp. He stated COWART is afraid to come back to Brookhaven, Miss., because he ran away with some of the Klan's money not too long ago. Informant stated that subject's wife lives on Highway 84 west out of Brookhaven approximately six miles past New Prospect Church;

V. RAY SMITH - informant stated that V. RAY SMITH still associates with known Klan members such as ALDO RAY MOAK and GEORGE EARL WINBORNE. Informant stated V. RAY SMITH runs a Cities Service Gas Station across the street from the courthouse in Brookhaven, Miss.

LLOYD CASE - informant stated that approximately two weeks ago LLOYD CASE shot his wife. Informant stated CASE's wife is in critical condition and LLOYD CASE is in jail. Informant stated that the Klan is taking up a collection to defend LLDYD CASE and is "talking it up" in the Lincoln County area to the effect that that was what was expected of him due to the way his wife was acting;

SEDGY HERRINGTON - informant stated that SEDGY HERRINGTON is a brother of A.C. HERRINGTON. Informant stated that SEDGY HERRINGTON lives in the Ruth, Miss., area and works for the Miss. Highway Commission out of McComb, Miss.;

HORACE JACKSON - informant stated that HORACE JACKSON reportedly is a retired farmer who lives on Highway 84 west of Brookhaven, Miss., near Prospect Church. Informant stated that he believes HORACE JACKSON is working for a wealthy person in Brookhaven, whose name he cannot recall;

Operator of Ford Tractor Place, Brookhaven, Miss. - informant stated he is not certain who owns the Ford Tractor Place in Brookhaven, Miss., but will ascertain this person's identity before the next contact;

LEE STAMPS - informant stated LEE STAMPS suffered a pertial paralysis in a recent stroke or automobile accident and believes him to be presently living in Jackson, Miss., with relatives;

Dr. BENNY HENNINGTON - informant stated BENNY HENNINGTON has recently called a lawyer in Jackson, Miss., and pledged a retainer for the WKKKK to defend LLOYD CASE and TOM EARL HENNINGTON who was apprehended by the Lincoln County Sheriff on a charge of assault and battery, at which time HENNINGTON has been charged with beating C.L. DAVIS, a service station owner and manager in Wesson', Miss. Informant stated HENNINGTON is a Klan member and radical;

ERNEST MAPP - informant stated ERNEST MAPP reportedly lives at 1010 Fisher St., in Brookhaven, Miss., and owns his own drilling company. Informant stated MAPP is approximately 37 years of age;

JULIAN CASE - informant stated JULIAN CASE is a "ne'er do well" who in 1924 or 1926 killed two men over a woman. Informant stated CASE received a penitentiary offense, but was allowed to go to the penitentiary on his own and spent most of his time back in Brookhaven on visiting privileges. Informant stated JULIAN CASE lives in the area of Brookhaven, Miss., and hangs around the pool hall;

CLAUDE CLARK - informant stated he believes CLAUDE CLARK is a mechanic who works for C.C. CLARK in the Ruth, Miss., area;

ELMO REID - informant stated he does not know ELMO REID's present location, but does know that ELMO REID would probably not have time for the KKK because he is too busy bootlegging;

JIMMY WHITTINGTON - informant stated that JIMMY WHITTINGTON lives at Route 2, Bogue Chitto, Miss., and his wife's name is TERESE IDELL WHITTINGTON. Informant stated he believes JIMMY WHITTINGTON is a brother of the Constable, Beat 4, JAYCEE WHITTINGTON. Informant stated he had heard that JIMMY WHITTINGTON had broken his arm or leg and would probably be at home;

ERNEST J. REEVES - informant stated that ERNEST REEVES lives approximately 1/4 of a miles south of Norfield, Miss., in an old shack on the left of Highway 51. Informant stated that ERNEST REEVES has recently returned from Baton Rouge, La., where he worked as a clerk in a relative's mercantile store;

CHARLIE STRINGER - informant stated that he had heard that CHARLIE STRINGER "swears in all the Kluckers in the southern Miss. area;

JACK EVANS, aka JESS EVANS - informant stated he believes there is a JESS EVANS working for Mrs. B. MC KENZIER, supervisor of the third district in Lincoln County in the area of Ruth, Miss.;

ARNIE WALKER, aka AUTIE WALKER - informant stated to his knowledge AUTIE WALKER is working on an off shore oil rig in New Orleans, La. He does not recall which one;

EUDDY WEIR, aka FRANK WEIR - informant stated FRANK WEIR works at the Clark Gin Co., in Ruth, Miss., as a mechanic;

J.W. RITCHIE - informant stated he believes RITCHIE's mother is presently working at Owens Cafe in Brookhaven, Miss. Informant stated that he has heard that J.W. RITCHIE drives a Holsum Bread Truck out of Brookhaven, Miss., and usually returns to Brookhaven approximately 4:00 p.m. each day;

MOISE RUSHING - informant stated that he does not believe there is any such name as MOISE RUSHING. He stated there is a BOISE RUSSELL who lives in the Ruth, Miss., area and is a member of the Klan; MACK WALKER - informant stated that MACK WALKER approximate age 35, lives below Ruth, Miss., on Highway 583, in a new house on the left. Informant stated MACK WALKER presently works for Croft Aluminum Co., in McComb, Miss.;

SAM EULLOCK = informant stated that he believes SAM BULLOCK works for C.C. CLARK of Ruth, Miss., as a "general flunky";

ALFUS DAVIS, aka ALCUS DAVIS - informant stated that ALCUS DAVIS lives in the area of Ruth, Miss., across the highway from C.C. CLARK's Shell Station and is in his early thirties:

B.F. MASON, aka S.B. MASON - informant stated that S.B. MASON is a mechanic at the Clark Cotton $Gin_{FOLA(b)}(6)$ Co., and is approximately 65 years of age; FOLA(b)(7) - (C)

UNSUB, son-in-law of DOC BLADES - informant stated that DOC BLADES is a Constable in Lincoln County and is presently in charge of the county farm where he works prisoners on the county farm. Informant stated he believes that he can find out by the next contact who DOC BLADES son-in-law is;

Informant stated he believes the tickets come from Louisiana, but he does not know who the "runner" is.

On 4/17/65, GERALD BYNUM, was heard make the remark that the Negro that killed Mr. CARTER, at the service station in Laurel, Mississippi, should be taken out of jail and killed. (NOTE: Negro has been moved to Parchman, Miss., to begin serving his sentence.)

C. H. THOMPSON

MORGAN HOLIFIELD

On 4/21/65, THOMPSON and MORGAN HOLIFIELD, former Sheriff, Jones County, Mississippi, were talking about the Negro that had killed Mr. CARTER at the service station in Laurel. Mr. HOLIFIELD was of the opinion that the Negro should have been sentenced to the "gas chamber"; instead, he got life in prison.

J. C. BROADHEAD PAT DICKERSON PAUL WEST

On 4/21/65, Mr. BROADHEAD remarked that PAUL WEST was still the Exalted Cyclops of the Laurel group. He also advised that PAT DICKERSON, who lives at the BROADHEAD home, is a member of the East Group (Wayne County), and is employed at Masonite Corporation, Laurel.

Mr. BROADHEAD states that he has not attended any recent meetings of the Laurel group and does not know what they have been doing.

On 5/27/65, Mr. BROADHEAD advised that PAUL WEST is no longer Exalted Cyclops, but has withdrawn from the klan due to his wife's objection. She is reported to be highly nervous and feared that Mr. WEST might get in trouble or be called before the Senate Committee during the coming investigation.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D)

BUDDY SHARPE

R. E. RIVERS

Source states he was talking with on Sunday, 5/30/65, and learned that he is a member of the Laurel Group of the WKKKKOM. He also learned that PAUL WEST had resigned as Exalted Cyclops and at the present time there is no Exalted Cyclops. Mr. R. E. RIVERS, insurance salesman, Liberty National Life Insurance Company, is the Assistant Exalted Cyclops. He lives in the Shady Grove Community. FOIA(b)(7) - (D)

FOIA(b)(7) - (D) was also discussing the trial of the three klan members in Alabama and commented that all the members of the jury were members of the klan, except three. All but two of the klan members voted for a conviction so that it would look "good" to the public. When the next trial is held, the vote will probably be about nine to three and will come down with each trial until the case is thrown out of court.

Source states that there is some "rumor," according to ______ that the three other defendants are going to turn "States evidence" and try to convict the FBI informant. He does not know just why ______ told him this since he did not indicate any interest in the conversation.

"SPECK" STEWART

LEONARD MC KEE

It has been learned that LEONARD MC KEE is no longer Exalted Cyclops of the East Group (Wayne County). He has been replaced by "SPECK" STEWART, who is reported to live on the Lower Myrick Road. He is employed at Masonite and has a brother, COOPER STEWART, who is employed at Jones Battery Company, Laurel.

V. L. LEE

On 4/27/65, V. L. LEE was talking about the Negro situation in Alabama recently. He stated that if they (Negroes) came to Mississippi and started that kind of activity, there would be "a young war" and he would be one that would lead it.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA

Source states that on 5/31/65, he was approached by a klansman, name not recalled, who asked him to go to Natchez, Miss., on Friday, 6/4/65, since there is to be a state meeting of the klan. He understands that ROBERT SHELTON, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, will be the speaker. He does not know the reason that a member of the WKKKKOM would be invited to the meeting, unless it was to change over.

B. F. HINTON

GRADY CHANCE

On or about 5/24/65, B. F. HINTON contacted DICK BARRETT, Barrett Service Station, Laurel, Miss., and made arrangements to have his vehicles serviced. Source has learned that HINTON and CHANCE have had an argument and HINTON has quit trading with CHANCE. He does not know what the break-up is about, but he has heard "rumors" that there is some woman involved.

He also learned through general klan circles that CHANCE has pulled out of the klan and does not want anything else to do with it. The trouble seems to have some relation between the Shrine Patrol (Motor) since CHANCE is trying to sell his motorcycle. He will follow this in an effort to get more information.

KEITH DYKES

KEITH DYKES recently stated that the West Group (Wolf Pace) has not held a meeting in over a month and does not expect to hold one until CLARENCE HOLIFIELD, Assistant Exalted Cyclops, gets over the "drunk" he has been on for weeks.

Source states that DYKES does not appear to be interested in holding any meeting since he, source, saw HOLIFIELD just a few days ago in Laurel.

BLACKLIST

During the first part of May, 1965, a blacklist was distrubited throughout the City of Meridian, Mississippi. On Sunday, 5/2/65, DEXTER TORRANCE picked up a mimeograph machine from DELMAR DENNIS and stated that he had a list to print. TORRANCE had three men in the car with him; however, I do not know who printed this list or who distributed it.

Recently, I learned that SAMMY DAVIDSON, Vice President of the Southern Pipe Co., Merdian, Miss., and whose brother's name, MYER DAVIDSON, was on the blacklist, contributed \$250 to the Legal Defense Fund for the defendants in the civil rights slayings in Philadelphia, Miss., in June, 1964.

JERRY BARFIELD

Recently I was in contact with JERRY BARFIELD, at which time he advised me that he wanted nothing further to do with any klan organization. BARFIELD stated that he was formerly the Secretary of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM), Lauderdale County; however, he is burning all records and does not plan to have any further association with this group.

TOMMY HORNE

During the latter part of May, 1965, I was in contact with TOMMY HORNE, at which time he advised that his wife is quite displeased with his being associated with the klan. He stated that he is harassed by Agents of the FBI continually and that his wife is insistent that he get out of the klan. HORNE did not indicate whether or not he would adhere to his wife's wishes.

AMERICANS FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE WHITE RACE, INC. (APWR)

On Saturday, 6/5/65, a conservation rally is to be held at the Liberty Ball Park, beginning at 3:00 p.m. in Natchez, Miss. Speakers will be KENT COURTNEY, Publisher, "The Independent American," New Orleans, Louisiana; Reverend A. C. EVERETT, Professor of Whitworth College, Brookhaven, Miss.; Honorable JOHN RICHARD RARICK, District Judge, St. Francisville, La.; and JAMES E. CLARK, JR., Sheriff of Dallas County, Selma, Alabama. This rally is to be sponsored by the APWR, Natchez Chapter.

The APWR is also distributing a letter which contains a list of products which, according to this letter, are sponsors of nationwide television and radio network programs which have teamed up with MARTIN LUTHER KING and his

"civil righters" goon squad to destroy the constitutional liberties of all Americans, Negroes and whites, North and South. These listed sponsors are, according to this letter, financing distorted news programs.

The APWR is also distributing a printed mimeographed letter or newsletter entitled, "Christian Conservative Communique", Vol. 1, No. 12, Jackson, Miss., 5/27/65. This letter sets forth numerous news articles regarding racial demonstrations which have happened throughout the world. E. L. MC DANIEL, GRAND DRAGON, UKA, INC., NATCHEZ, MISS.

Recently it was learned that E. L. MC DANEIL has mailed letters to all Exalted Cyclops and fellow klansmen in Miss., stating that the time has arrived that the klan should show strength, and therefore, a call is being put out for every klansman to be in Natchez, Miss., at 12:00 noon Saturday, 6/12/65. This letter indicates there is to be a motorcade through downtown Natchez, Miss., composed of klansmen wearing their robes. After the motorcade, they will go to a place and play a tape of an alleged confession, which a local newspaper editor has made big issue over. Instructions were given that all klansmen were to go the Albert Pick Motel and someone will have a Rebel flag on the antenna of his car to direct the 4 klansmen to the place where they will transfer into cars bearing Adams County tags. The letter denotes that they will not be recognized. It also urges that everyone in the area where the letter is received should be notified of this rally. This letter indicates that it is desired that at least three or four hundred members be present for the rally. MC DANIEL indicates that if robes are not available, then klansmen in Natchez will provide them, if at all possible.

W. S. TORRANCE, EXALTED CYCLOPS, UKA, LAUDERDALE COUNTY, MISS.

On 5/28/65, W. S. TORRANCE advised that in April, 1965, a newspaper article was published in the "Meridian Star" in which it requested that persons interested in segregation should go to Atlanta, Georgia, on 4/25/65 and participate in a march organized by LESTER MADDOX. This article was signed by RAYMOND ROBERTS. TORRANCE advised that LEE ROBERTS had this article placed in the "Meridian Star," however, he, TORRANCE, actually paid the expense of having the article published. TORRANCE stated that it is his plans to get in touch with RAYMOND ROBERTS who lives in Georgia, and to have ROBERTS contact the Georgia klan and get them to

"take care of" JAMES E. JORDAN, who is reported to be living in an unknown place in Georgia. JORDAN is reported to be a "stool pigeon" for the FBI. He is also reported to have furnished the FBI information regarding the slaying of the three civil rights workers in Philadelphia during June, 1964. SMITH COUNTY, UKA, INC.

W. S. TORRANCE advised that recently while in conversation with E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon, UKA, Inc., Natchez, Miss., MC DANIEL indicated that the UKA had gained new strength in Raleigh, Miss. MC DANIEL stated that several new units had been organized at Raleigh.

ED FRASIER

ED FRASIER, employee of Redd Exterminating Company, Meridian, Miss., has been sworn into the UKA as a secret member. FRASIER is reported to be going to reorganize the old WKKKKOM unit in Kemper County and bring them into the UKA, Inc.

LEAKE COUNTY, UKA, INC.

W. S. TORRANCE has advised that he plans to go to Carthage, Miss., to organize the UKA, Inc., in that county. W. S. TORRANCE stated that he desired to have someone else handle this matter, but if he could not get anyone, he would do it himself.

WKKKKOM

W. S. TORRANCE advised that the WKKKKOM is presently on its "last legs" and that BILLY BUCKLES, JULIUS HARPER, and SAM BOWERS are the only persons who are attempting to hold this organization together.

W. S. TORRANCE related that VERNON "COOKY" CAHOON and one FNU BAUCUM, both of Chunky, Miss., have paid up their dues in the UKA, Inc., and plan to organize a unit of their own in Chunky, Miss. CAHOON owns and operates a number of music boxes in the Lauderdale County area.

BERNARD L. AKIN

W. S. TORRANCE related that he anticipates B. L. AKIN, owner and operator of Akin's Mobile Homes and attempt to have AKIN once again become active. TORRANCE related that AKIN was quite active in the WKKKKOM and he is hopeful that he will be able to get AKIN interested in the UKA.

PETE HARRIS

PETER HARRIS, according to W. S. TORRANCE, recently paid his dues up to date in the UKA. HARRIS has been inactive in klan work since he was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in connection with the slaying of the three civil rights workers in Philadelphia in June, 1964.

ALGENE PRICE

Recently, ALGENE PRICE advised that he was once again interested in joining in klan work. PRICE has indicated that he amenable to organizing his own UKA unit. He related that he plans to organize slowly in order to get good men.

PRICE related that he has come upon an idea whereby persons such as MARTIN LUTHER KING who should be eliminated can best be killed by the use of a bow and arrow. PRICE is of the opinion that the person to be eliminated could be shot with a bow, thereby fatally wounding him and without causing any noise or commotion. He then related that he could destroy the bow and arrow by burning them and they could not be traced. He would then deny that he is capable of shooting a bow and arrow. PRICE advised that he intends taking up the art of archery in the near future.

COFO

W. S. TORRANCE related that the Lauderdale County Klan of the UKA plans to beat up a COFO worker in the Meridian, Miss. area. TORRANCE advised that this COFO worker is a tall, red-headed young boy who usually wears a big straw hat. TORRANCE did not give the reason as to why

this COFO worker was to be beaten, other than that he had seen him at the dedication ceremonies of the new junior college in Meridian, Miss., and did not like the way this person was acting.

W. S. TORRANCE

On 5/28/65, W. S. TORRANCE, during a conversation with a number of known klansmen, advised that there would be a UKA planned rally and motorcade in Natchez, Miss., on 6/12/65, and that persons participating would wear robes. He stated that his wife plans to make robes for klansmen who are going to participate in this rally. TORRANCE is also known to have in his possession the UKA oath, which he intends to use to swear in new members.

GARY SMITH, PROGRAM DIRECTOR, WOKK RADIO STATION, MERIDIAN, MISS.

GARY SMITH was voted on to become a member of the WKKKKOM in Lauderdale County during the middle of the summer of 1964. To my knowledge, SMITH was never obligated as a member and it is my impression that it was SMITH's father who was the instigator in having his name put up as a possible member for the WKKKKOM. I have never heard any klansmen state that SMITH actually was ever obligated as a member of the WKKKKOM.

May 20, 1965 Pascagoula, Mississippi

The Pascagoula Klavern met Monday night, May 17, 1965, in a trailer located behind the Hideaway Lounge on Telephone Road between Pascagoula and Moss Point, Mississippi. This trailer is owned by W. E. SNOWDEN who operates the hideaway.

B. L. WHITE, TINY FRAZIER, LEE MC INTOSH, JOE TURNER, BILL SNOWDEN, VINCENT PURSER and Mr. LACEY were present. They agreed among themselves that WHITE will be Exalted Cyclops, FRAZIER will be Assistant E. C. and Secretary, MC INTOSH will be Treasurer and TURNER will be Master at Arms.

The following new members were voted on for admission by the officers, and then sworn in. Most of them had been members before the latest reorganization:

> CECIL HAYDEN RODNEY JONES FRANKIE LARSON, owns a sheet metal company J. ADAMS, partner with LARSON TOM SEAY, owns Riverside Cafe and deals in "Moonshine." CLARK DEVERS, operates a fruit stand on Telephone Road JAMES BALIUS, works on off-shore oil rig. SAM (LNU), operates Triangle Lounge TROY (LNU), operates Woodie's Cafe near Hideaway Lounge

FRANKIE LARSON and JAMES BALIUS were elected to the office of Rear Guard.

B. L. WHITE said that the Klavern needed guns and that the National Guard Armory at Columbia, Mississippi, would be easy. He said he had a man in the guard there who would leave the door open. He wanted MC INTOSH to do the actual burglary. MC INTOSH said he would not do it without seeing it first. FRAZIER, WHITE, MC INTOSH, JOE TURNER and PURSER plan to go there and look it over sometime next week. They will travel in PURSER's car, a 1960 Chevrolet sedan, two-

door, blue, which has an Alabama license. This burglary was discussed only by the officers and the new men were not taken in on it.

WHITE discussed the possibility of burning some crosses. He said he was making them at his house and they should burn about 25 in the Pascagoula area. Possible places for burning them was on the neutral ground of Highway 90 in Gautier, in front of the U. S. Post Office at Pascagoula, Walkers Barbeque on Telephone Road, Tom's Super Market on Market Street (it is rumored that a Negro employee of Tom's has been going with a white woman), and the Midway Cafe on River Road (this place has been selling beer to minors.)

The meeting ended at about 9:30 p.m. It was announced that there would be a meeting every Monday night.

FNU SHELTON

The SHELTON I mentioned earlier lives somewhere in North Mississippi. The last time I saw him was at the meeting at Greenwood, Miss. To my knowledge, he has not lived or worked in Louisiana. It was my information that A. C. HERRINGTON had moved to Louisiana.

SHELTON is a white male, about 6' tall, 35 - 40 years of age, husky build, black curly hair, and speaks with a hoarse voice.

VCM CLUB, KREOLE, MISSISSIPPI

TOM SEAY has taken over the VCM Club and reopened it about a week ago. TINY FRAZIER is running it for SEAY.

JOE TURNER

JOE TURNER has Alabama license 2-96017 on his car.

Mt. Olive, Mississippi May 2, 1965

STATE MEETING WKKKKOM:

A state meeting of the WKKKKOM was held on 5-2-65 about 18 miles West of Poplarville, Mississippi, on Highway 43. There were about 100 to 115 members present. SAM BOWERS, Imperial Wizard, and BILLY BUCKLES, Grand Giant, were present. ERNEST GILBERT, State Investigator, and JULIUS HARPER, Grand Dragon, were not present. Reverend (FNU) BILBO, Chaplain, was also present.

SAM BOWERS:

BOWERS arrived about one hour late and explained that he had attended a district meeting in Chickasaw County, Saturday' night. When he left there he was followed by FBI Agents to Jackson, Mississippi, where he left his car in a parking lot and came on to the meeting with friends from Hinds County.

He related that HARPER had stayed in Crystal Springs, Mississippi, to lure the Agents in another direction.

BOWERS stated that the United Klan was trying to take over the White Knights or force "use" out. He spoke strongly against the United Klan and related that SHELTON and MC DANIELS are dictators; that our (WKKKKOM) strongest weapon is that we are secret. No member of the WKKKKOM should appear at any demonstration but this should be the time to strike at another location.

BOWERS informed that of the 10,000 members in the State of Mississippi that the WKKKKOM have over half of them.

He then introduced a resolution that the dues be raised from \$1.00 to \$2.00 per month; that \$1.00 be paid to the State Treasurer. This was voted down. Another resolution was made to allow each of the five (5) Klan Bursars to hold \$500.00 each at all times and no disbursement can be made for any purpose. This motion was passed.

BURSARS:

Four of the five Bursars were present and reported over \$3,000.00 on hand not counting the collections at the meeting. It was also set up so that state and district officers can draw monthly for expenses not to exceed \$50.00 each. This is to come from any money over and above the \$500.00 that the Bursars are to hold.

W. R. MANGUM:

100

MANGUM was elected Master of Ceremonies, he made a talk and states he has lost his job and credits the FBI for his being out of work. He also claimed that Labor Unions are our (WKKKKOM) worst enemy.

He also told of refusing to take money from FBI Agents to furnish names of WKKKKOM members from Simpson and Covington Counties. He states this proves that they do not know anything about the members.

BILLY BUCKLES:

BUCKLES told of the many times he has been followed and questioned by FBI Agents. He advised against any members supporting the PTA or the Methodist Church.

REVEREND (FNU) BILBO:

Reverend BILBO opened the meeting with a sermon which was not pertinent except one statement. He said that if it becomes necessary to fight against "Saten" my services will be available.

He had to leave at 12:00 noon and a hat was passed among the members for contributions to help with Reverend BILBO's expenses.

TRAVIS AINSWORTH:

AINSWORTH from Hattiesburg, Mississippi, was not present at the meeting. Only one of five units from Forrest County was present.

JOHN PRESTON HARVEY, SPELL PHILLIP NORRIS - COVINGTON COUNTY UNITS:

Mr. HARVEY and SPELL PHILLIPP NORRIS from Covington County Unit 2, were present at the meeting along with two (2) young men who appeared to be around 19 or 20 years old. Their names were (FNU) WARD and (FNU) HERRIN.

MISCELLANEOUS - WKKKKOM:

. .

In addition to the officers present there were four (4) or five (5) Bursars present; four District Kleagles present, and 47 representatives present. There were some 40 mabsent.



Informant made available copy of The Klan Ledger dated April, 1965.

Informant advised that in his conversations with CHARLES FALVEY, Brookhaven, Mississippi, he has come to the conclusion that if the klan decided to kill an FBI Agent that CHARLES FALVEY would be in on the killing as "he despises the FBI". Informant stated he feels FALVEY could easily be let into killing anyone.

Informant advised that he has been unable recently to get hold of CHARLES FAINEY. He stated that when he calls FAINEY's home that Mrs. FAINEY advises him that GHARLES FAINEY has just gene



fishing". Informant stated that Mrs. FALVEY calls the informant's wife daily and discusses the informant who was exposed and testified against the klansmen in Birmingham, Alabama, in connection with the white woman who was killed during the march by Negroes between Selma and Montgomery, Alabama. Informant pointed out that he, in the past, has normally been able to reach FALVEY easily and it is not customary for FALVEY to be on extended fishing trips. Informant stated he feels that FALVEY is possibly doing work for the klan and may possibly be surveilling the informant or Agents of the FBI for klan leaders.

Informant suggested if possible FBI Agents should keep their eye on CHARLES FALVEY.

New Orleans, Louisiana 4-28-65

The state meet of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) is to be held on 5-2-65 and the purpose of holding the meet on 5-2-65 is to keep members of the WKKKKOM from attending the rally being held by the United Klans of America (TKA), Inc., at Natchez, Mississippi, on the same date, 5-2-65. It is the opinion of the klan officials that all FBI Agents will be at Natchez, Mississippi, to cover the rally of the UKA, Inc., and that no attention will then be directed to the state meet of the WYKKKOM. The state meet of the WKKKKOM is to be four miles West of Poplarville, Mississippi, on Highway 26 which is the state righway between Poplarville and Bogalusa, Louisiana. Those attending the meet are scheduled to arrive at 6:30 a.m. on 5-2-65 and there will be a car on this road with the trunk lid up. The pass word is "theater" and every klansman with a car load of fellow klansmen must have a ticket from the Lincoln Theater, Laurel, Mississippi, which is a Negro theater. Upon giving the pass word and exhibiting the ticket to the klansman at the car with the trunk lid up on the highway, further instructions will be given as to the exact location of the state meet.

On the night of 4-27-65, JULIUS HARPER was overheard talking to E. S. GILBERT, the head of the Klan Bureau of Investigation (KBI), at which time HARPER was heard to tell GILBERT that he, HARPER, had talked to SAM BOWERS but could not get ROWERS to stay away from the next state meet on 5-2-65. HARPER told ULLEFRE that he would not go to the next state meet. He explained that FFL Agents have not questioned him as much as they have SAM FOWERS and that therefore FBI Agents do not know as much about AARPER as they do about BOWERS. HARPER indicated that he wanted to leave the situation as it is as he felt this put him in a much better position.

Following the meet between JULIUS MARPER and E. S. GLEERI, it was noted that GERALD WHITEHEAD of Brookhaven, Mississippi, talked to MARPER. HARPER was pointing and appeared to explaining directions to WHITEHEAD and during the course of this explaination, HARPER appeared to be upset. Following this conversation, WHITEHEAD departed as if he was going on a mission for MARPER.

• • • •

The frame has been built for the sign on the Laird place just out of Brookhaven, Mississippi. The sign will bear a picture showing MARTIN LUTHER KING in attendance at the Highlander Folk School at Monteagle, Tennessee. It is expected this sign will be erected within the next few days.

Informant advised that SAM BOWERS told him that BILLY BIRDSONG, Meridian, Mississippi, exposed an FBI informant to the klan and that this informant was a policeman of the Meridian Police Department. Since this time BIRDSONG keeps coming to EOWERS and asking for permission to kill this informant. Every time BIRDSONG comes to BOWERS he "acts like a bird dog" looking everywhere.

BOWERS stated that the FBI knew that this informant of the Meridian, Mississippi, Police Department, was to be exposed by FIRDSONG and that the FBI then sent FIRDSONG to get BOWERS to give orders to kill the informant. BOWERS stated the FBI would then have a statement from BOWERS giving orders to kill and the FBI could then arrest BOWERS.

Informant stated that BOWERS admitted to him that he did have a picture of former president JOHN KENNEDY and on either side of the picture were pictures of STALIN and LENIN.

Informant stated that he gained the impression that if SAM BOWERS is run out of the klan at the next state meeting this will only split the WKKKKOM and then the UKA, Inc., will attempt to eliminate BILLY BUCKLES and other state officers of the WKKKKOM and thereby take over the members of the WKKKKOM. Informant is of the opinion that if SAM BOWERS is eliminated from the WKKKKOM that some members will follow BOWERS and some members will go with the UKA, Inc. He pointed out that a few members will cwase to operate in either klan.

Informant stated that BOWERS advised bim that he intended to "hog-tie one member". Informant stated he feels that the individual referred to by SAM BOWERS is BILLY BUCKLES, the Grand Giant.

Informant further stated that he is of the opinion there will be a riot at the state meet, 5-6-65, and that perhaps someone will get killed. He attributed this statement to the fact that feelings are running high in the WKKKKOM and that many members will attend the meet with side arms.

Informant advised that he has received no information regarding contemplated action by the klan against FBI Agents.

Informant advised that he has not heard of CHARLES JAMES SEALE in several months but that from his past knowledge of SEALE he is of the opinion that perhaps SEALE is the individual who made arrangements for the state meet between Poplarville and Eogalusa, Louisiana, on 5-2-65. 1

GEORGE H. BIRDSONG, aka BILLY BIRDSONG

Recently, BILLY BIRDSONG was in the Meridian Police Department talking about a beating which he received from a group of masked men. He related that he was beaten as a result of cooperating with the Mississippi Highway Patrol. BIRDSONG related that he had had nothing to do with the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (WKKKKOM) or the United Klans of America (UKA) since he got out of the klan sometime during the winter or early spring of 1965. BIRDSONG also highly criticized SAM BOWERS, Imperial Wizard of the WKKKKOM, and stated that BOWERS is a communist and that he wants nothing more to do with any klan operations.

BIRDSONG stated that he was now celebrating his

divorce from his wife, MARGIE BIRDSONC, and that she is always

BIRDSONG indicated that he desired to talk with MILLER at length regarding treatment received from MILLER at the hands I believe that BIRDSONG might be attempting to of the klan. get back in the good graces of members of the klan in the Meridian area and that he may be attempting to learn of additional information through this talk with MILLER. MILLER has not indicated whether he will have an extended talk with BIRDSONG. MILLER has indicated that BIRDSONG has been most friendly recently and that he, MILLER, feels that BIRDSONG and he are both in the same situation, in that both have been banished by the klan.

LEE ROBERTS

On 5/1/65, LEE ROBERTS was seen in the company of DEXTER TORRANCE at the Trailways Bus Station, located near the

Meridian Police Department. It was noted that ROBERTS and TORRANCE were talking together and it was also noted that on 5/2/65, a "blacklist" was distributed throughout the Meridian, Miss., area. It is the general belief of police officials that LEE ROBERTS, DEXTER TORRANCE, JIMMY SMITH and B. L. AKIN are responsible for distributing this blacklist.

JAY RAY RUTLEDGE, aka RAYMOND RUTLEDGE

RAYMOND RUTLEDGE, also known as JAY RAY RUTLEDGE, a driver for the Rider Truck Lines, Meridian, Miss., is reported to be a member of the WKKKKOM. RUTLEDGE is a brother of JIM RUTLEDGE, who was caught with some dynamite in Meridian during the summer of 1964. RAYMOND RUTLEDGE is reported to be operating a service station located on 11th Avenue and A Street, Meridian, Miss.

HORACE L. GOODMAN

HORACE L. GOODMAN is a teacher at the Ross Collins Vocational School, Meridian, Miss. GOODMAN lives in Bonita, Miss., and is a member of the Lauderdale County klan, WKKKKOM.

GOODMAN is a friend of AUTHER HORNE, Mr. DEWITT SMITH, and other known klansmen. I do not know if GOODMAN is presently a member of the WKKKKOM or the UKA.

HAROLD CRENSHAW

CRENSHAW lives at Collinsville, Miss., and is a salesman for the Mississippi Power Company, Meridian, Miss. CRENSHAW at one time was a member of Unit 3, Lauderdale Klavern, WKKKKOM. It is not know if he is presently a member of this organization.

J. C. RIGDON

J. C. RIGDON is known to me to have at one time been a member of the Neshoba County Klavern, WKKKKOM. RIGDON was employed at the Swartzfager Ford Company, Meridian, Miss. At present, he is employed at Lex Chamling Company, Meridian. RIGDON is reported to be friends of EDGAR RAY KILLEN, CONRAD KEENE, PETE JORDAN, and other known members of the Neshoba County Klan. RIGDON attended at least one meeting of the WKKKKOM at Key Field, Meridian, Miss.

BILLY BIRDSONG

On 5/28/65, while in conversation with BILLY BIRDSONG, he told me that DEXTER TORRANCE is reported to have a lot of

arms and dynamite in his possession. He stated that TORRANCE might possibly have these weapons in the trunk of his automobile. Recently I have heard through police sources, that TORRANCE is reported to have an arsenal in the back of his automobile, and it is believed that BIRDSONG may have furnished this information to the police department. JIMMY SMITH

JIMMY SMITH, according to police sources, said that when he was interviewed recently by the police, that the reason the Meridian police officers were placed on the "blacklist" was because they did not fire WALLACE MILLER, the sergeant who was banished by the WKKKKOM.



It was reported that there was to be a meeting of the AFWR in Natchez, Miss., on the weekend of 6/5 - 6/65, and that M. W. HAMILTON was arranging for a chartered bus to go to Natchez for this meeting.

The informant stated that he had a conversation with ROSS WEATHERS on 6/3/65 and that WEATHERS related that members of the Forrest County Klavern had gone to Pearl River County on a Sunday about three weeks prior. WEATHERS stated no meetings were being held in the Hattlesburg area as the members were afraid to meet in this area. ROSS advised informant that they do not meet in the house in Lamar County since the FBI is watching it.

Informant advised that he has gotten the feeling that something was wrong about the way BILLY BUCKLES and CLYDE SEALE had continued to talk to the informant about traveling over the State of Mississippi to stir people up about getting SAM BOWERS impeached as Imperial Wizard of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM). Informant stated it now appears that BILLY BUCKLES and CLYDE SEALE were attempting to use the informant in view of the fact that at the state meet, BILLY BUCKLES and CLYDE SEALE made no comment or effort to have SAM BOWERS impeached.

Informant advised that he personally went to visit SAM BOWERS and told him he wanted to check the home of BOWERS to determine if the stories that were being circulated about BOWERS having pictures of HITLER, KHRUSHCHEV, MUSSOLINI, and CASTRO in his house were actually true. Informant stated BOWERS told him he could search his house and that if the informant so desired, he, BOWERS, would leave the premises and return later. Informant stated that he advised BOWERS it was not necessary for him to leave the premises. Informant stated he looked about the house and noted a few books on the Nazi party and a file maintained by BOWERS on the American Nazi Party. Informant stated BOWERS admitted that he had some pictures in his house of HITLER, MUSSOLINI AND KHRUSHCHEV, but that he had had them on either side of a picture of ex-President JOHN KENNEDY.

Informant stated he then confronted BOWERS with the fact that the officers of the klan were planning to vote him out at the next state meet and the informant told BOWERS that he, the informant, would vote to have BOWERS impeached if it came to a vote. Informant stated BOWERS then advised him that he had a right to vote as he saw fit, and BOWERS did not seem too perturbed over the fact that the officers were planning to vote him out.

Informant advised that he had been unable to attend the state meet held near Poplarville the weekend of 5/15-16/65, but that from several sources he had heard that nothing went on of any importance. No vote came up to throw BOWERS out of the klan and several of the sources commented that CLYDE SEALE and BILLY BUCKLES caused no trouble whatsoever. Informant stated that in view of what transpired at the state meet, he feels that CLYDE SEALE and BILLY BUCKLES had hoped to have the informant present at the meeting to initiate the action to have BOWERS removed as Imperial Wizard. ۲

Informant stated that he had been told by his sources that an amendment had been passed which allowed the bursars (all five) to keep on hand \$500 for emergencies regardless of bills or requests for funds.

Informant stated he had been told by his sources that a financial statement had been read by BOWERS which was very well accepted by the entire meeting. BOWERS told how he had spent the klan's money and then began "talking down" ROBERT SHELTON, the Imperial Wizard of the United Klans of America (UKA.). BOWERS stated he thought SHELTON was getting money from the U. S. Government through an intermediate source.

Informant advised that during the course of his meeting with SAM BOWERS, that BOWERS advised him that the UKA is "taking over" Meridian completely. BOWERS asked the informant to get the word out that the WKKKKOM knew where their money was coming from, whereas the UKA will not account for their sources of money.

Informant advised that he feels that CHARLES FALVEY is planning something with CLYDE SEALE, as each time informant attempts to contact FALVEY, he is told by the wife of FALVEY that FALVEY has "gone fishing."

Informant again cautioned that FBI Agents should be extremely careful in their dealings with CHARLES FALVEY, as FALVEY has said he will tell the Agents "to go to hell," and if they do not leave him alone, then he will do something else. Informant again pointed out that FALVEY is known to

have killed one man in Brookhaven, Miss., and informant feels that FALVEY would be willing to kill an FBI Agent if given the slightest provocation.

Informant advised that J. M. FOSTER, who is a brother of PAUL LAYFETTE FOSTER of Natchez, Miss., assisted in the erection of a billboard near Brookhaven, Miss., on the property of one of the LAIRDS who resides near Highway 84. The billboard contains a picture identifying MARTIN LUTHER KING in attendance at the Highlander Folk School near Monteagle, Tennessee. ÷

Informant advised that he had received no information concerning the burning of four COFO houses at Indianola, Miss., on 5/1/65, but that from his knowledge of individuals in this area, he would suspect BYRON DE LA BECKWITH and GORDON LACKEY.

Informant advised that he has received no information about JIM FORD, Grand Titan for the 6th District of the Original Knights of Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) combining all 47 groups over the United States into one group, with the exception of the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, which is under the leadership of HOUSTON MORRIS.

SAM BOWERS

Source advised that he was in telephonic contact with BOWERS the past few days. During conversations with BOWERS, the Imperial Wizard related that he was recently visited by MARGIE BIRDSONG, the wife of the former klan investigator, BILLY BIRDSONG. MARGIE advised BOWERS she was experiencing marital difficulties and that recently BILLY had "beat up" her latest boyfriend. She asked if BOWERS would again have BILLY whipped. BOWERS stated that he was not responsible for the whipping of BIRDSONG, but rith rather that the FBI was responsible.

WKKKKOM

BOWERS related that things were "looking good" throughout the state. The only bleak area insofar as the klan was concerned was the Meridian area. He stated that a lot of the good men are returning to the WKKKKOM after a brief time with the UKA, Inc. BOWERS then proceeded to prevail upon the source not to lose faith, to get out and work and in general to run the Meridian area klan as he saw fit.

WAYNE ROBERTS

BOWERS related that ROBERTS did not attend the meeting of the WKKKKOM which was scheduled for Jackson, Miss. about two weeks ago. BOWERS stated he feels ROBERTS "didn't want to go." In reference to the last state meeting, BOWERS commented that they "had a good one" and that a good "sound financial report" was given and it looks like the "White Knights" are "on their way up."

This organization has held many meetings on Saturday night from Spring of 1964 until before ARCHIE FATHER and JAMES SEALE were arrested for the murder of two Negroes. Since that time there have been no meetings to informant's knowledge of this organization. The meetings were held at an abandoned house near ARCHIE PRATHER's home. During the Spring of 1964, a group of klansmen who were wearing hoods came to informant's home in a new Chevrolet owned by JAMES SEALE's wife and tried to get informant to come out of his house. Informant knew they were planning to beat him and he would not come out of his house. The men then left and went to the home of ALTON ALFORD whom they kidnaped and then beat him.

After they had beaten ALFORD they brought him to a road near informant's home, let him out of the car and told him to come to informant's house and if he didn't get informant out of the house they would kill him. ALFORD approached informant's house and hollered at informant while the klansmen were waiting outside. He did not answer and after the klansmen left ALFORD came into informant's house and he treated his wounds which he received from the severe beating which they gave him. Informant does not know why the klan beat ALFORD other than he was a heavy drinker and the only reason they wanted to beat informant up was because ARCHIE PRATHER does not like him.

INFORMATION CONCERNING JAMES SEALES

During the Fall of 1964, klan literature had been distributed in the Natchez and Meadville area. It is generally believed by people in Franklin County that the literature was written by ARCHIE PRATHER and typed by Mrs. JAMES SEALE, who works for an insurance company in Natchez. Informant stated he has heard that JAMES SEALE's Volkswagen has not been seen since the disappearance of the two Negro boys, DEES and MOORE.

UNSUBS; DISAPPEARANCE OF DEES AND MOORE (62-5)

Informant has no information concerning the disappearnce and murder of DEES and MOORE and the first he knew of it was at the arrest of JAMES SEALE. Prior to the disappearance of these boys, it was rumored that CHARLES EDWARDS had made the statement that the DEES boy would walk by his home and whistle and he said he was going to leave the area.

HAROLD SAUCIER has told informant that (FNU) BEASLEY of the MHSP has attended every meeting of the Ku Klux Klan and that he is a member.

CURTIS DAVIS of Wesson, Mississippi has sworn out a warrant of arrest against THOMAS EARL HENNINGTON of Wesson in connection with the beating DAVIS received during the summer of 1964. The warrant was sworn out at Brookhaven, Mississippi on 5/18/65 at the office of Sheriff JOE BRUECK.

Mrs. J. W. CURTIS of Wesson, who was defeated in a runoff election by "BUBBA" DRAIN for the post of Mayor of Wesson has a lot of information on HENNINGTON and might be willing to talk to the FBI.

During March of 1965, it was learned that a light was shot out on the porch of HENRY BRYANT, a Negro, and resident of Wesson, Mississippi. BRYANT lives northeast of Wesson almost in Beauregard, Mississippi and is not active in civil rights.

The persons who were in the car from which it was believed the shots came were BILLY BOUTWELL, his girl friend who is now his wife, and BILLY ASHLEY. BILLY BOUTWELL's wife's mother is very upset over this incident.

The klan in Wesson feels that the FBI has tapped their telephone lines because they know so much. There is also a conflict between them as they feel someone has talked.

Source states that the Klavern has slowed down their activity and only a few persons attend the meetings. About the only regular members are "NIG" HALL, AARON JERNIGAN, BENOID GRAHAM, CLAUDE STUBBS and TRAVIS GILES. He relates these men keep the roads "hot" at night to see what is going on and determine if there are any Negro meetings or other type of gatherings.

He related that HALL, JERNIGAN and GRAHAM have been to Bogalusa, Louisiana, and attended at least one of the rallies. He does not know if they took part or not.

Source states the membership at Ellisville is rather "shook-up" since the recent mayor's election. The Klan had three members in the race, one for mayor, and one for each of the commissioners post. All three were defeated, and the vote was not even close. The members, or at least some of them, feel that the public is not for the Klan and the members who have businesses have started pulling out or have become inactive. VICTOR WALTERS-Mayor; O.L. NIX and BUFORD DOBSON, Commissioners.

BOBBY CRUMPTON -- JIMMIE POLSUM -- BUFORD DOBSON

There is an opening on the Police Department, Ellisville, Mississippi, and all the above have tried to get it. Each one has been questioned about being a member of the Klan. He told them that if they had been a member of this group it would not help them get the job.

CRUMPTON is presently employed by the State Forestry Service, POLSUM operates a tile shop in Ellisville and DOBSON is working for the 555 Wilkinson Tire Shop, Laurel, Mississippi. UNSUBS; Attempt to Burn Residence of ULYSESS JOHNSON, Ellisville, Mississippi, 4-23-65 RM

Source states that on the night the attempt was made to burn the residence of ULYSESS JOHNSON, CLAUDE STUBBS and TRAVIS GILES hung around with policemen ED WARDSWORTH and BARNEY CARTER until they went off duty. The source feels that they had something to do with the fire. 3

Murder of Civil Rights Worker Near Selma, Alabama, during March from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, around 3-27-65

Source states that DUB PARKER, Ellisville, Mississippi, asked him to go to Bessemer, Alabama, with him to check on one of PARKER's drivers that was in jail. They were accompanied by BOBBY CRUMPTON, employee of State Fire Service (Forestry). After they had completed the checking on the driver they visited a relative, JIM CRUMPTON, of BOBBY CRUMPTON. This individual is a member of a Labor Union or some official in the Union. JIM made the statement that two of the men charged with the killing of the woman were arrested in the lane leading to his home. Source believes that JIM stated that all four men had eaten at his home the day of the killing. He believes the meal was at breakfast.

LEONARD CAVES

Source states LEONARD CAVES has been to Ellisville on several occasions recently. This may have been in connection with his regular duties.

Informant advised that GEORGE KELLUM is under suspicion of being a leak in the Forrest County Klavern. He said that DAYTON GILLESPIE had lost all the respect from the Klan, in that he has been referred to as weak, and scared to do anything, and the Klavern is disgusted with him for not taking part in the White Citizens Council.

Informant advised that he had not heard anything more about JOSEPH M. ALBRITTON or COON DOG DOSSETT. He said DOSSETT has been noticeably absent from the area lately. He stated that JAMES EARL LEE may be identical with the LEE he referred to who went to the meeting in Jackson, Mississippi, on May 17, 1965.

Informant advised that TRAVIS AINSWORTH has been in the hospital for about 2 weeks.

He advised that JIMMY WATTS, JIMMY WATSON and DEAN EVANS have not been active, and did not attend the meeting in Jackson, Mississippi.

Hattiesburg, Miss. May 19, 1965

"On 5-17-65 the Trailway Bus left the parking lot on Corner of East Pine and Market St. at 5:20 p.m., Hattiesburg, Miss., and went straight to the <u>colesum</u> in Jackson where the meeting was opened by the WILLIAM J. <u>SIMMONS</u>, Administrator for State Citizens Council who acted as Master of Ceremonies where different officals were introduced. Among them <u>was</u> Lt. Gov. CARROLL GARTIN, Atty General JOE T. PATTERSON, Commissioner of Agriculture CORLEY and State Senator GEORGE YARBROUGH from Red Banks - also former Gov. HUGH WHITE. Sheriff JIM CLARK from Selma was introduced and received a standing ovation from the crowd.

"Then ROSS BARNETT was introduced and after making a short speech in regard to Gov. WALLACE, he introduced WALLACE who opened his remarks in regard to the National Press and news medior for being unfair to the South in regard to the reporting of the news. Then he went on to the school situation and that the public health and education was going to cause chass in the South, trying to push to fast. Told about the feeling on the Civil Right Bill cooling down some since the trouble in the East and after this summer it would be about 50-50.

"Talked about the Students having the demonstrations on the campus of several colleges in regard to the Viet-Nam War. he said if that was tried in Ala. they would be expelled because they would be comitting <u>Sabatog</u> against the United States of America - That the people of Ala. still loved their country even if they had been slapped on the wrist for things they did not deserve. The reaction from the people were mixed, most of the racket was made on the left side of the speaker where the people from Bogalusa, Greenwood and Millsoppi College were seated.

"The conversation going up on the bus was mostly in regard to this summer and trying to get at least 400 members for Citizen Council in Forrest County. So they could get around the seg of the schools. The arrangements for the trip were handled by MR. HAMILTON and that is who the money was paid to. The fare was \$3.54 plus dinner at Dennery's after the speaking - According to a statement made there was approx. 15 members of the right church on the bus (KKK). I believe I picked about all of the men that went 1. LAWLER SHARP 2. JOHN MAUBERG 3. ACE WEATHERS 4. MR. SHOEMAKE, butcher for Lewis Gro. 5. MR. ROGERS who operates Pine Sol. 6. MR. "They have decided on a bus to go to Natchez on June 5 for a rally over there and expect people from La., Ala., Ark., Miss., Ga., Tenn. This will be on Saturday afternoon.

"Other people seen at Jackson were Mr. and Mrs. BEN GAMELL of 4th St., Mr. and Mrs. SAUL (Plumber) Dr. and Mrs. BYNUM, Dr. SMITH (makes <u>Bullons</u>, and an<u>teceptis</u>) MRS. NAN FRANCES, a MRS. HERRINGTON and MRS. LEE MYRICK and another MRS. MYRICK. Understand quite a few other were there but did not know them. The MR. FARMER you was asking about who belongs to Church lost a leg, he is a logger. Also a MR. FISHER from LamarCounty works for Gulf Ref. Co.

"They are taking the members in the Church (KKK) now five at a time and if their names leak out they are dropped so they want know anymore of the members until they have been tested other_wise they are really trying to find leak.

"BLACKLIST"

On 5/2/65, a mimeographed sheet entitled "Blacklist" was distributed throughout the Meridian area. This list contained the following information - Attention white citizens of Meridian and Lauderdale County - Listed below are a few people and businesses who are traders and parasites, who would sell their souls for 30 pieces of silver - integration. After this paragraph was listed the names of 33 businessmen, police officials, and businesses. It has been rumored that LEE ROBERTS, DEXTER TORRANCE had something to do with this list and that B. L. AKIN and JIMMY SMITH probably distributed the list. On 5/3/65, AKIN was overheard to say that he and SMITH had numbers of paper to deliver. The following morning a number of blacklists were located on the lawns of various individuals.

On 5/26/65, B.L. AKIN advised that he had been summoned to the Meridian Police Department and questioned about the blacklist. He stated that he denied any knowledge of this list and that he told Police Chief GUNN that B. C. LIDE could probably furnish him some information regarding this list. LIDE is supposed to tell GUNN that he thinks City Councilman HOPPER THOMAS and CURTIS SAXTON, THOMAS' employee, and both known integrationists, to have had something to do with this list. It should be noted that the list contained the name of HOPPER THOMAS, as well as Mayor-elect AL KEY.

It has been ascertained that the list was designed to hurt the chances of AL KEY being elected Mayor of Meridian. It was noted that this apparently did not work, since most of the Negroes in the Meridian area indicated they voted for AL KEY against Mayor BURNS.

On 5/26/65, JIMMY SMITH, Private Detective, advised that he had been called to the Meridian Police Department and was questioned any knowledge he might have regarding the blacklist. SMITH stated that he told police authorities that he felt the list was published by HOPPER THOMAS and CURTIS SAXTON, and was a move designed to assist THOMAS in re-election as city councilman. SMITH added that THOMAS had been on television and said that the klan was out to get him. B, L. AKIN

Recently, B. L. AKIN attempted to get enough

individuals interested in traveling to Jackson to attend a Citizens Council Rally. AKIN was unable to do so; however, he drove his own automobile and he was accompanied by B. C. LIDE, HERBERT BREWER, and J. B. COLLIER.

On or about 5/25/65, B. L. AKIN related that the klan was expecting some guns from Selma, Alabama.

On 5/26/65, Constable HARRY HUGHES related that he had recently been traveling with Detective MIKE NICHOLS and had learned that DEXTER TORRANCE has been made head of the "goon squad" for the klan. HUGHES stated that TORRANCE is reported to have a load of guns in the trunk of his automobile, and that the police are watching TORRANCE very closely. HUGHES stated that TORRANCE should be warned that the police may "knock him off." This information was furnished B. L. AKIN, who stated that the klan had recently got in a load of "stuff" and that TORRANCE should be notified. It was decided that WAYNE ROBERTS should be told of this in order that he might contact TORRANCE. It was ascertained. that ROBERTS was drunk and unable to handle this assignment, so ED FRASIER was contacted and FRASIER indicated he would locate TORRANCE and advise him of the police's intentions.

FRANK HERNDON

On 5/25/65, FRANK HERNDON was in town and related that some of the "boys" from Selma were reported to have been in town on that date. HERNDON did not furnish any further information regarding this matter. HERNDON is presently operating a "beer joint" near Pascagoula, Mississippi.

JIMMY SMITH

JIMMY SMITH, Private Detective who is reported to be retained by B. L. AKIN, related recently that he had been questioned by the Meridian Police Department regarding the blacklist. He stated that since that time, the police have been "harassing" him and checking him very closely. SMITH stated that he is having to be very careful about his activities in view of the heat being placed on him by the police department.

On 6/1/65, SMITH related that he has been receiving calls during the night threatening his life as well as that of B. C. LIDE. He stated that the persons calling stated that if he did not "lay off" of LEE ROBERTS, he would be shot. SMITH stated that he has not been furnishing any

information regarding LEE ROBERTS and does not understand these threats. SMITH stated that recently he was interviewed by Detective MIKE NICHOLS and HARRY HUGHES and questioned about a plot to kill Sergeant C. WALLACE MILLER. SMITH related that denied any plot to kill MILLER, but stated that he will testify in court that C. WALLACE MILLER tried to get FRANK HERNDON to kill him.



Recently BILLY ASHLEY and JAMES TEASTER both have decided to leave the WKKKKOM as they did not like being contacted by the FBI and they were amazed to learn that the FBI knew they were members of the WKKKKOM. TEASTER is concerned over loosing his job as a result of his membership in the WKKKKOM.

BILLY BOUTWELL

BILLY BOUTWELL has been treasurer of the Wesson klavern for approximately three months. Members of the klan are trying to talk BOUTWELL into hiring a lawyer and sueing the Potter Company for firing him due to his klan activity.

THOMAS EARL HENNINGTON

THOMAS EARL HENNINGTON has been very upset recently and is aware that the FBI knows he is amember of the klan. He was formerly active in klan activities and undoubtedly is worried about his past activities. It is believed by members of the klan that the FBI had a list of all of the klan members in Wesson prior to their interviewing any members. The klan suspects JAMES "PRE WEE" WILLIAMS as being one of the persons who talked to the FBI.

On 5-27-65, informant advised that on 5-21-65 he went to Brookhaven, Mississippi, and met with GARLAND WHITE, J. M. FOSTER and Dr. HENNINGTON. These individuals agreed to come over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA.

On 5-22-65, informant went to Crystal Springs, Mississippi, and visited with JULIUS HARPER.

Following this visit he then went ot Natchez where he talked to JACK SEALE and "allowed" SEALE to talk him into swinging over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA.

On 5-23-65, LOUIS DI SALVO came from the Mississippi Gulf Coast to the home of the informant and spent the night. On the afternoon of 5-23-65 CLYDE SEALE, BILLY BUCKLES, L. C. MURRAY, JACK SEALE, the Exalted Cyclops of the #1 Unit, Lincoln County, and the E. C. of Dr. HENNINGTON's unit all came to the house of the There was a discussion regarding members changing over informant. from the WKKKKOM to the UKA. CLYDE SEALE and BILLY BUCKLES wanted to stay in the WKKKKOM and vote SAM BOWERS out as the Imperial Wizard. CLYDE SEALE and BUCKLES could not say who would be selected to take BOWERS' place. The informant ruled out HARPER as a replacement for BOWERS in view of the fact JULIUS HARPER is a sick man. Informant advised that on 5-25-65 he met with the Cobb Unit of Lincoln County with EDDIE MC DANIEL and that in two weeks this unit is to advise him whether or not they wish to be sworn into the UKA and obtain their charter. agreed to come over into the UKA and bring his unit with him which is in the Lloyd Star-Caseyville area of Franklin County.

On the same date, informant visited with J. M. FOSTER who is not the Exalted Cyclops but controls the # 1 Unit of Lincoln County of the WKKKKOM. The unit controlled by FOSTER is to come over to the UKA.

Informant also made available a copy of the Konstitution of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of USA, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (a copy of this is not being furnished to the New Orleans Division in view of the fact that they presently have a copy of this "Konstitution" in their possession).

Informant advised that Mrs. CLYDE SEALE, Bunckley Community, Franklin County, Mississippi, made the statement in the presence of the informant that the WKKKKOM knew the names of the FBI Agents and where they were from before the Agents arrived.

Informant advised that at the meeting ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, reported in attached report that JACK SEALE told the informant that ERNEST PARKER of Natchez had monitored the FBI radio transmissions during the UKA Klonvocation at Natchez on 5/15-16/65. Informant stated he did not know if PARKER monitored the MHSP frequency or the FBI frequency but that SEALE further stated that PARKER was installing new radio equipment in his airplane.

Informant advised that SAM BOWERS at the officers meeting of the WKKKKOM on 5-16-65 at Jackson, Mississippi, made the statement that FBI informants would be called in closed session of the HCUA hearings and that other klansmen would be called in public session.

In the officers meet on 5-16-65 (FNU) DILLARD from Pearl River County, Mississippi, made the statement he was obtaining information from a man who has a daughter in Jackson who has been employed at the FBI office since the Jackson office was opened. The informant got the impression that this daughter is married and lives in Jackson and that her father resides in the Crossroads, Mississippi, area. DILLARD stated this father asked his daughter who sold out the names of the klansmen in the Crossroads area and they mentioned a suspect to which the daughter replied that they should look further down the road.

Informant stated that it appears those at the officers meet suspect (FNU) VARNADO. of Picayune, Mississippi, as being an FBI informant. According to DILLARD the klan is laying a trap for VARNADO. The informant expressed the opinion that DILLARD may be

an informant of the FBI and that the is attempting to divert attention from himself. Informant stated that he personally does not feel there is any truth in the story about the FBI employee divulging information to the klan but he feels that since this story has been repeated several times in his presence that it is possible if the klan persists in repeating the story that some "hot headed" klansman may kill VARNADO because he believes him to be an informant of the FBI. Informant stated that following the state officers meet he personally went to C. J. SEALE and LOUIS DI SALVO and told them to tell VARNADO about the fact he was suspected of being an FBI informant and for VARNADO to keep a gun handy. Informant stated that in his conversation with C. J. SEALE and LOUIS DI SALVO he did not feel that either of these individuals suspected VARNADO of being an informant.

Information contained in the enclosed report, if used in a report being prepared for dissemination, should be suitably paraphrased in order to adequately protect the identity of the informant.

New Orleans, Louisiana 5-18-65

Informant advised that on 5-17-65 in conversation with C. J. SEALE and LOUIS DI SALVO he determined that C. J. SEALE will bring into the UKA, Inc., the units of the WKKKKOM in Crossroads, Picayune and Derby. DI SALVO promised him that he would bring into the UKA the WKKKKOM units in the Bay St. Louis area.

Informant advised on 5-14-65 he went to Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, and set up a meet with LOUIS DI SALVO for Monday night, 5-17-65. Following this he went to the Crossroads area and met with C. J. SEALE to set up a meet for Monday night, 5-17-65. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss having the WKKKKOM join the UKA.

On 5-15-65, informant went to Jackson, Mississippi, to see (FNU) FORTENBERRY whom he was unable to locate. Informant did visit with BILL SULLIVAN in Jackson and was told that all of the Jackson units of the WKKKKOM with the exception of one or two had gone over to the UKA.

Following his meeting with SULLIVAN informant went to Magee, Mississippi, and visited with W. R. MANGUM. MANGUM made the statement that the Mount Olive-Magnolia Unit has the tightest group with no leaks. He based this statement on the fact that only nine klansmen in this unit had been interviewed by FBI Agents. Informant stated he asked MANGUM if there had been any incidents or trouble in this area to which MANGUM replied there had not been any trouble. Informant then stated he pointed out to MANGUM that prehaps the FBI would have informants in his unit but had only interviewed nine klansmen in order not to divulge the fact that they were fully acquainted with the klansmen in his unit.

Informant cetated he inquired of MANGUM if MANGUM was going to help the informant with the idea of forming a political party and disbanding the klan. MANGUM stated he would go along with this idea if it did not interfere with the WKKKKOM. Informant stated he then advised MANGUM that the WKKKKOM had done absolutely nothing but had taken an oath to uphold the Constitution of the U.S. in an honorable way. Instead of doing this the WKKKKOM had played into

Ξ,

the hands of the Negro by causing incidents and creating strife.

Informant advised that on Sunday, 5-16-65, there was a meeting of the state officers of the WKKKKOM in the American Insurance Company offices located in the Magnolia Towers building, Jackson, Mississippi. Informant stated that he went to this meeting with CLYDE SEALE of the Bunckley Community, Franklin County, Mississippi; that JULIUS HARPER of Crystal Springs was picked up en route to Jackson. Present at the meeting was SAM BOWERS and BOWERS made a talk about dissension in the members of the WKKKKOM and about the impending investigation by HCUA. Informant stated he replied to BOWERS regarding the dissension that this was caused by the officers of the WKKKKOM calling "booger" all the time. Informant pointed out that everyone in the WKKKKOM is "running:scared" and that this caused distrust and dissension among the members.

JULIUS HARPER made a short talk which dealt with getting informants of the FBI out of the klan.

ERNEST S. GILBERT gave a talk regarding the idea that the klan should be dissolved and a large political organization formed throughout the South with a very small per cent of klansmen as members of this organization.

The discussion at this meeting then turned toward the HCUA hearings and it was decided that the WKKKKOM would have Attorney HUGH BAILEY and some other Jackson Attorney present with each klansman when he appears before the HCUA and that the klansman and the attorneys would attempt to embarrass and make fools out of the HCUA.

Informant advised that it was then brought out that the WKKKKOM will again put out the jugs formerly used by the White Christian Protective and Legal Defense Fund (WCP&LDF) with new labels on the jugs asking for help. It was brought out that the hearings by the HCUA should be used by the klan for propaganda purposes in that the klan can use the approach that the klan is being persecuted by the Federal government which is unable to prove anything against the klan. There was a discussion regarding having stencils made to attach KKK on bridge abutments, highway signs, and similar such places.

Informant advised that at the meeting JULIUS HARPER made the comment that A. C. ANDREWS, who manages a plant at Wesson, Mississippi, had been visited by two FBI Agents who made ANDREWS fire an employee. HARPER stated he wanted to institute a suit against the FBI charging ANDREWS and the FBI with violation of the civil rights of the employee who was fired.

Informant advised that on Sunday night, 5-23-65, there was to be a meeting at Brookhaven, Mississippi, at which time CLYDE SEALE, BILLY BUCKLES and other leaders of the WKKKKOM were to discuss moving from the WKKKKOM to the UKA.

Informant advised that at the officers meeting in Jackson on 5-16-65, that (FNU) DILLARD from Pearl River County was appointed "co-ordinator" by SAM BOWERS upon the request of (FNU) PURSER who is from the Mississippi Gulf Coast area. DILLARD then made the statement that the klan had fooled C. J. SEALE as the last state meeting was held on DILLARD's property in the Crossroads area and they had "cut out" C. J. SEALE. Informant advised that at this point ERNEST S. GILBERT gave DILLARD hell as a "Johnny come lately" who was now saying what was good for the klan and what was not good for the klan. GILBERT then jumped on BOWERS for breaking up the Poplarville units by saying he had goon squads who would "eliminate" any klansman who got out of line.

Informant advised that SAM BOWERS is now trying to get his trusted men into position in the WKKKKOM to control the organization. He stated BOWERS appoints all Titans and Co-ordinators which are officers made up by BOWERS and have no connection with the klan in insofar as the Constitution is concerned.

On 5/8/65, source advised that MARVIN WOD had been to Hattiesburg, Mississippi, one night during the weekend 5/8/65 to attend a Karate instruction class and had attempted to contact HAMILTON by telephone, without success. Subsequent to this, WORD told FATHO OVERBY that he doubted that HAMILTON would talk to him even if he was successful in contacting HAMILTON. OVERBY also furnished HAMILTON's name and address as being M. W. HAMILTON, 711 South Main, Petal, Miss, wrote the initials A.O.G. on a slip of paper and told WORD to show that to HAMILTON and tell him OVERBY sent him and HAMILTON would know WORD was okay.

On 5/13/65, source furnished the following information: GATHO OVERBY was at some sort of meeting recently at which he was asked by some individual, whose identity is unknown to the source, if he had a gun. GATHO said yes, a .32 cal. pistol. This individual asked him if it was registered and OVERBY said no. This individual then told OVERBY his gun was no good and for him to take the one the individual then handed OVERBY. OVERBY also said he heard HAMILTON tell another individual that he (HAMILTON) had access to plastic explosives through his surplus store.

On 5/18/65, source advised as follows: GATHO OVERBY saw HAMILTON at the coliseum in Jackson on Monday evening at the White Monday meeting. At that time OVERBY approached HAMILTON about having MARVIN WORD give Karate instructions to a group in Hattiesburg. HAMILTON told OVERBY he did not want to have anything to do with anyone not known to HAMILTON personally.

Individual klan members of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) and officers of this organization in the Adams County, Mississippi area, have no knowledge of any plan on the part of the OKKKK to combine all klan groups into one organization.

"TINY" LEWIS

"TINY" LEWIS, a person with whom the informant is well acquainted, is believed to have been a member of the United States Navy during World War Two. He was probably born in Hinds County, Mississippi, and was most probably educated at Terry, Miss. LEWIS is no longer a Province Giant in the WKKKKOM.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. (UKA), WALTHALL COUNTY, MISS.

The informant has no knowledge relating to activities or units of the UKA, Inc., in Walthall County.

BURNING OF COFO BUILDINGS, INDIANOLA, MISS.

The informant has no knowledge of the person or persons responsible for the burning of several buildings used by the COFO at Indianola, Miss., in the recent past.

WKKKKOM, WILKINSON COUNTY, MISS.

It is not believed that meetings of the unit of the WKKKKOM in Wilkinson County, Miss., are being held at the present time on any regular basis.

ACTIVITIES OF INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS OF THE WKKKKOM AND UKA, INC., ADAMS COUNTY, MISS.

JIMMY D. MITCHELL is not engaging in sufficient klan activity to make himself known to officers of the WKKKKOM in the Adams County area at the present time.

MARION LEE HOUSE is strongly interested in the erection of billboards depicting civil rights leader MARTIN LUTHER KING at a communist training school, HOUSE has assisted in erecting several of these signs.

JOHN BOSTICK has greatly decreased his activities in the WKKKKOM in recent weeks due to an increased workload. The increased workload came about as a result of a fire at the 'Natchez Democrat' newspaper building where he is employed and he now has to drive on a daily basis to Vicksburg or McComb, Miss. BOSTICK has in his possession sufficient money for the purchase of several walkie-talkie type radios for the WKKKKOM. and the second of the

ROBERT LEE TEMPLETON is not known to be a member of the WKKKKOM or the UKA, Inc. He is not known to the informant.

JOHN NOSSER, Mayor of Natchez, Miss, who is not known to be a member of any klan type organization, but who sometimes appears outwardly sympathetic to klan organizations, is presently suffering in business from an unofficial boycott on the part of many Negro citizens in Adams County, Miss. NOSSER owns or has interest in three large supermarkets in Natchez, Miss.

FNU BRASWELL is not known to be engaging in klan activity at the present time

PERCY NETTLES is believed to be a membership recruiter for the UKA, Inc., in the Adams County, Miss., area.

BILLY L. WOODS is presently taking flying lessons at the Natchez Adams County Airport and he has purchased a one-fourth interest in a light airplane. WOODS has expressed the desire to be a crop-dusting pilot.

GEORGE NOSSER, the son of Natchez Mayor JOHN NOSSER. is very worried about his business situation due to the Negro boycodt and is presently trying desperately to induce the white residents of the Natchez community to trade with him.

ERNEST AVANTS, a member of the WKKKKOM in Adams County, Miss., is believed by many of his associates to be losing his mind. He traveled to a fish camp south of Vidalia, La., on Sunday, 5/16/65, and had his wife and 7 year-old son with him. AVANTS had strapped a .22 caliber pistol in a holster on his 7 year-old son's hip and was teaching him to shoot at logs floating in the Mississippi River. AVANTS was extremely drunk and was asked by other members of the fishing camp to leave the area or take the .22 pistol away from the small boy.

C. L. WHEELER, frequently takes 2 yellow capsules which are slightly shorter than the commercial type of "Contac" capsule. About 15 minutes after taking these capsules, WHEELER has all the appearance of being intoxicated.

On 5-27-65, informant advised that on 5-21-65 he went to Brookhaven, Mississippi, and met with GARLAND WHITE, J. M. FOSTER and Dr. HENNINGTON. These individuals agreed to come over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA.

On 5-22-65, informant went to Crystal Springs, Mississippi, and visited with JULIUS HARPER.

Following this visit he then went ot Natchez where he talked to JACK SEALE and "allowed" SEALE to talk him into swinging over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA.

On 5-23-65, LOUIS DI SALVO came from the Mississippi Gulf Coast to the home of the informant and spent the night. On the afternoon of 5-23-65 CLYDE SEALE, BILLY BUCKLES, L. C. MURRAY, JACK SEALE, the Exalted Cyclops of the #1 Unit, Lincoln County, and the E. C. of Dr. HENNINGTON's unit all came to the house of the informant. There was a discussion regarding members changing over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA. CLYDE SEALE and BILLY BUCKLES wanted to stay in the WKKKKOM and vote SAM BOWERS out as the Imperial Wizard, CLYDE SEALE and BUCKLES could not say who would be selected to take BOWERS' place. The informant ruled out HARPER as a replacement for BOWERS in view of the fact JULIUS HARPER is a sick man. BUCKLES said he would take the position of Imperial Wizard but that he was not old enough according to the Constitution. The informant then pointed out that it would be impossible to get SAM BOWERS out as Imperial Wizard. BUCKLES and CLYDE SEALE then hinted at a crooked election. Informant advised them that SAM BOWERS could see through a crooked election and stopped this immediately.

MC DANIEL advised the informant that the informant could not mention violence at any meeting and pointed out that this would be difficult for the informant in view of his past reputation.

Informant advised that EDDIE MC DANIEL told him that ROBERT SHELTON, the Imperial Wizard, has advised that no klansmen of the UKA is to take the fifth amendment when he is called before any Congressional hearings such as the HCUA. Informant advised that he expects to visit with ROBERT SHELTON to straighten out this matter of the fifth amendment as the informant feels he is still in the position of having to take the fifth amendment in connection with the WKKKKOM.


Informant advised that on 5-25-65 he met with the Cobb Unit of Lincoln County with EDDIE MC DANIEL and that in two weeks this unit is to advise him whether or not they wish to be sworn into the UKA and obtain their charter. on 5 26-65; informant visited with CHARLES FALVEY who agreed to come over into the UKA and bring his unit with him which is in the Lloyd Star-Caseyville area of Franklin County.

On the same date, informant visited with J. M. FOSTER who is not the Exalted Cyclops but controls the # 1 Unit of Lincoln County of the WKKKKOM. The unit controlled by FOSTER is to come over to the UKA.

On 5-27-65, informant met with former governor ROSS BARNETT in the office of BARNETT in Jackson, Mississippi. Informant advised BARNETT that he represented a large group in Mississippi which was affiliated with a large group in the Southern states. Informant advised BARNETT that he needed advise politically and the help of someone who could command respect among the people of Mississippi. THE FOREGOING INFORMATION SHOULD NOT BE DISSEMINATED, AS THE INFORMANT HAS STATED THAT THE FOREGOING TWO ITEMS RE THE DELAYED PILLS AND THE RATTLE SNAKES COULD QUITE POSSIBLY BE "BAIT" INFORMATION BEING PUT OUT BY JACK SEALE TO TEST THE INFORMANT.

Informant advised that JACK SEALE appears to be very friendly with the informant and also the individual whom the informant "allowed to talk him" into joining the UKA. Informant stated that he does not feel that JACK SEALE suspects him; however, the informant stated he would continue to be very apprehensive concerning any of his dealings with the SEALEs.

Informant identified photo ofFOIA(b)(7) - (D)FOIA(b)(7) - (D)as an inner guard at a meeting in Bogalusa,Louisiana approximately a week ago when the informant,JULIUS HARPER, BILLY BUCKLES, DR. HENNINGTON, CLYDE SEALE,CHARLES FALVEY AND J. M. FOSTER, all from Mississippi, wentto Bogalusa at the request of the Bogalusa group to explainthe WKKKKOM constitution and its functions. Informantstated he recalled FOIA(b)(7) - (D)was wearing a .45 caliber automatic pistol onthe outside of his robe.

The above-mentioned meeting was held approximately eight miles west southwest of Bogalusa, La., in a "shotgun" building with a small room in front, and behind this, a long and larger room.

SAXON FARMER was in charge of the meeting and FARMER was attempting to pull his group out of the OKKKK of Louisiana.

Informant advised that approximately three months ago, SAXON FARMER and 11 other individuals came to the informant's house for further advice regarding organizing a new klan group in the 6th Congressional District of La.

Informant advised that within the next few days, he is to contact klansmen in the Crossroads, Derby, and Picayune areas at which time he may obtain information regarding the murder of the Deputy Sheriff in Bogalusa, La.

Informant advised that within the next few days he will visit C. J. SEALE, who resides in the Crossroads, Mississippi area, at which time SEALE is to bring into the United Klans of America (UKA) the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) units at Derby, Crossroads, and two Picayune units.

Informant advised that on 5/28/65, he went to Prentiss, Miss., and visited with FELTER POLK, who is the individual who swore Preacher BROWN and Preacher BILBO into the WKKKKOM. Informant stated that BROWN now resides at Brookhaven, Mississippi.

FELTER POLK stated he had gone to north Mississippi to see GORDON LACKEY at the specific request of SAM BOWERS and LACKEY told POLK how to build a furnace which is fired by butane gas. This furnace would be used to cremate Negroes or anyone else the klan wished to eliminate. POLK came back to Prentiss and built one of more of these furnaces. POLK stated that BOWERS had promised him that the state treasurer of the WKKKKOM would pay for the building of these furnaces, but that POLK had at no time received any remuneration for these furnaces which he still had in his possession. POLK did not discuss the location of these furnaces.

Informant stated that he went to Columbia, Miss., and met LOUIS ANTHONY DI SALVO. Together, they went to a klan meet at Cocomo, which was held in a field with no shelter. It rained during this meeting. This was a meeting of a Columbia unit. Present were two visiting klansmen from Walthal County who advised the informant that the Walthall Unit had broken up and formed a unit of their own. These two individuals, whose identity is not known to the informant, asked for a poster of MARTIN LUTHER KING at the Highlander Folk School, Monteage, Tennessee. Informant agreed to furnish these individuals with a poster. These same two individuals then asked the informant if their Walthall Unit could come into the UKA and keep it a secret. The informant advised them that this could be arranged, and that he would use fictitious names for their dues.

Informant advised that an individual by the name of FORTENBERRY, who said he was from Columbia, Miss., and is described as being young, 6 feet tall, slender build, crew-cut, and wearing a .45 caliber automatic pistol in a holster on his stomach, advised the informant that he was either joining the UKA or he was going to Bogalusa and join the group there.

Informant advised that on 5/29/65, he went to Natchez, Miss., and saw EDDIE MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon, Realm of Mississippi, UKA, who said he had been up for two days and nights keeping the "niggers" out of Duncan Park. MC DANIEL advised the informant that the demonstration by the klansmen in the park put pressure on the Chief of Police in Natchez to do something. MC DANIEL made the statement that the "klansmen would be back at the park each and every time the Negroes attempted to integrate the park."

Informant stated that while he was conversing with MC DANIEL, that BILL SULLIVAN called from Jackson and advised them that two klansmen were in jail at Brandon, for pointing a gun at a Negro. Informant stated that this "shook" MC DANIEL and that after he settled down, the informant agreed to go to Brandon and attempt." to get the two klansmen out of jail.

Informant stated he proceeded to Brandon where he met BILL SULLIVAN. Informant stated from inquiry and conversation in Brandon, he determined that the Chief of Police of Brandon and the son of the Chief of Police are both members of the WKKKKOM. The Chief of Police then took them to a grocery store and explained before entering that the owner of the grocery is a member of the WKKKKOM and would be a good man for the informant to know. Informant stated that he recalled the owner of the store to be named OVERBY, and that OVERBY apparently recognized him as the KBI Agent for the WKKKKOM.

OVERBY advised the informant to get the bonds

at the Sheriff's Office and he would sign them and "they had better let them out." Informant stated he obtained the bond from the Deputy Sheriff, as the Sheriff could not be located. After the bonds were signed, the Deputy Sheriff did contact the Sheriff by radio, at which time the Sheriff stated if the bonds were not "right" and the men were released, that it was possible that a Federal Marshal might pick up these two individuals and take them to a Federal institution. It was decided to leave the two men in jail until Sunday morning to insure that there was no difficulty in connection with the bonds.

Informant stated that he then visited with the two men in jail and advised them as to why they were not being released Saturday night and that they would be released the following morning. Informant stated he pointed out to these individuals that the march of the Negroes had not been successful but that by pointing a gun at one of the Negroes, the klansmen had actually made the march a success, as this gave the Negroes widespread publicity.

Informant advised that he and BILL SULLIVAN would, on 6/10/65, go to Smith County to swear in 100 or more klansmen into the UKA. These klansmen are from the Raleigh, Taylorsville, Bay Springs, Silvenia, and Mize area.

Informant advised that on 5/30/65, CLYDE SEALE, his wife; DON SEALE and his wife; DI SALVO and his wife, went to Whitworth College, Brookhaven, Miss., to hear ex-governor ROSS BARNETT make a speech.

Informant advised that on 5/31/65, he went to Natchez and picked up literature and wrote a press release for E. L. MC DANIEL. He then returned to Brookhaven, where he swore in J. M. FOSTER and T. E. SMITH. These individuals promised that they would take into the UKA "the cream of the crop" in the Brookhaven area and that there would be no "hot-heads." Informant was asked if this was meant to include CHARLES FALVEY, whom he has previously described as a "mean and tough" individual whom the Agents should handle

with caution, to which informant replied that FALVEY was to be sworn into the UKA because the informant felt as other klansmen in the Brookhaven area felt, that FALVEY could be controlled by the klansmen and that it was much better to have him in the klan where he could be watched than to antagonize him and have him against the klan.

Informant advised that on June 1, 1965, EDDIE MC DANIEL and himself met with Dr. HENNINGTON's group which is the Laurel and West Lincoln group, to discuss swinging this group over from the WKKKKOM to the UKA. Informant stated that this group "talked favorably" and that they would advise him within two weeks whether or not they would make such a move.

Informant advised that DR. HENNINGTON had made the comment on this occasion that he had recently been visited by 2 FBI Agents and that they were "real nice to him for a change."

Informant stated that the meeting of Dr. HENNINGTON's group mentioned above was held on the property of "Three Finger" HOMER SMITH, but that this has no particular significance as to locating the place, since SMITH owns several farms in the Brookhaven area.

Informant advised that on 6/2/65, SHELBY BREWER was summoned as a kleagle.

Informant advised that Professor (FNU) EVERETTE of Whitworth College, Brookhaven, Miss., is to be sworn into the UKA and EVERETTE is asking the klan to help him secure finances to set up a high school which would be a private school in conjunction with the College of Whitworth. SAC, JACKSON

Above informant when contacted on 6/17/65, furnished the following information when questioned as to why it was so difficult to contact him, and why he would not go to a pay telephone to call the writer or SA HARRELL:

Approximately four to five months ago, CHARLIE STRINGER, a radio announcer from Mc Comb, Miss., spoke to his Klan Unit in the Salem, Miss., area as he had done on other occasions in the past. On this occasion STRINGER commented at length regarding the number of members of various Klans throughout the State of Miss., who worked for the telephone companies, the number of daughters, wives, sisters, girl friends, of these and other Klan members who worked for the telephone companies, and how the Klan could check any telephone call to any individual in the state at any time of the day.

STRINGER advised the members of his Unit that the Klan could check any telephone they wanted to, it did not matter what part of the state or what position the individual may hold whose phone calls they wanted monitored they could have it done with one phone call the the right party.

On June 28, 1965, a confidential source of information, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished a copy of the following letter to a Special Agent of the FBI:

> "White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan Realm Headquarters Realm of Mississippi

"To all Klaverns:

"Plans for a top secret action on state-wide scale enclosed below:

"Select the best group of men in your unit and begin immediately to prepare for a state-wide cross burning July 1, 1965 at 9:30 p.m. sharp. Use a standard 5 feet high by 3 feet wide cross. Properly wrap with sacks or cloth and soak in a half and half mixture of gasoline and diesel fuel for at least 18 hours. Burn these crosses in public places. This is a SYMBOLIC CROSS BURNING. Each unit will burn two crosses only. No person is to make any call to a radio, newspaper or TV station. This will be done by the proper officers in the Klan. All men involved will keep this project as secret as possible. Highway intersections, court house lawns and such places are ideal. Pick a place with safety first in mind. Then pick a place that the most people will see the crosses. Throughout this entire operation all Klansmen are urged to use the utmost amount of caution. 63 - 1/03



WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI RACIAL MATTERS (KLAN)

On June 28, 1965, a confidential source of information, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, that a state meeting of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) was held on June 27, 1965. This meeting was held in Carroll County, Mississippi, approximately seven miles east of Greenwood, Mississippi. A total of 86 men attended the meeting. Thirty-three units of the WKKKKOM were represented. The meeting was held in the front yard of a private home belonging to an unidentified white man.

The meeting opened at 10:00 a.m. with a prayer. Thereafter, J. K. Greer was elected moderator and served in that capacity throughout the meeting. W. R. Mangum acted as chaplain.

State officers, including Billy Buckles and Sam Bowers, spoke at length regarding the attempts of the United Klans of America, Inc., to gain a foothold in the State of Mississippi. Instructions were issued that no members of the WKKKKOM were to associate with members of the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA). Billy Buckles compared the association of the WKKKKOM and the UKA to that of the United States and Russia during World War II in that they were engaged in a common cause but did not trust one another.

called to testify at the hearings and in this way the Federal Bureau of Investigation informers would be pointed out.

Sam Bowers observed a Dodge automobile with four white men riding in it pass by the meeting place and he stated that these individuals were probably law enforcement officers.

After a lunch period, the meeting resumed and several resolutions were passed. One of these resolutions was "a resolution requiring all Knights of the WKKKKM to get in or out." One paragraph of this resolution is as follows:

"That commencing on the first day of August, 1965, and continuing thereafter no officer or member of the WKKKKM may contact, discuss or negotiate any Klan business, nor enter into any Klan inspired relationship, nor represent himself, nor acknowledge himself to be a Klansman, with any officer or member of the UKA in the Realm of Mississippi, upon pain of banishment from the WKKKKM except, only that licensed Kleagle of the WKKKKM may attempt to recruit United members into the WKKKKM with the direct knowledge and special permission of the Imperial Wizard of the WKKKKM in each case."

The confidential source stated that Bowers made it quite clear that the WKKKKOM and UKA were to have no further contacts with regard to any Klan business.

An election of officers was held for the purpose of electing a new Klan investigator. An individual named (first name unknown) Nix, who operates John's Restaurant, Laurel, Mississippi, was elected the new Klan investigator.

The assembled members voted to appropriate \$300 per month toward publication of the "Southern Review" newspaper. Final action on this matter depends on the action of the Klan Bursars.

A financial accounting was presented to the members and votes were taken on the various bills outstanding.

It was decided that if at least \$300 is available in the treasury of the WKKKKOM that at least \$300 and no more than \$500 is to be sent to the white man being held in Bogelusa, Louisiana, for the murder of a Negro deputy. This money is to be used for legal defense.

MEETING OF MEMBERS OF SOUTH JACKSON KLAVERN

A meeting was held the evening of 6-2-65 in a wooded area at the South end of Siwell Road. To get there you go South onSiwell Road from Raymond Road and take the right fork near the end of Siwell and proceed approximately one-fourth mile into a wooded area.

There were 25 individuals in hoods and robes and about seven to ten guards around the meeting area. The only recognizable guard was a heavy set individual who lives in Choctaw Village and is employed at Zinsco Electrical Products Company in Jackson. The meeting commenced at 8:15 p.m. and lasted about an hour and a half.

There were 11 new members sworn in and the initiation ceremony was conducted by BURRIS DUNN. The only recognizable members were:

H.H. HEREDEEN JOHN MC CREGOR CHARLES C. WILSON KEN HENSARLING MARSHALL SANFORD PLUMMER SANFORD.

The purpose of the meeting was to swear in the new members and announce that the next regularly scheduled meeting was to be held on 6-15-65 for the election of officers.

The swearing in ceremony was very formal, the meeting was brief and the members did not stand around talking after the meeting as had been customary in the past.

At the next meeting in addition to the elections, plans of reorganization will be discussed. It is not contemplated that robes will be worn at this meeting. The proposed election of officers will include the Jackson area and possibly maybe countywide.

MISCELLANEOUS

EARL COMFORT, a friend of MEREDITH W. TATUM, is a member of the North Jackson Unit.

The present manager of Mid-State Glass Company, 614 South West Street was the Exalted Cyclops of the North Jackson Unit up to a few months ago and is believed to be serving in that capacity now although the unit does not appear to have been too active recently. All the male employees in this company are members of the North Jackson Klavern and meetings have been held at 614 South West Street in the past. It is believed that there are four or five employees in this firm.

advised that he had heard an unrecalled member of the Wesson Unit during the summer of 1964 make the statement that THOMAS EARL HENNINGTON had been elected "spokesman" for the group" that gave CURTIS DAVIS the beating during the summer of 1964. Regarding the shooting into the

home of CURTIS DAVIS, the informant stated that QUINN RUTIAND was the Exalted Cyclops when this happened, and that during the evening meeting following this shooting, RUTIAND questioned individually every member present in an effort to determine who shot into the house. He stated RUTIAND and JAMES ASHLEY (position unknown) were both extremely unhappy about the shooting into DAVIS' house, stating that innocent members of his family or visitors to his home could be killed, and further stating that no such action would be knowingly condoned by the leadership of the Wesson Unit.

The informant advised that he has heard through associates of his in the Hazlehurst area that that unit continues to meet on a weekly basis in wooded areas or in the vicinity of the local "auction barn." He stated that he has mentioned to one or two members of that unit the possibly necessity of his transferring his membership from the Wesson Unit to the Hazlehurst Unit, in view of the fact that he is building a home in Hazlehurst, will move there shortly, and is employed in Hazlehurst. The informant advised that he is reasonably certain he can arrange such transfer when and if requested to do so by the FBI.

C. DOLLAHITE. Informant advised he heard that AVON HOLLIMAN did not actually leave the coast as previously indicated, but still operates his small store north of Gulfport, Miss.

Informant advised that W. C. DOLLAHITE related recently that VINCENT PURSER continues to make periodic trips to attend klan meetings at Pascagoula, Miss., and information believed that MARVIN LACY may occasionally accompany PURSER on these trips. Informant advised that DOLLAHITE: furnished information concerning PURSER in a derogatory tone, again indicating to informant that DOLLAHITE is disgusted with the klan and is not actually particularly active at the present time.

Informant had no information whatsoever to indicate that there is any activity in the Mississippi Gulf Coast area on the part of the United Klans of America, (UKA), or the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK), adding that he has no reason to believe that any klansmen from the Mississippi Gulf Coast have participated or intend to participate in any racial violence in the Bogalusa, Louisiana area.

During the last week in January, 1964 and the first three weeks in February, 1964, three organizational meetings of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) were held at HAROLD HUSBANDS' place which is two miles west of Raleigh, Mississippi, on Highway 18. JACK YATES, a klansman from Crystal Springs, Miss., along with "RED" FORTENBERRY, a klansman from Jackson, Miss., who is employed with the Jackson City Water Department, accompanied by several unidentified klansmen, came to the meetings to organize a klan group in Raleigh, Miss.

I attended all three meetings and at one of the meetings I was sworn in by "SLIM" VINSON, who was the Exalted Cyclops. My number was FOIA(b)(7) - (D)

The following persons whom I know were in attendance at the organizational meetings:

ELTON CRAFT MILTON BARRETT W. O. GARNER CHALRES HOLDER BERT MC DANIELS SLATER ROBINSON DALLAS LITTLE VOYD "SPEEDY" WALTERS ROYCE WELBORN (FNU) WEDGEWORTH, employed by Sumbeam Co., Forrest, Miss. BURFORD YELVERTON TILLMAN MYERS

"SLIM" VINSON is the Exalted Cyclops, MILTON BARRETT is the secretary, and ROYCE WELBORN is the treasurer. I paid \$1.65 in dues to ROYCE WELBORN.

A klan meeting was held in May, 1964, in the Pleasant Hill Gravel Pit, seven miles west of Raleigh, which was a district meeting for Smith, Jasper, counties. (FNU) MAGNUM from Magee, Miss., presided at the meeting. I recall a (FNU) MOON from Pelahatchie, Miss., attended.

Sunday, June 13, 1965, I was at the beach at Beach Park in Pascagoula. B. L. WHITE, RAYMOND TURNER, BEDFORD HARRIS, FRANKIE LARSON and CLARK DEVERS were there awaiting a proposed wade-in to be made by Negroes. We all just stood around. No wade-in took place but several cars of Negroes drove past. One car filled with Negroes stopped but no one got out.

The beach was patrolled by Pascagoula Police car all afternoon and I saw Mississippi Highway Patrol cars in the area. Chief OWEN DAVIS drove by several times accompanied by Detective WINSTEAD.

TOM THRASHER told me that TROY WILKERSON and B. L. WHITE have been interviewed by FBI Agents. WHITE hasn't mentioned this to me or other members as far as I: can tell.

No plans have been made for any meetings in the near future.

June 22, 1965 Pascagoula, Mississippi

Friday night, June 18, 1965 LEE MC INTOSH called me all upset about having been interviewed by FBI Agents. He wanted me to call B. L. WHITE. He suspects that WHITE is talking to the FBI. I called WHITE and asked him what should be done. He said he had turned in his papers as a Klan official and was done with the organization. JOE TURNER has quit his job and left Pascagoula. It appears that the Klavern at Pascagoula is breaking up. Everyone is scared. MC INTOSH believes that if WHITE is not talking then JOE TURNER must be.

TOM THRASHER thinks VINCENT PURSER is informing.

MC INTOSH told me that he learned through his Uncle JUNIOR MC INTOSH at Laurel that the proposal by WHITE to burglarize the National Guard Armory at Columbia is a "set up" to get someone killed. He believes that this set up is being planned by WHITE to eliminate someone.

INFORMATION REGARDING INACTIVE MEMBERS

The two men VIRGIL BECKMAN and CLYDE MORRISON who said they were from Brookhaven have not contacted me since February and I don't believe they have been in contact with anyone here since then. I believe they may have been using false names. I haven't learned anything more about them than I have previously reported. JOHNNY BERGER has left; Pascagoula and I do not know his whereabouts. No one here seems to know what happened to him.

CHARLES HAGAN and PAUL WATSON are no longer members of the Klavern. They were not taken in after it was reorganized with B. L. WHITE as E. C.

The man I knew as MICKEY MC GUIRE has left town. I have heard he is wanted by the Pascagoula Police Department for bad checks as MC MCGUIRE or MICKEY MYERS.

SONNY HODGES who lives on Ken Avenue is not active and I believe he is no longer a member.


J. L. SKINNER quit at Ingalls Shipyard during the strike there two or three months ago and is reportedly working at a shipyard in Louisiana.

DOUG PEREZ and VINCENT PEREZ are brothers. I was told by someone in the Fall of 1964 that they were Klan members, but I can't recall who told me this. I never did see them at any meeting nor did I ver talk to them about being in the Klan.



Under authority granted by President Johnson, committee agents compared Klan officials' tax returns with information from other sources. The resulting disclosures, turned over to the Revenue Service, led to its launching a probe of its own.

Iliustrative of the nature of the committee's evidence is the following:

• One Klan official made a statement to the Veterans Administration that he had no income other than a World War II pension. The House investigators obtained records revealing this klansman was doing a ibriving business selling Kian attire and paraphernalia.

Other significant committee findings due to be stroc at the public hearings are:

A Louisiana Klansturn, at the Instigation of official of the organization, became a licensed gun dealer for the purpose of providing klanstner, with weapens at wholesale prives. Records show he purcha ed some 600 rifles, shotguns and pistols, directly linked to klanster, in four Southern states. Committee agents are on the trailof other reputed instances of gun dealers for this purpose.

A number of Negro shootings in the past two years have been directly linked to klansmen. However, while all of these cases of terror factics by individual Klan elements have been carefully documented, the House investigators have uncovered not ties between them and Klan ofties between them and Klan officials 5 as 30 instance was was 2009 freed perpetrated at the behalf

Most Klan officials are schooldropouts. They average less than a fifth grade education. NEGRO 'KLUXERS'

Rep. Edwin Willis, D-La., chairman, is discussing with other committeemen widening the investigation to include the "Deacons for Defense and Justice."

This is a Negro organization with the avowed purpose of safeguarding members of that race and civil rights workers and demonstrators.

'KBI' TARGETED

A major target of the committee's hearings is Klan units known as "KBI" — Klan Bureau of Investigation. Their, avowed function is to "safeguard the internal security" of the Klan, particularly against infiltration by state and federal agents.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D) contacted on 6/18/65, advised that he was very much opposed to the violence that resulted in the murder of the Negro Deputy Sheriff in Washington Parish, Mississippi; however, he still could not "be a pimp" on his friends and relatives or in other words, he would not at this time furnish the identity of the individuals who were members of the Improve Klavern with him prior to September, 1964. He advised that he would furnish information on any individual of particular interest to the FBI.

When questioned regarding FELDER STOGNER, the informant advised that in late September, 1964 when he was sworn out of the Improve Unit, FELDER STOGNER was a member of a unit of the United Knights of American in Tylertown, Miss. He stated that he has heard nothing of FELDER STOGNER since he withdrew from the klan at Improve in late September.

When advised that it was important that the FBI determine his current activity, if any, in klan-type organizations, the informant advised that he would make a short trip, return in approximately one hour, if the writer could wait that long, and see if he could obtain any information regarding STOGNER's current activity. He was advised that the writer would wait if he thought he could obtain any information during an hour. The informant departed, came back in 55 minutes, and advised as follows:


FELDER STOGMER was a member of a unit in Tylertown, Miss., when the entire Tylertown Klan disbanded in early December, 1964; STOGMER became associated with the Improve Unit of the UKA and immediately after his membership therein each member of the Improve Unit was assessed a small fee for the construction of a Unit meeting hall. He advised that the building was constructed on the property of FELDER STOGNER behind his home and the Improve Unit continues to meetinn this building on either Friday or Saturday night.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D) advised that STOGNER no doubt is a current member of the Improve Unit, but stated that in his opinion he is completely incapable of participating in activity such as the murder of the Washington Parish Deputy Sheriff on 6/2/65.

Regarding ABNER ARD, the informant stated that he was a member of the unit in Tylertown, Miss., at the time it disbanded and transferred his membership to the Improve Unit.

He stated that ABNER ARD lives just above the Lousiana line in Mississippi, where Louisiana Highway 438 comes up to the Mississippi border. He states that where 438 turns left below the Mississippi border, there is a highway sign pointing straight north reading, "Tylertown 9 miles." He stated that straight north of that sign approximately one and seven tenths miles on the left hand side of the road is a white concrete dairy barn, immediately behind which is a white concrete block house with a sun porch above the garage with white railings around it. He stated that there are numerous swings in the front yard and generally a red Vokswagen convertible with white top sitting by the house. He stated that he considers ABNER ARD completely incapable of participating in any violence for the following reason:

FOIA(b)(7) -(D) on 6/17/65, advised that at the 6/11/65 meeting of the Salem Unit, United Klans of America (UKA), he became a member of that organization. He advised that much to his surprise, he was not sworn into the klan by anyone. He stated he was taken to the meeting by BRYANT, LEWIS, a cattleman in the Salem area and a member of the Walthall County Board of Education and after conversing" briefly with an individual unknown to him at this time. he was advised by this individual that the initiation fees were \$10 and that it would cost him an additional \$30 which he assumes to be dues for an unknown length of time. He advised that he hoped to determine why the dues cost him \$30 as of that date, but was unable to question BRYANT LEWIS regarding this matter. He stated that there were two individuals by the name of HOLMES, father and son, not further identified, and approximately 11 other individuals present at this meeting. He stated he did not attend the business meeting, but arrived toward the end of the function and heard no comment regarding. what transpired other than a statement made by an unknown individual as they prepared to depart, to the effect that each member of the unit must "continue to have a witness with him every night for an alibi."

Informant advised that he is not aware of the significance of this statement, but hopes to determine same at the 6/18/65 meeting.

The information advised that he is concerned about the manner in which he became a member of the Salem Unit and is fearful that the leaders of the unit may be setting a trap for him to determine whether or not he is an informant for the FBI or some other organization.

Mt. Olive, Mississippi June 25, 1965

W. R. MANGUM

On June 21, 1965, W. R. MANGUM, Magee, Mississippi, passed through Mt. Olive on his way to Collins, Mississippi. He said the Collins Unit had disbanded because of suspected leaks. MANGUM advised that two suspects at Collins had been identified as Judge FELTON CAMERON, Justice of the Peace, and LATRELL SANDFORD, Constable.

He related that MANGUM remarked that the week before he had gone to Collins to help disband the Collins Unit but the FBI and the Sheriff was all along the road near the meeting. That scared the people away and the meeting was not held.

ROBERT TURNAGE --- W. R. MANGUM

MANGUM stated on June 21, 1965, that he had met with the Mize, Mississippi, Unit and had helped with the swearing in of the new officers. The new president (Exalted Cyclops - EC) is ROBERT TURNAGE. This man is an electrician.

On June 23, 1965, W. R. MANGUM told HOMER SULLIVAN, City Marshal, Mt. Olive, Mississippi, that a state meeting of the WKKKKOM would be held on Sunday, June 27, 1965. The meeting will be near Greenwood, Mississippi. Go two miles East of Greenwood on U. S. Highway 82, until a truck is observed on the side of the road. This truck will be jacked up. Stop and use the code word "cigarette lighter" and the man at the truck will then give further instructions. The meeting is supposed to start at 8:00 a.m.

STATE MEETING WKKKKOM - May 2, 1965

W. R. MANCUM advised that he and several of the other state officials believe that the state meeting on May 2, 1965, was taped. He based this belief on the fact that the FBI had talked with several klansmen two or three days after the meeting and told them everything SAM BOWERS, Imperial Wizard, and Reverend (FNU) BILBO had talked about. They feel that two men from the Natchez, Mississippi, area who sat near the speakers stand were the ones that did the taping. No one was searched so it was possible that some one had a tape recorder on his person.

They based this on the fact that the FBI was talking about the two PONDER boys who were the last ones to come into the Unit and had attended only one or two meetings. They are not too well known in the Unit.

Everyone is very careful about who he talks to and when.

JOHN PAUL HARVEY keeps the membership list of Covington County Unit #2 in his personal possession at all times. It is believed that HARVEY wants to be the EC of Covington County Unit #2.



The sign is an obvious imitation on the famous poster of Uncle Sam inviting young men to join the U. S. Army.

PURSER advised that several of these signs were nailed to telephone poles in Hazlehurst on Monday night 6/28/65. He advised that the city **P**olice of Hazlehurst had ripped them down. He advised that he **d**id not know he might be responsible for these signs being put up in Hazlehurst.

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI RACIAL MATTERS (KLAN)

On June 30, 1965, Mr. James Ray, 238 Savannah Street, Jackson, Mississippi, made available to an agent of the FBI a Mimeograph copy of a one-page leaflet captioned "Chamber of Commerce Element Our Worst Enemy" which he believes was printed and distributed by the Ku Klux Klan. Mr. Ray advised that these leaflets were distributed to the front doors of all the homes in the block where he lives.

Additional citizens of Jackson, Mississippi, have reported that they also received copies of this leaflet at their front doors during the night of June 28, 1965, and June 29, 1965.

The above-mentioned leaflet does not indicate by whom it was printed or distributed, however, its content is similar to previous literature distributed by the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

A characterization of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi is attached to this memorandum.

The above-mentioned leaflet is as follows:

"CHAMBER OF COMMERCE ELEMENT OUR WORST ENEMY

"The Holy Bible says, 'It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle, than it is for a rich man to go to heaven.' Of course, the real meaning here is that the rich live only for their money and in most cases turn back on God, Race and Country. The best example of this can be found here in the South.

"In recent weeks our local newspapers have been carrying ads written and paid for by local businessmen and their Chamber of Commerce. They plead with the White people to obey the Civil Rights Laws, and to keep the peace and help quietly integrate all communities. The rich businessmen say that in order for them to make money and grow richer, they must have a 'peaceful' and 'integrated' community. They cannot stand the thought of losing a single dollar from any Negro boycott. In fact, they are so frightened by the thought of any Negro CORE picket line, they want to surrender in advance. They are in a big rush to hire Negro clerks, cashiers, even white collar workers, place Negroes in supervisory positions over White workers, just to appease the demands of Martin Luther King and his communist rabble.

"The rich businessmen know that they can afford to live in wealthy areas of a city where the Negro cannot move, they have their rich private country clubs and golf links and swimming pools and private schools. THEY ARE SELFISH AND VICIOUS IN DEMANDING THAT THE WHITE WORKING CLASS MIX WITH BLACK UN-CIVILIZED ANIMALS JUST SO THAT THEY MAY MAKE MONEY OFF THEIR NEGRO CUSTOMERS!"

"It is time that we single out the main leaders of these 'surrender all White Rights at any cost just so I can make money' business leaders and boycott them to the hilt. Let's cut off their White trade and put them in the bread lines with negroes where they would like to place OUR people. SPEAK UP, WHITE MAN, TELL THESE SELL-OUT TRAITORS TO EITHER STAND AND FIGHT WITH THE WHITE RACE, OR PACK UP THEIR CARPETBAGS AND MOVE IN WITH THE NEGROES BECAUSE THEY ARE GOING TO LOSE ALL THEIR WHITE TRADE. SINCE THEIR PRINCIPLES ARE BANKRUPT, LET THEIR BANK ACCOUNTS ALSO BE BANKRUPT.

"The above is an exact copy of a recent article in the conservative publication 'Thunderbolt.' We wish to point out the following: There are some different tactics being used on our local scene.

"Robert L. Ezell, Jr., president of our Chamber of Commerce and Mississippi Bedding (Mattress) Co., has had a lot of people sound asleep, but not with the use of his mattresses. This motley master was a Millsaps Major in the mid 30's, followed in a couple of years by Robert Mayo and Nat S. Rogers, and all of them follow the socialist lines. Also; there has been a 'finger' in the pie in more recent years.

"The Chamber, with 'Big Robert' at the head, has remained primarily in the background for almost one year, or ever since they came out with their outright compliance in absolute defiance of the principles and people they are supposed to represent. The Miss. Manufacturers Association and the Miss. Economic Council have been used as the somewhat open supporters of the communist-backed movement to bring about complete abolition of our Christian beliefs and way of life.

"If you can recall or assemble the recent comments and announcements from our liberal press, you will readily see how many phases of activity the Miss. Economic Council has delved into (business, social, civic, churches, schools, even roads, etc.), nothing short of dictating policies to all of these organizations.

"We invite and humbly request that you take notice and ask questions about 'Big Robert' and this situation. There will be more, and <u>THEN</u>, think about these comments and announcements, and you will readily realize the seriousness of the sell-out that has taken and is taking place, and what can and will be done about it."



WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy and the segregation of the races, to fight communism and to extend the dignity, heritage and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on February 4, 1965, that the present membership of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) is between 1,000 and 1,500 members and the organization has continued to operate in the State of Mississippi as an independent Klan organization with the same aims and purposes as when it was created in February, 1964.




He was at the office of the FDP, Jackson, Miss telephone 948-4038 and wanted this Bureau to have this information.

On the morning of 7/2/65 at about 11:10 AM as he was driving to Jackson, Miss the remains of a burning cross ware observed at the intersection of highway 569 and 98. This is about 10 or 12 miles north of Liberty, Miss at the Amite-Lincoln County line . He had no idea as to who may have burned the cross other than he said he believed it was done by the WK KKK Miss. He could furnish no information to substantiate this belief.

Vicksburg, Mississippi June 21, 1965

The White Knights of the Ku.Klux Klan was Chartered at Vicksburg, Two klaverns, in 1960. There are about thirty members in one group but I do not know how many there are in the second group or klavern.

With reference to the beating of TON MONTCOMERY, eldorly negro male, while eating in the Vicksburg Cafe on Washington Street in March, 1965 by REX PIERCE, JR. and MILTON STOKES, while they are members of the Klavern, this incident was not sponsored by the klavern in fact PIERCE and STOKES were thed by the klavern for doing this on their own, whe severely reprimanded and placed on two years probation by the klavern.

With reference to the Vicksburg Cafe, HILLY RAY FORD who is a commercial fisherman at Kingspoint, Mississippi Turaished the Ford automobile used, drove it and some thirteen or fourteen other men were called in on the job, is called to the hospital parking lot from which FORD and his two accomplances left from. This many people are not generally knowledgable of what is going on, for generally we are furnished information that an act is going to be carried out, it may happen say tonight but it maybe sometime within a week. The general memberehip is not told who is going to do it but the ones given the assignment are secretly notified.

With reference to the firebombing of Anderson's Cafe in Vicksburg in March, 1965 this was planned by BILLY RAY FORD but he had nothing further to do with it. WARREN "LITTLE SON" MEVELS drove his two tone blue Ford and probably was accompanied by two man, whose identity T will determine. •

Source advised that W. S. TORRANCE and TOMMY HORNE, both members of the UKA, Inc., have stated that they are going to "whip" LIDE because they are sure that he has been an informant.

WKKKKOM

Source stated that BILLY BUCKLES, JULIUS HARPER, and SAM BOWERS are still maintaining their association with the WKKKKOM. Source did relate that overtures were made to HARPER by MC DANIELS to come on into the UKA, Inc., but he refused. Source could not amplify on this.

SCHEDULED RALLY OF UKA, INC., AT MERIDIAN, MISS., 7/10/65.

A rally of the UKA, Inc., is tentatively scheduled for Meridian, Miss., on 7/10/65. It is expected that klansmen from Alabama and Mississippi will be on hand and the speaker may be SHELTON or MC DANIELS of the UKA, Inc. It was proposed that the meeting take place outdoors, possibly in an open field near Suquelena, Miss. (a small community located off Highway 19 North, of Meridian, Miss.) The source advised that the meeting would be similar to that which was held at Natchez, Miss. recently. Source additionally advised that the participating klansmen would wear robes.

W. S. TORRANCE

TORRANCE advised the source that he has a supply of robes on hand, and that he will be the source of supply for the East Central Mississippi area. TORRANCE's wife is making these robes.

TOMMY HORNE

HORNE has been receiving a great deal of admonishment from his wife regarding his klan activities. She wants him

to stop, but he has repeatedly stated he would not give up his activities in the klan. HORNE recently had published at his own expense (\$11.00) a pamphlet entitled "Objectives of the Communist Party and the National Council of Churches)." This Pamphlet is marked as an enclosure to the subject's substantive file.

DEXTER TORRANCE

Source stated that DEXTER and his brother, W. S. TORRANCE make a good team and are presently the motivating force behind the activities of the UKA, Inc., in the Meridian, Miss., area. Source made available a rubber stamped copy of a pamphlet entitled, "Some Questions that Needs Straight Answers" and containing the insignia of the United Klans of America, on the front page. This pamphlet is designated as an enclosure to the UKA, Lauderdale Co. file. DEXTER TORRANCE answers any inquiries directed to the Post Office Box as indicated on the pamphlet.

MIKE WATKINS

Source stated that WATKINS, one of the defense attorneys in the case involving the slaying of the three civil rights workers in Neshoba County on 6/21/64, is presently in Washington, D. C., on business re the case. He could not add anything else re this comment.

DEWITT SMITH

SMITH has not been obligated into the UKA, Inc. However, he is acting as the "go-between treasurer" of the UKA organization. Source advised that SMITH would do anything to become a klansman, but he is afraid to take any chances so he refuses to be sworn into the klan. SMITH is an older man and is reputed to be very sickly.

LAWRENCE RAINEY

W. S. TORRANCE has stated that RAINEY has written to E. L. MC DANIEL of the UKA, Inc., and asked to be notified when the UKA will hold their next meeting. He indicated in the letter that he wants to be there.

Informant advised that VINCENT PURSER is very "shook up" following a recent interview by FBI Agents at Gulfport, Mississippi. Following this interview, PURSER told MARVIN LACY and W.C. DOLLAHITE that in the course of talking with him, the FBI Agents made reference to Pascagoula, Miss., as a result of which PURSER is convinced that the FBI is aware that he has been recently attending Klan meetings at Pascagoula. PURSER believes in this regard that there must be an FBI informant at either Gulfport or Pascagoula, and he also believes that the FBI either has him under surveillance or has his telephone tapped or both.

Informant had no information to indicate that PURSER is attempting to affiliate with the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA) and stated that so far as he can tell the Klan on the Coast, particularly in the Gulfport, Miss., area, is still inactive and consists primarily of PURSER, LACY and DOLLAHITE.

ERNEST GILBERT

ERNEST GILBERT has apparently separated himself from the WKKKKOM and is now a kleagle at the state level for the UKA, Inc., Realm of Mississippi.

BILLY BUCKLES

E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon, Realm of Miss., UKA, Inc., recently asked BILLY BUCKLES to become a kleagle for the UKA, Inc. BUCKLES has refused to accept this position and presently is a member of the WKKKKOM.

RACIAL SITUATION, NATCHEZ, MISS.

Recent attempts by Negroes to integrate the Duncan Park in Natchez, Miss., have become a topic of great interest to members of the WKKKKOM. The klansmen are particularly concerned with the possibility that Negroes may attempt to use the swimming pool in Duncan Park. This matter is a very explosive topic of conversation and in the event the Negroes do attempt to use the swimming pool, it could become a serious and dangerous situation.

JAMES SEALE

JAMES SEALE, Franklin; County, Miss., has stated that recently, two FBI Agents went to his employer at Roxie, Miss., and informed his employer that SEALE and a companion were believed to be carrying guns in the course of their employment. SEALE and his companion drive a sawdust truck from Roxie Miss., to Bogalusa, La. After the Agents left, the employer told SEALE that he would be fired if he did not cease carrying his gun while driving the truck.

SEALE has stated that if he is fired, he fully intends to bring suit against his employer and attempt to learn the identities of the Bureau Agents and bring suit against them. An attorney at Natchez, Miss., by the name of BILL RILEY would handle these suits and has acted as SEALE's attorney in the past.

MEETING OF STATE OFFICERS, WKKKKOM, JACKSON, MISS., 6/6/65

A meeting of the state officers of the WKKKKOM was held at the Snack Shop in Jackson, Miss., on 6/6/65. The back portion of the Snack Shop had been rented for the sum of \$15 for the meeting. The persons attending first went to the Cotton Bowl Bowling Alley and were thereafter directed to the Snack Shop.

Persons in attendance were:

SAM BOWERS JULIUS HARPER BILLY BUCKLES CLYDE SEALE H. H. HEREDEEN BURSE (LNU)(*PUNN*)? (FNU) SANDIFER from Jayess, Miss. JACK SHELRER (phonetic) J. K. GREER, from Natchez, Miss. One man from Natchez who is employed by Natchez Upholstery Co. and resides at Franklin County, Miss.

The meeting opened and thereafter SAM BOWERS and JULIUS HARPER discussed the fact that the UKA, was attempting to take over membership of the WKKKKOM. BOWERS and HARPER voiced varying degrees of concern regarding this matter.

BILLY BUCKLES stated that the organization must began having two state meetings a quarter in order to hold the membership, and that four state kleagles should be put to work on as near a full-time basis as possible in order to gain and hold membership.

There was a discussion regarding the fact that the klan should carefully plan anything that is to be done and that the klan should try to come out into the open more. It

was discussed that work should be started in an effort to gain help from the National Council of Churches, the PTA, and other civic organizations.

It was suggested that literature of good quality is publicly available which calls attention to the communist influence in the United States and that this literature could be distributed by the klan as a program.

Included in the meeting was a showing of a movie depicting the riots during the UN-american Activities Committee meeting in San Francisco, California, several years ago. The klansmen thought the activities of the rioting persons were very poor and stated that in the event they are investigated, they do not want any repetition of such activities with regard to them.

BILLY BUCKLES again brought up the activities of the UKA, Inc. in taking members of the White Knights away.

SAM BOWERS stated he does not want either one of the NOSSER brothers from Natchez, Miss, brought to any more state meetings.

Informant advised that CHARLES J. SEALE and HOUSTON DILLARD of the Cross Roads Klavern (WKKKKOM) are very much concerned about a recent FBI interview of DILLARD.

Informant stated DILLARD has told a number of persons in the Cross Roads area about this interview and has freely expressed his opinion in the area that he believes CHARLES VARNADO of Picayune, Mississippi, is an FBI informant who possibly referred the FBI to DILLARD for interview.

Informant expressed the opinion that DILLARD may actually be "putting the bad mouth" on VARNADO in order to cover up the possibility that he, DILLARD, may actually be an FBI informant.

Informant advised he heard that both DILLARD and CHARLES SEALE recently went to some kind of state meeting but he had no information as to this meeting, and he had no reason to believe that either DILLARD or SEALE or making any effort at this time to affiliate the Cross Roads group with the United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA).

Informant advised that sofar as he knows there still is no activity in the Cross Roads Klavern with the exception of efforts on the part of SEAH and DILLARD to revive interest in the Klan in that area.



FOIA(b)(7) - (D) on 6/17/65, advised the following individuals attended the 6/12/65 meeting of the Varnell Klavern of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi (WKKKKOM) held on the front porch of the home of ALTON RANDALL, Klavern Leader: ALTON RANDALL, aka ALVIN REYNOLDS, DALE GHIN, ALTON RHYMES, WILTON RUSHING, ELVERT SANDIFIER and WES DILLON.

Informant advised that the individual who appeared before the Klavern in February, 1965 and promised to supply the rifles, ammunition and hand grenades, has been discussed on many occasions and was mentioned at the 6/12/65 meeting. It is now the opinion of the membership that this individual who introduced himself as ROBERT (BOB) WHITE, was the biggest liar ever to address the group. He promised to return with rifles and hand grenades in two months and has not been heard from by a member of the Unit since February, 1965. ALTON RANDALL advised he had tried to contact this individual at his insurance agency in Brookhaven, Miss., and could find no such individual in the insurance business. It is the opinion of all that he has never had the number of rifles he claimed or some one would have been trying to sell them to members of the Unit by this time.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D) described this ROBERT WHITE as an individual approximately 47 years of age, 6'2" or 6' 3" tall, weighing approximately 250 pounds with sandy or light grey hair.

ALTON RANDALL advised that on Saturday night, 6/19/65, it is his intention to put acid on and inside the automobile of the local leader of the NAACP, one CHRISTINE MAGEE, who lives on Highway 98, just east of Tylertown and just west of the Stewart Dairy Bar, on the south side of the highway. He advised that he had five or six quarts of powerful acid in powerful containers with hand pumps on each that would make it possible to spray the acid several yards. He advised he

would have to wait until very late, as the lights from the dairy bar lit up the area at the front of MAGEE's house, where her yellow 1965 Ford is generally parked.

ALTON RANDALL, in answer to a question from one of the group, advised that many of the leading citizens of the community and town of Tylertown are members of the klan. He advised that for example, during the Christmas holidays of 1963, the following individuals were sworn in as secret members, promising to aid the klan in any way possible, but requesting their identity and membership remain secret due to their position in the community:

"They were delivering three men to the Improve, Miss. area after the shooting and taking the long way home." He also stated there was an automobile that came into the Improve, Miss. area with the Chevrolet truck driven by MC ELVENE.

(Regarding the above statements by RANDALL, FOIA(b)(7) - (D)advised that he has heard the same story in his place of employment and on the streets in Tylertown on numerous occasions and is of the opinion that RANDALL is "carrying the best rumor in town.)

WILTON RUSHING, advised that on Thursday evening, 6/3/65, he cooked a large steak and carried it to the Walthall County Jail and asked Sheriff KNIPPERS if he could give the steak to the individual arrested and accused of participating in the murder of the Negro Deputy Sheriff. He was advised by KNIPPERS that no one could give anything to the prisoner as long as he remained in the Walthall County Jail.

FOIA(b)(7) - (D) advised that in his opinion, the only individual connected with the klan who resides in the general area of Improve, Miss., who is capable of participating in the murder of the Negro Deputy Sheriff in Washington Parish, La., is one ABNER ARD, a cattle man who lives on one of the blacktopped roads south of Improve, Miss., toward the Louisiana line.

DEXTER TORRANCE DESIGNATED AS OPEN MEMBER OF UKA, INC.

On 6/7/65, source advised that DEXTER TORRANCE has received instructions from E. L. MC DANIEL, Grand Dragon on the United Klans of America, Inc., to "Come out in the open" as a member of the UKA, Inc., in Meridian, Miss. Source said that TORRANCE has rented a Post Office Box, Number 1711, Meridian, Miss. and he is to act as the official klan spokesman in Lauderdale County, Miss. He said that TORRANCE accepted the position only with the agreement that he be notified in advance of any klansponsored activity, violent or non-violent, in order that he could establish an alibi at the time of the activity.

UKA, INC. OBLICATION CEREMONIES, JUNE 11, 1965, WARREN LAKE, NEAR MERIDIAN

On 6/7/65, source advised that he had received information from W. S. TORRANCE to the effect that on Friday night, 6/11/65, there was to be a big UKA swearing in or obligation ceremony at WARREN LAKE, near Meridian, Miss. He said that TORRANCE did not mention the name of the person on whose property the ceremony would be held. Source did state that E. L. AKIN was supposed to attend the ceremony with some men from his group of friends, who were desirous of being sworn into the UKA, Inc.

> ⁻ŪKA, INC, MARCH AT NATCHEZ, MISS., SATURDAY, JUNE 12, 1965

On 6/7/65, source advised that he had received information on 6/5/65 from W. S. TORRANCE to the effect that E. L. MC DANIEL, of Natchez, Miss., had made plans for a big klan march on 6/12/65 at Natchez, Miss. Source said he has not received any details of the march other than the fact that W. S. TORRANCE said that quite a few UKA, Inc. members from Louisiana would be participants in the march and that klansmen were to march in their klan robes. Source said that he is supposed to leave Meridian, Miss., at about 7:00 a.m. on Saturday 6/12/65 with AUSTIN MC CARY and W. S. TORRANCE in TORRANCE's car.

BERNARD CLAY AND B. C. LIDE

. . .

On 6/7/65, source advised that W. S. TORRANCE, Exalted Cyclops of the UKA, Inc, Lauderdale Klavern, ordered one DEXTER TORRANCE to contact BERNARD CLAY, owner of the Torch Restaurant and Service Station in Meridian, Miss., and tell CLAY that the UKA wanted him to remove a juke box from his establishment since the juke box was owned and operated by B. C. LIDE, a suspected FBI informant. Source said that he had learned that on 6/6/65, DEXTER TORRANCE did go to see CLAY and "really shook CLAY up" by telling CLAY if he did not move the juke box out of his place of business, then the klan would do it for him.

Source said that he has also learned that B.C. LIDE has been conducting his own investigation in an effort to learn the identity of the persons behind the printing of the "Blacklist" for the Meridian area.

POSSIBLE SPEAKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR ROBERT SHELTON

On 6/7/65, source advised that W. S. TORRANCE related to him on 6/6/65 that he had made inquiry concerning the little league ball field at Suqualena, Miss., as a possible speaking place for ROBERT SHELTON at some future date. W. S. TORRANCE said that he felt that he could get that ball field for such a speech if and when it is desired by E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Miss. Source said that TORRANCE told him that he was going to talk to MC DANIEL about the possibility of a speech at that ball field and if MC DANIEL liked the setup, then he would try to make final arrangements. TORRANCE said that he would notify source of the decision of MC DANIEL on 6/12/65.

DEXTER TORRANCE HAS RUBBER STAMP IDENTIFYING <u>HIMSELF WITH UKA</u>

Source advised on 6/7/65 that W. S. TORRANCE brought back instructions on 6/5/65 from E. L. MC DANIEL,

Natchez, Miss., for DEXTER TORRANCE to get a rubber stamp identifying himself with the UKA and a Post Office Box. Source said that he had learned that on 6/7/65, DEXTER TORRANCE did rent Post Office Box 1711, Meridian, Miss., and that he had also obtained a rubber stamp containing the following information: UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN. ANYONE INTERESTED IN AFFILIATION WITH ABOVE ORGANIZATION, WRITE POST OFFICE BOX 1711, MERIDIAN, MISSISSIPPI." Source said that TORRANCE was supposed to use that rubber stamp in connection with any klan type communications.

ROBES FOR MERIDIAN, UKA KLAN

On 6/7/65, source advised that W. S. TORRANCE recently told him that Mrs. W. S. TORRANCE was in the process of making klan robes for the Meridian klan members and further that he, W. S. TORRANCE, had spent about \$50 out of his own money for material for these robes.

PETE HARRIS AND TOMMY HORNE, UKA MEMBERSHIP DUES

Source advised on June 9, 1965, that he received instructions from E. L. MC DANIEL to contact PETE HARRIS of Meridian and TOMMY HORNE, former defendant in the murder of the three civil rights workers, in an effort to collect dues owed to UKA, INC.

TOMMY HORNE has also advised source that he quit his job in Birmingham, Alabama because he was afraid the FBI would interview him at his place of employment.

SHERIFF RAYMOND DAVIS VISITED BY W. S. TORRANCE

On June 9, 1965, source advised that W. S. TORRANCE recently told him that he, TORRANCE, visited Sheriff RAYMOND DAVIS at Meridian, Miss., recently relative to "MA" SHOEMAKER, on Old Highway 80 near Meridian. TORRANCE

said that he was upset over the fact that SHOEMAKER was allowed to operate a house of prostitution at that address and therefore, he had a discussion with Sheriff DAVIS and told DAVIS that the klan did not like the idea of DAVIS' allowing such a place to operate openly and that the UKA would do everything possible to sabotage any future plans that DAVIS might have for public office, if DAVIS did not close that place. Source said that he had learned later that Sheriff DAVIS had closed "MA" SHOEMAKER's house of prostitution upon the threat of TORRANCE.

HAROLD CRENSHAW

On 6/3/65, source advised that he recently learned that W. S. TORRANCE had brought instructions back from E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Miss., for TORRANCE to advise HAROLD CRENSHAW that he was going to be designated as another individual in the Lauderdale Klavern who would be authorized to obligate new members into the UKA.

PREACHER DELMAR DENNIS

W. S. TORRANCE recently commented to source that he had been instructed by E. L. MC DANIEL of Natchez, Miss., to have a talk with Preacher DELMAR DENNIS and to instruct DENNIS that he was going to have to start carrying his share of the klan business in Meridian. TORRANCE said that it was his feeling and the feeling of MC DANIEL that DENNIS was not doing all he can to help promote and further the klan efforts in Meridian.

BILLY BIRDSONG

On 6/3/65, source advised that he had learned through general conversation with the black-haired waitress at the Tally Ho Restaurant that BILLY BIRDSONG supposedly recently paid cash for a 1963 Pontiac and has been flashing what is purportedly a state investigator's card. Source

said that he also received information from the same waitress that BIRDSONG recently bought a small pistol from the woman who owns the Triangle Restaurant in Meridian, Mississippi.

KLAN SOURCE OF INFORMATION AT MERIDIAN, MISS., POLICE DEPARTMENT

Source advised that he and other klansmen in the Meridian area now have a source of information in the person of Captain HAIG's secretary at the Meridian Police Department. He related that any information coming to the attention of Captain HAIG is also usually known to his secretary since HAIG has made a point of confiding in his secretary to gain her favor. Then the same secretary furnishes LEE ROBERTS with information which may be of interest to ROBERTS, especially klan type information, and then the same information is made known by ROBERTS to klansmen.

EDGAR "SHORTY" MOORE

Source advised on 6/7/65 that EDGAR "SHORTY" MOORE can be contacted during his off hours from the Flintkote Corp. at the King Loan Company on 4th Street across from the Western Union office in Meridian, Miss.

HERMAN TUCKER AND W. H. PETTIS

Source advised on 6/9/65 that he had been unable to develop any information which would indicate that HERMAN TUCKER and W. H. PETTIS are active in the klan in Philadelphia, Miss.
