Her husband, MARSHALL MARTIN, during late 1963 and early 1964, was serving a burglary sentence in jail at Parchman, Mississippi. He heard from TOMMIE JONES, who is known to him as a member of a Klan-type group, that the Klan was aware of WALKER's employment, her race, and her activities and that the Klan was going to take "appropriate action." HERNANDEZ stated that in order to prevent a beating or murder, he told MIKE MC DONOUGH, the owner of the motel, that WALKER's employment represented a potentially explosive situation. WALKER's employment was terminated and no violence occurred.

HERNANDEZ stated that Sheriff ANDERS, after taking office in January, 1964, leased three white Olds-mobiles from McPhail Oldsmobile in Natchez, Mississippi. HERNANDEZ stated that he was furnished a white Oldsmobile, four-door Jet Star, that had a police two-way radio with a whip antenna on the left rear and an AM radio, a standard radio receiver, which had the usual AM radio antenna on the right front.

In addition to the bullet-shaped combination red light and siren on the top of the vehicle, he was of the opinion that it had a gold star on each side of the car.

The other similarly equipped Oldsmobiles were used by Deputy Sheriff DAVID BLOUGH and Sheriff JAMES O. ANDERS. After HERNANDEZ quit on April 1, 1964, his car was repaired and used by Deputy Sheriff BOBBY ANDERS and Deputy Sheriff PETE HALEY.

JAMES HORACE "SONNY" TAYLOR visited Silver Dollar Group (SDG) member JAMES "RED" LEE in Natchez, Mississippi, on September 25 and 26, 1967. LEE told TAYLOR that six hard-core SDG members had met on September 24, 1967, and had discussed the future plans of the SDG. LEE did not go into detail concerning these discussions except to say that the TOMMIE JONES case was once again discussed.

LEE advised NORMAN HEAD, RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, E. D. MORACE, JACK SEALE, L. C. MURRAY, and himself were the individuals who attended this meeting.


LEE invited TAYLOR to attend a SDG meeting to be held during the afternoon of October 1, 1967, in the vicinity of a hunting camp owned by SDG member E. D. MORACE. LEE did not go into detail concerning the meeting, but indicated they were trying to get all of the trusted SDG members together to plan for the future.

LEE either would not or could not furnish TAYLOR directions to the exact location of this meeting, but told TAYLOR that he would pick him up and transport him to the meeting.

TAYLOR learned from LEE that the individual unknown to him who attended the SDG meeting on September 9, 1967, in Natchez, Mississippi, was most likely identical with ERNEST PARKER.

JAMES HORACE "SONNY" TAYLOR has always been a suspect in the METCALFE bombing. TAYLOR was recently overheard to say something to the effect that a week or two prior to the bombing of METCALFE, TAYLOR had heard a group of ten or twelve Klansmen discussing the bombing of METCALFE.

TAYLOR would not furnish any details as to the identities of these individuals participating in this discussion, nor did he indicate where the discussion was held.



SCHOOL SHOULDANK GROSSES

On August 29, 1967, JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR visited Silver Bullar Group (SDG) member James "RED" LEE in Nasches, Mississippi, and had a lengthy conversation with LEE concerning TAYLOR's fight with GLOVER over the theft of TAYLOR's chainsaw and concerning the arrest of GLOVER for the theft of the bushhog.

LEE told TAYLOR that GLOVER was not to blame for stealing his saw, that GLOVER had merely passed on to TAYLOR information ELDON HESTER had furnished GLOVER about the saw. LEE told TAYLOR that because of the saw incident, GLOVER was giving HESTER the "cold shoulder." LEE also told GLOVER was giving HESTER the "cold shoulder." LEE also told TAYLOR that GLOVER had nothing to worry about concerning the TAYLOR that GLOVER had nothing to worry about concerning the bushhog since there was no evidence connecting GLOVER with the theft.

LEE told TAYLOR that GLOVER is solid and that everyone should stand behind him. LEE also said that within a week or two, he would bring GLOVER to Harrisonburg, Louisiana, to see TAYLOR so they could straighten out their differences.

At about 8:30 p.m., on August 30, 1967, LEE appeared at the TAYLOR residence in Harrisonburg, Louisiana, accompanied by RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER. Shortly after their arrival, GLOVER, LEE, and TAYLOR stood in the middle of TAYLOR's front yard and had a lengthy conversation. GLOVER explained his position about the saw to TAYLOR and TAYLOR said that although he did not appreciate how GLOVER had treated him over the saw, he would stick by GLOVER since he was in trouble. TAYLOR offered to help GLOVER in any way possible.

Was an informant for the FBI. GLOVER and LEE, while talking to TAYLOR, both had and referred to detailed notes during this conversation. GLOVER said that on numerous occasions in the past, information had come back to him which could have only come from TOMMIE LEE JONES. GLOVER explained that some of the SDG members who had been interviewed by the FBI had been requested to write down in as much detail as possible immediately after the interview the questions asked by the FBI Agents so that this information could be studied and an attempt made to identify the source of information upon which FBI questions were based.

CLOVER also told LEE and TAYLOR that they had tested SDG members in the past several months by giving a particular individual certain information. This information was then noted in detail as to what information was furnished and to whom this information was furnished so that if the information ever came back, they would know positively that it could have only come from one particular source.


LEE took over the discussion at this time and told TAYLOR and GLOVER that JONES had come by his Natchez home on August 29, 1967, and had questioned him in detail about the bushhog incident and the SDG business. LEE said that he had the distinct impression that JONES was trying to turn LEE against GLOVER. LEE said that JONES was so obvious with his questions that the conversation between JONES and LEE sounded like an FBI interview. LEE also pointed out to GLOVER and TAYLOR that JONES' wife had told the source that JONES had extra money every month.

LEE told TAYLOR that he and GLOVER had come to see him for two reasons: First, to warn him about JONES and, second, to obtain his thinking as to what should be done about JONES. LEE said that he was convinced that JONES was an FBI informant and thought that he should be killed immediately. GLOVER said that he wanted to do some more checking before any action was taken.

BEATING OF DEWEY WHITE, HORSESHOE LAKE, LOUISIANA:

Sometime in the past, JAMES "RED" LEE told JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR that he and other Klansmen from the Horseshoe Lake area had given a white man a good beating with LEE's wide leather belt because this white man had been messing with a Negro woman in a motel located on Horseshoe Lake. LEE did not furnish TAYLOR any further details concerning this beating.

GLOVER said he did not believe this story as it was like JONES being seen in a car with an FBI Agent and he doubted that JONES was forced into the car.

CLOVER reminded JAMES LEE that JONES had made a trip to Laurel, Mississippi, with them, at which time they were accompanied by JOEL FREEMAN and THOR LEE TORGERSEN. Later, FBI Agents questioned them about a bombing or burning in Laurel and GLOVER wondered if JONES was not responsible. LEE remembered the incident but indicated he had not made the trip.

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GLOVER was asked by someone the purpose of the MORACE inquired if SDG members had secrets from each other. In an incident needed to know about it.

There was a discussion about the questions those present at the meeting had been solved.

present at the meeting had been asked by FBI Agents. JAMES LEE said he had been questioned about the burning of FRANK MORRIS and another burning. E. D. MORACE said he was questioned two weeks ago about the burning of REEF FREEMAN's night club and about two Negroes being whipped. When MORACE mentioned about the two Negroes being whipped, GLOVER laughed loudly but made no comment.

JAMES LEE stated that sometime ago, he saw O. C. POISSOT parked in front of his house with someone who looked like an FBI Agent. LEE stated two days later, FBI Agents came to his house and questioned him about a levee job he was supposed to have been involved in.

BARFIELD in Ferriday, Louisiana, a few minutes earlier. OGDEN said he wanted to warn MORACE as he felt BARFIELD needed money and if BARFIELD knew any information about the Klan or about MORACE, he might furnish it to the FBI. OGDEN asked MORACE if BARFIELD knew anything on him and was told BARFIELD did not. MARION WILLIAMS FREEMAN: Source recalls having furnished information in the past on the long, cylinder-shaped bomb thrown at a Negro house in Ferriday, Louisiana, which failed to explode. Source was told that FREEMAN was involved in this bombing by JAMES FREDERICK LEE under the following circumstances:

Source saw the long bomb which failed to explode and recognized the dynamite from which it was made as appearing to be the same dynamite he had seen at the SDG fishfry.

Source asked LEE about this and was told by LEE it was the fault of JAMES "SONNY" TAYLOR that the bomb did not go off. LEE told source the whole story of the attempted bombing and stated MARION FREEMAN was involved and was driving the car used in the bombing.

Source recalls having in the past furnished information concerning MARION FREEMAN of Ferriday, Louisiana, having possibly been involved in a church burning at Sicily Island, Louisiana, along with JAMES LEE, JOHN FORD, and SONNY TAYLOR.

FREEMAN was a member of the Ferriday - Clayton Unit of the Klan from about 1965 until the Klan broke up. He has not been active in the Klan in the past year or two and never attended meetings regularly. FREEMAN said that he could not attend meetings but was willing and available for any type of assignment at any time.





RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER advised E. D. MORACE on September 16, 1967, that JACK SEALE reported to him he saw TOMMIE JONES with an FBI Agent. GLOVER told MORACE that he and SEALE were not the only ones who had seen JONES with FBI Agents.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD advised BUCK HORTON on September 15, 1967, that TOMMIE LEE JONES had been telling that there would be a Federal Grand Jury in Shreveport, Louisiana, in October, 1967. JONES said several people from the Ferriday - Vidalia, Louisiana, area would be subpoensed for the Grand Jury. HEAD and HORTON thought this Grand Jury might be responsible for JONES' meeting the FBI Agent at the Eola Hotel.

REORGANIZATION OF THE KLAN:

JACK SEALE told E. D. MORACE the Klan in Natchez, Mississippi, would reorganize in the near future. SEALE stated he would let MORACE know so he could attempt to get other men to attend.

KENNETH NORMAN HEAD advised BUCK HORTON on September 15, 1967, of a planned meeting at HEAD's house on Concordia Lake near Ferriday, Louisiana, at 7:00 p.m., September 24, 1967. Ex-Klan members in the area will be invited and will discuss what the FBI has been questioning them about. The main purpose of the meeting is to discuss reorganizing the Klan. HEAD stated that after the Klan reorganized, a permanent meeting place was needed. He said he would ask E. D. MORACE and PAUL TOLBERT about using their deer camp as a meeting place.

BEATING OF RICHARD JAMES AND ROBERT WATKINS:

Source stated according to RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER it was JAMES FOUNT MC NEELY and not JAMES FOUNT who was involved in the beating of RICHARD JAMES and ROBERT WATKINS. MC NEELY is about 45 years old and was the acting Exalted Cyclops of the Black River - Monterey Unit of the Klan when this unit broke up.

Source did not hear anything about a man other than GLOVER having been without a mask during the beating.

Source has no additional information about the identity of the girl friend of TOMMIE LEE JONES at the Shamrock Motel. RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER mentioned that the girl friend of JONES had a car on which the tires were cut but did not say anything else or mention whether one or more of the tires were cut.

JAMES FREDERICK "BED" LEE:

Source located LEE on Highway 61 North and had a cup of coffee with him and was then invited to LEE's home where he stayed until LEE started looking at the World Series and obviously was not going to talk anymore.

It was apparent that LEE wanted the source to do the talking and wouldNot volunteer much informations

LEE did express himself that he was very unhappy with RED GLOVER bringing TOUMIR LEE JONES to the SILVER DOLLAR meeting this past Sunday.

LEE said that he had questioned GLOVER why CHARLES SHITH and JACKSON were at the meeting. RED said they are not members of the SILVER DOLLAR but that at their last meeting he understood that they agreed they, the members, could bring anybody they destred. LEE and source agreed that this was ruled out at the meeting and that they should not have been brought.


LEE was quite put out with E. D. MORACE, who he said didn't have very much sense, that he would back up from nothing, and has indicated that he doesn't give much if any thought before acting (on any type project). LEE said that WORACE thinks that with brute force he can do most anything and get away with it. Source reported that LEB did not identify any particular job or what he specifically had reference to.

RALPH ODELL DAY:

Source reported that the name R. O. DAY had meant nothing to him but when furnished the full name, source said he had

SILVER DOLLAR GROUP:

Dollar Croup (SDG) members on October 1, 1967, at the hunting lodge of E. D. MORACE and PAUL TOLBERT located near the levee between Ferriday and Vidalia, Louisiana. The meeting lasted from about 2:45 p.m. until 4:45 p.m. There were eight men present, including RALEIGH JACKSON GLOVER, TOMMIE LEE JONES, JAMES LEE, SONNY TAYLOR, E. D. MORACE, and JACK SEALE.

Mississippi, and were unknown to the source. One was a short, curly haired man about 35 years old. GLOVER was overheard to ask LEE if this man was worthy of a silver dollar and would he accept a silver dollar if offered one. LEE replied the man was worthy and would accept a silver dollar. The other man was an older man.

At the meeting, there was a discussion of the financial problems of RED GLOVER. A donation was taken up for GLOVER and \$5 to \$50 was received. The money was to be added to donations furnished by others so GLOVER could pay his attorney.

CLOVER said the main purpose of the meeting was to re-organize the SDG and to make plans to combat the indictments which the FBI was trying to get on SDG members. It was decided that each man should save some money, as much as \$100 each, so that if one member is indicted, other members can make his bond without going through a bondsman.

Everyone seemed surprised to see TOMMIE LEE
JONES at the meeting and JONES was brought to the meeting
by RED GLOVER. JAMES LEE was overheard to remark that
the only thing he did not like about the meeting was JONES'
being there. LEE wondered aloud what he would have to do
to prove to GLOVER that JONES is an FBI informant.

and JAMES LEE and E. D. MORACE fired at some targets with MORACE's .45 caliber automatic pistol. GLOVER had his and he shot this gun.

observed to hand his shotgun to SONNY TAYLOR and state, "It his (TAYLOR's) pickup truck.

After the meeting broke up, GLOVER, JONES, LEE, and TAYLOR drove to the home of LEE at Natchez, Mississippi. JONES soon left to go home and the other three men counted the money received for GLOVER. GLOVER stated his attorney, Mr. RILEY, of Natchez, Mississippi, needed \$500. The three men took the donations received on October 1, 1967, to the home of the man who made GLOVER's \$1,000 bond in Jackson, Mississippi. This man was in possession of donations received previously for GLOVER. The man reported he now had \$400.40 including the donations received that day.

GLOVER wanted to take the money to his attorney that afternoon but RILEY did not answer his home telephone.

Before JONES left the other three men, he inquired from GLOVER the identity of the short, curly haired man who was at the meeting. GLOVER refused to reveal the identity of the man to JONES. After JONES left, GLOVER stated JONES was not an FBI informant. GLOVER said he could get JONES any night and include him in a criminal act which would prove JONES was not an informant.

It was decided that another meeting of SDG members would be held the same place on Sunday, October 15, 1967.

It was expected many people who could not attend the meeting of October 1, 1967, would be able to attend the next meeting.

on October 2, 1967. BLANEY has been hanging around Jonesville quite a bit lately because he has a girl friend there.

BLANEY asked TAYLOR to help him steal some gasoline and oil but TAYLOR declined to get involved in stealing.

RE-ORGANIZATION OF THE KLAN:

GERALD CRAWFORD, HENRY HAVARD, and J. M. BLANEY have been discussing re-organization of the Klan in the Harrisonburg area. They indicated that they wanted the Klan to start meeting again so that they will have a more active role in the forthcoming elections.
