

Source never heard anything about burying anyone in a refrigerator. He felt this occurred before the Silver Dollar Group was actually formed.

source was confident in his own mind that the winston to the swamp where several of the men beat him with bull whips. Source explained that the above group would just load up in a car and drive around until someone could think of some Negro that "needed it," find him and let him have it. BEATING OF ROY BEESON - FEBRUARY 1, 1964

Source reported that he had heard through Klan at Natchez had several days prior to February 1, 1964, stopped ROY BEESON and his Negro girl friend driving drunk and naked on a local highway. The Sligo group of the WKKKK found out about it. This group was responsible for taking BEESON to a remote spot, stripping him to the waist, and beating him.

JAKE FRISHMAN - RESIDENCE BURNED

Source understood that JAKE FRISHMAN, a white man and a Negro man had words over a Negro woman they were both associating with. The Negro man, as best his Klan group could find out, set fire to FRISHMAN's house. Source indicated that the Klan had gotten their information from the police at Natchez.



Source advised that when E. D. MORACE went to E. L. MC DANIEL about two weeks before the burning of FRANK MORRIS' shoe shop in Ferriday, Louisiana, on 12/10/64 and told MC DANIEL he had attempted to get some of the Mississippi boys to whip "Old FRANK," they would not handle his request without the authority of MC DANIEL, he did not tell MC DANIEL the identities of the individuals whom he had approached to handle his request.

TOMMIE L. JONES WHIPS UNKNOWN NEGRO

Source heard a few years ago, possibly 1963, that TOMMIE L. JONES, for some unrecalled reason, picked up a Negro painter who lived in the area of JACK MOORE's grocery store located on Madison Street in Natchez, and under the pretext of having him look at a house, drove him out of town. Afterwards, JONES was joined by other individuals and they whipped the Negro.

Source advised that E. L. MC DANIEL, who was the organizer for the OKKKK at that time, heard about the incident and he, JACK SEALE, DOUBLAS BYRD, and L. C. MURRAY went to JONES' home in the Cloverdale Section of Natchez and talked with JONES about the incident. JONES admitted to this group that he had participated in beating . the Negro but he would not identify the individuals who participated in the beating with him. JONES advised the group they could kill him but he would not identify the other participants.



Source advised that the group told JONES if he beat anyone else, they would give him a beating.

SOURCE ATTENPTED BEATING OF JAMES WHITE, NECKO

unrecalled source that TOUGHIE L. JONES and some other individuals went to the residence of JAMES WHITE, a Negro who resides on Horseshoe Lake Road, which is located on Highway 84 a few miles west of Ferriday, Louisians, to give him a beating. WHITE raised pheasants so the group got WHITE out of his house under the pretext of looking at his birds. Someone in WHITE's house, possibly his wife, saw one of the individuals take a pistol from his pocket and the individual in the house began shooting with a shotgun. JONES was hit with some pellets from the shotgun and he had to be taken to Brookhaven, Mississippi, to have a doctor remove the pellets from his body. Source was of the opinion the pellets had hit JONES in the cheek of his face.

Source advised that ERNEST GILBERT of Brookhaven is the individual who arranged for the doctor to treat JONES. He thought the doctor's name was (FNU) BARRETT.

Source advised he had never heard the identity of the individuals who were with JONES at WHITE's residence.

RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER


Source advised he had learned that when BILL RILEY, Natchez attorney, talked with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER about representing him in connection with the theft of the bush hog charge against GLOVER in Jefferson County, Mississippi, he told GLOVER he must tell him the truth about the bush hog matter. GLOVER told RILEY the charge is a "frame-up" by the FBI.


Source also learned that GLOVER told RILEY he had never been involved in anything personally. GLOVER did not explain that comment.




Source also learned that GLOVER had told RILEY in the recent past that several individuals had disappeared in Concordia Parish, Louisiana. SILVER DOLLAR GROUP.

Source advised that the Silver Dollar Group (SDG) was formed because some of the Klansmen were dissatisfied with the way the Klan was being operated. Some of the Klansmen wanted to form a Klan within the Klan. The members of the new secret unit had to be trusted and members had to vouch for each other. Members were not required to have committed acts of violence in the past in order to become members of the SDG.

Source advised he heard MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE and ERNEST FINLEY (deceased), both of Natchez, Mississippi, approached L. C. MURRAY, of Natchez, about becoming a member of the secret unit. This first contact with MURRAY was made from a few months to a year prior to the fishfry at the residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE, which was in the Summer of 1965.

Source advised that the same day that MURRAY was approached to join this new group, SEALE and FINLEY took him to a night meeting. MURRAY was told this was a select group, and the group did not meet with the Klan.

Source advised this meeting took place in an oil field off Liberty Road in Natchez. The following individuals were in attendance at the meeting, in addition to SEALE, FINLEY, and MURRAY:



T. L. TORGERSEN FETE TYRE (employed at Bluff City Motors in Natehes) ERNEST PARKER (attended meeting in his orange station wagon)

Source advised that these individuals just talked about starting a super secret group. Source stated MURRAY was told at this meeting he would be advised later regarding his membership.

Source advised he believed that some of the individuals present at this meeting already had their silver dollars.


Shortly after the first meeting, a second meeting of this group was held near the site of the first meeting. At this meeting source learned that individuals in Concordia Parish, Louisiana, and Franklin County, Mississippi, also belonged to this group. Source learned that FINLEY and JACK SEALE apparently were the leaders of the members of this group in Mississippi.

At this meeting MURRAY was given a silver dollar by FINLEY, who took the coin from a paper bag. Most of the early members of this group were given coins dated 1886. After they gave out all of the coins with this date on it, they gave out silver dollars with other dates. Source believed MURRAY's silver dollar was dated 1898. Source advised he observed the coin which was given to MURRAY and he saw no unusual markings on it.



HURRAY was still a member of the WIRKERCH. Source pointed out that MURRAY and some of the other members of the WEREKEN did not leave that organization until August, 1964, when they formed the UKA.

was held a short period of time after the second meeting. This meeting was held on the Homochitto River, off Highway 98. about three or four miles from Meadville, Mississippi. Those in attendance were as follows:

talked at this meeting, and had something to eat. Source recalled that GLOVER had a sawed-off shotgun with him, and he shot it a few times.

A short time later this group held another meeting at this same location. Those present were as follows:

Source advised he did not believe TOPHIE JOHNS and T. L. TORGERSEN showed up for this meeting. The members from Brookhaven did not show up, nor did any of the members from Louisiana; consequently those present went home.

Some time later there was another meeting which was held at Clear Springs Lake, which is located a few miles west of Meadville, Mississippi. Those present were as follows:




Source advised that at this meeting the group talked about segregation, had something to eat, and then went home. Source advised to his knowledge no act of violence was ever mentioned at these meetings.

Source advised that he believed someone at one of the meetings on the Homochitto River had some large sticks of dynamite in the trunk of their car. This dynamite resembled large sticks of baloney. Source did not see anyone take the dynamite out of the automobile, and he does not recall whose automobile contained the dynamite.

Source advised that the next meeting of this group was the fishfry at the Wildsville, Louisiana, residence of JAMES FREDERICK LEE on June 26, 1965. Source believed this meeting occurred on a Saturday afternoon. MURRAY, ERNEST PARKER, JAMES SEALE, JACK SEALE, and ERNEST FINLEY went to the meeting in the red Ford of PARKER's.

Present at LEE's residence were three or four individuals whom source did not know. Others present were as follows:





JAMES FREDERICK LEE LEE's wife was present as were two or three other women. Source could not recall if T. L. TORGERSEN was present. PETE TYRE was not present. Source pointed out that TYRE's wife and the wife of L. C. MURRAY are first cousins.

During the afternoon someone got out charcoal, saltpeter, and some other ingredient and ground them up in a coffee grinder in an effort to make an explosive powder. There had been general talk that the government was going to restrict the sale of guns, ammunition, and powder. Some of this mixture was put in some container and JACK SEALE threw it toward the trees, in the back side of the yard, but it did not explode.

During the afternoon, several of the men went to Forman's Grocery, which is next door to LEE's residence, and when they left, they placed UKA cards on the counter.

Wives of some of the men were there as were some of their children. They were inside LEE's residence part of the time. The group talked about integration and related subjects, but GEORGE METCALFE was not mentioned. Source stated he did not believe he even knew who METCALFE was at that time.

ERNEST PARKER was there in his red Ford. When PARKER's car left late in the afternoon, MURRAY and FINLEY were in the back seat, and PARKER, JAMES SEALE, and JACK SEALE were riding in the front seat.

This group met TORGERSEN and the wife of TOMMIE LEE JONES in JONES' white Chevrolet before they reached Highway 84. They explained about TOMMIE JONES having been arrested and he was in jail at Ferriday, Louisians, for nitting a Negro with his gun. There was some comment made about how close she was sitting to TORGERSEN when the group GLOVER came along, and went to see the man who owned the King Hotel in Ferriday, and got some money from him for JONES' bond. JONES made his bond and this group of Klansnen, as well as the law in Ferriday, told JONES to get his car and get back over in Mississippi and stay away from Ferriday.

talked to JACK SEALE and MURRAY about taking REGINALD P. CARTER into the group and SEALE told GLOVER he did not care who GLOVER took into the group because he was through with it.

Source did not know if JOE LEE HARDY had ever been HARDY told him one time about shooting plate glass windows out of the Royal Furniture Store in Natchez. He used glass marbles and a sling shot.

TOMMIE JONES WHIPS NEGRO WHO INSULTED MRS. JACK MOORE.

Source advised that four or five years ago JACK MOORE, who is employed at Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company, had a small grocery in Natchez which was operated by his wife. One day a Negro painter supposedly went into the store and insulted Mrs. MOORE. Source said that JONES went to the Negro and on the pretext of having him look at a house which JONES wanted him to paint, the group took him out Liberty Road beyond JIMMY CARTER's place. There JONES, TORGERSEN, and someone from across the river (across the Mississippi River) blind-folded and beat the Negro badly and left him.




Source reported that he is sure that L. C. MURRAY in the driveway of the residence of WILLIE WASHINGTON in Natchez which occurred on the same date. Source did not know who was responsible for these explosions. However, it had come to his attention at that time that TOMMIE LEE JONES and T. L. TORGERSEN were making telephone calls to TROY GUICE, at his Chevrolet company, and raising hell with him to fire his Negro help. JONES and TORGERSEN were upset with Mayor NOSSER for hiring Negroes in his business operations. They called NOSSER a Negro lover and the like.

Source continued that at the time of these explosions there were internal problems in the Natchez City Government. J. T. ROBINSON and Mayor NOSSER were at each others throats over operation of the Civil Service Commission.

JAMES FREDERICK LEE - L. C. MURRAY.

Source advised he had learned that after JAMES FREDERICK LEE, a shop steward at the Armstrong firm, got off from work at 8:00 a.m. on 8/15/67, he went directly to the residence of L. C. MURRAY. LEE wanted MURRAY to ride into


Source advised that he talked with RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, Silver Dollar Group (SDG) member, in downtown Natchez, Miss., on 7/28/67, after GLOVER had left the office of his Natchez attorney, BILL RILEY. Source pointed out that in the past, he had been relatively close to GLOVER and that he had sworn GLOVER into the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) a few years ago.

GLOVER told the source that whoever is responsible for blowing up WHARLEST JACKSON is causing the FBI to investigate him. GLOVER stated that JACKSON was not a trouble maker, he was not a smart alec, and that he was a good worker. GLOVER stated that there were a number of Negroes at the Armstrong firm who might have needed killing before JACKSON did. GLOVER told the surce that he had done a number of things, without going into any details, but he did not have anything to dowith the killing of WHARLEST JACKSON

GLOVER told the source that JAMES FREDERICK LEE is the individual who organized the SDG because he wanted to start an underground organization within the Klan. GLOVER told the source that LEE, E. D. MORACE, and JAMES LEE SCAROBOROUGH were some of the first members in this group.

GLOVER said that there were only three or four meetings of the SDG and that the fishfry meeting at the Wildsville, Louisiana, residence of LEE on 6/26/65, was the last meeting where a number of the members were present. After that meeting, if the members got together, it was just two or three at the time.





The 6/26/65 meeting was held so a number of the SDG members could meet together and practice and experiment with explosives, according to GLOVER.

GLOVER told the source that there are no members of the SDG in Brookhaven, Mississippi, to his knowledge. GLOVER stated that if there were any members from that area, he had never met with them.


L. C. MURRAY - MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE:

Source advised that L. C. MURRAY is a member of the SDG and was in attendance at the 6/26/65, fishfry. MYRON WAYNE "JACK" SEALE is a member of the SDG and he was also in attendance at this fishfry. Source advised that MURRAY and SEALE did not admit to the Agents, when they were interviewed, that they had been in attendnace at this fishfry because they were of the opinion they could be tied in on some type of conspiracy.

Source advised that MURRAY and SEALE are obviously

of the opinion that the FBI does not trust them and, consequently, they do not fully trust the FBI. Source advised that these two individuals are destitute. SEALE is unemployed and he has no immediate prospects of employment. MURRAY has been off from work at the Armstrong plant with a back injury and he has not, to date, received any compensation from his employer in connection with this injury. MURRAY's wife is expecting her first child in a few weeks and she will be forced to terminate her employment at a Natchez bank.

Source stated these individuals, no doubt, have information which he does not possess, they have friends and associates from whom they can obtain information, and if they were approached, they would assist the Bureau if they were adequately paid for their information.



source advised that he talked with PAT PARTRIDCE. an employee of the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company. on 7/27/67, and PARTRIDCE told him that someone had told saver wood to have WHARLEST JACKSON work overtime on the date he was killed. PARTRIDCE did not identify this individual and he furnished no additional details regarding this matter. WOOD is the supervisor at the Armstrong firm who asked JACKSON to work overtime on 2/27/67.


Source advised that PARTRIDGE is a radical but klan group. Source advised he was never a member of any PARTRIDGE is a close associate of JAMES FREDERICK LEE. Source believes he can obtain additional pertinent information from

Source advised that E. D. MORACE came to him a few days prior to this incident and asked the source to send some men to Ferriday to give the victim a beating because he had been flirting with white women who frequented his shoe shop. MORACE wanted the beating to occur on a particular night because the law would be on the other side of the parish. Source told MORACE he would not handle his request without first checking on the allegation. A few days after the incident, MORACE told the source that they had to kill the Negro and he said something about pouring gasoline on him. MORACE told the source that the others involved in this incident were TOMMIE LEE JONES and THOR LEE TORGERSEN, both of Natchez, and JAMES LEE SCAROBORCUGH of Ferriday, Louisiana.




TOUGHIE LEE JONES, a resident of 75 Cloverdale, Natchez, Mississippi, made available an unpainted wooden box lined with tar paper, which box was retrieved by JONES from the west side of the Moose Hall, Highway 61, Natchez, Mississippi. This box, according to JONES, was transferred from the residence of RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER in Kentwood, Louisiana, in JONES' automobile, a 1963 white Chevrolet, to the Moose Hall, Natchez, on July 14, 1967.


It was evident that this box had been exposed to several days of heavy rain and was quite dirty and muddy when retrieved by JONES.

This box was immediately examined at the time it was turned over by JONES and it was empty.

The box is constructed of rough unpainted lumber, completely lined on the inside with tar paper, and measures approximately 54¹/₂ by 9 3/4 by 5¹/₂ inches.

JONES requested this box be returned to him upon completion of examination by this Bureau.







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
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








L. MC DANIEL SHOULD NOT BE USED.





Source advised that E. D. MORACE of Ferriday. Louisiana, was the KBI man for the OKKKK in Louisiana in 1964. E. L. MC DANIEL at that time was the Grand Dragon of the UKA in Mississippi.

About two weeks before the incident occurred, where the Negro was burned in his shoe shop in Ferriday, Louisiana, MORACE saw MC DANIEL at Carnett's Restaurant in Ferriday and told him that he wanted to talk with him. Source said that MORACE called MC DANIEL about a week before the incident and MC DANIEL met MORACE at the bowling alley in Ferriday. At this time MORACE told MC DANIEL that he had attempted to get some of the Mississippi boys to whip "Old Frank" who operated the shoe shop in Ferriday. MORACE said that the Mississippi men would not handle his request without the authority of MC DANIEL. Source stated that MORACE told MC DANIEL that he wanted MORRIS given a beating because he had flirted with and made smart remarks to white women who frequented his shoe shop. Source advised that MORACE wanted the beating to take place on the following Thursday night. MORACE told MC DANIEL that he would not have to worry about the law because they would be on the other side of the parish.

Source stated that MC DANIEL told MORACE he would have to check the allegations -- not that he did not trust MORACE--but that was the way his organization operated. MC DANIEL told MORACE that his organization did


not work on hearsay information. Source advised that MC DANIEL did not check on MORACE's allegations and he did nothing about MORACE's request. Source advised that on Wednesday, the day before the incident, MORACE telephoned MC DANIEL and told him, "The rabbit hunt is off--forget about it." Source

Stated that MC DANIEL knew that MORACE meant for him to forget about the request that he had made about giving

Source advised that the next morning, a little after 8:00 a.m., MC DANIEL was driving to Ferriday on Highway 65 and he saw that MORRIS' shoe shop had been burned. Source advised that at that time MC DANIEL was employed by the Red Ball Trucking firm in Natchez and he made frequent trips to Ferriday.

Source advised that a few days after the indicent and after MORRIS had died, MC DANIEL saw MORACE in Ferriday and MORACE told MC DANIEL that if JONES, TORGERSEN, SCAROBOROUGH, and himself were arrested, that MC DANIEL should get a bondsman and get them out of jail. MORACE told MC DANIEL that he was not to leave them in jail. Source stated when MORACE mentioned the three names, he knew that he was talking about TOMMIE L. JONES. THOR LEE TORGERSEN, and JAMES SCAROBOROUGH. Source stated that MC DANIEL asked MORACE the reason they had killed the Negro and MORACE replied that the smart s-- o- b---- made us kill him. Source stated that MORACE made some statement about pouring gasoline on the Negro or that the Negro got gasoline on him, or something to that effect.

Source advised that to his knowledge MORACE never again mentioned this matter to MC DANIEL.





Source advised that he talked with TORSIN L. Jonnes, Silver Dollar momber, on the night of 7/22/67, at the Fountain Lounge in Natches, Miss. JOHNES told the source that about a week ago he drove BALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, Silver Dollar member, from Natchez to his home in Kentwood, La. When they returned to Matchez, they drove to the Jefferson Davis Hospital so GLOVER could pick up his truck which was parked in the parking lot there. However, when they arrived at the hospital, they observed two strange automobiles and they assumed FBI Agents were watching GLOVER's truck, so JOHES drove GLOVER directly to the Armstrong Tire and Rubber Company. JONES told the source since that night the FBI has been watching him day and night. Source stated JONES did not confide in him as to the reason they had gone to Kentwood. Source stated JONES 18 concerned about the pressure from the FBI since he and GLOVER made the trip to Kentwood or he is concerned that the FBI is aware he made this trip with GLOVER.

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
